GAME 25: CLEMSON

- Carolina returns to the Smith Center for a two-game homestand to face Clemson and Miami, two of the top four teams in the ACC standings, in a span of three days.
- The Tar Heels play host to Clemson on Saturday, February 11, at 2 p.m. and Miami on Monday, February 13, at 7 p.m.
- Carolina has lost three straight games and is 15-9 overall. The Tar Heels are ninth in the ACC at 7-6.

- Clemson is 18-6 overall, tied for second in the ACC at 10-3. The Tigers last played on February 4, losing 78-74 at home to Miami.
- The Tigers are second in the nation in free throw shooting at 80.3%.
- UNC trailed Wake Forest on Tuesday by 26 points early in the second half before battling back to within seven and ultimately falling, 92-85.

- Carolina out-scored the Deacs, 60-45, in the second half. It was the first time the Tar Heels lost when scoring 60 in a half since 1/10/1990, when UNC and Maryland both scored 61 in the second half in a 98-88 Terrapin victory in College Park.

- It was a poor shooting night from the floor for the Tar Heels, who made 33.3% of their field goal attempts (0 for 5 from three) in the first half en route to trailing by 22 points at the half.

- For the game, Carolina shot 40.5% from the floor, including 4 for 18 from three. The Tar Heels did convert 21 of 26 free throws, their best performance at the line in four games.

- Carolina had nine assists on 30 field goals, five by junior point guard RJ Davis.

- Wake Forest point guard Tyree Appleby made an ACC-record 23 of 28 free throws and finished with 35 points, 11 assists and seven rebounds.

- In the first half, the Demon Deacons shot 51.4% from the floor, made five threes and scored 24 points in the paint. In the second half, UNC held Wake Forest to 33.3% from the floor but the Deacs went 27 for 36 from the line and scored nine fastbreak points.

UNC-CLEMSON ALL-TIME

- Carolina is 134-23 all-time against the Tigers, including 59-1 in Chapel Hill.
- The Tar Heels are 28-1 vs. Clemson in the Smith Center.
- This is the first time the teams will play in Chapel Hill since 2020. The teams were scheduled to play here in 2021 but the game was postponed and ultimately not re-sched-

• Carolina won on the road, 79-77, in the only game between the teams last season on a Brady Manek basket with 3.1 seconds to play. **More details on last year's game in the next note.**

• In the last meeting in Chapel Hill, the Tigers defeated UNC, 79-76, in overtime on 1/11/2020, to end UNC's 59-game home win streak vs. Clemson. It is the NCAA's longest homecourt winning streak against an opponent. The Tar Heels led by 10 with 2:08 to play, but the Tigers ended regulation on a 12-2 run and sent the game to overtime on a three-pointer by Aamir Simms with three seconds remaining.

• UNC and Clemson have played four of their last five games at Littlejohn Coliseum.

• Carolina forward Pete Nance's dad, Larry, scored 1,341 points for the Tigers from 1977-81 prior to a 13-year NBA career.

LAST SEASON AT CLEMSON

• Brady Manek scored the game-winning field goal off an assist from Caleb Love with 3.1 seconds to play.

• Carolina trailed by 11 and led for only 16:16. The win equaled the largest comeback win last season (also came back from 11 down at Charleston).

• The game featured 11 lead changes and 10 ties.

• Carolina shot 60.7% from the floor in the second half (17 for 28) and 50% for the game.

• Armando Bacot had 24 points and 10 rebounds.

• Leaky Black scored all 11 of his points in the second half, including a three-pointer with 3:57 to play to give UNC a 72-68 lead.

• RJ Davis scored 16 points, six assists and zero turnovers.

• Carolina kept alive a streak of never having lost three in a row to Clemson. The Tigers had won the previous two games, the fourth time UNC had dropped two straight to Clemson.

STATISTICAL RANKINGS

• Carolina leads the ACC in rebounding (39.8) and is second in rebound margin (+5.2), fourth in scoring (77.9 ppg) and eighth in scoring margin (+5.7).

• Last season, UNC was No. 1 in the ACC and No. 3 in the country in rebound margin (plus 8.5). This season, UNC is No. 2 in the conference and 34th nationally.

• The Tar Heels are 10th in the country in rebounds per game.

• The Tar Heels are 10th in the ACC in field goal percentage and eighth in field goal percentage defense.

• Carolina is 12th in the ACC in three-pointers per game (6.6), 15th in three-point shooting (.308) and eighth in three-point percentage defense (.338).

• Carolina's three-point percentage (.305) is 320th in the country and the second-lowest in school history (.304 in 2019-20).

• Carolina is the only team with multiple players in the top 10 in the ACC in scoring. Armando Bacot is third (17.5), Caleb Love is sixth (16.6) and RJ Davis is tied for 10th (15.8).

• Bacot and Clemson's Hunter Tyson are the only players in the ACC in the top 10 in scoring, rebounding and field goal percentage.

• Bacot's 23 rebounds vs. James Madison in November equal the third most in a game this season in the NCAA. Kentucky's Oscar Tshiebwe

had 24 vs. Georgia and Indiana's Trayce Jackson-Davis had 24 vs. Northwestern.

• Davis leads the ACC in free throw shooting at 87.3%. That is on pace to be the sixth-highest in UNC single-season history. The last Tar Heel to lead the ACC in free throw shooting was Joel Berry II (.893 in 2017-18).

• Davis's 14 for 14 from the line against NC State is the fourth best in a game this season in the NCAA.

KENPOM NOTES

• The Tar Heels are 38th in offensive efficiency (113.5 points per 100 possessions) and 45th in defensive efficiency (97.5).

• Carolina and Virginia are the only ACC teams in the top 50 in both offensive and defensive efficiency.

• Carolina is fifth in the ACC in offensive efficiency behind Miami, which is 10th nationally, Virginia (25th), Wake Forest (27th) and Virginia Tech (33rd).

• The Tar Heels have committed the 17th-fewest turnovers per possession, but are 335th in the nation in forcing turnovers.

• The Tar Heels are 116th in two-point field goal percentage and 329th in three-point percentage.

• Armando Bacot is 17th in the country in offensive rebound percentage, but as a team the Tar Heels are 133rd. Bacot has 101 offensive rebounds, 63 more than Leaky Black, who is second with 38. Puff Johnson is third with 19.

• Bacot has 38% of Carolina's offensive rebounds. Last season he grabbed 36% of UNC's offensive boards.

INSIDE THE NUMBERS (WINS & LOSSES)

- Carolina is averaging 81.9 points in its 15 wins and 71.2 (10.7 fewer) in the nine losses.
- The opponents are scoring 76.8 points in their nine wins and 69.5 in UNC's victories. Wake Forest was just the third team to score 80 or more points when defeating the Tar Heels this season.
- Carolina is shooting 47.0% from the floor in the wins and 39.7% in its losses.
- The Tar Heels make 7.3 threes at 33.6% in the wins, but 5.4 threes at 25.3% in the losses.
- Carolina's best three-point percentage in a loss this season was 33.3% at Virginia (8 for 24).
- UNC is 34 for 135 (25.2%) from three-point range in its six ACC losses.
- Carolina is 6-0 this season when shooting 35% or higher from three-point range with wins over Portland, The Citadel, Michigan, Wake Forest, Notre Dame and Syracuse.
- The Tar Heels are 9-9 when shooting under 35% from three.
- Carolina has a rebounding edge of 7.3 per game in the wins and 1.7 in the losses.
- The Tar Heels are a combined plus 48 in assists/turnovers in the wins and minus 15 in the losses.
- The opponents are a combined plus 27 assist/turnovers in UNC's losses and have 14 more turnovers than assists in Carolina's 15 wins.
- UNC has outscored the opponents, 240-174, in points off turnovers in the Tar Heels' 15 wins, including 24-10 vs. Charleston, 27-12 vs. Ohio State, 32-8 vs. Wake Forest, 23-8 at Louisville and 20-14 at Syracuse.
- The opponents have outscored the Tar Heels, 123-77, in points off turnovers in the losses. That includes a 15-point advantage by Iowa State, a seven-point edge by Alabama, a 17-4 advantage at Indiana, a 12-6 margin at Pittsburgh and 19-10 advantage by Virginia.
- Carolina is 8-2 in games when it has scored more points off turnovers than its opponents.
- The Tar Heels are 5-6 when the opponents score more points off turnovers (and 2-1 when even).
- The opponents have scored at least 40 paint points four times in the UNC losses, including 40 by Alabama, 50 by Indiana, 42 by Virginia Tech and 42 at Pittsburgh.
- Carolina is 9-4 when it scores more paint points and 5-5 when the opponents have more.
- Carolina has scored 80 or more points 12 times. The Tar Heels are 10-2 in those games,

losing 103-101 in four overtimes vs. Alabama (scored 77 in the regulation) and 92-85 at Wake Forest.

- The Tar Heels have averaged 65.0 points in the other seven losses with a high of 74 at Pittsburgh.
 - Bacot is averaging 19.3 points in the wins and 14.1 in the losses. However, Bacot only played 1:18 in the loss at Virginia and did not play at Virginia Tech (he is averaging 16.1 in the other six losses).
 - Caleb Love is shooting 39.8% from the floor, including 27.7% from three, and has 49 assists/34 turnovers in the wins; in the losses, Love is shooting 35.9% from the floor (31.9% from three) and has 21 assists/22 turnovers in the losses.
 - RJ Davis is averaging 16.6 points, is shooting 47.6% from the floor (42.5% from three) and has 56 assists/26 turnovers in the wins; in the losses, he is averaging 14.4 points, is shooting 35.7% from the floor (20.5% from three) and has 25 assists/21 turnovers.
 - Pete Nance is shooting 48.4% from the floor (40.5% from three) in the wins and 40.5% from the floor (18.8% from three) in the losses. Nance is 33 for 39 (.846) from the free throw line in the wins and 16 for 24 in the losses (.667).
- ### MISCELLANEOUS
- KenPom ranks Carolina's strength of schedule 25th overall and 15th in non-conference play when the Tar Heels went 8-3.
 - Carolina's nine losses are against teams with a combined record of 136-54 (.716) through 2/9/23 (Alabama 21-3, Virginia 18-4, Duke 17-7, Pittsburgh 17-7, Indiana 17-7, Iowa State 16-7, Wake Forest 16-9 and Virginia Tech 14-10).
 - Carolina has played five teams that are ranked in the February 6 Associated Press Top 25 – losing to No. 3 Alabama, No. 8 Virginia, No. 11 Iowa State and No. 18 Indiana and defeating No. 22 NC State.
 - Armando Bacot leads Carolina in scoring (career-high 17.5 ppg), rebounding (11.3 rpg), offensive rebounding (career-high 4.4), blocks (25) and field goal percentage (.557). Last season, he became the first Tar Heel ever to lead UNC in scoring, rebounding, field goal percentage and blocked shots in consecutive seasons, and he is on pace to accomplish that again this season.
 - Carolina is 12-2 this season and 33-9 in his career when Bacot attempts more than six free throws in a game. The Tar Heels are 3-6 this season and 42-39 over the last four seasons when he attempts six or fewer.
 - Davis and Bacot lead the Tar Heels in plus/minus at plus 148 and plus 147, respectively.
 - Bacot has led UNC in plus/minus eight times. Pete Nance is second with four.
 - Puff Johnson led UNC in plus/minus at Wake Forest at plus 4. It was the second time this season (Alabama) he came off the bench and led UNC in plus/minus. Non-starters have led UNC six times, including Johnson twice, Tyler Nickel at Virginia Tech, Seth Trimble vs. Wake Forest, Jalen Washington at Virginia and D'Marco Dunn at Louisville.
 - Dunn leads the non-starters in plus/minus at plus 47. Johnson is next at plus 39. Johnson has an even or positive plus/minus in each of his last eight games.

