This week, Clemson quarterback Trevor Lawrence (31-1) can tie the Clemson record for career wins by a starting quarterback, held jointly by Rodney Williams (32 from 1982-85), Tajh Boyd (32 from 2010-13) and Deshaun Watson (32 from 2014-16). Lawrence opened his career with wins in his first 25 consecutive starts prior to suffering his only loss in last year's College Football Playoff National Championship. Dating to his time at Cartersville (Ga.) High School, he is 64-0 in regular season games as a starter, as his only losses across those two levels have come in postseason play.

His backfield counterpart, running back Travis Etienne, already has a collection of Clemson records and ACC records in hand. He can add another on Saturday, as he enters the contest 43 yards away from becoming the ACC's all-time leading rusher and breaking the record held by NC State's Ted Brown (4,602 from 1975-78).

WHAT TO WATCH FOR THIS WEEK

- Clemson playing on the 124th anniversary of its football debut. Clemson earned a 14-6 win against Furman in its first game on Oct. 31, 1896.

- Clemson attempting to open a season 7-0 for the ninth time in school history, joining the 1948, 1981, 2000, 2011, 2015, 2016, 2018 and 2019 seasons.

- Clemson attempting to improve to 15-7 all-time in games played on Halloween. A win would push Clemson to 7-2 all-time in Halloween home games a give Clemson a 6-1 mark at Death Valley on that date since the Memorial Stadium's opening in 1942.

- Clemson and Boston College meeting in Death Valley in consecutive years for the first time. It will be the first time the teams have played one another in back-toback seasons at the same venue. The only time in the series the teams faced one another in the same region in back-to-back years was in the 1950s, when Clemson faced Boston College at Braves Field in 1952 and then at Fenway Park in 1953.

- Clemson attempting to improve to 19-9-2 all-time against Boston College, dating to the teams' first meeting in the Cotton Bowl on New Year's Day in 1940.

- Clemson attempting to win its 10th consecutive game against Boston College, dating back to 2011. Clemson's nine-game winning streak against Boston College is its second-longest active streak against an ACC opponent, trailing Clemson's 12-game active winning streak against Wake Forest.

- Clemson attempting to record its eighth winning streak of 10 or more games against a single opponent all-time.

Note: A win Saturday would give Clemson a 10th consecutive victory against Boston College and its eighth 10-game winning streak against a single opponent all-time.

- Clemson attempting to improve to 12-4 against Boston College since the Eagles joined the ACC in 2005. - Clemson attempting to improve to 7-0 against Boston

College at home under Head Coach Dabo Swinney. - Boston College facing an undefeated Clemson team for the sixth straight season. The last time Boston College

faced a Clemson team with a loss on its ledger was in 2014 when the 4-2 Tigers defeated the 4-2 Eagles, 17-13.

- Clemson entering the game having not trailed in regular season play since the final minute of the second quarter of its game against North Carolina on Sept. 28, 2019. Clemson has not trailed at any point of its last 13 regular season games (final seven games in 2019 and the first six in 2020). Clemson has played 810:33 of regular season game action since it last trailed in a regular season game.

- Clemson entering the contest having held Boston College to seven points in each of the teams' last three meetings. If Clemson holds Boston College to seven or fewer points for a fourth straight meeting, it would be Clemson's first time holding a single ACC opponent below that threshold in four straight years since 1993-96, when the Tigers' series against Maryland produced three straight shutouts from 1993-95 plus a 35-3 win in 1996.

- Clemson playing its final of four home games in the month of October. October 2020 is the seventh time Clemson has played at least four home games in a single month, joining the 1920, 1987, 1989, 1993, 2008 and 2011 campaigns. In every instance (including this year), Clemson posted a winning record in those contests.

- Clemson attempting to win four home games in a single month for only the second time in school history. Clemson opened the 2011 season with four consecutive home games in September, earning wins against Troy, Wofford, Auburn and Florida State to kick off an ACC Championship season.

- Clemson attempting to secure its eighth five-win month in school history. Clemson went 5-0 in October 1977, October 1981, November 1991, September 2000, October 2015, September 2017 and September 2018.

- Clemson attempting to win a 27th consecutive home game to extend its school record for the longest home winning streak and longest home unbeaten streak in school history. Of the 120 players on Clemson's 2020 roster, 111 have never experienced a home loss in their Clemson careers. Nine fifth-year seniors on Clemson's 2020 roster were on the 2016 team that recovered from a home loss to Pitt by winning the national championship that season.

- Though 2020 is technically being played sans divisions, Clemson attempting to defeat a traditional ACC Atlantic Division opponent for a 17th straight time and for the 37th time in its last 38 opportunities.

- Clemson attempting to win a 28th consecutive game against an ACC opponent, including postseason play. A 28-game winning streak against conference opponents would tie Clemson with the 2012-15 Florida State Seminoles (28) for the second-longest streak in ACC history.

- Clemson entering the game having won 35 consecutive regular season games, the longest such streak in ACC annals. Clemson's last regular season loss came in October 2017 at Syracuse. A 36th consecutive regular season win would pass the 2008-10 Boise State Broncos (35) for the longest such streak in ESPN Stats & Info data back to 2005.

- Clemson attempting to win a 39th consecutive non-bowl game, which would tie the 2000-03 Miami Hurricanes for the second-longest streak in the AP Poll era. Clemson has won 38 straight non-bowl games, including 35 regular season games and three conference championship games.

- Clemson attempting to improve to 26-1 in October games in the College Football Playoff era (since 2014).

- Clemson attempting to push its winning streak in Saturday games to 50 to extend the longest Saturday winning streak in FBS history.

- Clemson playing its 21st game all-time while ranked No. 1 in the AP Poll, the 15th-most since the poll's inception in 1936. It will be Dabo Swinney's 20th game coached at No. 1, passing Jim Tressel for sole possession of 17th all-time.

- Clemson attempting to improve to 19-2 all-time when ranked No. 1 by the Associated Press. Clemson has never lost a regular season game as the nation's top-ranked team.

- Clemson entering the game ranked 10th in the country in both total offense (518.0 yards per game) and total defense (274.7). Clemson and Northwestern (which has played only one game) are the only schools in the Top 10 in both categories.

- Clemson, which has won each of its first six games by at least 18 points, attempting to win each of its first seven games of a season by that margin for the first time in school history. Clemson would join 1993 Florida State and 1995 Florida State as the only ACC teams to do so.

- Clemson, which has scored at least 37 points in each of its first six games, trying to open a season with seven consecutive games of 37 points or more for the first time in school history. Clemson would join 1995 Florida State and 2013 Florida State as the only ACC teams ever to accomplish the feat.

- Clemson attempting to score 40 points in a sixthstraight game, which would tie the school record set last season.

- Clemson attempting to open a season with 400 yards of offense in each of the first seven games of a season for the third time since 2000 (2000 and 2018).

- Clemson attempting to throw for 300 yards in a third straight game for the first time since a four-game stretch against NC State, Wake Forest, South Carolina and Virginia last season.

- Clemson entering the game having allowed opponents to complete only 50 percent or fewer of their passes in five out of the team's six games this season. Clemson's five games this season allowing a completion percentage of 50 percent or less are the most in the country, leading

Appalachian State, Louisiana-Monroe, Navy and UAB (three each).

- Clemson attempting to win the turnover margin in a fifth-straight game. Clemson had a nine-game streak winning the margin prior to last year's National Championship Game.

- Clemson entering Saturday having played its last 16 complete games without having surrendered a point off of a turnover defensively. Clemson's only points off a turnover in that span came on a pick-six surrendered by the offense vs. Syracuse last week.

- Clemson attempting to produce multiple takeaways in a fifth straight game for the first time since the final three games of the 2018 season and the first two games of the 2019 season.

- Clemson attempting to produce at least three takeaways in a fourth straight game for the first time since the 2008-09 seasons.

- Clemson, which recorded three interceptions against Syracuse last week, attempting to pick off at least three passes in consecutive games for the first time since 2008 against Virginia and South Carolina.

- Clemson entering the game having recorded multiple sacks in 28 of its last 29 games, including each of its last 12.

- Clemson, which has two fumble returns for touchdowns already this season, attempting to record a third scoop-and-score in a season for the first time in school records back to 1951. Clemson's two fumble return touchdowns in 2020 match the totals by the 1996, 1998, 2006 and 2013 squads.

- Clemson (two) entering the game as one of 16 FBS teams (and one of three ACC teams) with multiple defensive touchdowns this season.

- Clemson (two) attempting to record a third defensive touchdown for a fourth straight season, which would be Clemson's longest streak in records back to 1951.

- Clemson entering the game having rushed for at least 100 yards in each of its last 29 games, Clemson's longest streak since a 61-game streak across the 1987-93 seasons. Clemson has rushed for at least 100 yards in all but one game since the start of the 2018 season, a 91-yard rushing performance against NC State on Oct. 20, 2018.

- Tight end Davis Allen attempting to become the first Clemson player with a touchdown catch in four straight games since Tee Higgins' five-game streak last season.

 Allen attempting to become the first Clemson tight end with a touchdown catch in four consecutive games since a five-game streak by Jordan Leggett in 2015.

- Running back Travis Etienne (at least one rushing or receiving touchdown in 41 of his 49 career games) attempting to score a touchdown of any kind in a 42nd career game, breaking the FBS record held by San Diego State's Donnel Pumphrey from 2013-16. (**NOTE: Entering the 2020 season, the NCAA FBS Record Book listed Florida's Tim Tebow (38 games from 2006-09) and Louisiana Tech's Kenneth Dixon (38 from 2012-15) as the record-holders for most career games scoring a touchdown. Etienne was believed to have broken that record by scoring in a 39th career game against Miami. However, after additional research by ESPN, the NCAA acknowledged an error in its record book and updated it to reflect Pumphrey scoring a touchdown in 41 games from 2013-16.*)

- Etienne (4,560) needing 43 rushing yards to break the ACC career rushing record held by NC State's Ted Brown (4,602 from 1975-78).

- Etienne attempting to record his 20th career 100yard rushing game to tie NC State's Joe McIntosh and Boston College's AJ Dillon for seventh-most in ACC history. Etienne's 19 100-yard rushing games are already a Clemson record.

- Etienne entering the game with two career 100-yard games against Boston College. Earlier this year against Wake Forest, he tied the school record held by Kenny Flowers (vs. Duke, 1983-85) and Wayne Gallman (vs. South Carolina, 2014-16) with three career 100-yard rushing games against a single opponent (three). This week, he can become the first Clemson player to post three career 100-yard games against multiple opponents.

- Etienne (64) needing two rushing touchdowns to tie or three rushing touchdowns to pass Florida Atlantic's Devin Singletary (66) for sixth-most career rushing touchdowns according to official NCAA FBS records.

- Etienne (71) needing four touchdowns of any kind to tie Texas' Ricky Williams (75) for the fifth-most career total touchdowns of any FBS player since 1956.

- Etienne attempting to rush for three touchdowns in back-to-back games for the first time since doing so in a school-record three straight games against Syracuse, Wake Forest and NC State in 2018.

- Etienne (426) needing five points to surpass Duke's Ross Martin (430 from 2012-15) for second on the ACC's career scoring leaderboard. Etienne is already Clemson's all-time leading scorer and the only non-kicker in ACC history with at least 400 career points.

- Etienne (5,982) needing 18 all-purpose yards to join C.J. Spiller as the only players in ACC history to record 6,000 career all-purpose yards.

- Etienne (4,583) needing 32 combined rushing and passing yards to pass Homer Jordan (4,614) for 11th on Clemson's career leaderboard for total offense.

- Etienne (861) needing 139 receiving yards to reach 1,000 career receiving yards. He would become only the 12th player in FBS history to record at least 4,000 rushing yards and at least 1,000 receiving yards in a career.

- Quarterback Trevor Lawrence (31-1 as a starter) attempting to tie the school record for wins as a starting quarterback. Rodney Williams, Tajh Boyd and Deshaun Watson are all presently tied for the record with 32 wins each.

- Lawrence (17) entering the sixth game of the season three touchdowns shy of the mark for the most passing touchdowns through Clemson's first seven games, set by Deshaun Watson (20) in the first seven games of 2016.

