#### YALE TALE

After a 10-day break for exams, the Yale men's basketball team returns to action on Sunday. The Bulldogs travel to South Carolina to face Clemson. Tipoff is slated for 4 p.m. The game will be televised on the ACC Network. Video is available on WatchESPN. Yale then takes another break for the holiday before returning south to face North Carolina on Dec. 30.

It's been a very strong start to the season for the Bulldogs, who have won six straight games and sit at 9-3 overall. Yale is ranked No. 11 in the CollegeInsider Mid-Major top 25 poll and was No. 60 in the NCAA's first NET ranking released earlier this week, the highest ranking of any New England school. Yale is the defending Ivy League champion, although four starters from last year's team have moved on. The four – Alex Copeland, Miye Oni, Trey Phills and Blake Reynolds – combined for 4,154 career points, 1,545 rebounds, 897 assists and 310 starts in their careers.

James Jones, The Joel E. Smilow, Class of 1954 Head Coach of the Bulldogs, though, has built a program where there is talent waiting in the wings. In the last 5+ seasons, the Bulldogs, have won 110 games, the most of any Ivy League school, posted a 52-18 record in Ivy games, captured three Ivy League championships, won the first NCAA Tournament game in school history, knocking off Baylor in the first round in 2016, and earned victories over schools from the ACC (Miami), Big 12 (Baylor) and Pac 12 (Washington, California).

Yale is coming off an 83-80 overtime victory over UMass on Dec. 11. It was the Bulldogs' fourth OT game of the season, one shy of the school record set in 1997-98. Yale has won three of the four, including a triple overtime thriller over Siena on Nov. 20.

The Bulldogs have played only three of their 12 games in the friendly confines of the John J. Lee Amphitheater. Yale is 6-3 away from home, including 4-3 in true road games. The Bulldogs are one of only four schools in the nation with four road victories through games of Dec. 19. DePaul, East Tennessee State and William & Mary are the others.

Yale leads the Ivy League in field goal percentage (.468) and field goal percentage defense (.369). The Bulldogs have been among the national leaders in defense for much of the season. They currently sit at No. 14 in field goal percentage defense. Yale also is fourth nationally in defensive rebounds per game (31.0).

The game at Clemson is a homecoming for senior Jordan Bruner, a Columbia, South Carolina, native where he was a three-time all-state and all-region selection at Spring Valley High School. His sister Ashley played for the University of South Carolina and professionally in Portugal.

#### **DID YOU KNOW?**

- Yale University, founded in 1701, is the third oldest college in the United States and one of the foremost research universities in the world. First known as the Collegiate School, it changed its name in 1718 to honor benefactor Elihu Yale.
- In 1889, Yale students adopted the first college mascot, Handsome Dan, a ferocious and enthusiastic fan at early football games. Handsome Dan inspired Cole Porter to write Yale's famous fight song, "Bulldog, Bulldog." Today, the original Handsome Dan continues his reign from the lobby of Payne Whitney Gymnasium. Yale students also adopted the first school colors (1853), fielded the first cheerleaders (1890) and developed the first school fight song (1892).
- Five U.S. Presidents have ties to Yale. William Howard Taft (1878), George H.W. Bush (1948) and George W. Bush (1968) all received their undergraduate degrees from Yale, while Gerald Ford (1941) and Bill Clinton (1973) are both graduates of Yale Law School.
- Chris Dudley, who played 16 seasons in the NBA, is a 1987 Yale graduate. He was a three-time first team All-Ivy selection for the Bulldogs, and in his career with the Cleveland Cavaliers, New Jersey Nets, New York Knicks, Phoenix Suns and Portland TrailBlazers scored 3,473 points and collected 5,457 rebounds.

#### HISTORY LESSONS

Yale and Clemson are playing for the first time since the 2001-02 season, a 68-65 Yale victory. The Bulldogs went on to earn a share of the Ivy League championship that season, their first under James Jones, and beat Rutgers in the first round of the NIT, the first postseason victory in school history. The only other meeting between the teams came in the 1976 IPTAY Classic at Clemson, a Tiger victory. Yale's last win over an Atlantic Coast Conference team came last year, 77-73 over Miami in the Hoophall Miami Invitational at American Airlines Arena.

