

ALL-TIME SERIES

This will be just the first career meeting between Detroit Mercy and Clemson, but the two coaches are well versed in this weekend's foe.

Head coach Mike Davis is 0-3 against Clemson as his first meeting came when he was coaching UAB in the First Four of the NCAA tournament, while the last two came on the road when he was at Texas Southern.

Clemson head coach Brad Brownell is 9-0 all-time against the Titans from his time when he was a member of the Horizon League leading Wright State.

LAST TIME OUT

Sophomore Antoine Davis scored a game-high 28 points and sophomore Boe Nguidjol grabbed a game and career-high nine rebounds as Detroit Mercy dropped an 84-65 decision at North Carolina State in the 2019-20 season opener.

Davis also added six rebounds, four assists and two steals, while Nguidjol had two blocks and scored six points.

Senior Justin Miller added nine points and sophomore Chris Brandon had eight points, three rebounds and two assists.

The Titans shot 40.0 percent from the field and won the battle of the glass, 40-33, while holding NC State to 10-of-29 from the outside with 11 turnovers.

Detroit Mercy was an uncharacteristic 5-of-25 from outside the arc and 12-of-20 at the free-throw line.

TOUGH NON-CONFERENCE SLATE

Get your frequent flyer miles ready as Detroit Mercy has a number of power five schools on the non-conference schedule.

In total, the red, white and blue will play 13 games in the non-conference with nine away from the Motor City, including trips to North Carolina State, Clemson, Wyoming,

Notre Dame, Gonzaga and a two-game tournament in Las Vegas.

The first seven games on the road will see the Titans travel just under 10,000 miles round trip (9,980).

"This is the type of schedule that I like to play, one that I believe will really help prepare us for the Horizon League," said head coach Mike Davis. "We have a lot of big schools on the schedule and that is what I like to do, test our team against big competition."

The home non-conference slate gets underway in December after seven road games in a row to start the season when the Titans host in-state rival Eastern Michigan on Dec. 7.

The opponents were a combined 258-176 (.594) a year ago with six teams earning postseason bids.

114 YEARS OF TITAN BASKETBALL

This season is the 114th year of collegiate basketball at the University of Detroit Mercy - the oldest Division I program in the state - as the Tigers - yes, Tigers as they were called back then - beat Collegiate, 18-7, in the first official Detroit basketball game in 1905.

Until 1919, the U-D teams were known as the Tigers. In the fall of 1919, Detroit Free Press' sportswriter Stan Brink, who was covering football for the paper, thought that a good nickname for the team would be the Titans.

In its 114 years (two years records are missing in 1907-08 and 1908-09), Detroit Mercy is 1,420-1244 (.541) with two regular-season HL Championships (1998, 1999) and three tournament titles (1994, 1999, 2012).

Detroit Mercy has also made six NCAA tournaments (1962, 1977, 1979, 1998, 1999, 2012) and seven NIT appearances (1960, 1961, 1965, 1978, 2001, 2002, 2013).

YEAR ONE FOR DAVIS

The first year of the Mike Davis era saw the Titans post double-digit wins for the first time since going 16-15 in 2015-16. The eight conference wins were also the most since the team went 9-9 in 2015-16 and that was with a team that returned just four players - three who actually saw time in a game - coming into the year.

This season, coach Davis has six returners, including four sophomores who saw plenty of action as freshmen.

AGAINST THE ACC

Detroit Mercy is 20-70 all-time against current teams in the ACC, although most of that is the 12-41 record versus Notre Dame.

The Titans last win against a current ACC school was the Fighting Irish as Detroit Mercy won, 83-59, in the Motor City in 1992.

The season opener at NC State marked the fourth time in the last five years that the Titans have faced an ACC program as they were at Virginia Tech to start the 2017-18 campaign, at Florida State in 2016 and at Florida State in 2015.

BASKETBALL BLOODLINES

MOVE OVER STEPHEN CURRY

Antoine Davis nailed 132, 3-pointers last season to break the NCAA record for most 3-pointers by a freshman, passing Stephen Curry's 122 at Davidson in 2006-07.

His record-breaking triple came at home against IUPUI early in the second half last season and his 132 treys on the year was a Titan freshman record and second in school history, trailing only legendary scorer Rashad Phillips' 136 in 2000-01.

and the games have not even started yet - as the University of Detroit Mercy high-scoring guard was named to the Wooden Award Preseason Top 50 list.

