ABOUT THIS GAME

- The winner of today's game will add a point to their department's standings in the Certified SC Grown Palmetto Series competition, which is currently tied 3-3. South Carolina women's basketball has won its point all four years of the Palmetto Series.
- Clemson leads the all-time series in women's basketball 33-31, but the Gamecocks have won the last nine meetings and are 9-2 against the Tigers in the Dawn Staley era.
- Last season's meeting was the tightest of the Gamecocks' Staley-era victories, a 69-57 decision at Colonial Life Arena on Nov. 15, 2018.

GAMECOCK NOTABLES

- The Gamecock offense has exploded in the last two weeks, averaging 93.0 points on 53.7 percent field goal shooting. Much of that uptick is due to better outside shooting. South Carolina has shot at least 50.0 percent from 3-point range in each of the last three games, including a sterling 12-of-23 from beyond the arc against USC Upstate (Nov. 21).
- Better offensive flow has led to an increase in assists as well. On the season, the Gamecocks are 11th in the nation with 20.8 assists per game and have assisted on 63.4 percent of their
- made field goals.
- South Carolina's interior has been dominant on both sides of the ball. Defensively, the Gamecocks lead the country in blocks per game (12.0). On the other side, South Carolina averages 45.6 points per game in the paint, accounting for 51.2 percent of their offense.
- The Gamecocks' returning SEC All-Freshman Team selections Destanni Henderson and Victaria Saxton hit their stride in the second week of the season. The duo has combined to average 24.3 points over the last two games, shooting a collective 61.4 percent from the field.
- Senior Tyasha Harris has scored in double figures in four of the team's five games this season and has been especially efficient in the last two - 14.5 ppg on 57.9 percent shooting, including 5-of-8 from 3-point range. The surge did not affect her assist numbers – 5.0 apg. Freshman Aliyah Boston is the team's top scorer and the only Gamecock to reach double figures in all five games. In the last three games, she has shot 19-of-21 (.905) from the field.
- Senior Mikiah Herbert Harrigan has been all hustle over the last two games, averaging 17.0 points, 6.0 rebounds and 3.0 blocks. She also added four assists and three steals to the team effort while shooting 15-of-26 (.577) from the field during the stretch.

Six Gamecocks have scored in double figures in three of the team's five games this season. 10 Gamecocks have reached double figures at

least once this season.

The Gamecocks are among the nation's top 10 in seven different stats, including scoring (8th), scoring margin (5th), FG% defense (2nd), 3FG% (8th), RPG (8th).

South Carolina has shot 47.3 percent (18-of-38) from 3-point range over the last two games.

Five-Second Count

South Carolina women's basketball is in the midst of its most successful era, claiming at least 20 wins for the last eight seasons. The Gamecocks have played in the NCAA Elite Eight three times in the last four seasons, including winning the 2017 National Championship, and have been ranked in the AP Top 25 for 134 consecutive weeks, the fourth-longest active streak in the nation. Staley has led the Gamecocks to four SEC regular-season titles and four straight SEC Tournament Championships, making South Carolina the first program to win four consecutive tournament crowns in league history.

Under Staley's leadership, five Gamecocks have earned All-America status, two have earned SEC Player of the Year honors and 15 have picked up All-SEC recognition. Six Gamecocks have been selected in the WNBA Draft in the last four years, including 2018 No. 1 overall pick A'ja Wilson, who went onto become the Gamecocks' second-straight WNBA Rookie of the Year.

Clemson Series Notes

Clemson leads the all-time series 33-31, but South Carolina has won the last nine meetings and has claimed 12 of the last 14. After the Tigers claimed the first two games of the Gamecocks' Staley era, South Carolina opened its nine-game win streak with a 73-59 victory in Columbia on Nov. 18, 2010.

The Gamecocks won the most recent meeting 69-57 on Nov. 15, 2018, as Clemson had then-No. 10 South Carolina on the ropes late after holding the Gamecocks to just eight points in the third quarter to help erase a 16-point halftime deficit. After getting as close as four early in the fourth quarter, the Tigers saw the Gamecocks power the ball inside to Alexis Jennings and then-freshman Victaria Saxton to get back to a doubledigit lead with 2:25 to play. The Gamecocks salted away the game at the free throw line, including two each from Tyasha Harris and Mikiah Herbert Harrigan.

