# WHAT TO WATCH FOR

# **SERIES HISTORY**

As an homage to legendary NFL broadcaster and noted master of understatement Ray Scott, former Dallas Stars broadcaster Ralph Strangis used to often go to commercial breaks by proclaiming in scoreless games, "The score?...There is no score."

The series history of Clemson and Charleston Southern? There is no series history of Clemson and Charleston Southern.

Those wishing to gain insight into the full series history of contests between these two programs are able to witness it in person today, as the contest represents the schools' first all-time meeting.

# **HOME OPENERS**

Even though 2023 represents the 128th season of Tiger football, Clemson has had just 122 home openers in its history as a function of the five seasons in which Clemson did not play a game at home. In 122 home openers, the Tigers have a 97-17-8 record against 38 different opponents.

Clemson is 34-2 in home openers since 1987, with its only losses in Death Valley debuts in that span

coming in 1999 and 2003. The Tigers have won 19 straight home openers, with the last loss coming in Dabo Swinney's first year as an assistant coach, a 30-0 loss to Georgia in 2003.

## **NON-CONFERENCE PLAY AT HOME**

Clemson has been right at home in non-conference contests at Memorial Stadium during recent years, compiling victories in 26 of its last 27 non-conference home games. The Tigers had won 26 consecutive non-conference home games until a one-point loss to South Carolina in November.

Previously, Clemson's longest unbeaten streak (including ties) in non-conference home games was a 20-game unbeaten streak from 1978-84 that saw ties against Boston College and Georgia interrupt winning streaks of 12 games, four games and two games.

# TODAY'S HONOREES

# **BLOCK C HONORARY CAPTAINS**

Kendall Joseph earned All-ACC honors twice during his Tiger career. He had 124 tackles on Clemson's 2016 national championship team and 84 tackles on the 2018 national championship squad, our five-year anniversary team. He is the only linebacker in Tiger history to start on two national championship teams.

Ken Pengitore was a two-year starter at quarterback for Clemson, including our 50-year anniversary team of 1973. He led the ACC in passing efficiency, yards per attempt and completion percentage. He was also 10th in rushing in 1973, when he was named the First-Team All-ACC quarterback.

Spencer Shuey was a Third-Team All-ACC line-backer in 2013, our 10-year anniversary team. He had 119 tackles, second most on that team, and had four recovered fumbles, second most in the nation. One of those recoveries came in the fourth quarter against Ohio State in the Orange Bowl, a game in which he had a career-high 18 tackles.

# **PROFESSOR-OF-THE-GAME**

Michelle Boettcher, Ph.D., is an associate professor in the Department of Educational & Organizational Leadership Development. Boettcher is celebrating her 10th year at Clemson as a passionate educator. She is a leader and mentor for junior

faculty and students across her department. Her teaching, advising, research and service activities reflect the prominent role she plays at Clemson University and in her field.

# STAFF MEMBER-OF-THE-GAME

Susan McCall is the executive assistant to the dean, College of Arts & Humanities. "Susan puts in 200 percent every day and is the engine that runs the College," said Dean Nicholas Vazsonyi, Ph.D. Unfortunately, McCall could not be at today's game, but we thank her today and every day for her support of Clemson University.

# STUDENT-OF-THE-GAME

Sheldon Johnson, an architecture major, is an exceptional student dedicated to his studies and service to his peers. He is the most visible student leader who works to benefit underserved populations in the School of Architecture. Johnson has served as a leader for the Clemson National Organization of Minority Architects (cNOMAS). His leadership, advocacy and commitment were highlighted during the planning of the cNOMAS conference that was held in Charleston in 2022.

# FOOTBALL REUNION DAY LAND GRANT DAY

Every year, Clemson welcomes back members of our 50, 25, 10 and five-year anniversary football teams. This year, we are welcoming back teams from the 1973, 1998, 2013 and 2018 seasons. For more on each of the teams, see pages 120 and 121.

Today's game marks the third-annual Land Grant Day. This national system was created by the U.S. Congress to improve the quality of life for citizens in every state through teaching, research and extension.

The initiatives were defined and outlined in the Morrill Acts (1862, 1890), which permitted states to grant universities land. The act set focus for teaching on four main areas...agriculture, science, military science and engineering.

From Clemson's mission statement, "Nurtured by an abiding land-grant commitment, Clemson has emerged as a research university with a global vision. Our primary purpose is educating undergraduate and graduate students to think deeply about and engage in the social, scientific, economic and professional challenges of our times. The foundation of this mission is the generation, preservation, communication and application of knowledge."

Today's game recognizes and celebrates the mission Clemson University works so hard to support. It has helped to create a healthy, vibrant economy in the state and contribute to this mission globally.

Since joining the ACC as a charter member in 1953, Clemson is 128-33-4 at home against opponents from other conferences. That includes a 36-4 mark in nonconference games at Death Valley under Head Coach Dabo Swinney.

# **CLEMSON VS. NEW OPPONENTS**

Charleston Southern is the 108th different opponent faced by Clemson all-time. The Tigers hold a 65-38-4 all-time record when facing an opponent for the first time.

Clemson has won 16 of its last 17 games when making its all-time debut against a new opponent, dating to 2003. The team's lone debut loss in that time frame came against South Florida in the 2010 Meineke Car Care Bowl in Charlotte, N.C., the last game before Clemson embarked upon its active streak of 12 consecutive 10-win seasons.

# **COMMITMENT TO IN-STATE PROGRAMS**

Under Head Coach Dabo Swinney, Clemson has typically adhered to a non-conference scheduling philosophy that features two Power Five Conference opponents (rival South Carolina and one additional Power Five Conference squad, typically either Notre Dame or a team from the SEC), one Group of Five Conference opponent and one FCS opponent from the state of South Carolina.

The commitment to football in the state of South Carolina at all levels has resulted in the Tigers hosting a Palmetto State FCS team every year since 2007, with Clemson welcoming Furman, The Citadel, South Carolina State, Presbyterian, Wofford and Coastal Carolina (which has since made the transition to FBS) to Memorial Stadium during that span. The Tigers add Charleston Southern to that group today.



# **UNDEFEATED VS. FCS TEAMS**

Entering today's contest, Clemson is 37-0 against FCS teams since the NCAA formed the division prior to the 1978 season (Southern Conference schools became I-AA in 1982).

Clemson has outscored FCS teams by a combined margin of 1,555-254, an average victory margin of

35.2 points per game. The Tigers have won 36 of the 37 games by double digits, including each of the last 11 contests by 23+ points.



# **HEAD COACH CONNECTION**

Today's game is a reunion of sorts, as Charleston Southern Head Coach Gabe Giardina served as a placekicker and holder on the 2000 Alabama squad for which Clemson Head Coach Dabo Swinney served as wide receivers coach.

The game is the second in the 2023 season in which the Tigers are facing an opposing head coach for the first time, a list that includes Giardina, Duke's Mike Elko, Florida Atlantic's Tom Herman and Georgia Tech's Brent Kev.





Roberts Sets School Record,

Finishes Fifth at Nationals

n January, cornerback Sheridan Jones announced that he would return for one more year with Clemson football to finish up some unresolved business.

Jones' success on the field goes back to his high school career playing under Dyrri McCain at Maury High School. Throughout his four years, he collected an extensive list of achievements.

Jones was rated among the top-100 players in the nation by ESPN and Rivals, and he was the second-best player in the state of Virginia. His high school success landed him a selection to the World Bowl in Mexico and the Under Armour All-American Game.


"High school football was great. I got great coaching...Coach McCain was with me from my freshman to senior year. I got a lot of reps with a lot of good people, and it gave me a lot of experience."

After his success in high school, Jones' decision to take the next step at Clemson came easy to him.

"When they say something is different in these hills, it is very true. When I came on my visit, I felt something different in the air. The coaches and the team were so welcoming at all my visits, and it felt like I was on the team before I got here. Them being so open to me was a great opportunity."

Jones has genuinely taken advantage of his time at Clemson the past four years, both on and off the field. He is a three-time ACC Academic Honor Roll member and earned a communication degree in August 2022. At the same time, he has shown success in football, as he entered 2023 with 83 tackles, nine pass breakups, two interceptions and a recovered fumble in 1,376 snaps over 48 games (21 starts).

While Jones has already accomplished so much at Clemson, he knew there was more left for him if he returned for his last season.



"It is another year of maximizing myself. I did not want to leave Clemson with a little bit left in the tank. I wanted to get to my full potential. The guys who I came in with, Ruke Orhorhoro, Jalyn Phillips and Tyler Davis, and many other players in that class of 2019 are still here working towards that final goal of a national championship. Every class since 2013 has won a national championship, so as a member of the class of 2019, we are working towards that."

With big goals ahead for this season, being a veteran player has also allowed Jones to take on a leadership role among his teammates

"I have a lot of guys looking up to me. We have three younger cornerbacks that look to me for knowledge and wisdom to lead them in the right direction on and off the field. I want to smell the roses all along the way and be the best I can."

Jones credits his success as both an athlete and a person to his family. His brother, Kennedy, is a fellow student-athlete who played baseball at UNC Greensboro before transferring to South Carolina during the summer.

"My family means everything to me. I come from a small, tight family. I lost my father at the age of two, so it has just been me, my mom and my brothers, and they mean everything to me. My mom comes to every home game and almost every away game. She moved closer to me and my brother, so it is good that my family is always around whenever I need them"

In addition to having a support system within his family, Jones also thrives from the relationships he has built with two of his teammates.

"Jalyn Phillips and Ruke Orhorhoro are my roommates...they are my guys.


We talk about everything together. When one of us is down, we pick each other up. We feed off each other every day."

Along with his roommates, he has found a home from everyone involved in the program.

"The Clemson Family means a lot to me. Coach (Mike) Reed is like a father figure out here. There is so much wisdom and love going around the football facility. There is never a dull moment on this team."

As for his next steps, Jones has some big things ahead as he finishes his time as a Tiger.

"After Clemson, I plan to go to the league and do my due diligence there. I am a man who likes to do a lot of everything, so I might drop an R&B album, I might become a professional bowler, you might see me in a movie or a TV series... so a lot of motion."



f you asked Hunter Helms about his time as a Clemson Tiger, he would give you a smile and say that overall, he has had a great college experience. A recent graduate as of this past May with a degree in construction science & management, Helms has also tacked on two ACC Championship Game victories during his time with the program. Stating that he could not ask for more than graduating and winning a championship, Helms is expectant for this upcoming season.

A West Columbia, S.C. native, Helms grew up playing both baseball and football. An attendee of Gray Collegiate Academy, Helms originally favored baseball through his freshman year of high school. However, the starting quarterback spot was up for grabs entering his sophomore season, and he knew he had a shot at it.

"I was in competition for the starting quarterback role going into my sophomore year, and I really took that to heart and realized that is what I wanted to be. I started meeting regularly with Coach (Brett) Bethune to watch film, and we would be in there at 6 a.m. watching film and looking over plays."

The aforementioned coach is an assistant at Gray Collegiate Academy and someone who Helms credits as a mentor while he learned to play the quarterback position. With guidance from Bethune, Helms ultimately went on to win the starting job.

