CLEMSON OVERVIEW

- Clemson returns 17 letterwinners from the 2022 roster, including five players that were All-ACC selections, and added three graduate transfer to bolster the roster.
- The Tigers hold a .340 batting average led by Valerie Cagle (.479) and JoJo Hyatt (.385). The team holds a .578 slugging percentage led by Cagle (.950) and a .435 on-base percentage also led by Cagle (.557).
- Clemson's pitching staff maintains a 0.90 ERA through 257.0 innings pitched. They have struck out 230 batters and limited opponents to a .174 average.

SOUTH CAROLINA OVERVIEW

- South Carolina is led by head coach Beverly Smith.
- The Gamecocks are batting .297 as a team led by Brooke Blankenship (.384) with a .484 team slugging percentage.
- In the circle, the team posts a 3.34 ERA with 232 strikeouts through 228.2 innings. Donnie Gobourne leads the group with a 2.94 ERA through 52.1 innings.

QUICK HITS

- Clemson has outscored opponents 278-50.
- The Tigers have run-ruled 14 opponents: FIU, Georgia State, No. 14/11 Northwestern, Ohio State, Michigan State, Gardner-Webb, Syracuse, Mercer, Bryant, Jacksonville, Charlotte, Georgia Tech (twice), South Carolina and Boston College.
- Clemson has 348 hits through 41 games, including posting 71 doubles and 54 home runs.
- The Tigers have 259 RBIs this season with Valerie Cagle (41), Alia Logoleo (37), Caroline Jacobsen (31) and McKenzie Clark (31) leading the way. A total of 10 players have double-digit RBIs.
- 10 Tigers have combined for 94 multi-hit games this season led by Cagle (18), Clark (14), Davenport (11), Logoleo (10) and Jacobsen (10).

SINGLE-GAME TICKETS

- During the off-season, Clemson expanded the berm seating along the outfield fence to allow more fans into McWhorter Stadium.
- Single-game tickets went on sale on Feb. 19 to the general public. Fans are encouraged to purchase tickets at https://am.ticketmaster.com/clemson/.
- New in 2023, the Clemson Athletic Ticket Office will hold a limited number of seats on the berm for walkup sales on the day of each game. Fans can purchase these tickets on gameday at the gate of McWhorter.

McWHORTER MADNESS

- Clemson fans continue to showcase why they are the best fans in the country.
- Through 23 home events (the Gardner-Webb doubleheader counts as one event), Clemson has welcomed 43,410 fans into the stadium to average roughly 1,887 fans per game.
- Prior to the 2023 season, Clemson sold out of season tickets for the second consecutive year after previously selling out in 2022 (season tickets were not sold in 2021 due to COVID).

THE NATIONALLY RANKED TIGERS

- Heading into week 10, Clemson continues to remain in the top 10, coming in at No. 8 on D1Softball's rankings
- The Tigers reached new heights climbing to No. 4 first on the USA Today/NFCA and ESPN/USA Softball polls heading into week four. They remained in the fourth spot through week six in both polls.
- Clemson received its first single-digit ranking in program history clocking in at No. 9 on the ESPN/USA Softball poll during the third week of 2022.
- The Tigers have received single-digit rankings by the NFCA for eight consecutive weeks in 2023