He also set career highs that day in minutes (25:56), points, field goals (5), three-pointers (2), offensive rebounds (2), rebounds (5), steals (2) and plus/minus (+25) and tied his career highs in free throws (2), assists (1), turnovers (1) and blocks (1)
- Carolina's bench has outscored the opponents five times this season (16-12 in the loss at Virginia Tech, 42-18 vs. The Citadel, 10-9 in the loss at Pittsburgh, 22-12 vs. Notre Dame and 26-10 at Louisville).
- The opponents are averaging 5.5 more bench points per game this season. The UNC bench combined for 15 points at Wake Forest, which equaled the point production off the bench in UNC's previous four games.
- Freshman Tyler Nickel's 16 points vs. The Citadel were his season high and the most by a Tar Heel non-starter this season. They were the most by a Tar Heel non-starter (in a non-Senior Day game) since Johnson had 16 in the win at NC State last February.

- Bacot passed Wayne Ellington and tied Rick Fox for 20th in scoring at UNC with 1,703 points.
- Bacot needs seven points to pass Billy Cunningham, 14 to pass Brice Johnson and 19 to pass Rashad McCants for 17th place.
- RJ Davis scored 27 points against Wake Forest on January 4 to pass the 1,000-point mark in his 83rd game, the 38th-fewest games needed by a Tar Heel to score 1,000 points (standout UNC guards Raymond Felton and Ty Lawson both scored their 1,000th points in their 84th games).
- Bacot has 10 or more rebounds in a UNC-record 71 games. He passed Billy Cunningham, who had 61 in three seasons from 1962-65.
- Bacot is Carolina's all-time leader in rebounds (1,261) and double-doubles (64), is second in offensive rebounds per game (3.60), second in offensive rebounds (443) and tied for fifth in rebounds per game (10.3). He is one of eight Tar Heels to average a career double-double (13.8/10.3).
- Sean May and Bacot are the only Tar Heels to average career double-doubles in the last 50 years.
- Bacot has 64 double-doubles in 123 games (double-doubles in 52.1% of his games). Only Cunningham (87.0%) recorded double-doubles in a higher percentage of games by a Tar Heel.

- Bacot set UNC single-season records last year with 511 rebounds, 31 double-doubles, five 20-rebound games (tied), 32 games with 10 or more rebounds, rebounds in an NCAA Tournament and rebounds by a Tar Heel in the Elite 8, national semifinal and championship games.
- Bacot became the first player in NCAA Tournament history with six double-doubles in one year and tied the NCAA single-season record for double-doubles with 31 (Navy's David Robinson also had 31 in 1985-86).
- Bacot grabbed a career-high 23 rebounds in UNC's 80-64 win over previously unbeaten James Madison on November 20.
- RJ Davis has tied Marcus Paige for fourth and Caleb Love is 15th all-time at UNC in free throw percentage.

- Caleb Love had 20 points and eight assists and Armando Bacot finished with 12 points and 20 rebounds in Carolina's 101-40 win over Johnson C. Smith on October 28.
- Pete Nance added 19 points, hitting 7 of 8 two-point shot attempts, while freshman Seth Trimble had 11 points and five assists.
- The Tar Heels led, 18-3, in the opening minutes and forced a Golden Bull timeout at the 13:54 mark of the first half. Bacot had a first-half double-double with 10 points and 12 boards in 17 minutes.
- UNC shot 50 percent in the first half (20 of 40) in running out to a 53-29 lead at the break. Carolina also shot 50 percent in the second half (19 for 38) and for the game (39 for 78). The Tar Heels hit 11 three-pointers as a team in 35 attempts.
- Carolina's defense held Johnson C. Smith to 23.1 percent shooting in the game, including 12.1 percent in the second half (4 for 33 for 11 points).

GAME 1: @UNC 69, UNCW 56

- No. 1-ranked Carolina shot 54.2% from the floor in the second half and 45.8% for the game.
- UNC held the Seahawks to 24.2% from the floor in the second half (8x33) and 29.3% for the game (17x58).
- The teams combined for seven assists on 39 field goals.
- The Tar Heels had four assists, fewest since it had four in a double-overtime loss to Texas A&M in the 1980 NCAA Tournament.
- Pete Nance led UNC with two assists.
- UNCW had three assists, fewest by a Tar Heel opponent since Kentucky had three on 12/8/1975.
- Carolina made 23 of 30 free throws, while UNCW converted 18 of 24.
- Both teams made more free throws than field goals.
- UNC made two three-pointers, its fewest in a victory since it made two against NC Central on 12/12/20.
- In the second half UNCW scored 19 points from the floor (eight field goals, including three three-pointers) and made 16 free throws.
- The Tar Heels are 101-12 in season-opening games with wins in each of the last 18 season openers.
- The Tar Heels have won their last 21 home openers at the Dean E. Smith Center.
- Carolina's previous game as No. 1 in the AP poll was a 71-67 loss at Northern Iowa on Nov. 21, 2015.
- Armando Bacot had 16 points and nine rebounds (1,010 career). He passed Brad Daugherty (1,003) and Mitch Kupchak (1,006) to move into eighth place in Tar Heel history in rebounds.
- Nance, Tyler Nickel and Seth Trimble made their Tar Heel debuts.
- Carolina improved to 177-18 all-time against in-state, non-ACC opponents.
- It was Carolina's 48th straight win in-state, non-ACC opponents.

GAME 2: @UNC 102, COLLEGE OF CHARLESTON 86

- Carolina trailed by seven at the half but out-scored the Cougars by 23 points in the second half (59-36) to win by 16.
- The Tar Heels shot 71.4% from the floor in the second half and 60.3% for the game. It was the highest field goal percentage in a game under head coach Hubert Davis (previous high was 56.4% at Georgia Tech last season).
- It was the second-highest field goal percentage in any half in the Davis era. The only higher percentage was 74.2% in the first half vs. Florida State last season.
- Carolina is 208-2 all-time when it scores 100 points (2-0 under Davis).
- Carolina made 27 of 38 free throws. The 27 makes equal the season high a year ago (vs. Elon). The 38 attempts were one more than the high a year ago (37 vs. Baylor).
- Carolina was out-rebounded for the second time in as many games. Charleston out-rebounded the Tar Heels, 37-32. UNC was 0-3 a year ago when it was out-rebounded.
- Carolina made 30 of 38 two-point field goal attempts vs. Charleston, its fifth-highest percentage (.789) in a game in the three-point era and the best since 2000.
- Bacot scored 27 of his game-high 28 points in the second half. It was the first time a Tar Heel scored 27 points in a half since Caleb Love scored 27 in the second half vs. UCLA in Philadelphia in the 2022 NCAA East Regional.
- Bacot was one shy of his career scoring high of 29 set last season vs. Virginia and Georgia Tech.
- Bacot was 0 for 1 from the floor and 1 for 3 from the line in the first half; in the second, he was 10 for 12 from the floor and 7 for 9 from the line.
- It was the 17th career game Bacot scored 20 or more points.
- Bacot drew 11 fouls.
- Love had 25 points, a career-high nine rebounds and five assists.
- Carolina improved to 16-0 in his career when Love scores 20 points.
- Leaky Black was a career-best 6 for 6 from the floor and finished with 15 points, one off his career high. He was 4 for 4 from the floor three times in his career, including the overtime win at Louisville last season.
- Black tied his career high with six made field goals.
- It was the 13th time Black scored in double figures as a Tar Heel. He also made two three-pointers, the 10th time he made multiple threes in a game.
- Nickel scored eight points in less than eight minutes (7:48), his first points as a Tar Heel.
- Carolina improved to 190-31 all-time as the No. 1 team in the Associated Press poll.
- Carolina out-scored the Cougars, 24-10, in points off turnovers. In the second half, UNC forced 11 turnovers that led to 17 points (the Cougars scored two points off UNC turnovers in the second half).
- The game featured nine lead changes and 10 ties.
- The Tar Heels improved to 7-3 against the College of Charleston.

GAME 3: @UNC 72, GARDNER-WEBB 66

- Carolina improved to 178-18 all-time against in-state, non-ACC opponents, including 48 straight wins.
- Davis led UNC with 10 rebounds. He added 14 points for the second double-double of his career.
- It was the first time a guard led the Tar Heels in rebounding since Love shared the team lead with Brady Manek (with six) in the home loss to Duke last season.
- It was the first time in his three seasons Davis led UNC in rebounding.
- Nance had season highs in points (18), rebounds (five), three-pointers (3) and blocks (tied season best with three).
- Nance scored a season-high eight points in the first eight and a half minutes of the first half. He had 14 points, three rebounds and three blocks in the first 11 minutes.
- It was the 11th time in his career Nance made three or more 3FGs.
- Carolina improved to 17-0 when Caleb Love scores 20 or more points.
- Love and Bacot combined for seven points in the first 1:25 of the second half after combining for five in the first half.
- Carolina made 18 of 21 free throws (85.7%).
- Carolina out-rebounded the Bulldogs, 40-38. It was the first time in three games this season UNC out-rebounded an opponent.
- The Tar Heels improved to 6-0 against Gardner-Webb.

GAME 4: @UNC 80, JAMES MADISON 64

- Carolina held previously-unbeaten JMU to 41 points below the Dukes' season average. The Tar Heels limited JMU to 34.8% shooting from the floor and 7 of 27 from three (JMU was shooting 58.6% from the floor and 54.1% from three entering the game).
- The Tar Heels out-rebounded the Dukes, 50-34, UNC's largest rebound margin of the season (JMU was plus 18 per game).
- Carolina equaled its season high in three-pointers with eight.
- Seven different Tar Heels made threes, a season high (previous was four players against Charleston and Gardner-Webb).
- Six different Tar Heels made threes in the first half.
- Carolina led, 45-26, at the half. The 45 points were a season high for a first half and the 19-point margin was UNC's largest of the season at the half.
- Bacot and Black both had career highs in rebounds and combined to out-rebound JMU, 35-34.
- Bacot had 23 rebounds, his sixth career 20-rebound game and 18th career game with 15 or more.
- Bacot passed both Antawn Jamison and Brice Johnson to move into sixth place in UNC history with 1,048 rebounds.
- Bacot had 19 points to go along with the 23 rebounds for his first double-double of the season. It was Bacot's 50th career double-double.

