### CLEMSON HOSTS FURMAN IN 2018 SEASON OPENER

The 123rd season of Clemson football will commence on the afternoon of Saturday, Sept. 1, when the Tigers play host to the Furman Paladins. Kickoff at Memorial Stadium in Clemson is scheduled for 12:20 p.m.

While the very nature of college football ensures that every team assumes a new identity every season, the faces that comprise Clemson's 2018 squad may look extremely familiar. The Tigers return 61 lettermen from their 2017 squad that went 12-2 and captured the program's third consecutive ACC title en route to a third straight College Football Playoff berth.

There's a myriad of reasons to love the 2018 Tigers, all of which had Head Coach Dabo Swinney beaming at the start of the team's fall camp.

"I feel great about this team. I love this team," Swinney said. "Last year was such a fun, different challenge for us. But this team, we've got all the ingredients. I think we've got talent. We've got experience. We've got depth. We've got character. We've got good leadership. So we have, I think, all of the things that it takes."

Now entering his 11th season as head coach and his 10th in a non-interim role, Swinney has produced teams that have been strong out of the gate during his tenure. Clemson is 8-1 in season openers under Swinney. A victory against Furman on Saturday would give Swinney nine season-opening wins, which would match Danny Ford for the second-most in program history, trailing only Frank Howard's 25 season-debut victories as head coach of the Tigers.

### WHAT TO WATCH FOR THIS SEASON

- Clemson seeking to become the first team in ACC history to win four consecutive ACC titles outright. (Note: Florida State earned at least a share of nine consecutive ACC titles from 1992-2000 but never earned more than three consecutive titles outright.)
- Clemson attempting to become only the second team ever to earn four consecutive College Football Playoff berths (Alabama, 2014-17).
- Clemson winning 10 games for a school-record eighth consecutive season. Clemson would match Miami (1985-92) and Virginia Tech (2004-11) for the fourth-longest streak of 10-win seasons in FBS history.
- Clemson earning 12 victories to reach 100 wins in a single decade for the first time in school history. Entering 2018 with an 88-22 record this decade, the 2010s already representing the winningest decade in Clemson history, surpassing the 87-25-4 mark set in the 1980s.
- Clemson (40 from 2015-17) winning 11 games to make the 2018 senior class the winningest class in school history. Last year's 2017 class currently holds the school record with a 50-7 mark across the 2014-17 seasons. The 2018 class already ranks tied for fifth in Clemson annals with the 1990 seniors.
- Clemson (22 from 2015-17) winning seven regular season ACC contests to make the 2018 senior class the winningest class in school history in regular season conference play. Each of the last three senior classes from 2015-17 have exited with a 28-4 record in regular season ACC play.
- Clemson (20 from 2015-17) winning all seven home games to allow the 2018 senior class to tie the school record for most home wins by a senior class, matching the mark set by the 2017 seniors.
- Clemson winning at least six home games to add to its active seven-year streak of winning at least six games at Memorial Stadium.
- Clemson going undefeated at home for the fourth time in five years. It would mark the school's first time accomplishing the feat since going undefeated at home in four straight years from 1938-41, when the team played four games at home in 1938 and two games at home in each of the 1939-41 campaigns.
- Clemson hosting home games against head coaches who enter the 2018 season a combined 0-7 at Memorial Stadium in their head coaching careers (Dino Babers, 0-1; Dave Doeren, 0-2; Bobby Petrino, 0-2; David Cutcliffe, 0-1; Will Muschamp, 0-1)
- Clemson going undefeated in true road games for the third time in four years for the first time in school history.
- Clemson entering preseason camp with a Power Five conference-best 17 student-athletes on the roster having already earned their degree.
- Tackle Mitch Hyatt (2,885) playing 115 snaps to become only the fifth player in Clemson history to play at least 3,000 career snaps.
- Hyatt playing 477 snaps to pass center Dalton Freeman (3,361) for the most snaps in Clemson history.
- Wide receiver Hunter Renfrow (28) recording a catch in each of the first 11 games of the season to pass Artavis Scott (38 from 2014-16) for the longest streak of consecutive games with a catch in Clemson history.
- Defensive tackle Christian Wilkins attempting to become the fourth Clemson player to earn three first-team All-American selections in a career (MG William Perry, 1982-84; LB Anthony Simmons, 1995-97; WR Sammy Watkins, 2011-13).