The Gamecocks' last trip to Clemson was a 66-36 victory on Nov. 16, 2017, after a dominant defensive first half yielded just 11 points to the Tigers.

The Gamecocks' pair of seniors, Harris and Herbert

Harrigan, have not been dominant in the Palmetto Series victories, although Harris averages 3.3 assists against the Tigers and Herbert Harrigan has blocked 2.7 shots per game over the series.

Staley's 20th

Celebrating her 20th season as a head coach this season, Dawn Staley has averaged 23.4 wins through her first 19 seasons. With a .718 (450-177) winning percentage in that time, she is 18th among active NCAA Div. I head coaches with at least 10 years of experience.

In her 12th season at South Carolina, she is the program's all-time winningest coach (278) with a program-record nine postseason appearances (8 NCAA/ 1 WNIT). She accounts for both of the Gamecocks' Final Four appearances (2015, 2017) and the first national championship in program history.

Staley has won 122 SEC games to rank second among active league coaches and eighth all-time. Her 11.1 SEC wins per season is the best all-time among coaches with at least 10 seasons in the league, and her .701 winning percentage is second only to Tennessee's Pat Summitt in league history.

Ranking Review

The Gamecocks are ranked No. 5 in this week's AP Poll, their highest ranking since coming in at No. 4 on Jan. 1, 2018.

South Carolina has appeared in the AP Poll for 134 consecutive weeks, the fourth-longest active streak in the nation. Under Staley, the Gamecocks have appeared in 139 AP polls, highlighted by 94 in the top 10, including 64 in the top five and 12 at No. 1.

The Gamecocks are No. 6 in this week's USA Today/ WBCA Poll.

Schedule Strength

The Gamecocks' schedule includes 10 games against teams ranked in at least one of this week's polls.

Four of the top-25 opponents are non-conference games, which began at #4/5 Maryland (Nov. 10). At the

Paradise Jam, South Carolina will open and close against ranked opponents – #18/25 Indiana (Nov. 28) and #2/2 Baylor (Nov. 30). #4/4 UConn comes to Colonial Life Arena in February to round out the non-conference ranked opponents.

Five SEC teams were ranked this week with South Carolina set to open league play against #13/14 Kentucky (Jan. 2). #6/6 Texas A&M, #10/8 Mississippi State, #20/18 Arkansas and #23/- Tennessee all visit Colonial Life Arena this season as well.

Ranked Readings

South Carolina is 64-60 against nationally ranked opponents under head coach Dawn Staley, although that record is skewed by the early seasons of her tenure. The Gamecocks are 49-21 versus ranked foes since the start of the 2014-15 campaign, including a 19-16 mark against top-10 opponents during that time.

Preseason Props

Three Gamecocks have collected preseason honors from league and national affiliations.

Tyasha Harris has been named to all three national player of the year watch lists – Naismith, Wade, Wooden – in addition to the Nancy Lieberman Award watch list. She was also a Preseason All-SEC First Team selection by both the league's coaches and media.

Mikiah Herbert Harrigan was a Preseason All-SEC Second Team choice by the league's coaches and media.

Freshman Aliyah Boston captured a spot on the Lisa Leslie Award watch list, the second Gamecock to be on the list in the award's three seasons.

SEC Status

SEC coaches and media were split on who will win the 2020 SEC regular season, but the agree that the Gamecocks will be in the mix.

SEC media members selected the Gamecocks to return to the throne ahead of Texas A&M and Mississippi State. SEC coaches reversed the top two positions. Both groups tapped Tyasha Harris for First-Team All-SEC and Mikiah Herbert Harrigan for a spot on the All-SEC Second Team.

Oh Captain, My Captain

South Carolina named two team captains this season – Tyasha Harris and Victaria Saxton. This is Harris' third season as a team captain.

