GAME 16 NOTEBOOK

- Carolina is 8-7 overall, including 1-3 in ACC play. The Tar Heels have lost two conference home games in a row, 96-83 to Georgia Tech and 73-65 to Pittsburgh.
- Clemson is 7-7, 1-3 in the ACC.
- Carolina has lost seven of its last 10 games since beginning the season with wins in its first five games.
- The Tar Heels are 2-4 since leading scorer Cole Anthony was sidelined with a right knee injury.
- Carolina has not lost three consecutive home games since dropping four straight in 2010.
- Carolina's seven losses in its first 15 games are the most since the 2001-02 team went 5-10 in its first 15 games (and 5-11 in the first 16).
- The Clemson game is the finale of a season-long four-game homestand for the Tar Heels. It began with a 70-67 win over Yale prior to the losses to Georgia Tech and Pittsburgh.
- The Clemson game is UNC's 500th game in the Smith Center. The Tar Heels are 423-76 in the Smith Center since the building opened on 1/18/1986. That includes a 215-59 record in ACC play.
- Carolina has won 423 of its 992 home wins in the Smith Center (42.6 percent).
- Carolina is 4-4 at home this season (4-3 at the Smith Center and 0-1 at Carmichael). This is the first time UNC has lost four times at home games since 2014-15, when the Tar Heels went 10-5 at the Smith Center.

GARRISON'S STELLAR PLAY

- Junior forward Garrison Brooks has played well all season, performing at an even higher clip in the last six games without Cole Anthony.
- For the season, the LaFayette, Ala., native is averaging 14.4 points and 8.8 rebounds, shooting 54.7 percent from the floor. With Anthony, Carolina's leading scorer at 19.1 points per game, out of action, Brooks has increased his production to 18.7 points and 9.8 boards per game and is shooting 58.9 percent from the floor.
- Brooks is second in the ACC in field goal percentage, third in rebounding and fourth in offensive rebounding, while playing the seventh-most minutes in the league. He's averaging just under 11 minutes more per game than he did a year ago when he started every game.
- Brooks has double-doubles in each of the last three games, including 35 points and 11

rebounds against the Yellow Jackets and 21 and 10 vs. Pitt. He has five career double-doubles, all this season.

- Brooks tied his career high with nine field goals against both Georgia Tech and Pitt, went 17 for 18 from the free throw line vs. Tech and hit his first career three (to tie the game late in the second half) vs. the Panthers.
- He was UNC's defensive player of the game against Pittsburgh, his team-leading seventh award of the season and the 27th of his career. He was UNC's defensive player of the year as a sophomore in 2018-19.

SERIES VS. CLEMSON

- Carolina is 133-21 against the Tigers, including an NCAA-record 59-0 in Chapel Hill and 28-0 in the Smith Center.
- The Tar Heels won at Clemson, 81-79, on 3/2/19 in the only matchup from a season ago.
- Carolina has won 11 of the last 12 games against the Tigers.
- Roy Williams is 21-3 against Clemson, all while head coach of the Tar Heels.
- The teams are not scheduled to play this season at Clemson.
- This is the first time UNC has played host to the Tigers as an unranked team in the AP poll since 2014.
- Carolina was ranked in the AP poll in 36 of the 42 previous games against Clemson in Chapel Hill dating back to 1964.

- Coby White (28) and Cameron Johnson (19) both made six three-pointers. It was the first time in UNC history two Tar Heels made six three-pointers in a game.
- The Tar Heels won at Clemson for the eighth time in the last 10 tries.
- Roy Williams left the court with 55 seconds to play in the first half due to vertigo and did not return to the bench. Assistant coach Steve Robinson led the team in Williams' absence.
- Garrison Brooks scored six points and had three rebounds; the six points represent all of UNC's scoring from players active this season.

CHALLENGING SCHEDULE

- Ken Pomeroy ranks UNC's schedule as the 12th most difficult in the country, with the non-conference schedule as the 24th hardest. That's easily the most challenging schedule among ACC teams. The average ACC non-conference strength of schedule (other than UNC) is 211.
- Carolina has already faced five teams that are ranked in this week's AP top 25 (No. 1 Gonzaga, No. 9 Oregon, No. 11 Ohio State, No. 18 Virginia and No. 19 Michigan).
- No.2 Duke (twice), No. 10 Florida State and No. 13 Louisville are upcoming in ACC play.

