SEMINOLES PLAY HOST TO CLEMSON ON TUESDAY IN TALLAHASSEE

Florida State, which has won six consecutive home games against Clemson, plays host to the Tigers at the Donald L. Tucker Center in Tallahassee on Tuesday, February 15, 2022 at 7:00 p.m. The Seminoles have won each of their games against Clemson at the Tucker Center since a 109-61 win on February 5, 2017. Florida State's game against Clemson its second of the season against the Tigers after the two teams met in Clemson, S.C. on February 2. Florida State holds a 25-9 record against Clemson in games played in Tallahasse and are 23-8 against the Tigers since joining the ACC for the 1991-92 season. Florida State won eight of the first 10 games against Clemson since joining the ACC. Following Tuesday's game against Clemson, the Seminoles travel to play at Duke in Cameron Indoor Stadium on Saturday, February 19 at 6:00 p.m.

FLORIDA STATE AT THE DONALD L. TUCKER CENTER IN THE LAST FIVE SEASONS

Florida State is 85-8 at home in the last five (plus) seasons (.914 winning percentage). The Seminoles have won 85 of their last 93 home games since February 27, 2015. The Seminoles won their final three home games of the 2015-16 season (Notre Dame, Syracuse, Davidson) and have won 82 of 89 home games (.921 winning percentage) in the last five seasons. The Seminoles have lost just four ACC home game since a 77-68 win over Clemson on January 22, 2019. Florida State has won 29 of its last 34 ACC home games since defeating the Tigers and won 25 consecutive ACC home games from January 22, 2019 through March 3, 2021 – the second longest conference winning streak in ACC history. Only Duke, who won 26 straight ACC home games from 1997-2002, has a longer streak than then Seminoles in the history of the ACC.

HAMILTON, FLORIDA STATE WITH TWO NATIONAL HISTORICAL RECORDS

...Under Head Coach Leonard Hamilton, the Seminoles have won a NCAA record 13 consecutive overtime games. The streak began with a 101-90 double overtime win over Syracuse on January 13, 2018 and continued on January 18, 2022 with their 79-78 overtime win over Duke;

...Speaking to the ability of Head Coach Leonard Hamilton and how he develops talent, Hamilton has now won an NCAA record 55 games over ranked teams while his teams were unranked. Hamilton's 55th win over a ranked team as the coach of an unranked team came as a 79-78 overtime win over Duke on January 18.

HAMILTON TO BE INDUCTED INTO FLORIDA STATE HALL OF FAME

The Florida State University's Athletics Hall of Fame will induct nine new members on Friday, April 8, including men's basketball coach Leonard Hamilton and All-Americans from six different sports. Hamilton, who is the Seminoles' all-time winningest basketball coach and currently the fifth all-time winningest coach in ACC history, will be inducted along with one of his former players in star point guard Toney Douglas.

FLORIDA STATE DEFENSIVELY

Florida State enters Tuesday's game against Clemson ranked first in the ACC in steals (9.3 spg) and third in the ACC in blocked shots (4.3 bpg). The Seminoles are the only team in the ACC that is ranked in the top five for both steals and blocked shots.

HAMILTON IS THE FIFTH WINNINGEST COACH IN ACC HISTORY

Seminole Head Coach Leonard Hamilton is the fifth winningest coach in ACC history with 390 career wins and ranked fifth in ACC history with 173 career ACC wins at Florida State.

SEMINOLES AT HOME IN THE TUCKER CENTER

Florida State has won 28 of its last 32 ACC home games since defeating Clemson on January 22, 2019. Since the beginning of the 2016-17 season, the Seminoles have won 45 of their last 52 ACC home games (.865 winning percentage) including 21 of their last 26 since the start of their 2019-20 conference schedule.

FLORIDA STATE CONTINUES TO LEAD THE ACC IN STEALS

With nine steals against North Carolina on Saturday, Florida State increased its team total to 222, and maintained its stronghold on the steals lead in the ACC. The Seminoles enter Tuesday's game against Clemson with 222 steals and a leagueleading 9.3 steals per game. Florida State has earned double figures in steals in eight games with its season-high of 16 steals coming at Wake Forest. The Seminoles' 16 steals against Wake on January 4 is the second highest total in the ACC this season.

FLORIDA STATE IMPROVED TURNOVER MARGIN

Florida State enters Tuesday's game against Clemson ranked third in the ACC with a +2.7 turnover margin. The Seminoles totaled a season-low five turnovers in their win over No. 5 Duke on January 18 and totaled only nine against Clemson on February 2. Florida State ranked 11th in the ACC in the turnover margin category with a -0.6 margin during the 2020-21 season.

