## CLEMSON TO FACE KENTUCKY IN 2023 TAXSLAYER GATOR BOWL

Clemson will make its record 10th all-time Gator Bowl appearance when the Tigers face the Kentucky Wildcats in the 2023 TaxSlayer Gator Bowl on Friday, Dec. 29. Kickoff at EverBank Stadium in Jacksonville, Fla. is set for noon ET.

The Gator Bowl will be Clemson's 50th bowl appearance in school history. Clemson will become the 12th program in the nation to play at least 50 all-time bowl games.

Though Clemson's streak of consecutive 10-win seasons concluded this year at a dozen (the third-longest streak in FBS history), Clemson can still extend a historically profound streak of consecutive nine-win seasons with another victory.

Despite the challenges of a 4-4 start, Clemson responded by being one of only 11 teams in the Power Five to go undefeated in the month of November, a stretch that included multiple wins against ranked opponents.

"Football is exactly like life," Head Coach Dabo Swinney said following Clemson's regular season finale.

#### WHAT TO WATCH FOR THIS WEEK

- Clemson attempting to win a postseason game (conference championship, bowl game and/or national championship game) for a 13th consecutive season. Clemson's current 12-year streak is the longest streak on record in major college football history.
- Clemson attempting to win nine games in a season for the 31st time in school history. It would be Clemson's 13th consecutive nine-win season and its 14th overall in Dabo Swinney's 15 full seasons as head coach.
- Clemson (12) attempting to tie Yale (13 straight from 1886-98) for the fourth-most consecutive nine-win seasons in major college football history, trailing only Nebraska (33 from 1969-2001), Alabama (16 from 2008-23) and Florida State (14 from 1987-2000).
- Clemson making its 50th bowl appearance in school history. Clemson will become the 12th program in the nation to appear in 50 bowl games all-time.
- Clemson making its 10th Gator Bowl appearance alltime, its most of any bowl game.
- Clemson becoming the first program in history to appear in 10 Gator Bowls.
- Clemson attempting to even its Gator Bowl record at 5-5.
- Head Coach Dabo Swinney becoming the first coach in ACC history to lead a team in 20 bowl games.
- Swinney (11) attempting to break Bobby Bowden's ACC record (11) for the most career bowl wins leading an ACC program.
- Clemson attempting to earn its sixth victory in its alltime series with Kentucky.
- Clemson attempting to improve to 3-1 all-time in postseason games against Kentucky.
- Clemson facing multiple SEC opponents in a season for the 17th time in the last 18 years, dating to 2006. The lone exception came in 2020 when the SEC opted out of non-conference play amid the COVID-19 pandemic.
- Clemson attempting to improve to 14-6 against SEC opponents since 2015. A Clemson win would make Kentucky the sixth different SEC opponent defeated by Clemson in that span, joining Alabama, Auburn, LSU, South Carolina and Texas A&M.
- Clemson attempting to improve to 21-12 in games at NFL stadiums under Dabo Swinney. A win would improve Clemson to 18-8 at NFL stadiums since 2015.
- Clemson facing Kentucky Head Coach Mark Stoops for the first time.
- Clemson attempting to improve to 163-73-3 all-time (and 46-7 since 2011) when facing a coach for the first time.
- Swinney (sixth) and Stoops (seventh) facing off in a matchup of two of the seven longest-tenured head coaches in the FBS.
- Clemson attempting to improve to 3-0 against the Stoops family including postseason victories against Mark's brother, Bob, in 2014 and 2015 during Bob's tenure at Oklahoma.
- Clemson attempting to improve to 131-18 against AP-unranked teams under Dabo Swinney and improve to 108-8 in those games since the start of the 2012 season
- Clemson entering the game unranked despite having more wins against ranked teams (two) than 10 members of this week's AP Top 25: No. 10 Penn State (one), No. 12 Oklahoma (one), No. 13 LSU (one), No. 17 SMU (one), No. 18 Liberty (none), No. 19 NC State (none), No. 20 lowa (none), No. 23 Tulane (none), No. 24 James Madison (none) and No. 25 Tennessee (none). Clemson's two ranked wins are also equal to the number of ranked wins by No. 7 Ohio State, No. 11 Ole Miss, No. 15 Notre Dame, No. 16 Louisville, No. 21

- Clemson's senior class (39-12) attempting to become the 11th senior class in program history to earn 40 wins in a four-year span. Clemson's seniors would be the fifth active class in the country to accomplish the feat (Note: Notre Dame and Liberty's classes can also reach 40 wins with a victory in their respective bowls).
- Clemson (918) running 82 offensive plays to produce the  $10 {\rm th} \ 1,000 {\rm -play}$  season in school history.
- Clemson (4,868) needing 132 yards to produce its 12th 5,000-yard season in the last 13 years. It would be Clemson's 13th 5,000-yard season in Dabo Swinney's 15 full seasons.
- Clemson (272) needing 28 completions to post the 11th 300-completion season in school history.
- Clemson attempting to produce a sixth 200-yard rushing game this season to give the Tigers at least six 200-yard rushing performances in a season for the first time since 2019 (10).
- Clemson entering the game having scored at least one rushing touchdown in a national-best 77 of its 81 games since the start of the 2018 season. Clemson has also rushed for multiple touchdowns in a national-best

- 64 games in that span.
- Clemson attempting to produce a fourth player with multiple receiving touchdowns in a game for the first time since 2020 (four). Jake Briningstool, Tyler Brown and Antonio Williams have each recorded one game with two receiving touchdowns this season.
- Clemson attempting to hold five consecutive opponents to 50 percent or worse completion percentage for the first time since a six-game streak in 2019.
- Clemson attempting to win the turnover margin for a fifth consecutive game for the first time since a nine-game streak in 2019.
- Clemson attempting to record multiple takeaways in five consecutive games for the first time since the final three games of 2018 and the first two games of 2019.
- Clemson attempting to add to its 24 takeaways this season, its most since 2019 (30 in 15 games).
- Clemson (five) trying to score six non-offensive touchdowns in a season for the first time since 2009 (seven six on special teams and one on defense).
- Clemson (five) attempting to record its sixth defensive touchdown of the season to take sole possession of the school record. Clemson's five defensive touchdowns

this season (four via interception return, one via fumble return) are tied for the record set in 1990.