INJURY BUG

- Mainly due to the injuries, UNC has used five different starting lineups in 15 games. Last season, Roy Williams used two starting lineups – one for 35 games and a different one for one game.
- Freshman guard Anthony Harris tore his right ACL in the second half of the Yale game. Harris missed the first eight games this season due to a left knee injury he suffered as a high school senior. He played for the first time as a Tar Heel at Virginia on 12/8 and scored 14 second-half points in the win over UCLA on 12/21.
- Seven different Tar Heels have combined to miss a total of 46 games due to injury thus far this season: Sterling Manley (15 games– left knee surgery on 12/12/19), Anthony Harris (10– including the first eight games due to left knee injury from high school, and two games after right knee surgery on 1/4/2020), Jeremiah Francis (first 8 games– left knee injury from high school), Cole Anthony (last 6 games– right knee surgery on 12/16/19), Brandon Robinson (first 4 games– right ankle), Andrew Platek (2 games– left ankle) and Leaky Black (1 game– turf toe, right foot).
- Anthony (nine games), Smith (three) and Francis (three) have started at the point this season. This is the first time since 2007-08 UNC started three players at the point in a season (Ty Lawson 29, Quentin Thomas 9 and Bobby Frasor 1).

GARRISON'S BIG OFFENSIVE NIGHT

- Forward Garrison Brooks led all scorers in the Georgia Tech game with a career-high 35 points.
 - It was the most points by a Tar Heel since Brice Johnson's 39 at Florida State on 1/4/2016;
 - He became the fourth Tar Heel and ninth collegiate player to score 35 or more in the Smith Center (with Tar Heels Antawn Jamison, Joseph Forte and Tyler Hansbrough).

- Brooks made 17 of 18 free throws against the Yellow Jackets. His percentage of .944 is the second highest in UNC history among players with 18 or more attempts in a game. The 17 free throws equal the sixth most in any game by a Tar Heel and tie the third most by a Tar Heel in an ACC game.

B-ROB PLAYING AN EXPANDED ROLE

- Brandon Robinson has played in 117 games as a Tar Heel. He established career highs in points (20), three-pointers (5) and minutes played (36) against Yale on Dec. 30 and assists (6) and steals (4) against Georgia Tech on Jan. 4. The Yale game marked the first time Robinson led UNC in scoring in his career.
- He leads the team in total assists (35) and threes (25).
- Robinson has scored in double figures in seven of the 11 games he has played in this season. He reached double figures twice in his first three collegiate seasons.
- Robinson has made 15 three-pointers in the last four games (three vs. UCLA, five vs. Yale, four vs. Georgia Tech and three vs. Pitt). His 25 threes this season are already the most in a season in his collegiate career (23 last year).

REBOUNDING LEADERS ONCE AGAIN

- The Tar Heels lead the nation in rebounds per game (43.9), are fifth in offensive rebounds per game (14.7) and eighth in rebound margin (+9.7). Carolina has led the nation in rebounds per game in each of the previous three seasons.
- Carolina is scoring 14.7 second-chance points per game. UNC averaged 14.4 in 2015-16, 17.6 in 2016-17, 15.1 in 2017-18 and 15.3 in 2018-19.

SCORING/SHOOTING WOES

- Carolina scored a season-high 83 points in the loss to Georgia Tech. It was second time in four games UNC scored 80 or more points, but UNC has lost both those games (GT and Gonzaga). Dating back to the 97-80 loss to Auburn in the 2019 NCAA Tournament, UNC has lost three consecutive games in which it scored 80 or more points. That's the first time UNC has lost three straight games when scoring 80 points since the 1991-92 season (lost 99-94 to NC State, 110-96 at Florida State and 82-80 at Maryland).
- The Tar Heels have shot under 50 percent from the floor in the first 15 games. That's the longest stretch to open a season since the 1959-60 team shot 53.6 percent against Duke in the 16th game.
- Carolina's field goal percentage (.404) is its lowest since the 1957-58 season and its three-point percentage (.301) is its lowest ever.
- Carolina is 10th in the ACC in scoring at 70.3

points per game. Carolina has finished first, first, second and first in the ACC in scoring in the last four seasons.

- In Roy Williams' previous 16 seasons, Carolina has led the ACC in scoring eight times, finished second five times and third three times.
- No Roy Williams-coached team in 16 previous seasons at UNC has averaged fewer than 74.5 points per game (in 2009-10). The lowest scoring average in his 15 seasons at Kansas (1988-2003) was 72.1 in 1998-99. Williams' teams have averaged 80 or more points in 23 of his previous 31 seasons as a head coach.

MEDIA POLLING

- Carolina is not ranked in the Associated Press poll for the fourth week in a row. UNC had been ranked in the top 10 in each of the first five weeks of the 2019-20 AP poll.
- The December 16th poll marked the first time in 107 polls the Tar Heels were not ranked in the AP poll.
- UNC has finished the season in the top 10 in each of the last four seasons (3 in 2015-16, 5 in 2016-17, 10 in 2017-18 and 3 in 2018-19).
- Carolina has been ranked in 922 AP polls, the most rankings of any school in the country.
- Carolina has finished in the Top 10 of the AP poll 38 times, including 27 of the previous 39 years.
- Carolina's 106-week streak of being ranked in the AP poll was the third longest in UNC history and the sixth longest in ACC history.