SEMINOLES AMONG ACC ASSISTS LEADERS ENTERING TUESDAY'S GAME

Florida State enters Tuesday's game against Clemson with double figure assists in 12 consecutive games and are one of eight teams in the ACC who are averaging at least 14 assists per game. The Seminoles earned their season-high of 22 assists in their win over Lipscomb on December 15 with their ACC high of 21 coming in their win at Syracuse on January 15.

SEMINOLES' COLLEGE BASKETBALL RECORD OVERTIME WINNING STREAK

Florida State defeated Duke, 79-70, in overtime on January 18 in Tallahassee for its all-time college basketball record 13th consecutive overtime victory. The Seminoles have won each of the their overtime decisions since a 101-90 double overtime win over Syracuse on January 13, 2018 in a game played at the Donald L. Tucker Center in Tallahassee. Florida State has defeated 11 teams during their overtime streak including Clemson on February 14, 2018. The Seminoles are 2-0 in OT games this year.

ACC BLOWOUTS ACCORDING TO FLORIDA STATE HEAD COACH LEONARD HAMILTON

Florida State enters Saturday's game against Wake Forest with four one-point victories this season - 81-80 over Boston University (November 24), 65-64 over Miami (January 11), 79-78 over No. 5 Duke (January 18) and 61-60 at Miami (January 22). The Seminoles' four one-point wins are the most by any team in the nation. The Seminoles are the third team in the ACC since 1980 with four one point wins in a season - joining Duke in 1981-82 and Maryland in 1982-83.

PJ Hall scored 15 points and grabbed seven rebounds to help Clemson hold off Florida State 75-69 on January 29, 2022 at Littlejohn Coliseum in Clemson, S.C. Hall sank 5 of 8 from the floor and 5 of 6 at the free-throw line for the Tigers. Nick Honor came off the bench to score 10 of his 12 points in the first half for Clemson. Chase Hunter added 12 points, while reserve Naz Bohannon pitched in with 11 points, five rebounds and three assists. Bohannon's jumper gave the Tigers a 57-46 lead with 14:27 remaining. The Seminoles chipped away at the lead until Caleb Mills' basket cut their deficit to 67-64 with 6:22 left. Hall sank four straight free throws to push the lead to six with 1:15 to go and FSU never threatened again. Hunter's layup was the final basket for Clemson. The Tigers scored just six points from there — all at the foul line. Mills led Florida State with 16 points. RayQuan Evans scored 11. Florida State shot 48% overall and made 7 of 22 from beyond the arc (32%). Clemson shot 52% overall and 40% from 3-point range. The Tigers came in third in the ACC with a 38.7% mark from distance. The Tigers had a 37-24 rebound advantage and outscored the Seminoles 32-24 in the paint.

Son Of Georgia Tech Alums, Matthew Cleveland Shines For Florida State

Growing up and cheering for Georgia Tech as a child, Matthew Cleveland had his favorites. Calvin Johnson was the first football player he remembered. For basketball, his favorites were of a more recent vintage, Marcus Georges-Hunt and Josh Okogie.

"I like the way he played a lot, and the swagger that he had on the court," Cleveland said of Georges-Hunt.

"From Josh Okogie, I just liked the way he played on defense," Cleveland told The Atlanta Journal-Constitution. "Just how, no matter what was going on the offensive side of the ball, he was always good on defense, guarding the other team's best player."

On Wednesday night in the arena where he once rooted for his parents' alma mater, Cleveland will be in Florida State's garnet and gold as his team attempts to extend Tech's misery. Cleveland is the latest metro Atlanta product to shine for the Seminoles, a dangerous freshman wing player who is skilled at finishing at the basket and also knows the words to "I'm a Ramblin' Wreck from Georgia Tech."

"It's going to be a cool experience," said Cleveland, a Pace Academy graduate whose family lives in Atlanta. "I think just stepping out on the court for the first time, it's going to be just a lot to take in. It's going to be a great experience overall."

Florida State (13-5, 6-2 ACC) is tied for first with Miami (whom Tech -- 8-10, 1-6 -- plays Saturday) thanks in no small part to Cleveland, who ranks second on the team in scoring (10.8 points per game) and third in rebounding (4.8 per game).

"Matthew's farther along than most guys we've had who were first-year players," FSU coach Leonard Hamilton said. "He's extremely competitive, he's very confident, he knows how to play within who he is and his abilities. He plays with a tremendous amount of effort, and he's a great defender."

Tech coach Josh Pastner recognized those traits before any of his peers, awarding Cleveland his first scholarship offer, when he was a sophomore at Cambridge High before he transferred to Pace Academy. Cleveland's father, Ralph, remembers the family was invited to visit campus. At the end, Pastner and assistant coach Julian Swartz huddled together, and then made the offer. Ralph was shocked and speechless for his son to receive an offer from his and his wife's alma mater.