- Bacot had 11 points and 11 rebounds in the first half. His previous scoring high in a first half this season was eight vs. UNCW (combined for only three in the first halves in the previous two games). His previous rebounding high for a game this season was nine twice).
- Bacot tied his career high in free throws made with nine and also led UNC in plus/minus at +15.
- Black had career-high 12 rebounds. His previous high was 11 vs. UNC Asheville on 11/23/21.
- Carolina led the entire game for the first time this season.
- Davis led UNC in scoring with 21 points. It was his sixth career 20-point game and ninth career time as UNC's top scorer.
- Johnson played for the first time this season after missing the first three games with a sore right knee. He scored six points in 13:30 and was a plus 13. He made Carolina's only three of the second half.
- UNC improved to 4-0 against the Dukes.

GAME 5: UNC 89, @PORTLAND 81

- Nance tied his career high with a season-best 28 points. He previously scored 28 playing for Northwestern vs. Maryland on 1/12/22.
- It was the ninth time Nance scored 20 or more points and second time with 25 or more.
- Nance made a career-high five three-pointers. He made four vs. Nebraska on 2/22/22.
- Nance had a season-high seven rebounds.
- Love scored 16 first-half points and 23 for the game. It was his third 20-point game of the season and 18th as a Tar Heel. UNC is 18-0 when Love scores 20 or more points.
- Love became the 80th Tar Heel to score 1,000 career points. That is more 1,000-point scorers than any school in college basketball history (Louisville is second with 69).
- Love made 10 of 15 field goals. It was the highest field goal percentage (.667) in his college career. Previous best was 7 for 11 (.636) at Boston College last season. His previous best in a game in which he made 10 or more field goals was 55.0% on 11 of 20 vs. Duke in the 2022 NCAA semifinals.
- Bacot had 11 points and a game-high 13 rebounds. It was his second double-double of the season and 51st of his career, which equals Antawn Jamison for the second most double-doubles by a Tar Heel (Billy Cunningham had 60).
- It was the 58th game in which Bacot had 10 or more rebounds, second most in UNC history (Cunningham had 61).
- Bacot had six offensive rebounds (14 over the last two games). It was the 22nd time he had six or more offensive rebounds in his UNC career.
- Bacot passed Kennedy Meeks for fifth in UNC history with 1,061 rebounds.
- RJ Davis led UNC with five assists and hit a key shot with 24 seconds to play to make it a two-possession game.
- Carolina shot 53.4% from the floor. It was the second time this season UNC shot at least 50% for the game (.603 vs. Charleston) and the first time UNC shot better than 50% in both halves.
- Carolina improved to 9-1 all-time in the state of Oregon (2-1 in the Moda Center).
- Carolina was a season-best plus-16 (39-23) on the glass for the second game in a row.
- The Tar Heels made only 16 of 26 free throws for a season-low percentage of .615.
- The Tar Heels connected on a season-high 11 three-pointers and made a season-best 50%

from three (11 of 22).

- It was the 20th straight time UNC won when shooting 50% from the floor.
- Portland made 12 threes, most by an opponent this season (previous was eight by Charleston).
- The game had 15 lead changes (most in a UNC game this season) and six ties.
- Portland had 22 assists on 28 baskets, the most assists by an opponent since Tennessee's 28 last November in Connecticut.

GAME 6: IOWA STATE 70, UNC 65 (PORTLAND)

- UNC scored 65 points, its fewest to date this season.
- It was the first time UNC lost as the AP No. 1 team since 11/21/2015 at Northern Iowa.
- Iowa State scored 21 points off 14 Carolina turnovers. The 21 points off turnovers were the most by an opponent to date this season.
- The Cyclones held a 21-6 advantage in points off turnovers.
- Carolina led for 25 minutes and 19 seconds. The Cyclones led for 7:56.
- The Tar Heels led 57-49 with 5:43 to play and 60-53 with 3:55 remaining after a Black basket. The Tar Heels didn't make another field goal until a tip-in at the buzzer by Nance.
- In between Black's and Nance's field goals, UNC went 0 for 3 from the floor, 3 for 4 from the free throw line and committed four turnovers, while Iowa State went 4 for 5 from the floor (with two 3FGs) and 7 for 8 from the free throw line.
- Carolina shot a season-low 16.7% from three-point range (3 of 18), one game after making 11 of 22 against Portland.
- The Tar Heels were 18 of 25 from the free throw but missed six, including the front end of a one-and-one, in the second half.
- Bacot had a game-high nine rebounds and passed Hall of Famer Billy Cunningham for fourth in UNC history with 1,070 rebounds.
- Bacot was 5 for 6 from the floor, but only attempted two field goals in the second half (1 for 2).
- Iowa State's Caleb Grill was 7 for 11 from three and scored 31 points. It was the most points by an opponent since Syracuse's Cole Swider had 36 on 2/28/2022. Swider also made seven three-pointers.
- Carolina led 34-32 at halftime. UNC fell to 25-2 under Hubert Davis when leading at the half. UNC's last two losses (Kansas and Iowa State) came in games when leading at the half.
- Carolina is 3-2 against the Cyclones.
- Iowa State has won the last two times the teams have played.

GAME 7: ALABAMA 103, UNC 101 (PORTLAND)

- It was the second four-overtime game in UNC history, 46 years after the first. UNC beat Tulane, 113-106, on 2/14/1976 in the Superdome in New Orleans.
- UNC had not played at least three overtimes since a 119-113 loss to Wake Forest on 12/20/2003, in what was Roy Williams' first ACC game as UNC's head coach.
- Love was one of three Tar Heels to play 50 or more minutes. Love played 57:24, Leaky Black played 53:52 and RJ Davis played 50:36.
- Love's 57 minutes were one off the UNC record of 58 by Phil Ford in the 1976 quadruple-OT game at Tulane.
- In addition to career highs in minutes for Love, Black and Davis, Puff Johnson (48) and D'Marco Dunn (15) also played career-high minutes.

- Love tied his career high with nine rebounds.
- Dunn led UNC in plus/minus at +19 and Johnson was next best at +9.
- Johnson scored a season-high 10 points, his fourth career game in double figures. He added five rebounds, two assists, a block and a career-high three steals.
- UNC is 8-3 all-time in games when both teams score 100 points.
- It was UNC's first game in which both teams scored 100 points since a 103-100 (regulation) loss to Kentucky in Las Vegas on 12/27/2016.
- Carolina is 208-3 when it scores 100 points.
- Love scored a career-high 34 points. His previous high was 30 vs. UCLA on 3/25/22 in the NCAA Sweet 16 in Philadelphia.
- Love made a career-high 13 field goals (previous 11 vs. UCLA and Duke in the national semifinals).
- Love's 36 field goal attempts were the fourth most in a game by a Tar Heel. Lennie Rosenbluth attempted 43 in the 1957 NCAA triple-OT semifinal vs. Michigan State, Billy Cunningham attempted 39 vs. Tulane on 12/10/64 and Rosenbluth attempted 37 vs. Furman on 12/4/1956.
- Love and RJ Davis combined for 60 field goal attempts, which equaled the most in a game by two Tar Heels. Rosenbluth (43) and Bob Cunningham (17) attempted 60 in the triple overtime national semifinal in 1957 vs. Michigan State.
- The last time two Tar Heels attempted 20 shots in a game was 12/29/69 vs. Harvard – Charlie Scott (22) and Bill Chamberlain (20).
- Bacot scored 20 points and had 10 rebounds for his third double-double of the season and 52nd of his career. He is second in UNC history in double-doubles behind Cunningham (60) and second in games with 10 or more rebounds with 59 (Cunningham had 10 or more 61 times).
- Black had 10 points, eight rebounds, a career-high tying three blocks and two steals. He was the only Tar Heel and one of two players on either team to make a three-pointer in any of the overtimes (he gave UNC a 101-100 lead with 1:34 left in OT No. 4).
- Carolina falls to 193-33 as the No. 1 team in the AP poll. It was the first time UNC has lost consecutive games as the AP No. 1 team since February 1986, when it lost, 77-72, Maryland in overtime and, 76-65, to NC State.
- Carolina made 18 of 20 free throws, a season-high percentage of .900.
- Will Shaver made his debut and was 2 for 2 from the free throw line for his first points.
- Alabama was No. 1 in the nation in rebounds per game and rebound margin. The Tide out-rebounded the Tar Heels, 58-54, but UNC out-scored Alabama in second-chance points, 18-15.
- Alabama made 16 of 38 threes. The 16 threes are a season high by an opponent and equal the sixth most in a game by an opponent.
- The 16 threes were the most by an opponent since Iowa made 17 on 12/8/2020.
- Alabama committed 22 turnovers. It was the first time an opponent committed 20 or more and beat UNC since Michigan State had 24 in the final game of PK80 in Portland on 11/26/2017.
- Mark Sears made 7 of 11 threes and led the Tide with 24 points. It was the second game in a row an opponent went 7 for 11 from three.

GAME 8: @INDIANA 77, UNC 65

- Carolina lost a third straight game for the first time since a seven-game skid in 2019-20.
- The loss dropped UNC to 11-13 in ACC-Big Ten Challenge games, including 1-4 against Indiana.
- Nance and Bacot had double-doubles, the first time this season two Tar Heels had double-doubles in the same game.
- Nance had a team-high 15 points (11 straight in the first half) and a season-best 12 rebounds.
- Indiana out-scored Carolina, 50-24, in the paint and 17-4 in points off turnovers.
- The Hoosiers scored 17 points off just 10 UNC turnovers.
- Carolina shot 28.6% from the floor in the first half, its lowest first-half percentage to date this season.
- Carolina had only five assists on 20 field goals.
- Trayce Jackson-Davis led Indiana with 21 points, 10 rebounds, four assists and four blocks.
- The Hoosiers shot 53.3% from the floor in the second half and 50.0% for the game. They were the first opponent this season to shoot 50% from the floor in a game.
- Indiana made only three three-pointers, the fewest by an opponent in a win over Carolina since Georgia Tech made three in a 75-63 win in Atlanta on 12/31/2016.

GAME 9: @VIRGINIA TECH 80, UNC 72

- Carolina lost its fourth straight game, the first time UNC has lost four in a row in November or December since dropping four straight in December 2019.
- Bacot and Dunn did not play. Bacot suffered a right shoulder contusion at Indiana; Dunn broke a bone in his left hand on 12/3.
- It was the second game Bacot missed in his college career and the first since 3/3/2020 against Wake Forest (sprained ankle).
- Puff Johnson made his first career start in place of Bacot (did not score in 12 minutes).
- Carolina had won its previous five ACC road games.
- The Tar Heels drop to 56-14 in ACC openers.
- The Hokies led by 10 at the half and by 18 in the second half before Carolina cut the lead to 67-64 with 3:06 to play.
- The 10-point halftime deficit and 18-point deficit were the largest of the season to date.
- Virginia Tech out-rebounded the Tar Heels by 14 (39-25), the largest margin by an opponent since Duke in Chapel Hill last season.
- It was the fifth time in nine games this season the Tar Heels were out-rebounded.
- Carolina grabbed four offensive rebounds, its fewest since it had one vs. Pittsburgh on 2/14/2016.
- The Tar Heels shot 53.6% from the floor in the second half, the fourth time this season they shot better than 50% in the second half.
- UNC made three of 17 from three-point range. Since making 11 threes in a win over Portland, UNC has made 18 in the last four games.
- The Tar Heels had six assists on 24 field goals (11 assists in the last two games).
- Davis, Nance and Love all scored 18 points to lead UNC. Nance added 10 rebounds for his second straight double-double.
- Nickel matched his season high with eight points and was a +1.
- Trimble scored a season-best six points.
- UNC's bench out-scored the Hokies, 16-12,

the first time this season the Tar Heel non-starters out-scored the opponent's bench.

