OPENING TIPS

• Columbia concludes a two-game road trip in the Carolinas on Sunday with its first ever tilt against Clemson. Tip from Littlejohn Coliseum is set for 12 noon ET.

• Columbia defeated Davidson, 87-78, on Friday behind 22 points from Abbey Hsu and 16 more from first-year Kitty Henderson. The Lions used a 10-0 fourth quarter run to take a 10-point lead and outscored the Wildcats 23-6 over a 10-minute stretch between the third and fourth quarter to move to 2-0.

• Abbey Hsu has scored 22 points in each of the first two games of her sophomore season. The returning All-Ivy selection is top 12 in the nation in total points entering Saturday (44) and top 50 in scoring average.

• First-year Kitty Henderson scored a season-high 16 points in Friday's win at Davidson. Fellow first-year Noa Comesana had 10 points (5-6 FG). The rookie duo were part of five Lions in double figures.

• Columbia will be facing an ACC opponent for the fifth time in program history. The Lions are 1-3 in their previous four ACC contests, picking up their win on Nov. 29, 2017 over Boston College, 68-60, in New York. Under Megan Griffith, Columbia has picked up its first victories in program history over opponents from the ACC and BIG EAST (Providence).

DAVIDSON, N.C. – In a game that saw neither side lead by more than single digits through the first three quarters, the Columbia women's basketball team stood tall in the fourth and passed its first road test of the season, 87-78, over Davidson Friday night at Belk Arena.

Leading by just a point, Columbia (2-0) put together a 10-0 run over a span of 4:30 of the final period to surge to victory. It started with first-year Kitty Henderson nailing a jumper and ended with sophomore Abbey Hsu knocking down three at the charity stripe, making it a 79-69 game with three minutes remaining.

Davidson (0-2), which tested No. 24 Virginia Tech in its season opener on Tuesday, momentarily stopped the bleeding with a free throw, but Hannah Pratt answered with the exclamation point. The junior out of Boca Raton, Florida knocked down a trey to balloon the lead to a dozen and put the game out of reach.

"We figured it out in the fourth quarter and played Columbia basketball down the stretch," head coach Megan Griffith stated. "A lot of credit to Davidson, that's a really good college basketball team and I thought that was a great game. They were relentless and I thought our players matched that really well."

The Lions were led by Abbey Hsu's second-straight outing of 22 points to start her sophomore season. Hsu did a lot of damage by getting to the foul line on a night where the three wasn't falling, going 9-of-10 at the stripe and adding six rebounds and four steals.

First-year duo Kitty Henderson and Noa Comesana were impressive. Henderson scored 16 off the bench on 6-of-10 shooting, while Comesana scored 10 on 5-of-6 from the floor. Junior Kaitlyn Davis recorded her first double-double of the season with 12 points and a game-high 10 rebounds, while Sienna Durr rounded out Columbia's double-figure scorers with 10.

"That was the definition of Columbia women's basketball," said Henderson, who hails from Australia. "Just finishing that really hard win there. We're going to celebrate this win tonight, get around each other, and tomorrow morning we've got to focus on Clemson for Sunday."

The Lions overcame a hot 3-point shooting night by Davidson, who started 5-of-10 from three to lead 24-20 at the end of the first quarter. Henderson's three early in the second quarter tied it up at 27.

A 12-0 second-quarter run gave the Lions the first bit of separation. Hsu's trey at the 5:55 mark forced Davidson to call for time. Pratt closed out the run to put Columbia up 36-27.

Davidson answered with a run of its own and led 45-43 with the half winding down. Carly Rivera was fouled on a desperation heave one second before halftime and knocked down all three free throws to put the Lions back in front.

A stalemate of a third quarter had things deadlocked at 66 heading for the final 10 minutes. Columbia was simply better down the stretch, outscoring Davidson 23-6 over a span of nearly 10 minutes to improve to 2-0 for the second time in its last three seasons.

Columbia's weekend road trip continues in South Carolina, as the Lions head down I-85 for a Sunday afternoon battle at Clemson. Tip from Littlejohn Coliseum is set for 12 noon.