- Lawrence (97) needing three more combined rushing and passing touchdowns to join Tajh Boyd (133), Lamar Jackson (119), Deshaun Watson (116) and Philip Rivers (112) as the only players in ACC history to be responsible for 100 career touchdowns.

 Lawrence, who threw his 17th career touchdown pass of 50 yards or more two weeks ago, attempting to record another 50-yard touchdown pass to surpass Tajh Boyd (17) for the most by a Clemson quarterback since 1950.

- Lawrence (10) attempting to post his 11th career 300-yard passing game. He, Tajh Boyd (18) and Deshaun Watson (13) are the only players in school history to record double-digit career 300-yard passing games.

- Lawrence attempting to record his 19th career game with three or more passing touchdowns. He presently stands at 18 such games, four shy of Tajh Boyd's school record of 22. Clemson is 18-0 when Lawrence throws three touchdown passes.

- Lawrence (995) becoming the fourth Clemson player to attempt 1,000 career passes with five more pass attempts. He would join Tajh Boyd (1,402), Charlie Whitehurst (1,368) and Deshaun Watson (1,207).

- Lawrence (9,589) needing 175 combined passing and rushing yards to surpass Charlie Whitehurst (9,763) for third-most career yards of total offense in Clemson history.

- Lawrence (9,589) needing 411 combined passing and rushing yards to join Tajh Boyd (13,069) and Deshaun Watson (12,094) as the only players in Clemson history to record 10,000 yards of total offense in a career.

- Defensive end Myles Murphy (3.5) needing one full sack to pass William Perry (4.0 in 1981), Ricky Sapp (4.0 in 2006) and Shaq Lawson (4.0 in 2013) for third-most sacks by a Clemson true freshman all-time.

- Placekicker B.T. Potter entering the game with four career field goals of 50 yards or more. He is one such field goal shy of the career school record of five held by Chris Gardocki (1988-90) and Donald Igwebuike (1981-84).

- Potter (120-for-120 for his career) entering the game as Clemson's all-time record-holder for consecutive extra points made.

- Receiver Amari Rodgers attempting to catch at least six passes in a fifth straight game. He would be the first to do so since a six-game stretch by Mike Williams in October and November of 2016.

-- ON THE OPPONENT --

SERIES HISTORY VS. BOSTON COLLEGE

Clemson holds an 18-9-2 lead in its series with Boston College dating to the programs' first meeting in the 1940 Cotton Bowl.

Early in the series, the two teams played three games at famed Fenway Park in Boston, the home of the Boston Red Sox. Clemson won its first game there in 1941 — just 13 days after Ted Williams finished his .406 season for the Red Sox — by a 26-13 score. The teams met at Fenway again the following year, and Boston College won, 14-7. The two teams played to a 14-14 tie in 1953 at Fenway, evening the series' all-time record at Fenway Park at 1-1-1.

The two teams also played at Braves Field in Boston, then the home of the National League's Boston Braves. Clemson had a 3-1 advantage in games played at Braves Field, all between 1942-52. Clemson has a 9-6-1 lead in the series in games played in Boston or Chestnut Hill.

The Tigers have won 11 of the 12 games played against Boston College since Dabo Swinney became Clemson's head coach on an interim basis on Oct. 13, 2008, including his first win as a head coach on Nov. 1, 2008. Clemson's only loss to the Eagles in the Swinney era as head coach came on the road in 2010.

Clemson has won each of the last nine games in the series. Boston College's last win in the series took place in 2010, a 16-10 final score. The Eagles have not won at Clemson since 2007, a 20-17 Eagles win that determined the ACC Atlantic Division title.

Clemson has been dominant on defense against Boston College over the last seven years. The Tigers have not allowed the Eagles to score more than 17 points in each of the last seven meetings and have allowed just 31 total points over the last four. Swinney-coached Clemson teams have allowed more than 17 points just twice in his 12 games against the Eagles, a 27-21 road win for Clemson in 2008 and a 45-31 road win in 2012.

The Tigers hold an 11-4 advantage in the series since Boston College joined the ACC for the 2005 season. BC won each of the first three, all by seven points or less, with two overtime finishes.

Five of Clemson's victories in the series took place during undefeated Tiger regular seasons. Clemson won, 26-19, in 1948 on the way to a perfect 11-0 season, and won, 35-14, in 1950 on the way to a 9-0-1 season. Clemson won, 34-17, in 2015 during its perfect regular season and posted a 27-7 win in Chestnut Hill in 2018 en route to a 12-0 regular season and eventual 15-0 national championship finish. Clemson also defeated Boston College, 59-7, in 2019 in the midst of a second-straight perfect regular season.

This will mark the sixth straight season that Clemson has been undefeated going into its annual game against Boston College. Including this year, Clemson has been undefeated going into its game against Boston College in eight of 10 meetings since 2011.

MEMORABLE MEETINGS

1939: The teams first met in the Cotton Bowl on Jan. 1, 1940 to conclude the 1939 season. That was a landmark victory for the Clemson program, as it represented the school's first bowl game and the school's first win over a Top 20 team, as Boston College was ranked 11th in the nation entering the game. Clemson won, 6-3, behind 115 yards rushing from Charlie Timmons and four pass deflections in the fourth quarter by Clemson legend Banks McFadden. Boston College was coached by Frank Leahy, who ranks second in career winning percentage in college football history. Leahy lost only 13 games in 13 years as a head coach (two at BC and 11 at Notre Dame), but one was to Clemson.

1982: The two teams tied in a 1982 game in Death Valley. The game was televised by CBS on a regional basis, the first CBS broadcast from Clemson's Memorial Stadium. Clemson had a 14-0 lead at intermission, but sophomore quarterback Doug Flutie led Boston College back to take a 17-14 lead. The Tigers tied the game in the fourth quarter on a field goal by Donald Igwebuike, who played soccer and football for the Tigers that fall. He then had another attempt from 43 yards with eight seconds left, but the kick missed and the game ended in a 17-17 tie.

1983: At Chestnut Hill, the Eagles gained a 31-16 win behind Doug Flutie, who would win the Heisman Trophy the following year. Clemson had a 16-3 lead with 25 minutes left in the game, but the Eagles went on a 28-0 run behind Flutie to end the contest. He was 20-of-36 for 223 yards and two touchdowns against a Clemson defense that featured All-American William Perry. The Eagles gained 504 yards of total offense on the night, 281 rushing and 223 passing. It was Clemson's only loss in 1983 (9-1-1) and the most yards against Clemson during its 30-2-2 run between the 1981-83 seasons. Clemson had just two losses and two ties over a three-year



period from 1981-83, with one of the losses and one of the ties coming against Boston College in that 1982-83 period.

2005: The 2005 game at Clemson was an overtime meeting, a 16-13 Boston College victory. It was the first between the two schools as an ACC matchup. The game was tied, 10-10, at the end of regulation.

2006: The two teams played a double overtime affair in 2006, a 34-33 Boston College victory as a missed extra point in overtime proved costly for the Tigers.

2008: Dabo Swinney earned his first victory as Clemson's head coach with a 27-21 road win at Boston College. C.J. Spiller totaled 242 all-purpose yards and Clemson scored the game's final 10 points to earn the victory. Clemson jumped out to a 17-0 halftime lead. But Boston College took advantage of several Tiger miscues and scored 21 straight points to take the lead in the fourth quarter. But Spiller's 64-yard kickoff return set up the Tigers' go-ahead touchdown pass to Aaron Kelly and the Clemson defense thwarted Boston College to preserve the win.

2009: Clemson won, 25-7, in Death Valley to collect its first win over the Eagles at Clemson since 1958. Clemson won that 1958 game, 34-12.

2018: Clemson brought home both the O'Rourke-McFadden Trophy and the ACC Atlantic Division Trophy following a 27-7 win in Chestnut Hill, the first two of many trophies collected by the 2018 national champions.

O'ROURKE-McFADDEN TROPHY

This year's matchup represents the 13th time that Clemson and Boston College will play for the O'Rourke-McFadden Trophy, which the Boston College Gridiron Club began sponsoring in 2008. Clemson has won 11 of the 12 years the trophy has been awarded.

The trophy features a leather helmet replica of those used by Charlie O'Rourke of Boston College and Banks McFadden of Clemson when they competed against each other in the 1940 Cotton Bowl in Dallas, Texas. In addition to the trophy presentation, the Boston College Gridiron Club presents a replica leather helmet to the MVP of the winning school in the locker room.

C.J. Spiller won the award for the 2008 game when he had 242 all-purpose yards, and Clemson kicker Richard Jackson won the award for the 2009 game. He kicked six field goals in the Clemson victory, the only kicker at the FBS level to kick six field goals in a game in 2009.

Montel Harris won the award for Boston College in 2010 thanks to his 143 yards rushing and the game's only offensive touchdown. Chandler Catanzaro became the second Clemson kicker to win the honor with his five field goals in the 36-14 Clemson win in 2011. Tajh Boyd won it in 2012 with a 367-yard passing game, and Vic Beasley took the honor in 2013 when he had a fumble return for a touchdown.

Cole Stoudt had 308 yards of total offense in Clemson's 2014 win. Deshaun Watson won it in 2015 and Wayne Gallman in 2016. Travis Etienne made it consecutive Clemson running backs to win the honor in 2017 prior to quarterback Trevor Lawrence securing it in 2018. Wide receiver Diondre Overton is the reigning recipient after he recorded a career-high 119 yards on three receptions for a school-record-tying three touchdowns against the Eagles in 2019.

The Boston College Gridiron Club developed the idea in order to honor the tradition at both schools and to honor the legacy of Charlie O'Rourke and Banks McFadden, who played during the leather helmet era.

O'Rourke led Boston College from the quarterback position to a 26-3-2 record in his three years as the quarterback of the Eagles between 1938-40. One of those three losses was to McFadden and Clemson in the 1940 Cotton Bowl. O'Rourke had his jersey retired at Boston College and was inducted into the College Football Hall of Fame in 1972.

McFadden led the Tigers to a 9-1 record in 1939 as the starting quarterback. Regarded as the greatest allaround Clemson athlete of the 20th century, he was an All-American in football and basketball at Clemson. The 1939 football team finished 12th in the final AP poll, Clemson's first Top 20 season on record, and the win over Boston College in the Cotton Bowl was Clemson's first bowl appearance. In the spring of 1939, he led Clemson to the Southern Conference basketball championship. McFadden was inducted into the College Football Hall of Fame in 1959, Clemson's first inductee.

LAST MEETING VS. BOSTON COLLEGE Clemson 56, Boston College 7

(Oct. 26, 2019, Clemson, S.C.)

CLEMSON, S.C. – No. 4/2 Clemson extended the nation's longest winning streak to 23 games at Memorial Stadium on Oct. 26, defeating Boston College, 59-7, on Homecoming.

The Leather Helmet Award, given to the MVP of the game, was bestowed upon Diondre Overton, who hauled in his first three touchdown receptions of the season. Overton recorded three receptions for 119 receiving yards and an average of 39.7 yards a catch. All three of his receptions found the end zone, including scoring catches of 22, 63 and 34 yards.

Travis Etienne recorded his fifth three-touchdown game of his Clemson career, scoring three first-half touchdowns, all from within five yards of the end zone. Etienne rushed for 109 yards on 16 attempts and caught three passes for 33 yards.

Trevor Lawrence continued to shine for the Tigers, completing 16-of-19 passes for 275 yards and three touchdowns. Amari Rodgers added his third touchdown of the season, as Lawrence connected with him for a 19-yard scoring strike.

The Clemson defense held the Boston College rushing attack to only 96 yards. The Eagles came into the contest ranked sixth in the nation and first in the ACC with 278.3 rushing yards per game. Logan Rudolph returned a fumble 39 yards to score his first career touchdown. Chad Smith led the defense with nine total tackles, a forced fumble and a sack.

Clemson outgained Boston College, 674-177. The 497-yard differential was Clemson's biggest since a 558-yard advantage against Kent State on Sept. 2, 2017. It was Clemson's largest yardage differential against an ACC opponent since the conference's founding in 1953, surpassing a 464-yard advantage against Wake Forest in 2000.