"Truly learning how to compete and earn something was a great experience. I still have that work ethic to this day. I eventually won the starting job and went on to have a pretty solid high school career."

Helms' 4,000+ yards and 48 touchdowns as a senior led to offers from various Division I schools, including South Florida and Troy. While he did not receive a scholarship offer from Clemson, he nevertheless decided to walk on and do his best to earn a spot on the team.





"Clemson was always my dream school. I grew up going to Clemson games and loved it. I was blessed to receive a few offers from other great schools and I visited them, but I realized I didn't want to have that regret of wishing I went to Clemson and at least try to earn a soot on the team.

"I knew with my work ethic at the time, I could possibly earn a scholarship, so I really wanted to go in and give it a shot at this level. Living with no regrets was a main driving factor in the decision to come to Clemson."

While only seeing playing time in five games during his first three years with the program, Helms has enjoyed getting to know and learning from the recent starting quarterbacks, Trevor Lawrence and DJ Uiagalelei.

"Being with Trevor for that one season (2020) helped me learn a lot. I remember following him to the quarterback room when he would go in to watch film so I could ask questions and pick his brain. He was a great mentor to me. DJ is one of my best friends to this day, and I also learned a lot from him."

When asked about some memorable experiences while being on the team, Helms chuckled as he recounted a few.

"In my freshman year, I was on the scout team. Not many people know this, but I was playing wide receiver at the time. I took full advantage of that and made sure to always tape up and wear gloves. One time I made a catch and must have gotten in the way of Baylon Spector, because he rocked me. I learned not to do that again."

On a more serious note, Helms recalled the 2020 Georgia Tech game as being a defining moment for his time wearing a Tiger uniform. His two touchdowns in that game cemented his place in the Clemson annals as one of three walk-ons with a passing touchdown since 1954, and the only original walk-on to throw two touchdowns in a game while still on walk-on status.

"That Georgia Tech game will always be a surreal moment for me and my family. Since I grew up a Clemson fan, it was really cool to be able to produce on the field for the Tigers."

Along with being a student-athlete, Helms is also a P.A.W. Journey ambassador. Clemson's P.A.W. Journey is a leadership initiative designed to develop football student-athletes through holistic maturity in multiple facets of life. The acronym stands for "Passionate About Winning."

"I knew coming into Clemson that I wanted to be P.A.W. Journey ambassador. It really pushed me to get better at things I've been uncomfortable with in the past, such as public speaking. It has also developed me from a leadership standpoint and has helped me with life in general."

Helms graduated in May and is currently in the process of earning his MBA, but he is unsure of whether it will take him one or two years to complete the degree program. He is also considering using his COVID eligibility year to stay an extra year and pursue an additional master's degree in athletic leadership.

"Long term, I'm going to ride this football thing out as long as I can and see where it takes me. The NFL is obviously the dream, but I have a major in construction science & management, and owning my own construction company one day wouldn't be too bad of a deal. Coaching is up there too, but I also have some time to think about it. I wouldn't say I'm in any rush right now."

Helms is looking forward to the remainder of the season as he hopes to contribute to the team in any way he can. While his goal is always to maximize his learning, he also possesses the leadership qualities, gained through being both an upperclassman and through P.A.W. Journey, necessary to guide his younger teammates and fellow quarterbacks as they progress through their football careers in Tigertown.





rom a very young age, Hamp Greene's parents always emphasized the importance of discipline, accountability and work ethic. As a man of faith, these are values that he carries with himself every day, whether it be on or off the football field.

These values have made him the man he is today, so when Dabo Swinney awarded him a scholarship for his senior year, it meant the world to him.

"It left me speechless. When I heard the news, it felt like I watched all the hard work through the years go through my head. It is amazing to be recognized for your hard work, and I am grateful."

Swinney had nothing but praise for Greene, noting that he is among the most respected players on the team.

"He is a guy who is incredibly well respected and one of the best leaders on the team. You can ask anyone on the team. The players wanted to see

him rewarded for his efforts. I'm really happy for him. He's a great student with an incredible attitude and great spirit."

Originally from the Birmingham, Ala. area. he first visited Clemson as a sophomore at Mountain Brook High School, Even before arriving on campus, he knew the impact Clemson could have on him as a player, but he was genuinely amazed by how much more it had to offer.

"What I did not realize was the offthe-field development that takes place here. It's amazing how Coach Swinney incorporates the gospel into the program. As a man of faith, that really drew me to Clemson. Obviously, I knew I would grow my skills to become the best football player I could be, but even more important to me was becoming the best man I could be."

Greene was able to get his feet wet during his redshirt season in 2019. He believes that being around the 2019 squad that made a run to the national championship game was one of the best experiences he has had at Clemson. A big reason for that was the team chemistry, and he believes this year's team has a lot of similarities.

"What I feel now with this team is the same chemistry, love and unity that the 2019 team had."

Greene has become one of the 2023 team's essential leaders. While the 2019 group showed him the importance of leadership, his microinternship experience with First Rate in England last spring helped reinforce that this value goes beyond football alone.

"I learned a lot of great things about finance and culture in general. A lot of companies can rise and fall based on leadership and culture, and that's something that can be applied anywhere, whether it be business or football."

As a senior, Greene has allowed himself to reflect on his time in Tigertown. In just a few years, it has become a very special place to him for various reasons.

"Some of the things I love most are the little things...the conversations that go on in "Paw Bistro" while we are eating and developing relationships. There are a lot of great people at Clemson. Embracing Clemson as a whole and all that it offers has made me enjoy it the most."

When asked if there is anything he would tell a freshman version of himself, his message was a simple one that can serve as valuable advice to any player.

"Trust the process and have patience...know that all things work together for the good of those who love God... play, live, act and lead all without fear."


Greene holds high expectations for himself and the team for this season. Personally, his goal is to "empty the tank" and give his all for the 2023 team.



very player has a story. Some stories are more unique than others...different backgrounds, different paths, different obstacles.

Enter Davian Sullivan, a senior wide receiver who has had quite the journey on his way onto the Tiger roster.

Sullivan, a Woodruff, S.C. native, tried out for the team as a walk-on twice

before making the team on his third attempt as a junior.

"I knew I loved the game, but I didn't know how much I loved it until it was taken away from me. Watching everyone else pursue their dreams, I was like, 'Why not me?' so I went out there and

worked my tail off. I kept going at it, and I knew my time would come."

After receiving the long-awaited call, Sullivan knew that all of his hard work and dedication had paid off.

"Finally! I had worked for two-plus years. I tried out twice and got told 'no' both times. But the third time's the charm. I finally got the phone call. It was a relief. I could wake up every morning with something to feel motivated for and something to do."

Growing up in the passionate football town of Woodruff, Sullivan played just about every sport throughout his youth and was a four-sport letterman in high school. However, football was always his first love.

"My first word was 'touchdown'."

Ironically, Sullivan was a South Carolina Gamecock fan as a kid until one gift changed his perspective.

"I was actually a South Carolina fan up until about eight years old, because my dad went to South Carolina. But then one day, my mom got me a Clemson shirt, and I didn't pay any mind to it. I wore the shirt around, and then one day on TV, I saw that the team that I was wearing was playing, and I said, 'This team is actually cookin' right now. This team's actually pretty good.' So, I started watching them, and from that day on, I've been a diehard Clemson fan."

When asked about his favorite memory so far as a member of the Tigers, Sullivan pointed to the tradition like no other.

"The bus ride around the stadium and running down the Hill...it's something you watch on video and you never think that it's going to be you, but then it becomes you. It's amazing. It's like a fever dream."

Outside of football, Sullivan is an architecture major, which drew him to Clemson, and he would love to pursue a career in architecture after college or possibly coach football. He loves to fish in his free time along with beating his teammates in Madden.

Now in his second season with the team and his senior year, #29 wants to be the best teammate he can be for the team from his position while also continuing to strengthen his faith and lead others to God.

When asked about his story and experiences, Sullivan pointed to some lessons that people can take away.

"One thing that I was thinking the whole time was, 'Why not me?' With everything in life, someone's going to be going against you or someone's going to tell you that you can't do this. And you just have to say, 'Why not?' and trust the process."

Sullivan's story of perseverance and determination is undoubtedly an inspiring one as he followed his passion to achieve his dreams and is now a valued member of one of the best football programs in the country.





raham Neff was named Clemson University's 14th director of athletics on Dec. 23, 2021 in the midst of his ninth year at Clemson and is now in his second year in the role

His first year in Tigertown was at full speed, as he oversaw significant facility development, including investments at football and a women's sport expansion project to house Clemson's new lacrosse and gymnastics teams. Neff led the bringing of Clemson's multimedia rights in-house, developed a comprehensive NIL program and launched a streaming service, Clemson+. IPTAY has seen record-breaking growth in the past year, which included the largest gift in IPTAY history.

The 39-year-old has been in senior leadership positions within Clemson athletics since 2013, including as chief financial officer and director of capital projects prior to his most recent role as deputy director of athletics. Neff has



helped oversee the building and financing of more than \$200 million in facility improvements, has aided in the contin-

ued development of IPTAY and served as a sport administrator for football and men's basketball.

Neff works consistently with key university stakeholders, including the university's Executive Leadership Team, Board of Trustees, IPTAY Board of Directors, Athletics Council and several university committees and appointments.

During his time as a sport supervisor, the football program won two national titles and the men's basketball program made two NCAA Tournament appearances, including a Sweet 16 run in 2018. Academically, Clemson's graduation success rate has been above 91 percent for seven consecutive years, and student-athlete total GPA has been above 3.0 for nine straight semesters.

Neff has helped develop several key areas of the department, including the financial philosophy, fundraising, student-athlete welfare and external operations management. In 2019, he was named one of Sports Business Daily's Power Players and in 2021 was named to SBJ's 40 Under 40 list.

Prior to his role as deputy director of athletics, he joined Clemson in 2013 as associate athletic director of finance and facilities. Before Clemson, Neff served more than two years in several senior administrative roles with Middle Tennessee athletics, with emphasis in finance, facilities and external operations.

A civil engineering graduate of Georgia Tech, he served as a student manager for Paul Hewitt and the men's basketball program, advancing to a Final Four in 2004. He worked in the financial advisory services group at Deloitte & Touche from 2006 to 2008 prior to returning to a finance and ticketing role at the Georgia Tech Athletic Association. He earned an MBA from Georgia Tech in 2010. He and his wife, Kristin, have three sons, Grady and twins Emmett and Nolan.

n illustrious coaching heritage is embedded in the foundation of Clemson football. At the dawn of the 20th century, the Tigers were led by future College Football Hall of Famer John Heisman. Hall of Famers Jess Neely, Frank Howard and Danny Ford followed in Heisman's winning tradition.

Now in his 16th season (and 15th full season) as Clemson's head coach, Dabo Swinney has already carved his name into that foundation, elevating himself amid a pantheon of Tiger greats by becoming the first coach in program history to lead Clemson to multiple national championships.