- Virginia Tech out-scored UNC, 42-32, in the paint.
- Justyn Mutts scored 21 of his game-high 27 points for the Hokies in the second half.
- The Hokies shot 50.8% from the floor, the second game in a row (and second time in the first nine games) the opponents shot at least 50% for the game.

GAME 10: @UNC 75, GEORGIA TECH 59

- Carolina snapped a four-game losing streak.
- It was the fifth time since 2000 two Tar Heels had 20 points and 10 rebounds. The others were Luke Maye and Theo Pinson vs. NC State on 1/27/2018, Harrison Barnes and John Henson vs. LIU in the 2011 NCAA Tournament, Sean May and Marvin Williams vs. Iowa State in the 2005 NCAA Tournament and Joseph Forte and Brendan Haywood at Virginia on 1/18/2000.
- The Tar Heels had 15 assists on 27 field goals, their highest A/FGM percentage of the season (.556). Previous high was .548 with 17 assists on 31 field goals vs. Portland.
- UNC out-rebounded the Yellow Jackets 43-22. The margin of plus-21 was UNC's highest of the season (previous was plus-16 vs. JMU and Portland).
- UNC held Georgia Tech to one offensive rebound and no second-chance points. Tech entered the game averaging 13.1 offensive rebounds.
- It was the first time UNC did not allow a second-chance point since Furman last season on 12/14/2021.
- Tech's one offensive rebound was the fewest since Notre Dame had one on 1/5/22.
- Bacot had 21 points and 13 rebounds. It was his 61st career game with 10 or more rebounds, tying Billy Cunningham for the most double-figure rebound games in UNC history.
- Bacot passed George Lynch for third place in UNC history in career rebounds and became the third Tar Heel with at least 1,100 career rebounds.
- It was Bacot's 15th career game with at least 20 points and 10 boards (second this season).
- RJ Davis led all scorers with 22 points (fifth time he led UNC this season and 12th time career) and added 11 rebounds for his third career double-double (second this season).
- Carolina ended the first half on an 11-0 run during which it held the Yellow Jackets to 0-4 FG and two turnovers, while UNC was 3 for 4 from the floor, including a Pete Nance three-pointer, and 4 for 4 from the line.
- Carolina's 39-26 lead at the half was the largest scoring margin for the Tar Heels in a half since November 20, when UNC out-scored JMU, 45-26, in the first half.
- The Tar Heels scored 13 fastbreak points in the first half after scoring 17 total in the previous two games at Indiana and Virginia Tech combined.
- Seth Trimble had three assists in the first half. He had two in the first nine games.
- Freshman forward Jalen Washington played the final 2+ minutes and scored two points in his first appearance as a Tar Heel after missing the first nine games of this season. He did not play high school basketball in 2021-22 due to a knee injury he originally suffered as a sophomore.
- UNC has won three in a row and 12 of the last 15 games against Georgia Tech.

- UNC has beaten the Yellow Jackets 19 of the last 21 games in the Smith Center (except 2010 and 2020).

GAME 11: @UNC 100, THE CITADEL 67

- The 33-point margin of victory was Carolina's largest of the season to date and the largest in two seasons under head coach Hubert Davis.
- Carolina made a season-high 15 three-pointers and had a season-high 24 assists.
- The 15 threes equaled the most in two seasons under head coach Hubert Davis.
- UNC had 24 assists on 32 made field goals, its highest percentage of assists to field goals this season (75%).
- Bacot had 14 points and 11 rebounds. He set the UNC record for games with 10 or more rebounds with his 62nd, one more than Billy Cunningham.
- It was Bacot's 55th career double-double in 110 college games (one in 50% of his games).
- Love led UNC with 17 points and also with a season-high six assists. He had no turnovers for the first time this season.
- Love, RJ Davis and Pete Nance made a combined 9 of 14 three-pointers.
- Love made a season-high four three-pointers and shot 60% from the floor (6x10), including 66.7% from three (4x6).
- Nickel scored a season-high 16 points, the most off the bench by a Tar Heel this season.
- Nickel made three 3FGs; he made one in the first 10 games.
- Nickel's 16 points off the bench equaled the previous high point total by UNC's bench in any game this season.
- Carolina's bench scored a season-high 42 points and out-scored the Bulldogs' bench, 42-16.
- The previous scoring high for UNC's bench this season was 16 vs. Charleston and Virginia Tech.
- This was the second time in 11 games this season UNC's bench out-scored its opponent's bench (also at Virginia Tech).
- Trimble had three first-half assists for the second straight game and finished with a season-best five.
- Carolina improved to 20-0 all-time against The Citadel.
- Carolina's 20 wins are the most in school history without a loss against any opponent.

GAME 12: UNC 89, OHIO STATE 84 (OT) NEW YORK, N.Y.

- Carolina forced overtime on a turnaround jump shot by Nance as time expired.
- Carolina trailed by 10 with 6:44 to play. It was the first time UNC trailed by double digits with less than 10:00 to play and won since beating Louisville, 72-71, on 1/10/2015.
- Ohio State led by 14 twice in the first half. That was the largest deficit in a Tar Heel victory 2/27/21 when UNC overcame a 16-point deficit to beat Florida State, 78-70, in the Smith Center.
- Carolina held OSU to 5 of 17 field goals and five turnovers in the final 6:44 of regulation plus overtime.
- Carolina improved to 6-3 in the CBS Sports Classic, including 3-0 vs. Ohio State.
- Carolina improved to 30-11 in Madison Square Garden and 44-25 all-time in New York City.
- It was UNC's first game in MSG since 12/28/2010.
- Carolina improved to 4-1 in overtime games

under head coach Hubert Davis.

- It was Carolina's first overtime game in MSG since beating Rhode Island in the 2010 NIT semifinals on 3/30/2010.
- Carolina is 3-1 in overtime games in MSG.
- Bacot (28 and 15) became the first Tar Heel to score at least 25 points and have 15 rebounds in a game in the current Madison Square Garden (41 games since 1968).
- Bacot recorded his 16th career game with at least 20 points and 10 rebounds, his third with 25 and 15 and his 56th career double-double.
- Bacot matched his season high with 28 points (also vs. Charleston).
- It was Bacot's fifth consecutive double-double and seventh in his 11 games this season.
- Bacot scored 28, Caleb Love scored 22 and RJ Davis had 21. It was the first time this season three Tar Heels scored 20 or more points.
- It was Bacot's 20th career 20-point game, Love's 20th career 20-point game and Davis's eighth career 20-point game.
- Bacot made a season-high 11 field goals, one off his career high.
- Bacot grabbed seven offensive rebounds (has 31 in the last five games).
- Carolina improved to 19-1 in three seasons when Love scores 20 points.
- UNC improved to 4-0 this season and 18-0 the last two seasons when Love has five or more assists.
- Love had seven assists (most to date by a Tar Heel this season) and two turnovers. UNC improved to 6-0 this season when has more assists than turnovers.
- Carolina had 20 assists on 32 field goals (59 assists on 91 field goals in the last three games)
- Black had seven points (made his first three in five games) and led all players with a game-high plus/minus of +27. He assisted on Nance's game-tying field goal at the end of regulation.
- Nance had 10 rebounds, his third time with double figures in the last five games.
- Carolina scored a season-high 27 points off 16 Buckeye turnovers (previous high of 24 points vs. Charleston).
- The Tar Heels led for 9:29, the least amount of time in a win to date this season (previous was 18:15 vs. Charleston).
- Carolina is 13-3 vs. Ohio State, including 3-0 in Madison Square Garden.

GAME 13: UNC 80, MICHIGAN 76 CHARLOTTE, N.C.

- Carolina has won four in a row, including back-to-back wins over Big Ten opponents, Ohio State and Michigan.
- The last time UNC defeated Big Ten teams in consecutive games was 2005 when UNC beat Wisconsin, Michigan State and Illinois in the final three games of the NCAA Tournament to win the national championship.
- Carolina improved to 165-27 all-time in Charlotte, including 15-2 in the Spectrum Center.
- Bacot scored a game-high 26 points, his 21st career game with 20 or more (UNC is 17-4 in those games) and sixth career game with 26 or more (UNC is 6-0 in those games).
- Bacot scored 28 vs. Ohio State. It was the first time a Tar Heel scored 25 or more in consecutive games since Brady Manek (28 vs. Marquette and 26 vs. Baylor) in the 2022 NCAA first and second rounds.
- Bacot tied his season high with 11 field goals, the second game in a row he made 11. That

tied his career high for field goals in consecutive games (he made 12 vs. Virginia and 10 vs. Georgia Tech in January 2022).

- It was the first time a Tar Heel made 11 or more field goals in consecutive games since Brice Johnson had 11 vs. both Tulane and UCLA in December 2015.
- Bacot passed Scott Williams (1,508) and Tyler Zeller (1,501) to move into 30th place in UNC career scoring with 1,518 points.
- Bacot led all players on both teams in plus/minus at plus 12. Caleb Love and Puff Johnson were next for UNC at plus 9.
- Davis made a season-high four three-pointers (he had made four in the previous four games combined). It was the eighth time in his career he made four or more threes in a game.
- Davis also had a team-high five assists, which matched his season high. He also had five vs. Charleston, JMU and Portland. Carolina is 16-1 the last two seasons when Davis has five or more assists (and 16-2 in his career).
- Black made two of the defensive plays of the game, scored nine points and grabbed 10 rebounds. It was his sixth career game with 10 or more rebounds. His field goal in the lane with 1:45 to play gave UNC a 75-71 lead.
- Carolina shot 53.8% from the floor in the second half, the seventh time this season and fourth time in the last five games the Tar Heels shot 50% or higher in the second half.
- Carolina shot 50.0% from the floor for the game, the third time this season UNC shot 50% for a game.
- The Tar Heels were 15 for 27 from the free throw line, a season-low percentage of .556. (previous was .615 vs. Portland).
- Carolina had 19 fastbreak points, most since it had a season-high 24 in the four-OT loss to Alabama.
- Carolina has beaten the Wolverines two games in a row and leads the series, 6-4.

GAME 14: @PITTSBURGH 76, UNC 74

- The loss snapped UNC's four-game winning streak.
- In the first half, UNC shot 51.6% from the floor and held Pitt to 41.9%. In the second half, UNC shot 33.3%, while the Panthers made 50% from the floor.
- Carolina's field goal percentage (.333) was its lowest in a second half to date this season.
- Pitt guard Jamarius Burton, the only Panther who also played in Pitt's win last season in Chapel Hill, was 14 for 17 from the floor and scored a game-high 31 points.
- Burton became the first opponent to make 14 field goals since Syracuse's Cole Swider went 14 for 21 in Chapel Hill last season.
- Carolina made 6 of 13 threes in the first half en route to a 40-34 lead, but made only 1 of 9 in the second.
- The Tar Heels made 50% from two-point range for the game (18 of 36).
- The Panthers out-scored UNC, 42-26, in the paint. It was the fourth straight UNC loss this season in which the opponent scored at least 40 points in the paint (40 by Alabama, 50 by Indiana, 42 by Virginia Tech and 42 by Pittsburgh).
- UNC fell to 7-2 this season when leading at the half (led Iowa State by two).
- UNC led Pitt by as many as nine points, which matches the largest lead by the Tar Heels in a loss this season (also in the Iowa State game).
- The Tar Heels led for 34:13, the most time

they have led in a loss this season (previous was 25:19 vs. Iowa State).

