TOP STORYLINES

- A new era for Georgia Tech football officially begins on Thursday night when the 20th head coach in program history, **Geoff Collins**, leads the Yellow Jackets into the 2019 season opener versus longtime rival and defending national champion Clemson.
- After 11 seasons of utilizing an option-based offense under former head coach Paul Johnson, Georgia Tech will debut its new spread, pro-style offense.
- The Yellow Jackets will also debut a 4-2-5 effort-based defense after utilizing a 3-4 scheme last season. Dubbed "The Minister of Mayhem," Collins has coached some of college football's top defenses throughout his career, including as the defensive coordinator at Mississippi State (2011-14) and Florida (2015-16) and head coach at Temple (2017-18).
- Georgia Tech and Clemson are meeting for the 85th time in a series that dates back to 1898 and has been played annually since Tech began Atlantic Coast Conference play in 1983. Georgia Tech holds a 50-31-2 advantage in the all-time series*.
- Despite it being the 85th all-time meeting between the two schools, Thursday's game marks only the eighth time overall and the first time since 1962 that Georgia Tech opens its season against Clemson. Tech is 6-1 all-time in season openers against Clemson. After losing 73-0 the first time it opened a season against Clemson in 1903, Georgia Tech has won the last six times that it has opened its campaign against CU (1918, 1932, 1933, 1934, 1944 and 1962), outscoring the Tigers by a combined 188-32 in those six matchups.
- Georgia Tech is opening the season with a conference game for only the seventh time since beginning ACC play in 1983 and the first time since 2016. The Yellow Jackets are 4-2 all-time when opening the season against an ACC opponent.

* Georgia Tech's series record does not include 2009 ACC Championship Game win, which was vacated

Head coach Geoff Collins returns to Georgia Tech for the third time in his 27-year coaching career. He served as a graduate assistant (1999-2000) then tight ends coach (2001) under head coach George O'Leary, then returned as director of player personnel under head coach Chan Gailey in 2006.

Georgia Tech holds a 50-31-2* advantage in the all-time series with Clemson (*GT series record does not include win in 2009 ACC Championship Game, which was vacated due to NCAA sanctions).

A GEORGIA TECH WIN WOULD ...

- make Georgia Tech 1-0 overall and 1-0 in ACC play;
- be the third win over a No. 1-ranked team in program history and the first since the Yellow Jackets' 41-38 victory at No. 1 Virginia on Nov. 3, 1990 (en route to an 11-0-1 season at Georgia Tech's fourth national championship);
- be its first win over Clemson since a 28-6 victory on Nov. 15, 2014, snapping a four-game losing streak to the Tigers;
- be its first win at Clemson since a 21-17 victory on Oct. 18, 2008, snapping a five-game losing streak at Memorial Stadium;
- up it to 51-31-2 all-time versus Clemson;
- up it to 89-34-4 all-time in season openers;
- up it to 5-2 all-time when opening the season with an ACC game;
- up it to 7-1 all-time when opening the season versus Clemson.

A GEORGIA TECH LOSS WOULD ...

- drop it to 0-1 overall and 0-1 in ACC play;
- drop it to 2-9-1 all-time when playing the nation's No. 1 ranked team;
- be its fifth-straight loss to Clemson and sixth-straight loss at Clemson;
- drop it to 4-3 all-time when opening the season with an ACC game;
- be its first loss to Clemson in a season opener since 1903.

GEORGIA TECH'S 20TH HEAD COACH — GEOFF COLLINS

Geoff Collins, an Atlanta area native and one of college football's most successful and innovative coaches, was named the 20th football head coach in Georgia Tech history on Dec. 7, 2018.

Born in Decatur, Ga. and raised in Conyers, Ga., Collins took the reins at Georgia Tech after serving as the head coach at Temple University in 2017 and 2018. At Temple, he put together the most successful first two seasons by a head coach in the school's 121-year football history.

Collins compiled 15 wins and led Temple to two bowl games in his two seasons with the Owls, which are both school records for a coach in his first two campaigns at TU.

In his first season at Temple, Collins led the Owls a 28-3 win over Florida International in the 2017 Gasparilla Bowl, which was good for only the third bowl victory in school history and its first since 2011.

He coached the Owls to an 8-4 record and 7-1 mark in the American Athletic Conference in 2018, with Temple's only conference defeat coming at No. 8-ranked and undefeated UCF. The 8-4 campaign earned Temple a berth in the Independence Bowl.

Prior to becoming head coach at Temple, Collins was one of the nation's most respected defensive coordinators, serving in the role at Florida (2015-16), Mississippi State (2013-14, co-DC: 2011-12), FIU (2010) and his alma mater, Western Carolina (2002-05).

