NATIONALLY RANKED SEMINOLES BACK IN TALLAHASSEE FOR ACC HOME OPENER

Florida State, which is ranked No. 17 in the Associated Press Poll and No. 19 in the USA Today Coaches' Poll, returns to ACC play as it plays host to Clemson on Sunday, December 8, 2019 at 2:00 p.m. at the Donald L. Tucker Center. The Seminoles will look to even their ACC record at 1-1 after falling in their season and ACC opener at Pitt (61-63, November 6, 2019). The Seminoles have a 7-1 record with victories over then No. 6 Florida (63-51, November 10), No. 17 Tennessee (60-57, November) and Purdue in winning the team championship at the Emerald Coast Classic since playing the Panthers to begin their 20-game ACC schedule. Florida State's game against Clemson begins a two-game home stand over a nine-day period and sees the Seminoles take a full week off for semester exams. Following the exam period, the Seminoles play host to North Florida (December 17, 8:30 p.m.) before their annual trip south to play in the Orange Bowl Classic. Florida State faces USF in the Orange Bowl Classic at the BB&T Center in Sunrise, Fla., (December 21, 12 Noon) before taking time off for the holidays.

SEMINOLES BACK IN THE NATIONAL RANKINGS

With seven consecutive victories – including two over nationally ranked teams – Florida State included in the national rankings for the first time this season. The Seminoles are ranked 17th nationally by the Associated Press and 19th in the USA Today Coaches' polls. It marks the fourth consecutive season the Seminoles have been included both polls – the first four-year period that Florida State has been included in at least one national poll since the 2009, 2010, 2011 and 2012 seasons.

FLORIDA STATE AGAINST NATIONALLY RANKED TEAMS

Florida State is just one of five teams in the nation who have defeated two nationally ranked teams in the first six weeks of the college basketball season. With wins over No. 6 Florida and No. 17 Tennessee, the Seminoles are joined by only Duke (No. 3 Kansas and No. 11 Michigan State), Michigan (No. 6 North Carolina and No. 8 Gonzaga), Oregon (No. 13 Memphis and No. 13 Seton Hall) and Tennessee (No. 20 Washington and No. 20 VCU). Of that group of five, Florida State is one of only three teams (Florida State, Duke, Michigan) which has defeated at least one team in the top-10.

FLORIDA STATE HAS MADE THE TUCKER CENTER A TOUGH PLACE FOR OPPONENTS TO PLAY

Florida State is 53-3 (.946 winning percentage in its last 56 home games) since the tail end of the 2015-16 season. The Seminoles earned a 15-1 record home record at home during the 2018-19 season. The Seminoles enter Sunday's game against the Tigers having won .946 percent of their games (53-3) and .897 percent of their ACC games (26-3) at home since the tail end of the 2015-16 season. Florida State's streak began with a 77-56 win over No. 23 Notre Dame on February 27, 2015. The Seminoles were 18-0 at home (including 9-0 in the ACC) during the 2016-17, 15-1 at home during the 2018-10 season and are 4-0 at home this season (2019-20).

FLORIDA STATE IN ACC PLAY AT HOME SINCE FEBRUARY 27, 2016

Florida State is 26-3 in ACC play at the Donald L. Tucker Center since a 77-56 win over Notre Dame on Feb. 27, 2016. Including its win over nationally ranked Notre Dame, the Seminoles have defeated 10 nationally ranked teams (eight ACC teams and Florida) including No. 7 Duke (88-72, January 7, 2017), No. 15 Notre Dame (83-80, January 18, 2017), No. 12 Louisville (73-68, January 21, 2017), No. 25 Miami (66-57, March 4, 2017), No. 12 North Carolina (81-80, January 3, 2018), No. 11 Clemson (81-79, Feb. 14, 2018), No. 16 Louisville (80-75, February 9 2019), No. 14 Virginia Tech (73-65, March 5, 2019). The Seminoles have won three games at home against Clemson during their current streak (Feb. 5, 2017, Feb. 14, 2018 and January 22, 2019).

LOOK FOR FLORIDA STATE TO...

...Defeat Clemson and raise its record to 54-3 at home in the Donald L. Tucker Center since the end of the 2015-16 season (a perfect 18-0 record in 2016-17; 13-2 in 2017-18, 15-1 in 2018-19 and 4-0 in 2019-20);

...Defeat Clemson and win its 11th consecutive home game. The Seminoles won their final six home games of the 2018-19 season and their first four of the 2019-20 season;

...Defeat Clemson and win its fifth consecutive home game against the Tigers – matching the longest home winning streak against the Tigers since joining the ACC for the 1991-92 season. The Seminoles won their first five home ACC game against Clemson (1992, 1993, 1995, 1995, 1996) and have a 23-9 record in Tallahassee against Clemson.