CLEMSON'S HALLOWEEN HISTORY

Clemson enters Saturday's Halloween contest with Boston College with a 14-7 record in games played on Halloween all-time. Clemson is 6-2 in Halloween home games, including a 5-1 record in Oct. 31 games in Death Valley.

Included below are some of Clemson's most memorable Halloween moments.

- Oct. 31, 1896: Clemson played its first football game, beating Furman, 14-6, in Greenville, S.C., as Charlie Gentry was credited with scoring the Tigers' first touchdown. One of the members of the squad was Shack Shealy, who would later serve as Clemson's head coach in 1904, becoming the only Clemson graduate ever to serve as head coach of his alma mater.

- Oct. 31, 1953: Clemson won its first ACC game in history, securing an 18-0 victory against Wake Forest in in Clemson.

- Oct. 31, 1970: Don Kelley had the greatest return game in ACC history when he gained 223 yards on interception and punt returns in a 24-11 win against Maryland. He had a record 167 yards in punt returns, including an 85-yarder for a touchdown, in addition to a 56-yard interception return.

- Oct. 31, 1981: Clemson had 756 total offensive yards against Wake Forest in an 82-24 win. The Tigers set 21 school, stadium and conference records in the game that was one of the highest-scoring games in ACC history. The Tigers scored 49 points in the first half,

then scored on the first possession of the second half. Clemson's final touchdown was scored on a 72-yard run by Craig Crawford, his first carry as a Tiger and the longest touchdown play in Tiger history for a player on his first play. Clemson was 12-for-12 on third downs and scored 12 touchdowns on the day. The Tigers had 536 rushing yards and averaged 8.7 yards per play.

- Oct. 31, 1998: Though it came in a 46-39 loss to NC State, Brandon Streeter, now Clemson's Passing Game Coordinator/Quarterbacks Coach, set Clemson single-game passing yardage (329) and completion (27) records. He threw three touchdown passes in the fourth quarter. It also marked Clemson's first time ever having two 100-yard receivers in the same game, as Brian Wofford caught nine passes for 128 yards and a touchdown while classmate Mal Lawyer had eight catches for 100 yards and two touchdown receptions.

-- NOTES FROM LAST GAME --

POSTGAME NOTES VS. SYRACUSE

- Clemson has now won each of its first six games of a season by 18 points or more for the first time in school history.

- Clemson has now opened a season with six consecutive games scoring 37 points or more for the first time in school history.

- Clemson scored at least 40 points for a fifthstraight game, the second-longest streak in school history behind a six-game streak last season.

- Clemson recorded four takeaways, Clemson's 17th game with four or more takeaways under Head Coach Dabo Swinney. It was Clemson's most takeaways in a game since a four-takeaway game against NC State last November.

- Clemson won the turnover margin, 4-1. Clemson finished a season-best +3 in the turnover margin, its first performance with a +3 turnover margin since last year's ACC Championship Game against Virginia. Clemson is now 15-0 under Dabo Swinney all-time when finishing a game +3 or better in the turnover margin.

- Clemson's three interceptions gave the Tigers their second three-interception game of the season, joining the team's win against Miami two weeks ago.

- Clemson passed for 308 passing yards and has now produced back-to-back 300-yard passing performances for the first time this season and for the first time since a four-game streak against NC State, Wake Forest, South Carolina and Virginia last season.

- Running back Travis Etienne rushed 16 times for 86 yards with three rushing touchdowns. He also added three catches for 20 yards.

- Etienne's three rushing touchdowns matched his career high, set previously five times including most recently against Boston College in October 2019. It was his ninth career game with three or more total touchdowns (including receiving touchdowns), his first since last year's Fiesta Bowl against Ohio State.

- Etienne now has seven career rushing touchdowns

against Syracuse, his most against any opponent.

- Etienne scored a touchdown of any kind in a 41st different game of his career, matching the FBS record held by San Diego State's Donnel Pumphrey from 2013-16. (*NOTE: Entering the 2020 season, the NCAA FBS Record Book listed Florida's Tim Tebow (38 games from 2006-09) and Louisiana Tech's Kenneth Dixon (38 from 2012-15) as the record-holders for most career games scoring a touchdown. Etienne was believed to have broken that record by scoring in a 39th career game against Miami. However, after additional research by ESPN, the NCAA acknowledged an error in its record book and updated it to reflect Pumphrey scoring a touchdown in 41 games from 2013-16.).

- During the game, Etienne (4,583) became the 12th player in school history to record 4,500 career yards of total offense. Every player ahead of him in school annals recorded at least 3,300 passing yards to help reach that figure; Etienne has 23 career passing yards.

- On his first score, a 25-yard touchdown run in the first quarter, Etienne passed Woodrow Dantzler (68) for sole possession of fourth on Clemson's alltime leaderboard for career touchdown responsibility. Etienne is fourth on that list despite not having a passing touchdown to his credit in a category that credits both touchdowns scored and touchdowns thrown.

- During the game, Etienne (64) entered the Top 10 in FBS history in career rushing touchdowns according to official NCAA records. Etienne passes Donnel Pumphrey (62) and Ron Dayne (63) and is now tied with Anthony Thompson and Cedric Benson (64 each) for seventh-most in FBS history.

- With his second touchdown of the game, Etienne became only the seventh FBS player since 1956 to record 70 career total touchdowns.

- Quarterback Trevor Lawrence completed 27-of-43 passes for 289 yards with two touchdown passes. His 43 pass attempts were a career high, surpassing his 41 against Miami earlier this season.

- Lawrence improved to 31-1 as a starter to pull within one win of the school record for wins as a starting quarterback. Rodney Williams, Tajh Boyd and Deshaun Watson are all tied for the school record with 32 wins each.

- With his second touchdown pass of the game, Lawrence (97) passed Marquise Williams (96) for fifth on the ACC's all-time career leaderboard for touchdown responsibility.

- Lawrence recorded an eight-yard reception on a pass from Amari Rodgers. It was his third career reception, but his first that didn't come from himself on a batted pass.

- The pass completion by Rodgers to Lawrence was the first pass completion by a Clemson receiver since Hunter Renfrow against Wake Forest in 2018. However, Renfrow was playing quarterback on that play in his role as the team's emergency quarterback. The last pass completion by a receiver playing in his normal position was Deon Cain against Wake Forest in 2015.

- Lawrence opened the scoring on a 25-yard touchdown pass to wide receiver Cornell Powell on the game's opening drive.

- Powell has now scored a touchdown in consecutive games for the first time in his career.

- Tight end Davis Allen caught his third touchdown pass of the season on a 17-yard pass from Lawrence in the second quarter.

- Allen became the first Clemson tight end with a touchdown catch in three consecutive games since Jordan Leggett against Georgia Tech, Louisville and Boston College in 2016.

- Allen's touchdown was the sixth by a Clemson tight end through six games this season. In the previous three seasons, Clemson tight ends combined for four total touchdowns in 44 games across 2017-19.

- Receiver Amari Rodgers recorded a career-high eight receptions for 91 yards. He now has four straight games with at least six receptions and has caught at least five passes in five of Clemson's six games this season.

- Defensive back Nolan Turner recorded the game's first takeaway on an interception on Syracuse's second possession. It was his single-season career-high third interception of 2020.

- Turner became the first Clemson player with an interception in back-to-back games since both he and Isaiah Simmons picked off passes against Virginia and Ohio State last season.

 $\mbox{-}$ Cornerback Andrew Booth Jr. scored his first career touchdown on a 21-yard fumble return in the third quarter.

- The fumble returned by Booth was forced by defensive tackle Bryan Bresee on a half-sack split with linebacker Mike Jones Jr.

- It was Clemson's second fumble return for touchdown this season, joining James Skalski's scoop and score against The Citadel. Clemson has now recorded multiple fumble return touchdowns in a single season for the first time since 2013.

- With Clemson's fumble return touchdown and Syracuse's interception return touchdown, the game was Clemson's first in which both teams recorded a defensive touchdown since 2014 when Clemson's Jadar Johnson and South Carolina State's Dominique Mitchell each scored via fumble return.

- Jones added his first career interception in the fourth quarter, returning it 40 yards to the Syracuse three-yard line to set up a Clemson touchdown.

- Defensive back Jalyn Phillips recorded his first career interception in the fourth quarter. The interception came one play after Phillips made a touchdown-saving tackle on a 61-yard rush by Syracuse.

- Defensive end Xavier Thomas recorded his first sack of the season. He has had one sack in each of his three career games against Syracuse.

- Running back Lyn-J Dixon opened the game with a 49-yard kickoff return, three yards shy of his seasonlong and career-long 52-yarder against Virginia.

- Punter Will Spiers, who was celebrating his 23rd birthday, averaged 53.6 yards on five punts, including four of 50 yards or more. It was his third straight game with a punting average of 50.0 yards or more, a career-long streak.

- Spiers recorded a career-long-tying 64-yard punt in the first quarter, matching 64-yard punts against Louisville in 2017 and against Charlotte in 2019.

- Spiers' second punt of the game was blocked, Clemson's first punt block surrendered since 2010 when South Florida blocked a Clemson punt in that year's Meineke Car Care Bowl. Clemson went 615 punts between blocks surrendered across 2010-20.

- Spiers converted a fourth-and-3 on a fake punt with a six-yard rush in the second quarter. It was the third career first down to which he's contributed but his first via rush. Spiers threw for a first down on a fake punt in 2017 and threw for one last week in his role as an emergency quarterback.

- Syracuse scored on a 39-yard interception return for touchdown in the second quarter. It ended a streak of 15 full games in which Clemson had not allowed a single point off of turnovers. The streak covered more than a calendar year, dating to Sept. 28, 2019. Clemson's defense still has not surrendered any points off turnovers since that date, as the seven points off turnovers surrendered Saturday were given up by the offense.

- Clemson played its 20th game all-time while ranked No. 1 in the AP Poll, the 15th-most since the poll's inception in 1936. It was Dabo Swinney's 19th game coached at No. 1, tying him with Jim Tressel for 17th all-time.

- Clemson has been ranked in the AP Top 25 in every contest against Syracuse all-time, including a Top 3 ranking in seven of its eight most recent matchups with the Orange since 2013.

- Captains for the contest were tight end J.C. Chalk, defensive end K.J. Henry, wide receiver Cornell Powell and safety Elijah Turner.

WITH THE WIN...

- Clemson has now opened a season 6-0 for the 16th time in school history, joining the 1900, 1928, 1929, 1930, 1948, 1981, 1987, 2000, 2011, 2013, 2015, 2016, 2017, 2018 and 2019 seasons. Clemson's sixyear streak of 6-0 starts is the longest active streak in the country.

- Clemson improved to 18-2 all-time when ranked No. 1 by the Associated Press. Clemson has never lost a regular season game as the nation's top-ranked team.

- Clemson won its 26th consecutive home game to extend its school record for the longest home winning streak in school history. Of the 119 players on Clemson's 2020 roster, 110 have never experienced a home loss in their Clemson careers. Nine fifth-year seniors on Clemson's 2020 roster were on the 2016 team that recovered from a home loss to Pitt by winning the national championship that season.

- Clemson (26 straight home wins) now takes sole possession of the school record for its longest home unbeaten streak. The previous record had been set when Clemson went unbeaten in 25 straight games at Memorial Stadium from 1980-84, posting 23 wins and two ties under Danny Ford in that span.

- Though 2020 is technically being played sans divisions, Clemson defeated a traditional ACC Atlantic Division opponent for the 16th straight time and for the 36th time in its last 37 opportunities.

- Clemson won its 27th consecutive game against an ACC opponent, including postseason play. The 27game winning streak against conference opponents pulls Clemson within one game of the 2012-15 Florida State Seminoles (28) for the second-longest streak in ACC history.

- Clemson has now won 35 consecutive regular season games, the longest such streak in ACC annals, tying the 2008-10 Boise State Broncos (35) for the longest such streak in ESPN Stats & Info data back to 2005.

- Clemson won its 38th consecutive non-bowl game, passing the 1992-96 Nebraska Cornhuskers for sole possession of the third-longest streak in the AP Poll era. Clemson's 38 consecutive wins in non-bowl games includes 35 regular season games and three conference championship games.