The John R. Wooden Award® presented by Wendy's® is chosen by a preseason poll of national college basketball experts and the list is comprised of 50 student-athletes who are the early front-runners for the most prestigious honors in college basketball, the Wooden Award All American Team™ and Most Outstanding Player Award.

BOE BREAKOUT

Sophomore Boe Nguidjol was one player that head coach Mike Davis has seen marked improvement and the season opener at NC State showed just that.

Nguidjol finished with a career-best and game-high nine rebounds along with two blocks and six points, hitting his first 3-pointer in the process.

He was a big reason the Titans outrebounded the Wolfpack, 40-33.

BACK IN THE 20'S

Sophomore Antoine Davis had a gamehigh 28 points in the season opener at NC State, his 24th career 20-point game in just his 31st collegiate game.

It was his seventh-straight game with 20 or more points dating back to last season, where he posted eight in a row at one point.

He has now scored in double figures in all 31 games - reaching at least 17 points in all 31 - and he also nailed a pair of 3-pointers to extend his three-point shooting streak to 31-straight games, the eighth-longest streak in the country.

ABOUT THAT 48-POINT GAME

Antoine Davis' season-high 48 points against Wright State last year was the fourth most in league play in Horizon League history and the most since LaSalle's Kareem Townes had 52 against Loyola (Ill) in 1995.

The 48 points were the sixth most by a league player against any competition in the 40 years of the Horizon League.

He is also the third freshman since 1996-97 to score at least 48 points joining Oklahoma's Trae Young's 48 points against Oklahoma State in 2018 and St. Peter's Keydren Clark's 48 against Northern Arizona in 2002.

CAN HE UP DEBUSSCHERE

Sophomore Antoine Davis scored a Titan and Horizon League-freshman record 784 points last season in 30 games and started the year with 28 at NC State to give him 812 in his first 31 games.

He is trying to catch the great Dave DeBusschere - a NBA Hall-Of-Famer who was named one of the top 50 players in NBA history - as the fastest Titan to 1,000 points.

DeBusschere accomplished the feat in his 43rd collegiate game and he did so in a big way with a then career-best 32 points in a 69-65 win over Toledo in 1961.

By that count, Davis would need to average 18.0 points in his first 12 games to reach 1,000 in his 42nd game.

If he reaches that feat, he will become the 43rd player in school history to eclipse 1,000 career points.

HALL OF FAME NAMES DAVIS TO JERRY WEST AWARD WATCH LIST

Sophomore Antoine Davis was named to the 20-man Jerry West Shooting Guard Watch List by the Naismith Memorial Basketball Hall of Fame.

The award is named after Class of 1980 Hall of Famer and 1959 NCAA Final Four Most Valuable Player Jerry West, the annual honor in its sixth year recognizes the top shooting guards in Division I men's college basketball.

Davis is the first Titan to ever appear on the national accolade watch list after he put together a historic freshman campaign. As a rookie, he was the HL Freshman of the Year and a finalist for the USBWA Wayman Tisdale Award for National Freshman Player of the Year along with Duke's RJ Barrett and Zion Williamson and North Carolina's Coby White - all of whom were top seven draft picks in the NBA draft.

A freshman All-American, Davis ended his rookie season leading the Horizon League in scoring at 26.1 points per game, third in the nation, and tallied 784 points, which was a Titan and Horizon League freshman record and just one point off the school record for points in a season.

He was also top 10 in the country in 3-pointers per game (4.40-second), total 3-pointers (132-third), field goals (263-seventh) and total points (784-seventh) and broke the NCAA freshman record of 122 by Stephen Curry at Davidson in 2006-07 by nailing 132 triples on the year, the second-most in school history and fifth-most in the Horizon League record book.

Previous winners of the Jerry West Shooting Guard of the Year Award include RJ Barrett, Duke (2019), Carsen Edwards, Purdue (2018), Malik Monk, Kentucky (2017), Buddy Hield, Oklahoma (2016) and D'Angelo Russell, Ohio State (2015).

DAVIS NAMED TO 3RD NATIONAL WATCH LIST IN THE LUTE OLSON AWARD

The 2019-20 Lute Olson Award preseason Watch List was announced and once again, sophomore Antoine Davis saw his name among the contenders.

