CLEMSON OVERVIEW

- Clemson returns 17 letterwinners from the 2022 roster, including five players that were All-ACC selections, and added three graduate transfer to bolster the roster.
- The Tigers hold a .318 batting average led by Valerie Cagle (.465) and JoJo Hyatt (.355). The team holds a .537 slugging percentage led by Cagle (.906) and a .414 on-base percentage also led by Cagle (.553).
- Clemson's pitching staff maintains a 1.34 ERA through 346 innings pitched. They have struck out 296 batters and limited opponents to a .196 average.

DUKE OVERVIEW

- Duke is led by head coach Marissa Young.
- The Blue Devils are batting .326 as a team led by D'Auna Jennings (.458) with a .531 slugging percentage.
- In the circle, the team posts a 2.12 ERA with 329 strikeouts through 356.2 innings. Cassidy Curd leads the group with a 1.65 ERA through 101.2 innings.
- Clemson last met Duke in the ACC Championship game in 2021 where the Blue Devils won, 1-0. Current Tiger, Caroline Jacobsen was a member of the 2021 Blue Devil squad that captured the ACC Title.

ACC SEMIFINAL HISTORY

- For the third-consecutive year, every year the program has been eligible, the Clemson Tigers are heading to the ACC Championship Semifinals.
- In 2022, Clemson upset the top-seeded Virginia Tech Hokies with a 4-1 victory. Alia Logoleo hit two home runs (top of the second and seventh). Clark had scored on a throwing error in the fourth, and Arielle Oda hit a sac fly in the fifth.
- In 2021, Clemson also defeated the Hokies, 2-0. Logoleo scored a run in that game as well off a sac bunt, and Cagle hit a solo home run in the third inning.

QUICK HITS

- Clemson has outscored opponents 331-86.
- The Tigers have run-ruled 15 opponents: FIU, Georgia State, No. 14/11 Northwestern, Ohio State, Michigan State, Gardner-Webb, Syracuse, Mercer, Bryant, Jacksonville, Charlotte, Georgia Tech (twice), South Carolina, Boston College and Pitt.
- Clemson has 435 hits through 54 games, including posting 81 doubles and 70 home runs.
- The Tigers have 311 RBIs this season with Valerie Cagle (53), Alia Logoleo (46), Caroline Jacobsen (41) and McKenzie Clark (35) leading the way. A total of 10 players have double-digit RBIs.
- 11 Tigers have combined for 113 multi-hit games this season led by Cagle (23), Clark (16), Davenport (12), Jacobsen (12) and Logoleo (12).

THE NATIONALLY RANKED TIGERS

- Heading into week 14, Clemson continues to remain in the top 10, coming in at No. 10 on all major polls: NFCA Coaches, USA Today/ESPN, D1Softball and Softball America.
- The Tigers reached new heights climbing to No. 4 on the USA Today/NFCA and ESPN/USA Softball polls heading into week four. They remained in the fourth spot through week six in both polls.
- Clemson received its first single-digit ranking in program history clocking in at No. 9 on the ESPN/USA Softball poll during the third week of 2022.
- The Tigers received single-digit rankings by the NFCA in 11-consecutive weeks in 2023.

IN THE ACC

- Continuing her dominant year, redshirt junior Valerie Cagle was named the 2023 ACC Player of the Year. This marks the second ACC POTY award during her career after earning the honor, along with ACC Freshman of the Year, in 2021.
- Cagle, a first team selection, was joined on the All-ACC teams by Caroline Jacobsen, Alia Logoleo, Ally Miklesh and Millie Thompson, who were all third-team honorees.
- Clemson finished the regular season with an 18-6 record, which trailed only Florida State and Duke.