- Clemson improved to 25-1 in October games in the College Football Playoff era (since 2014).

- Clemson pushed its winning streak in Saturday games to 49 to extend the longest Saturday winning streak in FBS history.

- Clemson has now won 78 of its last 83 games overall dating to 2014.

 $\mbox{-}$ Clemson has won 48 of its last 50 games against ACC teams.

- Clemson has now won 84 of its last 86 games when leading at halftime, including each of its last 47 such

games.

- Clemson improved to 106-2 since 2011 when leading after three quarters.

 $\mbox{-}$ Clemson is now 56-1 when scoring first since 2015.

- Clemson now has a 104-2 record when totaling more first downs than its opponent since 2011.

- Clemson is now 62-3 when winning the turnover margin since 2011.

- Clemson is now 45-1 at home since 2014, the best winning percentage in the country.

- Clemson has now won 86 straight games when holding teams under 23 points (dates to 2010).

- Clemson improved to 7-2 all-time against Syracuse. - Clemson remained undefeated at home against Syracuse. The win improved Clemson to 4-0 against Syracuse at Memorial Stadium.

-- BEST IS THE STANDARD --

MOST WINS SINCE 2015, SECOND-MOST SINCE 2011

Clemson's recent success has been particularly pronounced in the midst of Clemson's five-year streak of College Football Playoff appearances since 2015. Clemson leads Alabama for the most wins in the country in that span, while those two teams have each earned two national championships in that time frame.

12-WIN SEASONS

Clemson has won at least 12 games in five consecutive seasons, the longest active streak of 12win seasons and one of only four such streaks in major college football history, joining Alabama (five from 2014-18), Penn (seven from 1892-98) and Yale (five from 1888-92).

Even at lower thresholds, Clemson's streak of success would remain impressive. Of the 130 active FBS schools, only 30 programs won at least six games in all five seasons from 2015-19. That number dips to 12 when pushing the win total to eight, and drops all the way to four (Clemson, Alabama, Oklahoma and Ohio State) when setting the bar at 10 wins.

10-WIN SEASONS

Clemson entered 2020 riding a streak of nine consecutive seasons with 10+ wins. The program's ninth consecutive 10-win season in 2019 made Clemson only the fourth program in FBS history to record at least nine consecutive 10-win seasons, tying the 2001-09 Texas Longhorns for the third-longest streak on record. With another 10-win season in 2020, Clemson would become only the third program in FBS history to produce a "double-double" -- double-digit wins in a double-digit number of consecutive seasons.

The record for consecutive 10-win seasons is 14, set by Florida State (1987-2000). Alabama is the only other program with an active streak of at least nine straight 10-win seasons.

The Tigers have 16 10-win seasons in school history, with more than half coming under head coach Dabo Swinney. The 2019 season was Clemson's sixth with at least 12 wins, with Swinney sitting at the helm for five of them.

SENIORS CHASING HISTORY

Every January, Head Coach Dabo Swinney conducts his first official meeting with his new team. The first order of business in the meeting is to "reset the room," reorganizing the seating arrangement with seniors in front and all succeeding classes in order behind them in the team auditorium.

The 2020 Clemson seniors reached the front of the room having watched each of the two classes in front of them depart as the winningest senior classes in FBS history, tied with the 2018 Alabama seniors at 55 wins in four years. This year's group needs 14 wins in 2020 to follow in that lineage and match that mark.

The 2019 seniors were the second Clemson class and one of only three classes all-time to reach 55 career wins in a four-year span. Clemson's 2019 group reached 55 wins in 58 games, tying the 2018 Alabama seniors as the quickest to that mark.

Clemson won its fifth straight ACC championship in 2019, as the Tigers and the Oklahoma Sooners both became the first programs in an active FBS conference since the 1971-75 Alabama Crimson Tide to win five consecutive outright titles.

Clemson had already been the first ACC school to win four outright titles in a row prior to extending the streak to five in 2019. Florida State was a champion or co-champion nine years in a row from 1992-2000, but never won more than three outright in a row.

Clemson's success in the conference championship game era is unprecedented, as in 2019, Clemson became the first school since the formation of conference championship games in 1992 to win five consecutive conference title games.

POWER OVER THE POWER FIVE

Early in his head coaching tenure, Dabo Swinney laid out his belief to then-Clemson athletic director Terry Don Phillips that the Tigers needed to add tough non-conference challenges on top of their tests in ACC play to serve as a foundation for the program's growth.

"I had a conversation with Terry Don and said, 'Terry Don, I know we are not very good right now, but we need to play people because that is going to help me teach and help me develop the culture and the mindset that you have to have to win at the highest level,'" recounted Swinney. "I didn't think we had that, and that's what we committed to. That's what we've done."

That scheduling philosophy and culture change has resonated in the Clemson program, and since 2013, no team can claim more wins against Power Five Conference opponents than the Tigers.

NO. 1 FOR NO. 1 RECRUITS

As Clemson was in the midst of the winningest decade in school history and tied for the thirdwinningest decade in major college football history, Head Coach Dabo Swinney would frequently point out that Clemson accomplished its goals by finding the right fits for its program in recruiting rather than chasing recruiting rankings.

Swinney often noted that Clemson accomplished its immense success in his tenure despite never signing the No. 1 recruiting class in the country. That changed in 2020, when ESPN ranked Clemson's 2020 group as the nation's top recruiting class. Clemson also recorded its highest rankings in both Rivals (No. 2) and 247 Sports (No. 3) history.

Clemson has signed the nation's consensus top player in two out of the last three recruiting cycles, welcoming quarterback Trevor Lawrence in 2018 and defensive tackle Bryan Bresee in 2020.

Clemson is the only team in the country to sign Rivals' No. 1 recruit twice in a three-year span since Dabo Swinney was named head coach at Clemson. Clemson and Alabama (two each) are tied for the most No. 1 recruits signed since 2009 per Rivals' rankings. Clemson and Georgia (two each) are tied for the most in that span per the 247 Composite.

Clemson's recruiting classes have finished in the top 15 of at least one of three primary recruiting services (ESPN, Rivals and 247 Sports) every year since 2011. Clemson is one of only seven schools to produce a Top 15 class in each of the last 10 years, a group that also includes Alabama, Auburn, Georgia, LSU, Notre Dame and Ohio State. After that group, the next longest active streak of Top 15 classes is five (Florida).

ESTEEMED COMPANY

Head Coach Dabo Swinney's run of excellence in his decade-plus at Clemson has placed him in the company of college football legends.

Swinney boasts a career winning percentage of .814, sitting as one of only 13 head coaches in history with at least 10 seasons of FBS head coaching experience to post a mark of .800 or better.

FIVE "FINAL FOURS" FOR SWINNEY

While the term "Final Four" may still be the linguistic property of the men's basketball tournament, since the advent of the four-team College Football Playoff in 2014, Head Coach Dabo Swinney has had Clemson among the sport's final four teams in each of the last five seasons, joining Alabama Head Coach Nick Saban (2014-18 seasons) as the only coaches to make the College Football Playoff five consecutive years. Oklahoma has qualified for four College Football Playoffs in the last five years, one under Bob Stoops and three in a row under current coach Lincoln Riley.

The men's college basketball tournament dates to

1939. In the history of that tournament, only John Wooden of UCLA (nine from 1967-75) and Mike Krzyzewski of Duke (five from 1988-92) coached teams to five consecutive Final Fours.

During Wooden's streak of nine straight Final Fours, he recorded eight championships and a semifinal loss. Coach K's Blue Devils had two championships, a second-place finish and two semifinal losses in their run. Saban's run produced two championships, two runner-up finishes and a semifinal loss in his run from 2014-18, while Swinney so far has two championships, two runner-up finishes and a semifinal loss from 2015-19.

Swinney is 6-3 in College Football Playoff games and that .667 percentage is tied for the best among football coaches who have been in at least three games. When compared to basketball coaches who have been in the Final Four, only three have a better winning percentage than Swinney with a minimum of eight games coached: John Wooden (21-3, .875), Adolph Rupp (9-2, .818) and Bob Knight (7-2, .778).

With another "Final Four" appearance by virtue of a College Football Playoff selection in 2020, Swinney would join basketball's John Wooden (nine straight at UCLA from 1968-75) as the only college football or men's basketball coaches to take teams to six consecutive Final Fours in their respective sports.

STAFF CONTINUITY

Clemson has become a beacon of stability in the increasingly unstable environment of college football. Clemson Head Coach Dabo Swinney is in his 18th overall season at Clemson in 2020, including his 12th full season as head coach (and his 13th including an interim stint in 2008).

From the start of Swinney's first season as full-time head coach in 2009 through 2019, there had been 392 head coaching tenures in the FBS, but only one such tenure at Clemson. Clemson and Duke are the only schools in the ACC with only one head coach since the start of the 2009 season, and among the 11 schools ever to qualify for the College Football Playoff, only Clemson and Alabama have had only one head coach since 2009.

Head Coach Dabo Swinney coached his 150th game as leader of the Clemson program in the 150-year anniversary season of college football in 2019. He became just the second coach to coach 150 career games at Clemson, joining Hall of Famer Frank Howard, who coached 295 games as Clemson's head coach from 1940-69.

Entering 2020, only eight coaches had coached at least 150 games at schools presently in the Football Bowl Subdivision while achieving an .800 or better mark. Interestingly, Clemson holds a 4-0 combined alltime record against the top three coaches on the list.

A FAMILIAR NO. 1

Clemson opened the season at No. 1 atop both polls, marking the program's second straight top preseason ranking. With the top selection in the AP Poll, Clemson became the sixth program since the inception of the preseason poll in 1950 ever to open consecutive preseason polls at No. 1, joining Alabama (2016-18), USC (2004-05), Oklahoma (1985-87, 1974-75, 1956-57), Ohio State (1969-70) and Notre Dame (1953-54).

Seeing Clemson at No. 1 has started to feel familiar in recent years, as 2020 is now the sixth straight year in which Clemson has appeared at No. 1 in at least one AP Poll. Dabo Swinney joined Nick Saban (12) as the only coach in AP Poll history (since 1936) to lead a team to at least one No. 1 ranking in six consecutive years. Clemson joins Alabama (12 from 2008-19) and Miami (seven from 1986-92) as the only programs to appear at No. 1 in at least six consecutive years.

A total of 22 coaches have led the AP's top-ranked team into a game at least 15 times. Sixteen of the 22 coaches on the list are College Football Hall of Famers, and a 17th (Bob Stoops) is on the ballot for 2021. Swinney holds a total of nine career victories over five coaches on the list, including two each over Stoops, Nick Saban, Urban Meyer and Steve Spurrier and one over Bobby Bowden.

CHAMPIONSHIP HERITAGE

After being named Clemson's full-time coach in December of 2008, Head Coach Dabo Swinney set about securing his first signing class in 2009.

His first class, which he tabbed the "Dandy Dozen," brought home Clemson's first ACC title since 1991 during their junior campaign in 2011. All of Clemson's first 11 signing classes under Swinney have at least one ACC title to their credit in their four years at Clemson. Every signing class since 2012 has played for at least one national title, and every class since 2013 has won a national championship with exception of Clemson's 2019 class, which fell just shy in the College Football Playoff National Championship Game last season.

EXCEEDING EXPECTATIONS

Prior to 2019, Clemson equaled or exceeded its postseason AP and USA Today rankings in comparison to its preseason rankings in eight straight seasons. That included quite an accomplishment in both 2016 and

2020 CLEMSON FOOTBALL

2018, as it finished No. 1 by winning the national championship to exceed the school's No. 2 preseason ranking both times.

Clemson exceeded its USA Today coaches poll preseason ranking eight straight years from 2011-18, the longest such streak in poll history. With regard to Associated Press voting, Clemson exceeded its preseason ranking in the AP poll in seven of the last nine years. The lone exceptions came in 2013, when Clemson was picked No. 8 in the AP preseason poll and finished No. 8, and 2019, when Clemson finished second in the country after opening the season at No. 1.

POLL STREAKS

Clemson has been ranked in the top 25 of 93 consecutive AP polls dating to the 2014 season, the second-longest active streak in the nation. That includes a streak of 84 straight top-10 rankings, tied for first in the country with Alabama.