- It was the fifth time an opponent shot 50% from the floor in the second half this season and the third time in a UNC loss (also by Indiana and Virginia Tech).
- Bacot led UNC outright in scoring (22) and rebounds (13) and shared team honors in assists (3) and blocks (2), the first time a Tar Heel has led in all four since Luke Maye vs. Tulane on 12/3/2017.
- It was Bacot's 57th career double-double, his 64th career game with 10 or more rebounds, his 17th career game with at least 20 points and 10 rebounds and his 22nd career game with 20 or more points.
- Bacot was the only Tar Heel to make multiple field goals in the second half. He was 4 for 8 from the floor in the second; the rest of the Tar Heels were 5 for 19 as five different players made one field goal apiece in the half.
- Love was held to a season-low seven points (previous was nine vs. James Madison) and attempted a season-low nine field goals.
- Love made Carolina's only three-pointer of the second half with six seconds to play. It was his only three of the game but set the UNC record for consecutive games with a three (43 in a row).
- Black had nine points, nine rebounds, three assists and three steals. He scored his 700th career point and grabbed his 600th career rebound.
- Black was the only Tar Heel other than Bacot to get an offensive rebound (Bacot had five, Black two).
- Dunn played for the first time in six games (broken bone in his left hand) and scored five points in 19:44.
- Carolina entered the game averaging 26 free throw attempts per game. The Tar Heels attempted only two free throws in the first half before making 15 of 19 in the second half.
- The Panthers have won four of the last five games vs. the Tar Heels.

GAME 15: @UNC 88, WAKE FOREST 79

- It was the 300th ACC game in the Smith Center. Carolina improved to 265-35 in those games.
- The game featured 20 lead changes, the most in a UNC game this season (previous was 15 in the Tar Heels' win at Portland in November).
- Davis set season highs in three-pointers (5) and points (27) and became the 81st Tar Heel to score 1,000 career points (has 1,022).
- He scored his 1,000th point in his 83rd career game, one game faster than Ty Lawson and Raymond Felton and two faster than Justin Jackson and Jeff Lebo.
- Davis scored 22 of his game-high 27 points in the second half. His five threes equaled his second most in a game in his career.
- Davis tied his career high with nine field goals (also vs. Brown and at Duke last season).
- Carolina improved to 4-0 this season and 9-0 in the last three seasons when Davis scores 20 or more points.
- Black scored a career-high 18 points. He scored 14, including a season-high three three-pointers, in the first half.
- Black tied his career high with six field goals (also at Miami in 2021 and this season vs. Charleston).
- Bacot scored 21 points, the first time in his career he scored 20 or more points in four

straight games.

- Bacot had a season-high five assists and did not commit a turnover. The five assists are the most Bacot has distributed in a game in his career without a turnover (previous was three assists and no turnovers vs. Syracuse in the 2020 ACC Tournament).
- Trimble scored a season-high 11 points and was a game-high and season-best plus 16. His previous highs were six points at Virginia Tech and plus 15 vs. Georgia Tech. He played 21:49, the third time he has played 20 or more minutes.
- Carolina shot 60% from the floor in the second half. It was the second-highest percentage in a half this season (.714 in the second half vs. Charleston).
- Carolina has shot 50% or better from the floor in the second half in five of the last seven games.
- Carolina shot 51.7% from the floor for the game. UNC improved to 4-0 this season and 14-0 in the last two seasons under Hubert Davis when making at least 50% from the floor.
- Carolina scored a season-high 32 points off 15 Wake Forest turnovers. The 32 points were the most by UNC in any game since the Tar Heels scored 32 off 20 turnovers at Wake Forest in 2019.
- The Tar Heels committed eight turnovers in the first half that led to eight Wake Forest points. In the second half, Carolina committed only one turnover that led to no points.
- The Tar Heels scored 51 points in the second half, which equaled the most points allowed by Wake Forest in any half this season (Clemson scored 51 in the second half in a 77-57 win over the Deacs).
- Nance left the game after playing 1:56 and did not return due to a stiff back. He initially strained his back in the first half of the game at Pittsburgh on December 30.
- Justin McKoy played a season-high 17 minutes and had two points, two rebounds and two blocks. His previous longest stint this season was seven minutes vs. The Citadel on December 13.
- The Tar Heels have won nine of the last 11 games vs. the Demon Deacons.
- UNC improved to 80-18 all-time vs. Wake Forest in Chapel Hill, including 25-5 in the Smith Center (eighth straight win at home over the Demon Deacons).

GAME 16: @UNC 81, NOTRE DAME 64

- It was Carolina's sixth win in its last seven games.
- Bacot posted his 58th career double-double with game highs in points (21) and rebounds (13).
- Bacot passed College Basketball Hall of Famer Sam Perkins for second place in UNC history in rebounds.
- It was Bacot's 18th career game with at least 20 points and 10 rebounds and his 65th with 10 or more rebounds.
- Bacot tied Duke's Randy Denton (1968-71) for 10th in ACC history with 58 double-doubles.
- It was Bacot's fifth straight 20-point game, the longest streak in his career.
- Love made three three-pointers, all in the first half (he made three in the previous three games combined).
- Love scored 18 points; he scored a combined 14 in the previous two games.
- Johnson scored a season-high 11 points

(previous was 10 in the four-overtime game vs. Alabama when he played a career-high 48 minutes).

- Johnson made two threes, the first time this season he made two in a game. He made two at NC State last season.
- Carolina made 8 of 19 three-pointers, a percentage of .421 that was the third highest in a game this season and the highest in an ACC game (.500 vs. Portland and .484 vs. The Citadel).
- RJ Davis led UNC with five assists. UNC improved to 5-0 this season when Davis has five or more assists.
- Dunn scored a career-high seven points.
- Carolina had 19 assists and matched its season low in turnovers with eight. It was the seventh straight game UNC had more assists than turnovers. The Tar Heels went 6-1 in those games. That followed a four-game stretch, all of which UNC lost, when Carolina had more turnovers than assists.
- Carolina led 41-28 at the half. The 13-point margin tied UNC's largest halftime lead in an ACC game this season.
- Carolina made and attempted season lows from the free throw line (11 of 19).
- Trimble made his first start in place of Pete Nance, who had a strained back.
- It was only the second time in 16 games UNC had a different starting lineup than the five players who have started the other 14 games.
- The Tar Heels have won 10 of the last 12 vs. Notre Dame.
- UNC improved to 9-1 at home vs. the Irish, including 8-1 in the Smith Center.

GAME 17: @VIRGINIA 65, UNC 58

- Virginia beat Carolina for the eighth straight time in Charlottesville, overcoming a 29-27 UNC halftime lead and a six-point Tar Heel advantage early in the second half.
- After UNC built a 37-31 lead with 15 minutes to play in the second half, the Cavaliers scored 11 straight points and went on a 21-5 run to take a 10-point lead.
- Three-pointers by Love pulled Carolina within three points twice in the final 2:48, but an Isaac McKneely three and a driving layup by Reece Beekman thwarted the Tar Heel comeback.
- Bacot sprained his left ankle while grabbing an offensive rebound and left the game without returning just 1:18 into the game. He did not score and had one rebound.
- It was the fourth time in Bacot's career, but first since his freshman season, he started a game but left due to injury after playing fewer than 10 minutes.
- Carolina also played without Nance (strained back) for the second straight game.
- Washington played 27 minutes (had played 19 all season) and scored a season-high 13 points and had six rebounds. He scored 12 of UNC's 29 first-half points.
- McKoy returned to John Paul Jones Arena for the first time since playing for the Cavaliers from 2019-21 and matched his career high with six rebounds in 15 minutes.
- Carolina had more turnovers (13) than assists (9) for the first time in eight games. UNC has lost five straight times when it has more turnovers than assists.
- Davis led three Tar Heels in double figures with 16 points but had one assist and four turnovers.
- Carolina had a 24-15 lead and led, 29-27,

at the half despite just five combined points by Bacot, Black and Love.

- The Tar Heels had eight assists on 12 field goals in the first half (.667) but only one on nine field goals in the second (.111).
- Carolina was 8 for 12 from the free throw line, season lows to date in makes and attempts from the line.
- The Tar Heels shot 39.6% from the floor, their third time under 40% this season and the first since the loss at Indiana on 11/30/22.
- Carolina held Virginia to 37.5% shooting from the floor in the first half, but the Cavaliers shot 53.6% in the second half.
- Virginia out-scored the Tar Heels in all five specialty stats, including 19-10 in points off turnovers, 32-20 in paint points and 10-2 on fastbreaks.
- Ohio transfer Ben Vander Plas came off the bench for Virginia to score 14 of his team-high 17 points in the second half.
- Beekman had 13 points, five assists and five steals.
- The Cavaliers blocked eight shots, which equaled the most by an opponent in the Hubert Davis era as head coach.

GAME 18: UNC 80, @LOUISVILLE 59

- The 21-point win is Carolina's largest at Louisville (previous was a 93-76 win on 2/17/2018).
- Carolina won on the road for the first time this season (also beat Portland in Portland, Ore., on Thanksgiving in a game that is officially recorded as a neutral-site game) and snapped a four-game road losing streak.
- Bacot, who played 1:18 and had no points and two rebounds at Virginia on January 7, tied for the team lead in scoring with 14 points and grabbed a game-high 16 rebounds.
- Other than the game at Virginia, this was Bacot's least amount of playing time this season (24:42).
- Bacot had 11 points and 10 rebounds in just the first half to post his 10th double-double of the season and the 59th of his career, one from tying Naismith Hall of Famer Billy Cunningham for the all-time UNC record (60).
- It was Bacot's 20th career game with 15 or more rebounds and 66th with 10 or more (extending his school record).
- Bacot scored his 10th and 11th points on an offensive rebound (his 10th rebound) and tip-in with 6:46 to play in the first half.
- Bacot tied Duke's Shelden Williams (2003-06) for ninth place in ACC history with 59 double-doubles.
- Dunn shared UNC scoring honors with Bacot with a career-best 14 points. It was the first time Dunn led UNC in scoring.
- Dunn scored in double figures for the first time in his career (previous high was seven vs. Notre Dame on January 7).
- Dunn set career highs in minutes (25:56), points, field goals (5), three-pointers (2), offensive rebounds (2), rebounds (5), steals (2) and plus/minus (+25) and tied his career highs in free throws (2), assists (1), turnovers (1) and blocks (1).
- Dunn was a plus 18 in the first half and led all players in the game with a plus 25.
- Johnson scored a season-high 12 points, his third game this season and sixth in his career in double figures
- Johnson matched his career highs in three-pointers (2) and rebounds (6).

