SEMINOLES ON THE ACC ROAD TO PLAY AT CLEMSON WEDNESDAY AT 7:00 P.M.

Florida State, which has won five of its last nine games against Clemson, travels to play the Tigers at Littlejohn Coliseum in Clemson, S.C. on Wednesday, February 15, 2023, at 7:00 p.m. It is the second game of the regular season between the Seminoles and the Tigers. Florida State has found success on the basketball court at Littlejohn with 11 wins on the road at Clemson since joining the nation's best collegiate basketball conference for the 1991-92 season. Upon joining the ACC, Florida State won three of its first four games at Clemson as ACC members and have 13 wins in the basketball coliseum on Clemson's campus. Following Wednesday's game at Clemson, the Seminoles return home and play host to Boston College on Saturday, February 18, 2023, at 12 Noon. With five regular season games remaining on its schedule, Florida State has three ACC road games and two ACC home games left to play before traveling to the annual ACC Tournament at the Greensboro (N.C.) Coliseum, March 7-11.

SEMINOLES' NCAA RECORD OVERTIME STREAK IS AT 13 STRAIGHT WINS

Florida State enters Wednesday's game against Clemson having won an NCAA record 13 consecutive overtime games. The Seminoles' streak began with a 101-90 win in double overtime against Syracuse on January 13, 2018. Florida State defeated Duke, 79-70, in overtime on January 18, 2022, in Tallahassee for its all-time college basketball record 13th consecutive overtime victory. Florida State has defeated 11 teams during its overtime streak, including nine ACC teams including Clemson, 81-79, on February 14, 2018, in Tallahassee.

SEMINOLES SHOOT .833 FROM FREE THROW LINE AGAINST PITTSBURGH

Florida State made 20 of 24 free throws and shot .833 from the line against Pittsburgh on Saturday in Tallahassee. It marked the third time this season the Seminoles have made 20 or more free throws in an ACC games – with their ACC high of 23 free throws made coming in their 84-71 win at Notre Dame On January 17. Florida State is shooting a combined .813 from the free throw line in its last two games.

FLORIDA STATE'S OUTSTANDING ASSIST:TURNOVER RATIO

Florida State has a 1.6:1 assist:turnover ratio in his last three games with an incredible 51 assists against 31 turnovers against Louisville (19 assists and eight turnovers), Syracuse (21 assists and 12 turnovers) and Pittsburgh (11 assists and 1 turnovers). The Seminoles have earned a positive assist:turnover ratio in seven of their last nine games, and have been on the underside of the ratio just once in their last 10 games. Florida State was positive in the assist:turnover column with 16 assists and 13 turnovers against Clemson on January 28, 2023 in Tallahassee.

FLORIDA STATE'S IMPROVED BENCH PLAY

Florida State is averaging 16.1 points from its bench players and outscored Pitt (17-4), Miami (24-12), Clemson (22-11) and Syracuse (19-2) from the bench in four of its last seven games. The Seminoles' increased bench production marks eight times this season (Mercer, Virginia1, Louisville, Wake Forest, Pitt1, Miami1, Clemson1 and Syracuse) that their bench players had outscored their opponents' bench players. Naheem McLeod scored 16 points off the bench against Syracuse – the most bench points by a Seminole this season and the most since ACC Sixth Man of the Year Matthew Cleveland scored 21 off the bench against North Florida on January 20, 2022.

FLORIDA STATE VS. CLEMSON – THE LAST GAME

Clemson's Chase Hunter scored the final three points of the game on an old-fashioned three-point play with 4.5 seconds remaining to give the visiting Tigers an 82-81 win over Florida State at the Donald L. Tucker Center. Hunter made a driving layup to tie the game, then won the game with the ensuing free throw to give Clemson its 18th victory of the season. The Seminoles were unable to get a shot off before the clock expired. In a game that saw eight lead changes and four ties, Florida State took the lead on a 3-point by Calen Mills with 2:18 remaining to be played. The Seminoles maintained their lead, and led 81-79 with 8.5 seconds remaining. Clemson then inbounded the ball, and Hunter drove to the basket, scored and was fouled to tie the game and set up the game-winning free throw. Clemson's Hunter Tyson scored a game-high 27 points on ten made field goals to lead the No. 24 Tigers to the win. Tyson led three Tigers in double-figure scoring, with Hunter (26 points) and PJ Hall (17 points) also in double figures. Matthew Cleveland scored in double figures with 18 points on six made field goals and three for three free throws for his 15th consecutive game this season.