Swinney's stratospheric start to his head coaching career placed his record not only among Clemson legends, but also among the names of the winningest leaders in the 150+ years of major college football.

Swinney coached the 200th game of his career in the 2022 Orange Bowl, and his 161-39 record through 200 career games positioned him alongside College Football Hall of Famers Bob Stoops and Robert Neyland for the fifth-most wins through 200 games in FBS history.

At 161-39 (.805), Swinney entered the 2023 season as the winningest active FBS head coach by percentage among coaches with at least 10 seasons of head coaching experience. With an initial hire date of Oct. 13, 2008, he is the senior member of the ACC's head coaching fraternity and entered 2023 as the seventh-longest-tenured FBS head coach.

Clemson's success on the gridiron has been matched by its prowess in the classroom, as prior to the NCAA suspending APR reporting during the COVID-19 pandemic, Clemson was one of only three programs to earn top-10 percent APR recognition from the NCAA in at least nine of the previous 10 years, joining Duke and Northwestern, Clemson was in the top 10 of APR scores and the final top 25 of the AP and USA Today polls from 2011-15, the only FBS program that could make that claim.

Swinney's 2022 squad had an 11-3 record and returned the Tigers to the ACC throne, earning a 39-10 victory in the ACC Championship Game against North Carolina to give the Tigers their seventh ACC title in eight years. Clemson became the first program in an active Power Five Conference to win seven outright titles in an eight-year span since Alabama won eight out of nine SEC titles outright from 1971-79.

Clemson's 2022 squad extended its streak of consecutive 10-win seasons to 12, becoming only the third FBS program ever to record double-digit wins in 12 consecutive seasons. The ACC title also gave Clemson's 2021 and 2022 recruiting classes their first conference title, ensuring that every recruiting class in Swinney's tenure as head coach has won at least one ACC championship in

In 2021, Swinney's final win of the season in the Cheez-It Bowl was his

150th career win in his 186th game as head coach. In terms of games, Swinney became the sixth-fastest coach in FBS history, and the fourth-fastest in the modern era, to register 150 career victories. At the conclusion of that season, only 16 coaches in FBS history (including Swinney) had accomplished the feat within 200 games, and 14 of the 16 had been inducted into the College Football Hall of Fame, with the lone exceptions being Swinney and Urban Meyer, both of whom are not yet eligible.

Though other seasons resulted in more hardware, analysts and observers opined that 2021 might have been Swinney's best coaching job, as the Tiger mentor guided his team through adversity and attrition to overcome a 2-2 start and finish 10-3. Clemson entered that October as one of 28 Power Five Conference teams with two or more losses, yet it concluded the season as one of only two of those 28 programs to finish the season having reached 10 wins.

A year earlier, Swinney's squad accomplished its "double-double mission"





in 2020, going 10-2 in a condensed season to give the Tigers 10 consecutive 10-win seasons. Clemson became only the third program in FBS history to accomplish the feat and became the first school to win 10 games in 10 straight seasons as a member of the ACC, as only the final nine of Florida State's record 14-straight 10-win seasons came during the Seminoles' tenure in the ACC.

The pandemic-affected 2020 campaign was a historic one for the Tigers both as a team and individually, as Trevor Lawrence ascended to become the winningest quarterback in school history (34-2) and running back Travis Etienne added the ACC's all-time rushing crown (4,952 yards) to his arsenal of school and conference records. Etienne's versatility as a rusher and receiver earned

him consensus All-America honors as an all-purpose selection, while Lawrence became the second Heisman Trophy finalist in program history, tying Deshaun Watson (second in 2016) for the highest finish in Heisman Trophy voting in school history.

The prolific duo under Swinney's tutelage helped guide Clemson to its sixth consecutive outright conference title with a 34-10 win against Notre Dame in the ACC Championship Game. That day, Clemson and Oklahoma's six-year streaks of outright conference titles made the two programs the first among current Power Five Conference programs to win at least six straight outright championships since Oklahoma (12 from 1948-59) as part of the now-dissolved Big 8 Conference.

The conference title helped Clemson secure its sixth College Football Playoff berth, becoming the first program to reach the postseason tournament in six consecutive seasons. Clemson is 6-4 all-time in College Football Playoff games, the second-most wins of any program since the format's inception.

Clemson entered the third decade of the 21st century in 2020 after Swinney helped author one of the most prolific 10-year periods in the history of the sport. The Tigers posted a 117-22 record under Swinney's leadership in the 2010s, and the program's 117 wins trailed only Penn (124 in the 1890s) and Alabama (124 in the 2010s) to tie for the third most in a decade in major college football since 1890

Before a pandemicshortened 2020 season, Clemson won at least 12 games in five straight years from 2015-19, tied for the longest streak in the modern era and only

two seasons shy of Penn's record sevenseason streak from 1892-98. Clemson won 69 games during that five-year span, the most in a five-year stretch in the AP poll era.

In 2019, the Tigers earned their fifthstraight College Football Playoff berth following their fifth-consecutive ACC title, becoming the first team in history to win five straight conference champion-

ship games since conference title games were created in 1992.

Clemson posted a 14-1 record that year, earning its fourth appearance in the College Football Playoff National Championship Game in five years. Prior to the season finale, Clemson extended its school-record winning streak to 29 games, tied with Florida State (2012-14) for the longest streak in ACC history and tied for 12th longest in FBS history.

Clemson produced the 2018 William V. Campbell Trophy winner (known colloquially as the "Academic Heisman") in Christian Wilkins and won the program's first AFCA Academic Achievement Award. Clemson repeated as an AFCA Academic Achievement Award recipient in 2019, becoming the only school in the country to repeat, doing so while appearing in the national championship game in both seasons.

Swinney and Clemson's 2018 season was one for which statistics and superlatives accumulated in historic fashion. The Tigers became the first major college football team in the modern era (and the first since Penn in 1897) to finish a season with a 15-0 record.

Clemson's 15 wins included a school-record 12 against teams who finished with a winning record. Clemson won by an average margin of 31.1 points per game, highest in the nation and second highest in school history, trailing only a 35.3-point average margin in 1900. Among the seasons it passed was a 30.4-point average margin in 1901, a season in which Clemson won one of its five games by a score of 122-0.



With Lawrence leading Swinney's Tigers, Clemson took flight. After a dramatic 27-23 comeback win against Syracuse, the Tigers rattled off 10 consecutive wins of 20+ points to conclude the season, including blowout wins of No. 3 Notre Dame in the Cotton Bowl and No. 1 Alabama in the College Football Playoff National Championship Game.

Seven Tigers earned first or secondteam All-America honors, including a school-record three players who collected consensus honors. The 2018 Tigers produced a program-record 18 All-ACC picks and became the first team to produce the ACC Player-of-the-Year, ACC Offensive Player-of-the-Year, ACC Defensive Player-of-the-Year, ACC Offensive Rookie-of-the-Year and ACC Coach-ofthe-Year in a season since Florida State in 1997.

Accolades also accumulated for Swinney, who earned his second career ACC Coach-of-the-Year honor and brought home the Woody Hayes Award as national coach-of-the-year. Less than a week after winning the national title, he also won the Bear Bryant Award, becoming the first three-time winner of the award. Including the 2018 Bryant and Hayes Awards, he has won national coach-of-the-year honors from at least one organization in five of the last 10

In 2017, Clemson was on a mission to prove that it was built to last. He guided the team to a 12-2 record, an ACC title and a College Football Playoff berth despite having only six scholarship seniors and losing players who accounted for 77 percent of the offense during the 2016 national championship season.

Despite a setback in the Sugar Bowl to the eventual national champion. Alabama, Clemson finished ranked No. 4 in both polls. Swinney was inducted into the Alabama Sports Hall of Fame following the season.

The Tiger-record six wins over top-25 teams in 2017, also a national high, included a school-record four on opponents' home fields and five away from home. The defense, including three defensive linemen, featured four players who were named All-American, helping Clemson finish in the top four in the nation in scoring defense (No. 2) and total defense (No. 4). Clemson led the ACC

The 2016 Tigers lived up to their hype after compiling a 14-1 record and earning a spot in the College Football Playoff for the second-straight year. Along the way, Clemson knocked off five top-25 foes.

Clemson defeated the top two teams in the national polls in consecutive games in the College Football Playoff at the end of the season. The Tigers blanked Ohio State 31-0 in the Fiesta Bowl, the first shutout suffered by Head Coach Urban Meyer in his career and the first for Ohio State since 1993.

The Tigers then earned a rematch with No. 1 Alabama, and for the first time in school history, took down the top-ranked team in a second epic battle with the storied Crimson Tide program. Deshaun Watson's touchdown pass to

on the clock gave Clemson a dramatic 35-31 victory in Tampa, Fla. Swinney received the Bear Bryant Award as national coach-of-the-year for the second consecutive season.

Swinney coached Watson to two record-setting seasons in 2015 and 2016. The two-time Heisman Trophy finalist became the first player in FBS history to total 4,000 passing yards and 1,000 rushing yards in a season in 2015, and he followed by setting an ACC record with 41 passing touchdowns in 2016. Watson won both the Davey O'Brien Award and Manning Award in back-toback seasons.

Swinney guided Clemson to the No. 1 national ranking in every College Football Playoff poll in 2015 and led the Tigers to their first national championship game appearance under the new format after his team defeated Oklahoma 37-

led Alabama in the fourth quarter of the championship contest, but came up just short (45-40) in an epic game in Glendale, Ariz.

Following the team's 14-1 record and No. 2 final ranking, he was the recipient of 10 national and two ACC Coach-ofthe-Year honors.

In 2015, a then-Tiger-record 17 players were named to one of three All-ACC teams, including all five starting offensive linemen for the first time in school history. In 2016, 15 players were honored, including a school-record three First-Team All-ACC offensive line picks.

The 2012, 2013 and 2014 seasons were also noteworthy, with three top-15 final rankings.

With a 40-6 Russell Athletic Bowl victory over Oklahoma in 2014, Swinney became the first coach in history to win three bowl games in consecutive seasons



over teams whose head coaches had previously won the national title. He upped that mark to five years in a row in 2016.

Clemson capped off the 2013 season with a thrilling 40-35 victory over No. 6 Ohio State in the Orange Bowl. The Tigers had an 11-2 record after finishing 7-1 in ACC games. It marked Clemson's first back-to-back 11-win seasons in school history.

The 2012 season (11-2) gave Clemson back-to-back 10-win seasons for the first time in 22 years. Its seven conference regular-season wins set a school record, and Clemson was co-champion of the ACC Atlantic Division.

Swinney's 2011 squad, which ended the season ranked No. 22 in the nation, captured Clemson's first ACC title since 1991 when it beat No. 3 Virginia Tech 38-10 in the ACC Championship Game. It gave Clemson its first 10-win season since 1990. For his efforts, Swinney was named Bobby Dodd National Coach-of-the-Year in 2011 to become the first Tiger head coach to win a national coach-of-the-year award since Ford in 1981.

The 2010 schedule was one of the most challenging in school history, as nine bowl teams were on the regular-season slate and two non-conference opponents were ranked in the top 25.