"It was surreal, it really was," Ralph Cleveland said. "I'm forever thankful and grateful for the coaches there taking the time to get to know him. It was surreal."

Cleveland, whose stock shot up in the summer before his junior year and became a five-star prospect ranked the No. 25 player in his class (247Sports Composite). Cleveland considered Tech and had the Yellow Jackets in his top 10 before leaving them out of his final five of Florida State, Stanford, Kansas, Michigan and N.C. State. Pastner and his staff recruited him relentlessly.

"I love them," Cleveland said. "There's just like a homey atmosphere. They're just really, really good people overall."

Said Pastner: "Matthew Cleveland's such a phenomenal young man, and his parents are awesome."

Florida State won out, as Cleveland joined the legion of Seminoles from metro Atlanta, including Toney Douglas, Malik Beasley and M.J. Walker, among others, another win for Seminoles assistant Charlton Young, a former Tech assistant on coach Paul Hewitt's staff.

"The people and the coaches made me comfortable," Cleveland said. "They made me feel like I was at home."

Another factor – after basketball, Cleveland is interested in going to law school and becoming an FBI agent. Cleveland was intrigued by Florida State's nationally recognized criminology program. He's already taking a class in the degree. "Normally when they assign readings, it feels like homework," Cleveland said. "But in this class, it just feels like an extracurricular activity that I get to study. It's been fun so far."

Cleveland's parents are delighted thus far. They see him growing as a leader and feeling comfortable in his surroundings.

"I feel like my play's been really good," Matthew said. "I wouldn't say it's been easy, but it's been a good experience just with my teammates helping me feel comfortable, learning the offense, learning the defense."

Ralph acknowledged that it would have been exciting if their son had wanted to study engineering or management – Ralph earned his degree in mechanical engineering and now runs his own management consulting business after a career in the energy field; Sandra was a management major and teaches math at Heritage Elementary School in south Fulton County – and chosen Tech.

"But he's got other interests and passions, and as parents, all of us want to support our kids and help them become the very best version of themselves, and that means you've got to pick a school that's going to allow them to do that, as well," Ralph Cleveland said. "Florida State was just a terrific fit for all of those things."

It doesn't change the Clevelands' loyalty to Tech. Ralph served on the advisory board for the school of mechanical engineering. Sandra was a member of the Goldrush dance team. The family held season tickets for football when Matthew was a boy. Matthew's understanding of what it meant to be a Tech supporter was strong enough that, during his recruitment, he asked his parents if they would let him go to Georgia if he received a scholarship offer. (They would have, Ralph said.)

"Georgia Tech was a great experience for my wife and I, certainly," Ralph said. "Certainly, Florida State thus far has been a great experience for Matthew. That's what really counts."





TALLAHASSEE, Fla. - Malik Osborne had 18 points and a career-best 13 rebounds, Anthony Polite scored 17 points, and No. 20 Florida State won its seventh straight home opener, routing Pennsylvania 105-70 at the Donald L. Tucker Center. Osborne recorded his fourth career double-double and third at Florida State. The 6-foot-9 forward shot 4 of 6 from the floor and 9 of 12 from the free-throw line in 22 minutes, spending much of the game playing center as the Seminoles went with a smaller lineup. The Seminoles outscored the Blue Devils by a 12-11 margin in the overtime period to win their 13th consecutive overtime game. Game 22 -- Wake Forest 68, Florida State 60


TALLAHASSEE, Fla. - Jake LaRavia had a near tripledouble, Alondes Williams scored 23 points, Damari Monsanto hit a clutch 3-pointer, and Wake Forest defeated Florida State 68-60. LaRavia had 18 points, 13 rebounds and nine assists, missing out on a triple-double. Isaiah Mucius added 10 points for Wake Forest. A 3-pointer by Caleb Mills drew Florida State within 57-56 with 3:51 remaining but Mucius came right back with a 3-pointer for the Demon Deacons. Cam'Ron Fletcher's layup kept Florida State within four points with 53 seconds remaining before Monsanto's huge 3-pointer. Mills led Florida State with 15 points. Harrison Prieto had 13 points and 13 rebounds off the bench and Matthew Cleveland scored 11 points. Florida State forced 26 turnovers. A 3-pointer by Williams gave Wake Forest a 23-16 lead with 5:21 remaining in the first half. The Demon Deacons added just two more points in the half but still led 25-21 at the break. Florida State scored the first four points of the second half but soon fell behind 38-30 when LaRavia hit a jumper with 16:18 remaining. At halftime, Florida State celebrated Basketball Alumni Weekend. Among the more than 100 former players honored were the 1972 team that finished as the runner-up in the NCAA Tournament, the 1991 team that won the Metro Conference Championship and George McCloud, whose No. 21 jersey was hung from the rafters of the Tucker Center.