- Davis had a game-high five assists. The five matched his season high (for the sixth time). UNC improved to 6-0 this season and 18-2 over the last three seasons when Davis has five or more assists.
- Davis committed only one turnover. The Tar Heels are 10-2 this season when he has more assists than turnovers.
- Love made a career-high five steals.
- Love did not make a three-pointer (0x7), ending his UNC-record streak at 45 consecutive games with a made three-pointer.
- Black had three assists and three steals. It was the fifth straight game Black made multiple steals. He has three, three, two, three and three for a total of 14 in the last five games.
- Both teams turned the ball over 14 times. Carolina converted those turnovers into 23 points, while the Cards scored eight points off UNC miscues. UNC improved to 7-1 this season when it scores more points off turnovers than its opponent.
- Carolina had a season-best 17-2 edge in fast-break points (previous best was 17-3 vs. Georgia Tech).
- Carolina's bench out-scored Louisville, 26-10, the fifth time in 18 games this season UNC's non-starters out-scored the opponent bench. UNC is 3-2 in those games with wins over The Citadel, Notre Dame and Louisville.
- Johnson started in place of Pete Nance, who missed his third straight game (and almost all of the Wake Forest game) due to a strained back.
- Johnson made his second career start.
- The lineup of Davis-Love-Black-Johnson-Bacot started for the first time.
- Styles played five of his eight minutes late in the first half and was a plus 8 in helping the Tar Heels take an 11-point lead at the half.
- The Tar Heels made 19 of 23 free throws (82.6%), their third-highest percentage of the season.
- UNC held Louisville to 37.0% from the floor, lowest by an opponent since James Madison on November 20.
- The Cardinals made one three-pointer (in 14 attempts), the fewest vs. the Tar Heels this season (previous low was three by Indiana).
- Louisville was 18 for 28 from the free throw line. The 18 made free throws matched the most and the 28 attempts were the most by an opponent to date this season.
- Carolina was whistled for a season-high 25 fouls (16 in the second half).
- UNC held Louisville to 59 points, which matched 59 by Georgia Tech as the fewest by an opponent since UNCW's 56 in the season opener.
- Carolina has won four in a row and six of the last seven vs. Louisville.
- Carolina improved to 4-3 in the KFC Yum! Center and 4-5 vs. Louisville on the road.

GAME 19: @UNC 72, BOSTON COLLEGE 64

- Bacot had game highs in points (20), rebounds (16), assists (tied, 3) and blocks (tied, 1).
- Bacot tied Billy Cunningham for the all-time UNC record for double-doubles with 60.
- Carolina improved to 45-15 when Bacot has a double-double (8-3 this season).
- It was the second straight game Bacot had a double-double in the first half. He had 11 points and 10 rebounds in the first half at Louisville and 10 points, 12 rebounds vs. the Eagles.
- Bacot joined Tyler Hansbrough as the second

Tar Heel and 12th ACC player all-time with 1,200 rebounds (1,203).

- It was Bacot's 67th career game with 10 or more rebounds, extending his own UNC record, his 21st with 15 or more and his 19th with at least 20 points and 10 rebounds.
- It was his second consecutive game with 16 rebounds, the first time this season he had 15 or more in consecutive games.
- Bacot (1,616 points) passed Mitch Kupchak (1,611) and Hubert Davis (1,615) in UNC career scoring.
- Carolina did not allow a three-point field goal for the first time in 33 seasons (Boston College was 0 for 6 from three). The last opponent that did not make a three was Jacksonville on 11/27/1990. The opponents had made a three in 1,149 straight games since the Jacksonville game.
- Carolina attempted 23 more three-pointers than the Eagles (UNC made 10 of 29). The 23 more attempts equaled the largest margin ever in a game by the Tar Heels. On 12/30/1986 UNC went 9 for 30, while SMU was 0 for 7.
- Davis was 4 for 7 from three-point range and had 18 points.
- Davis has made 16 three-pointers in the last five games (16 for 28).
- Black tied his career high with four steals, the sixth consecutive game he made two or more steals. He has 18 in the last six games.
- Nance played for the first time since a brief stint vs. Wake Forest on January 4. He made two three-pointers, had a season-high three offensive rebounds and scored six points in 30-plus minutes.
- Love made two three-pointers, the biggest of which came with 5:21 to play to stop an 8-0 BC run and give Carolina a 59-55 lead.
- Love passed James Worthy, Harrison Barnes, Joe Wolf and James Michael McAdoo in UNC career scoring.
- Carolina made 10 three-pointers, the third time this season with 10 or more.
- Carolina attempted 29 threes and 32 two-pointers (47.5% attempts from three). The only game in which UNC attempted a higher percentage of field goal attempts from three was against The Citadel on 12/13/22, when the Tar Heels attempted 31 of 65 shots (.477) from beyond the arc.
- The Eagles shot 57.1% from the floor in the second half, best by an opponent to date this season.
- UNC has won three in a row and 15 of the last 16 vs. Boston College.

GAME 20: @UNC 80, NC STATE 69

- Carolina improved to 36-5 in the last 41 games and 53-12 over the last 31 seasons against NC State.
- The Tar Heels are 81-23 vs. the Wolfpack in Chapel Hill, including 30-7 in the Smith Center.
- It was UNC's fourth straight win over NC State and fifth straight in Chapel Hill.
- Bacot set UNC career records for rebounds (1,221) and double-doubles (61).
- Bacot moved up to eighth in ACC history with 1,221 rebounds. He passed Georgia Tech's Malcolm Mackey, Wake Forest's Len Chappell, Clemson's Dale Davis and Hansbrough.
- It was Bacot's fourth career double-double vs. NC State. He's had five vs. Virginia Tech, the most against any opponent.
- Bacot scored 23 points and had a game-high

18 rebounds, again tying the school record for most rebounds vs. NC State. Cunningham had 18 on 1/13/1965 and Bacot had 18 in Raleigh on 2/26/2022.

- It was Bacot's 20th career game with at least 20 points and 10 rebounds.
- It was Bacot's 10th career game with at least 18 rebounds, his 22nd with at least 15 and his 68th with 10 or more.
- Bacot has 50 rebounds in the last three games (16 at Louisville, 16 vs. Boston College and 18 vs. NC State).
- Bacot moved up to 22nd place in all-time scoring by a Tar Heel with 1,639 points, passing Jawad Williams, Justin Jackson, Eric Montross and Kenny Smith.
- Davis led all scorers with 26 points. UNC improved to 5-0 this season and 10-0 in three seasons when Davis scores 20 or more.
- Davis was 5 for 8 from the floor, 2 for 4 from three and a career-best 14 for 14 from the free throw line.
- Davis tied the third-most free throws without a miss in a game by a Tar Heel (York Larese was 21 for 21 vs. Duke on 12/19/1959, Phil Ford was 16 for 16 at NC State on 2/24/1976 and Davis is the third to make 14 for 14, joining Cole Anthony vs. Boston College on 2/1/2020 and Tyler Hansbrough vs. NC State on 1/7/2006).
- Davis became the first Tar Heel to score at least 24 points with fewer than nine field goal attempts.
- It was the eighth time this season (most on the team) and 15th time as a Tar Heel Davis led UNC in scoring.
- Love was 9 for 10 from the line and scored 16 points. He was a game-high plus 17, the third time this season and second time in a UNC win (also Notre Dame) he led the team in plus/minus.
- Carolina set a school record for its highest free throw percentage in a game with at least 30 attempts. The Tar Heels made 36 of 39 for 92.3%. The previous high was 91.9% vs. Syracuse (34 of 37) on 2/26/2019.
- The 36 free throws were the most by UNC since making 37 vs. Clemson in the 2005 ACC Tournament.
- The Tar Heels committed a season-low seven turnovers.
- Carolina's bench scored a season-low one point.
- Carolina was 20 for 54 from the floor, a percentage of .370 that was the lowest in a win this season (previous was .383 vs. Gardner-Webb).
- Carolina's 20 field goals equaled the fewest in a game that UNC scored 80 or more points (20 in a 1957 win over NC State and 20 in a 1995 win over Clemson. UNC made 43 free throws in the '57 game and 34 in the '95 game).
- The 20 field goals equaled UNC's fewest in a game this season (loss at Indiana).
- Carolina improved to 2-2 this season when shooting under 40% from the floor.
- The Tar Heels had only five assists on 20 baskets. No player had more than one assist.
- It was the fifth time in any game and the first time in a win no Tar Heel had more than one assist (losses at South Carolina in 1969 and 1970, 1979 at Wake Forest and 1980 NCAA Tournament vs. Texas A&M).
- NC State went on a 13-0 run in the first half to take an 18-10 lead. The 13 points were the most consecutive scored vs. UNC this season.

GAME 21: UNC 72, @SYRACUSE 68

- It was UNC's fourth win in a row and second straight on the road.
- Carolina held the Orange to 68 points, the sixth straight game the Tar Heel defense has held the opponents under 70 points.
- Carolina had 14 assists on 16 first-half field goals and finished with 21 assists on 26 baskets for a season-best percentage of .808 (previous was 75% on 24 assists/32 FG vs. The Citadel).
- It was the third time this season UNC had 20 or more assists (also 24 vs. The Citadel and 20 vs. Ohio State). The Tar Heels had a combined 13 assists in the previous two games vs. Boston College and NC State.
- Nance scored a game-high 21 points. It was his second 20-point game as a Tar Heel (10th career) and the fourth time he led UNC in scoring (first time since 12/4 at Virginia Tech).
- Nance matched his career high with eight made free throws, tied his season-high with three assists and had a career-high three steals (one more than his previous career best for steals, which he had done six times).
- Love scored 15 points and passed Ademola Okulaja, Raymond Felton, Ed Cota and Bobby Jones to move into 53rd in UNC history with 1,266 points (one behind Vince Carter).
- Davis and Love both had five assists. UNC improved to 7-0 this season and 19-2 overall when Davis has five or more assists and 5-1 this year and 26-3 overall when Love has five or more.
- Love made his first three three-point field goal attempts and finished the game 3 for 5 from three. He was 3 for 22 from three-point range over the previous three games.
- Bacot scored 18 points, grabbed a game-high eight rebounds and had four assists.
- Carolina scored 20 points off turnovers, six more than the Orange. The Tar Heels improved to 8-1 when they have more points off turnovers (are 5-5 when they have fewer).
- The Tar Heels led for 36:42 and trailed for only 1:40, including for 1:04 at 68-66 before Nance made one FT and then scored the game-winner with 17.7 seconds to play after a missed FT and steal.
- Nickel led all players on both teams in plus/minus at +12 in just under a dozen minutes.
- Carolina won despite converting 60.9% from the free throw line (14 of 23).
- The Tar Heels scored a season-low two second-chance points (an offensive rebound and basket in the second half by Davis). The game-winning basket by Nance, which came after a missed free throw, was officially recorded as following a Syracuse defensive rebound and turnover.
- Syracuse shot 50% from the floor, the highest percentage by an opponent in a Carolina victory to date this season. UNC improved to 1-2 this season when an opponent shoots 50% from the floor.
- Carolina had lost the previous eight times the opponents had shot 50% from the floor. The last time UNC had won when an opponent shot 50% was against Brown in the second game of the 2021-22 season.
- Carolina is 16-6 all-time vs. the Orange.
- The Tar Heels have won 12 of 15 against the Orange since Syracuse joined the ACC.
- Carolina is 12-3 all-time in the JMA Dome (formerly the Carrier Dome), including 5-2 against Syracuse.

