PACK TRACKS

- The Pack ended the regular season with a 89-76 loss to Florida State on Saturday afternoon. The Pack forced a season-low eight turnovers, and the Seminoles outscored the Pack, 42-22, in points in the paint and had a 53-4 advantage in bench points.
- Freshman guard **Terquavion Smith** led NC State with 30 points against Florida State. He was 11-of-23 shooting, including 5-of-10 from three-point range. Smith has led the Pack in scoring in five consecutive games and eight of the last 10 games overall.
- Smith has scored 20 or more points in five consecutive games and is averaging 23.8 points per game during this stretch. He has hit 23 three-pointers (4.6 per game) and is shooting 46.9% (23-of-49) in the last five outings.
- Smith has made 96 three-pointers this season, which is the most by a freshman in program history and the third-most in a single season in program history. He leads the ACC with an average of 3.1 three-pointers per game. He is aiming to be the first freshman to lead the ACC in three-pointers since Duke's JJ Redick in the 2002-03 season.
- Redshirt-sophomore guard **Dereon Seabron** leads NC State in scoring, rebounding, assists and steals. Seabron is one of only just three DI players - and the only power conference player - to lead his team in points, rebounds, assists and steals. He has led NC State in scoring 12 times this season, in rebounding 22 times, assists 17 times and steals nine times.

SEABRON AND SMITH SCORE ACC ACCOLADES

■ Dereon Seabron and Terquavion Smith both earned Atlantic Coast Conference accolades as the conference office announced the 2021-22 ACC postseason awards Monday morning. Seabron was named the ACC's Most Improved Player and earned All-ACC Second Team honors while Smith was named to the All-ACC Rookie Team and earned All-ACC Honorable Mention. Seabron is the first NC State player to win the conference's Most Improved Player honor.

■ Seabron had a stellar sophomore season. He averaged 17.3 points and 8.0 rebounds per game while shooting 49.9 percent from the field. He led NC State in scoring, rebounding, assists and steals. He is one of just four players in NCAA Division I to lead his team in all four of those stat categories and the only player from a power conference to do so.

■ Smith averaged 16.5 points, 4.1 rebounds, 2.0 assists and 1.4 steals per game. He also hit an ACC-best 96 three-pointers in the regular season. In conference only games, Smith upped his average to 18.3 points per game which was the second-best scoring average in the ACC. He also led all players in ACC-only games with 73 three-pointers, an average of 3.65 per game. Smith also ranked eighth in steals with an average of 1.55 per game.

NC STATE - CLEMSON SERIES

■ Tuesday is the 161st meeting between the two programs. NC State leads the all-time series, 104-56.

■ Kevin Keatts has a 4-4 record against Clemson as head coach of NC State, including a 1-0 record against the Tigers in the ACC Tournament

■ NC State is 7-3 all-time against Clemson in the ACC Tournament

■ Earlier Meeting this season: Clemson shot 58 percent in the second half to defeat NC State, 70-65. The Tigers outscored NC State, 44-20, in points in the paint. Dereon Seabron led the Pack with 27 points and added a team-high tying seven rebounds and finished with three assists and two steals. Terquavion Smith scored just two points in the game and was 0-7 shooting (all three-pointers).

LAST TIME AGAINST CLEMSON IN THE ACC TOURNAMENT

■ The Pack posted the second-largest halftime deficit comeback (16 points) in ACC Tournament history as it outscored Clemson 33-16 in the second half to win, 59-58, in the second round of the 2019 ACC Tournament in Charlotte. NC State held the Tigers to just 19 percent shooting from the field in the final 20 minutes. Junior guard Markell Johnson made two clutch free throws with 2.6 seconds remaining to give NC State the win. Johnson led all scorers with 23 points and four assists. Trailing by as many as 18 in the contest, NC State would reclaim the lead at the 5:38 mark in the second half following a 20-2 run.

CHART CLIMBING

■ **Career Scoring:** Jericole Hellems is currently in 39th place on NC State's career scoring list. He is just 20 points away from moving up four spots into 35th place. He trails Tracy Smith by nine points for 38th place, 14 points to C.C Harrison in 37th, 18 points shy of Ernie Myers in 36th place and 19 points away from Kevin Thompson in 35th.