Highlights of his career as a coordinator included ranking among the nation's top 10 in total defense in each of his two seasons at Florida (No. 8 in 2015 and No. 5 in 2016), ranking among the top 25 nationally in total defense (18th - 2013) and scoring defense (23rd - 2014) during his two seasons calling plays at Mississippi State and leading the Sun Belt Conference in total defense, scoring defense and turnover margin in his lone campaign at FIU (2010).

He is the only coach to ever be nominated for the Broyles Award, given to college football's top assistant coach, at three different schools (FIU – 2010, Mississippi State – 2014 and Florida – 2015).

Collins' 26-year career also includes a pair of prior stints at Georgia Tech. He first came to The Flats as a graduate assistant (1999-2000), then tight ends coach (2001) under head coach George O'Leary from 1999-2001, followed by a year as director of player personnel under head coach Chan Gailey in 2006.

During his initial three seasons at Georgia Tech under O'Leary, the Yellow Jackets were 25-12 with three consecutive bowl appearances. As the Jackets' director of player personnel in 2006, Collins led the efforts to land a recruiting class that included Derrick Morgan (all-American, first-round NFL Draft pick), Morgan Burnett (all-American, third-round NFL Draft pick), Joshua Nesbitt (quarterbacked GT to two ACC Championship Games) and Jonathan Dwyer (the sixth-leading rusher in GT history).

Collins' coaching career also includes stops at Western Carolina (student assistant – 1993-94), Franklin (N.C.) H.S. (assistant coach – 1995), Fordham (linebackers coach – 1996), Albright (defensive coordinator – 1997-98), Alabama (director of player personnel – 2007) and UCF (linebackers coach/recruiting coordinator – 2008-09).

In all, Collins has recruited and/or coached more than three dozen players that have gone on to play in the National Football League. Among Collins' pupils in the NFL are Philadelphia Eagles All-Pro defensive tackle Fletcher Cox (a consensus All-American at Mississippi State and No. 12 overall pick in the 2012 NFL Draft), Tampa Bay Buccaneers cornerback Vernon Hargreaves (a consensus All-American at Florida and No. 11 overall pick in the 2016 NFL Draft), Atlanta Falcons safety Keanu Neal (the No. 17 overall pick in the 2016 NFL Draft) and Indianapolis Colts cornerback Rock Ya-Sin (who earned first-team all-American Athletic Conference honors at Temple after transferring from Presbyterian College and went on to be selected in the second round of the 2019 NFL Draft).

In addition to being renowned as a coach, strategist and evaluator, Collins is also widely recognized as the nation's top head coach when it comes to branding his football program, particularly when it comes to utilizing social media in branding and recruiting efforts. His expertise in marketing and branding has led to him being a guest lecturer for Georgia Tech's Scheller College of Business executive MBA program and a featured speaker at the 2019 Hashtag Sports conference in New York City.

His innovations in utilizing social media to aid in recruiting efforts not only helped Georgia Tech land the highest-rated recruiting class in program history in 2006-07, but also helped Alabama sign the No. 1 class in the nation in 2007-08. Alabama's 2008 signing class included running back Mark Ingram, who went on to become the first Heisman Trophy winner in Crimson Tide history in 2009.

As a student-athlete, Collins totaled 194 career tackles as an outside linebacker and defensive back at Western Carolina (1989-92). He had 68 tackles and six tackles for loss as a junior and helped lead WCU to a 7-4 record with 62 stops, including five behind the line of scrimmage, as a senior.

Collins, 48, is married to the former Jennifer Haynes. They have a daughter, Astrid (3).

• After playing their first two games at neutral sites (Augusta, Ga. in 1898, Greenville, S.C. in 1899), the schools' next 41 gridiron matchups between 1902-1973 were all held at Georgia Tech. After playing at Clemson's Memorial Stadium for the first time in 1974, the next three matchups were all played at Georgia Tech (1975-77) before the teams started alternating home and away games when Georgia Tech began ACC play in 1983.

• In 36 matchups since the Yellow Jackets joined the Tigers in the ACC in 1983, Clemson officially holds a slim 20-16 advantage*.

• This year's matchup marks the eighth time overall but the first time since 1962 that Georgia Tech opens its season against Clemson.

• After losing to Clemson, 73-0, in its 1903 season opener, Georgia Tech has won each of the last six times that it has opened the season against the Tigers. Tech has outscored Clemson by a combined 188-32 in those six games.

GEORGIA TECH vs. NO. 1

• Georgia Tech is playing the nation's No. 1-ranked team for the 12th time in school history but the first time in 20 years.