DAVIS TABBED HORIZON LEAGUE PRESEASON PLAYER OF THE YEAR

Coming off a sensational rookie campaign, the nation's leading returning scorer picked up an early preseason accolade as sophomore Antoine Davis was named the Horizon League's Preseason Player of the Year.

Davis - the 2019 HL Freshman of the Year - is the first Titan to earn the preseason honor since Ray McCallum in 2012.

GOING AFTER YOU DAD

Head coach Mike Davis is quick to point out that Antoine Davis is not the defender that he was in college, but in terms of offense, the son is winning that battle.

Coach Davis starred at Alabama from 1979 to 1983 and totaled 1,211 points in 121 career games, going 478-of- 1003 (47.7%) from the field with 238 assists.

Last season, Antoine posted 784 points, was 263-of-657 (40.0%) shooting with 107 assists in 30 games, and after scoring 28 in the opener, he is now at 812 career points.

MOORE BOARDS

Sophomore Marquis Moore really starting to come on last season, becoming a tough rebounder and hitting some shots from the outside.

He grabbed at least five rebounds in eight games, including two in double figures with a season-best 11 rebounds at Milwaukee and 10 against IUPUI

Moore also started the year 2-of-16 from three, but then hit 6-of-11 in his last three games

He had his first collegiate double-double with 10 points and 10 rebounds against IUPUI, a team-high on the boards, and posted a season-best 12 points and eight rebounds in the Horizon League Championship quarterfinals at NKU.

He started the season with four points, four rebounds, two assists and a steal.

BIG WILLY STYLE

Willy Isiani made his long-awaited debut midway through his freshman season and against NKU, he scored nine points, hitting three 3-pointers in just 11 minutes of action, until he suffered a head injury that kept him out for a few games.

He came back with four more 3-pointers at Oakland, finishing with 12 points.

He tallied a season-high 20 points nailing

six more from downtown at IUPUI and finished the year with 14 in the Horizon League Championship quarterfinals at NKU.

As a European, Isiani likes to showcase his long-range shooting as 21 of his 26 career field goals are from behind the arc.

A native of Tbilisi, Georgia, he is believed to be the first Titan from the country of Georgia.

BRANDON SHOWING OFF

Sophomore Chris Brandon showed last season that he was one of the most athletic players in the Horizon League and did that just again in the season opener with a couple of dunks, finishing with eight points, three rebounds, two assists, a steal and a block.

Last year, he recorded 11 games on the season with at least five rebounds.

He earned his first collegiate start at Temple and had a stellar game going 7-of-9 from the floor with a team-high nine rebounds and had some nice buckets off his four offensive caroms and came away with two blocks.

He tied his season high with nine boards and scored six points against Ohio and put together a 12-point, six-rebound game against Kent State, where he was 6-for-6 from the field.

On the season, he shot 60.8 percent from the field, mostly on getting to the rim and putting back offensive rebounds.

MILLER TIME

The Titans got some good news as another veteran transfer in senior Justin Miller, a 6-8, 268-lb forward, was declared immediately eligible by the NCAA.

At NC State, he scored nine points with three rebounds in just 15 minutes.

He played the last three seasons for Louisiana Lafayette, seeing action in 97 games with 59 starts and averaging 9.1 points, 5.4 rebounds and 1.4 assists, shooting 44.9 percent.

He tallied 11.1 points as a freshman starting 31 of 33 games and posted 9.0 points, 7.4 rebounds and 1.7 assists last season, second on the team in rebounding and assists.

In his career, he has scored in double figures in 41 games - including 20 or more four times - with a career-high 22 points on the road at Kansas. He has also recorded seven career double-doubles with a career high in rebounds 15 at Arkansas State last season.

He spent three seasons at Kentucky and played in 27 games with the Wildcats, under the direction of his dad head coach John Calipari, and was part of 88 wins as the Wildcats advanced to the Elite 8 in 2017 and 2019 and the Sweet 16 in 2018.

According to stories in the Detroit Free Press, Kentucky has said they would be open to playing the Titans next season and that meeting could occur in Calihan Hall.

LONE STAR TRANSFER

Another graduate senior will don the red, white and blue is B.J. Maxwell.

