## GAMECOCK NOTABLES

- Prior to tonight's game, South Carolina will celebrate its 2021-22 accomplishments by distributing rings and unveiling banners to recognize the program's sixth SEC Tournament title and third trip to the NCAA Final Four.
- Tonight's game is the home opener for South Carolina, which is 25-7 all-time in home openers, including an 11-2 mark under head coach Dawn Staley. The Gamecocks have won their last 10 home openers and are 17-2 in home openers played in Colonial Life Arena.
- The home opener is a great time to remind everyone that South Carolina fans have led the nation in average attendance for each of last seven seasons, including the limited-attendance 2020-21 season. This season, the Gamecocks have sold over 10,100 season tickets, putting them on track to retain the title.
- South Carolina's depth has shown in bench production so far this season. Through two games, the bench is averaging 23.0 points per game to account for 33.3 percent of the offense. Last season, the bench averaged 17.3 points per game for 22.9 percent of the offense.
- Senior Destanni Henderson continues to be the engine that powers the Gamecock offense. She leads the team with 14.5 points per game and 5.0 assists per game. Those numbers rank 14th and fourth, respectively in the SEC. She has shot 56.3 percent from the field, including a sterling 66.7 percent from 3-point range (4-of-6).
- Junior Aliyah Boston continues to garner a lion's share of opponents' attention on defense, but teams have not been able to slow her down as much defensively as she leads the nation with 4.5 blocks per game.

## Five-Second Count

South Carolina women's basketball is in the midst of its most successful era, claiming at least 20 wins for the last 10 seasons, including four 30 -win seasons in the last seven campaigns. The Gamecocks have played in the NCAA Final Four three times in the last six NCAA Tournaments, including winning the 2017 National Championship, and have been ranked in the AP Top 25 39 in the top 10 . Staley has led the Gamecocks to their only No. 1 rankings in program history ( 12 weeks in 201415, 10 weeks in 2019-20, 3 weeks in 2020-21, 2 weeks in 2021-22), five SEC regular-season titles and six SEC Tournament championships.

Under Staley's leadership, seven Gamecocks have earned All-America status, two have earned SEC Player of the Year honors and 16 have picked up All-SEC recognition at least once. Eight Gamecocks have been selected in the WNBA Draft in the last six years, including 2018 No. 1 overall pick A'ja Wilson, who went on to become the Gamecocks' second-straight WNBA Rookie of the Year (2018) and the program's first WNBA MVP (2020).

## The Clemson Series

South Carolina has won the last 10 meetings, but Clemson leads the overall series 33-32. The Gamecocks' 10 straight victories have all come by double digits.

The Gamecocks hold a 20-11 overall advantage in games played in Columbia, winning the last five meetings at Colonial Life Arena.

The most recent meetings between the rivals went to South Carolina, 84-48, at Littlejohn Coliseum on Nov. 24, 2019. Six Gamecocks scored in double figures as South Carolina opened with a 20-9 advantage after the first quarter and never looked back.

The last game at Colonial Life Arena was on Nov. 15, 2018, resulting in a 69-57 South Carolina victory. Four Gamecocks on the current roster played in that game LeLe Grissett, Destanni Henderson, Victaria Saxton, Elysa Wesolek.

## Home Sweet Home

The Gamecocks are 479-165 (.744) all-time in home games, including a 167-34 mark under head coach Dawn Staley. Her 831 winning percentage at home is second among the program's seven all-time head coaches (Pam Parsons (41-7) .854).

Playing in its 19th season at Colonial Life Arena, South Carolina boasts a 230-67 (.774) record in the building, including three undefeated seasons since 2013-14. Staley's share of that record is 164-34 (.828).

## TEAM THEME: NETWORTH

South Carolina's 2021-22 season theme "Net Worth" taps into the universal symbol of success in basketball - cutting down the nets. Each member of the team, the program and the fan base plays a role in the march toward achieving that level of success.

Every role is not the same, but every person has a "Net Worth" - an added value necessary for the team to achieve its goals.

Head coach Dawn Staley's program develops a different theme each season to amplify the team's goals and mindset for the season ahead.

