SEMINOLES TRAVEL TO PLAY AT CLEMSON ON WEDNESDAY AT 7:00 P.M.

Florida State, which has won eight of its last 11 games since defeating NC State on New Year's Day, travels to play at Clemson on Wednesday, February 2, 2022 at 7:00 p.m. The game will be televised on the ACC Network. The Seminoles' game against the Tigers marks the first of two regular season contests between the two teams with only 13 days separating both regular season games. The Tigers will play at the Donald L. Tucker Center in Tallahassee on February 15. The Seminoles won a season-high six consecutive games from January 8 against Louisville (79-70) through January 22 at Miami (61-60) and enter Wednesday's game win a 6-4 mark in the first half of the 20-game conference season. Following Wednesday's game against Clemson, Florida State will host two consecutive home games against Wake Forest (February 5, 12 Noon) and Pittsburgh (February 9, 9:00 p.m.).

SEMINOLES TO HONOR GEORGE MCCLOUD WITH JERSERY CELEBRATION

George McCloud, the first NBA Draft Lottery selection in school history in 1989, will become the seventh player in school history to have his jersey (No. 21) honored and hung prominently displayed in the Donald L. Tucker Center on February 5 during the Seminoles' game against Wake Forest. McCloud was twice named to the All-Metro Conference First Team and was named the Metro Conference Most Valuable Player in 1989. He averaged 13.5 points during his career as a Seminole (1986-89) and was a finalist for the John R. Wooden Award which recognizes the nation's top player. McCloud enjoyed a productive 12-year career in the NBA.

FLORIDA STATE TRAVELS TO PLAY AT CLEMSON WITH A WINNING RECORD ON THE ROAD IN ACC PLAY

With victories at NC State (January 1, 83-81), at Syracuse (January 15, 76-71) and at Miami (January 22, 61-60), Florida State enters its game at Clemson with a 3-2 record on the road in ACC play. The Seminoles are one of four teams in the ACC with winning conference road records through the first half of conference play. Florida State (3-2) is joined by Miami (3-1), Duke (2-1), Notre Dame (3-2) as the four ACC teams with winning conference records away from their home arenas. Florida State is 18-14 (.563 winning percentage) in ACC road games during the last three seasons.

FLORIDA STATE AGAINST THE CURRENT TOP TWO TEAMS IN THE ACC STANDINGS

Florida State is 3-0 against Miami and Duke – the two teams who currently occupy the top two spots in the ACC standings. The Seminoles won both ends of the season series against Miami (64-65 in Tallahassee on January 1 and 61-60 in Coral Gables on January 22) and defeated Duke in overtime (79-78 in Tallahassee on January 18).

FLORIDA STATE'S WINNING WAYS

Florida State has won eight of its last 11, seven of its last 10 and six of its last eight overall games since a 97-60 win over Lipscomb on December 15. In ACC play, the Seminoles have won five of their last six and of six of their last eight since an 83-81 win over NC State in Raleigh in January 1. Florida State is 2-1 in their last three ACC road games with wins at Syracuse (January 15, 76-71) and at Miami (January 22, 61-60).

LOOK FOR FLORIDA STATE TO...

...Defeat Clemson and win its seventh ACC game of the season. It would mark the school-record 17th consecutive season the Seminoles have won at least seven conference games under Leonard Hamilton -- (2021, 11; 2020, 16; 2019, 13; 2018, 9; 2017, 12; 2016, 8; 2015, 8; 2014, 9; 2013, 9; 2012, 12; 2011, 11; 2010, 10; 2009, 10; 2008, 7; 2007, 7; 2006, 9);

...Defeat Clemson and win its fourth ACC road game of the season. The Seminoles were 6-4 on the road in ACC play in finishing with a 16-4 overall record in ACC play and won the ACC championship with a 16-4 record in 2020; ...Defeat Clemson and gain a win at Littlejohn Coliseum for the third time in the last six seasons. The Seminoles most recently earned victories at Clemson in the 2017 and 2019 seasons and have 14 wins at Clemson since first playing there on December 18, 1959.