NEW YORK— The Columbia women's basketball team created a double-digit first-quarter lead and never looked back, disposing of Hampton, 78-56, Tuesday night in the 2021-22 season opener at Levien Gymnasium.

Sophomore Abbey Hsu led the way for Columbia (1-0) with a game-high 22 points on 8-of-16 shooting, including 5-of-9 from the perimeter. The 2019-20 All-Ivy League selection hit her first shot of the season, a 3-pointer just 11 seconds in, and hit another just before the halftime horn to have the Lions up 41-23 at the break.

"It was one of those nights where it felt good," said Hsu. "I want it to feel good the rest of the season, but tonight felt good ... I'm excited to be back on the floor and excited to play with this group."

Hsu was joined in double figures by juniors Kaitlyn Davis and Sienna Durr, who netted 14 apiece on identical 4-of-7 marks from the floor. Junior point guard Carly Rivera had game-highs of seven assists and six rebounds, while Duke transfer Jaida Patrick scored nine off the bench.

"We were solid. We held them to eight points in the first quarter, which was really nice to see," Columbia head coach Megan Griffith said. "I think we just had to get those jitters out ... Depth is amazing. It makes everything a little bit easier when you're not relying on one or two people every night ... the depth has been really helpful and a big credit to my staff for recruiting these kids."

The Lions outscored Hampton 14-3 over the final 8:32 of the first quarter to hold a 12-point cushion. They extended the run to 19-3 with back-to-back buckets by Hsu to open the second quarter. Her layup at the 9:08 mark put Columbia ahead 25-8.

Columbia continued to hold a double-digit lead through the third quarter, but Hampton was staying within striking distance. The Lady Pirates whittled the deficit down to as little as 11 and remained uncomfortably close, 57-44, with 9:06 left in the ball game.

That's when the Lions put the game away. Back-to-back treys by Sienna Durr and Abbey Hsu spurred a 10-0 run that left no doubt in the final outcome.

"If we can go about it the right way and prepare ourselves every day, [our results] will just be the byproduct of all the work that we do," Griffith added. "There's something about this team where culturally they are so dialed in. It's so fun to be around them and it's the most fun I've had coaching."

Columbia ultimately turned 24 Hampton turnovers into a 21-10 scoring advantage. The Lions' bench also outscored the Lady Pirates, 23-7, led by Duke transfer Patrick's nine.

After a successful season opener at home, Columbia will play its next four on the road. That stretch begins this weekend when the Lions fly to the southeast, going up against Davidson on Friday and Clemson on Sunday.

COLUMBIA WOMEN'S BASKETBALL NOTES

QUICK HITS

- Columbia started 2-0 for the second time in its last three seasons.
- The Lions are 13-4 in their last 17 non-conference games dating back to 2018-19.
- Columbia's 82.5 ppg ranks No. 27 among teams that have played at least twice entering Saturday.
- Columbia was picked third in the 2021-22 Ivy League Preseason Poll, marking the highest preseason selection in program history.

TAKING DOWN THE POWER CONFERENCES

- Columbia is 4-4 in its last eight games against power-conference opponents (ACC, Big 10, Big 12, BIG EAST, SEC, Pac 12). The Lions opened the 2017-18 season by defeating Providence on the road, 73-64, marking their second-straight victory over the Friars. In 2016, Columbia took down Providence in overtime in New York to mark its first win in program history against a BIG EAST opponent. The Lions earned their first ACC win in the 2017-18 season when they defeated Boston College, 68-60, in front of a record 2,372 fans on Education Day. In 2019-20, they added to the tally with a 54-49 victory on Education Day over Georgetown (Dec. 6).