- Clemson (four) attempting to record its fifth interception return touchdown this season to take sole possession of the school record. Clemson's four interception return touchdowns this season are tied for the record set in 1990.
- Clemson entering the game 5-0 this season in games in which it scores a non-offensive touchdown. Clemson is 27-1 in such games since 2015.
- Clemson attempting to outsack its opponent in an eighth consecutive game for the first time since a ninegame streak across the 2019-20 seasons.
- Clemson (30) needing five sacks to reach 35 sacks on the year. Entering 2023, Clemson had reached 35 sacks in every year of the College Football Playoff era, and Clemson's nine such seasons led Alabama (seven) for the most in the nation.
- Safety Khalil Barnes entering the game as the only Clemson freshman in the Dabo Swinney era to record multiple forced fumbles and multiple interceptions in a freshman season
- Barnes (two) needing one more forced fumble to join Myles Murphy (three in 2020) as the only Clemson freshmen under Dabo Swinney to force three fumbles in a season. Presently, Murphy and Ed McDaniel are the only Clemson freshmen (true or redshirt) with three forced fumbles in a season since 1988.
- Barnes (three) attempting to become the first Clemson freshman to record four interceptions in a season since Jayron Kearse in 2013 (four).
- Tight end Jake Briningstool entering the game with a career-high 407 receiving yards this season. He needs 93 yards to post the first 500-yard season by a Clemson tight end since Jordan Leggett in 2016 (736).
- Briningstool (41) sitting nine receptions shy of the Clemson record for receptions by a tight end in a single season set by Dwayne Allen in 2011 (50).
- Briningstool (10) needing one more touchdown to pass Bennie Cunningham (10 from 1972-75) for sole possession of the sixth-most receiving touchdowns by a tight end in Clemson history. He is two touchdowns shy of an existing four-way tie for second with John McMakin, Dwayne Allen, Brandon Ford and Davis Allen (12 each).
- Briningstool (two touchdowns vs. Miami on Oct. 21) attempting to become the first Clemson tight end to catch multiple touchdown passes in multiple games in a single season since Brandon Ford in 2012 (two).
- Wide receiver Tyler Brown (51) needing four receptions to become the fourth Clemson player since 2010 to record 55 receptions in a freshman season, joining Antonio Williams (56 in 2022), Artavis Scott (76 in 2014) and Sammy Watkins (82 in 2011).
- Brown (two touchdowns vs. Florida Atlantic on Sept. 16) attempting to become the first Clemson player to record multiple touchdown receptions in multiple games of a freshman season since Artavis Scott (three games) in 2014. Scott is now an offensive graduate assistant on Clemson's staff.
- Brown (153 yards at Syracuse on Sept. 30) needing one more 150-yard receiving game to join Sammy Watkins (three in 2011) and Artavis Scott (two in 2014) as the only Clemson true freshmen to record multiple 150-yard receiving games in a season.
- Defensive tackle Tyler Davis (51) making his 52nd career start to extend his Clemson record for the most career starts by a defensive player.
- Davis tying PK Chandler Catanzaro (52) for the fourth-most career starts in Clemson history.
- Quarterback Cade Klubnik (21) chasing Steve Fuller (22 from 1975-78) for 13th on Clemson's all-time leaderboard for career passing touchdowns. He is

three touchdowns shy of 11th place, shared by Bobby Gage (24 from 1945-48) and Tommy Kendrick (24 from 1969-71)