Clemson has won each of its last 49 Saturday games. Clemson went 12-2 during the 2017 campaign, with its only losses coming on a Friday at Syracuse and a Monday on New Year's Day in the Sugar Bowl, followed by a 15-0 campaign in 2018 and a 14-1 season in 2019 in which its only loss was on a Monday in the College Football Playoff National Championship Game.

You have to travel back to Nov. 12, 2016, a total of 1,449 days prior to this Saturday's contest for Clemson's most recent loss on a Saturday. The Tigers' current streak started following a 2016 loss to Pitt that was preceded by a 21-game Saturday winning streak across the 2014-16 seasons, previously the longest such streak in program history.

A LOOK BACK: 29 IN A ROW

Clemson's remarkable 29-game winning streak across the 2018-19 seasons represented not only a highwater mark in the history of the program but also one of the most impressive streaks in the history of the sport's highest levels.

Clemson's streak was only the 28th winning streak of 25 or more games in major college football history. It finished tied for the 12th-longest streak all-time and tied for the second-longest since the turn of the century.

ESTABLISHED FIREPOWER

Etienne has scored at least one touchdown rushing or receiving in 41 of his 49 career games.

Entering the season, the NCAA FBS Record Book listed Florida's Tim Tebow (38 games from 2006-09) and Louisiana Tech's Kenneth Dixon (38 from 2012-15) as the record-holders for most career games scoring a touchdown.

Etienne was believed to have broken that record by scoring in a 39th career game against Miami. However, after additional research by ESPN, the NCAA updated its record book to reflect the 41 games in which San Diego State's Donnel Pumphrey scored a touchdown from 2013-16, so Etienne is once again chasing that FBS record, which he can break with a touchdown this week.

SEASONS WITH 7.0+ PER CARRY

Through his first three seasons, Etienne earned the distinction as the only FBS running back to average at least 7.0 yards per carry on at least 100 carries in three different seasons since 2000. The only other FBS player to accomplish the feat since the turn of the century was Nevada quarterback Colin Kaepernick, who did so from 2008-10.

This season, Etienne will attempt to become the first FBS player since 2000 to reach that average in four different seasons. He opened his career with a 7.2-yard average on 107 carries in 2017, a career-best 8.1-yard average on 204 carries in 2018 and an ACC-leading 7.8-yard average on 207 carries in 2019.

GAMES WITH 10.0+ PER CARRY

Etienne's explosive 2019 season opener resulted in an average of 17.1 yards per carry against Georgia Tech, which at the time was the second-best singlegame average of his career (19.1 vs. Louisville in 2018). Against Louisville in mid-October, he ripped off 192 yards on 14 carries for a 13.7-yard average, and in early November, he posted a career-best 23.6-yard average on nine carries for 212 yards against Wofford.

Etienne's 12 career games averaging double-digit yards per carry on at least five attempts exceed Colin Kaepernick's 11 for the most by any FBS player since 2000.

Etienne averaged at least 7.0 yards per carry in each of his first three seasons. Etienne is the only FBS back since 2000 to average 7.0 yards in three different seasons and joins Kaepernick (three years) as the only two FBS players at any position to accomplish the feat.

200-YARD RUSHING GAMES

Etienne recorded a then-career-high 205 yards in Clemson's 2019 season opener against Georgia Tech, the 17th 200-yard rushing game in Clemson history. It was Etienne's second career 200-yard day, tying him with Ray Yauger, Terrence Flagler, Raymond Priester and Andre Ellington for the most in school history.

Etienne then went on a record-grabbing spree in November 2019 against Wofford. He posted a careerhigh 212 yards on only nine carries, becoming the first Clemson player to post three career 200-yard games and joining Terrence Flagler as the only players with multiple 200-yard games in a single season. Etienne set those marks in the same contest in which he rushed for his 48th career touchdown to break James Davis' career record at Clemson.

Etienne's 12 carries against Georgia Tech had been the fewest by any Clemson player in the midst of a 200-yard performance. He undercut that mark with his nine-carry performance against Wofford, becoming only the third FBS player since 2000 to rush for 200 yards on single-digit carries.

HISTORY OF EXPLOSIVENESS

Ten of Etienne's 64 career rushing touchdowns have covered at least 50 yards. Etienne has three runs of 80 or more yards in his career, surpassing the previous school record held by Derrick Witherspoon and C.J. Spiller (two each).

YARDS AFTER CONTACT

Etienne's breakaway speed tends to dominate highlight reels, but to those who watch him closest including Clemson's coaches, it's his ability to power through contact and maintain his balance that stands as his most remarkable trait.

Since Etienne became Clemson's starter in 2018, Pro Football Focus credits him with 2,285 rushing yards after contact, second-most in that time frame behind Wisconsin's Jonathan Taylor, who averaged 36.9 carries per game in that span to Etienne's 13.7.

RETURNING 4,000-YARD CAREER RUSHERS (FBS HISTORY)

Clemson returned one of the most proflific career passer-rusher duos in college football history in 2020. Trevor Lawrence entered his junior campaign with 6,945 career passing yards, while Travis Etienne entered his senior season with 4,038 career rushing yards. The 2020 Clemson Tigers became only the third team in FBS history to return a 6,000-yard career passer and 4,000-yard career rusher, joining the 2001 Oregon State Beavers and 2018 Washington Huskies.

Per data available via Sports Reference, of the 139 players who have rushed for 4,000 yards all-time prior to 2020, Etienne was one of only 14 to enter his final collegiate season with 4,000 career yards.

AIR ETIENNE

Etienne had a then-career-high 98 receiving yards on three receptions with two touchdowns in Clemson's Fiesta Bowl win in last year's College Football Playoff. The 98 receiving yards were the most by a Clemson running back since C.J. Spiller recorded 104 receiving yards at Miami in 2009 in a 40-37 overtime win. It marked the first time a Clemson running back had two receiving touchdowns in a game since 2010 when Jamie Harper scored two at Auburn.

Then against Virginia in Clemson's third game of 2020, Etienne set a Clemson receiving yardage record for a running back with 114 receiving yards on five receptions. His performance broke Spiller's Clemson running back record of 108 receiving yards, set against Duke in 2008. It was only the fourth 100-yard receiving game by a running back in Clemson history, with all three previous instances recorded by Spiller.

After finishing his first two seasons with 17 career receptions for 135 yards and two touchdowns, Etienne was much more involved in the passing game in 2019, recording 37 receptions for 432 yards and four touchdowns. His 432 receiving yards in 2019 ranked as the third-most in a season for a running back in Clemson history, trailing only the 2008 and 2009 production of Spiller, a College Football Hall of Fame nominee. His 37 receptions that season ranked second among Clemson running backs all-time.

A similar performance in the passing game in 2020 could help Etienne join elite company in college football history. Only 11 players in FBS history have finished their careers with at least 4,000 rushing yards and at least 1,000 receiving yards. Etienne has already exceeded the 4,000-yard mark on the ground for his career and entered 2020 with 567 career receiving yards. With 433 receiving yards in 2020, Etienne would become the 12th FBS player all-time to join the 4,000/1,000 club.

TREAD ON THE TIRES

While some observers were surprised by Etienne's decision to return to Clemson in 2020, a projected second-round grade and a desire to complete his degree program made Etienne's call an easy one.

"I just felt like I could come back and improve that grade," Etienne said. "I don't have my degree. Coming back and going second round (in 2021), at least I'd have my degree. Leaving for the second round has never been a dream of mine. I feel like I can do so much better than that. The NFL is going to be there."

Detractors cited the "wear and tear" of another collegiate season as reasons why Etienne would have benefited from turning pro, but the story of Etienne's career usage has been one of immense production in very measured opportunities. In his first three seasons from 2017-19, Etienne averaged only 12.0 carries per game. Even accounting for only his two seasons as a full-time starter, he averaged only 13.7 carries per game from 2018-19.

The difference in the amount of tread left on Etienne's tires, figuratively speaking, to some of the NFL's most recent draft picks at running back is stark. All six running backs selected in the first two rounds of the 2020 NFL Draft were early entrants, and Etienne entered his senior season with fewer career carries than all but two of the six.

Etienne's single-season career high in carries is 207, set in 2019. Even if Etienne were to add another 207 carries in 2020 to his career total from 2017-19, despite using all four years of his eligibility, he would still enter the NFL with 201 fewer carries than Jonathan Taylor's three-year career, 120 fewer carries than AJ Dillon's three-year run and the exact same number as J.K. Dobbins' three-year tenure.

-- NO. 16 QB TREVOR LAWRENCE --

QB WIN STREAKS

After entering his first four career games at Clemson as a reserve, Trevor Lawrence was named Clemson's starting quarterback heading into its game against Syracuse on Sept. 29, 2018. Clemson's victory in that contest was its first with Lawrence as a starter.

Lawrence would go on to guide Clemson to another 24 straight wins as the starting quarterback prior to suffering his first defeat in the College Football Playoff National Championship game to conclude the 2019 season. Per ESPN Stats & Info, Lawrence's 25-game winning streak tied for the sixth-longest by a starting quarterback in major college football history and finished one shy of being the longest such streak to open a career.

INTERCEPTION AVOIDANCE

While mild panic emerged from national observers about Lawrence's eight interceptions early in 2019, Lawrence finished the 2019 season with a school record for consecutive pass attempts without an interception and still in possession of Clemson's career interception rate record. He remains the only qualified passer in school history to throw an interception on fewer than two percent of pass attempts.

Lawrence went 12 straight games without throwing an interception before throwing his first interception in Clemson's fifth game of the 2020 season.

ALL-AMERICAN DOUBLE?

If Trevor Lawrence and running back Travis Etienne were to both earn consensus All-American status (first-team honors from three or more of the five NCAA-recognized selectors) following the season, it would mark only the sixth such occurence in FBS history. Clemson will attempt to become only the third school to produce such a duo, joining Notre Dame (four) and Penn State (one).

As a freshman, Lawrence set a then-single-season Clemson record by closing the 2018 season with 169 consecutive pass attempts without an interception. Lawrence threw an interception on his 13th pass attempt of the 2019 season opener against Georgia Tech, ending a streak of 182 consecutive pass attempts without an interception.

As a sophomore, Lawrence shattered school singleseason and multi-season records in that category in 2019. Across the 2019 and 2020 campaigns, he threw a school-record 366 pass attempts without an interception, the second-longest streak in ACC history. In all, he went 364 calendar days between an interception at Louisville on Oct. 19, 2019 and his next interception on Oct. 17, 2020 at Georgia Tech.

Last season, Lawrence set a school record for consecutive completions in a single game, completing 18 consecutive passes at South Carolina to break the mark held by Cullen Harper (15 vs. Central Michigan in 2007) and Kelly Bryant (15 vs. Miami in 2017). His 18 consecutive completions tied ACC single-game records held by Virginia's Michael Rocco (vs. Miami in 2012) and North Carolina's Mitch Trubisky (vs. James Madison in 2016).

300-YARD GAMES

Clemson's balance and its willingness to take what defenses offer on the ground or through the air sometimes limits opportunities for Lawrence to accrue some of the passing numbers put up around the country. But even playing in an offense that values balance and for a coach who values spreading playing time throughout the roster, Lawrence has still been able to light up defenses in his career, ranking third on Clemson's all-time leaderboard in 300-yard passing games.

LAWRENCE'S LEGS

Lawrence had a Clemson team-high and career-best 107 rushing yards on 16 carries and scored on a careerlong 67-yard run in Clemson's 29-23 win against Ohio State in last year's PlayStation Fiesta Bowl. The 67yard run was the longest by a Clemson quarterback since Woody Dantzler had a 75-yard scoring run at Virginia in 2000.

Lawrence finished 2019 with 563 rushing yards on 103 carries, an average of 5.47 yards per rush. That rushing average was the best in a season for a Clemson quarterback since transitioning away from single-wing formations in 1953.

KILLER T'S STRIKE IN OPENER

The prolific duo of Trevor and Travis shot out of the starting gate quickly in 2020, with Lawrence producing 351 passing yards and Etienne producing 102 rushing yards in Clemson's season opener at Wake Forest.