He played three years with Abilene Christian University, seeing action in 72 games with 21 starts and averaging 5.4 points, 2.9 rebounds and 1.0 assists, while shooting 48.3 percent from the field and 40.3 percent from behind the arc.

He tallied 9.2 points, 4.7 rebounds and 1.7 assists in 24 games in 2018-19 and shot 49.1 percent from then field and 40.5 percent from three.

He was also a part of 56 wins and two postseason teams in the CIT as a sophomore and NCAA last year.

I WAS BORN IN NEW YORK CITY

Sophomore Alonde LeGrand transferred to the Titans from State Fair Community College in Vermont and will have three years of eligibility.

Originally from Harlem, New York, he enrolled at Fairfield as a freshman, but did not appear in any games, therefore, allowing him three years of college basketball.

THE HEART OF A WALK-ON

Junior Jordan Gorman continues to show his heart and dedication that has allowed him to make a Division I roster as a walkon.

He saw action in seven games last season, making his Division I debut against Loyola and scoring his first collegiate points hitting a field goal against Green Bay.

Gorman spent his freshman season at Wright State Lake Campus on a club

team, starting all 33 games and averaging 12.5 points, 5.0 assists, 3.4 rebounds and 2.4 steals per game. He was second in the conference in steals (79) and third in assists (164) and scored in double figures in 24 games, including four 20+ point performances with a season-high 26 at Grace Bible College, and even recorded a triple-double with 11 points and season highs of 11 assists and 10 rebounds against Ohio State Lima.

JUST A KID FROM BELGIUM

Freshman Sam Hofman will bring some much-needed muscle in the inside to go with some outside shooting.

Hofman is believed to be the first Titan recruit from Belgium.

He was a member of the U-20 and U-18 Belgium National Team and helped the squad to a bronze medal at the 2018 and 2019 European Championships.

BOE KNOWS

Sophomore Boe Nguidjol is back as the athletic big man will look to improve upon his understanding of the collegiate game.

He played in 20 games on the year and averaged 1.1 points and 1.9 rebounds and pulled down at least five rebounds in three games with season highs of six at Akron, at Wright State and against NKU.

He gets his athleticism and footwork from his dad, who played professional soccer in England and China.

ROSE BACK AT DI

Junior Dwayne Rose Jr. is back playing at the Division I level after suiting up for Southwestern Illinois College last season, where he averaged 7.6 points, 2.9 rebounds and 1.5 assists per game.

The Chicago native played in 14 games off the bench at Toledo as a freshman in 2017-18 and scored a season-high seven points at Kansas.

Nothing new for the Titans to have a family connection in the program and this season, Detroit Mercy will once again feature three Davis' in head coach Mike Davis, assistant coach Mike Davis Jr. and sophomore guard Antoine Davis.

From 2010-13, the Titans had head coach Ray McCallum and star guard Ray McCallum, winning the Horizon League Championship in 2012 and earning a trip to the NIT in 2013.

WHO WILL START?

Detroit Mercy saw 13 players start a game last season, the most in the country.

Detroit Mercy also used 15 different starting line-ups on the year.

TAKING CARE OF THE BALL

Detroit Mercy was first in the HL and 49th in Division I committing just 11.5 turnovers per game last season.

Detroit Mercy had just six turnovers at Oakland and a season-low five turnovers on the road at Cleveland State as part of 10 games on the season with less than 10 turnovers.

LET IT FLY

Detroit Mercy was fourth in the Horizon League with 9.5 triples per game, 44th in the country, and fourth in the HL and 123rd in DI in three-point field goal percentage (35.6) last season.

The Titans also nailed a school-record 294 treys on the year, tying a school record with 17 against Loyola Maryland.

FOLLOWING HIS DAD

The Davis family has always been close and when it came time to play college basketball, they both chose to play for their dad.

Assistant coach Mike Davis Jr. played for his dad at both Indiana and UAB and Antoine Davis chose to come to Detroit Mercy.

Antoine originally committed to Kelvin Sampson at Houston as a senior in high school, but changed that to Texas Southern in the spring and then followed his dad to the Titans.

He was a 3-star recruit by ESPN and Rivals and was also ranked 28th in the region and 20th in the state of Texas and the 15th best recruit in the Houston area for the Class of 2018 by the Houston Chronicle.