- Klubnik (21) needing four more touchdown passes to become the 11th player in Clemson history to throw 25 career touchdown passes.
- Klubnik attempting to tie his former offensive coordinator Brandon Streeter (four) for the fifth-most career 300-yard passing games in Clemson history.
- Klubnik (260) entering the game 10th in school history in completions in a single season.
- Klubnik (413) entering the game ranked tied for seventh in Clemson history in pass attempts in a single season. He is 20 attempts from fifth (Cullen Harper, 433 in 2007).
- Klubnik (321) needing 13 completions to pass Rodney Williams (333 from 1985-88) and enter the Top 10 in Clemson history in career completions.
- Klubnik (321) needing 29 completions to become the 13th player in school history to complete 350 career passes.
- Klubnik (3,277) sitting 77 yards shy of entering the Top 15 in Clemson history in career passing yards. He is 223 yards shy of becoming the 15th player in Clemson history to reach 3,500 career passing yards.
- Klubnik (523) entering the game having the most plays of total offense (combined rushing attempts and passing attempts) by a Clemson player in a single seaosn since Kelly Bryant in 2017 (590).
- Running back Phil Mafah (nine) seeking to add to his single-season career high in rushing touchdowns.
- Mafah needing one more rushing touchdown to give Clemson at least one player with double-digit rushing touchdowns in nine consecutive seasons.
- Mafah (career-high 894) needing 106 more rushing yards this season to post the 24th 1,000-yard rushing season in school history.
- Mafah (894) and Will Shipley (798) entering the game as one of only four running back duos in the Power Five with 750+ rushing yards each.
- Mafah (894) and Shipley (798) needing two rushing yards from Shipley to make them the fifth Clemson duo since 1948 to each rush for 800 yards in a single season. They would be only the third running back duo to accomplish the feat, joining C.J Spiller/James Davis in 2006 and Kenny Flowers/Stacey Driver in 1985.
- Defensive end T.J. Parker (5.0) needing two more sacks to tie the Clemson freshman record for sacks set by Michael Dean Perry (seven in 1984), Chester McGlockton (seven in 1989) and Dexter Lawrence (seven in 2016). Among the trio of current record holders, only Lawrence's performance came in a true freshman season; neither Perry nor McGlockton played in their first years on campus.
- Parker (11.0) entering the game leading the nation in tackles for loss by a freshman. He is one tackle for loss shy of Myles Murphy's true freshman school record of 12 and four tackles for loss shy of the overall freshman school record of 15 set by redshirt freshman Michael Dean Perry in 1984.
- Offensive lineman Will Putnam (3,480) playing 20 snaps to become the second player on record in Clemson history to play 3,500 career snaps from scrimmage. His 3,480 career snaps from scrimmage presently rank second in Clemson history behind only Mitch Hyatt (3,754 from 2015-18).
- Putnam (59) playing his 60th career game to become the first offensive lineman in school history to play 60 career games.
- Putnam and safety Jalyn Phillips (59 each) both attempting to join seven existing players in school history to have reached 60 career games (P Will Spiers, WR/H Will Swinney, LB James Skalski, PK B.T. Potter, S Nolan

The Tigers' first appearance in the Gator Bowl took place at the conclusion of the 1948 season. Clemson defeated Missouri, 24-23, in a battle of Tigers, clinching a perfect 11-0 season for Frank Howard's team.

Clemson also participated in the Gator Bowl at the conclusion of the 1951, 1977, 1978, 1986, 1989, 1995, 2000 and 2008 seasons.

Clemson's appearance against Pittsburgh in the 1977 Gator Bowl ended an 18-year stretch without a bowl for the Tiger program. Clemson defeated Ohio State, 17-15, in the Gator Bowl the following year in Danny Ford's first game as Clemson's head coach. Ford had taken over for Charley Pell, who had resigned at the end of the regular season to become head coach at Florida. A late interception by Charlie Bauman, the only interception of his four-year career, clinched the victory for the Tigers.

The Tigers had a 2-0 record in the Gator Bowl in the 1980s, a 27-21 win over Stanford in 1986 and a 27-7 win over West Virginia in 1989. The win over West Virginia was the final game for Ford as Clemson's head coach. Ford went 3-0 in his career in the Gator Bowl, including both his first and last games as head coach.

The Gator Bowl also holds personal significance for Clemson Head Coach Dabo Swinney. Swinney's first bowl game as a coach was the 1993 Gator Bowl when he was a graduate assistant on Gene Stallings' staff at Alabama. The Crimson Tide earned a 24-10 win against North Carolina in that contest. The Gator Bowl was also the site of Swinney's first bowl game as a head coach, as Clemson ended the 2008 season after Swinney was elevated to head coach by facing Nebraska in the Gator Bowl on New Year's Day in 2009.

#### ONE TIGER FROM KENTUCKY

Clemson has one member of its 2023 roster from the Bluegrass State: offensive lineman Walker Parks. Parks suffered a season-ending injury in early September and will not play in the Gator Bowl.

Parks was a two-year captain at Frederick Douglass High School in Lexington, roughly 80 miles east of Louisville. As a senior, he did not allow a sack in 15 games, earning first-team all-state and district player of the year honors en route to being ranked by every major recruiting service as the No. 2 recruit in Kentucky for the Class of 2020.

Parks is the son of former Wildcat offensive lineman David Parks, who lettered at Kentucky from 1991-93. David's final game at Kentucky actually came against Clemson in the 1993 Peach Bowl, a 14-13 Clemson victory

Upon his signing at Clemson, Walker became the Tigers' first signee from Kentucky since cornerback Justin Miller in 2002. Miller was a three-year starter, a 2002 freshman All-American and 2004 all-conference honoree who would become a 2005 second-round pick by the New York Jets

#### **BOWL SUCCESS UNDER SWINNEY**

Clemson has posted an 11-8 bowl record under Head Coach Dabo Swinney, including a 10-5 mark in its last 15 bowl games dating back to the 2012 season.

Swinney is already the ACC record holder for career bowl games coached (19). This year, Swinney will become the first coach ever to lead a team in 20 bowl games as an ACC head coach. He is also tied for the conference record in career bowl victories (11, shared with Bobby Bowden).

Many of Clemson's 10 bowl wins since 2012 have not come against run-of-the-mill opponents. Eight of Swinney's 10 bowl victories in that span have come against head coaches with national championship victories to their credit at various levels of NCAA play, including two wins each against Nick Saban, Urban Meyer and Bob Stoops, as well as single victories against Les Miles and Brian Kelly. Four of those coaches won FBS titles, while Kelly was a two-time champion at the Division II level.

in postseason play, with Clemson earning a 14-13 Peach Bowl win in 1993 and the teams splitting a pair of Music City Bowls in 2006 (a 28-20 Kentucky win) and 2009 (a 21-13 Clemson win).