VALERIE CAGLE

- The Yorktown, Va., native is a two-time NFCA All-American (First Team in 2022, Second Team in 2021).
- She was the first softball player in the ACC to be crowned both the ACC Freshman of the Year and Player of the Year earning the honor in 2021.
- This season, Cagle is batting .465 with a team-high 74 hits, including 14 doubles and 18 home runs with a .906 slugging percentage. She has tallied 53 RBIs and scored 46 runs.
- Being a dual threat, she also holds a 1.20 ERA through 33 appearances with seven solo shutout and three combined. She has struck out 177 batters in 169 innings of work while limiting opponents to a .177 average.
- On May 3, Cagle was named a USA Softball Top 10 Finalist for the second time of her career. She was announced as a Top 25 Finalist for the third-consecutive season on April 19.
- Cagle continues to etch her name in the record books throwing Clemson's first perfect game against Mercer. The 5.0 inning performance had Cagle facing 15 batters, striking out eight, while only throwing 51 total pitches (40 strikes), and never reached a three-ball count during the contest. During the performance, she eclipsed 600 career strikeouts. She became the eighth D1 player to throw a perfect game this season.
- In the opening game of the 2023 ACC Tournament, Cagle struck out a season-high 12 batters in eight innings of work to surpass 700 strikeouts in her career.
- Against Georgia Tech, she threw an immaculate inning tossing only nine pitches to strikeout all three GT batters on March 24 in the bottom of the second.
- In the sixth week of action, Cagle came forward with her injury report in her own words speaking about the shoulder surgery she had following the 2022 season. The full video can be watched at [clemsonsoftball.com](https://www.clemsonsoftball.com).

- The redshirt junior continued to rake in the honors in 2023 being named the Louisville Slugger/NFCA Player of the Week, D1Softball Player of the Week and ACC Co-Player of the Week after her week seven performance against Georgia Tech.
- Cagle was named ACC Pitcher and Co-Player of the Week after the second week of action where she batted .529 with one double and four home runs and maintained a 1.65 ERA with three victories and a save while striking out 23 batters. She earned her second ACC Pitcher of the week honor after earning three wins against Charlotte and Virginia. She notched her third weekly pitcher honor after picking up three wins in the circle against South Carolina and Boston College. Her latest ACC weekly honor came after she tallied six hits including one double and four homers, 10 RBIs, scored six runs and had a 1.727 slugging percentage. She has six total ACC weekly honors this season (three pitcher, three co-player)
- After opening weekend, Cagle earned her first Top Performances by the NFCA of the season. She has been selected five times this season.
- During week 10, Cagle picked up the victory against South Carolina in the circle pitching 1.2 innings and hit a three-run go-ahead homer to seal the Palmetto Series, and tallied her 18th home run of the season with a homer at NC State to set a single-season record.
- On her career, she has 229 hits, 178 RBI, 149 runs and a .386 average. In the circle she holds a 1.51 ERA through 636 innings with 707 strikeouts, 76 wins and 25 solo shutouts.

CAGLE HOME RUNS/VICTORIES

- In her career, Valerie Cagle has earned 76 pitching victories and hit 58 home runs at Clemson. She has accomplished both 27 times in the same game.
- When she hits a home run and has the pitching decision, the Tigers are 27-4 (she has suffered only one loss each season).
- In 2023, she accomplished the feat four times in eight days (March 24-31)

PITCHING PROWESS

- Junior Millie Thompson has added the perfect 1-2 punch dynamic with Cagle to Clemson's pitching staff.
- The lefty was a Third Team All-ACC selection in 2022 after making the All-Freshman team in 2021.
- She threw two no-hitters in 2022, her first coming against Furman (April 6) in five-innings and her second against UNCW (May 20) in the Clemson Regional. The Bedford, Va., native finished the Clemson Regional with a five-inning shutout against Louisiana (May 22) with five strikeouts, one hit and one walk.
- This season, Thompson holds a 1.68 ERA with 13 wins and five solo shutouts throwing 83.1 innings with 68 strikeouts.
- On her career, she holds a 1.74 ERA through 64 appearances and 281.1 IP. She has struck out 248 batters and clocked 37 victories.
- Joining Cagle and Thompson have been junior Regan

Spencer and sophomore Brooke McCubbin.

- Spencer has made 16 appearances (30.1 innings) with one solo shutout and 18 strikeouts while maintaining a 1.62 ERA with five wins and one save this season.
- McCubbin has appeared in 17 games (62.1 innings) and struck out 32 batters, including a career-high eight in the third week of action against Michigan State. She holds a 1.12 ERA with five victories.
- During week nine against Furman, McCubbin was one out away from throwing her first career no-hitter after going 6.2 innings before giving up a hit.