DAVIS INVITED TO NIKE SKILLS ACADEMY

Sophomore Antoine Davis received an invitation to the Nike Skills Academy this past August.

The academy was held at Mamba Sports Academy in Thousand Oaks, California, and featured 20 of the top collegiate basketball players as well as the nation's top 80 high school players.

The event had a number of elite instructors and included intense skill development and competition in front of hundreds of college coaches, members of the media and scouts from nearly every NBA team.

AD GETTING BUCKETS

Antoine Davis netted 30 in the Horizon League Championship quarterfinals last season to end the year, giving him a lead or share of the team lead in scoring in 29 of the 30 games he has played in.

He tallied 23, 20-point games, nine 30+ performances and a pair of 40-point efforts in his first 30 collegiate games, the only freshman in school history with two 40-point outings.

To start the year, he posted eightstraight 20-point games, the first Titan to have eight-straight games with 20 or more since Willie Green's 10 in a row as a senior in 2002-03.

His 23, 20-point games are the most by a Titan since Rashad Phillips had 24 in 1999-00

His nine 30-point games on the season are the most since Archie Tullos had 10 in 1987-88.

#REACHTHEHORIZON

The Horizon League has unveiled its logo and official hashtag - #ReachTheHorizon - for the 2020 Horizon League Basketball Championships. The 2020 championships will mark the first year that the Horizon League Basketball Championships will take place in Indianapolis at the Indiana Farmers Coliseum located at the Indiana State Fairgrounds & Event Center.

The men's and women's championship games will take place on Tuesday, March 10, and the semifinals will be played on Monday, March 9. Early round games will be played on campus with the bracket announced at a later date.

EIGHT POSTSEASON WINS

WILLIE GREEN NOW COACHING IN NBA

Willie Green, who starred as a Titan from 1999-2003, was named an assistant coach for the Phoenix Suns this past summer after spending the last four seasons on the Golden State Warriors staff, helping the team win two NBA Championships.

Green was a part of four Titan winning seasons, including a pair of 20-win campaigns and postseason appearances

As a sophomore, Green helped Detroit Mercy reach the semifinals of the NIT knocking out Bradley, Connecticut and Dayton as the Titans made their way to Madison Square Garden.

Green is still fourth all-time in scoring with 1,779 points. As a senior, he was an AP Honorable Mention All-American and the Horizon League Player of the Year after averaging a league-best 22.6 points per game.

He was selected in the second round (41st) in the 2003 NBA Draft by the Seattle SuperSonics and later traded to the 76ers. He would play seven of his 12 NBA seasons with Philadelphia, averaging a career-high 12.4 points in 2007-08 and 11.3 points in 2006-07.

He finished his career playing in 731 games tallying 8.3 points, 1.8 rebounds and 1.3 assists.

DETROIT MERCY NAMED NCAA HOST

It will be a busy season for the University of Detroit Mercy as the Titans have been selected as the host institution for the 2020 NCAA Women's Bowling Championship and the 2020 NCAA Men's & Women's Fencing Championships.

Detroit Mercy will also co-host with Oakland for the 2021 NCAA men's basketball first and second round tournament games.

Detroit Mercy, in partnership with Olympia Entertainment and the Detroit Sports Commission hosted the 2018 NCAA men's basketball first and second round games on March 16 & March 18, 2018 from the brand-new Little Caesars Arena.

Experience in the system and experience on the collegiate level will be all over the Titan sidelines for head coach Mike Davis.

Mike Davis Jr.

Someone who knows coach Davis more than anyone, Mike Davis Jr. learned the game from his dad and not only played under him at Indiana and UAB, but has been on the sidelines with him for seven years.

Davis Jr. served as an assistant coach for six years at Texas Southern, where the Davis duo built the Tigers into a perennial power in the SWAC and a staple in the postseason.

During his six seasons, Texas Southern won four regular season and conference tournament championships and appeared in four NCAA Tournaments with one NIT bid. In 2018, the Tigers won their first-ever NCAA Tournament game, defeating North Carolina Central in the First Four match-up.

His first collegiate coaching job was at Chipola Junior College in 2011-12. Prior to that, he worked on the AAU circuit with the Alabama Ice as an assistant coach from 2010-12

Davis Jr. played collegiate basketball at Blackhawk Community College, Indiana and UAB, and saw action in 76 games at the Division I level.