#### SCOUTING CLEMSON

The Tigers (6-5) cruised to a 68-39 win over Jacksonville on Friday night which snapped a four-game losing streak. Four of Clemson's five losses have come by seven points or less. Two Tigers average double figures in scoring, led by Aamir Simms (12.8 ppg.). Tevin Mack (12.2 ppg.) is the other. Clemson averages nearly eight steals per game. Brad Brownell is in his 11th season as the head coach of the Tigers. He guided Clemson to the Sweet 16 in 2017-18.

#### YALE SUCCESS

#### YALE PICKED THIRD IN IVY PRESEASON MEDIA POLL

If the preseason prognosticators prove correct, Yale will have the opportunity to defend its Ivy League Tournament championship at Harvard in March. The Bulldogs were selected third with 94 points by the 17 media members that voted.

Last year, Yale also was picked to finish third and then promptly went out and captured a share of the league's regular season title, won the postseason tournament at Lee Amphitheater and advanced to the NCAA Tournament where they nearly knocked off No. 3 seed LSU. In fact, the Bulldogs have finished higher than projected in 10 of the last 14 years.

Harvard is the preseason favorite. The Crimson received 15 of 17 first-place votes. Penn, with two first-place votes, was picked second. Princeton was fourth followed by Brown and Columbia. Cornell and Dartmouth tied for seventh with 33 points apiece.

#### IVY LEAGUE RATED 10TH BEST CONFERENCE

The Ivy League heads into the 2019-20 campaign ranked the 10th-best (out of 32) Division I men's basketball conference in the country.

#### NEW ENGLAND ELITE

Yale was the highest ranked college in Connecticut in the 2018-19 final NCAA Net (78) and KenPom (77) rankings. The Bulldogs were second in New England in KenPom and third in NCAA Net.

#### ONI WITH UTAH JAZZ

Miye Oni, the 2019 Ivy League Player of the Year, has begun his professional career with the Utah Jazz. Oni was selected by the Golden State Warriors in the second round of last spring's NBA Draft, but his rights were traded to the Jazz. He was chosen 58th overall. He enjoyed a remarkable career at Yale, finishing 10th in school history with 1,308 career points, fourth all-time with 174 three-pointers, sixth with 91 blocks and 10th with 287 assists.

Oni was the first Bulldog to be drafted since Chris Dudley '87 was a fourthround pick of the Cleveland Cavaliers in 1987. Oni was Yale's highest selection since Tony Lavelli '49 was chosen by the Boston Celtics in the first round in 1949

Oni hopes to become the fourth Bulldog to appear in an NBA game. Dudley played 16 seasons and 886 games between 1987 and 2003 with five franchises (Cleveland Cavaliers, Portland Trailblazers, New Jersey Nets, New York Knicks, Phoenix Suns). Butch Graves appeared in four games with the Cleveland Cavaliers in 1984-85, and Lavelli played two seasons – one for the Celtics (1949-50) and one for the New York Knicks (1950-51).

Oni was the first Ivy Leaguer selected in the NBA Draft since Jerome Allen (1995, 2nd round by Minnesota).

#### OFF COURT SUCCESS, INCLUDES TWO RHODES SCHOLARS

In addition to success on the court, Yale players have shined off it as well. During James Jones' tenure as head coach, two Yale players have been named Rhodes Scholars. The most recent is J.T. Flowers, who played for Yale in 2013-14, and was a 2018 Rhodes Scholar. In 2014-15, Matt Townsend '15 was selected as a Rhodes Scholar and was named the men's basketball Academic All-American of the Year. Javier Duren '15 was a candidate for the 2014-15 Allstate Good Works Team. In 2015-16, Justin Sears was a finalist for the national Senior CLASS Award, which focuses on the total student-athlete and encourages students to use their platform in athletics to make a positive impact as leaders in their communities. Trey Phills was a candidate for the Senior Class Award last year and also was named to the National Association of Basketball Coaches 2019 Give Back Team, which recognized 10 men's student-athletes from across the nation for their outstanding community service efforts.