HAMILTON MOVES CLOSER TO SIXTH WINNINGEST COACH IN ACC HISTORY

With 341 career victories during his tenure at Florida State, 18th-year Head Coach Leonard Hamilton enters the Seminoles' game against Clemson on Sunday as the seventh all-time winningest coach in ACC history. He needs only eight wins to move into sixth place in ACC history (passing Maryland's Lefty Driesell) and only nine wins to become just the sixth coach in the illustrious history of the nation's best basketball conference to win 350 career games.

FLORIDA STATE NATIONALLY IN THE LAST TWO SEASONS

The Seminoles are one of seven teams in the nation (Florida State, Duke, Gonzaga, Kentucky, Michigan, Purdue and Texas Tech) who have advanced at least as far as the Sweet 16 of the NCAA Tournament in both of the last two seasons. The Seminoles advanced to the Elite Eight in 2018 and to the Sweet 16 in 2019.

FLORIDA STATE TRENDING UP AS ONE OF THE NATION'S TOP PROGRAMS

With seven wins in their first nine games of the 2019-20 season and 16 wins in their final 19 games of the 2018-19 season, the Seminoles have won 23 of their last 28 games (.821 winning percentage) since defeating Clemson, 77-68, at the Donald L. Tucker Center in Tallahassee on January 22, 2019. Florida State has defeated four nationally ranked teams during that incredible stretch of victories with their losses coming at then No. 8 North Carolina, then No. 5 Duke in the Championship game of the 2019 ACC Tournament, then No. 4 Gonzaga in the Sweet 16 of the 2019 NCAA Tournament, at Pitt in the 2019-20 season opener and at Indiana on Tuesday night in Bloomington.

SEMINOLES ON THE DEFENSIVE

Florida State enters Sunday's game against Clemson ranked fourth in the ACC in defensive field goal percentage. The Seminoles held each of their first eight opponents under 46 percent shooting and have limited their nine opponents to a combined .377 percent shooting from the field. Florida State led the nation in defensive field goal percentage in 2010 (.377) and 2011 (.363) under head coach Leonard Hamilton. During the history of the Seminole program, three of the top five defensive field goal percentage seasons have come under Hamilton.

FLORIDA STATE CONTINUES TORRID STEALS PACE

Florida State earned eight steals against Indiana and enters Sunday's game against Clemson ranked second in the ACC in steals with 86 and a 9.6 steals per game average. The Seminoles trail Duke by only one steal in the ACC statistics. Florida State has earned eight or more steals in seven of its first nine games and earned a season-high 16 steals its Emerald Coast Classic Championship clinching victory over Purdue. Florida State is only 14 steals away from reaching the 100 steals mark for the 34th consecutive season – each season the NCAA has recognized steals as an official statistic.

FLORIDA STATE TOUGH TO SCORE ON

Florida State enters Sunday's game against Clemson ranked fourth in the ACC as it is allowing an average of 62.1 points per game. The Seminoles have held five of its first nine opponents to 60 points or less including holding then No. 6 Florida to 51 points on their home floor in Gainesville, Fla. The Gators are averaging 67.6 points scored per game entering their game on Saturday against Butler. Florida State held Purdue to 60 points in an overtime win in the Emerald Coast Classic Championship Game on November 30 – the Boilermakers then scored 69 against defensive-minded Virginia in the ACC / Big Ten Challenge on Wednesday night in West Lafayette, Ind.

FLORIDA STATE IN OVERTIME

With their overtime victory over Purdue in the championship game of the 2019 Emerald Coast Classic, the Seminoles have won eight consecutive overtime games. During the stretch of eight consecutive overtime wins, the Seminoles have defeated seven ACC opponents, one of the SEC (LSU), one from the Big Ten (Purdue) and three ranked opponents (No. 24 LSU, No. 15 Virginia Tech and No. 16 Virginia Tech). The Seminoles have outscored their last eight overtime opponents by a 110-66 margin including a 5-2 margin over Purdue on November 30. Florida State scored all five of their overtime points from the free throw line in its win over the Boilermakers.