The first meeting took place in 1925, a Southern Conference contest won by the Wildcats in Lexington, 19-6. The first six games of the series were played in Lexington and Kentucky won five of the six. The greatest upset in the series took place in 1929 when Kentucky defeated a 6-0 Tiger squad, 44-6, in Lexington.

The two teams played in the 1971 season opener at Clemson. Kentucky won that game, 13-10, after Doug Kotar took the opening kickoff, the opening kickoff of the season, 98 yards for a score.

Clemson defeated Kentucky, 21-3, during the Tigers' first national championship campaign in 1981 and earned a 24-6 win against the Wildcats a year later.

Kentucky stymied the Clemson offense for the first half in 1981 and led 3-0 at halftime. But the Tigers stormed back for 21 second-half points behind touchdowns by Kevin Mack, Homer Jordan and Chuck McSwain. The Tigers ran their record to 4-0 with the win and moved into the top 10 in the polls for the first time since 1959 after the victory. Cliff Austin scored three touchdowns and ran for 116 yards on the ground to pace the offense to the 1982 win.

#### LAST MEETING VS. KENTUCKY

Clemson 21, Kentucky 13

(Dec. 27, 2009, Nashville, Tenn.)

NASHVILLE, Tenn. — C.J. Spiller totaled 172 all-purpose yards and a rushing score in his final collegiate game to lead Clemson to a 21-13 win over Kentucky in the Music City Bowl at LP Field in Nashville, Tenn. It was the Tigers' first bowl win since 2005, ending a three-game bowl losing streak.

Spiller earned game MVP honors, as he had 67 rushing yards, three catches for 58 yards and 47 kickoff-return yards. His touchdown was the 51st of his career to set what was at the time a school record.

The Tiger offense was productive despite totaling just 47 offensive plays. Clemson set bowl records for yards per play (6.8) and yards per carry (5.5) in its 321-yard performance.

The Wildcats drove 61 yards on their opening possession, capped by Morgan Newton's 17-yard touchdown pass to Chris Matthews. The Tigers answered late in the first quarter with Kyle Parker's 32-yard touchdown pass to Jacoby Ford over the middle.

Jamie Harper, who had 79 yards on eight carries, gave Clemson the lead in the second quarter on his one-yard plunge.

In the fourth quarter, Kavell Conner stripped Gene McCaskill and Jarvis Jenkins recovered at the Wildcat 19. Three plays later, Spiller scored on an eight-yard touchdown run.

Kentucky drove 60 yards on its last drive, but Ricky Sapp tackled Newton just short of the first-down marker on fourth down at the Tiger 25. Clemson drained the final 5:27 off the clock thanks to 53 combined rushing yards by Spiller and Harper.

#### ON THIS DATE

- Dec. 29, 1978: Clemson defeated Ohio State 17-15 at the Gator Bowl in Danny Ford's first game as head coach and Woody Hayes' final game at Ohio State. The winning touchdown was scored by freshman Cliff Austin, who scored a critital touchdown three years later in Clemson's national championship win against Nebraska in the Orange Bowl. Charlie Bauman made the key play with an interception of an Art Schlichter pass with just two minutes left. He ran the return out of bounds on the Ohio State sideline and was punched by Hayes.
- Dec. 29, 2014: Clemson concluded the season with its 10th victory, a 40-6 win over No. 24 Oklahoma. Cole Stoudt earned MVP honors by throwing for 319 yards and three touchdowns as the Tigers' 34-point win tied a school record for victory margin over a ranked opponent. The win gave Clemson three straight bowl wins over opposing coaches that had won the national

- **Dec. 29, 2018:** Clemson appeared in the Cotton Bowl for the first time since Jan. 1, 1940. Clemson defeated Notre Dame, 30-3, in a College Football Playoff semifinal game that represented the first matchup of undefeated teams in CFP history.
- Dec. 29, 2021: Despite being without the services of 30 scholarship players from its initial camp roster, Clemson battled to a 20-13 win against lowa State in the Cheez-It Bowl in Orlando, Fla. to extend its streak of consecutive 10-win seasons to 11. The win was Dabo Swinney's 150th in 186 career games, making him the sixth-fastest head coach in FBS history (and fourth-fastest in the modern era) to reach 150 career victories.
- **Overall:** Clemson is 4-1 all-time in games contested on Dec. 29, including wins in each of its last three Dec. 29 games.