GAME 22: PITTSBURGH 65, @UNC 64

- It was the first time UNC lost by a point since 2/17/2020 at Notre Dame (76-77).
- The loss ended UNC's 12-game home win streak (had won the previous seven ACC home games). It was UNC's first home loss since the Panthers beat the Tar Heels on 2/16/2022.
- It was Pittsburgh's fifth win in the last six games vs. UNC.
- Pittsburgh became the third team to win at least three straight games in the Smith Center, joining Duke (1999-2002) and Wake Forest (2002-04).
- It was the second time this season the Panthers snapped a four-game UNC winning streak.
- Love led UNC with 22 points. It was just the second time in 21 games over three seasons UNC lost when Love scored 20 or more points.
- Carolina shot 34.8% from the floor, lowest since the loss at Indiana.
- The Tar Heels were 11 for 36 from the floor in the first half, their lowest first-half percentage (.306) since the loss at Indiana.
- Carolina was 5 for 27 from three-point range, including 1 of 14 in the second half. Love made four of UNC's five threes. The four threes matched Love's season high (also vs. The Citadel and Ohio State).
- Carolina's three-point percentage (.185) was its third lowest to date this season. The two worse percentages were losses to Iowa State (.167) and Virginia Tech (.176).
- The Tar Heels were 13 of 22 from the free throw line (.591). Bacot made nine of 15. The 15 attempts equaled his career high (also vs. Baylor in 2022).
- Bacot had 15 points and a game-high 11 rebounds for his 62nd career double-double and 69th game with double-digit rebounds.
- Bacot grabbed five offensive rebounds which pushed his career total to 434, surpassing George Lynch (431) for second place in UNC history.
- Bacot's nine free throws made moved him past Tyler Zeller for 10th in UNC history with 415.
- It was the fifth time in his career Bacot has made nine free throws in a game.
- Love passed Vince Carter, Garrison Brooks and York Larese to move into the top 50 in UNC career scoring with 1,288 points.
- There were eight ties and a dozen lead changes.
- The teams combined for 12 assists on 48 field goals (six assists for both teams).
- Carolina out-rebounded the Panthers, 43-34, including 19-7 on the offensive boards, but the Tar Heels converted those 19 rebounds into just 13 points.
- The 19 offensive rebounds were a season high for the Tar Heels.
- It was the seventh straight game the Tar Heels held an opponent under 70 points. UNC dropped to 5-2 in those games.
- The 64 points were the fewest UNC scored at home to date this season. They were the fewest at home since beating Boston College, 58-47, on 1/26/2022.

GAME 23: @DUKE 63, UNC 57

- Carolina scored a season-low 57 points.
- The Tar Heels shot 34.3% from the floor, 25.9% from three and was 2 of 3 from the free throw line.
- It was the second loss in a row in which UNC shot under 35% from the floor (34.8% vs. Pittsburgh). It was UNC's second-lowest FG percentage of the season (.339 in a loss at Indiana).
- Carolina's two made free throws equaled the fewest in UNC history in the ACC era (the seventh time since 1953 and the first time since 12/1/2021 against Michigan).
- The three free throw attempts equaled the fewest in any game in UNC history in the ACC era. UNC also attempted three last season vs. Michigan.
- UNC entered the game averaging 18.1 made free throws and 24.7 attempts per game.
- Duke blocked 11 shots (eight by Dereck Lively II), most by an opponent this season and the most by an opponent since Ohio State blocked 11 on 12/20/2014 in Chicago.
- The Blue Devils won despite shooting 39.3% from the floor. That ended a streak of 21 straight games the Tar Heels had won they held an opponent under 40% from the floor.
- The last time an opponent had won when shooting under 40% was Virginia on 2/13/2021 (39.6%).
- Duke out-scored UNC, 20-2, in fastbreak points, including 16-0 in the first half. The 20 points were the most by an opponent this season. The previous high was 15 by Alabama and NC State.
- UNC scored 25 points in the second half, its lowest in any half this season (previous was 26 in the first half vs. Gardner-Webb in November).
- Carolina shot 28.6% from the floor in the second half, its lowest percentage in a second half this season (previous .333 in the loss at Pittsburgh).
- Black had his first career double-double with 13 points and 10 rebounds. He was 3 for 6 from three-point range (came into the game 2 for his last 20).
- Black had five offensive rebounds for the second game in a row.
- Bacot had his 63rd career double-double with 14 points and 10 rebounds.
- Bacot tied Duke's Mike Gminski for sixth in ACC history with 63 double-doubles and passed Gminski for seventh all-time in ACC history in rebounds with 1,250.
- Love score 12 points and has 1,300 in his career. He passed Joseph Forte, George Karl and Kevin Madden to move into 47th in UNC history.
- Davis had 11 points, five assists and no turnovers. It was the first time this season UNC lost when Davis had at least five assists (now 7-1 this season and 19-3 in his career).
- Duke's 63 points marked the eighth straight opponent the Tar Heels held to fewer than 70 points.
- Duke's 63 points were the fewest by the Blue Devils in the series since they beat Carolina, 60-48, in the ACC Tournament in Charlotte on 3/8/2002.
- The 63 points are the fewest by Duke vs. UNC in Cameron since a 73-63 Carolina victory on 1/16/1982 (non-shot clock game).
- Carolina's 57 points are its fewest vs. Duke since a 69-53 loss in Chapel Hill on 3/9/2013.
- The 57 points are the fewest by UNC in Cameron since an 82-50 loss on 3/6/2010.

GAME 24: @WAKE FOREST 92, UNC 85

- It was Carolina's third-straight loss to begin the month of February and the third-consecutive loss at Wake Forest.
- It was the first time UNC has lost three straight at Wake Forest since losing four in a row from 1961-64 at Memorial Coliseum.
- Carolina out-rebounded the Demon Deacons, 50-35. It was the first time UNC lost a 40-minute game when it had 50 rebounds since the Tar Heels out-rebounded Kansas, 55-35, in the 2022 NCAA championship game.
- Carolina scored 25 points in the first half and 60 in the second. The 60 points were the most scored in any half by the Tar Heels this season.
- Carolina out-scored the Deacs, 60-45, in the second half. It was the first time the Tar Heels lost when scoring 60 in a half since 1/10/1990. UNC and Maryland both scored 61 in the second half in a 98-88 Terrapin victory in College Park.
- UNC had won the 35 times it had scored 60 or more points in a half.
- It was the first time UNC scored 50 or more in a half in a loss since scoring 56 in the second half vs. Georgia Tech on 1/4/2020.
- Wake Forest's 92 points were the most by an opponent this season in a 40-minute game.
- UNC's 25 first-half points matched the 25 it scored in the second half at Duke in the previous game as the fewest points in a half this season.
- Wake Forest's largest lead was 26 early in the second half. That was the largest deficit of the season for the Tar Heels (previous was 18 at Virginia Tech).
- The Deacons led by 22 points, 47-25, at half-time. UNC's previous largest halftime deficit this season was 10 at Virginia Tech.
- Wake Forest's Tyree Appleby scored 35 points and had 11 assists. The 35 points and 11 assists were the most against UNC this season.
- Appleby set all-time single-game ACC records for free throws made (23) and attempted (28). He was 21 for 26 from the line in the second half, including making 15 in a row in one stretch.
- Appleby scored 15 of Wake Forest's final 18 points from the free throw line, including 11 straight points from 1:58 to 0:24 remaining in the game.
- The previous ACC record for free throws made was 21 by South Carolina's Grady Wallace at Duke on 2/23/1957 and UNC's York Larese vs. Duke on 12/59/1959.
- The previous ACC record for free throw attempts was 26 by Wake Forest's Dickie Hemric at Duke on 2/19/1955 and NC State's Ronnie Shavlik vs. Villanova on 1/29/1955.
- Since 1990, the previous highs for free throws made and attempted by an opponent were by Virginia Tech's Zabian Dowdell, who went 17 for 19 in a 81-80 Hokies win in overtime in Chapel Hill on 2/13/2007.
- Wake Forest went 33 for 42 from the free throw line. The 33 made free throws were the most by an opponent since Duke went 33 for 37 in the 2017 ACC Tournament semifinals.
- Wake Forest's 42 free throw attempts were the most by an opponent since Louisville attempted 44 on 1/31/2015.
- Love scored 22 of his UNC-high 24 points in the second half. He was 9 for 16 from the floor in the second half and 9 for 25 for the game.
- Love's 25 field goal attempts were the most by a Tar Heel in a 40-minute game since Joseph Forte attempted 27 at Virginia on 2/27/2001.

- Bacot had 17 points and 11 rebounds but fouled out after playing only 21:42, his shortest stint of the season (other than at Virginia, when he was injured less than two minutes into the game).
- Nance had his third double-double of the season with 11 points and 10 boards.
- Black had 10 rebounds, the first time in his career he had 10 in consecutive games (he also had 10 at Duke and has 29 in his last three).
- Carolina lost for the first time in eight games when it scored 80 or more points.
- Bacot passed Wayne Ellington and tied Rick Fox for 20th in UNC career scoring with 1,703 points.
- Carolina was 4 for 18 from three, its third straight game under 30% from beyond the arc (.222). Love made all four of UNC's three-pointers. He was 4 for 9 and the rest of the lineup was 0 for 9.
- Wake Forest made 5 of 11 threes in the opening half and was 0 for 8 in the second half.
- Carolina had 15 offensive rebounds but converted them into only 11 second-chance points.
- The Tar Heels scored 17 fastbreak points (had scored a total of 20 in their previous four games).
- Wake Forest committed only five turnovers, fewest by an opponent this season.
- Wake Forest led for 37:16, the most time an opponent has led this season., The Demon Deacons had a 14-0 run to go ahead, 24-9, the largest scoring run vs. the Tar Heels this season.

Hubert Davis led the Tar Heels to the 2022 NCAA East Region championship, a win over Duke in a historic Final Four matchup and a berth in the national championship game, all in his first season as a head coach. The 1992 graduate of the University of North Carolina received two National Coach-of-the-Year awards as UNC won 17 of its last 21 games and came within a few possessions of securing the program's seventh NCAA Tournament title.

Davis was named the 20th head coach of the University of North Carolina men's basketball program on April 5, 2021. He became the fourth former Tar Heel player to become UNC's head coach and the first Black head coach in Carolina men's basketball history.

Davis played for Dean Smith at Carolina from 1988-92 and was an assistant coach on Roy Williams' staff from 2012-21. He played a key role coaching, recruiting and scouting and was the head coach of the UNC junior varsity program for six seasons from 2013-19.

"I said (to Coach Davis) keep what's good but don't get stuck," UNC Director of Athletics Bubba Cunningham told the media at the 2022 Final Four. "Change what needs to be changed to be modern and current. And I think that's what Hubert brings — a current mentality to the historical tradition and success that we've had."