VALERIE CAGLE

- The Yorktown, Va., native is a two-time NFCA All-American (First Team in 2022, Second Team in 2021).
- She was the first softball player in the ACC to be crowned both the ACC Freshman of the Year and Player of the Year earning the honor in 2021.
- This season, Cagle is batting .479 with a team-high 57 hits, including 12 doubles and 14 home runs with a .950 slugging percentage. She has tallied 41 RBIs and scored 36 runs.
- Being a dual threat, she also holds a 0.68 ERA through 24 appearances with seven solo shutout and three combined. She has struck out 134 batters in 123.1 innings of work while limiting opponents to a .157
- Cagle continues to etch her name in the record books throwing Clemson's first perfect game against Mercer. The 5.0 inning performance had Cagle facing 15 batters, striking out eight, while only throwing 51 total pitches (40 strikes), and never reached a three-ball count during the contest. During the performance, she eclipsed 600 career strikeouts. She became the eighth D1 player to throw a perfect game this season
- Against Georgia Tech, she threw an immaculate inning tossing only nine pitches to strikeout out all three GT batters on March 24 in the bottom of the second.
- In the sixth week of action, Cagle came forward with her injury report in her own words speaking about the shoulder surgery she had following the 2022 season. The full video can be watched at clemsontigers. com/2023-yalerie-cagle/
- The redshirt junior continued to rake in the honors in 2023 being named the Louisville Slugger/NFCA Player of the Week, D1Softball Player of the Week and ACC Co-Player of the Week after her week seven performance against Georgia Tech.
- Cagle was named ACC Pitcher and Co-Player of the

Week after the second week of action where she batted .529 with one double and four home runs and maintained a 1.65 ERA with three victories and a save while striking out 23 batters. She was also a Top Performance selection by the NFCA. She earned her second ACC Pitcher of the week honor after earning three wins against Charlotte and Virginia. She notched her fifth weekly honor after picking up three wins in the circle against South Carolina and Boston College. She has five total ACC weekly honors (three pitcher, two co-player)

- After opening weekend, Cagle earned her first Top Performances by the NFCA of the season. She has been selected four times this season.
- On her career, she has 212 hits, 166 RBI, 139 runs and a .383 average. In the circle she holds a 1.42 ERA through 590.1 innings with 664 strikeouts, 71 wins and 25 solo shutouts.

PITCHING PROWESS

- As a staff, Clemson holds a 0.90 ERA.
- Junior Millie Thompson has added the perfect 1-2 punch dynamic with Cagle to Clemson's pitching staff.
- The lefty was a Third Team All-ACC selection in 2022 after making the All-Freshman team in 2021.
- She threw two no-hitters in 2022, her first coming against Furman (April 6) in five-innings and her second against UNCW (May 20) in the Clemson Regional. The Bedford, Va., native finished the Clemson Regional with a five-inning shutout against Louisiana (May 22) with five strikeouts, one hit and one walk.
- This season, Thompson holds a 1.49 ERA with 11 wins and four solo shutouts throwing 65.2 innings with 56 strikeouts
- On her career, she holds a 1.70 ERA through 59 appearances and 263.2 IP. She has struck out 236 batters and clocked 35 victories.
- Joining Cagle and Thompson have been junior Regan Spencer and sophomore Brooke McCubbin.
- Spencer has made 14 appearances (26.1 innings) with one solo shutout and 15 strikeouts while maintaining a 0.80 FRA with four wins and one save this season.
- McCubbin has appeared in 11 games (40.2 innings) and struck out 24 batters, including a career-high eight in the third week of action against Michigan State. She holds a 0.69 ERA with four victories.
- During week nine against Furman, McCubbin was one out away from throwing her first career no-hitter after going 6.2 innings before giving up a hit.

TOP TRANSFERS

- Clemson added three transfers to the roster during the offseason in Reedy Davenport, Caroline Jacobsen and Ally Miklesh.
- Each one has added a missing piece to the Tiger lineup, and been a positive addition to the Clemson defense.
- Davenport has taken ownership of the hot corner making multiple quick reaction plays after being the 2021 ASUN Defensive Player of the Year and ASUN First Team honors to the Clemson to sure up the defense.
- Offensively this season, she holds a .323 average. with 30 hits, 27 RBIs, 10 runs and a .473 slg. percentage.
 She has tallied 27 putouts with 74 assists on the year.
- Jacobsen, a Duke transfer, joined the Tigers and filled the vacant right field spot tallying 36 putouts and three assists this season.
- She has also stepped into the cleanup spot in the lineup maintaining a .322 average with 37 hits, including 10 doubles and nine home runs for a .643 slg. percentage, with 31 RBIs and 27 runs. She has also added some speed to the lineup with six stolen bases on the year.
- Rounding out the transfer squad has been Ally Miklesh from Wisconsin. She joined the Tiger lineup as the

- starting left fielder tallying 29 putouts, joining Jacobsen and McKenzie Clark as three of the strongest outfielders in the country.
- Offensively, Miklesh holds a .346 average with 28 hits, 26 runs and 11 RBIs with a .500 on-base percentage and .444 slg. percentage. Her speed in the eighth spot is an added bonus, as she has stolen 13 bases.