### WHAT TO WATCH FOR TODAY

- Clemson facing the opponent against whom the team played its first game in program history. Guided by Head Coach Walter Riggs, Clemson earned a 14-6 road victory against the Furman Purple Hurricane in the Tigers' gridiron debut on Oct. 31, 1896.
- Clemson improving to 43-10-4 against Furman all-time.
- Clemson opening a season against Furman for the ninth time in program history. The Tigers are 8-0 all-time against Furman in season openers, including victories to begin the 1896, 1915, 1916, 1964, 1979, 1989, 1994 and 1998 campaigns.
- Clemson winning its 31st consecutive contest against Furman and extending its unbeaten streak against the Paladins to 32 consecutive games. The last tie between the two teams occurred in 1937, and the most recent Furman victory in the series came during the 1936 campaign. Clemson's 30-game winning streak against Furman is its longest active winning streak against any opponent.
- Clemson improving to 92-23-8 all-time in season openers.
- Clemson extending its winning streak in non-conference regular season play to 16 games. Dating back to 2014, Clemson's current 15-game winning streak in regular season non-conference games is already the longest such streak in program history.
- Clemson winning its ninth consecutive game at Clemson Memorial Stadium, dating back to a 56-7 win against South Carolina on Nov. 25, 2016. It would be Clemson's third home winning streak of at least nine games in Dabo Swinney's tenure as head coach (21 from 2013-16, 13 from 2011-12).
- Dabo Swinney improving to 2-0 all-time against Furman as a head coach. The Tigers earned a 41-7 victory on Sept. 15, 2012, in the lone meeting to date between the Tigers and Paladins during Swinney's tenure.
- Swinney extending his record in season openers as head coach to 9-1.
- Swinney tying Danny Ford (nine) for the second-most season-opening victories in Clemson history, trailing only Frank Howard (25) in program annals.
- Swinney pushing his all-time record in non-conference play as a head coach to 37-13, including a 30-8 record against non-conference opponents in regular season play.
- Quarterback Kelly Bryant (2,877) passing for 123 yards to become the 15th player in school history to record 3,000 career passing yards.
- Bryant (275) completing 25 passes to become the 10th player in school history to record 300 career pass completions. In doing so, he would pass his position coach, Brandon Streeeter, for 10th in program history.
- Bryant maintaining his school record for lowest percentage of passed intercepted (2.16).
- Kicker Greg Huegel (271) chasing No. 7 Obed Ariri (288) and No. 6 James Davis (294) on the school's leaderboard for career points.

## -- GETTING STARTED --

### SEASON OPENERS

Clemson has won 26 of its last 33 season openers. Head Coach Dabo Swinney is 8-1 in his career in season opening games with the only loss coming at Georgia to open the 2014 season. A win this week would give Swinney his ninth season-opening victory to tie Danny Ford for the second-most by a head coach in school history.

# NOTES

Swinney's opening wins include two over Auburn and one over Georgia. The season opening victory over Georgia came at home in 2013 when the Bulldogs were ranked fifth in the nation entering the game.

Clemson has played eight openers against top 25 teams in the last 18 years after having played just five top 25 teams in opening games between 1936 (first year of the AP poll) and 1999.

Clemson has been no stranger to exciting season openers since the turn of the century. In 2004, against Wake Forest, Clemson won a 37-30 overtime thriller on ABC. Clemson won at home in 2005, a 25-24 win over No. 17 Texas A&M on a 42-yard field goal by Jad Dean with two seconds left. Clemson also beat No. 19 Florida State in the 2007 season opener.

The Tigers are 91-23-8 (.779), regardless of site, in their first game in their previous 122 seasons.

## HOME OPENERS

Even though 2018 represents the 123rd season of Clemson football, Clemson has had just 117 home openers in its history as a function of the five seasons in which Clemson did not play a game at home. In the 117 home openers, Clemson has a 92-17-8 record (.821) against 38 different opponents. Clemson has won 14 straight home openers with the last loss coming in Dabo Swinney's first year as an assistant coach, a 30-0 loss to Georgia in 2003.

## -- ON THE OPPONENT --

## SERIES HISTORY VS. FURMAN

The 2018 season opener will bring Clemson back to its very beginnings when the team plays host to Furman, the school against whom Clemson played its first game in program history.

The teams met in Clemson's football debut on Oct. 31, 1896, with Coach Walter Riggs' Clemson squad collecting a 14-6 road victory in Greenville, S.C. The two teams did not meet again until 1902, a 28-0 Tiger victory. Clemson won the first seven games of the series between 1896 and 1918 before Furman broke the string when the two teams tied 7-7 in 1919.

Furman earned its first win in the series in Greenville in 1920 by a 14-0 score. The first game in the series at Clemson took place at Riggs Field in 1916, a 7-6 Tiger win and Clemson's first win at Riggs Field.

## MORE CLEMSON-FURMAN HISTORY

- Clemson has won 30 straight games against Furman since a 0-0 tie between the two schools at Furman in 1937. Furman's last win over Clemson took place in 1936 in a Nov. 26 game played in the snow in Clemson. That contest remains the only time on record that Clemson has played a home game in the snow.

- Overall, Clemson holds a 42-10-4 lead in the series, including a 24-2 lead in games played at Clemson and a 19-0 advantage in games played in Memorial Stadium. The two teams played at Memorial Stadium as far back as 1942, the first year of the facility and just the third Clemson game played at Death Valley.

- Clemson did not allow a Furman touchdown between 1962 and 1998, a span of eight games. That streak ended in 2003 when Bo Moore threw a touchdown pass to Brian Bratton in the second quarter. The Paladins had scored five field goals during the last 34 quarters against Clemson.

- The 2003 Furman game on Sept. 6, 2003 was the last game broadcast by Jim Phillips, Clemson's Hall of Fame broadcaster who suddenly passed away the following Tuesday morning (Sept. 9).