DAVIDSON POSTGAME NOTES

- Five Lions scored in double figures for the first time since Feb. 21, 2020 at Brown
- Kaitlyn Davis had her first double-double of the season and third of her career
- Abbey Hsu went 9-of-10 at the stripe, marking career-highs in makes, attempts and percentage
- Carly Rivera tied her career-highs of eight assists and three steals
- Columbia went 22-of-30 at the free throw line, marking its most attempts since Nov. 9, 2018 at Hofstra
- Columbia made 20+ free throws for the second straight game to start the season

HAMPTON POSTGAME NOTES

- Abbey Hsu went 5-of-9 from the perimeter, marking the fifth time in her career she's made at least five threes. It was fourth time she has shot 50 percent or better from the arc (min. 5 makes).
- Hsu's 22-point performance marked her fifth career 20-point game.
- Jaida Patrick had career-highs of four steals, five made free throws and six free throw attempts
- Columbia's 15 steals were its most since going for 23 in a 102-18 victory over Central Penn on Jan. 3, 2016.
- Columbia went 20-of-25 from the charity stripe, its most made free throws since Feb. 8, 2019 against Harvard.
- Hampton's 20 made free throws were the most against the Lions since Milwaukee (25-27) on Nov. 16, 2018.
- Six Lions made their Columbia debuts (Comesaña, Patrick, Stephens, Henderson, Lobon, Lauder). Five of the six made their collegiate debuts (Patrick transferred in from Duke).
- Columbia improved to 2-1 in the all-time series against Hampton.

SCOUTING CLEMSON

- Clemson (1-0) began its season Wednesday night with a 64-47 victory over USC Upstate. Newcomer Daisha Bradford scored a game-high 16 points on 7-for-8 shooting from the floor, including 2-2 behind the arc.
- The starters tallied 52 of the Tigers' 64 points, as Delicia Washington (14 points), Amari Robinson (12 points), and Kiara Lewis (10 points) joined Bradford in double-figures. Freshman Eno Inyang had four points, a game-high 10 rebounds and a game-high four blocks in her debut.
- The Tigers welcome back three starters from a season ago, including graduate Delicia Washington who earned preseason All-ACC honors and ended the 2020-21 season being named Second Team All-ACC, WNIT All-Region, and led the Tigers in scoring and assists.
- Clemson will also add graduate transfers Kiara Lewis (Syracuse) and LaTrese Saine (SEMO) and junior college transfer Daisha Bradford, who will immediately impact. Lewis was a First-Team All-ACC selection in 2019-20 and an honorable mention selection last season at Syracuse.
- Saine was the 2020-21 OVC Defensive Player of the Year and became the all-time blocks leader at SEMO her senior year.

LEADING RETURNERS

- Abbey Hsu is Columbia's leading returning scorer after averaging 14.3 points in 2019-20.
- Columbia's top returner on the glass is Sienna Durr who averaged 6.1 per contest.
- The Lions had two players post 20+ blocks in 2019-20, which were Hannah Pratt (23) and Kaitlyn Davis (22).
- Returning PGs Mikayla Markham and Carly Rivera combined for 152 of the team's 408 assists in 19-20.



COLUMBIA WOMEN'S BASKETBALL NOTES

PRESEASON NUGGETS

• Columbia begins its 37th varsity season and 35th competing at the NCAA Div. I level as a member of the Ivy League. The program's first season competing as the Columbia-Barnard Athletic Consortium was 1984-85, followed by its first season competing in both the Ivy League and NCAA Div. I in 1986-87. The 2020-21 season was canceled due to the COVID-19 pandemic.

• Columbia returns eight players from the 2019-20 season, which accounts for over 80 percent of its scoring and over 83 percent of its rebounding.

• The Lions have seven newcomers since the end of the 2019-20 campaign. Those include two first-years, four sophomores and junior transfer Jaida Patrick (Duke).

• The 2019-20 team went 17-10 overall with an 8-6 mark in Ivy League play. The program's 17 wins and eight Ivy victories were its second-most since becoming a Div. I program in 1986-87.

• Abbey Hsu ranked led the Ivy League, ranked No. 30 nationally and was No. 3 among all NCAA freshmen in 2019-20 in 3-point field goal percentage (.411)

• Columbia was picked third in the 2021-22 Ivy League Preseason poll with 87 total votes. The preseason ranking is the team's highest in program history.

RECORD CAMPAIGN

• Columbia concluded the 2019-20 regular season with a record of 17-10 and an 8-6 mark in the Ivy League. Columbia's 17 wins and eight Ivy wins are its second-most since becoming a Div. I program in 1986-87 - the 2009-10 team holds the record by going 18-10 with a 9-5 mark in the league. The 2009-10 Lions were the only other team to post a winning season. Along the way, Columbia won a program-best six consecutive Ivy League games, including three straight weekend sweeps. Prior to 2019-20, the last time the Lions swept an Ivy League weekend was in 2011. Columbia's longest Ivy League winning streak prior to 2019-20 was four games, which occurred in 2008.