TOP TRANSFERS

- Clemson added three transfers to the roster during the offseason in Reedy Davenport, Caroline Jacobsen and Ally Miklesh.
- Each one has added a missing piece to the Tiger lineup, and been a positive addition to the Clemson defense.
- Davenport has taken ownership of the hot corner making multiple quick reaction plays after being the 2021 ASUN Defensive Player of the Year and ASUN First Team honors to the Clemson to sure up the defense.
- Offensively this season, she holds a .294 average with 37 hits, 30 RBIs, 13 runs and a .460 slg. percentage. She has tallied 31 putouts with 100 assists on the year.
- Jacobsen, a Duke transfer, joined the Tigers and filled the vacant right field spot tallying 53 putouts and four assists this season.
- She adds power to the lineup maintaining a .312 average with 48 hits, including 12 doubles and 11 home runs for a .604 slg. percentage, with 41 RBIs and 35 runs. She has also added some speed to the lineup with seven stolen bases.
- Jacobsen was recently the 20th overall selection of the 2023 WPF Draft after being drafted by USSSA Pride.
- Rounding out the transfer squad has been Ally Miklesh from Wisconsin. She joined the Tiger lineup as the starting left fielder tallying 43 putouts, joining Jacobsen and McKenzie Clark as three of the strongest outfielders in the country.
- Offensively, Miklesh holds a .339 average with 41 hits, 38 runs and 12 RBIs with a .474 on-base percentage and .421 slg. percentage. Her speed is an added bonus, as she has stolen 18 bases.
- Miklesh propelled the Tigers to an opening round victory against North Carolina at the ACC Tournament clocking an RBI and scoring the walk-off run on a passed ball.

EXPERIENCED LINEUP

- There is no question that Clemson amped up the lineup for the 2023 season after adding the three transfers, but the returners have loaded themselves with the right tools to take the next step both offensively and defensively.
- McKenzie "Pie" Clark has been Clemson's starting centerfielder since stepping onto campus in the fall of 2020. She has tallied 150 putouts with 14 assists and constantly shows opponents that they shouldn't test her arm from center throwing out multiple runners looking for extra bases or attempting to score.
- At the plate in 2023, Clark is batting .342 at the top of the lineup with 54 hits, including 11 doubles, one triple and 11 home runs, with 50 runs scored and 35 RBIs. She holds a .633 slg. percentage with 10 stolen bases.
- Joining Clark as a key returner is shortstop Alia Logoleo. Logoleo has played multiple positions (outfield and third base) before finding her home in the middle infield. She has clocked 174 putouts with 290 assists during her career.

NOTES

- In 2023, Logoleo has a .287 average. She has 43 hits, 46 RBIs, 29 runs scored and a .500 slg. percentage while also stealing 10 bases.

SUPER SOPHOMORES

- Sophomores Maddie Moore and Aby Vieira have stepped up to the plate and taken the experience from the 2022 season to set the team up for success in 2023.
- Moore has taken over for former Tiger Cammy Pereira at second base and made it her own. In her new role, she has already tallied 73 putouts and 88 assists compared to 46 putouts and 94 assists in 2022.
- At the plate, Moore has shifted around the lineup, and is batting .268 with 41 hits, 31 RBIs and 45 runs scored. She has a .503 slg. percentage, .401 on-base percentage with 14 stolen bases. She also hit Clemson's first grand slam of 2023 against Pitt.
- Vieira is back behind the plate as one of two primary catchers for the Tigers. She has clocked 178 putouts, 20 assists and caught seven batters stealing.
- Offensively, Vieira is batting .326 with 28 hits, 17 RBIs and 11 runs scored. She has hit three home runs with five doubles for a .488 slg. percentage, while drawing eight walks for a .392 on-base percentage.
- Vieira sustained a left forearm injury during the South Carolina game (April 11) and has not returned to the lineup.

NEED FOR SPEED

- The Tigers have been dynamic on the base paths in 2023 clocking 96 stolen bases through 54 games to average 1.78 per game.
- Pinch runner Julia Bomhardt leads the team this season with 19 stolen bases followed closely by Ally Miklesh stealing 18.
- In total, 11 Tigers have stolen at least one base this season (Cagle, Hyatt, Oda, Davenport, Clark, Jacobsen, Logoleo, Moore and Houston).
- During week three against UIC, the Tigers finished with seven stolen bases led by Clark (3), while Miklesh (2), Bomhardt (1) and Moore (1) rounded out the group - this tied a program record set earlier in the season against Ohio State where six Tigers stole a base.
- Against UIC, Clark's three stolen bases tied her personal and the individual record for most stolen bases in a single game that was set by Sam Russ (2022) and Clark (2021).