.600 Freshman De'Ante Green is shooting .600 from the field (three of five) and has scored 10 points in the last two games (six at NC State and four against Pittsburgh).

.633 Freshman Cam Corhen is shooting .633 from the field (19 of 30) and averaging 11.3 points scored in Florida State's last four games. He scored 16 points against both NC State and Louisville on the road in ACC play.

.762 Sophomore Naheem McLeod is shooting .762 from the field (16 of 21) in his last four games. He is averaging 9.5 points scored per game, with his career-high of 16 points coming against Syracuse.

.762 Sophomore Jalen Warley is shooting .762 from the field (16 of 21) in the last three games. He was six of seven from the field (.857 percent) and scored 14 points at Louisville and was nine of 11 from the field (.818 percent) and scored his career-high of 23 points against Pittsburgh on Saturday in Tallahassee.

.950 Junior Caleb Mills has made 19 of his last 20 free throw attempts since the first half of Florida State's game against Clemson on January 28. He enters Wednesday's game against Clemson shooting .848 from the free throw line this season.

45 Florida State scored a season-high 45 points in the first half of Florida State's 81-78 win over Louisville on February 4.

JAYLEN WARLEY IN HIS LAST THREE GAMES

Sophomore Jalen Warley is averaging 13.3 points (40 total points) and 2.3 assists (seven total assists) while shooting .762 from the field (16 of 21), .500 from the 3-point line (two of four) and .750 from the free throw line (six of eight). In his last three games, Warley has a 3.5:1 assist:turnover ratio with five assists against zero turnovers in Florida State's win at Louisville (February 4, 81-78) and two assists and zero turnovers against Pittsburgh on Saturday in Tallahassee.

WARLEY AGAINST PITTSBURGH

Sophomore Jalen Warley scored his career-high of 23 points on nine of 11 shooting from the field (.818 percent) with two assists, zero turnovers and, 4 rebounds and 1 steal against Pittsburgh on Saturday in Tallahassee. He made his first five field goal attempts of the game as he established his career-high for field goals made in a game with nine. Warley played 30 minutes against the Panthers as the Seminoles' starting point guard for the 14th time in the last 15 games.

Seminoles' Jackson Gaining Increased Confidence with Each Game

TALLAHASSEE, Fla. -- Chandler Jackson's career is only just beginning.

Although Jackson has had a slow start to his freshman season due to a thumb injury, he has been coming back strong.

Growing up in Memphis, Jackson gained the love of basketball from his parents.

His mother, Norrishia Harden, was a basketball player and when Jackson was growing up she would shoot hoops with him. His dad, David Jackson, was a four-year starter on the basketball team at Western Illinois. After his college career was over, David played professionally in France, Italy, and Poland.

Chandler grew up playing and watching basketball, learning the fundamentals of the game to prepare him for his career at Florida State.

Jackson enjoyed a stellar high school career, and received scholarship offers from many of the nation's top programs.

"I chose Florida State because of the program and the coaches," said Jackson. "I've been talking to Coach Jones since my sophomore year of high school, so he's been there. Coach Hamilton, he is going to make sure we are taken care of, and that's what you're looking for in a coach.

"I'm looking for leadership after basketball and after leaving college, and I know he's (Coach Hamilton) going to be there for me and for everybody else who comes through here."

In addition to missing a majority of the preseason, Jackson also missed the first three games of the season.

His first game on the court after came against Florida.

As the season continues, Jackson is gaining more confidence and more minutes on the court.

"I had to have surgery, so that set me back," said Jackson. "I missed all the off-season. When I came back, I was not as confident in my game because I had not played basketball for two months. I've grown more confident with every game I've played.