WINNING SEASON

• Columbia locked up its first winning season in 2019-20 since going 18-10 in 2009-10. In fact, the 2009-10 team was the only team in Columbia's Div. I history to post a winning season - the program went Div. I and officially joined the Ivy League in 1986-87. Columbia's six Ivy League wins to this point are its most since going 6-8 in 2010-11. The 2009-10 team was the only one to finish the season with a winning record in Ivy League play (9-5).

NATIONAL PLAYER OF THE WEEK COMBO

• Columbia boasts two players that have earned U.S. Basketball Writers Association Freshman of the Week honors. Sienna Durr earned hers on Jan. 8, 2019 after averaging 19.5 points and 8.5 rebounds while shooting 68 percent (17-25) from the field to help the Lions to a 2-0 week over Hampton and Mercer. She scored 21 points against the Lady Pirates and followed it up with a double-double of 18 points and 11 rebounds against the Bears.

The following season, Abbey Hsu was named National Rookie of the Week on Feb. 16, 2020. Hsu shot 55.2 percent from the field and 50.0 percent (10-20) from 3-point range to lead Columbia to its first Ivy League weekend sweep in nine years. Hsu scored 19 points against the Big Green and followed it up with a career-high 31 points against Harvard (11-15 FG, 6-9 3FG).

HOME DOMINANCE

• Columbia went 10-4 in 2019-20, tying the 2009-10 team for the best home record in the program's Div. I era. The Lions won seven straight home games from Nov. 10 - Jan. 18, tying another program record. Over the course of that winning streak, Columbia outscored opponents by an average 21.4 points per game and holding them to less than 52 points per game. The Lions shot over 46 percent and held the opposition to under 35 percent. Additionally, they outrebounded the opposition by 9.3 per contest.

NOTES FROM 2019-20

Hsu's HISTORIC 2019-20 IVY SEASON

• Abbey Hsu scored 229 in Ivy League play during 2019-20 season. Her point total was the largest by a first-year Lion across Ivy play in program history. In those games, she is shot 45.4 percent from the floor and 43.4 percent (46-106) from the perimeter. Her scoring average and field goal percentage each ranked among the top three in league games, while her 3-point percentage ranked No. 1.

DAVIS STUFFS STAT SHEET TO BE NAMED ROOKIE OF THE WEEK

• First-year Kaitlyn Davis was named Ivy League Rookie of the Week for the first time following Columbia's week-end sweep over Brown and Yale (Feb. 21-22, 2020). Davis averaged 13.5 points, 9.5 rebounds, 3.0 assists, 2.5 steals and 2.0 blocks, all while shooting 47.6 percent (10-21) from the field. She went for a double-double against Brown of 13 points and 12 rebounds while also picking up four assists, four blocks and four steals. The following day, Davis helped the Lions defeat Yale on the road with 14 points, seven boards and a pair of assists.

NATIONAL HONORS FOR Hsu

• Abbey Hsu was named the Tamika Catchings National Rookie of the Week by the U.S. Basketball Writers Association (USBWA) for the week of games ending Feb. 16. Hsu shot 55.2 percent from the field and 50.0 percent (10-20) from 3-point range to lead Columbia to its first Ivy League weekend sweep in nine years and its first ever weekend sweep over Dartmouth and Harvard. It marks the second year in a row a Lion has earned the USBWA's national rookie honor - Sienna Durr earned it in January of 2019 on her way to being named both Ivy League and Met Basketball Writers Association Rookie of the Year. Additionally, Hsu was named Ivy League Player and Rookie of the Week.



NOTES FROM 2019-20

GROWN UP

• Columbia significantly improved in rebounding and blocked shots during the 2019-20 campaign compared to the year prior. At the end of the season, the Lions ranked 55th in the NCAA in rebounds (40.44), 77th in rebound margin (+4.1) and 89th in blocked shots (3.9). Compare that to the end of the 2018-19 season, Columbia was sitting 200th or worse in the NCAA in all three categories, including 339th out of 348 in blocked shots (1.6).