Veteran Vibes

Coaches

While the No. 1 freshman class is the new, shiny part of the Gamecocks' program, the two seniors at the top of the experience ladder have impressive credentials of their own, including a glut of big-game experience.

Tyasha Harris and Mikiah Herbert Harrigan were part of the Gamecocks' 2017 NCAA National Championship and have led teams that have never been ranked outside the top 25, including all three seasons with a final ranking in the top 16.

The duo was part of two of the Gamecocks' four straight SEC Tournament titles, They opened their careers with an SEC regular-season crown and have

never finished lower than second in the league.

In the Gamecocks' first "big game" of the season, at #4/5 Maryland, the presence of those two seniors on the floor was clearly calming with double-digit plus-minus ratings in the game for both. And, when it came time to win, the duo accounted for the team's final seven points after the Terrapins cut the margin to eight with 2:10 left to play.

Block Party

The Gamecocks have been busy in the paint on the defensive end as well, blocking 12.0 shots per game to lead the nation. Baylor is a distant second at 8.4 per game.

South Carolina opened the season by tying the school record for blocked shots in a game (16 vs. Alabama State, Nov. 5) then broke that record three games later with 17 against Appalachian State (Nov. 17).

The Gamecocks' top shot blocker, Aliyah Boston, leads the nation with 23 blocks. That number would rank her 27th in the TEAM standings this season.

Boston is not alone in her swat status, though. Eight of the 11 active Gamecocks have blocked at least one shot this season.

Senior Mikiah Herbert Harrigan continues her prowess in the category, ranking fourth in the league and 20th in the NCAA with her 2.6 average. Sophomore Victaria Saxton's 1.8 blocks per game are just outside the league's top 10.

Paint Ball

While the Gamecocks did take a preseason teambonding trip to play traditional paint ball, now that the season has started, they're in more of a basketball mind about paint now. And that doesn't just mean the frontcourt.

Through five games, South Carolina has scored 45.6 of its 89.0 points per game in the paint, which equates to 51.2 percent of the offense and 69.5 percent of made field goals.

The Gamecocks' aggressive guard lineup accounts for 43.0 percent of those paint field goals (19.6 points per game), compared to 57.0 percent of paint field goals from the forwards (26.0 ppg).

Sixth Woman

The high-octane Gamecock offense has been fueled by selflessness. Three of South Carolina's five games

have seen six Gamecocks score in double figures. That number already ties the 2014-15 season for the most by South Carolina in the Dawn Staley era.

Free for All

Yet again, South Carolina is among the nation's best at getting to the free throw line, and it is a full team effort.

The Gamecocks are 17th in the country with 124 free throw attempts and 14th in free throws made (86). While no Gamecock ranks individually among the top 50 in the nation in free throws made or attempted, five Gamecocks have double-figure attempts, led by Brea Beal's 22 trips to the line. Zia Cooke has made a teamhigh 15 free throws this season.

Hitting 1,000

Senior point guard Tyasha Harris scored her 1,000th career point in the third quarter against USC Upstate (Nov. 21) in her highest scoring game of the season to date. The Noblesville, Ind., became just the fourth Gamecock all-time to post both 1,000 points and 500 assists in her career. Only two Gamecocks have scored 1,000 points and handed out 600 assists, which is a mark that Harris could reach later this season.

Senior forward Mikiah Herbert Harrigan also has a chance to reach the classic basketball benchmark. She is currently at 824 career points. Only five Gamecocks have ever posted at least 1,000 points and 100 blocks in their careers.

Freshman Phenoms

Three of South Carolina's freshmen have already hit notable marks this season, living up to their billing as part of the best signing class in recent college women's basketball history.

The headline of the trio's early-season exploits is Aliyah Boston's season-opening triple-double – the first in a college debut in NCAA Div. I women's basketball history. It was just the seventh triple-double in Gamecock history and the first by a freshman.

Two games later, Brea Beal and Zia Cooke joined Boston with elite Gamecock freshman outings.

