## SYRACUSE NEWS AND NOTES

### FLJ TO THE RAFTERS

On Sunday, November 14th, women's basketball standout Felisha Legette-Jack had her jersey retired in the Carrier Dome. When Legette-Jack's jersey reached the rafters at halftime of the Syracuse game against Notre Dame, it was the first time in Syracuse University Athletics history that a female student-athlete was recognized in this manner. Her jersey joins those of 14 men's basketball and six football standouts who have received this honor. Legette-Jack is one of four former Syracuse student-athletes who will be honored as impactful and influential figures in the world of sport during the 2021-22 academic year. Anna Goodale (rowing, 2002-05) and Katie Rowan Thomson (lacrosse, 2006-09) are the other two women, and Gary Gait (lacrosse, 1987-90) will also be recognized this year.

### 50 YEARS OF WOMEN'S ATHLETICS AT SU

Orange alumni, fans and friends are invited to share in a year-long celebration of 50 years of Syracuse University women's athletics. Events and special recognition of all female student-athletes who have donned the Block S to represent Syracuse University and the Athletics Department since 1971-72 will be held throughout the 2021-22 seasons.

As we celebrate this history, we acknowledge those who have gone before us to set the standard we strive to achieve today so we can pave the way for the future. We reflect on the history of women in sport, admire their sacrifices, recognize their contributions and accomplishments, and honor their legacy.

The year-long celebration will include the retirement of jerseys for three impactful former student-athletes who are influential figures in the world of sport, including Felisha Legette-Jack (basketball, 1984-89), Anna Goodale (rowing, 2002-05) and Katie Rowan Thomson (lacrosse, 2006-09). Each woman will be honored during Syracuse athletic events over the course of the year.

### MILESTONES IN REACH FOR TRANSFERS

Senior transfer Christianna Carr scored her 1,000th collegiate point against Morgan State on Nov. 17. She will be recognized with a commemorative ball prior to the start of Sunday's non-conference game against Central Connecticut State.

Graduate transfer Naje Murray enters Sunday's game with 991 career points and will be Syracuse's second player to reach 1,000 career points this season when she does so later this month.

### CARR'S BACK-2-BACK-2-BACK-2 BACK

Senior point guard Chrislyn Carr entered Wednesday's game with four-straight 20 point performances for

the Orange. She tallied 23 points and added three assists and three steals in a loss to Buffalo on Nov. 22 and poured in 20 points on 9-of-15 shooting in last Sunday's win over Colgate at the Dome. She added a 23-point performance in Syracuse's upset over #18 Ohio State on Wednesday night while breaking a program record with 22 points in a quarter after entering the fourth quarter with just one point. Carr added 22 points in Syracuse's win over

### APPLYING THE PRESSURE

Syracuse's press has been a problem for opponents this season. The Orange currently lead the ACC in total steals (98) and steals per game (10.9).

The Orange have recorded 16+ steals in a game this season three times (Monmouth, Morgan State & Central Connecticut) and are led by Teisha Hyman with 2.6.

Hyman set a program record for steals in a game with 11 against CCSU on Dec. 5.

### SPREADING THE LOVE

Syracuse has had four different players lead the Orange in scoring in a game this season. Chrislyn Carr (15.9) has led Syracuse in scoring four times while Alaysia Styles, Teisha Hyman and Christianna Carr also have led Syracuse at one point this season.

### THE TEISHA HYMAN GAME

Redshirt sophomore Teisha Hyman etched her name into Syracuse history with a career-high 30-point performance on Wednesday night. She shot 12-for-18 from the field and 4-for-6 from three-point range while dishing out six assists in Syracuse's upset over Ohio State becoming the first Syracuse player to score 30-or more points in a game since Kiara Lewis had 32 against #22 West Virginia on Dec. 22, 2019.

### VONN READ'S FIRST SIGNATURE WIN

Syracuse earned Acting Head Coach Vonn Read his first signature win as a collegiate head coach on Dec. 1 when the Orange upset #18 Ohio State, 97-91.

Read, known as 'The Architect' of the Syracuse women's basketball system that has helped the Orange to eight-straight NCAA Tournaments, has been a part of many wins at Syracuse but the win over the Buckeyes was the first he could call his own.