The performance represented the 15th time in history that Clemson has produced both a 300-yard passer and a 100-yard rusher in a single game. All 15 instances at Clemson have come since the turn of the century. Twelve have come under Dabo Swinney, including four by the Lawrence/Etienne duo.

It was the seventh time Clemson had a 350-yard passer and a 100-yard rusher in a game.

COMEBACK KID

Since his arrival at Clemson in 2017, Amari Rodgers has been hailed by coaches and teammates as one of the program's hardest workers. The work ahead of Rodgers was substantial on March 25, 2019, when the wide receiver from Knoxville, Tenn., tore his ACL during spring practice.

Rodgers attacked his rehab with his trademark work ethic, returning to action 166 days later in Clemson's second game of the 2019 season, receiving a thunderous roar from Death Valley following his first reception. Rodgers completed his comeback 2019 campaign with 30 catches for 426 yards and four touchdowns.

With the national spotlight no longer being split with Tee Higgins and Justyn Ross, Rodgers is shining in 2020. After playing with a knee brace last season, Rodgers is playing without a brace this year in his "All Gas, No Brace" season, and the production has followed. He enters this week as the ACC leader in receiving yards and tied for the conference lead with five receiving touchdowns.

WELCOME TO THE SHOW

Clemson entered its 2020 season opener against Wake Forest missing two presumptive preseason starters at defensive end in Justin Foster and Xavier Thomas, perhaps leaving the uninitiated to wonder from where Clemson's pass rush might come.

America, meet true freshmen Myles Murphy and Bryan Bresee.

Bresee joined Clemson as the consensus No. 1 player in America for the class of 2020. Murphy joined the Tigers as ESPN.com's third-ranked player in the class. Both made an immediate impact in their collegiate debuts.

It had been five years since a Clemson true freshman had recorded a sack in a season opener, when Dexter Lawrence and Tre Lamar each did so in the 2016 season opener at Auburn. Both Murphy and Bresee got on the stat sheet in the opener against Wake, with Murphy compiling two sacks among a team-high seven tackles and Bresee adding half a sack and the Tigers' first blocked field goal since Week 2 of 2018.

With two sacks in the opener, Murphy was already halfway toward entering the Top 5 in Clemson history in sacks by a first-year freshman. He and Bresee have combined for 5.5 sacks through six games.

THE BRUISE BROTHERS

Behind Clemson's precocious defensive line is a pair of veteran linebackers that are leaving their mark on opponents this year and led Head Coach Dabo Swinney to coin one of college football's top new nicknames: "The Bruise Brothers."

Middle linebacker James Skalski is in his fifth year in the Clemson program. He took a mid-career redshirt in 2018, playing four games including the ACC Championship Game, Cotton Bowl and National Championship Game in what he and others have called "the sweetest gig on the team" that year before becoming a full-time starter in 2019. The physical presence of No. 47 has led Swinney referring to him as "a war daddy" and calling his participation in practices and scrimmages "just unfair."

But Skalski has had a new running mate at the second level of the defense this year, as redshirt junior Baylon Spector has produced superlative performances so far in 2020 including an ACC Linebacker of the Week selection for his play against Virginia on Oct. 3. The first-year starter announced his presence in a reserve role in last year's College Football Playoff when he had two sacks against Ohio State in the Fiesta Bowl.

"[Spector] and Skalski, it's a reflection of how they practice. I'm telling you, every single rep at practice is a game rep to those two guys. They put a ton of work in every week to get themselves ready to play," Swinney said. "I know how hard they've worked. It's the unseen grind. That's a ton of work that they've put in.

"I call them The Bruise Brothers. Those two right there, it's something to watch and it's fun to see."

The duo's success is not merely a function of their physicality and hard work. Defensive Coordinator Brent Venables praised the cerebral nature of their play as well.

"They've developed some really good chemistry together. They're always having side chat conversations when I'm trying to talk with the whole defense and I'm having to correct at practice, and I look over and they're coaching each other. Sometimes that bothers me, I'll be honest, [*smiling*] but I absolutely love it because it's always about the details of what we're talking about," Venables said. "They're like two coaches, really, out on the field."

300 OR FEWER YARDS

Clemson opened the 2019 season by keeping each of their first 12 opponents to fewer than 300 yards, marking the first time in ESPN Stats & Info searchable data going back to 1996 that a team had held the first 12 opponents of a season under that mark. ACC Coastal Division champion Virginia became the first team to hit the 300-yard plateau on Clemson, accounting for 387 in the ACC Championship Game.

DEFENSIVE POINT THRESHOLDS

Prior to surrendering 23 points in the 2019 Fiesta Bowl, Clemson had not surrendered more than 20 points since the 2018 regular season finale and had held 16 consecutive opponents to 20 or fewer points. A defensive streak of that length had not occurred at Clemson in 79 years, when Hall of Fame coaches Jess Neely and Frank Howard combined for a 31-game streak across the 1937-40 seasons.

Prior to the 16-game streak in 2018-19, there had been only four streaks of 15 or more such games in Clemson history. All four came in a vastly different era not just for college football, but for Clemson University as well. At the time of all four previous streaks, Clemson was an all-male, military institution still operating as Clemson

Agricultural College before becoming known as Clemson University in 1964.

Clemson has held opponents to 2.0 or fewer yards per carry in 22 games in the College Football Playoff era (since 2014), the second-most in the country. Clemson is 21-1 in those contests.

Clemson opened 2020 with two such performances. Clemson allowed only 1.1 yards per carry in its season opener against Wake Forest and then held The Citadel to 1.8 yards per carry, representing the team's first time holding consecutive opponents to 2.0 yards per carry or fewer since games 2-3 last season against Texas A&M and Syracuse.

Clemson's success sacking quarterbacks has not been limited to a handful of high-production players but is instead indicative of team-wide success. Prior to giving up seven points on a pick-six against Syracuse on Oct. 24, Clemson had not surrendered points off a turnover in 15 full games. The streak lasted more than a calendar year, dating to Sept. 28, 2019, when North Carolina converted a lost fumble into a touchdown and won the points-off-turnover battle, 7-0. Though Clemson's team streak ended at 15 games, by virtue of the offense surrendering points on an interception return, Clemson's *defense* still hasn't surrendered a point off of a turnover in 16 full games.

-- SPECIAL TEAMS --

SPOTLIGHT ON THE SPECIALISTS

- **B.T. Potter, PK:** Clemson's cannon-legged junior has been remarkably consistent on both his shortest kicks and his longest kicks throughout his career. He is 120-for-120 on PATs, and his 120 consecutive PATs shattered Clemson's school record (88 by Mark Buchholz from 2007-08). Potter, who has been one of the nation's foremost touchback specialists throughout his career, is also 4-for-5 on field goal attempts of 50 yards or more during his Clemson tenure, one 50-yarder away from tying Clemson's career record.

- Will Spiers, P: A four-year starter at punter, Spiers made his 47th career start on Oct. 3, breaking Cole Chason's Clemson record for a punter (46 from 2003-06). His experience has been evident in his finish to the 2019 season and his hot start in 2020. In 2019, he finished with a career-high 41.7-yard net average, the second-best single-season mark in school history behind Dale Hatcher's 1984 performance (42.4), and he saved his best performances for the biggest games, dropping 10 of his 16 punts in last year's College Football Playoff inside the 20. He has averaged at least 50.0 yards per punt in each of the last three weeks, a career-long streak.

Will Swinney, H: Spiers is not the only four-year starter among Clemson's special teams corps. Swinney is in his fourth season as Clemson's primary holder and has held for more placekicks than any player in Clemson history. Since 2017, Clemson has scored 406 points on placekicks, including field goals and PATs. Swinney, a 2020 William V. Campbell Trophy semifinalist, has held for 401 of those 406 points, and including his receiving touchdown vs. Louisville in 2018, he's touched the ball for 407 total points for Clemson in his career. Clemson's only three kicking points not held by Will Swinney in his career were instead held by his brother, Drew. Clemson's last hold by any player outside the Swinney family was on the final point of Clemson's 2016 national championship following Hunter Renfrow's touchdown with one second

remaining.

- Jack Maddox, LS: Maddox is in his first-year as Clemson's starting long snapper. A native of Acton, Mass., his attention first turned to Clemson after visiting his uncle, who is a professor at the university. He walked on at Clemson, and this past August, the redshirt junior was en route to Clemson's Applied Science Lab to take a nap when Head Coach Dabo Swinney approached him and asked him if he'd already paid his fall tuition. Upon Maddox confirming that he had, Swinney told him he'd have a little extra money in his pocket this semester, as Maddox was being placed on scholarship for the 2020 season.

- Quinn Castner, PK: Castner joined Clemson's program in August. At 140 pounds, the 5-foot-5 walkon became the 15th player below 150 pounds to appear on Clemson's roster since 1944. He became a viral sensation for his debut against The Citadel once Dabo Swinney, after exaggerating Castner's vitals as "5-foot-3 and 80 pounds... maybe," told the following anecdote about Castner and Clemson's current culture: "I put him out there and gave him a chance to kick one off, and listen, he ain't kicked one deep in the end zone yet since he's been here... So I put the first [team] kickoff out there and said, 'All right, boys, we've got a little wind, I'm putting my man Quinn out there. Y'all know this is coming out and y'all need some dadgum practice...' Potter booms 'em out of the end zone and I wanted them to get a little work, so I got my man Quinn out there, and what does he do? He kicks that sucker four yards deep in the end zone, and the whole team went crazy. They just loved it, and, I mean, that's special."

- **Returners:** Four different players (WR Amari Rodgers, CB Derion Kendrick, RB Travis Etienne and WR Will Swinney) have accounted for Clemson's eight punt returns this season. Clemson is averaging 14.0 yards per punt return this year, second-best in the ACC. Meanwhile, on kickoff return, running back Lyn-J Dixon has averaged 30.0 yards on five kickoff returns, including a return of 52 yards against Miami and 49 yards against Syracuse.

The approach to creating functional depth and rewarding players ready to play has been a key philosophy for Head Coach Dabo Swinney, whose own collegiate playing career was hatched as a walk-on fighting for playing time in Alabama's receiving corps.

"We're fully committed to playing guys who deserve to play," Swinney said. "You commit to a guy early in the season, and even if a guy's only played 10 percent of the snaps, when you get to game eight or nine, they've got some good experience."

That philosophy was on display in record fashion against Charlotte in September 2019, when Clemson played a school-record 111 players. Clemson later played 105 players against Wofford and 93 players against Wake Forest that season as well.

Clemson's high-water mark for player participation this season is 96 against The Citadel in the team's home opener.

Clemson opened the season by playing 78 of 80 available players in the season opener at Wake Forest.

The only two available Tigers who did not appear in the contest were reserve running back Lyn-J Dixon, who was being held for emergency situations, and reserve placekicker Jonathan Weitz. A week later, 96 of Clemson's 105 dressed players saw action against The Citadel. Clemson has recorded 454 combined mangames out of a possible 588 from available players this season, meaning Clemson has played an average of 77.2 percent of its available players in each game this season.

YOUTH + EXPERIENCE

One year after Clemson returned a school-record 61 lettermen for the 2018 season, Clemson entered the 2019 campaign with a roster that included 80 freshmen and sophomores. Clemson's 2020 squad is a mixture of youth and experience, as Clemson has 60 returning lettermen yet still features a roster that entered the year with 81 players classified as freshmen or sophomores.

In the first year of new redshirt regulations in 2018, Clemson played a then-school-record 20 true freshmen. Clemson immediately shattered that record in its 2019 season opener, with 27 true freshmen making their collegiate debuts in that contest. An additional eight true freshmen made their debuts to push that total to a school-record 36. The only true freshmen not to see game action for Clemson in 2019 were injured linebackers Bryton Constantin and Matthew Maloney.

Clemson's 78-player participation in its 2020 season opener included 22 true freshmen from Clemson's most recent 23-player recruiting class who made their collegiate debuts in the contest. The only Clemson true freshman signee who did not play in the game was DeMonte Capehart, who did not travel with the team.

Capehart made his debut a week later against The Citadel, as did true freshmen walk-ons Hunter Helms, Quinn Castner and Bubba McAtee.