ACC BLOWOUTS ACCORDING TO FLORIDA STATE HEAD COACH LEONARD HAMILTON

Florida State enters Wednesday's game at Clemson with four one-point victories this season – 81-80 over Boston University (November 24), 65-64 over Miami (January 11), 79-78 over No. 5 Duke (January 18) and 61-60 at Miami (January 22). The Seminoles' four one-point wins are the most by any team in the nation. The Seminoles are the third team in the ACC since 1980 with four one point wins in a season – joining Duke in 1981-82 and Maryland in 1982-83.

FLORIDA STATE AGAINST TEAMS IN THE CURRENT ASSOCIATED PRESS TOP 25

Florida State is 1-1 against opponents who are currently ranked in the top 25 of the Associated Press poll. The Seminoles defeated No. 9 Duke by a 79-78 score in overtime on January 18 in Tallahassee and fell at No. 4Purdue in the Big Ten / ACC Challenge on November 30 in West Lafayette.

HAMILTON, FLORIDA STATE WITH TWO NATIONAL HISTORICAL RECORDS

...Under Head Coach Leonard Hamilton, the Seminoles have won a NCAA record 13 consecutive overtime games. The streak began with a 101-90 double overtime win over Syracuse on January 13, 2018 and continued on Tuesday with their 79-78 overtime win over Duke;

...Speaking to the ability of Head Coach Leonard Hamilton and how he develops talent, Hamilton has now won an NCAA record 55 games over ranked teams while his teams were unranked. Hamilton's 55 win over a ranked team as the coach of an unranked team came as a 79-78 overtime win over Duke on January 18.

SEMINOLES' COLLEGE BASKETBALL RECORD OVERTIME WINNING STREAK

Florida State defeated Duke, 79-70, in overtime on January 18 in Tallahassee for its all-time college basketball record 13th consecutive overtime victory. The Seminoles have won each of the their overtime decisions since a 101-90 double overtime win over Syracuse on January 13, 2018 in a game played at the Donald L. Tucker Center in Tallahassee. Florida State has defeated 11 teams during their overtime streak including Clemson on February 14, 2018 (81-79 in overtime) in Tallahassee.

A KEY TO THE SEMINOLES' OVERTIME SUCCESS

Florida State won its 13th consecutive overtime game with its 79-78 win Duke January 18 in Tallahassee – the Seminoles' second overtime win of the season. One of the common denominators in Florida State's overtime wins over Boston University and Duke was the absence of turnovers by the Seminoles in the overtime periods. The Seminoles outscored BU by a 10-9 margin with zero overtime turnovers and outscored Duke with a 12-11 margin with zero turnovers in the overtime period.

FLORIDA STATE BY THE NUMBERS

...Florida State enters Wednesday's game against Clemson having made six consecutive and 12 of its last 13 free throws. The Seminoles shot .882 percent from the free throw line (15 of 17). The Seminoles are shooting .706 from the free throw line in their first 20 games of the season;

...Florida State enters Wednesday's game against Clemson as the ACC leaders in steals with 184 and a 9.2 steals per game average. The Seminoles need only 16 steals to reach the 200 steals mark for the seventh time in the last eight years under Head Coach Leonard Hamilton. The Seminoles totaled 182 steals (7.3 spg) in the shortened 2020-21 season;

...Florida State enters Wednesday's game against Clemson ranked third in the ACC in blocked shots with 84 and a 4.2 blocked shots per game average. The Seminoles need just 16 blocked shot to reach the 100 blocked shots mark for the 14th time in the last 15 season. The Seminoles totaled 69 blocks (2.8 bpg) during the shortened 2020-21 season;

...Florida State shot .500 percent from the field against Virginia Tech (26 of 52). It marked the fourth time this season the Seminoles shot 50 percent or better from the field.

...Florida State outrebounded Virginia Tech by a 25-18 margin on Saturday in Tallahassee. It was the fewest rebounds the Seminoles had surrendered to an opponent and the first time it has surrendered fewer than 25 rebounds in a game this season;

...Florida State has won eight of its last 11 games against Clemson since a 76-65 win over the Tigers in Tallahassee on January 30, 2016. The Seminoles have won 15 of the last 21 games played between the two teams since an 80-72 Florida State win on March 4, 2012.