Hsu IN FOR ROOKIE OF THE WEEK

• Abbey Hsu has picked up five Ivy League Rookie of the Week honors in 2019-20, four of which came in Ivy League play. She earned her first in December following an 18-point performance against NJIT, then her second after scoring 17 and hitting 5-of-7 from three in a victory over Cornell. Hsu's third came following back-to-back 16-point performances against Yale and Brown. Her last followed a 31-point explosion against Harvard in which she was also named the National Freshman of the Week by U.S. Basketball Writers Association. Hsu's five Rookie of the Week awards, along with one by Davis, gave the Lions 14 over the past two years.

NON-CONFERENCE SUCCESS

• The Lions won eight of their last nine non-conference games to wrap up the non-conference season at 9-4. Their nine non-conference victories tie for the third-most in program history and marks the third time in the last five years they've won at least nine games heading into Ivy League play.

SIX-PACK OF WINS

• The Lions put together a six-game winning streak that spanned Nov. 17 - Dec. 21. It began with a 61-59 victory over reigning NEC champion Robert Morris and was the longest winning streak since they rolled off seven straight during the 2016-17 non-conference season.

• Over the course of its winning streak, Columbia held opponents to 53.2 points per game, 33.6 percent shooting and 20.2 percent from 3-point range. They held opponents to fewer than 50 points three times and boasted a +17.1 scoring margin. Four of the six wins have come when trailing in the fourth quarter.

DOUBLE-FIGURE BLOCKS

• Columbia blocked a season-high 10 shots in the win over Tennessee St. It marked the team's most blocks in a game since rejecting 12 against Central Penn in January of 2016. It also tied for the seventh-most blocks in a single game in program history.

ROOKIE OF THE WEEK FIRST

• First year guard Abbey Hsu was named Ivy League Rookie of the Week for the first time for games played Dec. 16-22. A first-year guard out of Parkland, Florida, Hsu was near perfect from the field to lead the Lions to their sixth consecutive victory and largest margin of victory against a Div. I opponent in program history. She hit her first seven attempts against NJIT, finishing the game 7-of-8 from the floor and 4-of-5 from 3-point range. Led by Hsu's effort, Columbia ended the afternoon 59.7 percent shooting (40-67) and 54.2 percent from 3-point range (13-24). The rookie added two assists and a rebound.

THREE STRAIGHT AGAINST THE BIG EAST

• The Lions won their third consecutive BIG EAST game on Dec. 6 when they took down Georgetown, 54-49, on Education Day at Levien Gymnasium. The game tipped at 11 a.m. with over 2,400 elementary school students from the New York area in attendance. Columbia earned its first BIG EAST win in program history when it defeated Providence, 66-64, on Education Day in 2016. The Lions beat the Friars again in the 2017-18 season opener.

DURR'S CAREER DAY

• Sienna Durr posted career-highs in scoring (31), rebounding (13), field goals (11-21) and 3-pointers (5-10) at Buffalo (Nov. 15, 2019). Her 31 points tie for the 11th-most in a game in program history and is the most in a game by an Ivy League player this season. She also recorded the first 30-10 game by a Lion since Camille Zimmerman went for 31 and 11 at Harvard on Feb. 2, 2018.

HISTORIC DEBUTS

- The Lions saw five players make their Columbia debuts in the 2019-20 season opener at Albany, which included first-years Kaitlyn Davis, Abbey Hsu and Carly Rivera, sophomore Hannah Pratt and junior transfer Kallin Spiller.
- Davis shot 10-for-15 from the floor on her way to 23 points and 13 rebounds, becoming the first Lion in program history to post a 20-10 game in her debut. She is also only the third Lion in program history to go for 20 points and 10 rebounds in a season opener, joining Camille Zimmerman (2016) and Michele Gage (2005).
- Davis' 13 rebounds are the most by a Lion in a debut since Columbia Hall of Fame forward Judie Lomax '10BC had 14 against Oakland in 2008. Lomax transferred to Columbia after playing the 2006-07 season at Oregon State.
- Davis' 23 points are the most by a Lion in a debut since Carolyn Binder scored 28 at LIU Brooklyn in 2013.
- Davis is the first Lion to score 20 points off the bench since Devon Roeper in December of 2015.
- Davis and Hannah Pratt are the first pair of Lions to post double-doubles in the same debut. Chelsea Frazier was the last to do it on her own in 2006. Davis and Pratt are also the first Lions to each post a double-double in the same game since Camille Zimmerman and Devon Roeper did so in a 4OT win against Dartmouth in 2017.