■ **Career Free Throw Percentage:** Jericole Hellems is in 13th place on the Pack's career free throw percentage at 79.7 percent. He had his streak of 27 consecutive made free throws snapped in last Saturday's game vs. UNC. He enters the ACC Tournament having hit 34 of his last 36 free throws and ranks fourth in the ACC in free throw percentage this season at 84.5 percent.

■ **Single Season Three-Pointers:** Terquavion Smith has 96 three-pointers on the season which is the most by a freshman in school history. He is currently third on the program's single-season chart. Scott Wood and Rodney Monroe are tied for first with 104.

■ **Single Season Points by a Freshman:** Terquavion Smith has scored 513 points this season which is the third-most by a freshman in program history. The only freshmen in program history to score more points in a season are Brandon Costner (605 in 2006-07) and Dennis Smith, Jr. (580 in 2016-17).

■ **Single Season Blocks:** Ebenezer Dowuona has 53 blocks on the season. He currently ranks 12th on the Pack's single-season block list. He trails C.J. Leslie (54 in 2011-12) by one block for 11th and needs three more blocks to move into a tie for ninth with Todd Fuller (56 in 1995-96) and Pano Fasoulas (56 in 1985-86).

SMITH EARNS FOURTH ACC FRESHMAN OF THE WEEK HONOR

■ Freshman guard Terquavion Smith was named ACC Freshman of the Week Monday afternoon after averaging 26.0 points per game in the Pack's games at Wake Forest and Florida State last week. He was 5-of-10 from three-point range in both games and now has 96 three-pointers on the season. He led the Pack with 22 points at Wake Forest and had 30 points - his second 30 or more performance of the season - at Florida State.

PACK HAS HIGHEST SCORING TRIO IN THE ACC

- NC State's trio of Dereon Seabron, Jericole Hellems and Terquavion Smith is the highest scoring trio in the ACC. The three players combine to average 47.5 points per game this season. The trio is responsible for 64.8 percent of NC State's points this season.
- The trio is combined to average 47.8 points per game in 20 league games this season. They scored 67.1% of the Pack's points in the ACC regular season.
- In the Pack's 79-63 win over Louisville on Jan. 12, Seabron, Hellems and Smith combined for 58 of NC State's 79 points on a combined 68.8% (22-of-32) shooting. They scored 35 of NC State's 44 second half points.
- The trio has combined for 30 20+-point performances this season (Smith 13; Seabron - 11; Hellems -6) and one of the three has led NC State in scoring in all but one game this season. (Casey Morsell led NC State with 22 points in the Pack's win over Colgate on Nov. 13).
- Seabron ranks fifth in the ACC in scoring at 17.3 points per game. The Norfolk, Va., native has the fourth-most 20-point performances by an ACC player this season with 11. Seabron's career-high coming into the season was 17 points. This season he has scored 17 or more points in 17 of 31 games. He scored a career-high 39 points in the Pack's 40T win over Nebraska.
- Smith is the second-highest true freshman scorer in the ACC at 16.5 ppg and ranks eighth overall in the ACC in scoring. The Farmville, N.C. native has started the last 24 games for NC State and is averaging 18.5 points per game when in the starting lineup. He's hit the most three-pointers this season (96) by an ACC player.
- Hellems averages 13.7 points per game. Against Miami on 12/29, he became the 55th player in program history to score over 1,000 points in their career.

DEREON SEABRON BREAKING OUT

- Redshirt sophomore guard Dereon Seabron has broken out as one of the ACC's best players this season.
- Seabron has the second-most double-doubles in the ACC with 11 this season. He ranks second in rebounding (8.0), fourth in offensive rebounding (2.7), fifth scoring (17.3) and sixth in field goal percentage (49.9%).
- He leads NC State in scoring, rebounding, assists and steals. His 49.9 percent field goal shooting is also the best on the team. Seabron is one of just three players in Division I basketball and the only player in a power conference to lead their team in scoring, rebounding, assists and steals.
- Seabron averaged 5.2 points and 3.9 rebounds per game last season as a redshirt freshman. He saw limited time in the first two months of the season as minutes were hard to find with Devon Daniels playing ahead of him. Daniels was injured in the Pack's win over Wake Forest on Jan. 27. At that point in the season Seabron was averaging 3.8 points and 2.4 rebounds per game and had only played more than 15 minutes in a game two times. After Daniels went down, Seabron's minutes went up and he started to show flashes of what was to come this season. He averaged 8.4 points per game over last eight outings of the season and had all three double-digit scoring games of the season during that stretch. He ended the regular season by being named ACC Freshman of the Week on March 8 after posting then career-highs in points (17), rebounds (13) and blocks (3) in a win at Notre Dame.