Cooke poured in 27 points at Dayton (Nov. 13), the most by a Gamecock freshman since Kelsey Bone scored 27 against North Carolina on Dec. 20, 2009. It was the first 20-point freshman outing since Bianca Jackson netted 20 against UConn on Feb. 1, 2018. Cooke's scoring included five 3-pointers, the most by a Gamecock freshman since Tina Roy hit five against Presbyterian on Nov. 27, 2011.

Beal followed up her 10-rebound performance at #4/5 Maryland (Nov. 10) with another 10 rebounds at Dayton (Nov. 13), becoming the first Gamecock freshman with back-to-back double-digit rebounding games since A'ja Wilson pulled down 10 against Liberty (Dec. 21, 2014), 10 against Auburn (Jan. 2, 2015) and 13 at LSU (Jan. 4, 2015).

Milestone March

Seniors Tyasha Harris and Mikiah Herbert Harrigan are moving quickly up several career charts in their final season with the Garnet and Black.

Harris is fourth in the program's all-time career assists chart. With 138 so far, she is five behind Martha Parker (1986-89) in third place. The program record of 615 is held by Cristina Ciocan (2001-04).

As a regular starter each of the last three seasons, Harris could make the top-10 of four other lists – steals, minutes played, games played and games started – by the end of the season.

Mikiah Herbert Harrigan has 165 career blocks, which is fourth in program history. She is 12 away from Lakesha Tolliver's (2004-07) 177 in third place.

Historic Boston

Freshman forward Aliyah Boston opened her college career with a bang, recording an historic triple-double against Alabama State (Nov. 5).

GAMES LED TEAM IN

Woman Up!

South Carolina head coach Dawn Staley picked "Woman Up!" as this season's theme to recognize how inspired her team is to work hard toward its goals and how they inspire her, each other and the community at large to pursue something greater.

The theme reminds the team to compete relentlessly, stay disciplined to it goals and lift each other up as they pursue their dreams.

As always, Staley invites fans of the program to do the same in their lives and in their support of the team – commit to your goals, support others and dream big.

To launch the theme, each Gamecock told her Woman Up! story for a video series. Visit GamecocksOnline.com/WomanUp to watch all 13 short videos in the series.

It marked the first triple-double in a college debut in NCAA Div. I women's basketball history. Prior to Boston's mark, the last NCAA Div. I freshman to post a triple-double was Nebraska's Kate Cain against Florida Atlantic on Dec. 19, 2017.

It was just the seventh triple-double in South Carolina history, and the first by a freshman. That last Gamecock triple-double was by then-junior Alaina Coates, who posted 29 points, 16 rebounds and 10 blocks against Winthrop on Dec. 13, 2015.

Boston's 10 blocks tied Coates' school record.

The Gamecocks' five freshmen – Laeticia Amihere, Brea Bea, Aliyah Boston, Zia Cooke and Olivia Thompson – make up the No. 1 recruiting class in the nation, which includes four of the top 11 signees in the Class of 2019.

weight room and on the court, all five have come to the program eager to learn and thrive.

U-S-A, U-S-A

Since the arrival of Staley in the 2008-09 season, South Carolina has solidified its relationship with USA Basketball. At least one Gamecock has donned the red, white and blue in each of the last six summers, and the group of nine Gamecocks, including four on the current roster, has helped 13 U.S. teams to gold medals, three more to silver and another to bronze.

The participation streak is guaranteed to continue through 2020 as Staley was named Senior National Team Head Coach through the Tokyo Olympics. The Gamecocks' head coach led the U.S. to gold in the 2018 FIBA World Cup and earned her second USA Basketball National Coach of the Year award for the effort.

Junior Tyasha Harris is responsible for one of those gold medals (2016 FIBA U18 Americas Cup) as well as two silvers (2019 Pan Am Games, 2017 FIBA U19 World Cup). The point guard also trained with Staley's National Team when it was in Columbia for training camp prior to the 2018 FIBA World Cup.

Aliyah Boston and Zia Cooke were part of two goldmedal winning teams - 2018 FIBA U17 World Cup, 2017 FIBA U16 Americas Cup. Boston also picked up gold in the 2018 Youth Olympics 3x3 and the 2019 FIBA U19 World Cup.