GAME 1: UNC 76, NOTRE DAME 65

- Cole Anthony scored 23 of his game-high and ACC-record 34 points in the second half to overcome a five-point deficit in the win.
- Anthony set the ACC record for points by a freshman in his debut, breaking the previous mark of 33 set by Duke's RJ Barrett vs. Kentucky a year ago.

- It was Carolina's 700th ACC regular-season win. UNC is the first school to win 700 ACC regular-season games. Duke is second with 650.
- Carolina scored 30 points on 46 possessions in the first half (.65 points per possession) and 46 points on 39 possessions (1.18 PPP) in the second.
- Carolina shot 31.3 percent from the floor in the first half and 64.3 percent (18 of 28) in the second.
- Carolina made 10 of 20 from three-point range (50.0 percent).
- Carolina, which led the nation in rebound margin last year and two of the last three seasons, out-rebounded the Irish, 51-31.
- Five Tar Heels grabbed seven or more rebounds, led by Anthony with 11 (also Garrison Brooks 9, Armando Bacot 8, Leaky Black and Justin Pierce 7 apiece).
- Anthony led both teams in scoring (34), rebounds (11), three-pointers (6) and tied for the team lead in assists (5) and steals (1).

- Anthony was the first Tar Heel freshman with 30 points/10 rebounds since Tyler Hansbrough had 40 and 10 vs. Georgia Tech on Feb. 15, 2006.
- Anthony's 24 field goal attempts equaled the most by any Tar Heel under Roy Williams. Luke Maye attempted 24 at Duke last season.
- Anthony had 23 second-half points, most by a Tar Heel in a half since Coby White had 23 in the second against Miami last season.
- Anthony's 12 field goals were the most by a Tar Heel freshman since Harrison Barnes made 12 against Clemson on March 12, 2011.
- Anthony's six three-pointers were the most by a Tar Heel freshman since Coby White made six against Clemson on March 2, 2019, and were the most ever by a freshman in his debut (previous high was four by Forte in 1999-2000).
- Anthony was the first UNC freshman with a points/rebounds double-double since Sterling Manley against Bucknell on Nov. 15, 2017.
- Anthony was the first Tar Heel point guard with 11 rebounds in a game since Raymond Felton had 11 vs. Villanova in the 2005 NCAA regional semifinal. Other UNC point guards with 11 rebounds in a game were Ed Cota vs. Stanford in 1998-99 and Harvey Salz vs. Notre Dame in 1958-59.
- Four players made their first starts as Tar Heels – Anthony, Leaky Black, Armando Bacot and Christian Keeling (Keeling made 81 starts at Charleston Southern).
- Anthony and Bacot were the 36th and 37th freshmen to start the first game of the season. This was the third time in six seasons two Tar Heel freshmen started the season opener (fifth time multiple freshmen have done that under Roy Williams).
- This was the first time since 2005-06 three Tar Heels started the season opener in their first games in the program (Anthony, Bacot and Keeling). In 2005-06, that was Hansbrough, Bobby Frasor and Marcus Ginyard.
- Andrew Platek was 2 for 2 from three-point range and finished with eight points, four rebounds and two assists. He played a career-high 25 minutes. His previous high in minutes was 17 as a freshman against Western Carolina. Last year, his high was 11 against UNCW.
- Platek scored eight points. His high last season was six at Elon (game two). The eight points are the most he scored since he had 11 vs. Western Carolina on Dec. 6, 2017. It was the third time in his career he made multiple threes.

GAME 2: UNC 78, UNCW 62

- Three Tar Heels had double-doubles in points and rebounds: Anthony (20/10), Brooks (18/12) and Justin Pierce (18/12). It was the sixth time since 1970 three Tar Heels had double-doubles in points and rebounds.
- Anthony became the first UNC point guard with double-figure rebounds in consecutive games.
- Anthony became the first Tar Heel freshman to ever have at least 20 points and 10 rebounds in consecutive games.
- Anthony's 54 points in the first two games set a UNC freshman record (previous was 46 by Rashad McCants in 2002-03) and are second only to Lennie Rosenbluth by any Tar Heel, who had 67 in his first two games as a sophomore in 1954-55. Anthony's 54 tied Donald Washington, who had 54 in his first two games as a sophomore in 1972-73.
- Anthony became the fifth Tar Heel to record double-doubles in his first two games (with Rosenbluth, Larry Miller, Rusty Clark and Sean May).
- Brooks had a career-high 12 rebounds and posted his first career double-double.
- Pierce had 13 points and 10 rebounds in the first half. A second-half three-pointer pushed him past 1,000 career points. Pierce had a career-high six offensive rebounds.
- Platek led UNC in assists for the first time with a career-high four.
- Bacot was struck by an elbow early in the game and played less than three minutes.
- Black tied his career highs with eight points and seven rebounds.