Clemson enters this week having won 31 consecutive games against teams unranked in the AP PolI, the program's second-longest such winning streak since the inception of the poll in 1936. Clemson's last defeat at the hands of an unranked squad came in 2017 at Syracuse.

Clemson's longest winning streak against unranked teams came across the 2012-16 seasons, when Clemson won 46 in a row starting with a season-opening win against Auburn in 2012 and ending with an upset loss to Pitt in 2016.

Including a win against Syracuse last week, Clemson is 105-12 against AP-unranked teams under Dabo Swinney, including wins in 82 of 84 games against those unranked teams since the start of the 2012 season.

600-YARD GAMES

After setting a school record with five 600-yard games in 2019, Clemson produced its first 600-yard game of 2020 on Oct. 17 at Georgia Tech when the Tigers accumulated 671 yards in a resounding 73-7 win. Clemson threw for exactly 500 yards in the contest, the second-most in a game in school history but its most in a victory and its most in a road game in school annals.

Clemson outgained Georgia Tech, 671-204, after outgaining Miami by 340 yards a week earlier, helping Clemson outgain consecutive ACC opponents by 300plus yards for the first time since the Louisville and Boston College games in 2018.

By outgaining Georgia Tech by 467 yards, Clemson tied for its fourth-largest yardage differential in a game since 1953. It was Clemson's second-largest yardage margin against an ACC opponent all-time, trailing only a 497-yard yardage differential against Boston College last season.

MEMORABLE DAY IN "THE A"

Clemson's 73-7 win at Georgia Tech on Oct. 17 resonated historically. Among the superlatives from

that contest:

- Clemson's 66-point victory margin was the largest in a game between two ACC teams since the conference's inception in 1953.

- The 66-point victory margin tied for Clemson's seventh-largest in school history and its largest since a 66-point win against South Carolina State in 2014. It was Clemson's second-largest win all-time against a school presently in the Football Bowl Subdivision, trailing only a 73-0 victory against Georgia Tech in 1903.

- Clemson's 73 points represented Clemson's thirdmost against an ACC opponent all-time, trailing its 82-point performance against Wake Forest in 1981 and its 77 points against Louisville in 2018. However, both of those performances came at home, so Saturday's output was the most scored by Clemson in an ACC road game all-time, passing its 63 at Wake Forest in 2018.

- Clemson's 73 points tied for Clemson's secondmost points in a road game in school history, trailing its 94 against Furman in 1915 and matching its 73 at Georgia Tech in 1903.

- Clemson opened the game with a modern-era school-record 52 points in the first half. Clemson's previous high against an ACC opponent in a first half was 49 in its opening two frames against Wake Forest in its national championship campaign in 1981.

- Clemson produced 473 yards in the first half, only 14 yards shy of the school record for yards in a half (487 vs. Duke in 2012).

- Clemson tied a school record for points in a quarter with 35 in the second quarter, matching its second quarter against Wake Forest in 1981 and its third quarter against North Carolina in 2011.

- Clemson threw seven passing touchdowns, breaking the school record of six set previously against Central Michigan in 2007, against Duke in 2012, against North Carolina in 2014 and against South Carolina in 2016.

- Four different players (including starting punter and emergency quarterback Will Spiers) completed at least two passes and 17 different players caught a pass to contribute to the Tigers' second 500-yard passing day in school history. Clemson's 17 different players recording a reception were its most in a single-game under Dabo Swinney.

WALK-ON QB MAKES CLEMSON HISTORY

Clemson had four different players complete at least two passes in its 73-7 rout of Georgia Tech on Oct. 17. That included 24 completions by starting quarterback Trevor Lawrence, two by reserve quarterback Taisun Phommachanh and two by starting punter/emergency quarterback Will Spiers, but it also featured a 5-for-7 passing performance by true freshman walk-on quarterback Hunter Helms.

Helms' five completions went for 74 yards and two touchdowns, including touchdown passes to running back Kobe Pace and wide receiver Ajou Ajou. Helms became only the third quarterback who joined Clemson as an original walk-on since 1954 to throw a touchdown pass, joining Nick Schuessler (three touchdown passes in 2016) and Donny McElveen (one in 2010).

Helms and Schuessler are the only original walk-on quarterbacks to throw multiple touchdown passes in a game for Clemson, as Helms' two-touchdown game at Georgia Tech joined Schuessler's two-touchdown performance against Syracuse in 2016. However, Schuessler had been placed on scholarship by that point of his career, making Helms the first Clemson quarterback to throw two touchdown passes in a game while still on walk-on status.

RAIN, RAIN, GO AWAY YOU CAN STAY

Clemson played its first rain game of the 2020 season on Oct. 10, when the Tigers faced two sets of Hurricanes: one a football team from Miami, and the other remnants of Hurricane Delta.

Clemson defeated Miami, 42-17, in the rain that evening while winning the turnover margin, 3-1. With the victory, Clemson improved to 10-1 in rain games under Dabo Swinney and pushed its turnover margin in those games to 28-13 (+15).

OFFENSIVE BALANCE

Clemson has featured remarkable offensive balance while qualifying for the College Football Playoff National Championship Game in each of the last two years. Clemson has averaged at least 200 rushing yards and 200 passing yards per game four times in school history, with two of those seasons occurring in the 2018 and 2019 campaigns.

Clemson exceeded the 200/200 mark rushing and passing in 2019 by averaging 240.4 rushing yards per game and 288.3 passing yards per game. Clemson was one of only three teams in 2019 to average at least 240 yards per game in each category, along with fellow CFP participants Ohio State and Oklahoma. Clemson broke the 3,000-yard mark both rushing and passing in 2019, making the campaign only the third 3,000/3,000 season in school history (2015 and 2018).

Clemson has exceeded both 200 passing yards and 200 rushing yards in 52 games under Dabo Swinney, posting a perfect record in those contests. Clemson's 18 such games since the start of the 2018 season are the most in the country.

In October and early November of the 2019 season, Clemson reached the 200/200 plateau in five straight contests, its longest such streak on record. Clemson got back on pace with 200/200 performances at South Carolina in the regular season finale and against Virginia in the ACC Championship Game to give the Tigers seven 200/200 games in an eight-game span.

Clemson was one of only six FBS programs to both rush and pass for at least 6,000 yards each across the 2018-19 seasons. Clemson was the only of those six schools to reach both 7,000 rushing yards and 7,000 passing yards in that span.

TIGHT END RENAISSANCE

Last year, Clemson tight ends combined for 26 receptions for 239 yards and no scores in 2019. A year earlier, the Tigers recorded 17 catches for 161 yards and two scores by tight ends in 2018.

With junior tight end Braden Galloway returning in 2020 after playing only in the College Football Playoff a year ago to join a group that included talented sophomore Davis Allen and veteran J.C. Chalk, observers anticipated more influence from the tight ends in the Clemson offense in 2020.

That anticipation became reality in the season opener against Wake Forest when Galloway, Allen and Chalk combined for seven catches for 114 yards and a touchdown.

"When you have a great tight end in there that's a threat down the field, it just creates more matchup problems," Head Coach Dabo Swinney said following the game.

The group's 114 yards at Wake Forest ranked as the third-most receiving yards for the tight end position in a single game under Swinney, eight yards shy of the top mark of 122 against Florida State in 2016. It was the sixth game of at least 100 receiving yards by Clemson tight ends in the Swinney era.

The unit put together another superlative performance on Oct. 10 against Miami, as Braden Galloway (four

receptions for 114 yards with two touchdowns) and Davis Allen (22-yard receiving touchdown) combined for five catches for 96 yards and three touchdowns. It was the first time that Clemson tight ends combined for three scores in a game.

This season could be the most productive for Clemson tight ends since the 2016 National Championship team featured the play of All-American Jordan Leggett. Clemson tight ends had 797 receiving yards that year, most in the Swinney era, on 52 catches.

The record for receptions for the tight end position under Swinney is 65, in 2011 when the Tigers featured John Mackey Award winner Dwayne Allen.

STRONG OUT OF THE GATES

"Some start fast, some start slow, but the thoroughbred is great at the final pole."

Dabo Swinney used that horse-racing analogy with his team to encourage his team to "run its own race" in 2019. Clemson was strong out of the gates in 2019, outscoring opponents by a 177-34 margin (+143) in the first quarter. Only 26 teams in the country (including Clemson) recorded a plus-143 or better point differential in *entire games* in 2019.

Clemson's 9.53-point average scoring differential in the first quarter was the second-largest in the country in 2019, contributing significantly to Clemson's secondplace finish in overall scoring differential.

Clemson picked up where it left off in the 2020 season opener, outscoring Wake Forest, 14-0, in the opening frame en route to a 27-0 halftime advantage.

Clemson then tied a school-record with a 28-point first quarter against The Citadel a week later en route to a 49-0 halftime lead. Clemson later set a modern-era first-half record with 52 points in securing a 52-7 lead after the first two quarters at Georgia Tech.

YARDS PER PLAY

Clemson shattered its school record for yards per play in 2018 at 7.35, the program's first time exceeding seven yards per play in a season. That record stood for barely 12 months until Clemson broke it again in 2019 by averaging 7.38 yards per play. Clemson is averaging 6.58 yards per play in 2020, which would be the thirdbest mark in school history over the course of a full season.

In 2018-19, Clemson became only the third school since 2000 to average 7.35 or better yards per play in back-to-back seasons, joining Alabama, which did it across 2018-19, and Oklahoma, which was in the midst of a four-year streak across the 2016-19 seasons.

The Tigers' explosiveness includes the running game, as Clemson's six games with an 8.0 or better yards per carry average since 2018 are the most in the FBS.

650-POINT SEASONS

Clemson scored 659 points in 2019, concluding the season only five points shy of tying the school record of 664 set in 2018. Clemson is responsible for two of the 22 650-point seasons in major college football history and two of only 16 since Division I split in 1978. Clemson was the first school with back-to-back 650-point seasons since Yale in 1888-89, predating the start of official NCAA recordkeeping in 1937 and the second year of which was coincidentally the year Clemson was founded.

CLOSE-GAME SUCCESS

Though Clemson has not played a large number of one-possession games in recent years, the Tigers have proven very adept at winning such contests since 2011. In that span, the Tigers have played 30 games with a final margin of eight points or less, and Clemson's .867 winning percentage in those one-possession contests is the best in the country in that time frame.

Clemson's win against Ohio State in the Fiesta Bowl last season pitted the nation's top two teams in onescore games since 2011 against one another in a winor-go-home one-possession game. With the six-point win, Clemson improved to 26-4 in one-score games in that span, reaching the mark against a Buckeye squad that entered the game with a .735 winning percentage since 2011 in one-score games.

OWNING THE "MIDDLE EIGHT"

During its current run of five consecutive College Football Playoff appearances dating to 2015, Clemson has frequently won one of the hidden "games within the game."

SportSource Analytics tracks the "Middle Eight," the section of the game defined as the final four minutes of the first half and the first four minutes of the second half. Clemson has outscored opponents in that time window 50 times since 2015, posting a 49-1 record in those contests.

Clemson was historically strong in that category in 2018, outscoring opponents 132-10 in the middle eight, an average margin of +8.1 points per game. That per-game differential was the largest by any program in the country since 2013. Clemson outscored opponents in the Middle Eight 10 times in 2019, posting a 108-24 advantage in that time window.

Clemson recorded a critical middle eight

performance in its 2019 Fiesta Bowl win against Ohio State. Trailing 16-0 prior to the final four minutes of the first half, Clemson scored 14 points in the half's waning minutes to pull the halftime deficit to two. The 14-point momentum swing in that span helped Clemson to victory in the fifth-largest comeback in school history.

Clemson's top performance in the Middle Eight so far in 2020 came in its 73-3 win against Georgia Tech on Oct. 17. Clemson finished +21 in the category by virtue of three touchdowns in the final four minutes of the first half.

ALL-CONFERENCE O-LINEMEN

As Clemson climbed into the elite echelon of college football programs during the last decade, observers posited that Clemson's rise coincided with the rapid ascent of its offensive line play.

During Clemson's five-year run of College Football Playoff appearances from 2015-19, the Tigers produced a total of 22 All-ACC selections along the offensive line, including 10 first-team honors. Clemson's 22 all-conference selections by offensive linemen are the most of any Power Five program, and its 10 first-team selections are tied with Oklahoma for the most in that span.