In 2009, his first full season as head coach at Clemson, he led the Tigers to their first ACC Atlantic Division title. The Tigers came just six points short of winning their first ACC title in 18 years. Swinney was named ACC Coach-of-the-Year by Sporting News and was a Liberty Mutual Coach-of-the-Year finalist.

In October 2008, Swinney was named Clemson's interim head coach, replacing Bowden, who had been his po-

sition coach as a player at Alabama and was Clemson's head coach since 1999. Swinney led the Tigers to a 4-2 record during the rest of the 2008 regular season, including a win over South Carolina in the regular-season finale to earn a Gator Bowl bid against Nebraska.

On Dec. 1, 2008, his interim tag was removed and he was named head coach. At the time, there had been 28 interim head coaches at the FBS level since 1970, and those coaches had combined for a 26-86-2 record. Only one of those 28 interim coaches posted a winning

record, and that was Swinney. When he was hired as head coach, he became just the second interim coach to be elevated to the head coach position at the same school during that time period.

He has demonstrated his dedication to the community through Dabo's All In Team Foundation. Since 2009, the Swinney family and Dabo's All In Team Foundation have given more than \$9.6 million back to communities and programs in the state, a number expected to exceed \$10 million by the end of 2023.

In 2022, the foundation distributed approximately \$1.6 million in financial support to its core focus areas, with \$1.15 million of that total being distributed to more than 230 deserving organizations and non-profits through the foundation's grant program. In total, the foundation's grant program has issued more than \$6.2 million to worthy applicants in 15 years.

The 1993 Alabama graduate joined the Clemson staff prior to the 2003 season. In his first 20 years as an assistant or head coach, the Tigers finished in the top 25 of the polls 16 times and totaled 46 wins over top-25 teams.

In his 20 seasons at Clemson, a Tiger wide receiver has earned All-ACC status in 17 of those years, including a First or Second-Team All-ACC selection in 16 of those 20 seasons. In 2021, three of his protegés (Mike Williams, Tee Higgins, Renfrow) recorded 1,000-yard seasons in the NFL, while another (Chansi Stuckey) has gone on to serve as wide receivers coach at Baylor and Notre Dame.

The Alabama native has a reputation as one of the top recruiters in the nation. In 2006, he was listed as the No. 5 recruiter in the nation by Rivals. He signed 38 players in his five recruiting seasons as an assistant coach and was a major reason the 2008 recruiting class was No. 2 in the nation by ESPN when he signed 11 players. The 2020 class was a consensus top-three class, earn-

ing the top ranking from ESPN, No. 2 by Rivals and No. 3 in the 247 Composite.


Swinney received a commerce & business administration degree from Alabama in 1993 after lettering three times (1990-92). A walk-on who went on to earn a scholarship, Swinney was a wide receiver on Alabama's 1992 national championship team. He was also named Academic All-SEC along with being an SEC Scholar-Athlete Honor Roll member in 1990 and 1992.

After his playing career, he was a graduate assistant at Alabama from 1993-95. He received a master's degree in business administration from Alabama in 1995.

Swinney became a full-time assistant coach at Alabama in 1996 under Head Coach Gene Stallings and coached five seasons there on a full-time basis. He was assigned to coach the Crimson Tide's wideouts and tight ends in 1996, a season that saw Alabama win the SEC West Division title. The following year, he solely coached the tight ends.

During his time at Alabama, Swinney was a part of six teams with double-digit wins, five top-10 finishes, one national title (1992), three SEC championships (1989,92,99) and five SEC West Division titles (1992,93,94,96,99) as a player and coach.

Swinney married the former Kathleen Bassett in 1994. They have three sons, Will, Drew and Clay, and a daughterin-law, Mary Crosby, Drew's wife. Will played for Clemson from 2017-21, appearing in 69 games and holding for 558 career kicking points while also scoring two touchdowns of his own. Drew was a core special teams player for Clemson from 2018-22 who served as the starting holder in his final campaign and had 14 career receptions. Both Will and Drew earned All-ACC Academic selections during their playing careers. Clay is a redshirt freshman on the 2023 Tiger football team. #

### STADIUM INFORMAT



#### **ADA**

ADA entrances are at gates 1, 5 and 13.

#### **CLEAR BAGS**

Fans are encouraged to not bring bags. Clear bags that do not exceed 12" x 6" x 12" are permissible.

#### **CONCESSION STANDS**

Concession stands open two hours prior to kickoff and remain open through the end of the fourth quarter.

#### **FIRST AID**

First-aid stations are located at portal TDK on the north upper deck, portal TDE on the south upper deck, portal J on the south concourse and Mever Family Clinic is located at portal T on the north concourse. Trained nurses and doctors are on hand. For emergencies, call 911.

#### **LOST & FOUND**

Report any item to Clemson University Police Department.

#### **METAL DETECTORS**

Walkthrough metal detectors are at all stadium entrances.

#### **PASSOUTS**

Passouts are allowed at Memorial Stadium, but fans must go through the same level of security screening as upon entering. Fans must acquire a re-entry voucher upon exit and present the voucher and a valid game ticket for re-entry.

#### **PROHIBITED ITEMS**

Alcoholic beverages, artificial noisemakers, backpacks, bags (large) of any kind, banners, chairbacks with arms, coolers, flags, flagpoles, food and beverages from

outside, umbrellas, video cameras and weapons of any kind are prohibited at Memorial Stadium.

#### **SENSORY INCLUSION**

Sensory sensitivities or challenges with sensory regulation are often experienced by individuals (one in six) with autism, dementia, PTSD and other similar conditions. Clemson athletic staff are now sensory certified. Sensory bags are free for fans to check out at all guest services booths for anyone with sensory needs.

#### **SOLICITATIONS**

Solicitation for any purpose is prohibited at an athletic contest on the campus of Clemson University.

#### **TIGER TRACKER**

Fans can visit a guest service stand (gates 1, 5, 9, 11, 13, 16, 20) to receive a Tiger Tracker wristband for vulnerable guests. It helps identify guests in the event they become separated from the rest of their party.

#### **TOBACCO POLICY**

Clemson University is a tobacco-free campus. Tobacco products are prohibited on Clemson University property.

lemson's Memorial Stadium has been held in high esteem for many years. Whether it is players from the 1940s and 1950s, opposing players from the 1970s and 1980s or even professional players in the 1990s, the ambiance of this special setting is what college football is all about.

Clemson has finished in the top 20 in the country in average home attendance for 42 straight seasons. Clemson ranked third in the country and first in the ACC in total attendance in 2020 and led the conference (and finished 14th in the nation) in average attendance in 2022.

The storied edifice added to its legend when the first meeting of father-andson head coaches (Bowden Bowl I) took place before a record crowd of 86,092 in 1999. The legend was further enhanced from 2016-22, when the Tigers had an ACC-record 40-game home winning streak, tied for eighth longest in FBS history. Since the advent of the College Football Playoff in 2014, Clemson is 59-2 at home, tied for the highest home winning percentage in the nation.

The facility's mystique is derived from its many traditions, which date to its opening in the 1942 season, the legendary games and players and Clemson's corresponding rate of success. Entering 2023, the Tigers have totaled 334 wins in 81 years and have won 76.0 percent of the contests (334-103-7). Visiting defending national champions are 0-3 all-time at Memorial Stadium as well.

The stadium has definitely been good to the Tigers, but it was constructed against the advice of at least one coach. Before Jess Neely left for Rice after the

1939 season, he gave Clemson a message.

"Don't ever let them talk you into building a big stadium," he said. "Put about 10,000 seats behind the YMCA. That's all you'll ever need."

Instead of following Neely's advice, Clemson officials decided to build the new stadium in a valley on the western part of campus. The crews went to work, clearing, cutting, pouring and forming. On Sept. 19, 1942, Memorial Stadium opened with Clemson defeating Presbyterian by a score of 32-13. Those 20,000 seats installed for the opener would soon grow.

When the original part of the stadium was built in the early 1940s, much of

the work was done by scholarship student-athletes, including football players. The first staking out of the stadium was done by two members of the football team, A.N. Cameron and Hugh Webb. Webb returned to Clemson years later to become an architecture professor and Cameron went on to become a civil engineer in Louisiana.

The construction of Memorial Stadium did not proceed without problems. One afternoon during the clearing of the land, a young player proudly announced that he was not allergic to poison oak. He then proceeded to attack the poison oak with a swing blade, throwing the plants to and fro. The next day, the boy was swollen twice his size and was hospitalized.

There are many other stories about the stadium, including one that Frank Howard put a chew of tobacco in each corner of the stadium as the concrete was poured.

Howard said that the seeding of the grass caused a few problems.

"About 40 people and I laid sod on the field," he said. "After three weeks on July 15, we had only gotten about halfway through. I told them that it had taken us three weeks to get that far and I would give them three more weeks' pay for however long it took to finish. I also told them we would have 50 gallons of ice cream when we got through.

"After that, it took them three days to do the rest of the field. Then we sat down in the middle of the field and ate up that whole 50 gallons."

Howard said on the day of the first game in the stadium, "The gates were hung at  $1\ \text{p.m.}$ , and we played at  $2\ \text{p.m.}$ "





In 1958, 18,000 sideline seats were added, and in 1960, 5,658 west end-zone seats were added in response to increasing attendance. With the large east endzone ("Green Grass" section), this expansion increased capacity to 53,000.

Later, upper decks were added to each side of the stadium as crowds swelled, the first in 1978 and the second in 1983. It increased capacity to over 80,000, which makes it one of

the largest on-campus stadiums in the country. In 2006, the WestZone was added.

The original part of Memorial Stadium was built at a cost of \$125,000, or \$6.25 per seat. Memorial Stadium's newest upper deck was finished in 1983 at a cost of \$13.5 million, or \$866 per seat.

In 2022, Clemson debuted several stadium enhancements. The videoboard received its first major upgrade since 2005, installing the new affectionately and

unofficially nicknamed "DaboTron" that measures 126 feet wide by 56.5 feet tall, eighth largest in the NCAA at the time of its installation. The eight main stadium light poles were updated to an LED system, allowing for light fixture control, spotlighting of Howard's Rock and higher-quality field lighting.

The west side of the stadium received a facelift with the addition of IPTAY's Masters Club, a 688-seat premium area on the concourse level. Clemson also

installed new signage honoring the alltime greats, championship seasons and backlighting of the traditional "Clemson Welcomes You to Death Valley" signage.

Clemson began Phase II of renovations after the 2022 season. The renovations included a new gameday locker room and a complete reimagining of Lot 5 and the Tiger Walk experience as a 365-day destination for Clemson fans.

Through the years, Memorial Stadium has become known as "Death Valley"

across the country. It was tagged by Presbyterian Head Coach Lonnie McMillian during the late 1940s. After bringing his teams to Clemson for many years and getting whipped, he said the place was like "Death Valley." A few years later, the name stuck.

In 1974, the playing surface was named Frank Howard Field for the legendary coach and his long service and dedication to Clemson. Luckily, it wasn't built behind the YMCA.





hat has been described by television commentator Brent Musburger as "the most exciting 25 seconds in college football" from a color and pageantry standpoint actually started out as a matter-of-fact entrance, mainly because of necessity.