FLORIDA STATE VS. CLEMSON – THE LAST MEETING

Nick Honor scored all of his 13 points in the second half, including a 3-pointer with 7:01 to play that gave Clemson the lead for good as the Tigers defeated Florida State, 77-67 on January 23, 2021 at Littlejohn Coliseum in Clemson, S.C. Clyde Trapp led Clemson with 15 points and Al-Amir Dawes had 11. The Tigers were down 36-29 when Balsa Korprivica had a layup to start the second half. That's when things began to turn for Clemson, as Al-Amir Dawes hit a 3-pointer and Trapp scored three points, tightening the game. The teams traded the lead 13 times over the next 10 minutes, and Korprivica tied things at 54-all. Honor, broke the tie and put Clemson ahead for good with a 3-pointer with 7:01 to play. After John Newman III hit a basket, Honor stole the ball in the backcourt, was fouled and hit both foul shots as Clemson moved ahead 60-54. Florida State got within 71-65 on Anthony Polite's 3-pointer with 1:45 to go. But the Seminoles could not catch Clemson and lost for the second time in three games. Scottie Barnes led Florida State with 14 points.

A Home Away From Home': Inside Matthew Cleveland's Journey To Florida State Basketball

Matthew Cleveland has established himself as the next Florida State freshman standout.

By year's end, he may be the next Seminole basketball player to win the ACC Sixth Man of the Year honor in what has quickly become an annual tradition.

But when he began his high school career at Cambridge High in Milton, Ga. back in 2017, his focus was more on baseball than basketball.

Cleveland, who would go on to be the No. 25 overall player in the 2021 recruiting class, started his freshman season with a minimal role on the varsity team at Cambridge.

"Throughout middle school and my first year of high school, I was more of a baseball player so I put all my time into baseball. I played AAU (basketball) my eighth grade year, I felt like I was like behind the curve so then I quit baseball just to focus on basketball..." Cleveland told the Democrat.

"I didn't start a game, averaged maybe like 10 minutes a game, four points a game (as a freshman)."

It was around this time late in Cleveland's freshman season that FSU assistant coach Charlton Young first saw Cleveland play while on the road recruiting.

As he did previously with the likes of Terance Mann, Devin Vassell and quite a few other recent FSU standouts, Young quickly realized Cleveland's potential and how much of a fit he would be for the Seminoles.

"He was growing into his body. He was like Bambi. He was long, growing, so his coordination and everything weren't there. But he worked really hard to get in the gym from a skill component and that's when it took off..." Young told the Democrat.

"As a young, young, raw player, you could see his ability (as a) non-ball-dominant (player). You also could see the level of intellect he had about the ball and as a person. Just a highly intelligent person. Contrary to what people believe, basketball is a thinking man's game. Matthew is special in that area. What he lacks in skill, he surely makes up for with his IQ, his mind and his intellect. You could see that at a young, young age."

The Pace Presence

After Cleveland took a step forward as a sophomore at Cambridge, he changed schools halfway through his high school career.

Through a relationship with one of his AAU teammates, Cleveland met Pace Academy head coach Sharman White, who had previously been an assistant coach at Georgia State and was involved with the Team USA youth basketball program.

He and his family decided playing for White at Pace would be best for his development, so Cleveland transferred there to play his final two seasons.

"Coming to a program where we were striving to be a championship program, having him on board allowed him to be able to experience what that was about," White told the Democrat.

Matthew Cleveland's 10.4 points per game this season rank second for the Seminoles behind only Caleb Mills' 13.4.

"The process of that was big for his development and his well-being as a player. All those things kind of played in it. The deficiencies were not major, it was just things that just needed to be refined and developed. He took those on wholeheartedly and he understood that, he didn't shy away from it. He just worked his butt off to make sure he got those things in position where it would make him a high-level player."

In each of Cleveland's two seasons at Pace, he helped lead the Knights to 2A state championships. He scored over 22 points per game in both his junior and senior seasons, averaging a double-double as a senior with 10.6 rebounds, 3.3 steals and 2.0 blocks per game.

"Before I got (to Pace), I would say I was a winner, but I didn't have championship pedigree. Coach White was really big on making sure I had all the characteristics of a champion," Cleveland said.

"So in my junior year, we butted heads a little bit. But then my senior year and late in my junior year, I knew it was in my best interest and so I gave all my attention to him. He helped me make it to USA camp, which was big, Top 100 camp, which was big.