FLORIDA STATE VS. CLEMSON – THE LAST GAME

Mfiondu Kabengele had 19 points and 11 rebounds, and Florida State set a program record with its eighth consecutive Atlantic Coast Conference victory in a 77-64 win over the Tigers on February 19, 2019 at Littlejohn Coliseum in Clemson, S.C. Florida State used its size, strength and speed to keep the run going against the Tigers, holding on after seeing an 18-point edge cut to 59-52 with eight minutes left. That's as close as Clemson would get in dropping its third in a row and getting swept by Florida State for the second time in three seasons. Kabengele led the way on both sides of the ball. He hit 9 of 13 from the field, blocked two shots, and his rebounds were a season high. Then again, Clemson had trouble stopping much of anything Florida State did around the basket. The Seminoles' starting center in 7-foot-4 Christ Koumadje went 4-of-6 shooting for 10 points with seven rebounds and a pair of blocks. The Seminoles took control after Clemson closed to 23-21 on Marquise Reed's 3-pointer with 6:18 left in the half. Florida State then went on a 15-2 surge the rest of the half with Kabengele hitting three buckets and Walker landing a 3-pointer. Florida State went to the locker room ahead 38-23.

Florida State Men's Basketball By The Numbers

.292 Florida State is one of six teams in the ACC (and is ranked fifth among the 15 ACC teams) to currently hold its opponents below 30 percent shooting from 3-point line. The Seminoles limited their first nine opponents to a .292 3-point field goal defense mark.

.609 Graduate Transfer Dominik Olejniczak is shooting .619 from the field this season (13 of 21) and is shooting .609 from the field (229 of 376) for his four-year collegiate career.

.857 Freshman Balsa Koprivica averaged 8.0 points and shot .857 from the field (10 of 12) in Florida State's victories over Chattanooga, Chicago State, Tennessee and Purdue in four games during the Emerald Coast Classic.

1.1 Redshirt sophomore Anthony Polite is tied for first amongst his teammates with 15 steals and a career-high 1.7 steals per game average. He is averaging 1.1 steals more per game (1.7) than he did as a redshirt freshman (0.6).

2 Florida State is one of only two teams in the ACC (and is joined by only Duke) that has advanced at least as far as the Sweet 16 of the NCAA Tournament in both of the last two seasons. The Seminoles advanced to within one step of the NCAA Final Four -- the Elite Eight -- in the 2018 NCAA Tournament.

2 Florida State signed two players during the early signing period -- Scott Barnes (Guard, West Palm Beach, Fla.) and Sardaar Calhoun (Guard, Tappahannock, Va.) who will both begin play for the Seminoles for the 2020-21 season.

3 Head Coach Leonard Hamilton has named three captains for the 2019-20 season -- Trent Forrest, M.J. Walker and Harrison Prieto.

3 Three Seminoles -- Devin Vassell, Trent Forrest and Malik Osborne -- have started each of the first nine games of the season for Florida State.

4 Florida State is looking to play in its school-record tying fourth consecutive NCAA Tournament in 2020.

5 Freshman Balsa Koprivica has made five consecutive free throw attempts in the last four games. He is shooting .833 from the field in the first nine games of his career.

6 Redshirt sophomore RaiQuan Gray is third on the team with 10 assists (1.4 apg). He has earned at least one assist in six of the seven games he has played this season.

6 Six different Seminoles are averaging 21 or more minutes played through the first nine games of the season.

7 Florida State is undefeated, 7-0, when it outscores its opponent.

TRENT FORREST ACADEMICALLY

Senior Trent Forrest will earn his degree in Sport Management on December 13, 2019 and will walk in Florida State University commencement exercises in the building he calls his basketball home -- the Donald L. Tucker Center. He will continue his academic career as he has been admitted to Florida State's prestigious Sport Management Master's Program a program that admits just under 40 percent of the applicants in the Florida State School of Education. The latest rankings by U.S. News and World Report list the Florida State Sport Management Master's program as the top program in the nation. Forrest will begin his graduate education when classes begin on January 6, 2020. Forrest's graduation only adds to Leonard Hamilton's 94 percent graduation rate during his 18 seasons at Florida State.

FORREST'S CAREER-HIGH SCORING AVERAGE HAS HIM APPROACHING 1,000 CAREER POINTS

Senior Trent Forrest has scored in double figures in two straight games (17 against Purdue and 13 at Indiana) and enters Sunday's game against Clemson with 896 career points. He needs only 104 points to become just the 48th player in school history to score 1,000 or more points as a Seminole. Forrest is averaging a career-high 12.4 points scored per game with six double figure scoring games in Florida State's first nine games of the 2019-20 season.

Entering Sunday's game against Clemson, he is scoring nearly one-third of his career point total (284 of 896) from the free throw line. Forrest is ranked 17th in school history with 284 career free throws made and 19th in school history with 388 career free throws attempted.

With one steal at Indiana on Tuesday night, Forrest hit the 180 career steals marks. He is tied for eighth in school history with his 180 career steals and is looking to become just the sixth player in school history with 200 or more career steals.