The first 20,000 seats in Memorial Stadium were built and ready for use before the 1942 season, less than a year after Pearl Harbor was bombed and the U.S. was drawn into World War II.

The shortest entry into Memorial Stadium was a short walk down Williamson Road from Fike Fieldhouse's dressing rooms to a gate at the top of the Hill, located behind the east endzone. There were no dressing facilities inside the west endzone...there was only a giant clock, where the hands turned, and a scoreboard that was operated by hand.

Players would dress in Fike liamson Road, enter at the gate Fieldhouse, walk down Wilunderneath where the score-HOWARD'S ROCK FROM DEATH VALLEY, CA

board now stands and jog down the Hill for their warmup exercises. There was little fanfare, no cannon shot fired, no Tiger Paw flag and no "Tiger Rag" played...just the team making its entrance and lining up to do the side-straddle hop. That is the way things went for the next 25 years.

In 1964 or 1965, Sam Jones (Clemson class of 1919) made a trip to California. He stopped at a spot in Death Valley and picked up a white flint rock. After it traveled across the country, Jones presented the rock to legendary Head Coach Frank Howard as being from Death Valley, California to Death Valley, South Carolina.

The rock laid on Howard's office floor in Fike Fieldhouse for months. One day, he was cleaning up his office and told Gene Willimon (IPTAY executive secretary) to "take this rock and throw it over the fence or out in the ditch...do something with it, but get it out of my office!"

Willimon did not think that was the way a rock should be treated. After all, it had been brought over 1,900 miles by a very sincere Tiger fan.

By the mid 1960s, Memorial Stadium was living up to its moniker ("Death Valley"), because of the number of Tiger victories that had been recorded there. Actually, the name was first used by Lonnie McMillian, head coach at Presbyterian during the 1940s and 1950s.

McMillian and the other Blue Hose coaches before him opened each season by playing at Clemson. Seldom scoring (24 shutouts in 39 games) and with only three wins and four ties, his teams were getting "killed" by the Tigers regularly.

In 1948, McMillian made the remark to the press that he was taking his team to play Clemson in "Death Valley." An occasional reference to Memorial Stadium by that name could be heard for the next four years, but when Howard started calling it "Death Valley" in the 1950s, the name took off like wildfire. Clemson celebrated its 81st year in the "Valley" in 2022 with a 6-1 home record.

But getting back to Howard's Rock.

It was mounted on a pedestal at the top of the Hill on the east side of Memorial Stadium. It was unveiled Sept. 24, 1966, when Clemson played Virginia. The Tigers trailed by 18 points with 17 minutes remaining in the game and came back to win 40-35 on a 75-yard pass from Jimmy Addison to Jacky Jackson in the fourth quarter. That was quite a debut for Howard's Rock.

The team members started rubbing Howard's Rock prior to running down the Hill on Sept. 23, 1967, a day when Clemson defeated Wake Forest 23-6.

Prior to running down the Hill, Howard told his players, "If you're going to give

110 percent, you can rub that Rock. If you're not, keep your filthy hands off my

Howard told of the incident the following day on his television show, and the story became legend.

When Hootie Ingram succeeded Howard as head coach in 1970, he made the logical decision that the team would make its final entrance out of the new dressing room in the west endzone.

In all home games in 1970 and 1971 and the first four games of 1972 when the Tigers did not run down the Hill, their combined record was 6-9.

The seniors, led by Ben Anderson, decided to come down the Hill prior to the South Carolina game, the 1972 finale. The result, in a cold, freezing rain, was a 7-6 victory when Jimmy Williamson knocked down a two-point conversion attempt, which preserved the narrow win.


Clemson has made the entrance before every home contest since 1942, except for the years mentioned and the first game of 1973 (428 times entering 2023).

After final warmups, the team gathers in its dressing room under the west endzone stands for its final pregame instructions. Ten minutes prior to kickoff,

the players and coaches board multiple buses, ride around the north stands to the east endzone and disembark to the top of the Hill behind Howard's Rock.

At the appointed time, the cannon booms, and led by a giant Tiger Paw flag carried by cheerleaders and Rally Cats, the band forms two lines for the team to run between and strikes up "Tiger Rag." The frenzy starts in all sincerity and usually lasts three hours.

It is a tradition that has inspired Clemson players for many years. USA Today agreed, as it rated it the best entrance in the nation in 2017.

CLEMSON'S STATE-OF-THE-ART PLAYER FACILITY HOUSES ALL OPERATIONS FOR TIGER FOOTBALL AND IS THE NATIONAL STANDARD FOR EXCELLENCE.

ead Coach Dabo Swinney and Tiger athletics sought to build "the forever home of Clemson football" when envisioning what would become the Allen N. Reeves Football Complex, which opened in January 2017. Six years later, the facility remains among the gold standards of performance facilities, not just in college football, but in all of sports worldwide.

While discussion about the \$55 million facility spanning in excess of 142,000 square feet often centers around its bells and whistles, its design offers unparalleled functionality. During the facility's ideation, Clemson staff toured more than 35 sports performance facilities, pulling the best, most innovative ideas from every location and using the gleaned insight to create what 247Sports ranked as the nation's No. 1 facility as recently as 2021.

Upon entry into the main lobby of Allen N. Reeves Football Complex, the first thing visitors see are national championship trophies sitting in front of a video

screen flanked by massive trophy cases housing additional hardware from Clemson's history. The lobby also displays a

scaled replica of Howard's Rock and the Hill from Memorial Stadium, which also includes a button to play audio of Brent Musburger describing college football's grandest entrance prior to Clemson's 2013 game against Georgia.



At the behest of Swinney's original design, immediately visible on the lobby's right side is the home of P.A.W. Journey, a program that cultivates leadership on the team through four main pillars...personal growth, life skills and community service, career and professional development and former player engagement under the guidance of former All-American Jeff Davis.

Next to it, a corridor lined with all of the rings won in Clemson history leads to Hendrix Family Paw Bistro, the bestin-class dining facility whose cuisine is cited by many current and former players as their favorite part of the facility.

Despite national praise for the young facility, Clemson has not rested in its pursuit of making the facility the nation's standard-bearer. In the last several years, the Tigers have continued to invest in the facility's ability to meet the needs of the modern student-athlete, both on and off the field.

In 2023, Clemson completed the addition of Allen N. Reeves Clemson Athletics Branding Institute, a 12,000-square-foot, two-story area on the west end of Betty Sheppard Poe & William Maxwell Poe Indoor Facility and steps from Clemson's spacious weight room.

The institute, described in detail on pages 84 and 85 and known colloquially as "The CAB," contains two spacious photo and video studios, a customizable lighting grid, an audio studio, editing space, office space, meeting space and more to provide on-site resources for student-athletes choosing to pursue sponsorship opportunities and content generation. The lower lever of the facility is also home to Smart Family Media Center for press conferences.


A balcony on the top level of the institute overlooks Poe Indoor Facility, an 80,000-square-foot, \$10 million structure completed in late 2012. Clemson updated the facility in the spring of 2023, replacing the decade-old playing surface with a Hellas Matrix Helix monofilament synthetic turf system with RealFill rubber atop its Cushdrain drain-

age and shock pad. The surface helps to minimize wear and tear on Tiger players while allowing the team to continue its preparation in the event of inclement weather.

The facility also received an aesthetic and functional facelift in 2023, with new photos and graphics adorning the walls and the addition of new storage areas for equipment staff. The facility also includes raised video platforms, a game-ready scoreboard, four play clocks, a videoboard and a sound system.

A year earlier, Clemson invested significantly in the holistic health and wellness of its student-athletes with the completion of its "100 Yards of Wellness" area inside Allen N. Reeves Football Complex in 2022. Detailed further on pages 88-89, the project has become a central hub and hotbed of student-athlete activity as modern athletes continue to buy into the concept of "prehab," load management and active recovery. The collaboration of Clemson's Director of





Applied Science Dr. Alex Bina and Head Athletic Trainer Pat Richards, two young, dynamic leaders in their respective fields, has kept Clemson at the forefront as one of the world's top sports science facilities.

In addition to being a free resource for Clemson's active student-athletes, the space has become a draw for Tiger alumni in the NFL. With Clemson's professional-grade-or-better training areas, Tigers in the NFL have routinely returned and brought their NFL teammates to train in Clemson's facilities during summers between minicamp and training camp. The facility, including the 100

Yards of Wellness area, has inspired both awe and jealousy from NFL players who played collegiately at other programs.




Adjacent to the dining area and 100 Yards of Wellness are the outdoor player village and indoor player lounge. The

outdoor area includes a nine-hole miniature golf course, an artificial-surface wiffle ball diamond, a sand volleyball

facility, pickleball court, horseshoe pit, fountain with a Tiger Paw monument, outdoor kitchen and lounge area.

The indoor player lounge is complete with a two-lane bowling alley, Pop-A-Shot, three different video-game console centers, multiple ping-pong and pool tables, a shuffleboard table and Super Bikes motorcycle arcade game. Adjacent to the ping-pong tables is a golf simulator, where studentathletes can play many great golf courses from around the world and learn the game (and professional networking tool) in a comfortable setting.

Down the corridor from the golf simulator is an expanded and renovated barber shop with a pedicure station and massage chairs. The shop's





science graduate who served as an assistant superintendent on the renovation project prior to his final season at Clemson. Next to the barber shop is the nap room, designed to offer players a designated space to combat one of the largest obstacles to good mental health...lack of

Clemson's enormous weight room covers 23,000 square feet and debuted as the country's largest football-only weight room. The entire team can work out at once in the area that includes 20 inlay platforms, numerous machines, fatbells, kettlebells and dumbbells, as well as a well-equipped cardio deck overlooking the lifting area. It also houses the offices of Director of Performance Nutrition Meaghan Turcotte and her staff as well as a nutritional fuel bar.

Clemson's hydrotherapy areas include a large horizontal 47-degree cold tub that can handle 61 players at one time. Next to the locker room, it sits adjacent to the hydrotherapy portion of the 100 Yards of Wellness area that hosts a lap pool and four therapy pools.

The second floor houses offices and meeting spaces for Clemson football personnel, including Swinney's office, which is in the corner with accrued career memorabilia that serves for invited guests as a de facto museum of Clemson football and the future College Football Hall of Famer's career journey.

seats 180 people. The second level also features a movie theater with 20 lounge chairs.

But most famously, connecting the second-floor meeting spaces down to the locker room, weight room and prac-

tice fields is Clemson's renowned slide, which represents the most efficient

means to get Tiger players from meetings to practice in a timely manner.





he "Best" in "Best is the Standard" got better in early 2023, as Clemson opened Allen N. Reeves Clemson Athletics Branding Institute to provide Clemson student-athletes best-in-class facilities and resources for branding, marketing, sponsorship, content creation and more.