- Both teams won national championships in the 1980s. Clemson won the Division I crown in 1981 and Furman won the Division I-AA title in 1988. Furman was the second winningest program in Division I-AA in the 1980s, while Clemson was fifth for that decade among Division I schools. Clemson graduate George Bennett was the athletic director at Furman when they won the I-AA National title.

## 30 STRAIGHT

Clemson's active 30-game winning streak against Furman is Clemson's longest winning streak against a single opponent in program history.

Clemson had a 29-game winning streak against Virginia from 1955-89, the first 29 games in that series. Included below are the longest single-series winning streaks in Clemson history:

## TWO SCHOOLS, ONE PAIR OF PANTS

On Oct. 8, 1960, Clemson and Furman shared the same uniform pants. In one of the most bizarre uniform stories in college sports history, both teams wore a special (at the time) water-repellent uniform that day to guard against predicted severe weather.

Clemson wore the pants in defeating Virginia, 21-7, in the afternoon, then had the pants shipped to Furman for a night game against William & Mary. Furman defeated William & Mary that night in Greenville, 25-23. Furman Head Coach Bob King said after the game, "After those big Clemson boys got out of those pants, some of our guys had a hard time making them stay

up. We had to tape the legs of the pants for several players."

Players wearing the pants for two different schools defeated two teams from the state of Virginia on the same day.

## CLEMSON UNDEFEATED VS. FCS TEAMS

Entering this week's contest against Furman, Clemson is a perfect 32-0 against Football Championship Subdivision teams since the NCAA formed the division prior to the 1978 season (Southern Conference schools became I-AA in 1982.)

Clemson has outscored FCS teams by a 1315-218 margin all-time, an average victory margin of 34.3 points. Clemson has won 31 of the 32 games by double digits, including each of the last six by at least 34 points. The only exception came when Clemson defeated Wofford 35-27 in 2011. Wofford's 27 points were the most by an FCS school against Clemson.

## LAST MEETING VS. FURMAN

### Clemson 41, Furman 7

(Sept. 15, 2012, Clemson, S.C)

Tajh Boyd completed 20-of-29 passes for 310 yards and two touchdowns in leading No. 11 Clemson to a 41-7 win over Furman on Sept. 15, 2012. The Tigers took a 20-7 lead into halftime and held the Paladins scoreless in the second half en route to a 34-point win, Clemson's 30th straight victory over Furman.

Andre Ellington opened the scoring with a 10-yard burst off right tackle to put the Tigers up 7-0 in the first quarter. The run capped a seven-play, 80-yard drive that featured two first down catches a piece by Sammy Watkins and DeAndre Hopkins. Sammy Watkins scored on a 58-yard end around to make the count 14-0.

Furman finally broke through on its next possession as Reese Hannon found Jordan Snellings wide open down the sideline for a 37-yard score to cap an 84-yard drive that cut Clemson's lead to 17-7.

Chandler Catanzaro stretched Clemson's lead to 20-7 with a 22-yard field goal that matched Obed A'iri's 14 consecutive made field goals.



# NOTES

Clemson upped its lead to 34-7 when Brandon Ford ran free on a wheel route and hauled in a Boyd pass for a 30-yard touchdown catch. Boyd then threw a 39-yard scoring pass to Martavis Bryant for the only score of the fourth quarter and a 41-7 lead.

Clemson finished with 498 yards of total offense, while Furman had 349. The Tigers had 184 rushing and 314 passing. Ellington led Clemson in rushing with 59 yards and two scores. DeAndre Hopkins had seven catches for 95 yards and Jaron Brown added 4-76. Both are now veterans in the NFL.

## RECORD CROWD VS. FURMAN IN 2012

The attendance for the Clemson vs. Furman game in 2012 was 83,574. That is the highest attendance on record for a Clemson game against an FCS team. The previous record was 80,620 for a Clemson vs. Furman game in 1988.

## CLEMSON-FURMAN CONNECTIONS

Four head coaches in Furman history also coached at Clemson, including one who is a Clemson graduate.

**A.P. McLeod** served as Clemson's line coach in 1927 under Josh Cody and coached Clemson's first All-American, center O.K. Pressley. At Furman, McLeod was an outstanding player and coach. He was Furman's head basketball coach beginning with the 1928 season and still has the best winning percentage in the school's basketball history with a 69-17 record. In 1932, he became Furman's head football coach, a position he held until 1942. He is the last Furman coach to defeat Clemson (1936).

McLeod was followed in 1946 (Furman did not have a team from 1943-45 because of WWII) by **Bob Smith**, a 1934 Furman graduate. Smith was a star player at Furman from 1931-33. He became the Furman head football coach for the 1946-47 seasons. In 1950 he came to Clemson to coach under Frank Howard. He served Clemson for 28 years as an assistant football coach and head baseball coach. In fact, it was Smith who won Clemson's first ever ACC Championship in any sport when he led the Tigers to the 1954 ACC baseball championship. He is a member of the Athletic Hall of Fame at both institutions.