SECOND HALF SEABRON

- Dereon Seabron has been unstoppable in the second half and overtime of games this season. He averages 10.8 points on 52.4 percent shooting and 4.8 rebounds in the final 20 minutes/OT of games this season.

TERQUAVION SMITH IS A SHOOTING STAR

- Terquavion Smith is making a name for himself as one of the best pure scorers in the entire freshman class. He is averaging 16.5 points per game this season which ranks as the second-most by a freshman in the ACC (Duke's Paolo Banchemo -16.9) and eighth overall.
- Smith has upped his scoring average to 18.3 points per game in ACC play, second in the ACC and the most by a freshman in conference games.
- Smith has made 96 three-pointers this season which is the most by an ACC player this season. Smith has made the most three-pointers by a freshman in a power conference this season and has the second-most three-pointers of any freshman in NCAA DI (The Citadel's Jason Roche has made 106).
- Smith scored 34 points in the Pack's loss to North Carolina on Jan. 29. He was 10-of-21 shooting and 11-of-13 at the foul line. The 34 points are the second-most by a freshman in program history, tied for 11th-most all-time by an ACC freshman and the most ever scored by a freshman in the Dean E. Smith Center.
- Smith made his first start of the season in the Pack's game against Louisville on Dec. 4 and has stayed in the lineup since. In 24 games starting, Smith is averaging 18.5 points per game and has hit 83 three-pointers (3.46 per game). The Greenville, N.C., native has scored in double figures in 20 of 24 games since joining the starting lineup and has scored 20+-points in 12 of the 24 games.
- He has been named ACC Freshman of the Week three times this season.

HELLEMS HAS SHOWN SUSTAINED IMPROVEMENT

- NC State senior forward Jericole Hellems has improved his numbers every season of his collegiate career. After making a jump in every statistical category as a sophomore, Hellems made another jump as a junior as he has increased his output in every category.
- The Saint Louis, Mo., native was the only NC State player last season to lead the team in at least one game in points, rebounds, assists, steals and blocks.

WHAT THE PACK IS MISSING IN MANNY BATES

- Redshirt junior forward Manny Bates suffered a right shoulder dislocation just 57 seconds into the Pack's season-opener and will miss the rest of the regular season.
- The Fayetteville, N.C. native had led the ACC in blocked shots in his freshman and sophomore seasons and was aiming to be the first ACC player since Duke's Shelden Williams (2004-06) to lead the conference in blocked shots in three consecutive seasons.
- Bates registered his 100th career block in just his 34th career game. He is the fastest player in program history to 100 blocks and is the fastest ACC player to 100 career blocks in over 20 seasons. Since 1985-86, Wake Forest's Tim Duncan and Georgia's Tech Alvin Jones are the only ACC players to get to 100 blocks in less games than Bates.
- Bates ranks third (83 - freshman season) and sixth (64 - sophomore season) on NC State's single-season blocked shot chart and is fourth on the program's career blocked shot list.
- Bates has also been an efficient scorer for the Pack. Last season, Bates set the program's single-season field goal percentage record by shooting 64.1 percent (100-of-156) from the field. He also shot 68.6 percent from the free throw line, improving over 20 percentage points from his freshman campaign at the stripe.
- For his career, Bates is shooting 64.7 percent (165-of-255) from the field. He needs 200 made field goals to qualify for the career field goals chart. His current shooting pace would shatter the current leader in career field goal percentage (Kevin Thompson, 1990-93 - 58.8%).

EXPERIENCE LACKING BEHIND MANNY BATES

■ The Pack does not have very much experience in the frontcourt with Bates out for the season. Bates injury means the Pack only has three players on its team that are 6'9" or taller available. Prior to this season, that trio (Ebenezer Dowuona, Jaylon Gibson and Ernest Ross) had played a combined 128 minutes of college basketball with zero starts.

■ Ebenezer Dowuona has stepped into the starting lineup to replace Bates. As a freshman last season, Dowuona appeared in 9 of NC State's 25 games and played a total of 48 minutes. The Ghana native played 25 minutes in each of the Pack's first two games this season to surpass last season's total minutes played. For the season, Dowuona is averaging 4.1 points, 4.1 rebounds and 1.8 blocks per game. He ranks fifth in the ACC in blocked shots per game.