For a fourth straight season, Columbia women's basketball will be featured on SportsNet NY (SNY). Three Columbia women's basketball games will be televised live this winter. The Lions will appear live against Yale (Jan. 2), Penn (Jan. 8) and Cornell (Jan. 17).

With a total distribution of nearly 12 million homes, SNY is available to viewers throughout New York, New Jersey, Connecticut and Northeastern Pennsylvania for a regional reach of 8.0 million households. Combined with national coverage on DIRECTV, Verizon FiOS, Comcast Cable and AT&T U-Verse, SNY's total distribution is 12 million homes. SNY is the official television home of the New York Mets, New York Jets and all things New York sports. As New York's leader in local sports TV coverage, SNY delivers the most comprehensive access to all of the Tri-State area's professional and collegiate sports teams through several nightly sports and entertainment programs.



As part of an agreement between the Ivy League and ESPN, all Columbia home games and all Ivy League women's basketball contests will be streamed live on ESPN+.

ESPN and the Ivy League have reached a comprehensive, 10-year deal for ESPN to become the exclusive national media rights partner for the conference, carrying more than 1,100 events annually from more than 30 sports on ESPN media platforms. The majority of those will be exclusively available on ESPN+, the new direct-to-consumer sports streaming service from The Walt Disney Company's Direct-to-Consumer and International division in partnership with ESPN. The Ivy League will also have at least 24 events air on ESPN's linear networks each year, including the men's and women's basketball conference tournaments.

COLUMBIA ATHLETICS HALL OF FAME CLASS OF 2016

Megan Griffith '07CC is in her sixth year as head coach of the Columbia women's basketball program. She was named head coach in March of 2016 after spending the six years prior at Princeton University.

After building up the program over her first three seasons, Griffith led the Lions to a historical 2019-20 campaign that included a record of 17-10, an 8-6 Ivy League mark and the team's first ever qualification into the Ivy League Basketball Tournament. Columbia started off the year with a 9-4 non-conference record, which included a six-game winning streak and victories over reigning conference champions Fordham, Robert Morris and Mercer. The Lions then headed into league play, where they started 2-4 before rolling off a program record six-game Ivy League winning streak. The streak began the weekend of Feb. 14-15 with the team's first ever weekend sweep over Dartmouth and Harvard, including a 25-point blowout over the Crimson. The following weekend, Griffith's Lions went on the road and swept Brown and Yale for their first back-to-back Ivy League weekend sweep in program history. The winning streak grew to six the weekend of Feb. 28-29, when Columbia went on the road and swept yet another weekend over Harvard and Dartmouth. The Lions overcame a 10-point deficit in Cambridge to earn their first season sweep of Harvard in program history. Less than 24 hours later, they swept Dartmouth to lock up their first berth into the Ivy League Basketball Tournament.

First-year Abbey Hsu went on to be named the Met Basketball Writers Association (MBWA) Women's Div. I Rookie of the Year after ranking top 10 in the Ivy League in scoring (14.3) and leading the Ancient Eight in 3-point shooting (.411). She and sophomore Sienna Durr were each named Second Team All-Ivy League, becoming the first pair of Lions in 12 years to earn All-Ivy League first- or second-team honors. Hsu was named Ivy League Rookie of the Week five times through the season, as well as Ivy League Player of the Week and USBWA National Rookie of the Week on Feb. 18 after averaging 25.0 points and shooting 50 percent (10-of-20) from 3-point range in a weekend sweep over Dartmouth and Harvard.