**Art Baker** was an assistant coach at Clemson under Frank Howard from 1965-69, then became head football coach at Furman from 1973-77. In fact, he was the head coach when David Whitehurst, the father of former Clemson quarterback Charlie Whitehurst, was the quarterback at Furman. Baker laid the groundwork for considerable success at Furman as he hired Dick Sheridan, Jimmy Satterfield and Bobby Johnson as assistant coaches. They all went on to become head coaches at Furman.

**Bobby Johnson** is a 1973 Clemson graduate who went on to become head coach at Furman from 1994-2001. He coached against Clemson for Furman in 1994 and 1998. He and Mike O'Cain are the only Clemson graduates to coach against Clemson. In 1993, Johnson was Clemson's defensive coordinator, helping the Tigers to a 9-3 season. As a player at Clemson, Johnson led the Tigers in interceptions in 1971 and 1972 and was named Academic All-ACC each season. He is now retired from coaching, but is a member of the College Football Playoff Committee.

Former Clemson Executive Secretary of IPTAY **George Bennett** is a common denominator for both Furman and Clemson. Bennett was the athletic director at Furman from 1986-88, including the 1988 season when Furman won the Division I-AA National Championship. He has had a distinguished career at Clemson that dates to 1955 when he was a Clemson senior and head

cheerleader. He is a member of the Clemson Athletic Hall of Fame and won the University's Distinguished Service Award in 1986.

Clemson and Furman's current rosters also share a number of connections. Clemson redshirt freshman **Matt Bockhorst** is the younger brother of Furman center Jonathan Bockhorst. In addition, Furman cornerback Amir Trapp began his college career at Clemson, where his father, James, lettered in football and track from 1989-93 en route to induction into the Clemson Hall of Fame.

## CLEMSON VS. SOUTHERN CONFERENCE

Clemson has not lost to a Southern Conference school since the Tigers left the Southern Conference to help form the ACC in 1953. Clemson has won 44 games in a row against Southern Conference teams. Clemson last lost to a Southern Conference team in 1952 when South Carolina defeated the Tigers, 6-0, when both schools were still Southern Conference members.

The last time Clemson lost to a team currently in the Southern Conference was 1936 when Furman defeated the Tigers, 12-0.

## THREE CLEMSON STAFF MEMBERS PLAYED FOR FURMAN

Three current Clemson football staff members, including offensive line coach Robbie Caldwell, played for and graduated from Furman. The others are Clemson Director of Football Operations and Player Personnel Mike Dooley, and Assistant Director of Recruiting Jordan Sorrells.

Caldwell is a 1977 Furman graduate who lettered under Art Baker between 1973-75. He was the team MVP as a senior in 1975, an unusual accomplishment for an offensive lineman. He was also the team captain.

Caldwell served as a full time assistant coach at Furman under Dick Sheridan from 1978-85. In those eight seasons Furman won six league championships. Caldwell is in his 41st year as an assistant coach and has coached 477 college football games entering the 2018 season. Clemson has an 82-15 record in the seven seasons Caldwell has been on Dabo Swinney's staff.

Dooley is a 1998 Furman graduate and is in his 14th year at Clemson in various capacities. He lettered for the Paladins from 1993-95 and registered a sack against Clemson in 1994 at Death Valley.

Sorrells is a 2009 Furman graduate who is in his fourth year at Clemson. He served as Director of Football Operations at Furman from 2011-14 before coming to Clemson. He was a two-year starter at quarterback for Furman and is tied for first in career touchdown passes (42) and ranks second in school history in passing yards and completions and third in completion percentage.

## CHASING 100

Head Coach Dabo Swinney can vividly recall the looks he received when he said Clemson was on the cusp of the winningest decade in program history following a 2010 campaign in which the Tigers finished 6-7. In 2017, that vision became a reality with two seasons to spare when Clemson collected its 88th win of the decade in the ACC Championship Game against Miami to surpass the 1980s Tigers (87) for the most wins in any decade in school history.

With 12 wins in 2018, the Clemson can reach triple digits in wins in a decade for the first time in program history.

While wins against teams ranked in the Top 25 carry a lot of weight in the moment, one added layer of quality assurance for victories can be gleaned from viewing teams' records against opponents that actually finished the year in the Top 25. An independent analysis by Saturday Down South revealed that Clemson's 15 victories in the College Football Playoff era against opponents that finished the season in the Top 25 ranks second nationally.

## SWINNEY FOURTH COACH TO REACH 100 WINS IN FIRST 10 YEARS

When Dabo Swinney and the Tigers defeated South Carolina, 34-10, in the final regular season game of 2017, it gave Swinney 100 wins in his first 10 years as a head coach. Swinney accomplished the feat despite his first season as a head coach being limited to seven games after assuming the Interim Head Coach title six games into the 2008 campaign.

He became just the fourth coach to reach 100 wins in his first 10 years, joining Bob Stoops, Chris Petersen and Urban Meyer.

While the return of the members of Clemson's ballyhooed defensive line generated a majority of the team's offseason headlines, Clemson's offensive line returned its own first-team All-American in left tackle Mitch Hyatt. In July, Hyatt was the leading vote-getter in the preseason All-ACC selection process, appearing on a conference-high 130 of 148 possible ballots, 28 more votes than ACC Preseason Player of the Year AJ Dillon.