Redshirt sophomore RaiQuan Gray enters Sunday's game against Clemson with seven steals in his first seven games of the season. Freshman Balsa Koprivica enters Sunday's game against Clemson shooting a team-leading .833 from the field. He has made each of his five field goal attempts in the last four games. He made his final field goal attempt in the Seminoles' victory over Chicago State and was a perfect two-of-two from the field in Florida State's victories over Tennessee and Purdue in the semifinals and championship game of the Emerald Coast Classic.

WALKER BACK INTO SEMINOLES' TOP-25 FOR FREE THROW SHOOTING PERCENTAGE

Junior M.J. Walker was a perfect two-of-two from the free throw line in the Seminoles' victory over Purdue and enters Sunday's game against Clemson tied for 24th in school history with a .771 free throw shooting percentage. He has made 19 of 24 free throw shots in his first six games of the 2019-20 season and is shooting a career-high .792 from the free throw line. Walker has been an outstanding free throw shooter throughout his career as he shot a career-high .778 from the line as a sophomore. Florida State Basketball Point Guard RayQuan Evans Working Back To Form After Injury

Florida State is finally getting back to full strength after a number of injuries during preseason practice and this season.

FSU coach Leonard Hamilton couldn't be happier about that after going through the first six games with an abbreviated version of the team he put together.

"I'm looking forward to having a full team," FSU coach Leonard Hamilton said.

"Gosh, in practice, I will be will be celebrating. I'm going to be very thankful. You know, this Thanksgiving. I might be in the Thanksgiving spirit. I'm going to be extremely thankful that I got everybody healthy and ready to go. Now, if I could just get a little practice in, we might start developing a little bit."

The player that has missed the most time so far is junior college transfer RayQuan Evans, who tore his hamstring in the first few days of the preseason.

Evans missed five weeks of practice and the first two games of the season against Pittsburgh and Florida.

He's played the last four games and his minutes have gone up in every contest he's played in. He's expected to play tonight against Tennessee in the Emerald Coast Classic semifinal in Niceville, Fla.

"I think that he's still getting his feet under him," Hamilton told the *Democrat*.

"He's a very smart, instinctive, cerebral player. Brings a lot to our team. And he just needs more reps, so that he can gain the confidence to be who he is right now. He's done a lot of thinking because he's missed five weeks of practice. So he's not in great condition. He's still trying to learn his teammates.

"All of that goes with being out for the period of time that he's been. I like what I see. He's not disappointing me." Evans is averaging four points and 2.3 assists in just under 14 minutes per game so far.

Despite not being able to practice with the team for most of the preseason, his teammates have been impressed with the way he's stepped up in games despite not being completely comfortable with a new system and not being in game shape.

"He's definitely a good leader on the court," FSU redshirt sophomore guard Anthony Polite said.

"He's able to put people in the right places, and basically direct traffic in the sense that he knows where people are. He knows where you're supposed to be. He's able to find people and put them in comfortable positions for them to be able to succeed. So it's always easy to be on the court with him."

Evans hasn't been able to show much of his skill set yet as he gets back into form, but the talent is there. He averaged 18.2 points, 7.4 rebounds, and 4.9 assists per game and was named the Northwest Athletic Conference Player of the Year at North Idaho during the 2018-19 season.

FSU's coaches and players have a very high opinion of the player that he can become for the Seminoles.

"He has great command of the floor and leadership qualities," Hamilton said.

"He's a guy that really does a great job of seeing the floor making decisions. And even though you haven't seen it, he is a really, really good shooter. We think that he has all the skills to be an outstanding point guard in our program."

FSU has been fortunate to have good point guard play for the last few years and that's because it hasn't all been on the shoulders of one player.

FSU had Xavier Rathan-Mayes, Trent Forrest, and C.J. Walker in 2016-2017, Forrest and Walker in 2017-2018, and Forrest and David Nichols in 2018-2019.

With Evans injured to start the season, Forrest, a senior, had to play most of the minutes. He averaged 34 minutes per game the first three games.

But since Evans has returned, FSU has been able to cut his minutes down to 24 over the last three games. Part of that is the level of competition that FSU has played during that span, but the other part has been getting Evans increasingly more playing time.

Getting Evans into playing shape and comfortable is going to allow Forrest to stay fresh throughout the season, which will be key to the Seminoles' postseason plans.

"I feel like we definitely need to have a good tandem at the one position just to wear out teams by playing off of each other," Forrest said.

"He's not a little small guy. He's a pretty big guard for his size. He gets after it defensively too. He'll be able to use the size to his advantage the more he gets comfortable playing. The more games he gets under his belt."