Tracy Dildy

No stranger to the Midwest, Horizon League or coach Davis, Tracy Dildy worked with coach Davis at UAB in 2006-07 and also has coaching stops at Mississippi, Auburn, DePaul and Ball State before his recent assignment as head coach at Chicago State.

He was the head coach at Chicago State

from 2010-2018 and also served as the athletic director in his final season. He guided the Cougars to their first-ever Division I postseason appearance as the team won the Great West Conference and earned a bid to the CIT in 2013.

He was named the top mid-major assistant by Hoop Scoop in 2008, one of the top 25 mid-major assistant by CollegeInsider.com in 2009 and one of Hoop Scoop's top 50 mid-major assistants in Basketball Times when he was at UIC from 2007-10.

He helped assemble a nationally-ranked recruiting class for the 2005-06 season at Mississippi that was rated as high as third by numerous recruiting publications and earned a spot on Rivals.com's list of the Top 25 recruiters in the nation in June 2005.

At DePaul from 1997-2002, he worked as an assistant coach, the associate head coach and even served as an acting head for a period in 2001 and helped the Blue Demons advance to the quarterfinals of the NIT in 2001 and reached the second round of the 2002 NCAA Tournament. He spearheaded four huge recruiting classes for DePaul which included the nation's topranked class in 2001 and the second-best class in the country in 1999, in addition to signing future NBA players Quentin Richardson, Bobby Simmons, Steven Hunter and Eddy Curry.

Keith LeGree

A two-sport start in college and a veteran in the coaching ranks, LeGree has been an assistant coach at the Division I level for over 10 years and has almost 20 years of coaching experience.

LeGree and coach Davis know each other well as he spent six seasons (2012-18) on staff at Texas Southern. He helped the program win four regular-season titles and four conference tournament championships along with advancing to five postseason tournaments, including four trips to the NCAA's.

He also has coaching stops at Chipola Junior College, Alabama Southern Community College and at his alma mater Cincinnati. LeGree was on staff under his college coach Bob Huggins at UC from 2000-05, helping the Bearcats to 123 wins, with a school record 31 in 2001-02, and five trips to the NCAA Tournament, including the Sweet 16 in 2000-01.

LeGree was a standout student-athlete on the hardwood at Cincinnati and Louisville and also played professional baseball, parlaying that into a seven-year playing career in the minor leagues and reaching the Triple-A level before he entered the coaching profession.

Tim Waller

Tim Waller joined Mike Davis on the Titan staff in the summer of 2018 as the Director of Basketball Operations.

No stranger to coach Davis, Waller spent the last six years (2012-2018) at Texas Southern alongside the Titan leader as the Tigers' Executive Director of Operations.

He was on staff for all five of Texas Southern postseason appearances with coach Davis at the helm, and with a background spanning nearly 35 years in collegiate coaching, he has now been a part of 14 regular season and conference tournament championships at five NCAA Division I schools.

His relationship with coach Davis goes back even further as prior to arriving at TSU, Waller was the Director of Basketball Operations at UAB (2009-12). Working with coach Davis, the Blazers made a pair of postseason appearances and won a Conference USA regular-season title.

He recruited the likes of John Long, Terry Tyler, Terry Duerod and Wilbert McCormick and turned Calihan Hall into one of the most visitedvenuesincollegebasketballinthelate 70's.

He went 17-9 in each of his first two seasons and posted a 19-8 mark in 1975-76. In his final year as a head coach, the Titans tourched the competition going 25-4, including a 21-game winning streak, and earning a bid to the NCAAT our nament. They would defeat MiddleTennessee State, 93-76, for the school's firstevervictoryintheNCAATournamentandthen tookonapowerfulMichigansquad,dropping an 86-81 decision.

Vitale has now been selected for 10 halls of fame in his career.

FORMER TITAN COACH MICHAEL **BRUNKER NAMED 2019 MR. SAN DIEGO**

A distinguished Titan alum and coach received a well-deserved honor as former U-Dassistant coach Michael Brunker '74 was named the 2019 Mr. San Diego by the San Diego Rotary.