Hyatt, a three-year letterman out of Suwanee, Ga., entered the 2018 campaign with 43 games, 42 starts and 2,885 snaps to his credit, helping Clemson to an ACC title and College Football Playoff berth in each of his first three seasons.

The No. 5 Clemson Tigers opened the 2017 season in grand fashion by defeating the Kent State Golden Flashes 56-3 at Memorial Stadium, with the 56 points marking the highest scoring output by the Tigers in a season opener since 1990.

Led by junior quarterback Kelly Bryant, who was making his first career start, Clemson compiled 665 yards on offense in the Tigers' first game as defending national champions. Bryant was especially efficient on the day, accruing 313 total yards, a program record for an opening game.

C.J. Fuller scored on a 26-yard run. On the ensuing drive, Bryant connected with Deon Cain up the seam for a 61-yard touchdown, putting Clemson up 14-0.

Late in the first, running back Adam Choice capped off a 10-play, 54-yard drive with a three-yard rushing touchdown, one of six rushing scores on the day for the Tigers. Clemson recorded 353 yards on the ground with four rushers clearing the 50-yard mark.

Bryant was effective with his feet, as well as his arm, as the quarterback amassed 77 yards rushing and scored on an eight-yard run late in the second quarter to send the Tigers into the half leading 28-3.

The second half saw several new faces for Clemson become involved in the offensive action as part of another 28-point half. Running back Travis Etienne burst onto the scene with an impressive 54-yard carry and a four-yard score. Finishing as the game's leading rusher, Etienne compiled 81 yards on the ground.

Powered by a defense that sacked Auburn's quarterback 11 times, the No. 3 Clemson football team defeated No. 13 Auburn 14-6 at Death Valley. With the win, Clemson improved to 2-0 on the year, while Auburn dropped to 1-1.

Junior quarterback Kelly Bryant led the offensive charge for Clemson, passing for 181 yards and rushing for 68. On defense, Clemson was sparked by Dorian O'Daniel, whose 14 tackles, including 10 in the first half, were a career high for the redshirt graduate linebacker. Junior defensive lineman Christian Wilkins added another 10 tackles, and junior defensive end Austin Bryant had four of Clemson's 11 sacks.

Auburn scored the only points of the first quarter just under eight minutes in on a Daniel Carlson 24-yard field goal that capped off the first drive. They doubled their lead early in the second quarter, this time on a 28-yarder by Carlson.

Clemson took its first lead with less than a minute left in the first half on a three-yard touchdown rush by junior quarterback Kelly Bryant. The 12-play scoring drive was highlighted by 29-yard pass from Bryant to junior receiver Ray-Ray McCloud on third down, and Clemson found the end zone two plays later. Following the Bryant score, Clemson had a 7-6 lead at halftime.

Bryant opened the scoring in the second half, capping off Clemson's first drive of the half with a 27-yard rushing touchdown to give his squad a 14-6 lead early in the third quarter. That proved to be the final score, as Clemson's seven second-half sacks limited Auburn to 15 total yards with -25 rushing yards in the second half.

Six different Tigers scored at Papa John's Stadium as No. 2 Clemson defeated the No. 14 Louisville Cardinals 47-21 in the Tigers' first road game and ACC opener.

Kelly Bryant powered Clemson's offense on Saturday, passing for 316 yards and rushing for 26 yards with two touchdowns in his first road start. Ray-Ray McCloud was Bryant's most popular target, totaling a career-high 115 yards with a touchdown on seven catches.

The Tigers struck first, scoring on their opening drive on a Bryant eight-yard touchdown run five minutes into the first quarter. After two three-and-outs in their first two drives, Louisville tied the game late in the first quarter on an 11-yard scoring pass from Lamar Jackson to Charles Standberry. A Greg Huegel 31-yard field goal gave the Tigers a 10-7 lead, and that lead increased to 16-7 after a Bryant 79-yard touchdown pass to McCloud.

O'Daniel opened the second-half scoring when he returned an interception 44 yards for his first career score, and Bryant ran in a one-yard touchdown to give the Tigers a 33-7 lead in the third quarter.

Jackson found Jay Smith for a 36-yard touchdown to start the fourth quarter to cut the Clemson lead to 33-14, but the Tigers responded with a 39-yard scoring run by Choice on the ensuing drive put Clemson at the 40-point mark. The Cardinals found the end zone on an eight-yard touchdown pass from Jackson to Dez Fitzpatrick, but the Tigers had the last word with their longest score of the day, an 81-yard scoring run by Travis Etienne.

Four fourth-quarter touchdowns led the No. 2 Clemson Tigers to a 34-7 win over the Boston College Eagles at Memorial Stadium. On offense, the Tigers were powered by the run game, as all five of their touchdowns came on foot. Kelly Bryant rushed for a career-high 106 yards and two touchdowns on 22 carries, and Travis Etienne, who ran for 113 yards and two touchdowns on nine carries.

Defensively, Clemson was sparked by Trayvon Mullen and A.J. Terrell, who hauled in their first career interceptions, and Kendall Joseph, who had 10 first-half tackles.