Great Gamecock Fans

After winning the title for the last four seasons, South Carolina continues to lead the nation in average attendance this season with 10,379 and is the only program drawing 10,000+ fans per game.

This season's home games are the top three attended games in the country so far. The Gamecocks have drawn at least 10,000 fans in 70 straight regular-season home games.

South Carolina's last regular-season game with fewer than 10,000 in attendance was on Dec. 14, 2014, when 9,605 were on-hand to see the Gamecocks defeat Savannah State. The last game at Colonial Life Arena with an attendance below 10,000 was in the 2017 NCAA Tournament when the Gamecocks' second-round game against Arizona State drew 8,276, making the overall streak of 10,000 or more fans 34 games.

One More Ty-me

Senior Tyasha Harris has been among the top point guards in the nation over the last few seasons as her assist average and assist-to-turnover numbers have been routinely among the best in the country. She entered her senior season on the watch list of all three national player of the year awards as well as the Nancy Lieberman Award Watch List, which recognizes the top point guard in the country.

This season, the 5-foot-10 guard leads the SEC with 5.0 assists per game and is scoring a career-best 11.4 points per outing. For the second straight season, Harris has her hands on at least 25.0 percent of the Gamecocks' offense between her assists and points as her assist have led to 11.4 points per game. Combined with her scoring average, she touches 22.8 points of the Gamecocks' 89.0 points per game.

Since the start of her sophomore season, she has handed out 5.7 assists per game with a 2.6 assist-toturnover ratio. In that time, she has also averaged 10.7 points per game.

Harris is far and away the SEC's active leader in career assists (538). She is also the active career steals leader (176) and is fifth in scoring (1001).

H2-O (And D)

Senior forward Mikiah Herbert Harrigan has long been a shot-blocking menace to opponents, and she unleashed a lethal offensive game last season that will continue to grow in her final college season.

To open her senior season, Herbert Harrigan has scored 13.0 points per game - second on the team - on 51.0 percent shooting to go with 5.4 rebounds and 2.6 blocks per game, which is 20th in the nation.

Fourth in program history in career blocked shots (165), she is second among active SEC players in that category as well.

Offensively, Herbert Harrigan had a breakout season as a junior, shooting 46.3 percent from the field with an ultra-reliable mid-range game that gave opposing post players fits when paired with her ability to get to the rim. She averaged 10.4 points per game, scoring in double figures 17 times, including nine of the team's 12 games against ranked foes.

LG - LeLe the Guard

While players have often been described as "a forward with guard skills," junior LeLe Grissett is out to prove

she's a guard with forward skills. After showing flashes of being an active, agile forward for the last two season, the 6-foot-2 Grissett lobbied Staley for time at the guard position this season. Early returns are that the move could be a difference-maker for the Gamecocks.

So far this season, Grissett applied her typical forward skills – offensive efficiency and rebounding – to her new guard role with big results.

The 6-foot-2 Grissett's 5.2 rebounds per game have come primarily on the offensive glass where her 3.0 offensive rebounding average is second on the team and ranks 11th in the SEC.

Offensively, Grissett burst into the season with 6-of-7 shooting over the first two games and averages 5.0 points on 52.6 percent shooting on the season.

Henny-thing Goes

Sophomore guard Destanni Henderson is a dynamic athlete whose versatile offensive game makes her a weapon at any spot on the floor. The SEC All-Freshman Team selection scored in double figures eight times last season, including six SEC games, and handed out four or more assists three times in those eight games.

This season, Henderson has seen her minutes explode to 24.6 per game (from 15.6 last season). She continues to develop in her command of the team from the point guard spot, averaging 3.0 assists with 2.2 steals per game.

Her shooting has come alive in the last two games, lifting her to 9.6 points per game on 47.2 percent shooting, including 9-of-14 (.643) from 3-point range.

After a 16-point outing against Appalachian State (Nov. 17) – her highest scoring game since netting 18 at Florida on Feb. 17, 2019) – Henderson averages 8.3 points on 42.9 percent shooting, including 4-of-8 from 3-point range.