EXPERIENCED LINEUP

- There is no question that Clemson amped up the lineup for the 2023 season after adding the three transfers, but the returners have loaded themselves with the right tools to take the next step both offensively and defensively.
- McKenzie "Pie" Clark has been Clemson's starting centerfielder since stepping onto campus in the fall of 2020. She has tallied 136 putouts with 14 assists and constantly shows opponents that they shouldn't test her arm from center throwing out multiple runners looking for extra bases or attempting to score.
- At the plate in 2023, Clark is batting .371 at the top of the lineup with 43 hits, including 10 doubles, one triple and nine home runs, with 41 runs scored and 31 RBIs.
 She holds a .707 slg. percentage and 10 stolen bases.
- Joining Clark as a key returner is shortstop Alia Logoleo. Logoleo has played multiple positions (outfield and third base) before finding her home in the middle infield. She has clocked 153 outouts with 245 assists during her career.
- In 2023, Logoleo has a .318 average while batting in the fifth spot. She has 35 hits, 37 RBIs, 26 runs scored and a .555 slg. percentage while also stealing 10 bases.
- Being patient in her time as a Tiger is redshirt junior Arielle Oda. Oda, and teammate JoJo Hyatt, are the two remaining Tigers from the inaugural Clemson team.
- Oda has stepped into the DP role in this year's lineup after previously serving as a pinch runner and right fielder. This season she is batting .295 with a .426 slg. percentage and .411 on-base percentage. She has 18 hits, 14 runs scored and 11 RBIs, while also stealing seven bases.

SUPER SOPHOMORES

- Sophomores Maddie Moore and Aby Vieira have stepped up to the plate and taken the experience from the 2022 season to set the team up for success in 2023.
- Moore has taken over for former Tiger Cammy Pereira at second base and made it her own. In her new role, she has already tallied 57 putouts and 73 assists compared to 46 putouts and 94 assists in 2022.
- At the plate, Moore moved to the top of the lineup, compared to the ninth spot last season, and is batting .293 with 34 hits, 21 RBIs and 43 runs scored. Each of these is more than doubled her season totals from last season. She has a .543 slg. percentage, .427 onbase percentage and seven stolen bases.
- Vieira is back behind the plate as one of two primary catchers for the Tigers. She has clocked 174 putouts, 19 assists and caught seven batters stealing.
- Offensively, Vieira is batting .318 with 27 hits, 17 RBIs and 11 runs scored. She has hit three home runs with five doubles for a .482 slg. percentage, while drawing eight walks for a .379 on-base percentage.

NEED FOR SPEED

- The Tigers have been dynamic on the base paths in 2023 clocking 79 stolen bases through 41 games to average 1.93 per game.
- Pinch runner Julia Bomhardt leads the team this season

NOTES

- with 17 stolen bases followed closely by Ally Miklesh stealing 13.
- In total, 11 Tigers have stolen at least one base this season (Cagle, Hyatt, Oda, Davenport, Clark, Jacobsen, Logoleo, Moore and Houston).
- During week three against UIC, the Tigers finished with seven stolen bases led by Clark (3), while Miklesh (2), Bomhardt (1) and Moore (1) rounded out the group - this tied a program record set earlier in the season against Ohio State where six Tigers stole a base.
- Against UIC, Clark's three stolen bases tied her personal and the individual record for most stolen bases in a single game that was set by Sam Russ (2022) and Clark (2021).

FIRST 200

- Clemson softball is rapidly approaching the 200th game in program history - if the current schedule holds up, Clemson could reach the milestone during the 2023 postseason.
- The softball program has placed itself in a position to have the best record through the first 200 games amongst Clemson sports (see chart below). The Tigers already paced themselves to tie with women's tennis for the most wins through 100 games (78 wins, 22 losses - .780 percentage).
- Clemson hit its 100th win in program history in 130 games - this is the second fastest program to reach the 100 win mark after women's tennis did it in 128 matches.