The Tigers struck first, breaking a scoreless tie midway through the second quarter on a 94-yard drive that was capped by a Bryant 11-yard touchdown run. Taylor Hearn, an offensive guard, had a key 12-yard run on third down when he recovered a fumble.

That proved to be the only scoring of the first half, and Clemson took a 7-0 lead into the break. Boston College evened the score at 7-7 late in the third quarter when AJ Dillon ran in a one-yard touchdown, and the Tigers and Eagles entered the fourth quarter tied.

Clemson took the lead for good on its opening drive of the final quarter on a six-yard touchdown run by Adam Choice, set up by a 23-yard pass from Bryant to Diondre Overton on the previous play. An Etienne 50-yard rushing touchdown put Clemson up by 14 late in the fourth quarter, and Bryant scored on a four-yard quarterback keeper with just under three minutes left in the game.

The Tiger offense was not done, however, as Terrell's interception set up a 41-yard scoring drive that saw Etienne find the end zone on a 10-yard scoring run with less than a minute remaining in the contest.

Offensively, the Tigers were led by Kelly Bryant, who threw for 186 yards and a touchdowns on 12 completions. Bryant also rushed for 94 yards on 19 carries. O'Daniel piloted the Tiger defense, recovering a fumble, returning an interception 22 yards for his second pick-six of the season and totaling 10 tackles and a sack.

Clemson struck first, holding Virginia Tech to a three-and-out on its first drive before taking a 3-0 lead on an Alex Spence 23-yard field goal just over five minutes into the first quarter. After the Tiger defense forced another three-and-out on the ensuing Hokie drive, Clemson took a 10-0 lead on a Tavien Feaster 60-yard touchdown reception, the running back's first career receiving score.

The Tigers also opened the second half scoring, as Feaster gave the Tigers a 24-3 lead on a one-yard rushing score after O'Daniel recovered a Hokie fumble. The Tigers maintained that lead entering the final quarter, as the defense stopped a Virginia Tech fake field goal attempt in the final seconds of the third quarter.

Virginia Tech narrowed Clemson's lead to 24-10 a minute into the fourth quarter when it scored its first touchdown. O'Daniel's pick-six came on the Hokies' next drive, putting the Tigers up 31-10.

Hinton threw an 11-yard touchdown pass to Cam Serigne six minutes later, doubling the Demon Deacon point total and putting the final score at 28-14 in favor of the Tigers.

The No. 2. Clemson Tigers (6-1, 4-1) lost their first contest in 11 months as part of a 27-24 upset victory by the Syracuse Orange (4-3, 2-1) at the Carrier Dome, ending a 20-game win streak for the Tigers over ACC Atlantic Division foes.

Eric Dungey and the Orange offense fired on all cylinders from the start, as Syracuse converted a 10-play, 72-yard drive into points on the game's opening possession. Clemson answered with a three-play, 62-yard scoring series on the Tigers' first possession. With a 37-yard burst into the end zone, Clemson running back Tavien Feaster knotted the game up at 7-7.

Trailing 17-14 at halftime, Clemson was forced to go without Kelly Bryant in the second half due to injury, as he exited the game late in the second quarter. Therefore, Zerrick Cooper was under center for the Tigers for the remainder of the game.

After a Alex Spence field goal tied the score, Syracuse quickly regained the lead, driving 82 yards plays to take a 24-17 lead. Highlighted by a 45-yard run from Dungey, the possession was capped off by a 30-yard touchdown pass from Dungey to wideout Steve Ishmael with just over seven minutes remaining in the third quarter.

Clemson then reciprocated with an electrifying drive of its own, as running back Travis Etienne broke free for a 52-yard touchdown.

A six-minute drive by the Orange that featured a critical conversion on third and 11 ultimately enabled Syracuse to run out the clock.

The No. 7 Clemson football team picked up its 300th all-time win at Memorial Stadium, defeating the Georgia Tech Yellow Jackets by a score of 24-10. With the win, Clemson improved to 7-1 overall and 5-1 in the ACC, while Georgia Tech fell to 4-3 on the year and 3-2 in conference play.

Offensively, the Tigers were led in both rushing and passing by quarterback Kelly Bryant, who ran for 67 yards on 12 carries and threw for 207 yards and two touchdowns on 22 completions. The Clemson defense, who held the Yellow Jackets to negative passing yardage until late in the fourth quarter, totaled 11 tackles for loss.

The Tigers jumped out to an early 7-0 lead just two minutes into the game after Van Smith recovered a Georgia Tech fumble on the Yellow Jackets' first drive, and Bryant connected with Deon Cain for a 38-yard score two plays later. Georgia Tech cut into the Tigers' lead with five minutes remaining in the first quarter on a 25-yard Brenton King field goal, set up by a KirVonte Benson 65-yard run earlier in the drive. Milan Richard hauled in a 20-yard touchdown pass three minutes later to put the Tigers up 14-3. It was his first career touchdown and was scored with his uncle, Herschel Walker, in attendance.

Clemson scored the only points of the second quarter with just over three minutes left in the half when Travis Etienne punched in the end zone from two yards out, and the Tigers took a 21-3 lead into the break.

An Alex Spence 29-yard field goal made up the only points of the third quarter, and a TaQuon Marshall 22-yard touchdown run with just under five minutes left in the game rounded out the scoring.