GAME 3: UNC 77, GARDNER-WEBB 61

- Carolina led by three at the half, then went on an 11-0 run to begin the second half. The Bulldogs pulled within four midway through the second half before a layup by Platek and five straight points by Anthony pushed the lead back to double digits.
- Carolina had a 13-0 advantage in fastbreak points in the second half.
- The Tar Heels shot 41.4 percent from the floor in the first half and 50.0 percent in the second.
- Carolina out-rebounded the Bulldogs, 44-23, and out-scored them, 14-5 on second-chance points.
- Anthony led UNC in scoring for the third time in as many games, this time with a game-high 28, and had four steals.
- Anthony (28) and Bacot (12) were the only Tar Heels to score in double figures. It was the 10th time overall and the first time since 3/3/2015 that freshmen were the only Tar Heels in double figures.
- Anthony became the first Tar Heel freshman to ever score at least 20 points in his first three games.
- Anthony scored 82 points in the first three games. The previous high for a freshman in his first three games was 63 by Rashad McCants in 2002-03 (28, 18 and 17).
- Anthony became the fifth Tar Heel to have 28 points and four steals in a game, joining Phil Ford, Al Wood, Michael Jordan and Tyler Hansbrough.
- Bacot had his first collegiate double-double with 12 points and 11 rebounds.

GAME 4: UNC 75, ELON 61

- It was the fourth time in as many games UNC scored less than 80 points, the first time that happened to begin a season in the Roy Williams Era
- It was also the fourth time in as many games UNC held the opposition to 65 or fewer points, the first time that happened to begin a season since 2012-13
- Carolina out-rebounded Elon, 56-25, its largest margin (+31) since out-rebounding Boston College by 35 on 1/9/18.
- It was the fourth consecutive game a freshman led UNC in scoring (Anthony the first three and Bacot).
- Elon led 20-11 with 14:06 to play in the first half. That was Carolina's largest deficit of the season.
- Elon led 33-32 at the half; that was the second time in four games UNC trailed at the half (Notre Dame led 31-30).
- Bacot had a game-high 22 points, 14 rebounds, three blocks and two steals.
- Bacot became the fourth Tar Heel freshman with at least 22 points and 14 rebounds in a game (James Worthy had 24/16 vs. Detroit in 1979-80; Antawn Jamison had 23/14 vs. Duke and 25/14 vs. VMI in 1995-96; Harrison Barnes had 24/16 vs. Long Island in 2011 NCAA first round). None of them also had three blocks.
- Anthony had eight assists and grabbed 10 rebounds, the third time in four games he had at least 10 rebounds.

GAME 5: UNC 76, ALABAMA 67

- Carolina started 5-0 for the fourth year in a row and eighth time in 17 seasons under Roy Williams.
- Carolina out-rebounded Alabama by 29 (60-31).
- Carolina had as many offensive rebounds (23) as Alabama had defensive (23) and scored 23 second-chance points.
- The Tar Heels had a 23-7 edge in offensive rebounds, including 17-5 in the second half.
- Brooks, a LaFayette, Ala., native, tied his career high with 20 points.
- Brooks scored 16 points in the first half, most he has scored in any half as a Tar Heel.
- Bacot posted his third straight double-double with 12 points and 15 rebounds. He is the third Tar Heel freshman with three straight double-doubles – with Mike O'Koren in 1976-77 and Antawn Jamison in 1995-96.
- Bacot scored all 12 of his points in the second half. He had a season-high six offensive rebounds. Those six rebounds led to eight Tar Heel points.
- The 15 rebounds were the most by a UNC freshman since Harrison Barnes had 16 vs. LIU in 2011.
- Senior Brandon Robinson played for the first time this season and scored a career-high 12 points. It was his third career game in double figures.
- Black had career highs in points (9) and rebounds (9).

GAME 6: MICHIGAN 73, UNC 64

- Michigan out-scored the Tar Heels, 21-2, to begin the second half to extend a five-point Wolverine lead at the half to 24, UNC's largest deficit of the season.
- Carolina pulled within eight at 61-69 and had three field goal attempts with less than two

- minutes to play to get closer, but missed all three. Eli Brooks then hit one of his four three-pointers to make it 72-61 Michigan with 1:12 to play.
- Carolina scored its fewest points in the first six games (64) points and allowed a season-high 73.
- Carolina made a season-low two three-pointers (both by Anthony) and shot a season-low 50 percent from the free throw line (10 of 20) and season-low 15.4 percent from three (2 of 13).
- Michigan became the first opponent to shoot 50 percent from the floor this season (28 of 56).
- Anthony led UNC with 22 points, his fourth 20-point game in six collegiate games.