#### **NOTES FROM LAST GAME**

- Clemson now has a 155-52 advantage in its fivegame winning streak in games played at South Carolina, including a 118-20 edge in its last four trips to Williams-Brice Stadium.
- Clemson surrendered only 155 total yards, its fewest surrendered in its series with South Carolina since 1989 (155)
- The 169 yards allowed were the fewest surrendered by Clemson against an FBS opponent since allowing only 98 yards against Miami (Fla.) last November.
- South Carolina entered the week ranked 15th in the nation in passing yards per game (293.1). Clemson held South Carolina to 112 passing yards in the contest.
- South Carolina quarterback Spencer Rattler was held to a 79.3 pass efficiency rating, the lowest of any start of his career.
- South Carolina completed 16-of-32 passes (50 percent). Clemson has now held four consecutive opponents to a completion percentage of 50 percent or below for the first time since a six-game streak in 2019.
- After allowing a touchdown drive in the first quarter, Clemson forced eight punts and a turnover on downs on South Carolina's nine remaining possessions.
- Clemson rushed for 219 yards and has now rushed for 200 yards in three straight games for the first time since the final three games of the 2022 regular season.
- Clemson produced a sixth 200-yard rushing game this season to give the Tigers at least six 200-yard rushing performances in a season for the first time since 2019 (10).
- Clemson held the ball for 38:00 and has now recorded at least 38 minutes of possession in back-to-back games. It marks the first time under Dabo Swinney that Clemson has held the ball for at least 38 minutes in consecutive games.
- Clemson won the game despite not scoring an offensive touchdown. It was Clemson's first win in a game in which its offense did not score a touchdown since 2014 at Louisville (23-17).
- Clemson opened the scoring on a 42-yard fumble return touchdown by safety Khalil Barnes. It marked Clemson's second straight year opening the South Carolina game with a defensive touchdown, as Jeremiah Trotter Jr. scored the first points of the 2022 game on a 35-yard interception return for touchdown.
- Barnes' touchdown snapped a six-game streak for Clemson in which its opponents had scored first. Clemson is now 79-6 when scoring first since 2015.
- Barnes' score came 35 seconds into the game, representing Clemson's quickest score in its series against South Carolina since C.J. Spiller ran back the opening kickoff of the 2009 game in 19 seconds.
  - Barnes' touchdown was Clemson's fifth defensive

- touchdown of the season to tie the 1990 season for the most by the Tigers in a season since 1950.
- On South Carolina's next play from scrimmage, Barnes recorded his third interception of his freshman season. Barnes became the first Clemson player to record a takeaway on consecutive plays from scrimmage by an opponent since Brian Dawkins against Duke in 1995.
- Barnes became the first Clemson freshman with three or more interceptions in a season since Jayron Kearse in 2013 (four).
- Barnes became only the second FBS player and the only FBS freshman to record three or more interceptions, multiple forced fumbles and multiple sacks this season
- Barnes became the first Clemson player with a fumble recovery and an interception in the same game since Dorian O'Daniel at Virginia Tech in 2017.
- Clemson opened the game with takeaways on each of South Carolina's first two possessions. The last time Clemson notched takeaways on its opponents first two possessions was on Oct. 1, 2011 against Virginia Tech.
- Clemson won the turnover margin, 2-1, and has now won the turnover margin for a fourth consecutive game for the first time since 2020.
- Quarterback Cade Klubnik completed 15-of-27 passes for 100 yards and rushed for a career-high 52 yards on 11 attempts.
- On his 14th pass attempt of the game, Klubnik (401) posted the ninth 400-attempt passing season in Clemson history. On the same pass, Klubnik (501) also became the 14th player in Clemson history to attempt 500 career passes.
- Klubnik (260) now has the 10th-most pass completions in a season in Clemson history.
- Klubnik became the 24th Clemson quarterback since 1954 to win his first start against South Carolina. He joined Charlie Bussey (1955), Bill Barbary (1957), Lowndes Shingler (1960), Jim Parker (1963), Jimmy Addison (1966), Ken Pengitore (1972), Mark Fellers (1974), Steve Fuller (1976), Homer Jordan (1980), Mike Eppley (1983), Rodney Williams (1985), Chris Morocco (1989), DeChane Cameron (1990), Dexter McCleon (1993), Brandon Streeter (1998), Woodrow Dantzler (1999), Charlie Whitehurst (2002), Cullen Harper (2007), Deshaun Watson (2014), Kelly Bryant (2017), Trevor Lawrence (2018) and DJ Uiagalelei (2021).
- On his fourth reception of the game, wide receiver Tyler Brown (51) became the fifth Clemson player since 2010 to record 50 receptions in a freshman season, joining Antonio Williams (56 in 2022), Artavis Scott (76 in 2014), Sammy Watkins (82 in 2011) and DeAndre Hopkins (52 in 2010).
- With 112 all-purpose yards in the game, running back Will Shipley (4,121) passed Jacoby Ford (4,083) for ninth on Clemson's all-time leaderboard for career all-purpose yards.
- Linebacker Barrett Carter recorded his third sack of the season in the second quarter, ending a South Carolina drive
- Kicker Jonathan Weitz recorded a career-long 50-yard field goal in the first quarter. It was Clemson's longest field goal since a 52-yarder by B.T. Potter in the 2022 ACC Championship Game.
- Weitz' 50-yarder came in the same stadium as the first 50-yard field goal in Clemson history, a 52-yarder by Eddie Seigler against South Carolina in 1971.
- Weitz added a 49-yard field goal in the second quarter and a 42-yarder in the third quarter. All three of his field goals on Saturday exceeded his previous career long (41).
- Weitz' three field goals tied the Clemson record in a single game against South Carolina, set by several players but most recently by B.T. Potter in 2021.

- Weitz's three field goals of 40-plus yards tied a school record, shared by Bob Paulling (vs. North Carolina in 1982), Nelson Welch (vs. NC State in 1991), Mark Buchholz (vs. Wake Forest in 2007) and Chandler Catanzaro (vs. Troy in 2011).
- Defensive tackle Ruke Orhorhoro ended a South Carolina drive with a third-down sack in the third quarter. It was his career-high fifth sack of the season.
- Orhorhoro has now recorded a sack in consecutive games for the second time this season (at Syracuse and vs. Wake Forest).
- Center Will Putnam played his 59th career game to surpass Mitch Hyatt (58) for the most games played by an offensive lineman in school history.
- Putnam made his 48th career start to move into sole possession of the fourth-most starts by an offensive lineman in school history.
- Defensive tackle Tyler Davis made his 51st career start to extend his Clemson record for the most career starts by a defensive player.
- Davis pulled within one start of PK Chandler Catanzaro (52) for the fourth-most career starts in Clemson history.
- Defensive end Xavier Thomas played his 60th career game, becoming the seventh player in Clemson history to reach that mark.
- Clemson entered the game having led the all-time series with the Gamecocks for 45,663 consecutive days (125 years, 8 days). South Carolina won the series opener in 1896 before Clemson evened the series in 1897. Clemson won the third game in the series on Nov. 17, 1898 to take a 2-1 series lead, a lead Clemson hasn't relinquished.
- Captains for the contest were quarterback Hunter Helms, defensive end Justin Mascoll, center Will Putnam and defensive end Xavier Thomas.