Brunker served as an assistant coach for four years under legend Dick Vitale from 1974-78 and then went with coach Vitale to the Pistons as an assistant coach. He then joined another former Titan coach in Smokey Gaines at San Diego, where he was an assistant coach for seven seasons.

With the Titans, he was one of the youngest coaches in the country at age 22 right after graduating from the University and helped coach Vitale build the Titans into a national program.

He is currently the YMCA of San Diego County's vice president for mission advancement and that was after serving as the executive director of the San Diego Regional Police Athletic League for 10





HEAD COACH MIKE DAVIS



Mike Davis enters his second season as the Titan head coach, guiding the team to a tie for sixth in the Horizon League in 2018-19.

Detroit Mercy was picked to finish last in the league in the preseason poll, but Detroit Mercy notched 11 wins on the year and seven in conference play to qualify for the postseason. Led by star guard and son Antoine Davis, the Horizon League Freshman of the Year and First Team All-League, Detroit Mercy won the Gotprint.Com Legends Classic Subregional Championship game, presented by Old Trapper, with wins over Loyola Maryland and Bowling Green and had wins against conference co-champion Wright State and College Insider.com Invitational Tournament finalist Green Bay.

Davis was named the 22nd head coach in program history on June 13, 2018, as he looks to take

the program back to championship

heights.

"After an extensive search that included multiple high-quality candidates, we are pleased to have Mike Davis join us as our new men's basketball head coach," said **Detroit Mercy Director of Athletics Robert** C. Vowels, Jr. "Mike has achieved great success as a coach and leader of young men, and as an individual, he reflects the values upon which our University is built. I

"I think coach Davis is a great hire. He is an experienced coach who has coached and won on every level. His veteran experience is going to be a big boost to the University. am confident he will help return Titan basketball to a championship level."

Davis came to Detroit Mercy from Texas Southern University, where he spent six seasons building the Tigers into a perennial power in the Southwestern Athletic Conference (SWAC) with five postseason tournament appearances, including four NCAA Tournaments. For his efforts, he was named the SWAC Coach of the Year on three occasions. Texas Southern also had a team GPA of 3.0 and had four consecutive semesters of a perfect 1000 APR score.

A high school basketball star in the state of Alabama, Davis played collegiately at the University of Alabama before embarking on a professional career. His coaching resume includes more than 20 years of experience. This includes 18 years of head coaching experience, building a 352-241 record with 14 postseason trips, nine appearances in the NCAA Tournament and guiding Indiana to a national championship runner-up effort in 2002. His squads have recorded at

least 20 wins nine times, while posting a winning record in 14 of his 18

campaigns.

In his six seasons at Texas Southern, he posted a 115-89 (.564) record, including an 88-20 mark in conference play. His teams won four regularseason titles and four conference tournament championships advancing to four NCAA Tournaments. In his final season at the helm of TSU, the Tigers won their first-ever NCAA Tournament game defeating North Carolina Central in the First Four.

Under his leadership, five Tigers were named the SWAC Player of the Year, a feat which had never occurred in the league and was the fourthlongest streak in the history of the NCAA. In addition, 11 earned All-League honors, three were tabbed the Defensive Players of the Year, two were selected the Newcomer of the Year and one was picked the Freshmen of the Year.

He started his collegiate head-coaching career at Indiana University from 2000-06 after serving as an assistant coach for three seasons under legendary head coach and Hall-Of-Famer Bobby Knight.

At IU, he compiled a 115-79 record, 55-41 in the Big Ten, and led the Hoosiers to five postseason tournaments, including a run to the NCAA Championship game in 2002. Davis' teams played some of their best basketball during the postseason tallying a 21-12 record in the month of March and a 7-4 NCAA Tournament mark.

He was named the 25th head coach in Indiana history on Sept. 12, 2000, succeeding Knight, and had the most successful first season of any of his 24 predecessors going 21-13 and finishing fourth in the Big Ten at 10-6. His 21 wins were four more than any other first-year IU head coach. He was also the first coach in Indiana history to open his tenure with three straight 20-plus win seasons and three consecutive NCAA Tournament appearances as he directed the Hoosiers to a share of the 2002 Big Ten championship and an appearance in the 2002 national championship game, while also defeating 22 nationally-ranked opponents

EIGHT POSTSEASON WINS

In his second season, the Hoosiers were 25-12 and 11-5 in the Big Ten to share the regular season title. As the No. 5 seed in the South Regional of the NCAA Tournament, IU downed Utah (75-56) and UNC-Wilmington (76-67) to advance to the Sweet 16. The Hoosiers then ousted top-seeded Duke (74-73) and Kent State (81-69) to move into the Final Four.