## Schedule Strength

South Carolina's 10 games against teams in either the AP or USA Today/WBCA Poll are the third-most in the nation, trailing just Stanford (12) and Maryland (11). Michigan, Tennessee and Texas also have nine confirmed such games on their schedule. The Gamecocks have a chance to add two more games based on results in the Battle 4 Atlantis (Nov. 20-22).

## Ranking Review

The Gamecocks open the season atop both primary national polls for the second time in as many seasons.

In the AP Poll, the Gamecocks have appeared in each of the last 170 weeks, giving them the fourth-longest active streak in the nation, which dates back to Dec. 10, 2021. They have spent the last 39 of those weeks ranked in the top 10 and have been No. 1 in the poll 17 times.

In the USA Today/WBCA Coaches' Poll, South Carolina has been in the top 10 since claiming the No. 10 spot in the 2019-20 preseason poll. It has been No. 1 in this poll 12 times in the last eight seasons.

## Staley's Stand

In October, the University of South Carolina awarded head coach Dawn Staley a seven-year contract totaling $\$ 22.4$ million. With a guaranteed $\$ 2.9$ million this season, the move made Staley the highest paid women's basketball coach at a public institution (matching Geno Auriemma at UConn) and the highest paid Black coach in her sport.

Ever the trailblazer, Staley emphasized that her negotiations were about more than her contract. They were founded in her desire to make a point about the inequality in salaries for women, and Black women in particular, throughout her sport and across all professions.

## The Staley File

In 21 seasons as a head coach, Dawn Staley has a .734 (505-183) winning percentage, which ranks 12th in the nation among active head coaches with at least 10 seasons of experience (seventh among Power 5 conference coaches). The unanimous 2020 National Coach of the Year, she became the first person to win both a Naismith Player of the Year Trophy and a Naismith Coach of the Year Trophy.

In her 14th season leading the Gamecocks, Staley is the program's all-time winningest coach (332) with a program-record 10 postseason appearances (9 NCAA/1 WNIT). She accounts for all three of the Gamecocks' Final Four appearances $(2015,2017,2021)$ and the first national championship in program history (2017).

After winning five SEC regular-season titles, Staley has won 152 SEC games to rank second among active league coaches (Gary Blair, Texas A\&M, 154) and fourth all-time. Her 11.7 SEC wins average is the best in league history, and her .738 SEC winning percentage (152-54) is second only to Tennessee's Pat Summitt (.874) in league history.

## Oh Captain, My Captain

For the second time in as many seasons, senior Victaria Saxton and junior Aliyah Boston will serve as team captains. It is Saxton's third season in that position.

## All-Everything Aliyah Boston

From her career debut triple-double to becoming the only 2021 finalist for both the Naismith Trophy and Naismith Defensive Player of the Year, junior Aliyah Boston has spent two seasons on the national stage. In her third campaign, she is poised to rise to the top step.

Boston enters her third season as a two-time AllAmerican and two-time Lisa Leslie Center Award winner. She averages a double-double for her career (13.1 ppg/10.4 rpg) while her 30 career double-doubles leads all active SEC players and ranks eighth in program history. In 29 career games against ranked opponents, her averages rise to 13.5 ppg and 11.3 rpg .

Boston is USA Today's Preseason Player of the Year
and a unanimous First-Team All-American. Dropping 23 pounds since the start of her sophomore season, Boston was all about basketball this summer, helping the U.S. to gold at the FIBA AmeriCup and spending time training with NBA legend Tim Duncan.

## Paint Production

South Carolina has long dominated the paint on both ends of the court. This season Staley has challenged her team to be more efficient in the paint as well, especially in transition.

Through two games, the Gamecocks average 34.0 points in the paint, accounting for 49.3 percent of their total offense, and have scored them on 34-of-48 shooting (.708). Post players have accounted for 21.0 of those 34.0 paint points per game.

## Glass Ceiling

Since the start of the 2019-20 season, the Gamecocks have dominated on the glass, ranking among the NCAA's top five in rebounds per game and rebounding margin every season and sixth in offensive rebounds per game each of the last two full seasons. In the last 65 games played, South Carolina has been out-rebounded just three times, still winning all three games.