#### WITH THE WIN...

- Clemson has now won eight games in a season for the 41st time in school history. It represents Clemson's 13th consecutive eight-win season and its 14th overall in Dabo Swinney's 15 full seasons as head coach.
- Clemson (150-28) earned its 150th win since the start of the 2011 season. Clemson joined Alabama (161 prior to Saturday) as the only programs to win 150 games since 2011.
- Clemson earned its 300th road win in school history.
- Clemson improved to 73-43-4 all-time against South Carolina. Clemson's 73 all-time wins against South Carolina are the program's most against any opponent.
- Clemson moved its all-time road record against South Carolina to 54-32-3. Clemson's 54 road wins at South Carolina are double its most all-time road wins against any other opponent, as Clemson's second-most road wins against an opponent are 27 at Wake Forest. The Tigers have more road wins against the Gamecocks in Columbia (54) than they have total wins against all but three programs (South Carolina, 72; Wake Forest, 71; and NC State, 60)
- Clemson has now earned a fifth straight road win against South Carolina for the first time since defeating the Gamecocks on the road six straight times across the 1989-99 seasons.
- Barring a circumstance in which a 5-7 team is needed to fill an otherwise vacant bowl spot, Clemson's victory could deny South Carolina bowl eligibility by virtue of a win in the last game of the regular season for the first time since doing so against 5-6 South Carolina squads in both 2002 and 2003.
- Swinney improved to 9-6 all-time against South Carolina.
- Swinney joined Frank Howard (13) as the only Clemson coaches to defeat South Carolina nine times.

- Swinney earned Clemson's 54th all-time road win against South Carolina on the week of his 54th birthday.
- Clemson improved to 12-2 in its last 14 regular season games against SEC opponents, dating to 2014.
- With the win against the 5-6 Gamecocks, Clemson still has not lost to an opponent with a losing record at the time of kickoff since 2010 against 2-5 Boston College.
- Clemson earned its 36th road win since 2015, tied with Ohio State for the national lead in that time frame.
- Clemson improved to 130-18 against AP-unranked teams under Dabo Swinney and improved to 107-8 in those games since the start of the 2012 season.
- Clemson improved to 29-8 in night games since the start of the 2018 season. The win also moved Clemson to 48-11 at night since 2015.
- Clemson improved to 22-5 in road night games since 2015.
- Clemson is now 12-5 in night games against South Carolina all-time. Clemson has won each of the programs' last five meetings in night games (2016, 2017, 2018, 2021 and 2023)..
- Clemson improved to 8-3 all-time in night games at Williams-Brice Stadium.
- Clemson improved to 94-12 in regular season play since the start of the 2015 season. Ten of Clemson's 12 regular season losses in that span have been decided by a final margin of 10 or fewer points.
- Clemson is now 69-2 since 2015 when outscoring opponents in the "Middle Eight," defined as the final four minutes of the first half and the first four minutes of the second half. Clemson won that time window by a 3-0 margin Saturday.
- Clemson now has a 130-8 record when totaling more first downs than its opponent since 2011.
- Clemson now has a 77-4 record when winning the turnover margin since 2011.
- Clemson improved to 81-3 when rushing for 200+ yards under Dabo Swinney.
- Clemson finished 4-0 in games in the month of November and has now won 25 of its last 28 November games
- Clemson has now won 113 of its last 114 games when holding teams under 23 points (dates to 2010).
- Clemson has now won 114 of its last 119 games when leading at halftime.
- Clemson improved to  $135-4\ \text{since}\ 2011\ \text{when}$  leading after three quarters.

#### **CLEMSON ADDS MATT LUKE & CHRIS RUMPH**

Clemson announced on Monday, Dec. 4 that it had named Matt Luke as Offensive Line Coach and Chris Rumph as Defensive Ends Coach. Luke and Rumph assumed roles held previously by Thomas Austin and Lemanski Hall, respectively, both of whom Head Coach Dabo Swinney announced on Nov. 30 would not return to Clemson's coaching staff.

Luke, 47, brings more than 20 years of experience as an offensive line coach, co-offensive coordinator and head coach. Most recently, he served as the assistant head coach/offensive line coach at Georgia from 2020-21, helping the Bulldogs to a 22-3 record in that span and helping guide Georgia in 2021 to its first national championship in 41 years.

"My family and I are incredibly excited about this opportunity," Luke said. "I have always had tremendous admiration for Dabo as a man, as a coach and as a leader, and I am excited for the opportunity to help him win another national championship at Clemson."

Prior to his time at Georgia, Luke spent eight seasons at Ole Miss from 2012-19, serving initially as the Rebels'

assistant head coach/offensive line coach from 2012-16 prior to being elevated to interim head coach in the weeks leading up to the 2017 season. After a rivalry win to conclude the 2017 regular season, Ole Miss removed the interim tag from his title, and he guided the Rebels for an additional two years through the conclusion of the 2019 season. During his tenure, Luke's coaching helped guide tackle Laremy Tunsil to three All-SEC honors en route to Tunsil's selection as the No. 13 overall pick in the 2016 NFL Draft, Ole Miss' highest-selected offensive lineman in more than 60 years.