GAME 7: UNC 78, OREGON 74

- The win was the 877th for Williams, surpassing Kentucky's Adolph Rupp for fifth all time in wins by a Division I coach
- Carolina made 20 of 21 free throws for 95.2 percent. It was Carolina's best free throw percentage (min. 20 made or attempted) since 3/11/2007 when the Tar Heels made 23 of 24 (.958) against NC State in Tampa in the 2007 ACC Tournament championship game.
- Carolina came into the game 321st in the country in free throw percentage (.603).
- Carolina went 11 for 11 from the free throw line in the second half.
- It was the 14th consecutive win for the Tar Heels against Pac-12 opponents. Carolina is 15-1 against Pac-12 opponents under Roy Williams.
- Carolina blocked 12 shots, most since UNC had 15 against Northern Kentucky on 12/27/2015.
- Matched its season-high in points with 78.
- It marked the first time UNC has opened the season without scoring 80 points in its first seven games since the 1949-50 season.
- Carolina's 46 points in the opening half were the most in a first half this season and the second most in any half.
- Carolina shot 41.9 percent from the floor. It's the first time since the 1959-60 season UNC has not shot 50 percent from the floor in its first seven games (it took until the 16th game in 1959-60).
- Oregon's 12 three-pointers equaled the high by an opponent in the first seven games.
- Oregon's 22 offensive rebounds were twice as many as any other opponent in the first seven games and the Ducks' 21 second-chance points were the most by an opponent to date this season.
- Bacot had a game-high 23 points, 12 rebounds and six blocked shots. He became the first Tar Heel with 23 points, 12 rebounds and six blocks since 2/19/1995 when sophomore Rasheed Wallace had the same line at Virginia. Those are the only two times in UNC history a player had at least 23/12/6 in a game.
- It was Bacot's fourth double-double in the last five games.
- Bacot was a season-best 9 for 10 from the free throw line (began the game 7 for 17 for the season).
- Bacot's six blocks are the most by a Tar Heel since senior Brice Johnson had eight vs. Florida Gulf Coast in the first round of the 2016 NCAA Tournament in Raleigh.
- The six blocks were the most by a Tar Heel freshman since Ed Davis had six against Virginia Tech on 3/4/2009.

- Robinson scored a career-high 13 points, including a pair of free throws with 0.8 seconds to play to provide the final points of the game. It's the second time in three games Robinson has established a career high in scoring. He also led UNC in assists for the second game in a row with a career-high tying four.
- Anthony was a season-best 6 for 6 from the free throw line, including one-and-ones with 20.7 seconds to play to give UNC a 74-71 lead and 6.0 seconds to play to give UNC a 76-71 advantage.
- Black sprained his right foot in the second half of the game vs. Michigan. He started vs. Oregon and played 8:34 before leaving the game and did not return.
- Junior guard K.J. Smith played 8:16, his longest stint in two seasons as a Tar Heel (he played five at Wake Forest last season). Smith had two assists, including a drive-and-dish to Bacot for a dunk that gave UNC its largest lead at 70-60.
- It was Smith's first two assists of the season and marked his first two-assist game as a Tar Heel.

GAME 8: OHIO STATE 74, UNC 49

- The 25-point margin of defeat was UNC's second-largest in Smith Center history (29 vs. Duke on 1/31/2002, 58-87).
- The 49 points were the third-fewest by UNC in Smith Center history (46 vs. NC State on 2/24/2015 and 48 vs. Boston College on 2/19/2011).
- Carolina shot 27.4 percent, its lowest ever in the Smith Center (previous .279 vs. Iowa on 12/3/2014).
- Ohio State out-scored UNC by 23 points in the second half (45-22), the largest margin ever in a half against UNC in the Smith Center (previous 22 twice; in the second half by Temple on 2/21/1988 and the second half by Maryland on 1/8/1997).
- Carolina shot 28.6 percent in the first half and 25.9 percent in the second. It was the first time UNC shot under 30 percent in both halves since a loss to Michigan State in Portland, Ore., on 11/26/17.
- Anthony led UNC with 15 points and was the only Tar Heel in double figures. It was the first time only one Tar Heel scored in double figures since the 2017 loss to Michigan State (Theo Pinson had 16).
- It was the 17th non-conference loss in the Smith Center in 224 games.
- Bacot left the game with an ankle injury with 12:48 to play in the first half and did not return.
- UNC came into the game No. 1 in the nation in rebounding and No. 2 in rebound margin, but the Buckeyes out-rebounded the Tar Heels, 48-32.
- The loss was the first in eight games against Ohio State.
- UNC is 10-11 all-time in the Challenge, including 5-5 against top-10 opponents and 7-10 vs. ranked teams.
- Carolina scored a season-low 10 points in the paint.

GAME 9: VIRGINIA 56, UNC 47

- Carolina scored 47 points, its fifth-lowest point total under Roy Williams.