This season, South Carolina ranks 28th in the nation with a +20.0 rebounding margin. No one Gamecock ranks among the league's best on the glass, but that's because of the team effort that has five Gamecocks averaging 4.0 or more rebounds.

## Block Party

South Carolina annually ranks among the best shot blocking teams in the country and finished the 2020-21 season second in the nation with 7.0 blocks per game, including 7.6 in SEC play.

This season is not different with South Carolina coming in third in the country with 9.5 blocks per game and Aliyah Boston's 4.5 blocks per game leading the nation.

Senior Victaria Saxton is sixth in the SEC with 2.0 blocks

Boston showed the biggest improvement in the offseason, going from 3.44 at the start of 202021 to 3.03 to start this season.

## Jumping

Saniya Rivers is second on the team at a 29.8-inch vertical jump and can also touch 10 -foot-5. Laeticia Amihere has a 27 -inch vertical and can touch 10-foot-9. Aliyah Boston improved her vertical jump by four inches in the offseason.

per game, and junior Brea Beal's 1.5 blocks per game are 11th in the conference. Last season's ACC blocks leader Kamilla Cardoso has two blocks so far in her Gamecock career.

## Awards (Pre)Season

Five Gamecocks got an early jump on awards season with three grabbing Preseason All-America honors from at least one organization.

Aliyah Boston led the charge with unanimous FirstTeam All-America honors and a spot on the Lisa Leslie Center Award watch list. She was named USA Today Preseason Player of the Year as well.

Junior Zia Cooke picked up Preseason All-America Third Team recognition from Lindy's as well as a spot on the Preseason All-SEC First Team and the Ann Meyers Drysdale Shooting Guard Award watch list.
Senior Destanni Henderson made her debut on the national stage with a Preseason Second-Team All-America nod from USA Today. She was a Preseason All-SEC Second Team selection and was named to the Nancy Lieberman Point Guard watch list.

Sophomore Kamilla Cardoso and freshman Sania Fegain got in on the positional award recognition. Cardoso joined Boston on the Lisa Leslie Award list, which Feagin made the Katrina McClain Power Forward Award watch list.

## Great Gamecock Fans

South Carolina fans have led the nation in average attendance in each of the last seven seasons,. With over 10,100 season tickets sold this season - the most since 10,221 were out in 2016-17 - that streak looks to continue for another year.

Excluding the COVID limited-attendance season of 2019-20, South Carolina has drawn at least 10,000 fans in 47 consecutive games dating back to the Nov. 10, 2017, season opener. In regular-season action (excluding NCAA Tournament games), the streak stretches to 82 games beginning on Jan. 2, 2015.

## U-S-A, U-S-A

Since the arrival of Staley in the 2008-09 season, South Carolina has solidified its relationship with USA Basketball. at least one Gamecock has donned the red, white and blue in each of the last six years of international competition (no events in 2020), and the group of 11 Gamecocks, including three currently in the program, has helped 18 U.S. teams to gold medals, three more to silvers and another to bronze.

Staley along with three current and two former Gamecocks added four golds to that count this summer.

In Tokyo, Staley and alumna A'ja Wilson led the U.S. to its record-tying seventh-straight gold medal in $5 \times 5$ basketball, while Allisha Gray was part of the first ever Olympic $3 \times 3$ gold medal team.

In June, Staley led the U.S. team, which included senior Destanni Henderson and junior Aliyah Boston, to gold at the FIBA AmeriCup in June. Two months later, freshman Sania Feagin was part of the U.S. team to take gold int he FIBA U19 World Cup.

While this summer marked the first gold medals for Feagin and Henderson, Boston's was the fifth of her career. Junior Zia Cooke also has two gold medals with USA Basketball.

## Everybody's All-American

On the Gamecocks' 16-woman roster, 11 were McDonald's All-Americans in high school - Brea Beal, Aliyah Boston, Kamilla Cardoso, Zia Cooke, Sania Feagin, Bree Hall, Destanni Henderson, Raven Johnson, Destiny Littleton, Saniya Rivers and Eniya Russell.

At South Carolina, Staley has coached 18 McDonald's All-Americans, including 14 who joined the Gamecocks as freshmen.