### ORANGE REWRITE THE RECORD BOOK

Syracuse broke program records for points in a game and points in a half with its 116-65 win over Central Connecticut on Sunday.

Teisha Hyman recorded the fifth triple double in program history with 27 points, 15 assists and 11 steals. Her

eight rebounds left her two shy of recording the first quadruple double in NCAA history by a Power 5 player and it would have been the first quadruple double in Syracuse history for both the men's and women's team.

### ORANGE WWWWIN STREAK

Syracuse has won four-straight games for the first time since beginning the 2020-21 season 4-0. The Orange look to win a fifth-straight on Saturday against Clemson which would be the first five-game win streak since the 2019-20 season when Syracuse rattled off wins against Boston College, #5 Louisville, North Carolina, Pitt and Clemson from Feb. 6-20, 2020.

### JOHN A. LALLY ATHLETICS COMPLEX

As part of Syracuse's \$1.5 billion fundraising campaign, Manley Field House, which has been the main hub for activity and the center of student-athlete life at Syracuse University, will be transformed over time to the John A. Lally Athletics Complex -- a state-of-the-art academic and athletics village that will benefit all student-athletes.

The first phase of the multi-million, multi-year project will commence in spring 2022 with the construction of a new front entrance. As part of this initial work, the Student-Athlete Academic Support Program will have an expanded area to meet student needs through meeting spaces for expanded tutorial appointments and academic advising, along with career and life skills programming.

Additionally, early work will include an enhanced multi-display Hall of Champions experience. The display will celebrate the accomplishments of Orange student-athletes in the classroom and on the field in real time, as well as recognizing alumni successes. This area will also serve as a gathering and event space that can be used for special events, along with day-to-day activities and programming.

## ACTING HEAD COACH VONN READ

Vonn Read, who joined the Syracuse staff prior to the 2011-12 season, was named acting head coach for the 2021-22 season on August 4, 2021. Read was promoted from an assistant coach to associate head coach on Oct. 8, 2013.

Read has helped develop the Orange's defensive and offensive systems in his time on staff, which is predicated on creating more possessions, forcing turnovers, and maximizing points per possession. Syracuse saw the fruits of his labor during the 2015-16 season when it advanced all the way to the 2016 NCAA Tournament final.

Prior to Syracuse, Read served as assistant coach at Albany from 2008-10 and at Kentucky from 2005-08. In his first season with the Wildcats, the team posted a win against top-ranked Tennessee and advanced to the 2006 NCAA Tournament.

Before his tenure at Kentucky, Read served as an assistant coach for the United States Basketball League's Dodge City Legend in 2005, helping the team win the league title. He spent the 2004 WNBA season as an assistant coach with the San Antonio Silver Stars under former NBA standout Dee Brown.

Prior to his stop at San Antonio, Read spent five seasons with the Orlando Magic from 1999-2004. He worked in video scouting for the first two seasons in Orlando, then spent his last three years as an advance scout. In 2001, he served as an assistant coach for the team's summer league squad, as well. While with the Magic, Read held various positions with WNBA teams. In 2003, he was an advance scout for the Charlotte Sting. Read was an assistant coach for the Orlando Miracle in 2002 and Phoenix Mercury in 2000.

Read got his start as a coach as an assistant at Spelman College in Atlanta from 1997-99. In his time at Spelman, he also worked at Turner Sports as a senior archivist and production assistant for NBA telecasts.

Prior to entering the coaching ranks, Read served in the United States Army from 1989-93 at Fort Drum, N.Y. and Fort Lee, Va.

A talented writer, Read has published six basketball playbooks, which are in a series called "The Basketball Encyclopedia." He also has published numerous articles for various basketball publications.

A native of Milwaukee, Wis., Read graduated with a bachelor's degree in political science from Clark Atlanta in 1997, where he was a member of the tennis team. He resides with his wife, Cincereru, and son, Brandon, and has a daughter, April.

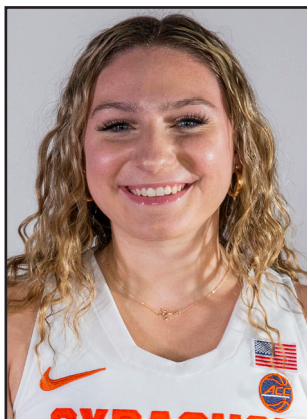