The No. 6 Clemson football team handed No. 20 NC State its first ACC loss of the year, defeating the Wolfpack, 38-31, at Carter-Finley Stadium.

The Tigers were sparked by Deon Cain, who amassed 84 yards on a career-high nine catches, and Tavien Feaster, whose 89-yard rushing touchdown in the third quarter was tied for the third-longest run in Clemson history. Defensively, Ryan Carter had three pass break-ups and hauled in a crucial fourth-quarter interception.

Clemson evened the score on Ray-Ray McCloud's 77-yard punt return for a touchdown in the first quarter, the Tigers' first since 2014. The Tigers found the end zone less than a minute into the second quarter when Kelly Bryant ran for a 10-yard touchdown, bringing the score to 14-14. NC State regained the lead a few minutes later, as Finley connected with Samuels for a seven-yard touchdown that put the Wolfpack up 21-14.

Cain opened the third-quarter scoring on a 12-yard scoring pass from Bryant, putting the Tigers up 24-21. As time was expiring in the quarter, Feaster broke loose for his 89-yard touchdown run, giving Clemson its largest lead of the game.

Carter's interception allowed the Tigers to drive down and take a 10-point lead on Bryant's second rushing touchdown. A Kyle Bamard 22-yard field goal left Clemson's lead at seven points with just under two minutes remaining in the game, and the game ended with K'Von Wallace intercepting Finley's final pass with no time left.

The No. 4 Clemson football team clinched a spot in the 2017 ACC Championship game by defeating the Florida State Seminoles by a score of 31-14 in Death Valley.

Offensively, the ground game powered the Tigers, as all four of Clemson's touchdowns were via a run, one each from Kelly Bryant and Adam Choice and two by Travis Etienne. On the defensive side of the ball, Van Smith led the way with an interception on what could have been the Seminoles' go-ahead drive.

Etienne found the end zone with six and a half minutes left in the second quarter, breaking through traffic and powering 28 yards to cap off a one-play drive, set up by a Ray-Ray McCloud 35-yard punt return. The Tigers took a 17-0 lead into halftime after limiting Florida State to just 46 yards in the first 30 minutes.

The Seminoles tallied their first points in the third quarter when Jacques Patrick rushed three yards for a score that cut the Tigers' lead to 17-7. Florida State then cut Clemson's lead to just three points midway through the fourth quarter when James Blackman connected with Ryan Izzo for a 60-yard touchdown pass.

On the ensuing Clemson drive, the Seminoles forced and recovered a fumble, but Smith's interception regained Clemson possession just one play later and paved the way for another Etienne touchdown that put the Tigers up 24-14 with three minutes remaining in the game. Choice scored the Tigers' final points of the matchup on a 10-yard touchdown run that ended a drive in which he amassed 28 of his 40 rushing yards on three carries.

Playing in front of a Memorial Stadium crowd for the final time in 2017, the No. 2 Clemson Tigers raced to a dominant 61-3 victory over The Citadel Bulldogs, accruing a season-high 479 passing yards in the process.

The Tigers took a 21-0 lead in the first quarter, as Kelly Bryant connected with Deon Cain on a 53-yard bomb during Clemson's first possession, putting the Tigers up 7-0. Cain totaled 140 receiving yards on five catches.

On the next series, The Citadel turned the ball over, as Trayvon Mullen picked off a pass. Soon afterward, Travis Etienne scored from six yards out. Later in the first quarter, Bryant capped an eight-play, 69-yard drive with a 12-yard touchdown pass to wideout Hunter Renfrow.

Early in the second quarter, Clemson increased its lead to 28 points when receiver T.J. Chase found the end zone for the first time in his Clemson career on a 13-yard strike from Bryant. Clemson kicker Alex Spence sent a 26-yard field goal through the uprights on the ensuing Clemson drive, and, with under a minute to play in the first half, quarterback Zerrick Cooper threw a touchdown pass to wideout Tee Higgins.

Higgins experienced a breakout performance in the contest, with the freshman amassing 178 receiving yards, the most for any Clemson player in 2017, on six receptions, two of which resulted in touchdowns.

Tavien Feaster opened up the second half with a 61-yard burst to the house for six, finding open space up the middle for his fifth rushing score of the season.

Using a balanced offensive attack, the No. 3 Clemson Tigers toppled the South Carolina Gamecocks, 34-10, at Williams-Brice Stadium, marking the fourth consecutive victory for the Tigers in the Palmetto Bowl.

Clemson outgained South Carolina by 262 yards and totaled 17 more first downs. The defense was stellar as well, shutting out the Gamecocks through three quarters.

In fact, a defensive highlight for the Tigers resulted in the first score of the evening, as Clemson cornerback Ryan Carter sprinted into the end zone on a 12-yard interception return, providing Clemson an early 7-0 lead.

The Tigers tacked on 13 more points in the second quarter to push their lead to 20-0, as quarterback Kelly Bryant led Clemson on two scoring drives. Bryant was 23-34 passing for 272 yards and two touchdowns.

Hunter Renfrow provided the Tigers with more breathing room, scoring on the first play from scrimmage in the third quarter on a 61-yard receiving touchdown.