FIRST 200

- Clemson softball is rapidly approaching the 200th game in program history - being only eight games away.
- The softball program has placed itself in a position to have the best record through the first 200 games amongst Clemson sports (see chart below). The Tigers already paced themselves to tie with women's tennis for the most wins through 100 games (78 wins, 22 losses - .780 percentage).
- Clemson hit its 100th win in program history in 130 games - this is the second fastest program to reach the 100 win mark after women's tennis did it in 128 matches.

McWHORTER MADNESS

- Clemson fans continue to showcase why they are the best fans in the country.
- Through 27 home events (the Gardner-Webb double-header counts as one event), Clemson welcomed 51,056 fans into the stadium to average roughly 1,890 fans per game (previous attendance record was 1,616).
- Prior to the 2023 season, Clemson sold out of season tickets for the second consecutive year after previously selling out in 2022 (season tickets were not sold in 2021 due to COVID).

ACC & NCAA RANKINGS

- As a team, the Tigers sit at the top of multiple stat categories in both the ACC and NCAA.
- In the ACC alone, Clemson holds the top spot in five categories, the second spot in seven categories and the third spot in five. The only area Clemson isn't in the top four is triples per game.

900 CAREER VICTORIES

- Head coach John Rittman reached the 900-win mark in the 2023 regular-season finale at Virginia Tech - this also was Clemson's 150th victory as a program.
- He is paced himself to be the 44th head coach to reach the 900 win milestone in NCAA Division I history.
- Rittman has been a head coach for 22 seasons, starting in 1996-97 at Stanford, where he spent 18 season and tallied a 750-351-3 overall record.
- Rittman reached the 800th win milestone on April 17, 2021 with a 4-3 extra-inning victory against Boston College

THE FIRST FIVE, THE NEXT FIVE

- Clemson softball was announced in March 2017 with the hiring of head coach John Rittman on Nov. 3, 2017.
- On June 21, 2022, Coach Rittman and Clemson reached a new five-year contract agreement keeping him at Clemson through the 2027 season.
- On Nov. 3, 2022, Coach Rittman celebrated five years at the helm of the softball program and looks ahead at what the next five years has in store for it.

HEAD COACH JOHN RITTMAN



John Rittman, a longtime head coach and member of the USA Softball Women's National Team coaching pool, was named the first Head Coach of Clemson Softball on Nov. 3, 2017. Rittman came to Clemson after serving as the Associate Head Coach at the University of Kansas from 2015-17. Rittman joined the Jayhawks after 18 seasons as the Head Coach at Stanford University and 10 years on the United States National Team coaching staff (2001-08, 2016-18).

In the third year of the Clemson program, Rittman continued to guide Clemson to new heights by making the program's first Super Regional appearance after earning the program's first national seed and hosting a Regional. Early in the season, the Tigers upset then-No. 6 Washington, 2-0, at the St. Pete/Clearwater Elite Invitational for the program's first top-10 win. Clemson followed that by playing its 100th game in program history against Illinois on March 13. The Tigers won with a 4-0 victory to tie Clemson women's tennis for the most wins through a program's first 100 games with a 78-22 record. With that record, Rittman solidified himself as the winningest coach among active head coaches at Clemson surpassing Dabo Swinney (football), who held a 74-26 record. The Tigers continued to reach new levels by winning their 100th game in only 130 games on May 1 with a 3-2 win against Georgia Tech on Senior Day to become the second-fastest program at Clemson to reach 100 wins trailing only women's tennis (128). The Tigers were ACC Tournament Runner-Ups. The upset win over Virginia Tech marks Clemson softball's highest victory over a ranked opponent in program history. The hot streak continued for Clemson entering postseason as the Tigers earned the No. 10 national seed for the NCAA softball tournament. The No. 10 Tigers welcomed No. 17 Auburn, Louisiana and UNCW for the Clemson Regional and made a clean sweep in three games by shutting out all three programs and run-ruling UNCW and Louisiana to advance to the Stillwater Super Regional. Clemson finished the year with five All-ACC team selections, and Valerie Cagle was named an NFCA First Team All-American, the second NFCA All-America honor of her career. Behind Rittman's efforts, Clemson climbed as high as No. 14 in the NFCA national rankings and earned its first single digit ranking from ESPN/USA Softball rankings coming in at No. 9 for two weeks. Off the field, graduate Sam Russ was named to CoSIDA's Academic All-America Third Team to become softball's first Academic All-American.