IN THE ACC

- The Tigers were predicted to finish third among Atlantic Coast Conference schools trailing Florida State and Virginia Tech.
- Redshirt junior Valerie Cagle was once again selected to the Preseason All-ACC Softball Team. This marks her third Preseason All-ACC selection (2021 & 2022).
- Junior McKenzie Clark back-to-back Preseason All-ACC honors after garnering it before the 2022 season as well.
- Redshirt junior Alia Logoleo earns her first Preseason All-ACC selection.
- Through the first nine weeks of action, Clemson sits second in the ACC with a 37-4 overall record (12-3 ACC)

ACC & NCAA RANKINGS

- As a team, the Tigers sit at the top of multiple stat categories in both the ACC and NCAA.
- In the ACC alone, Clemson holds the top spot in 11 categories, the second spot in four categories and the third spot in two. The only area Clemson isn't in the top three is triples per game.

900 CAREER VICTORIES

- Head coach John Rittman is closing in on 900 career victories as a head coach
- The earliest Coach Rittman could reach the milestone would be against Pitt on April 23.
- He is pacing himself to be the 42nd head coach to reach the 900 win milestone in NCAA Division I history.
- Rittman has been a head coach for 22 seasons, starting in 1996-97 at Stanford, where he spent 18 season and tallied a 750-351-3 overall record.
- Rittman reached the 800th win milestone on April 17, 2021 with a 4-3 extra-inning victory against Boston College

THE FIRST FIVE, THE NEXT FIVE

- Clemson softball was announced in March 2017 with the hiring of head coach John Rittman on Nov. 3, 2017.
- On June 21, 2022, Coach Rittman and Clemson reached a new five-year contract agreement keeping him at Clemson through the 2027 season.
- On Nov. 3, 2022, Coach Rittman celebrated five years at the helm of the softball program and looks ahead at what the next five years has in store for it.

FALL ACADEMIC SUCCESS

- The Tigers continue to make history on and off the field.
- In the fall of 2022, the softball team posted a 3.68 GPA to set not only a program record, but the highest team semester GPA in school history for any team at Clemson.
- As a department, Clemson tallied a 3.23 GPA to mark the ninth consecutive semester with a combined average GPA greater than 3.0.

HEAD COACH JOHN RITTMAN



John Rittman, a longtime head coach and member of the USA Softball Women's National Team coaching pool, was named the first Head Coach of Clemson Softball on Nov. 3, 2017. Rittman came to Clemson after serving as the Associate Head Coach at the University of Kansas from 2015-17. Rittman joined the Jayhawks after 18 seasons as the Head Coach at Stanford University and 10 years on the United States National Team coaching staff (2001-08, 2016-18).

In the third year of the Clemson program, Rittman continued to guide Clemson to new heights by making the program's first Super Regional appearance after earning the program's first national seed and hosting a Regional. Early in the season, the Tigers upset then-No. 6 Washington, 2-0, at the St. Pete/ Clearwater Elite Invitational for the program's first top-10 win. Clemson followed that by playing its 100th game in program history against Illinois on March 13. The Tigers won with a 4-0 victory to tie Clemson women's tennis for the most wins through a program's first 100 games with a 78-22 record. With that record, Rittman solidified himself as the winningest coach among active head coaches at Clemson surpassing Dabo Swinney (football), who held a 74-26 record. The Tigers continued to reach new levels by winning their 100th game in only 130 games on May 1 with a 3-2 win against Georgia Tech on Senior Day to become the second-fastest program at Clemson to reach 100 wins trailing only women's tennis (128). The Tigers were ACC Tournament Runner-Ups. The upset win over Virginia Tech marks Clemson softball's highest victory over a ranked opponent in program history. The hot streak continued for Clemson entering postseason as the Tigers earned the No. 10 national seed for the NCAA softball tournament. The No. 10 Tigers welcomed No. 17 Auburn, Louisiana and UNCW for the Clemson Regional and made a clean sweep in three games by shutting out all three programs and run-ruling UNCW and Louisiana to advance to the Stillwater Super Regional. Clemson finished the year with five All-ACC team selections, and Valerie Cagle was named an NFCA First Team All-American, the second NFCA All-America honor of her career. Behind Rittman's efforts, Clemson climbed as high as No. 14 in the NFCA national rankings and earned its first single digit ranking from ESPN/USA Softball rankings coming in at No. 9 for two weeks. Off the field, graduate Sam Russ was named to CoSIDA's Academic All-America Third Team to become softball's first Academic All-American.