Davis led the Tar Heels to a 29-10 record, including 15-5 in the ACC to tie Notre Dame for second place, just a game out of first. The Tar Heels went 7-3 on the road in league play, including five straight victories at Clemson, Louisville, Virginia Tech, NC State and fourth-ranked Duke when UNC won 11 of 13 games to conclude the regular season.

The 29 wins were the second most by an individual in his first season as Carolina's head coach and equaled the 10th most in NCAA history for a first-year head coach.

The Tar Heels shook up the college basketball scene in a 94-81 win at Duke when they scored 55 second-half points, all five starters played the entire second half and four scored 20 points for the first time in UNC history in Mike Krzyzewski's final game at Cameron Indoor Stadium.

UNC entered the NCAA Tournament as an eight seed but played some of its best basketball in winning the East Region. The Tar Heels had 51 assists on 62 field goals and sank 24 three-pointers in the first- and

second-round wins over Marquette and Baylor, when it crushed the Golden Eagles by 32 points and eliminated the defending NCAA champion Bears in overtime after leading by 25 points in the second half in front of a heavily partisan Baylor crowd in Fort Worth, Texas.

Carolina trailed UCLA with two minutes left in the Sweet 16 but went on an 8-0 run to beat the Bruins and overpowered Saint Peter's, 69-49, in the regional final to send the Tar Heels to the Final Four for a record 21st time.

"I want every player that played for Coach Smith, Coach Guthridge and Coach Williams, whether it's in person, TV, highlights — I want them to be able to identify and go, 'That's the Carolina I went to,'" Davis said during the Final Four. "It's really important for me that this program, with my own personality in my own shoes, looks exactly like the program that Coach Smith, Coach Guthridge and Coach Williams ran."

Davis became just the second individual to play for and serve as head coach of the same school in Final Four history; the fourth to take his team to the national championship game in his first season as a head coach; the seventh to play in and be a head coach in the Final Four; and the 10th to lead his team to the Final Four in his first season as a head coach.

The Tar Heels defeated Duke, 81-77, in the national semifinals, the first time the two great rivals ever played in the NCAA Tournament. The game featured a dozen ties and 18 lead changes, 13 of which came in the second half. Over the final 15:42, the margin for either team exceeded a single possession for a little more than just one minute. Carolina would score nine different times in the second half either to break a tie or reverse the lead, including field goals or free throws by all five Tar Heel starters.

"Hubert Davis may be the nicest person I know, and he's the best father I've ever seen," Jay Bilas said to the Washington Post in New Orleans. "He's a perfect balance of cutthroat competitor and incredibly nice, thoughtful, empathetic person. He is an amazing person, and I'm not at all surprised knowing him that he is having this level of success this early."

"I tell the parents, 'I'm not your son's parent, but every decision I make will be filtered through what is in the best interests for your son and what I think you would do for your son,'" says Davis. "So, the same way I care for my three children is the same way I care for the players. I just want things to work out for them. Being a father helps me relate to the players because that's the way I coach."

Davis led Carolina to wins in March and April over the No. 4 (twice), No. 9 and No. 11-ranked teams in the AP poll. He won the Big House Gaines Award (National Sports Media Association) and John McLendon Award (CollegelInsider.com) as National Coach of the Year.

Each of Carolina's starters made significant contributions to the team's success in Davis's first season as head coach.

Armando Bacot earned third-team All-America and first-team All-ACC honors, setting the single-season UNC record with 511 rebounds and tying David Robinson's NCAA record with 31 double-doubles; Brady Manek was named the top transfer in the country, coming to UNC after four seasons at Oklahoma, led the ACC in three-point percentage and averaged more than 18 points in three games vs. Duke; RJ Davis and Caleb Love alternated at point and shooting guard — Davis had 12 assists in the NCAA first round and 30 points vs. Baylor in round two; Love scored 30 against UCLA then 28 in the Final Four win over Duke; and Black became a lockdown defender, earning ACC All-Defensive team honors.

"It shows how much he cares about us and cares about the game," Love said during the NCAA Tournament. "We knew all along his passion, and we carried that with us. We feed off him and his energy. That's why you see us playing so hard for him."

"I just think Hubert is perfect for the job," Williams told USA Today during the Final Four. "He's the nicest person I've ever known but then he's also fiercely competitive. When you put those two together, it's a pretty good mix. It's why I asked him to join our staff. But he hasn't just had me as an influence. He had Coach (Dean) Smith, Don Nelson and Pat Riley

from when he was a player. He's got all of us, but then found a way to make it his. This run, he's put his fingerprints on it. It's his team. He's put Hubert Davis's stamp on North Carolina basketball. He's been absolutely sensational."

In nine seasons on the bench with Williams, the Tar Heels played in eight NCAA Tournaments, advanced to the Final Four and national championship games in 2016 and 2017 and won the NCAA title in 2017. The Tar Heels went 228-95, including 107-60 in Atlantic Coast Conference regular-season play, winning the regular-season ACC title in 2016, 2017 and 2019 and the ACC Tournament title in 2016.

Carolina earned three No. 1 seeds and a No. 2 seed in the NCAA Tournament in those nine seasons. The four-year run from 2016-19 was the best four-year NCAA seed average in UNC basketball history.

Davis helped coach 14 players who have played in the NBA, including 10 first-round draft picks – Cole Anthony, Tony Bradley, Reggie Bullock, P.J. Hairston, Justin Jackson, Brice Johnson, Cameron Johnson, Nassir Little, Day'Ron Sharpe and Coby White.

Brice Johnson and Jackson were consensus first-team All-America and first-team All-ACC selections; Jackson was the 2017 ACC Player of the Year and Cameron Johnson earned first-team All-ACC honors.

Jackson and Cameron Johnson rank one-two in UNC single-season history in three-pointers. Johnson transferred to UNC from Pittsburgh and blossomed into the 11th pick in the first round of the 2019 NBA Draft.

Davis also coached Marcus Paige, who earned second-team All-America and first-team All-ACC honors as a sophomore in 2014 and set the UNC career record with 299 three-pointers, and Joel Berry II, the 2017 Final Four Most Outstanding Player.

Anthony set the ACC record for most points in a college debut and had the second-highest single-season scoring average by a Tar Heel freshman.

White set the UNC single-season record for most threes by a freshman and became the seventh pick in the first round of the 2019 NBA Draft.

Prior to beginning his coaching career, Davis worked for seven years with ESPN as an analyst and co-host of the College GameDay program.

Born in Winston-Salem, N.C., Davis grew up in Burke, Va., where he attended Lake Braddock High School, the same high school UNC and US Soccer star Mia Hamm attended. Davis was a high school football teammate of future Olympic 110 hurdles gold medalist Allen Johnson.

Davis played in 137 games as a Tar Heel from 1988-92, during which time UNC went 102-37, won the 1989 and 1991 ACC Tournaments and played in the 1991 Final Four. He scored 1,615 points, an average of 11.8 per game. He still holds the UNC record for career three-point percentage at .435 (197 of 453). He scored in double figures 80 times with 23 games scoring 20 or more points.

"In 1987-88, I went with Coach Smith into Hubert Davis's home," says Williams, who was an assistant at UNC when Davis was being recruited. "Coach Smith said, 'I don't know if you're ever going to be able to play here, Hubert, and I don't want to do this.' I got in the car with Coach and I said, 'Coach, I think he'll play more than you think he will because I think he's so competitive and so driven.' Hubert told Coach Smith, 'You'll never know unless you give me a chance.' Coach Smith a couple days later called him and said, 'I listened to what you said and I'm going to offer you a scholarship to North Carolina.' Hubert committed to Coach Smith right then."

He scored in double figures in each of his last eight NCAA Tournament games, averaging 18.5 points in those games. That included 19 against Temple in the 1991 NCAA East Regional final and 25 against Kansas (coached by Williams) in the 1991 Final Four.

Davis averaged 21.4 points and earned second-team All-ACC honors as a senior. He scored in double figures in 32 of 33 games that season, including 20 games with 20 or more points and 30 or more in four games. He netted a career-high 35 points at Duke on March 8, 1992. That 35-point game was part of a seven-game stretch late in the season in which he averaged 28.7 points.

The New York Knicks selected Davis with the 20th pick in the first round of the 1992 NBA Draft. He played 12 seasons in the NBA, scoring 5,583 points, an average of 8.2 per contest. He made 728 three-point field goals and is currently second in NBA history in three-point percentage at .441.

Davis averaged double-figure scoring in four different seasons – a career-high 11.1 with Dallas in 1997-98 and with the Knicks in 1993-94 (11.0), 1994-95 (10.0) and 1995-96 (10.7).

He scored a career-high 32 points twice – as a second-year pro with the Knicks vs. Minnesota and in 2000 with Dallas against Seattle.

In 1993-94, he was fourth on the Knicks in scoring behind Patrick Ewing, John Starks and Charles Oakley as New York won 57 games and advanced to the NBA Finals, where they took Hakeem Olajuwon, Clyde Drexler and Kenny Smith to seven games (Doc Rivers and Greg Anthony were also Knicks that season).

He shot 40 percent or better from three-point range in eight seasons, including 1999-2000, when he led the NBA with a career-best 49.1 percent as a Maverick.

Davis shot 80 percent or better from the free throw line nine times. He connected on 83.7 percent of his career free throw attempts.

Davis played for NBA head coaches Pat Riley, Don Nelson, Jim Cleamons, Leonard Hamilton, Doug Collins, Rick Carlisle and Larry Brown. His NBA teammates included Anthony, Chauncey Billups, Ewing, Michael Finley, Richard Hamilton, Michael Jordan, Jason Kidd, Steve Nash, Dirk Nowitzki and Rivers.

"Hubert carved out a remarkable career in both longevity and achievement," said ABC/ESPN analyst and former NBA head coach Jeff Van Gundy when Davis was named head coach. "He will go down as one of the GREAT shooters of his era and had an under rated pick and roll game. Hubert was what you want in a player...dependable, reliable, trustworthy and his work ethic were second to none. Hubert's character, basketball acumen and love of UNC will drive him in his quest to continue the long and storied championship tradition that he helped create as a player and as an assistant coach. I have no doubt that Hubert will be the next in line of Hall of Fame coaches from Chapel Hill with an NCAA championship in the near future."

Hubert's uncle, Walter, starred at UNC from 1973-77 and was a six-time NBA All-Star. He was the NBA Rookie of the Year in 1978 with the Phoenix Suns, who retired his jersey.

"I've never known a finer person in my entire life, who has a switch he turns on and can be as competitive as anybody around," says Williams. "He loves this program and has the same passion I do, and he'll be better than me."

Davis graduated from UNC in 1992 with a degree in criminal justice. He and his wife, Leslie, have three children – Elijah, Gracie and Micah. Elijah is a sophomore on the basketball team at the University of Lynchburg.

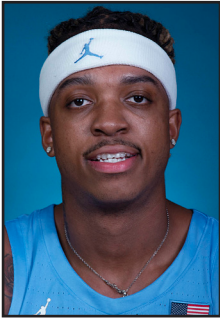

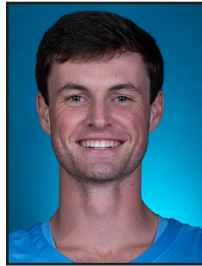