"He was always my biggest supporter whenever anyone called to talk about me. I would say he also instilled a lot of confidence in me by saying I could be a leader of this team so I had to go out there and prove it."

Between his junior and senior seasons, Cleveland committed to FSU. He chose the Seminoles over his list of other finalists, which included Kansas, Michigan, NC State and Stanford. He also got some strong interest late in the process from blue bloods like Kentucky and North Carolina.

In the end, however, he elected to join the "New Bloods."

"Out of the five, Florida State just felt like a home away from home," Cleveland said.

"It just had to have a comfortable atmosphere and this was the place that I felt like gave me the best place for that and also on the court."

Rising To The Challenge

As things worked out for FSU after the somewhat unexpected departures of both RaiQuan Gray and Balsa Koprivica this past offseason, this would have to be a season where the Seminoles relied more heavily on newcomers than they prefer.

In all, FSU has six new scholarship players on this year's team. Two of them, Caleb Mills and Cam'Ron Fletcher, were transfers who arrived with at least a bit of Division I experience. But Cleveland was one of four new Seminoles who were entering their first season of college basketball at this level.

After arriving over the summer, Cleveland relied heavily on some more experienced players on the roster as well as the other freshmen to get acclimated to the expectations of this stage.

"I would say Caleb really helped a lot, knowing that he had played college basketball (at Houston). But this was a new school for him. We got in the gym a lot, he just talked about what the college basketball experience was like. I had a lot of questions so I would go to him if no one else was available and he just told me what it was like," Cleveland said.

Cleveland is positioning himself to potentially become the fourth straight FSU basketball player to win the ACC Sixth Man of the Year honor.

"Jalen (Warley) and John (Butler), we're the closest friends so whenever something goes wrong or we don't like something, we always come to each other and we talk it out and we always make sure we're all on the page."

Even though he hasn't established himself as a consistent three-point shooter, Cleveland quickly proved himself to be the type of player who could score in bunches. His freakish athleticism in his 6-foot-7 frame and his remarkable knack for attacking the basket instantly translated to the college game.

He scored in double-figures in four of his first six games and led the way with 17 points -- including the game-winning basket in overtime -- to help FSU avoid what would have been a bad home loss to Boston University on Nov. 24.

"It's elite. He can affect the game without having to have plays ran for him specifically because of that athleticism," White said.

"He can make himself very active by just using his athleticism and he can affect the game on both ends of the floor, not just offensively, but defensively."

While FSU has gone through turmoil this season, including some early-season struggles and an injury that has hampered veteran forward Malik Osborne, Cleveland has established himself as one of the more consistent players on the Seminoles' roster.

His 10.4 points per game are second on the team to Mills, and he also averages 4.9 rebounds (third on the team). Young said he credits much of this instant impact to Cleveland's work ethic in all phases as well as the stellar job his parents did raising him.

"I'm very, very proud of him. It's because of his attention to detail, because of his commitment. He's a guy that does a lot of film study, who is very into game-plans, preparation..." Young said.

"Matthew Cleveland is going to be an NBA wing, but he's also already built to be a CEO and an owner of a company. You can just see it every day you coach him, when you talk to him. He's just built for success on the court and off the court. I'm really proud to be the guy that recruited him. Really proud of how he's responded to adversity, the ups and downs of his first year in the ACC."

While fellow newcomers Butler and junior college transfer Naheem McLeod have spent time in the starting lineup this season, Cleveland has been one of the first players off the bench despite his production.

FSU head coach Leonard Hamilton often talks about how unimportant it is regarding which players start on his team, which prides itself on depth.

Each of the last two seasons, FSU freshmen Patrick Williams and Scottie Barnes came off the bench, were named ACC Sixth Man of the Year and then were taken fourth overall in that year's NBA Draft.

Draft projections don't have Cleveland following those two in that final part but he's perfectly fine with his role and the chance to become FSU's fourth straight ACC Sixth Man of the Year.

"I just see it as an opportunity. Starting here really doesn't matter. It's just about making sure guys are fresh on and off the court," Cleveland said.

"Since we're big on transition and transition defense, it's important to make sure that everyone's fresh on the court. I take pride in being the first one off the bench for someone that needs a sub."