During the second season and first complete year, Rittman propelled Clemson to even higher heights by becoming the ACC Regular Season Champions after posting a 29-5 ACC record and winning seven ACC series, including six series sweeps. The Tigers were ACC Tournament Runner-Ups. The Tigers finished the season with a 44-8 record and the sixth-best WL Percentage in the NCAA (.846). Rittman was named ACC Coach of the Year and guided Cagle to being the first softball player in league history to be named both the ACC Freshman and Player of the Year in the same season. Clemson finished with six individuals earning nine All-ACC team selections following the regular season, including three on the first team. Cagle and freshman McKenzie Clark were

named to the NFCA All-Region team. The honors continued to roll in for Cagle as she became the first Clemson softball All-American garnering second team honors from the NFCA, was a JWOS First Team All-American, a Top-Three Finalist for the NFCA's National Freshman of the Year and a Top-10 Finalist for USA Softball's Collegiate Player of the Year. Behind Rittman's efforts, Clemson climbed as high as No. 13 in the NFCA national rankings and No. 10 in the ESPN/USA Softball rankings before finishing the season at No. 18 in the NFCA poll. Rittman led the Tigers to their first postseason appearance traveling to the Tuscaloosa Regional to defeat Troy twice, including a five-inning run-rule victory in the opening game that capped off a historic second season.

In its inaugural season, Rittman transcended Clemson into a nationally-respected program. Rittman guided Clemson, which was predicted to finish in 10th in the conference, according to the 2020 ACC preseason poll, to a 19-8 overall record, including 5-1 in ACC play. The Tigers, who won both of their ACC series against Virginia and Pitt, won 11 of their final 12 games before the 2020 season was cut short due to the coronavirus pandemic (COVID-19). Additionally, Clemson went 14-2 at Clemson Softball Stadium (now McWhorter Stadium), which included a 13-game home win streak that spanned 25 days. Rittman and the Tigers generated plenty of enthusiasm among the Clemson faithful as the first-year program ranked fourth nationally in attendance (24,860) and fifth in average attendance (1,544/game) in 2020.

At Stanford, Rittman and the Cardinals recorded 18-consecutive winning seasons, made 16-straight NCAA appearances, notched 13 40-win seasons and produced at least one All-American in 15 of his last 17 seasons. As head coach, Rittman accumulated a 750-351-3 overall mark, coached a national player of the year, 16 All-Americans, earned five Super Regional appearances, two Women's College World Series appearances and maintained a spot in every regular-season NFCA top-25 poll for more than a decade.

Rittman served on the staff of the USA Softball team which won gold at both the 2016 Women's Softball World Championship and the 2017 Pan Am Qualifier. He also worked with Team USA from 2001-08, coaching the 2004 Olympic gold medal winners in Athens and the 2008 silver medalists in Beijing. Team USA also won gold medals at the 2002 and 2006 World Championship and the 2003 and 2007 Pan Am Games.

Rittman graduated from New Mexico State with a degree in journalism in 1986. He was a three-year letterwinner in baseball as an outfielder at NMSU after transferring from Yavapai Junior College in Prescott, Arizona.

Rittman and his wife, Lorie, a former softball player at the University of Oklahoma, are the parents of Justin, a UCLA graduate and former fullback for the Bruins, and Jake, a Notre Dame graduate and former punter for the Fighting Irish.

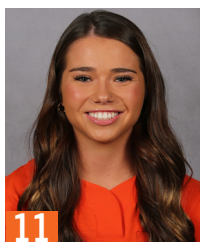

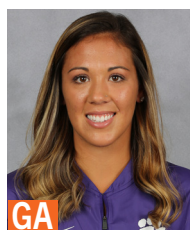