Saxton SZN

Coming off an SEC All-Freshman season, sophomore forward Victaria Saxton has added great experience to her constant energy in the post. The 6-foot-2 rebounder had a solid stretch of eight games late in league play last season to put herself on opposing coaches' radar.

Saxton got her sophomore season rolling in week two and has scored in double figures in three straight games (13 at Dayton, Nov. 13; 10 vs. Appalachian State, Nov. 17; 14 vs. USC Upstate, Nov. 21) on 71.4 percent shooting (15-of-21). Her defense was sharp in the stretch as well, blocking eight shots over the threegame stretch to move into 11th place in the SEC with 1.8 blocks per game.

LA Style

Redshirt-freshman forward Laeticia Amihere was the No. 10 recruit in the 2019 class and has been in full practice for much of the preseason following her Fall 2018 injury. Her length and agility will prove to be a problem for opponents whenever she is on the court.

The 6-foot-3 forward is part of the Canadian National Team as well. She missed the Appalachian State (Nov. 17) game with the Gamecocks to be with her national team for the FIBA Women's Olympic Pre-Qualifying Americas Tournament in Edmonton (Nov. 14-17).

Looks Like a Brea-ze

Freshman guard Brea Beal was the No. 11 player in the 2019 class, and her upside is even higher than that. Already drawing comparisons to former Gamecock and 2017 WNBA Rookie of the Year Allisha Gray, Beal has the ability to play and create mismatches at positions 1-4 on the court.

While she is still finding in her field goal shooting range, Beal has been a steady contributor in other ways with "Gray-like" competitiveness and versatility.

Beal is second on the team in rebounding with 7.4 per game to rank 14th in the SEC. Her back-to-back 10-rebounding outings at #4/5 Maryland and Dayton were the first by a freshman since A'ja Wilson (2014-15).

Offensively, Beal is second on the team in assists with 3.0 per game and third in the SEC with a 3.0 assist-to-turnover ratio.

From A to B

The No. 3 player in the 2019 class, freshman forward Aliyah Boston brings a dominant physical presence back to the Gamecock frontcourt. The 6-foot-5 Virgin Islands native thrives on contact and has been a handful for opposing frontlines right away.

Boston wasted little time serving notice to the SEC and the country with her opening-week performances that yielded 13.0 points, 9.5 rebounds and 7.5 blocks per game. The effort landed her SEC Freshman of the Week honors on Nov. 12.

Through five games, she is among the SEC's top 20 in five categories -17th in scoring (13.8 ppg), 10th in rebounding (8.2), third in field goal percentage (.718), first in blocked shots (4.6) and fifth in offensive rebounds (3.8).

Boston's blocked shots total (23) is best in the country, and her blocked shots average is third. Her 71.8 percent field goal shooting is 12th in the country.

In the season opener, Boston delivered the first tripledouble in a college debut in NCAA Div. I women's

basketball history. The 12-point, 12-rebound, 10-block effort came in just 21 minutes on the court for the seventh triple-double in Gamecock history and the first by a freshman.

On the bigger stage at #4/5 Maryland, Boston was undaunted, establishing the Gamecocks' paint presence on both sides of the ball early with eight of the team's first 10 points and five first-half blocks.

Cooke Charisma

Freshman guard Zia Cooke was the No. 4 entry in the 2019 class and spent her final high school season putting together highlight reels that made her a finalist for Naismith High School Player of the Year and wowed fans on social media. Under Staley, she is dialing in her point guard leadership, meshing it with her scorer's mentality and overall becoming a threat on both sides of the ball.

Her offensive game is as dynamic and athletic as advertised, and she is 20th in the SEC in scoring with 13.0 points per game. She has scored in double figures in three of five games this season, headlined by 27 points in a return to her homestate at Dayton (Nov. 13). It was the most points by a Gamecock freshman since Kelsey Bone's 27 against North Carolina on Dec. 9, 2009. The effort was fueled by five 3s, the most by a Gamecock freshman since Tina Roy hit five against Presbyterian on Nov. 27, 2011.