"I want to work on getting more confidence. That's the most important thing. Because you can't really go out there and do anything unless you're confident. Game by game, I'm getting better and doing something more."

In the summer before his freshman season, Jackson traveled with his Seminole teammates to Canada for a 10-day trip north of the border. During the trip, he began to understand what it would take to be successful at a high major basketball program. He also bonded with his teammates while exploring a different country for the first time.

"I love playing at Florida State for our coaching staff," said Jackson. "They give us a lot of freedom. I struggled with that in the beginning of the season because I really didn't see how much freedom they give us. As the season goes on, I've realized the coaches want us to go out there and play hard.

"Coach Jones, he told me that he wants me to be more aggressive. Once I realized that, it helped me be more aggressive. I'm trying to help the team win as best as I can."

In Florida State's first game against Pitt, he scored eight points with two rebounds and two steals.

"Chandler is playing with a lot more confidence," said Hamilton. "Against Miami, he hit a three and drove to the bucket big and strong. It was a welcome sight."

During Florida State's second victory over Louisville, Jackson scored an important 3-pointer, had two assists, and one steal to aid Florida State in its 81-78 win against the Cardinals

With more confidence, additional playing time, and the thumb injury behind him, Jackson continues to make an impact for the Seminoles.

"Chandler has areas that he is really making progress in," said Head Coach Leonard Hamilton. "He's shooting the ball better. He is defending better. He is making better decisions with the ball. Every game takes on a different personality, and he was extremely poised against the zone defense of Syracuse.

"He made good decisions with the ball (against Syracuse) and that shows a little bit about the progress he has made. It would be interesting to see if he had not had his injury and been forced to miss eight weeks of practice. I think he is grasping our system; he has a better understanding of how to utilize his teammates. Hats off to him; we are happy with his progress and we hope that he continues to move in the right direction."

Entering Saturday's game against Pittsburgh, the Seminoles are working to add victories in the wins column in the ACC standings.

The Seminoles' game against the Panthers begins at 12 Noon and will be televised on ESPNU.

WINSTON-SALEM, N.C. — Wake Forest's Cameron Hildreth scored a game-high 23 points on nine field goals to lead Wake Forest to their twelfth victory of the season in a 90-75 win over the Seminoles at Lawrence Joel Coliseum. Hildreth led four Demon Deacons in double figure scoring — Hildreth, Damari Monsanto (22 points), Andrew Carr (22 points), and Tyree Appleby (16 points) to improve Wake Forest's ACC record to 4-2. Florida State is now 3-3 in ACC play. Matthew Cleveland scored 19 points and 12 rebounds to earn his sixth

NOTRE DAME, Ind. – Darin Green Jr. scored a game-high 20 points on six made field goals, four 3-pointers, and four free throws to lead Florida State to an 84-71 victory over Notre Dame at the Joyce Center. Green Jr. led five Seminoles in double figure scoring, Green, Jalen Warley (17 points), Matthew Cleveland (14 points), Caleb Mills (11 points), and Cameron Corhen (10 points) to improve Florida State's ACC record to 4-4. Matthew Cleveland secured his eighth consecutive double double against Notre Dame with 14 points and a career-high 16 rebounds. The last Seminole to reach the milestone was Reggie Royals who finished the 1970-71 season with nine consecutive double doubles. Cleveland will have the chance to join Royals in Saturday afternoon's game against Pittsburgh. Girard III led four Orange teammates in double figure scoring, Jesse Edwards (18 points), Judah Mintz (16 points), and Chris Bell (10 points) to gain their eighth ACC win of the season. Matthew Cleveland earned his 11th double-double of the season, returning to a two-game streak of double figures in points and rebounds. Against Syracuse, he led the Seminoles with 19 points on nine made field goals and pulled down 12 rebounds. With Cleveland's 19 points, he has scored in double figures in each of the Seminoles' last 18 games. Naheem McLeod scored his career-high of 16 points on seven made field goals and two free throws to surpass his original career high of 15 points against Virginia Tech during the 2021-22 season. McLeod nearly passed his career high in a single half, leading the Seminoles with 14 points by shooting seven for eight (.875) from the field before halftime.