Energized by a strong first-year class, Griffith coached Columbia to its most Ivy League wins in eight years during the 2018-19 campaign. The Lions took down Harvard at home, swept Brown and won at home against Cornell, entering the final two weeks of the season in contention for their first Ivy League Tournament berth. Along the way, three different Lions combined for eight Ivy League Rookie of the Week selections, including six by first-year Sienna Durr, who went on to be named both Ivy League and All-Met Women's Div. I Rookie of the Year. Both of Durr's Rookie of the Year honors were the first ever to be won by a Lion. Additionally, Durr was named Second Team All-Ivy League while Janiya Clemmons earned honorable mention.

The 2018-19 first-year class also found its way into the Columbia record books. Sienna Durr scored a rookie record 392 points and Mikayla Markham tallied a rookie

record 120 assists. Markham's assist total ranks eighth in Columbia's all-time single-season record book. Markham also became the first Lion with 10 assists in a game in 10 years, as well as the first Lion in the same amount of years to record a double-double with points and assists.

In her first two seasons back at her alma mater, Griffith has coached the program to its first wins over ACC and Big East opponents, including a 68-60 victory over Boston College and two straight victories over Providence. Griffith coached the Lions to their best non-conference season in program history in just her first year as head coach with Columbia starting the year 10-3 (.769). The historic start included a seven-game winning streak, tying the program's Div. I record for consecutive wins last accomplished in 1986-87.

Griffith's first Ivy League victory came in historic fashion, defeating Dartmouth on the road in quadruple overtime, 91-88, on January 27, 2017. The game tied for the longest in Ivy League women's basketball history, when Columbia defeated Penn, 114-111, in 1987, and was featured that evening on SportsCenter.

Prior to her return to Columbia, Griffith spent six seasons at Princeton, including her last four as an assistant coach and the team's recruiting coordinator. She also served as the Tigers' director of basketball operations from 2010-12. The last two years, Griffith has helped Princeton make back-to-back trips to the NCAA Tournament. During that span, the Tigers posted a 54-7 overall record, including an undefeated 30-0 regular season in 2014-15, and a 26-2 mark in Ivy League play.

In Griffith's time with Princeton, the Tigers eclipsed 20 victories and reached the postseason each year, while securing five Ivy League titles. She has mentored 13

All-Ivy League players, including Blake Dietrick, who was the 2015 Ivy League Player of the Year and a WBCA Honorable Mention All-American, and 2013 Ivy League Defensive Player of the Year, Lauren Polansky.

Griffith captained the Lions for three seasons and was a two-time All-Ivy League selection (2006 and 2007). Griffith is one of nine Lions to score more than 1,000 points during her career, averaging 10.1 points per game. During her junior year, Griffith ranked 22nd in the nation in assists, averaging 5.5 per game, while chipping in 15.2 points per game. She was twice named Academic All-Ivy League and was a member of the Arthur Ashe Sports Scholar Team two straight years.

Following graduation, Griffith played three years of professional basketball in Europe. She joined FoA Nice Basketball in Forssa, Finland, during the 2007-08 season and was named the team's MVP at the end of the season. In 2008-09, Griffith led the Espoo Basket Team to the National Finnish Championship and the Finnish Cup Championship titles. During the year she was also a youth basketball coach for Honka Basketball Club.

Griffith was also a member of the Celeritas-Donar Basketball team in Groningen, Netherlands. In addition, she was named a U20 Dames 1 assistant coach and U18 Northern Selection Team assistant coach, while working as a youth coach and clinic director for Celeritas-Donar.

Griffith founded Back to Basics Basketball in 2008, an organization developed to teach basketball skills, while providing training and mentoring in her hometown of King of Prussia, Pennsylvania.

Griffith graduated from Columbia with a degree in economics in 2007.



Griffith led Columbia to its winningest season in a decade during the 2019-20 campaign, as the Lions went 17-10, 8-6 Ivy League, and qualified for that year's Ivy League Tournament.

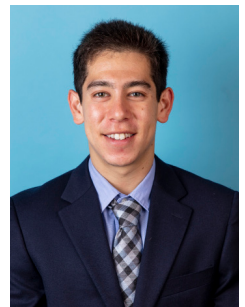