Luke began his coaching career at Ole Miss, his alma mater, in 1999 as a student assistant coach. He went on to serve as Murray State's offensive line coach from 2000-01 before returning to Ole Miss in 2002 to oversee the offensive line and tight ends from 2002-05 under head coaches David Cutcliffe and Ed Orgeron. In 2006, Luke reunited with Cutcliffe at Tennessee, serving as the Volunteers' offensive line and tight ends coach for two seasons. In that time, he helped the Vols to a 19-8 record and a division title while also serving as recruiting coordinator for Tennessee's top-five recruiting class in 2007. In 2008, Luke followed Cutcliffe to Duke, where he served as the Blue Devils' co-offensive coordinator and offensive line coach.

"Matt is exactly what we needed with his hire," Swinney said. "He brings an incredible résumé and a wealth of experience and has worked with a bunch of great coaches and players over his career. He is very familiar with our footprint in recruiting. I have no doubt he will be a great addition."

Rumph, 51, returned to Clemson with more than 25 years of coaching experience, including the last four years at the NFL level and 17 years of Division I experience from 2003-19 with some of the biggest name brands in college football. After serving as head coach at Calhoun (S.C.) County High School from 1997-2001, as defensive backs coach at South Carolina State in 2002 and as outside linebackers coach at Memphis from 2003-05, Rumph made his Power Five coaching debut at Clemson, serving as the Tigers' defensive line coach from 2006-10.

"For me, this is coming home," Rumph said. "Clemson is a great fit for me and my family in terms of the town and the quality of the people. The passion of the fan base is second-to-none... Clemson is a program that has won consistently and won at the highest levels under Coach Swinney. I am excited to do my part to return the program where it aspires to be and once again have Clemson in the College Football Playoff and competing for national championships year in and year out."

In Rumph's first stint at Clemson, he contributed to the success of two of the most decorated defensive ends in program history. In 2006, he worked with senior defensive end Gaines Adams, who became the second unanimous All-American in program history that season before being selected with the No. 4 overall pick in the 2007 NFL Draft. In 2010, he guided junior Da'Quan Bowers — now a member of Clemson's support staff — as Bowers led the nation in sacks (15.5) and tackles for loss (26.0) en route to winning both the Nagurski Trophy and the Ted Hendricks Award.

Rumph spent the last four years in the NFL including the last two as defensive line coach with the Minnesota Vikings. He served in the same capacity for the Chicago Bears in 2021, helping the Bears to 49 sacks, fourthmost in the NFL. He coached outside linebackers for the Houston Texans in his NFL coaching debut in 2020.

After his first stint at Clemson, Rumph went on to serve in various capacities at Alabama, Texas, Florida and Tennessee over a nine-season span. From 2011-13, he helped Alabama produce six NFL Draft picks along his defensive line in addition to helping the Crimson Tide

bring home national championships in both 2011 and 2012. In both of those national title-winning seasons, Rumph's group contributed to Alabama leading the nation in both total defense and scoring defense.

"Chris really fits what I was looking for in this hire," Swinney said. "I wanted someone with NFL experience — and he certainly brings that — and I was looking for the right recruiting fit as someone who grew up in this state and played in this state. We've had a great relationship for a long time now and, honestly, he was a guy that almost came back a couple of other times over the years, but this is the right time and I'm excited to welcome him and Kila back and him continuing the great tradition we've had with our defensive ends."

#### -- BEST IS THE STANDARD --

#### ONE OF THE ERA'S WINNINGEST PROGRAMS

Alabama and Clemson rank No. 1 and 2 in the country in wins since 2015, with the two teams combining for five out of eight national championships in that time frame. With a dominating win in the 2022 ACC Championship Game, Clemson became the second program in the FBS to win 100 games since 2015.

With a No. 22 ranking in the final College Football Playoff rankings in 2023, Clemson became one of three programs (alongside Alabama and Ohio State) to finish in the CFP Top 25 in all 10 years of the four-team format.

Among the 15 programs ever to qualify for the College Football Playoff, Clemson entered 2023 as one of only five to hold a positive point differential in CFP play. Clemson also owns three of the eight largest wins by point differential in CFP history and is the only program to win three CFP games by at least 25 points.

#### **SENIOR SUCCESS**

Every January, Head Coach Dabo Swinney conducts his first official meeting with his new team. The first order of business in the meeting is to "reset the room," reorganizing the seating arrangement with seniors in front and all succeeding classes in order behind them in the team auditorium.

Several of Swinney's senior classes placed themselves among select company in college football history. The 2017, 2018, 2019 and 2020 Clemson seniors account for four of only 13 four-year classes in FBS history to reach 50 career wins. That includes the 2018 and 2019 groups that are tied with the 2018 Alabama seniors for the most wins in FBS history (55 wins in four years).

#### HISTORIC CONFERENCE REIGN

Clemson's 2022 ACC title was the program's seventh in eight years, as the Tigers became the first team in an active Power Five conference to win seven outright conference titles in an eight-year span since Alabama won eight SEC titles in nine seasons from 1971-79.

Two years earlier, Clemson became the first program ever to win 20 ACC Championships. That year, Clemson became the first program in the conference championship game era to win six straight conference championship games. Clemson also became the first ACC program to

win six consecutive outright titles, as Florida State had a streak of nine straight ACC titles, but that streak included two co-championships that prevented Bobby Bowden's Seminoles from ever winning more than three straight titles outright.

