Need to Know

Clemson Tigers defeated Utah Valley to secure first road win of 2023

• After competing against them for the first time in program history, the Clemson Tigers took down Utah Valley at home to establish a series record of 1-0 against the Wolverines. Both teams played well defensively as the score was 0-0 after the first half. However, the Tigers were able to create two scoring opportunities in the second half to end the match 2-0.

Freshman Spotlight: Dani Davis and Jenna Tobia

• Against Utah Valley, the new Tigers shined as the two lone goals came from freshman's Dani Davis and Jenna Tobia. Dani Davis, who scored her first collegiate goal, opened up the second half with a rocket of a shot to give the Tigers the 1-0 lead. Then, in the final five minutes of the match, star-forward Jenna Tobia forced a one-on-one opportunity against the Wolverines keeper and was able to find the back of the net to secure the 2-0 victory against Utah Valley.

Starting goalkeeper, Halle Mackiewicz, finishes three games with three clean sheets

• Wearing the gloves for the Tigers so far this season is star-keeper, Halle Mackiewicz, who has tallied up three clean sheets in the first three games of the 2023 campaign. Mackiewicz currently has a save percentage of 1.000 as she is one of 39 players in the NCAA to hold this percentage. The senior has recored six saves so far this season and has tallied up 92 total saves in her Tiger career.

Tigers are set to play Utah in the Utes 2023 season home opener

• Looking ahead, the Clemson Tigers are set to face-off against the Utah Utes in the final game of the road trip to the West Coast. This match will mark the season home opener for the Utes as the Tigers will look to hand them their first loss at home on the Ute Soccer Field. Both the Tigers and the Utes are coming off of road wins as they both hold the same record (2-0-1). The match is set to air on the PAC-12 network with kickoff scheduled for 12pm MT/2pm ET.

PREVIOUS GAME RECAP

OREM, Utah - Freshman Dani Davis scored her first-collegiate goal, and freshman Jenna Tobia netted her second of the season to propel the No. 19 ranked Clemson Women's Soccer team to a 2-0 victory against the Utah Valley Wolverines in Orem, Utah on Thursday evening. The Tigers applied pressure early and the Clemson defense kept Utah Valley on edge to allow senior Halle Mackiewicz to finish with four saves for her third clean sheet of the season.

"From a work ethic perspective, we are pleased with what we have done. Scored two goals, Halle as our goalkeeper, made a couple great saves and keeps a clean sheet. Anytime you get a win, we are going to celebrate so we are going to celebrate this tonight," Head Coach Eddie Radwanski said.

The Tigers were the first team to get anything going on the offensive side of the field finding an opening in the 24th minute of action. Senior Makenna Morris fielded a give-and-go pass just outside the penalty box and fired a shot to the lower left corner of the goal that required Utah Valley's keeper to make a diving glove save to keep things even.

Clemson made another push in the 36th minute after junior Renee Lyles got her head on the third corner kick the Tigers were awarded in the half, but the shot went wide left. Despite things being tied, 0-0, entering halftime, Clemson had outshot Utah Valley, 4-1, and taken four corner kicks compared to the Wolverines not having any.

Clemson's offense came out firing in the second half needing only three minutes to take the lead. Davis got her left foot on the ball to send a rocket into the lower left corner of the net to put Clemson on the board after a cross from Hal Hershfelt opened up the middle of the 18-yard box for a one-touch goal from Davis. The Wolverines made three-consecutive attempts to tie things with three shots on goal within a five minute span, but Mackiewicz made three saves, including diving saves in the 55th and 56th minute of play.

"I don't think anyone can score a goal without the support of your teammates on and off the field so to be able to celebrate here in Utah with them, there is nothing better than that," Davis said.

Mackiewicz read another shot attempt by the Wolverines perfectly in the 78th minute to tally her fourth save of the match. With less than 10 minutes left in the match, Jenna Tobia got the next best look for the Tigers with a shot to the top right, but Utah Valley's keeper got her hands on it before it could find the back of the net. Back-to-back shots from Emily Brough and Tatum Short wound up blocked and off-target, respectively, as the Tigers maintained the 1-0 advantage.

The Tigers struck again in the final four minutes of play after the Wolverines had a poor clear attempt on their defensive half. Tobia picked up the ball just past midfield and dribbled around three defenders to force a one-on-one opportunity with UVU's keeper inside the 18-yard box. Her left-foot touch defeated the keeper to make it 2-0 and seal the victory.

Clemson returns to action on Sunday, Aug. 27 facing Utah in Salt Lake City, Utah at 2 p.m. ET.



2023 SEASON PREVIEW



CLEMSON, S.C. – As the 2023 roster blends together a group of nationally regarded returners, highly skilled reserves and some talented new faces, a new era will begin for Clemson Women's Soccer. Coming off a successful preseason run, these Tigers are ready to prove themselves at the national level.

“Our group is very much looking forward to the 2023 fall season. We have been working for this moment ever since the start of the spring semester of last year,” Head Coach Eddie Radwanski said. “Our group is dialed in, intense and looking forward to getting after it and competing in the ACC and NCAA. I think we have a little bit of something to prove this year, a little bit of a chip on our shoulder and I think we just need to continue our theme of ‘were just going to worry about us, were going to be the best version of us we can be and we will trust that our results will carry themselves.’”

Ranked No. 25 in the nation, the Tigers bring back a unique force of returners with Hal Hershfelt, Megan Bornkamp and Caroline Conti leading this team in the orange and purple. Both Bornkamp and Hershfelt were named to the Preseason All-ACC Team and were named players to watch by the United Soccer Coaches. Conti led the team in points in the 2022 season as she tallied 13 total points with five assists and four goals on the year.

“I’m excited to be back playing with the team I love and to play another season at Riggs. The atmosphere we have at home games is unreal,” Hershfelt said. “We have a lot of goals this season, and it being my last year it really is all or nothing. We have to do all we can to leave our mark.”

The Tigers wrapped up the 2022 season with an 8-5-5 overall record and a 4-3-3 record in conference play. For the ninth-straight season, the Tigers continued their run in the postseason as they earned a No. 5 seed and a bid to the NCAA tournament where they took on Vanderbilt in the first round to end the season.

Wearing the gloves for the Tigers this season will be Halle Mackiewicz, who was a key component for this team in the 2022 campaign. Mackiewicz started all 18 matches last season and ended the campaign with 59 saves and .759 save percentage.

Also returning to the roster for Clemson is senior Makenna Morris and junior Renee Lyles. Both players were in the top three for total points at the end of the 2022 season as they followed Conti with 11 (Lyles) and 10 (Morris) points.

Putting on the Tiger threads for the first time this season is Jenna Tobia, Tatum Short, Eleanor Hays and Dani Lynch. Tobia and Short impressed all with their preseason performances and will look to continue that success in their freshman campaigns.

The coaching staff of 13 seasons is made up of Head Coach, Eddie Radwanski who will look to lead this team to the top. Radwanski is supported by Associate Head Coach Jeff Robbins and Assistant Coach Siri Mullinix. The trio also added Allison Wetherington to their staff as she takes on the role of an assistant coach and will add a professional perspective with her experience in the NWSL as a guiding light.