• The Yellow Jackets have not faced off against the No. 1 team in the *Associated Press* top 25 poll since Nov. 11, 1999, a 41-35 loss at top-ranked Florida State.

• Georgia Tech is 2-8-1 all-time against top-ranked teams.

• The Jackets' last win over the No. 1 team in the nation was a thrilling 41-38 triumph at top-ranked Virginia on Nov. 3, 1990. That victory, which was capped by Scott Sisson's 37-yard game-winning field goal with seven seconds remaining, was the signature regular-season win of Tech's 11-0-1 campaign, which culminated with a 45-21 triumph over Nebraska in the Florida Citrus Bowl that secured Georgia Tech's fourth national championship.

OFFENSE

• The most noticeable change for the majority of observers as **Geoff Collins** takes the reins at Georgia Tech is the transition from the option-based offense that the Yellow Jackets ran under former head coach Paul Johnson for the past 11 seasons to a spread, pro-style offense.

• Leading the transition to Georgia Tech's spread, pro-style offense is offensive coordinator/quarterbacks coach **Dave Patenaude**.

• Patenaude also served as the offensive coordinator and quarterbacks coach under Collins the past two seasons at Temple.

• With Patenaude at the helm of Temple's offense the past two seasons, the Owls amassed two of the three highest single-season passing totals in school history (3,273 yards in 2017, 3,297 yards in 2018).

QUARTERBACKS

• At Georgia Tech, Collins and Patenaude inherited one of the least-experienced corps of passing quarterbacks in all of college football, as the three returners at the position on Tech's roster — sophomores Lucas Johnson and Tobias Oliver and redshirt freshman James Graham — have combined to throw just 17 passes during their collegiate careers.

• Georgia Tech's 17 combined pass attempts among the quarterbacks on its roster are the sixth-fewest in the nation heading into the 2019 season.

• Oliver boasts the most game experience of Georgia Tech's signal-callers, as he appeared in 12 games and made one start as a redshirt freshman in 2018.

• Despite only making one start, Oliver ranked second on the team, 10th in the ACC and 75th nationally with 876 rushing yards (73.0 per game) in 2018.

• His 876 rushing yards were good for the sixth-highest rushing total by a quarterback in Georgia Tech history.

• Oliver also led Georgia Tech, ranked fourth in the ACC and 34th nationally with 12 rushing touchdowns last season.

• His 12 touchdown runs were the fifth-most by a QB and tied for the 10th-most overall in a single-season in Georgia Tech history.

• Additionally, Oliver led the team, ranked fifth in the ACC and 43rd nationally (min. 10 carries per game) with a 5.76 yards-per-rush average last year.

• Georgia Tech returns seven student-athletes that played running back a season ago and combined for 1,675 rushing yards and 16 touchdowns in 2018.

• Headlining the returners are a pair of 2019 Doak Walker Award candidates in sophomore **Jordan Mason** (659 rushing yards, seven touchdowns in 2018) and junior **Jerry Howard Jr.** (564 rushing yards and five touchdowns in 2018).

• Georgia Tech is one of only eight teams nationally with multiple student-athletes among the 71 running backs on the official 2019 Doak Walker Award watch list (joining Arkansas, Duke, Louisiana-Lafayette, Minnesota, Notre Dame, Oregon and Tulsa).

TIGHT ENDS

• Georgia Tech's game experience at wide receiver looks deep compared to the tight end position.

• The Yellow Jackets are reintroducing the tight end position to their offense for the first time since 2007, as former head coach Paul Johnson's double-slot option-based offense did not utilize tight ends.

• The only tight end on Georgia Tech's roster with any collegiate game experience at the position is **Tyler Davis**, a graduate transfer from UConn.

• Davis, a converted quarterback, caught 47 passes for 500 yards and seven touchdowns in three seasons at UConn, including 22 receptions for 237 yards and six scores in 2018.

• Davis is on the official watch list for the 2019 Mackey Award, presented annually to college football's top tight end.

OFFENSIVE LINE

• Albeit in a wildly different offensive scheme, Georgia Tech does return a total of five offensive linemen that have starting experience at the collegiate level in 2019.

DEFENSE

• Dubbed the "Minister of Mayhem," Georgia Tech head coach Geoff Collins has been known for putting together some of college football's top defenses over the past eight seasons — first as defensive coordinator at Mississippi State (2011-14) and Florida (2015-16), then as head coach at Temple (2017-18).