- Carolina scored under 50 points in consecutive games (49 vs. Ohio State) for the first time since 2/16/1948 (53-47 loss at Wake Forest) and 2/21/1948 (69-45 loss vs. NC State).
- It marked the fourth time in the Roy Williams Era UNC scored less than 60 points in consecutive games (one instance in 2009-10, 2012-13 and 2013-14 seasons). It was the first time since 1/8/2014 (63-57 loss to Miami) and 1/11/2014 (57-45 loss at Syracuse).
- Williams' teams at Kansas never scored under 60 points in consecutive games.
- Carolina shot only 37.0 percent from the floor, but held the Cavaliers to only 32.7 percent. It was the first time in 27 games that Carolina lost when holding the opponents under 40 percent.
- It was the first time UNC lost to a team that shot under 40 percent since Clemson on 1/30/2018 and the first time an opponent won when shooting under 35 percent since Virginia on 2/27/2017.
- Carolina had won 10 straight road games, including nine ACC road games in a row.
- It was Virginia's fifth straight win over the Tar Heels, which matches UVA's longest streak in the series since 1918-1920.
- Carolina had six assists (one in the first half), its fewest since it had five in an overtime loss at Maryland in 2009.
- It was the second straight game UNC scored 17 field goals. It's the second time since the ACC was formed that UNC made 17 or fewer field goals in consecutive games. In December 1954, UNC made 16 vs. NC State and 17 vs. Duke in the Dixie Classic in Raleigh.
- The Tar Heels made 1 of 14 three-pointers (7.1 percent), their worst three-point performance since making 1 of 18 (5.6 percent) vs. Michigan State on 11/26/2017.
- Carolina was out-rebounded for the second game in a row (37-32).
- The teams combined for only four fastbreak points (two apiece).
- Virginia led 24-18 at the half. The 18 points tied the fewest points in a half by the Tar Heels in the Roy Williams Era (first half vs. Butler in Maui, 11/20/2012; first half vs. NC State on 2/24/2015).

GAME 10: WOFFORD 68, UNC 64

- The was played in Carmichael Arena due to a scheduling conflict with the University's December Commencement taking place at the Smith Center.
- UNC's first regular-season loss at Carmichael since 1/27/1985 against Georgia Tech.
- UNC's first three-game losing streak since January 2018 (at Virginia Tech, vs. NC State, at Clemson).
- UNC lost consecutive home games for the first time since 2015 (NC State and Duke).
- First time a non-conference opponent won consecutive games in Chapel Hill since Kentucky in 2000-01 and 2002-03.

- Played without two starters – Anthony (right knee) and Black (right foot).
- This was the first time Carolina lost after leading at the half (36-32) in 32 such instances.
- Carolina scored only four points off five Wofford turnovers (first time less than five points off turnovers since scoring three against Virginia in the 2018 ACC final in Brooklyn).
- Carolina shot 36.5 percent from the floor (third time in as many games UNC shot under 40 percent).
- UNC lost for the second consecutive game when holding the opponents under 40 percent shooting from the floor (Wofford shot 37.9 percent).
- Brooks had his second career double-double with 17 points and 12 rebounds (tied his career high).
- Robinson scored a career-high 16 points, had a career-high five assists and tied his career high with three three-pointers.
- K.J. Smith started at the point in place of Anthony and scored seven points with four assists and three rebounds. He played 25 minutes and 47 seconds (played 22 in eight games this season before this game).
- Smith's seven points and four assists are his top totals as a Tar Heel and tied his career bests while at Pacific.

GAME 11: GONZAGA 94, UNC 81

- Carolina lost its fourth straight game despite scoring a season-high 81 points (allowed a season-high 94).
- Gonzaga shot 72.0 percent from the floor in the second half (18 of 25) and 59.3 percent for the game. It was the highest an opponent has shot in a half since 2/3/2007, when NC State shot 76.5 percent in the second half in Raleigh.
- It was the second time the opponents have shot 50 percent for a game this season and was the highest an opponent has shot in a game (.593) since Pitt shot 64.9 percent on 2/14/2015.
- Carolina shot 45.6 percent from the floor, its highest since shooting that against Gardner-Webb in the third game of the season (equalled the second-highest percentage in the first 11 games).
- Carolina shot 51.6 percent from the floor in the second half. It was the first time in 16 halves UNC shot 50 percent from the floor (third time in 22 halves this season).
- Gonzaga out-scored the Tar Heels, 23-14, on fastbreak points and 19-7 on points off turnovers. The fastbreak points were the most since Notre Dame had 26 and the points off turnovers were the most by an opponent in the first 11 games.
- Brooks led UNC with 16 points and three assists.
- Freshmen Jeremiah Francis and Anthony Harris combined for 19 points. Francis scored 11 and had three assists and two steals; Harris added eight points.
- Christian Keeling scored a season-high 12, his first game in double figures as a Tar Heel.
- Carolina scored a season-high 53 points off the bench (previous high was 28 at UNCW).
- Brooks scored 16 of the 28 points scored by UNC's starters.
- Robinson became ill at halftime and was unable to play in the second half.