In the national semifinal, Indiana overcame a halftime deficit to move past the West Regional's No. 2 seed Oklahoma, 73-64, before falling to the East Regional's No. 1 seed Maryland, 64-52, in the title contest.

Prior to being named head coach Davis had already contributed significantly to the Indiana program. He spent the previous three seasons as an assistant coach with the Hoosiers. His successful recruitment of several of the country's top prep players earned him national recognition at Indiana.

In addition to his recruiting success, he was instrumental in the development of several players including A.J. Guyton, the Big Ten's Most Valuable Player in 2000, Kirk Haston, a first-round NBA selection in 2001, and 2002 Big Ten MVP and consensus second-team All-American Jared Jeffries, who was the 11th overall pick of the 2002 NBA Draft by the Washington Wizards.

In Davis' three seasons as an IU assistant, the Hoosiers compiled a 63-32 overall record and advanced to the NCAA Tournament all three seasons.

After Indiana, Davis was named the head coach at the University of Alabama-Birmingham (UAB), where he led the Blazers to a 122-72 (.629) overall record with a 62-34 mark in Conference USA during his six years (2006-12). Davis also led his teams to success off the court and in the classroom as the team had four consecutive semesters of a perfect 1000 APR score.

Davis had a highly successful season at UAB in 2010-11 leading the Blazers to the program's first-ever Conference USA regular season title. In doing so, he was named the 2011 Conference USA Coach of the Year, while also earning NABC All-District Coach of the Year accolades.

In 2010-11, Davis also guided the Blazers to an NCAA Tournament at-large berth with a record of 22-9 and a 12-4 mark in league play. UAB earned at least 20 victories in the regular season in four-straight years during Davis' tenure (2007-2012), marking the first time that feat had been in achieved in program history. The Blazers also won at least 11 conference games in each of those seasons.

Under Davis, the program clinched four consecutive postseason berths (three NITs and one NCAA Tournament). Davis subsequently etched his name in the record books as he became only the second coach in UAB history to reach 90 wins in a four-year span. The only other coach in program history to accomplish the feat was Hall of Famer Gene Bartow, who reached the pinnacle with a school-record 94 victories from 1983-87.

"Our vision in the Horizon League is to be a nationally recognized NCAA Division I conference that develops studentathletes to their fullest potential," said Jon LeCrone, Horizon League Commissioner. "Mike is a proven winner and brings the knowledge, skill and values that our League embraces."

He started coaching at Miles College as an assistant in 1989-90 and then moved to Venezuela to work with the country's national and professional teams. He arrived back in the states to coach in the Continental Basketball Association (CBA) with the Wichita Falls franchise that eventually relocated to Chicago. Davis moved with the team not only as an assistant coach, but also as a player. Despite not playing professional basketball for five years, Davis averaged 8.3 points, 3.3 rebounds and 2.6 assists per contest in 1994-95.

Davis was then an assistant coach at his alma mater from 1995-97 under David Hobbs at Alabama before taking the assistant coaching job at Indiana.

Davis spent his collegiate-playing career with the Tide after earning the state's Mr. Basketball honor and All-America status in 1979. He was a standout for four seasons at Alabama and finished his career in the Top 25 on the Crimson Tide's all-time scoring list with 1,211 points. In his first season, he played for the legendary C.M. Newton and then spent his final three years playing under another coaching legend, Wimp Sanderson.

Davis averaged 10.1 points per game for his collegiate career and ranks third all-time on the school's steals list with 165. During his four seasons at Alabama, the Crimson Tide posted an 80-42 record and advanced to two NIT and two NCAA Tournaments.

Davis is married to Tamilya Davis and the couple has one son, Antoine, the 2019 HL Freshman of the Year. Davis is also the father of current assistant coach Mike Davis, Jr., who was a member of the Indiana and UAB men's basketball team that he coached and was an assistant with him at Texas Southern, and he also has one daughter, Lateesha.