Attached to the west end of Poe Indoor Facility, the new 12,000-squarefoot, two-story facility houses two photo and video studios, an audio studio, editing space, a conference room and the office of Name, Image and Likeness Coordinator C.D. Davies, all intended to provide on-site resources for studentathletes choosing to pursue sponsorship opportunities and content generation. The facility is also home to Smart Family Media Center

From its ideation, "The CAB," as Head Coach Dabo Swinney nicknamed it, has been intended as a destination for student-athletes seeking branding guidance and resources to help elevate themselves among a crowded marketplace. "The CAB" is a part of Clemson

athletics NIL programming, dubbed "Reign."

"We're going to call it 'The CAB' because what does a cab do?...It gives you


a lift to your destination," said Swinney.

it because it's a living, breathing space where our guys know they can go for expertise.

"If you're injured, you go to the training room. If you want to get stronger, you go to the weight room. This was an opportunity for our guys to know that if they want help with branding and sponsorship and NIL and tax education and finances and all of these very real-world issues, you go to 'The CAB,' where we have a dedicated space with people ready to help them."

According to Davies, that real-world experience is indispensable and a part of Clemson's educational mission.

"This is a great education for them," said Davies of the opportunity for student-athletes to monetize their name, image and likeness. "They're getting an education that a lot of business schools don't get to give young people as far as actually being in the midst of doing these deals and negotiating for themselves, and we're giving them all the tools we can to make sure our players are in control of these transactions."





At the top of the stairs to the second floor of the new facility is a conference room overlooking Clemson's indoor practice field, providing a location for potential sponsors and collectives like Tiger-Impact and Dear Old Clemson to meet with Clemson student-athletes.

Down the walkway overlooking the practice field sit three studio spaces for content creation. The first includes a 625-square-foot infinity wall plus permanently installed customizable lighting to provide Clemson content creators and others quick, turnkey options for professional-grade studio space. It also includes a feature wall adorned with a neon-backlit Clemson logo.

The second studio is a blank canvas to provide greater flexibility for creation of custom photo and video sets. The third is a soundproof studio complete with top-of-the-line RODECaster equipment for the production of audio content, such as podcasts.

The ground level is home to Smart Family Media Center, which serves as a central hub for Clemson's award-winning media operations. The 1,200-square-foot center includes wired workspace for 40 media members to work comfortably and efficiently while interviewing Tiger personnel seated in front of the stage's 163-inch video branding wall, which can be customized for each student-athlete.

The creation of Smart Family Media Center is the latest illustration of Clemson's larger commitment to serving local and national media members and helping them tell the stories of Tiger studentathletes.

Clemson's athletic communications staff has won 10 Super 11 awards, presented annually by the Football Writers Association of America to the FBS' most helpful sports information departments, tied for the most in the award's history. The Tiger coaches' and student-athletes' helpfulness and authenticity with the media resulted in Clemson becoming the first program to earn the honor in eight straight years, doing so from 2015-22.

At the entry point to the top level is the office for Davies, whose addition during the summer of 2022 gave Clemson student-athletes a direct line to a resource with more than 30 years

of executive leadership in the financial services sector.

"I guarantee you there is no one in the country that has someone like C.D. Davies as their NIL Coordinator," stated Swinney. "He is overkill qualified, but it is a blessing for us at Clemson and a blessing for our team. He's been a CEO at major companies and corporations all throughout his career.

"This is all elementary to him compared to the world he comes from, but to our players, he is a major asset when it comes to finances, taxes, contracts, LLCs...anything that could come up in this space...for them to be able to have a good resource and sounding board and guidance and fulfill what we're trying to do, which is protect our players, train our players and truly educate them so they can maximize and navigate this NIL space."

In addition to his Clemson role, Davies serves as the chief executive officer for Figure Acquisition Corporation. His impressive business background also includes successful tenures as the CEO of CitiMortgage and head of Citi Global Mortgage, CEO of LendingTree, Wachovia Mortgage and QBE First as well as the head of Capital One Home Loans.

Building construction and renovations for "The CAB" also included the creation of updated spaces for professional scouts and for returning Tiger football players. The pro scout room has nine workstations for NFL scouts to watch tape, write reports and meet with Clemson personnel. A few yards away is the NFL locker room, a dedicated space for NFL players to dress and shower upon their returns to Clemson to train in the offseason.



# VELLNESS OF

CLEMSON HAS BROKEN DOWN WALLS, LITERALLY AND FIGURATIVELY, TO CREATE THE NATION'S PREEMINENT WELLNESS CENTER.

lemson's path to the forefront of elite athlete recovery started with a culture change. For generations, despite the best efforts and cheeriest dispositions of athletic trainers, an unfortunate mis-

conception lingered...the athletic training room is for the injured, and for the injured, the athletic training room is not a happy place to be.

"We really wanted to get away from the mentality of the 'Training Room'," said Head Coach Dabo Swinney. "We wanted to get away from the idea that it was only for guys who are injured and don't want to be in there."

Enter Jeanne & Brian Penner 100 Yards of Wellness, Clemson's new \$4.9-million wellness space at Allen N. Reeves Football Complex spanning roughly 300 feet in length that has become a central hub of activity and major point of pride for Clemson football.

Completed in 2022, 100 Yards of Wellness represents the natural evolution of Tiger football's long-time commitment to student-athlete health and wellness. By literally and figuratively breaking down walls that divided the focus areas, the new space combines Clemson's athletic training and rehabilitation expertise with its continued innovation in active recovery and applied science.

"Now it's a total wellness commitment, the mental side, the wellness side, the 'prehab' side, the applied science side, your stretching, your nutrition...all of it combined in this one big space," said Swinney. "It has created an environment where the guys want to be there all the time."

In 2018, Clemson enclosed what was previously an outdoor patio area to create Clemson Applied Science Lab (or CASL, pronounced "castle"). The area served a two-fold mission. It served as the hub of Clemson's data and performance analysis as well as a space for "prehab" and recovery.



As Clemson student-athletes bought in, the space became one of Allen N. Reeves Football Complex's most heavily trafficked areas. With demand quickly outgrowing the footprint, Clemson embarked upon the renovation and expansion immediately after the team's final practice of the spring in 2022.

Whereas walls previously divided the athletic training room from the recovery space, the new open-concept area features Clemson's medical diagnostic and treatment area to the north and the recovery space to the south, bisected by a nutrition bar. Visitors are often surprised to find an almost club-like atmosphere with upbeat music and moving colored lights creating a welcoming environment rather than a stale, clini-

cal one.

The center has created additional collaboration between Clemson's athletic training staff, led by Head Athletic Trainer Pat Richards, and Clemson's applied science group, pioneered by Dr. Alex Bina.

"There is no one in the country I would rather have caring for

our student-athletes in these positions than the duo of Pat Richards and Alex Bina," said Swinney. "Pat is incredibly well respected and is a young, dynamic leader in the athletic training industry.

"Alex is an example of blooming where you're planted. He was a student volunteer who went from working from a laptop on a weight room stool to creating an applied science department that operates college football's premier recovery facility. Those two are the best in the business, and that shows in how much our players love them and trust them."

Clemson's treatment and athletic training room area includes all requisite athletic training resources, including a diagnostic office with a full digital X-

ray space and diagnostic ultrasound, general medical exam room, 30 yards of turf and hydrotherapy areas, including two underwater treadmills. Among the features of Clemson's recovery center are:

- A cryotherapy chamber for muscle recovery through extreme cold temperature exposure.
- A sensory deprivation float tank that houses 1,200 pounds of Epsom salt dissolved in water at skin temperature to remove athletes from light, sound and some gravitational force.
- Infrared hyperthermic Cocoon pods for far-infrared light therapy and vibrational massage.

 Photobiomodulation therapy beds that leverage multiple wavelengths of infrared light to reduce oxidative stress.

- A hyperbaric chamber to create a pressurized environment for concentrated oxygen intake.
- Numerous massage chairs, including both percussive massage and hydromassage options.
- Percussive Hypervolt massage guns.
- Dedicated tables and space for practioner-assisted stretching, percussive massage gun therapy, and Normatec compressive sleeves provided to each player prior to the season.
- Functional testing equipment to obtain objective information on studentathlete muscle and joint function that can be used for injury prevention and return-to-play purposes.

The renovations also included updating the outdoor basketball court into an indoor basketball court, which, in addi-

tion to being a source of friendly competition, now can be transformed following games into a movement studio for active recovery modalities like yoga.

Clemson Applied Science Lab also became a nap destination, but the high-energy vibes and heavy traffic of the subsequent 100 Yards of Wellness space required an additional solution. Atop a portion of the south end of the recovery area is what the team calls "Tranquility Tower," an upstairs, quiet location with much of the same recovery equipment, but in a serene, peaceful environment conducive to rest and away from the social activity of the main floor.

Clemson's recovery resources have become a source of envy for its former players. Two-time All-American and NFL wide receiver Sammy Watkins remarked to Swinney that he routinely spends more than \$50,000 annually on services to maintain his body now provided to Clemson student-athletes for free.

# **CLEMSON APPLIED SCIENCE LAB**

UNDER THE DIRECTION OF ALEX BINA, CLEMSON PLAYERS ARE MAXIMIZING PERFORMANCE AND EXPEDITING RECOVERY.

lemson Applied Science Lab ("The CASL") has a very simple mission... "Carry out the vision of the head football coach by providing confidence to studentathletes that their physical and technical development is constantly advancing."

Director of Applied Science Dr. Alex Bina has done everything in his power to ensure that those words ring true and Tiger student-athletes are given every possible opportunity to both improve performance and physically recover, using any and all modern technologies available.

The two key focuses of "The CASL" are maximizing performance and expediting recovery.

The ultimate goal is quantifying human performance. Once the body and its abilities are put into numerical terms, it becomes considerably easier to determine what needs to be improved and the best possible route to enhance it.

Throughout the yearly training cycle, athletes are evaluated using technologies that leverage motion capture, force plates, sensory station, augmented reality, force transducers and GPS sensors in order to quantify athletic development. Through this process, an athlete's body composition, movement efficiency, vertical jump performance, cognitive reasoning skills, specific muscle strength, joint range of motion and on-field speed become clear to coach and athlete alike.

By building a database of the "Clemson Effect" on athlete development and performance, the Clemson football staff can continue to build championship

squads for future generations of Tiger players.

Not only does "The CASL" provide coaches and student-athletes with quantitative data with which they can analyze performance, it also is a key resource for student-athletes to use during the recovery process and injury risk mitigation protocols. Bina stressed that quick and healthy recovery is the priority of the staff at "The CASL."

The path to success in recovery is a two-step process. The first is communication and collaboration between the student-athlete and his strength & conditioning coach, nutrition and sports medicine experts and his sports psychologist. The second is using the established baseline scores of the student-athlete as targets for return-to-play protocols and as a foundation for injury-prevention training.

In 2022, through a collaborative effort with the sports medicine staff, "The CASL" launched an injury-risk-mitigation protocol that leverages data analysis to inform athlete-specific interventions. After each training cycle (winter, spring, summer), the entire roster is evaluated for strength and mobility deficiencies or imbalances. These deficiencies inspire tune-up exercises carried out by the sports medicine staff to attack issues before they become long-term injuries.