■ Jaylon Gibson appeared in 17 games last season as a freshman and averaged 0.8 points and 0.9 rebounds in 4.7 minutes of action a game. He is averaging 14.1 minutes per game this season and has shown a knack for offensive rebounding, 42 of his 74 rebounds this season are offensive.

IMPORTANCE OF A DEEP BENCH

■ Since Kevin Keatts arrival at NC State, the Pack has had one of the best benches in the country.

■ In 157 games with Keatts as head coach, NC State's bench has averaged 21.3 points per game and has outscored the opponent's bench by 644 points (3,345 bench points for NC State and 2,701 for its opponents).

■ Kevin Keatts teams have accounted for 11 of top-21 NC State bench scoring performances since 1999-2000 season, including the top-3. (see chart to left for best bench performances under Keatts).

PACK HAS BEEN ONE OF ACC'S BEST UNDER KEATTS IN TURNOVER MARGIN

■ In four seasons with Kevin Keatts, NC State has finished second twice, third place once and fourth place once in the ACC in turnover margin. The Pack had a +2.64 turnover margin in 2017-18 and a +3.08 turnover margin in 2018-19. In the Kevin Keatts era, NC State is 74-41 (64.3%) when it has the same or fewer turnovers than its opponent and just 16-26 when it has more turnovers than its opponent.

DEFENSIVE PRESSURE UNDER KEATTS

■ In the first two seasons under Kevin Keatts, the Pack led the ACC in forcing opponent turnovers. After ranking fifth in the ACC in his third season, the Pack was back towards the top, finishing in second place last season. In his first season with NC State in 2017-18, the Pack forced 487 opponent turnovers, an average of 14.8 per game. In 2018-19, NC State forced 560 turnovers, an average of 15.6 per game. The 560 opponent turnovers are the third-most forced turnovers in program history. In the Kevin Keatts era, NC State is 49-19 (72.1%) when it forces an opponent into 15 or more turnovers.

■ Redshirt sophomore guard Dereon Seabron has been named ACC Player of the Week on Monday, Nov. 15 and Monday, Dec. 6 to start this season.

■ Seabron posted double-doubles in NC State's two opening week wins. He had a then-career-high 18 points and 12 rebounds in the win over Bucknell. He followed up by resetting his career-high with 21 points and 10 rebounds against Colgate. Seabron hit the game-winning free throws, breaking a 74-74 tie, with two seconds remaining against Colgate.

■ In the first games of December, Seabron had career-highs in points (39) and rebounds (19) to lead the Pack to a 4 OT win over Nebraska on Dec. 1. He followed up with 11 points and nine rebounds in the Pack's ACC-opener against Louisville.

NC STATE ADDS THREE TALENTED SIGNEES IN 2021 CLASS TO THIS YEAR'S ROSTER

■ NC State has added three four-star freshmen to this year's roster in Breon Pass (Reidsville, N.C.), Ernest Ross (Alachua, Fla.) and Terquavion Smith (Greenville, N.C.)

■ Smith won three consecutive North Carolina Class 2A State Titles and was named North Carolina Mr. Basketball and North Carolina Gatorade Player of the Year. Ross was named Player of the Year in Florida by the coaches association and led his high school to the state championship game, while Pass is one of the more decorated dual-sport signees in NC State history. Pass had power five offers to play both college basketball and college football. Pass averaged 32.6 points and 12.3 rebounds per game on the basketball court and caught 35 passes for 758 yards and 11 touchdowns on the football field as a senior.

NC STATE ADDS TWO SIGNEES IN FALL CLASS

■ NC State signed two plays on the first day of the fall signing period on Nov. 10. The Pack added Shawn Phillips (Dayton, Ohio) and LJ Thomas (Stone Mountain, Ga.) to the program. Both players will join the team for the 2022-23 season

- Phillips is a four-star prospect according to ESPN and Rivals. He's ranked as the No. 98 overall prospect in the country according to Rivals and is playing his senior season at Dream City Christian School in Glendale, Ariz.

- Thomas is a four-star prospect by ESPN and the No. 138 overall recruit in the country according to 247Sports. He averaged 18.5 points, 4.2 assists and 3.5 rebounds per game while shooting 44 percent from the

- Through two seasons is on pace to become the program's all-time leader in blocked shots and have the best field goal percentage in program history
- Enters junior season with 147 career blocks which is fourth all-time on the program's career blocked shot chart