#### SCHEDULE NOTES

- The Bulldogs play 30 regular season games, including 11 in the friendly confines of the John J. Lee Amphitheater where they posted an 11-2 record last
- Seven opponents played in the post season last year, including two Vermont and North Carolina that reached the NCAA Tournament. Harvard and Clemson were both in the NIT, Stony Brook and Brown played in the CBI, while Cornell participated in the CIT.
- There are three first time opponents San Francisco (Nov. 11), Johnson & Wales (Jan. 12) and Howard (Jan. 20).
- Yale is participating in the NIT Season Tip-Off, which includes road games at Oklahoma State (Nov. 17) and Penn State (Nov. 23). It also includes a pair of neutral site games on Nov. 25-26 at ESPN's Wide World of Sports Complex outside Orlando, Fla. The Bulldogs face Western Michigan on Nov. 25 and then either Seattle or Bucknell on Nov. 26.
- Vermont visits Lee Amphitheater on Dec. 1. The Bulldogs and Catamounts have each been among the most successful programs in New England in recent years and both played in the NCAA Tournament a year ago.
- Yale is playing North Carolina for the first time since 1980 and the eighth time overall. The first meeting in 1921 resulted in Yale's 300th all-time victory 32-30. The Bulldogs hosted the Tar Heels in Payne Whitney Gym in 1974, a 70-53 UNC victory.
- Ivy League play kicks off on Jan. 17 at home vs. Brown. The Bulldogs play five of their first six league games in Lee Amphitheater.
- The first of two meetings with Harvard is set for Feb. 7 in New Haven. The Bulldogs play at Lavietes Pavilion one month later on Mar. 7.
- Yale hopes to return to Lavietes one week later for the Ivy League Tournament. The top four regular-season finishers qualify for the tournament, which will be Mar. 14 and 15 in Cambridge. The Bulldogs have earned a spot in the tournament in each of the first three years.



## **HEAD COACH JAMES JONES**



- Longest tenured head coach in the Ivy League. In his 21st season at the helm in 2019-20.
- Winningest men's basketball coach in school history. Second winningest coach in Ivy League history. His 169 Ivy wins are the third most in league history.
- Has guided Yale to four Ivy League championships 2002, 2015, 2016, 2019 - two NCAA Tournament appearances and five postseason appearances.
- 2019 recipient of the Ben Jobe Award as the top minority coach in Division I men's basketball.
- Ivy League and NABC District 13 Coach of the Year in 2015 and 2016.
- Mentored numerous players who have gone on to play professionally, including Miye Oni, who in 2019 became the first Ivy Leaguer selected in the NBA draft since Penn's Jerome Allen in 1995. Oni, the 2019 Ivy League Player of the Year, was picked in the second round with the 58th overall selection and is currently a member of the Utah Jazz.
- Has presided over the most successful era in the long history of Yale Basketball. Over the last five seasons, Yale has a remarkable 52-18 Ivy record. During that stretch, the Bulldogs have won three league titles and made two NCAA Tournament appearances, including earning the first NCAA victory in school history.
- In 2015-16, led the Bulldogs to the most successful season in school history. Yale won 23 games, the most since 1906-07, captured a second straight Ivy League title with a 13-1 record, matching the 1961-62 team for the best in school history, and advanced to the NCAA Tournament for the first time in 54 years where the Bulldogs upset Baylor.
- In 2014-15, guided the Bulldogs to 22 wins and a share of the Ivy title. One of the victories came over defending national champion UConn, just the second time an Ivy League team knocked off a defending NCAA champion.
- In 2001-02, Jones led the Bulldogs to their first Ivy title since 1962-63 and the first postseason victory in school history. The team won 21 games and reached the second round of the NIT after a victory at Rutgers in the first round.
- Inducted into the New England Basketball Hall of Fame in 2015.
- Served as an assistant coach to Villanova's Jay Wright for the 2007 USA Basketball Men's Pan American Games Team.
- 1986 University at Albany graduate. Earned master's in educational administration from Albany in 1995. Played for and coached with the legendary Dr. Richard Sauers at Albany.
- Younger brother Joe spent seven seasons as the head coach at Ivy League rival Columbia and is currently the head coach at Boston University.