The injury-risk-mitigation program carried out in "The CASL" was made possible through a cornerstone gift donated by Clemson alum and former Student Athletic Trainer Brook T. Smith

('89) to ensure that Clemson studentathletes can benefit from leading innovations occurring in human performance development.

Bina has always been interested in bioengineering, which is the degree he earned from Penn State. Bina, who received his Ph.D. from Clemson, is implementing a simple plan, which is to "learn how the body works as a machine and put students in a position to manipulate that machine to improve recovery and performance."

Tiger players have been responding very positively to the work that Bina and

"The CASL" have done for them, and as a program, Clemson has seen tremendous success in terms of both its players' short and long-term recoveries.

Bina wants to ensure that "everything possible is being done for them" to get them back to their peak performance as healthily and as quickly as possible.

As far as long-term and overarching goals and aspirations for "The CASL," Bina offered the following.

"When we talk about, 'Best is the Standard,' that means in all ways possible. This is just another piece of that puzzle."







The facility is attached to the indoor football facility and faces the outdoor practice facility, making for the most convenient and efficient facility in the nation.









hen Nieri Family Student-Athlete Enrichment Center officially opened on the west side of Memorial Stadium on Aug. 9, 2017, it became the new home of Clemson student-athlete enrichment services. The facility was a result of a \$2.5 million cornerstone gift pledged to Tiger athletics by Michael (Clemson '86) and Robyn Nieri and their family.

Nieri Family Student-Athlete Enrichment Center houses 25 full-time staff members in athletic academic advising, educational services and student-athlete development, as well as multiple graduate assistants and over 100 student employees who serve as content tutors and strategic mentors.

It is the mission of the entire staff to help our student-athletes succeed and maintain high standards academically, to reach their goals in the classroom and with career planning and to prepare them for a future in the working world.

In addition to staff offices, the 43,000 square-foot facility includes 44 tutor rooms, abundant study hall space, a computer lab, a large auditorium and several quiet spaces for free study. In 2023, Nieri CAB (Clemson Athletics Branding Institute) was constructed and four mental health and sport psychologist professionals joined the staff.

The center and its staff offer countless resources for Clemson studentathletes to enable and enhance their academic success. Athletic academic

coordinators meet weekly with students to assist in course tracking, to discuss academic progress and to teach productive classroom behaviors, organization, time management and study habits. Coordinators also support the student-athletes in major exploration along with registration and course selection, which includes priority registration.

The educational services staff develops and implements individualized aca-

demic success plans to help identified Clemson student-athletes strengthen their academic skills through research-

based learning strategies and study skills. This department also trains and works with content-specific tutors and strategic mentors to assist Tiger student-athletes in their specific areas of study, as well as to provide additional support as the student-athletes grow their organization and time-management skills.

The Tiger student-athlete development program is dedicated to the holistic development of Clemson student-athletes, propelling them toward success, not only during college, but in life, through career development, community service and outreach, leadership devel-

opment and personal enhancement and

responsibility.

Student-athletes are prepared for career readiness via professional development programs, internship placement, resumé assistance and mock interviews. They are encouraged to establish partnerships with the community by participating in individual and team service opportunities and outreach projects. Additional programming supports studentathletes' development as individuals and leaders.

Since its inception in 1991, the department, initially located in Vickery Hall on Clemson's campus until the move to Nieri Family Student-Athlete Enrichment Center in 2017, has seen its name and location evolve over 32 years. However, its continued commitment and dedication to Clemson student-athletes and their pursuit of excellence has remained unwavering. #



### A BOOSTER INCLUDES ANYONE WHO:

- Participates or has been a member of an organization promoting Clemson athletics (e.g., IPTAY member).
- Provides a donation/contribution to Clemson athletics (e.g., season ticket purchase).
- Assists or has been requested by Clemson staff to assist in a prospect's recruitment.
- Assists in providing benefits to enrolled student-athletes or their families.
- Has been involved otherwise in promoting Clemson athletics.

### **INTERACTION WITH** CURRENT STUDENT-ATHLETES

### **CAN'T**



Provide ANY type of gift or benefit to a Clemson student-athlete or his/ her family members. Examples include money in any form, discounts, lodging, transportation, meals, gifts (of any value) and complimentary tickets.



Use a current studentathlete's name, image or likeness (NIL) to promote products or services without a quid pro quo (i.e., something for something) arrangement. For example, extra benefits remain impermissible. However, student-athlete may receive compensation for use of his/her NIL.



Provide summer employment for the studentathlete (with prior compliance approval), so long as he/she is paid for work actually performed, paid for hours actually worked, paid at the same rate as anyone doing the same job or not used in promotions for an employer.



Collect autographs and photos with our team. However, no payment or gifts may be involved unless there is NIL activity with a guid pro guo. Also, NIL activity must be separate and distinct from team-mandated activities.

### **INTERACTION WITH RECRUITS**

### **CAN'T**



Provide ANY type of gift or benefit to a recuit or his/ her family members. Examples:

- Money in any form
- Discounts
- Lodging
- Transportation
- Meals
- · Gifts (of any value)
- Complimentary tickets



Contact a recruit (or his/ her family) via text, email and social media for a recruiting purpose.



Face-to-face contact on or off campus (includes family members if no previously established relationship).



Employ relatives, guardians or friends of a prospect as an inducement for the prospect's enrollment and athletics participation at Clemson.



Accept a call from a recuit or his/her family. However, voli.

- Can't initiate a call.

## GARRETT RILEY

THE FIRST-YEAR TIGER ASSISTANT, WHO HAS WORKED HIS WAY TO BECOME ONE OF THE MOST COVETED OFFENSIVE COORDINATORS IN THE NATION, IS MUCH MORE THAN A FOOTBALL COACH.

ith a quick Google search, you would find out that new Tiger Offensive Coordinator Garrett Riley attended high school in Muleshoe, Texas. You would also find out that he played at Texas Tech, where he was a quarterback for two seasons before transferring to Stephen F. Austin.

And you would find out that he is the younger brother of Southern California Head Coach Lincoln Riley and about his time as offensive coordinator at TCU in 2022, when the Horned Frogs played for a CFP national championship after he was named the winner of the Broyles Award as the nation's top assistant coach.

Riley said his move to Clemson has been a great adjustment for him and his family. ## REUNION TEAMS

WE HONOR FOUR TIGER TEAMS AND REMEMBER SOME OF THE GREAT MOMENTS FROM THOSE SEASONS.

oday, we honor the Clemson teams celebrating their 50th, 25th, 10th and fifth anniversaries. We appreciate their contributions to the heritage of Clemson football. Below are some season highlights.

## 1973

#### 50-Year Anniversary

The 1973 season ushered in the Red Parker era at Clemson. Parker was known for his ability as a recruiter, and this asset set the program on good footing for the late 1970s and 1980s. The players he recruited in 1973 and beyond were leaders of the 1977 team that set Clemson in motion to be one of the top programs in the nation for nearly 50 years.

The final record for the 1973 season was 5-6, but the Tigers finished 4-2 in the ACC, third in the league. The two conference losses were to NC State and Maryland, two teams that finished ranked in the top 20 of the AP poll.

The four ACC wins came against Virginia, Duke, Wake Forest and North Carolina. The Virginia and North Carolina victories were the two most exciting.

Against Virginia in Death Valley on Oct. 13, the Tigers trailed by 14 points (20-6) in the first half. No one on the Clemson team that year would have believed I would write about this game years later as a season highlight.



The Tigers drove to the Virginia three on their first possession, but quarterback Ken Pengitore fumbled and the Cavaliers recovered. After a 72-yard run by Kent Merritt, Virginia scored to take a 6-0 lead.

Clemson came back in the second quarter to score 18 points, but it still

trailed at halftime. The Tigers were behind 27-18 entering the fourth quarter when Pengitore made amends for his first-drive mistake. He took the Tigers on two touchdown drives in the fourth quarter, with the last score coming on a 29-yard touchdown pass to Jim Lanzendoen that gave Clemson a 32-27 victory.

Lanzendoen finished the day with 141 receiving yards, at the time the third most in a game in Tiger history. Pengitore led the team in rushing with 83 yards on 22 carries, while Smiley Sanders added 76 yards on 16 carries. Pengitore was efficient by completing 15-23 passes for 239 yards.

The wins over Virginia and North Carolina were two of three games Clemson had at least 200 rushing yards and 200 passing yards in the same contest. Pengitore had a game at North Carolina that would make today's quarterbacks smile, as he had 100 yards on the ground (96 in the first half) and 212 yards in the air, completing 12-17 passes.

Even with this offensive execution, the game came down to defense in the final minute. Trailing 37-29, North Carolina quarterback Nick Vidnovic was picked off by Clemson's Lynn Carson at the Clemson 11 with just 42 seconds left to preserve the Tiger win.

### 1998

#### 25-Year Anniversary

The highlight of the 1998 season came in the final game when the Tigers defeated South Carolina 28-19 at Death

Valley. The contest was played in front of 84,423 fans, at the time the largest crowd in Memorial Stadium history. The home victory ended an NCAA-record seven consecutive wins by the road team in the series.


There were many heroes in this game, including senior Howard Bartley, who had a 48-yard interception return for a touchdown. It was the first touchdown of Bartley's career in his final game as a Tiger.

Running backs Travis Zachery and Javis Austin both had at least 50 rushing yards and exactly 32 receiving yards, as quarterback Brandon Streeter repeatedly went to his running backs in passing situations. Austin added two touchdowns, one on a reception and one on the ground.

Those who attended the game will always remember Clemson players carrying Tommy West along with his wife and son.

The 1998 Tigers had a strong defense, a unit that had six players drafted by the NFL, a big reason Clemson finished in the top 25 in the nation in rushing defense and scoring defense.

The group was led by first-round draft pick Antwan Edwards, second-round selection Rahim Abdullah and fifth-round pick Adrian Dingle. Edwards was 10th in the nation in kickoff return average, Abdullah had 89 tackles, including 15 tackles for loss, and Dingle set a school record for sacks in a season (10.5). He broke the record of 10 that had been





held by Michael Dean Perry, Jim Stuckey and William Perry.

Clemson was led on the offensive side of the ball by Streeter. He became the first Tiger to record at least two 300-yard passing games in a single season. He completed 27-38 passes for 329 yards against NC State. The completion and yardage totals were a Clemson record at the time.

The Tigers led the nation with six defensive players taken in the 1999 NFL draft, one more than North Carolina and Florida. The six selections were the most by a Tiger team since the 1991 season.

## 2013

#### 10-Year Anniversary

The 2013 season was a landmark year in Clemson history because of the seeds of success against prominent programs that were planted. The Tigers finished the season with an 11-2 record, including a 7-1 mark in the ACC. The Tigers finished ranked No. 7 in the USA Today coaches poll and No. 8 in the AP poll.

Clemson began the year with a 38-35 win over No. 5 Georgia and finished the year with a 40-35 win over No. 6 Ohio State. In between, the Tigers scored 50+points five times, a record for a season at the time. That included consecutive wins over Virginia (59-10), Georgia Tech (55-31) and The Citadel (52-6).