FSU's competition level is going to ratchet up this weekend as the Seminoles take on Tennessee today and either Purdue or VCU on Saturday in the Emerald Coast Classic and then at Indiana in the ACC/B1G Challenge Tuesday. Evans is going to be relied on in all three games and FSU needs him to take the next step in his development.

"He has to improve and learn and grow on the fly," Hamilton said.

"We don't have any more time to get him extra minutes where we can afford to make mistakes and not have to pay for it with the level of competition that we face next couple weeks."

Malik Osborne's Versatility Paying Dividends Early In His Florida State Career

Days before his Florida State debut, Malik Osborne found out it would go a little differently than expected.

The redshirt sophomore on the FSU men's basketball team had worked all preseason with the guards as he transitioned away from the center role he played in high school and in his one year at Rice before transferring to FSU.

And yet, days before the Seminoles took on Pitt last Wednesday, he discovered that a calf strain to projected starting center Dominik Olejniczak would keep him out of the game.

While he had worked with the guards for the majority of the preseason, his 6-foot-9 frame paired with the inexperience of true freshman center Balsa Koprivica caused a change of plans. Osborne would start at center in his FSU debut.

"It was probably like a couple of days before when I heard that Dom was not gonna be able to play, so that it was like, 'Okay, you played big before at Rice and you had some experience,'" Osborne told the *Democrat*.

"It was pretty much like I was a vet big even though I wasn't practicing as a big already so based on my prior experiences, a couple of days before, that's when I knew. I was like, okay, it's time to start game-planning at the five.

"I never really knew I was gonna start and then I got the nod to start for the five so I was like you know it's not about just playing the five, it's about doing what I need to do at that position for what my team needs. It really wasn't a concern for me."

Despite the late change, Osborne has found instant success in a spot he didn't expect to play for the Seminoles (1-1, 0-1 in ACC). After a pair of road games to start the season, he'll finally make his home debut Friday at 7 p.m. against Western Carolina (2-1).

While Osborne transitioned away from playing the center position during his redshirt year, he's still got plenty of experience at the position.

He played center in high school as well as in his only year at Rice, averaging 9.0 points and 6.5 rebounds as a true freshman for the Owls.

This wealth of experience helped it all come back to him quickly when he and the Seminoles needed it most.

"At this point, it's second nature. The techniques, the footwork, all that stuff, it just comes naturally at that point because I've been doing it for so long and for so many reps... Nothing really went away and I'm thankful for it because it's helped our team," Osborne said.

"I'm still working on guard stuff in practice, but I'm also focused on the bigs right now because that's where immediate help and assistance is needed right now."

In his debut in FSU's 63-61 loss to Pitt, Osborne's offensive impact was minimal. He scored two points on four shots. However, he made a significant impact at the other end, wrangling a game-high nine rebounds -- four more than any other Seminole -- and blocking four shots.

Olejniczak was able to play in FSU's second game at Florida Sunday, but he remained limited enough that Osborne was called on to start again.

In his introduction to the FSU-UF rivalry, he made his impact felt as he finished with 10 points and played a major role in keeping SEC Preseason Player of the Year Kerry Blackshear Jr. from hitting a shot from the floor. Blackshear had 10 points, but they all came from the free-throw line.

"It's just huge to show the type of upside that he has and the type of ability, the type of player that he is to be able to go in and make an impact on the position that he's never really played at Florida State," sophomore Devin Vassell told the *Democrat*.

"I'm excited for him to just keep learning the spot because I know that once he really gets it, he's going to be a dominant force."

In short time, FSU head coach Leonard Hamilton has seen significant growth from Osborne in a role no one expected him to have to play entering preseason camp.

"When you are playing in our system, you get accustomed to working on your individual improvement areas, working on your game, thinking that this is what is needed for me to fit in and help our program. All of a sudden now, you lose Dominik and he's the next choice," Hamilton said.

"That was a tremendous adjustment for him. That didn't come easy because just to get in there, draw fouls, he was challenged by that early. A few more practices, I thought he got a little more comfortable. Those are some areas we need to work on because we need everybody to be comfortable in whatever position we put them in in relation to what we need in a particular game."

It's unclear whether FSU will ask Osborne to remain at center or return to more of a perimeter role once Olejniczak is fully healthy and ready to claim the starting center role.

It doesn't much matter to Osborne. He's going to have the same approach regardless.

"Everything is pretty much was the same as far as my mindset, the aggression in and just going out and being who I am and that's just like a rebounder, a hustle player and an energy guy," Osborne said.

"I knew whether I was going to be a perimeter player or play in the post, that that was going to be my mindset regardless."