- Over the past eight seasons, Collins' defenses have:
 - ranked in top 20 nationally in total defense three times (twice in top 8)
 - ranked in top 25 in scoring defense four times (twice in top 12)
 - ranked in top 30 in passing defense five times (twice in top 13)
 - ranked in top 45 in pass efficiency defense seven times (four times in top 22)
 - ranked in top 35 in turnovers gained five times (twice in top 6)
 - ranked in top 15 in interceptions four times (twice in top 10)
 - ranked in top 25 in sacks four times (twice in top 15)

• Georgia Tech returns just three starters from last season's defense — junior linebacker **David Curry**, junior safety **Tariq Carpenter** and sophomore cornerback **Tre Swilling**.

• Georgia Tech tied for first in the ACC and 11th nationally with three defensive touchdowns last season (**David Curry** fumble return vs. Alcorn State - Sept. 1; Anree Saint-Amour interception return vs. Bowling Green - Sept. 29; **Juanyeh Thomas** interception return vs. Louisville - Oct. 5).

• Although not officially a returning starter, linebacker **Charlie Thomas** saw extensive playing time as a true freshman in 2018, including six starts.

• Thomas' three fumble recoveries last season were the most by a Yellow Jacket since Quayshawn Nealy in 2014 (3).

• Thomas became only the third Yellow Jacket in the past decade with as many as three fumble recoveries in a season (Jerrard Terrant — 3, 2010; Nealy — 3, 2014).

• Thomas tied a single-game school record by recovering two fumbles in the Yellow Jackets' 66-31 win at Louisville on Oct. 5 of last season (both of which led to Georgia Tech touchdowns). He is the 18th Yellow Jacket to recover two fumbles in a game.

• In honor of teammate **Brandon Adams**, a would-be senior defensive lineman who died on March 23, Georgia Tech head coach **Geoff Collins** has announced that a different Yellow Jacket will wear Adams' jersey number 90 for each game this season.

• Wearing No. 90 for the season opener versus Clemson will be junior DL **Chris Martin**. Martin, who normally wears No. 96, was Adams' best friend on the team and has dedicated the rest of his football playing career in Adams' memory.

SPECIALISTS

• Two of Georgia Tech's three postseason honorees in 2018 earned the recognition on special teams — So. P **Pressley Harvin III** and Fr. KR **Juanyeh Thomas**.

• Harvin was named second-team all-ACC while Thomas was named a true freshman all-American by *247Sports*.

• One of the nation's least-utilized weapons a season ago, Harvin would've led the ACC and ranked 16th nationally through the 2018 regular season with a 44.3-yard punting average (*he did not qualify for official NCAA/ACC statistical rankings because he fell far short of the minimum 3.6 attempts per game*).

• Harvin III's season average fell to 41.3 yards per punt after he uncharacteristically punted four times for 75 yards (18.8 avg.) in the Quick Lane Bowl vs. Minnesota.

• Harvin III averaged a whopping 47.7 yards per punt in six home games but just 34.6 yards per punt in six games away from home in 2018.

• As a true freshman in 2017, Harvin III set a Georgia Tech freshman record by averaging 44.1 yards per punt.

• Thomas earned true freshman all-America recognition in 2018 on the strength of returning two kickoffs for touchdowns this season, with both coming in the final two games of the regular season — a 77-yard return vs. Virginia (Nov. 17) and a 100-yarder at No. 5 Georgia (Nov. 24).

• With his two kickoff returns for touchdowns last season, Thomas set or matched five school records.

JUANYEH THOMAS SCHOOL RECORDS

1) His 100-yard kickoff return vs. Georgia is tied for the longest in school history. Thomas became the fourth Yellow Jacket to achieve the feat, joining Drew Hill (vs. Georgia, 1978) Dez White (vs. Maryland, 1998) and Jamal Golden (vs. North Carolina, 2012).

2) He is the third player in school history with two kickoff returns for touchdowns in a single season, joining Hill (1978) and Golden (2012).

3) He is the first Georgia Tech freshman with two kickoff returns for touchdowns and one of only two Tech freshmen with even one kickoff return for a TD (joining White, 1997).

4) He is the fifth player in school history with two kickoff returns for touchdowns in a career, joining Hill (1975-78), Gary Lee (1983-86), White (1997-99) and Golden (2011-15).

5) He is the only player in school history to return kickoffs for touchdowns in consecutive games.

• Sophomore place kicker **Wesley Wells** made all 48 of his attempts as a true freshman last season — 9-of-9 field goals and 38-of-38 PATs.

• Wells took over the place-kicking duties last season after winning an in-practice competition for the job in the week leading up to the fifth game of the season vs. Bowling Green.

• Wells made four field goals (28, 28, 48 and 40 yards) in Georgia Tech's 30-27 overtime win against Virginia on Nov. 17 of last season), becoming the eighth individual and first true freshman in Georgia Tech history to make four field goals in a single game.