The Tiger offense was led by senior Tajh Boyd, wide receivers Sammy Watkins and Martavis Bryant and running back Roderick McDowell.

Boyd completed 283 passes for 3,851 yards, passed for 34 touchdowns and added 400 rushing yards. He completed his career with 107 passing touchdowns and 133 combined touchdowns rushing and passing, both ACC records at the time. His pass efficiency rating of 168.7 set a Clemson record as

Few will forget the performance Boyd and Watkins had against Ohio State in their respective final games at Clemson. Boyd passed for 378 yards and rushed for 127 yards for a 505 total yards, an Orange Bowl record and still the fourthmost yards in school history.

Watkins caught 16 of Boyd's 31 completions for 227 yards and two touchdowns. The reception total and yardage total still stand as Clemson records. Watkins finished the season with a school-record 101 receptions for a school-record 1,464 yards. He was the No. 4 overall pick of the NFL draft at the end of the season.

Clemson had a 3,500-yard passer, 1,400-yard receiver and 1,000-yard rusher in 2013. McDowell was that top rusher with 1,025 yards on only 189 carries.

The 2013 defense also had standouts, led by junior Vic Beasley, who had 23 tackles for loss and 13 sacks. He was named a consensus first-team All-American. Future first-round draft pick Stephone Anthony had a banner year as well.

### 2018

#### Five-Year Anniversary

It is hard to believe that it has been five years since Clemson's 2018 national championship season. It was an unforgettable year in which the Tigers finished with a 15-0 record, the first 15-0 team since Penn in 1897.

While Clemson finished with a perfect record and No. 1 final ranking, the Tigers were not ranked No. 1 in the AP poll until after the national championship game victory over the Crimson Tide. Alabama was renowned as possibly the greatest team in history before the Tigers defeated the Crimson Tide by 28 points.

As dominant as Clemson was during the 2018 season, the Tigers would not have played the ACC Championship

Game had not reserve freshman quarterback Chase Brice come off the bench against Syracuse to lead the Tigers to a come-from-behind 27-23 win. The Orange went on to a 6-2 record in the ACC Atlantic Division, and had they beaten Clemson, Syracuse would have had the tiehreaker

Clemson posted a 15-0 record against a schedule that included a school-record 12 games against teams that finished with a winning record. The Tigers played the nation's most difficult schedule in terms of opponent winning percentage (64.2).

The Tigers won an ACC-record 13 games by 20+ points, surpassing 2013 Florida State's record of 12. Clemson's average victory margin of 31.1 points per game was the highest in the nation and second highest in school history.

The 2018 Tigers were among the most talented in school history, with seven players earning first, second or third-team All-America honors. That included three defensive linemen, as Christian Wilkins, Dexter Lawrence and Clelin Ferrell all made at least one first-team All-America squad.

Eighteen Tigers made First, Second or Third-Team All-ACC, the most in a season in school history.

Clemson averaged 44.3 points per game and 527 yards per game, both school records.

In addition to the accomplishments on the field, Clemson won the AFCA Academic Achievement Award for the first time, becoming just the third program to win the honor and the national title in the same year. Clemson joined Notre Dame (1988) and Alabama (2017) with that distinction.

Leading the way in terms of academic honors was Wilkins, who won the Campbell Trophy from the National Football Foundation. The honor is known as the "Academic Heisman Trophy."

## 1967 NG STATE

## WITH THEIR ORANGE SHOES, THE TIGERS UPSET TOP-10 NC STATE ON THEIR WAY TO THE ACC CHAMPIONSHIP. BY TIM BOURRET

Editor's Note - For each program in 2023, Tim Bourret chronicles an epic game in the history of Memorial Stadium. Today is the first installment.

rank Howard totaled 165 wins in his Clemson career, a record that still stands today. One of his most memorable victories took place on Nov. 18, 1967, when the Tigers faced No. 10 NC State, coached by Earle Edwards. In fact, it would be Howard's highest-ranked win in Death Valley in his 30 seasons as Clemson's head coach

Clemson was just 4-4 entering the game, but had not lost in the ACC. Howard always played a tough non-conference schedule, and the slate that year included games against Georgia, Georgia Tech, Auburn and Alabama.

NC State had played a solid schedule as well, and their 1967 resumé had included a road win over No. 2 Houston in the fourth game of the year, a victory that brought national attention. With an 8-0 start, NC State jumped to No. 3 in the AP poll, still the highest AP ranking in Wolfpack history.

But the week before the Clemson game, NC State lost at Penn State 13-8 and dropped to No. 10. Most national media members still believed the Wolfpack could earn a bid to the Sugar Bowl with a win at Clemson in their final regular-season game.


NC State also had received national attention because of its "White Shoes" defense. In this era, every player wore black shoes. However, NC State safety Bill Morrow noticed a member of the Kansas City Chiefs wearing white shoes and thought they looked good. He went to co-captain Art McMahon with the idea of the defense wearing white shoes and team leader Chuck Amato endorsed it.

This was a different era. The trainer did not call Nike and ask for an order of white shoes. The players had to paint their shoes themselves.

With the 8-0 start and No. 3 ranking, the "White Shoes" defense was getting plenty of attention. And it had the stats to back it up. It would finish the season sixth in the nation in scoring defense.

So the week of the game, the Tigers got together and came up with the idea that they would paint their shoes orange for the NC State game...not just the defense...the entire team.

The players enlisted the help of Head Athletic Trainer Fred Hoover and Assistant Athletic Trainer Herman McGee about the idea, but they never told coach Howard of their plan. Hoover and his wife went all over the area and bought up



as much orange paint as they could find. McGee's task was to enlist some students to join him in painting the shoes.

"I will never forget the crowd when we appeared at the top of the Hill," recalled Billy Ware, one of Clemson's starting

defensive players that day. The stadium erupted."

On Saturday morning, Howard saw the shoes and supported the idea.

It did not look like the orange shoes would be much of a motivating factor when the Wolfpack took a 6-0 halftime lead on field goals by Gerald Warren, who made kicks of 37 and 47 yards with the wind behind him.

Clemson finally got on the scoreboard in the third quarter. On third-and-11 from the NC State 28, Howard called for a pass play.

"The NC State defense was in a double coverage on our receivers, so when Buddy Gore (All-ACC running back) went out of the backfield on a wheel route, he was wide open," remembered Ware.

"Most of the time, Buddy couldn't catch a cold, but he was so wide open on this play and made the catch and ran in easily, outrunning the NC State line-backer"

Statistics show that Gore only had seven receptions in his Clemson career as one of the program's best running backs, so this play had to be a surprise to Edwards and the Wolfpack coaching staff.

Clemson scored on its next possession on a seven-yard run by Jacky Jackson, giving the Tigers a 14-6 lead with 7:45 left in the third quarter. It was a back-and-forth game from a yardage standpoint late into the fourth quarter when two NC State turnovers proved to be the difference.


With the hopes of tying the score with a touchdown and two-point conversion, the Wolfpack drove to the Clemson 29 with 2:54 left in the game. However, Jim Donnan was intercepted by Richie Luzzi in the endzone to stop the drive.

NC State got the ball back and drove to midfield, but Donnan fumbled when he was chased out of the pocket and reserve defender George Burnett recovered with just 1:44 left.

After the game, Howard was asked about the orange shoes.

"There is something about football that makes boys believe in something that will help them. When they believe they can so something, they usually do it"

Clemson improved to 5-0 in the ACC with the win. The following week, the Tigers won the ACC outright with a 23-12 win at South Carolina.

CHANGES ARE AHEAD FOR CLEMSON & COLLEGE FOOTBALL.

here are some major changes in college football this year, changes that affect Clemson fans and the way they follow the Tigers, the ACC and college football in general. I am not talking about the transfer portal or NIL.

This past February, Woody McCorvey, the legendary former Clemson assistant coach and current "National Security Advisor" on Dabo Swinney's staff for the last 15 years, attended a meeting of the minds when it comes to the rules of college football. McCorvey is one of the most respected administrators in the business and is a member of the national rules committee.

Much of the discussion centered around the length of college football games. While many believe there are too many commercial timeouts that contribute to the three hours and 22 minute average for a game in 2022, cutting back is not an option, because indirectly, or directly, those commercials are a major source of the millions of dollars schools receive from their conference television contracts

That is what all the conference affiliation changes have been about during the

ability of game durations. Clemson was a prime example. The season opener last season at Georgia Tech took four hours and 20 minutes to complete. The Furman contest took only two hours and 59 minutes, and the game at Notre Dame later in the season lasted three hours

and five minutes.

The committee looked at many options, but the one it adopted was the NFL rule where the clock does not stop for a first down when the ball is in play until the last two minutes of each half. In the 2022 season when Will Shipley ran for a first down and was tackled in bounds, the clock stopped to reset the down markers. This year when Shipley runs for a first down in bounds, the clock will continue to run.

I asked McCorvey if the committee discussed how many fewer plays per game each team would run over the course of a game due to this new timing rule. He said the committee estimated each team would run seven to eight fewer plays per game. That seems about right, because on average, NFL games run about 15 less plays than a college game.

That does not sound like a lot, but that could be two less

possessions per game per team if it is a defensive battle.

Like in 2006 when timing rules were altered, fans who follow their team and are into statistics must understand when they evaluate their offense, they must take the reduction of plays and yardage into account. If Clemson averages 6.0 yards per play this year, a normal average for Clemson's offense over the last 10 years, that is a reduction of about 50 vards per game.

When fans look at a 500-yard total offense game as a barometer of excellence, they need to reduce that number to 450 vards.

I am sure at some point a national pundit will say Clemson's offense is down in production this year because it is averaging 20 fewer yards per game. In reality, it would be improved.

The second point most fans attending today's game realize is that there are no more divisions in the ACC. It is just one 14-team league. So, what is the big deal with that?

It is a good move because it will guarantee that the two-best teams play for the championship in Charlotte in December.

The 2018 season is an example of why the change is for the better. That season, Clemson and Syracuse had a thrilling game in Death Valley. Trevor Lawrence was injured in the first half and backup Chase Brice, who started the

week as the third-team quarterback, had to come in off the bench.

He completed a fourth-down pass to Tee Higgins in the fourth quarter that kept the drive alive and Travis Etienne eventually scored the winning touchdown in the last minute.

Had Clemson lost that game, it would have finished with a 7-1 ACC record, the same final mark as Syracuse. However, Syracuse would have gone to the ACC Championship Game as the Atlantic Division champion, because they would have won the head-to-head meeting.

How would the CFP committee have looked at the Tigers if they had not even played in the ACC Championship Game?

By today's setup, Clemson and Syracuse would have played again if the Orange had beaten the Tigers, giving Clemson a much better shot at getting into the playoff with an ACC Championship Game victory over Syracuse.

All this has come about because of the 12-team CFP format we will have starting in the 2024 season. No one wants to have an 8-4 team in the CFP as a league representative after an upset victory in a conference title game.

The drawback of having just one 14-team conference is that there will be more meaningless league games in November. When the teams were in divisions, there were more games that affected the division standings.

That is the price of progress.