GAME 12: UNC 74, UCLA 64

- The win ended a four-game losing streak for the Tar Heels, their longest since 2009-10.
- It was UNC's fifth straight win over UCLA and Carolina's ninth in the last 10 games against the Bruins.
- The Tar Heels improved to 10-3 all-time against UCLA. UNC's winning percentage of .769 is the highest against the Bruins (among teams that have played UCLA 10 or more times).
- It was UNC's 15th win in row against Pac-12 opponents. UNC improved to 16-1 under Roy Williams against the Pac 12.
- Five Tar Heels scored in double figures, led by Bacot with 15. It was the first time this season five Tar Heels scored in double figures. It was just the second time at least four players scored in double figures (four vs. Alabama).
- Bacot (15), Harris (14) and Francis (12) scored in double figures. It was the first time three UNC freshmen scored in double figures since 11/12/2010 against Lipscomb (14 by Harrison Barnes, 12 by Reggie Bullock and 10 by Kendall Marshall).
- Carolina forced 22 turnovers that led to 22 points. The 22 turnovers were the most by an opponent in the first 12 games (previous 16 by Michigan) and the 22 points were the most UNC converted (previous 21 against the Wolverines).
- The Tar Heels improved to 81-9 under Roy Williams when they force 20 or more turnovers. UNC has won six in a row and 13 of the last 14 when the opponents commit 20 or more turnovers.
- Carolina made a season-high 22 free throws (and attempted a season-high 35).
- Bacot had his fifth double-double with 15 points and 12 rebounds.
- Harris scored all of his season-high 14 points in the second half. He scored eight straight Tar Heel points in a 10-2 run that extended UNC's lead to 12 with 5:56 to play.
- Francis hit a first-half three and made 9 of 10 free throws in the second half.
- Harris scored in double figures for the first time as a Tar Heel. Harris and Francis were a plus 15 vs. UCLA (Brandon Robinson was a team-high plus 16).
- Robinson tied his career high with three three-pointers.
- Black had a career-high three steals.
- Carolina's 13-point halftime lead (36-23) was its largest of the season (previous 11, 40-29, at UNCW on 11/8).
- Carolina improved to 4-2 in the CBS Sports Classic (2-0 vs. Ohio State, 2-0 vs. UCLA and 0-2 vs. Kentucky).
- The Tar Heels are now 1-1 at T-Mobile Arena and 5-3 in Las Vegas.

GAME 13: UNC 70, YALE 67

- The win was the 879th for Roy Williams, which tied him with Dean Smith for fourth place in NCAA history for wins by a Division I head coach.
- It also tied Williams with Gary Williams for third place in wins by an ACC head coach with 461.
- UNC finished the season 7-4 in regular-season non-conference games and the calendar year 2019 with a 28-9 record.
- Yale led 11-2. The nine-point deficit UNC overcame to win matched the largest comeback win in the first 13 games. Elon led UNC by nine in UNC's 75-61 victory.
- Carolina had 15 offensive rebounds to one for Yale. The Tar Heels had a 14-3 advantage in second chance points.
- It was the second time in three games the Tar Heels allowed just one offensive rebound (Gonzaga).
- UNC's eight turnovers equaled a season low (also at UNCW).
- Robinson had career highs in points (20) and three-pointers (5).
- Brooks (11 points, 11 rebounds) had his third career double-double.
- Pierce had 14 points and seven rebounds. It was his second game scoring in double figures as a Tar Heel.
- Francis made his first career start at the point. He is the third Tar Heel to start at the point this season. Cole Anthony started the first nine games; K.J. Smith started against Wofford, Gonzaga and UCLA.
- It's the first time UNC has started three different players at the point (not counting senior nights) since 2007-08 (Ty Lawson 29 starts, Quentin Thomas 9 and Bobby Frasor 1).
- Harris left the game in the second half with an injury to his right knee. He had six points in 13 minutes vs. Yale before the injury.