On the next series, the South Carolina offense continued to struggle, as Trayvon Mullen stepped in front of a pass to secure an interception, marking the Gamecocks' second turnover of the night. A few possessions later, Clemson put together a 13-play, 69-yard drive that featured a critical 13-yard run by Bryant on fourth down to extend the drive deep in South Carolina territory.

Soon after, the series was capped off by a five-yard rushing touchdown by Travis Etienne, giving Clemson a 34-0 lead that it carried into the fourth quarter. The Gamecocks scored 10 points in the final period, though, converting a pair of Tiger interceptions into points.

Fueled by a balanced offensive attack and a stifling defensive performance, No. 1 Clemson won its third straight and 17th all-time ACC Championship, defeating the No. 7 Miami Hurricanes 38-3 at Bank of America Stadium. With the win, Clemson improved to 12-1 overall, while Miami moved to 10-2.

Offensively, the Tigers were sparked by Kelly Bryant, who completed his first 15 passes for 164 yards and finished the game with 252 yards and one passing touchdown on a career-high 23 completions after connecting with 10 different receivers. He was also named the game's MVP.

The ground game proved strong as well, as four different Tigers rushed for scores. The Clemson defense held Miami to just 22 yards of offense in the first quarter and 214 for the whole game while also forcing three Hurricane turnovers in the third quarter alone.

Travis Etienne put Clemson on the board first, darting four yards for a touchdown just under five minutes into the matchup. The score was set up when Bryant connected with Renfrow on third down for a 23-yard gain a few plays earlier. A Miami 46-yard field goal attempt then sailed wide left, and on Clemson's ensuing drive, Bryant broke free for an 11-yard scoring run that gave the Tigers a 14-0 lead near the end of the first quarter. The junior quarterback was also a perfect 9-9 passing for 124 yards during the first 15 minutes.

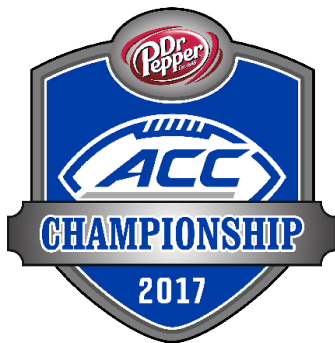
Adam Choice upped Clemson's lead to 21-0 two minutes into the second quarter with a one-yard touch-

down run. That proved to be the halftime score, and the 21-point advantage was good for the largest halftime lead in ACC Championship game history.

Five minutes into the second half, an Alex Spence 46-yard field goal pushed the Tigers' lead to 24-0, and Ryan Carter forced a fumble that was recovered by Dorian O'Daniel on the Hurricanes' next drive. The Tigers did not score on that possession, but Carter halted Miami again a few minutes later with an interception in Hurricane territory. Clemson did find the endzone then, with Tavien Feaster powering 11 yards and putting the Tigers up 31-0.

Kendall Joseph caused Miami's third turnover of the third quarter with just under two minutes left in it when he intercepted a Malik Rosier pass, and Bryant connected with Deon Cain for a 27-yard score two plays later. Miami scored its only points on a 22-yard by Michael Badgley with three and a half minutes remaining in the game.

The 35-point win was the largest victory margin in ACC Championship Game history and Clemson's largest victory margin against a top-25 team in history.

The No. 1 Clemson football team suffered its second and final defeat of the 2017-18 season, falling 24-6 to the No. 4 Alabama Crimson Tide in the Sugar Bowl and College Football Playoff Semifinal. With the loss, Clemson ended the year with a 12-2 overall record, while Alabama improved to 12-1 overall.

After Clemson forced a three-and-out on Alabama's first drive, the Tide capitalized on their second drive by hitting a 24-yard field goal to take a 3-0 lead with just over five minutes remaining in the first quarter. Alabama upped its lead to 10-0 as time was expiring in the first quarter when Jalen Hurts connected with Calvin Ridley for a 12-yard score.

Clemson got on the board five minutes into the second quarter on an Alex Spence 44-yard field goal. Deon Cain, who finished the game as the Tigers' leading receiver, had two catches for 27 yards to power the scoring drive that brought the Tide lead to 10-3. Both defenses proved stout for the rest of the half, with either team's best scoring chance coming on a failed 38-yard field goal by Alabama with 17 seconds left.

The Tigers opened the second half by cutting Alabama's lead to 10-6 on a Spence 42-yard field goal. The score was set up by Kendall Joseph causing and recovering a fumble on the Alabama 20-yard line on the Tide's first play of the half. A few drives later, Alabama's Da'Ron Payne intercepted a Bryant pass and returned it 21 yards, paving the way for Hurts to find Payne for a one-yard touchdown. Alabama found the endzone again immediately, as Mack Wilson intercepted Bryant's first pass on the next Clemson drive and returned it 18 yards for a score with just over five minutes remaining in the third quarter.

After the pick-six, the Tide took a 24-6 lead into the final 15 minutes, and that proved to be the final score after both defenses kept both offenses at bay.

The two teams combined for just 449 yards of total offense, the fewest in a Sugar Bowl since 1969.