During the second season and first complete year, Rittman propelled Clemson to even higher heights by becoming the ACC Regular Season Champions after posting a 29-5 ACC record and winning seven ACC series, including six series sweeps. The Tigers were ACC Tournament Runner-Ups. The Tigers finished the season with a 44-8 record and the sixth-best WL Percentage in the NCAA (.846). Rittman was named ACC Coach of the Year and guided Cagle to being the first softball player in league history to be named both the ACC Freshman and Player of the Year in the same season. Clemson finished with six individuals earning nine All-ACC team selections following the regular season, including three on the first team. Cagle and freshman McKenzie Clark were

named to the NFCA All-Region team. The honors continued to roll in for Cagle as she became the first Clemson softball All-American garnering second team honors from the NFCA, was a JWOS First Team All-American, a Top-Three Finalist for the NFCA's National Freshman of the Year and a Top-10 Finalist for USA Softball's Collegiate Player of the Year. Behind Rittman's efforts, Clemson climbed as high as No. 13 in the NFCA national rankings and No. 10 in the ESPN/USA Softball rankings before finishing the season at No. 18 in the NFCA poll. Rittman led the Tigers to their first postseason appearance traveling to the Tuscaloosa Regional to defeat Troy twice, including a five-inning run-rule victory in the opening game that capped off a historic second season.

In its inaugural season, Rittman transcended Clemson into a nationally-respected program. Rittman guided Clemson, which was predicted to finish in 10th in the conference, according to the 2020 ACC preseason poll, to a 19-8 overall record, including 5-1 in ACC play. The Tigers, who won both of their ACC series against Virginia and Pitt, won 11 of their final 12 games before the 2020 season was cut short due to the coronavirus pandemic (COVID-19). Additionally, Clemson went 14-2 at Clemson Softball Stadium (now McWhorter Stadium), which included a 13-game home win streak that spanned 25 days. Rittman and the Tigers generated plenty of enthusiasm among the Clemson faithful as the first-year program ranked fourth nationally in attendance (24,860) and fifth in average attendance (1,544/game) in 2020.

At Stanford, Rittman and the Cardinals recorded 18-consecutive winning seasons, made 16-straight NCAA appearances, notched 13 40-win seasons and produced at least one All-American in 15 of his last 17 seasons. As head coach, Rittman accumulated a 750-351-3 overall mark, coached a national player of the year, 16 All-Americans, earned five Super Regional appearances, two Women's College World Series appearances and maintained a spot in every regular-season NFCA top-25 poll for more than a decade.

Rittman served on the staff of the USA Softball team which won gold at both the 2016 Women's Softball World Championship and the 2017 Pan Am Qualifier. He also worked with Team USA from 2001-08, coaching the 2004 Olympic gold medal winners in Athens and the 2008 silver medalists in Beijing. Team USA also won gold medals at the 2002 and 2006 World Championship and the 2003 and 2007 Pan Am Games.

Rittman graduated from New Mexico State with a degree in journalism in 1986. He was a three-year letterwinner in baseball as an outfielder at NMSU after transferring from Yavapai Junior College in Prescott, Arizona.

Rittman and his wife, Lorie, a former softball player at the University of Oklahoma, are the parents of Justin, a UCLA graduate and former fullback for the Bruins, and Jake, a Notre Dame graduate and former punter for the Fighting Irish.