GAME 14: GEORGIA TECH 96, UNC 83

- The 20-point deficit (47-27) was UNC's largest ever at the half in the Smith Center (previous was 18 against Duke on March 9, 2013).
- Tech's 96 points were the most it scored against UNC since a 108-100 win in double overtime in Atlanta in 1998.
- Tech's 96 points matched the most Tech has ever scored against UNC in Chapel Hill (also in 1994).
- The 13-point margin was Tech's largest win in Chapel Hill (previous was 92-83 in overtime on 2/10/1996).
- Carolina's 83 points were a season high (previous and only other time with 80 or more was 81 in a loss to Gonzaga).
- Carolina missed its first 15 shots from the floor. Brooks made UNC's first field goal with 6:50 to play in the first half.
- Tech shot 59.0 percent from the floor, the third team to shoot at least 50 percent against UNC (.593 by Gonzaga, .590 by Tech and .500 by Michigan, all losses).
- Tech's 96 points, 36 field goals and 11 steals were the most against UNC this season.
- Tech's 19 assists tied Wofford for the most against UNC this season.
- Tech's 58 points in the paint were 20 more than any other team scored in the paint this season (38 by Gonzaga).
- Tech's 21 points off turnovers equaled the 21 scored by UCLA.

- Carolina shot 50 percent from the floor in the second half when it scored 56 points (in winning the half by seven).
- Carolina's 56 second-half points were nine more than UNC scored in any other half this season (47 in the second half vs. Gardner-Webb).
- It was the fourth time UNC shot 50 percent or better in a half this season (all second halves).
- Carolina missed 18 shots in the first half (16 field goal attempts and two free throws) but did not score a second-chance point. The Tar Heels did score 19 second-chance points in the second half (UNC missed 22 shots in the second half).
- The 19 second-chance points were the most by UNC since it had 22 against Oregon.
- UNC made 23 of 27 free throws. The loss snapped a streak of 13 straight wins when UNC made 20 or more free throws. It was the first loss when UNC made 20 or more from the line since the loss to Wofford on 12/20/2017.
- Brooks scored a career-high 35 points, most by a Tar Heel this season.
- The 35 points were the most by a Tar Heel since Brice Johnson scored 39 at Florida State on 1/4/2016.
- Brooks is the fourth Tar Heel and ninth player overall to score 35 or more in the Smith Center (three times by Antawn Jamison and twice by both Joseph Forte and Tyler Hansbrough).
- Brooks matched his career high with nine field goals (Wofford) and made a career-best 17 of 18 from the free throw line. He came into the game shooting 61.8 percent from the line for the season and had made six of his last 16 from the line.
- Brooks' free throw percentage of .944 was the second best in UNC history for players with 18 or more attempts. York Larese's ACC record of 21 for 21 (100 percent) vs. Duke on 12/29/1959 is the only better performance from the line (at least 18 attempts).
- The 17 made free throws match the second most by a Tar Heel in the Smith Center. Tyler Zeller made 20 of 23 vs. Maryland in 2012 and Tyler Hansbrough made 17 of 19 in a double OT win over Clemson in 2008.
- The 17 free throws were the most by a Tar Heel this season and most since Zeller's 20 vs. Maryland on 2/29/2012.
- Brooks also had a career-best seven offensive rebounds (previous five several times).
- Robinson had a career-high six assists and four steals.
- Pierce scored 11 points. It was the first time he has scored in double figures in consecutive games as a Tar Heel.

GAME 15: PITTSBURGH 73, UNC 65

- The loss ended a six-game UNC win streak against Pittsburgh and was UNC's first loss in eight games vs. the Panthers in Chapel Hill.
- Carolina led by 14 points (32-18) with 3:08 to play in the first half. The 14-point lead was UNC's largest in a loss this season.
- Brooks and Bacot were a combined 15 of 23 from the floor (.652), while the rest of the team was 10 for 38 (.263).
- Carolina had won six of the seven games it led at the half this season. UNC led 37-28 at the half.
- It was only the 16th time in 35 seasons UNC lost a game at the Smith Center when it led at the half (354-16 when leading at the half in the Smith Center).

- It was UNC's largest halftime lead in a loss at the Smith Center since Jan. 8, 1997. UNC led Maryland 50-38 (12) at the half in an 85-75 Maryland win.
- Pittsburgh out-scored the Tar Heels by eight from the free throw line (18-10) and by 12 from three-point range (27-15).
- Brooks posted a double-double (21 points and 10 rebounds) for the third time in as many games. He had two in his career prior to the Yale, Georgia Tech and Pittsburgh games.
- Brooks tied his career high with nine field goals for the second game in a row.
- Brooks made the first three-pointer of his career. He's now 1 for 2 from three-point range.
- Bacot was 6 for 11 from the floor for 15 points and had a season-high four assists. He had made six field goals in his previous three games (one in the last two).
- Black tied his career high with nine points.
- Robinson made three 3FGs and has made 15 in the last four games.

- One of six coaches to win three or more NCAA titles with John Wooden (10), Mike Krzyzewski (5), Jim Calhoun (3), Bob Knight (3) and Adolph Rupp (3).

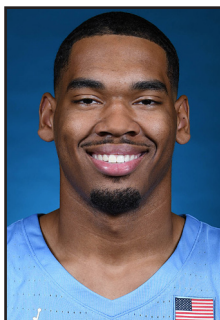