Working OT

Freshman Olivia Thompson was not as heralded as her classmates, but she may be the consistent outside shooter the Gamecocks need to create space for everyone else to work. The lifelong Gamecock fan was the SCBCA Player of the Year and joined the team as a walk-on.

The start of her career was a dream scenario as she scored seven points in 38 seconds and finished with 10 points in seven minutes of the season opener against Alabama State (Nov. 5).

Dawn Staley

Head Coach 12th Season at South Carolina Virginia, 1992



Catapulting South Carolina into the national spotlight, Dawn Staley has made the Gamecocks a mainstay in the battle for SEC and national championships. In 2017-18, she capped her first decade in Garnet and Black by leading her team to its fourth-straight SEC Tournament title, the first four-peat champion in league history, and celebrating the program's first National Player of the Year and No. 1 WNBA Draft pick in A'ja Wilson. The Gamecocks went on to sign the first No. 1 recruiting class in program history, landing four of the nation's top 13 prospects in the Class of 2019.

- Staley's first 11 seasons at the helm of the Gamecocks include:
- 2017 NCAA National Championship
- 134 consecutive weeks ranked in the AP Top 25, including 64 weeks in the top five
- Seven 25-win seasons, including three 30-win campaigns led by a school-record 34 victories in 2014-15
- Four SEC regular-season championships (2014, 2015, 2016, 2017)
- Four SEC Tournament titles (2015, 2016, 2017, 2018)
- Two top-two recruiting classes (#1 in 2019, #2 in 2014)
- Five NCAA Attendance titles, averaging over 10,000 fans each season (2015, 2016, 2017, 2018, 2019)

While her coaching career is in full bloom, Staley is still recognized for her body of work as a one of the most decorated participants in United States women's basketball history. The Naismith Memorial Basketball Hall of Fame solidified that legacy with her enshrinement as part of the Class of 2013. The Phoenix Club of Philadelphia established the Dawn Staley Award recognizing the nation's top guard in women's Division I basketball in 2013 as well. Staley was inducted into the Women's Basketball Hall of Fame as part of the Class of 2012 and was one of the final nominees for induction to the U.S. Olympic Hall of Fame the same year. In the summer of 2011, the WNBA recognized her as one of the league's "Top 15," honoring the most influential players in the league's history.

At the helm of the Gamecocks over the last 11 seasons, Staley has been named National Coach of the Year (2014, Basketball Times), a Naismith National Coach of the Year Finalist (2014, 2015, 2016), SEC Coach of the Year (2014, Coaches and AP; 2015, Coaches; 2016, Coaches and AP) and BCA Female Coach of the Year (2012). She became the fastest coach to 200 wins in program history, needing just 277 games at South Carolina to reach the plateau.

Under Staley's leadership, five Gamecocks have collected 10 All-America selections, two have picked up five SEC Player of the Year honors, two have earned SEC Defensive Player of the Year recognition a total of three times, one has been the SEC 6th Player of the Year and five were named SEC Freshman of the Year. She has coached 15 Gamecocks to All-SEC honors a combined 29 times, including 12 first-team selections, and six Gamecocks have been selected in the WNBA Draft, including 2018 No. 1 pick A'ja Wilson who went on to earn WNBA Rookie of the Year honors a year after Allisha Gray became the first Gamecocks to capture the honor in 2017. Two other Gamecocks have also earned WNBA All-Rookie honors.

On Staley's watch, the Gamecocks are enjoying the most sustained success in program history. After posting backto-back 25-win seasons in 2011-12 and 2012-13 for the first time in more than 30 years, the 2014-15 team broke the school record with 34 wins. South Carolina won more SEC games than the season before in each of her first seven seasons, culminating in the 2015-16 team recording just the second 16-0 conference record in league history. Staley's 122 SEC wins account for 65.6 percent of the program's total 186 wins over its 27 seasons in the league. She has delivered the only SEC championships in program history, and she has helped the Gamecocks to eight of the program's nine top-four finishes in the SEC.