PASS PROTECTION

Clemson's protection for quarterback Trevor Lawrence has taken on an almost-mythical quality in recent years, according to Syracuse Head Coach Dino Babers, whose own prolific defensive line was held without a sack against Clemson in 2019. "[It's like] Game of Thrones. He's got a castle, he's got a moat, he's got some dragons. That dude's *protected*." Babers said.

The standard remains high for Clemson's 2020 unit, which features four new starters. Last year, led by four seniors, Clemson's 2019 offensive line was named as a Joe Moore Award semifinalist, and its metrics compared favorably to the four lines that went on to be named as finalists, including the LSU squad that earned the award and helped lead the Bayou Bengals to a national championship.

Though Clemson's 2020 offensive line features four new starters from 2019, the unit does not lack experience among its starting five. Clemson's four new starters — Matt Bockhorst, Cade Stewart, Will Putnam and Jordan McFadden — entered the 2020 season with 1,821 combined offensive snaps in their careers as a function of Clemson's philosophy of developing its depth by furnishing playing time for reserves whenever possible.

Swinney was effusive in his praise of his starting offensive line's performance in Week 1, describing it to his team as "poetry in motion" and "as good of an offensive line performance as we've had in my time here."

"Our offensive line, I'm telling you, that first group – I don't think I've ever had so much fun watching and grading the tape," Swinney said of the line's performance against Wake Forest. "It was just awesome to watch those guys play... They do a lot of moving, and we just handled it so well. That set the tone for everything."

TRENCH WARFARE

Clemson's success in its 35-1 run since 2018 has been powered in part at the line of scrimmage, where Clemson holds a 125-45 edge over opponents in sacks in that time frame, including a 24-10 edge this season. Clemson's +80 margin in sacks since 2018 is by far the top differential in the country, as no other program can boast a sack differential greater than +57 since 2018.

ACADEMIC EXCELLENCE

Clemson has matched its on-field success in recent years with national acclaim for its success in the classroom. Of note:

- Clemson set a program record in APR in the NCAA's most recent figures released in May 2020, recording a multi-year APR score of 993 for the 2018-19 academic year. The performance marked the third straight year Clemson broke its program record in the

metric after breaking its 992 from 2017-18, which had broken its 987 mark from 2016-17.

- Clemson's 993 multi-year APR ranked fourth in the Power Five and fifth among FBS programs, trailing only Washington (999), Ole Miss (997), Northwestern (995) and Air Force (995). That metric covered a four-year span in which Clemson matched its off-field success with on-field accolades that included a 55-4 record, four College Football Playoff appearances and two national championships.

- The NCAA recognized Clemson with its annual APR Public Recognition Award, which is bestowed upon programs ranking in the Top 10 percent of their respective sports. Only 37 of the 130 FBS programs have earned at least one APR recognition since the 2009-10 academic year. Only 30 of them have earned it multiple times. Clemson, Duke and Northwestern programs are the only ones to earn the award nine or more times in that 10-year span.

- Clemson is one of only six FBS programs with an active streak of having earned an APR Public Recognition Award in each of the last three academic years, a group that also includes Air Force, Boston College, Navy, Northwestern and Washington.

- With its most recent award for the 2018-19 academic year, Clemson is now the only FBS program since the NCAA created the APR metric in 2003 to win a national championship and an APR Public Recognition Award in the same year multiple times. Alabama is the only other school to accomplish the title/APR double in a single year once (2011-12 academic year).

In addition to the APR honors, in November 2019, the AFCA announced that Clemson had repeated as Academic Achievement Award winners, making Clemson the only school in the country to earn the award across both of the 2018-19 seasons. Clemson had earned the award a year earlier as well in the midst of major college football's first 15-0 season since 1897.

ACC: WE DO THIS

Entering the 2020 season, the ACC was tied for the most football national titles of any conference since 2013 (three of the last seven). The conference has had a team in either the College Football Playoff or the BCS National Championship Game in each of the past seven years.

No conference produced more bowl teams in 2019 than the ACC, which placed 10 of its 14 members in bowl games. With the selection of 10 teams in 2019, the

ACC has had 42 bowl teams in the previous four years, including double-digit selections all four years (11 in 2016, 10 in 2017, 11 in 2018 and 10 in 2019).

WINSTON-SALEM, N.C. – A stellar outing by quarterback Trevor Lawrence and a Clemson-record 18th career 100-yard rushing performance by running back Travis Etienne led No. 1 Clemson to a 37-13 victory over Wake Forest in front of only 68 people in the first game under COVID-19 protocols.

Lawrence went 22-of-28 for 351 yards and a touchdown along with two touchdown runs. With 102 yards, Etienne passed Wayne Gallman (17 from 2014-16) for Clemson's career 100-yard rushing games record.

Defensively, Winston-Salem native K.J. Henry recorded the first of Clemson's six sacks on the night. Myles Murphy (2.0) and Bryan Bresee (0.5) each contirbuted sacks, become Clemson's first true freshmen with sacks in a season-opener since 2016.

Lawrence's two rushing touchdowns gave the Tigers a 14-0 first quarter lead, marking his first career game with multiple rushing touchdowns. His first passing touchdown of the season was a 12-yard strike to tight end J.C. Chalk in the second quarter.

A career-long-tying 52-yard B.T. Potter field goal as the first half expired gave Clemson a 27-0 halftime lead. During the game, Potter broke Mark Buchholz's Clemson record for consecutive PATs (88 from 2007-08).

Clemson carried a 37-3 lead into the fourth quarter before surrending the final 10 points. The Tigers played 78 of their 80 available players in the contest.

CLEMSON, S.C. – No. 1 Clemson won its home opener in front of a socially distanced crowd of 18,609 fans at Memorial Stadium, defeating The Citadel by a score of 49-0. The victory marked Clemson's 31st consecutive regular season win, passing the 2013-15 Florida State Seminoles for the longest such streak in ACC history.

Quarterback Trevor Lawrence went 8-of-9 passing for 168 yards with three passing touchdowns and a rushing touchdown. Freshman quarterback D.J. Uiagalelei added his first two career scores on the ground.

All of Clemson's points came in a 49-point first half, Clemson's most points in the first two quarters of play since scoring 49 against Temple in a 63-9 victory on Oct. 12, 2006.

Clemson's defense held the Bulldogs to just 162 total yards and added a score of its own when linebacker James Skalski returned a fumble 17 yards for the first touchdown of his career. Freshman Myles Murphy added two tackles for loss and forced the fumble that led to the Skalski scoop-and-score.

Wide receiver Frank Ladson Jr. recorded career highs in receptions (three), receiving yards (87) and receiving touchdowns (two).

Clemson produced its first shutout since the 2016 Fiesta Bowl, a 31-0 win against Ohio State. It was Clemson's first regular season shutout since a 54-0 win against Syracuse in 2016. The shutout was Clemson's seventh under Head Coach Dabo Swinney, and its fifth home shutout in his tenure.

CLEMSON, S.C. – Clemson improved to 3-0 with a 41-23 win against Virginia at Memorial Stadium. The win extended Clemson's winning streak on Saturdays to 46, passing the 1953-57 Oklahoma Sooners for the longest such streak in FBS history.

Trevor Lawrence was 25-for-38 passing for 329 yards and three touchdowns, including two to Amari Rodgers. Travis Etienne totaled 187 yards from scrimmage, including 73 on the ground and a career-high and Clemson running back record 114 through the air.

Clemson's defense picked off Virginia quarterback Brennan Armstrong twice. Nolan Turner recorded the Tigers' first interception of the season in the second quarter, and on the first drive of the second half, Andrew Booth Jr. made a spectacular one-handed interception, the first of his career, in the corner of the end zone.

Lyn-J Dixon returned the opening kickoff of the game for a career-long 52 yards, setting the tone for Clemson to run out to a 24-3 lead before a late second-quarter Virginia touchdown made it 24-10 Clemson at the half.

The Tigers opened the second half scoring off the Booth interception with a 42-yard Potter field goal. The Cavaliers answered with a touchdown before Etienne recorded his second score of the game to give Clemson a 34-17 lead. Chez Mellusi added a fourth quarter twoyard rushing touchdown, his first of the season and first since the 2019 ACC Championship against the Cavaliers, to extend the Tiger lead to 41-17 before a late Virginia touchdown brought the final score to 41-23.

CLEMSON, S.C. - No. 1 Clemson earned a 42-17 victory over No. 7 Miami (Fla.) in Clemson's first regular season matchup of Top 10 teams since 2016.

Clemson's defense kept the Hurricanes offense in check all night, allowing only 210 yards, while the offense piled up 550. Sheridan Jones, Derion Kendrick and Kane Patterson all had interceptions while the Clemson pass rush totaled five sacks.

Trevor Lawrence completed 29-of-41 passes for 292 vards and three touchdowns and Travis Etienne ran for 149 yards and two scores and caught a game-high eight passes for 73 yards. Etienne's second rushing touchdown was the 60th of his career, making him only the 12th player in official EBS records to score 60 career rushing touchdowns

Braden Galloway produced the first multi-touchdown game by a Clemson tight end since 2016, catching touchdown passes of 24 and 11 yards. Davis Allen added his first career touchdown as well to give Clemson tight ends three touchdowns in the contest.

Clemson controlled the ball for 12:31 of the first quarter and ran 25 plays to Miami's six. At halftime, Clemson held a 21-3 advantage in first downs.

Miami scored its first touchdown of the game on the final play of the first half, blocking a 61-yard field goal attempt by B.T. Potter and returning it 48 yards for a touchdown. It was one of three Miami field goal blocks.

Clemson's 25-point win represented its sixth victory of 25 points or more against an AP Top 10 opponent all-time.

ATLANTA - No. 1 Clemson cruised to the largest conference win in ACC history, defeating Georgia Tech, 73-7, at Bobby Dodd Stadium.

Clemson scored a modern-era school-record 52 firsthalf points, as Trevor Lawrence was 22-for-27 passing for 391 yards and five touchdowns in the first half alone. Lawrence finished with a career-high 404 passing yards. Wide receiver Amari Rodgers found the end zone twice in a career-high 161 yard performance as 17 different Tigers caught a pass, the most in the Dabo Swinney era.

Among those with a touchdown was defensive tackle Nyles Pinckney, who scored on a one-yard touchdown run in the second quarter. Travis Etienne scored a threeyard rushing touchdown in the second quarter as well, giving him 408 career points to break Chandler Catanzaro's school record of 404.

The Tiger defense forced three turnovers and totaled four sacks. Clemson held Georgia Tech to seven first downs, its second straight game holding its opponent to single-digit first downs.

Chez Mellusi, Kobe Pace and Ajou Ajou added second half touchdowns. Pace's came on Hunter Helms's first career touchdown pass. Ajou's touchdown, also from Helms, marked the first of his career as well.

CLEMSON, S.C. - Top-ranked Clemson improved to 6-0 with a 47-21 victory over Syracuse. After Clemson raced out to a 17-0 lead, Syracuse pulled to within six points at 27-21 before Clemson rattled off 20 unanswered points to seal the game.

The Tigers' defense forced a momentum-swinging strip-sack in the third quarter that was returned for a touchdown by Andrew Booth Jr. Clemson also had three interceptions, one each by Nolan Turner, Mike Jones Jr. and Jalvn Phillips.

Travis Etienne scored three rushing touchdowns on 16 carries and totaled 86 yards on the ground. Trevor Lawrence was 27-of-43 passing for 289 yards and two touchdowns.

Syracuse returned a Lawrence interception 39 yards for a touchdown and the Tigers responded with another Potter field goal to give them a 27-14 lead as the first half expired. With Clemson's fumble return touchdown and Syracuse's interception return touchdown, the game was Clemson's first in which both teams recorded a defensive touchdown since 2014 when Clemson's Jadar Johnson and South Carolina State's Dominique Mitchell each scored via fumble return.

The win gave Clemson a school-record 26-game home unbeaten streak. Clemson went unbeaten in 25 straight games at Memorial Stadium from 1980-84 with 23 wins and two ties in that span.