Including titles from its days as a member of the Southern Intercollegiate Athletic Association and Southern Conference, Clemson has 27 conference championships overall, also the most of any current ACC school. Duke ranks second among the ACC's current membership with 18 overall conference titles, including 11 Southern Conference titles and seven ACC titles.

The Tigers won the 1900, 1902 and 1903 SIAA Conference championships under John Heisman, then the 1906 SIAA title under Bob Williams. Clemson also won the 1940 and 1948 Southern Conference titles under Frank Howard. Howard won eight total conference titles, including two in the Southern Conference and six in the ACC. Swinney matched Howard with his eighth conference title in 2022.

#### POWER OVER THE POWER FIVE

Early in his head coaching tenure, Dabo Swinney laid out his belief to then-Clemson athletic director Terry Don Phillips that the Tigers needed to add tough non-conference challenges on top of their tests in ACC play to serve as a foundation for the program's growth.

"I had a conversation with Terry Don and said, 'Terry Don, I know we are not very good right now, but we need to play people because that is going to help me teach and help me develop the culture and the mindset that you have to have to win at the highest level," recounted Swinney. "I didn't think we had that, and that's what we committed to. That's what we've done."

That scheduling philosophy and culture change has resonated in the Clemson program, and since 2013, no team can claim more wins against Power Five Conference opponents than the Tigers. On Nov. 12, 2022, Clemson became the first program to reach 100 victories against Power Five opponents since 2013.

Clemson's national-best 108 Power Five wins since 2013 include victories against Wake Forest (11), Boston College (10), Syracuse (10), Georgia Tech (10), NC State (8), Louisville (8), South Carolina (8), Florida State (7), North Carolina (5), Miami (4), Notre Dame

On a year-by-year basis, Clemson has finished the season atop the country in wins against Power Five opponents four times since the institution of the College Football Playoff in 2014, including four of the last seven years. That includes 13 wins against Power Five opponents in 2018, the first team ever to reach that figure.

#### SIGN AND DEVELOP

While proud of his incoming classes, Head Coach Dabo Swinney has long stated that a true ranking of a recruiting class cannot and should not be published until four years later when the group can be evaluated on performance rather than potential.

Much to Swinney's delight, The Athletic has annually assumed that role in recent years, re-ranking every recruiting class four years later to account for on-field performance.

For its re-rankings, The Athletic uses the following grading scale: 5 points: All-American, award winner, top-50 NFL Draft pick; 4: Multi-year starter, allconference honors; 3: One-year starter or key reserve; 2: Career backup; 0: Minor or no contribution, left the program. The outlet also adds a bonus to each program's class average, derived from its total number of wins from 2017 through 2020 (e.g.: For re-ranking the Class of 2017, Clemson won 51 games, so its class average received a bonus of 0.51).

Even in its current stretch of recruiting success, Swinney has pointed out that Clemson often falls in rankings as its commitment to not oversigning leads to smaller recruiting classes, as well as noting that much of Clemson's on-field success is a function of the program's development, citing All-Americans like former three-star Isaiah Simmons or former two-star Nolan Turner. The re-rankings illustrate Clemson's impressive track record of talent identification, culture fit, resource allocation and player development.

On average, Clemson ranked 11.5 in the 247 Composite team rankings across the 2014-19 recruiting cycles. Upon re-ranking those groups, despite having little room for improvement while recruiting at a Top 15 clip in that span, Clemson ranked 3.5 on average

in the re-rankings, a ratings bump of eight spots. Each of those Clemson classes averaged at least 11 wins a season during their careers.

#### CLEMSON'S ALL-TIME WINNINGEST COACH

College Football Hall of Famer Frank Howard, known as "The Bashful Baron of Barlow Bend," compiled a 165-118-12 record in 30 seasons at Clemson from 1940-69. With a 31-23 upset of No. 12 Notre Dame on Nov.

4, Dabo Swinney earned his 166th career victory as Clemson's head coach, surpassing Howard to become Clemson's all-time winningest coach. Swinney accomplished the feat in his 209th career game.

#### **THROUGH 200 GAMES**

The 2022 Orange Bowl was the 200th game in Dabo Swinney's head coaching career. Among coaches who qualify for the NCAA FBS record book by virtue of five years or 50 wins as a major college head coach, 17 coaches had earned at least 150 victories in their first 200 career games as head coach as of the conclusion of the 2022 season.

At 161-39 through 200 games, Swinney tied Bob Stoops and Robert Neyland (162 each) for the fifthmost wins through 200 career games in major college football history.

Four previous Clemson head coaches earned 150+ FBS wins in their careers: John Heisman (186), Jess Neely (207), Frank Howard (165) and Ken Hatfield (168). Howard, a College Football Hall of Famer,

recorded his 150th victory in his 273rd career game, in a 14-10 victory against Maryland in 1966 that clinched a piece of what later became an outright ACC title. Heisman earned win No. 150 in game No. 203, Neely earned it in game No. 268, and Hatfield did it in game 259, though none of those three won more than 43 games in their Clemson tenures.

#### **FIRST 15 SEASONS**

Dabo Swinney completed his 15th season (and his 14th full season) in 2022 with a 161-39 record. Swinney amassed the second-most wins through a coach's first 15 seasons in FBS history despite not having the benefit of a full season in his first year, as he went 4-3 on an interim basis in his first season in 2008 after taking over for Tommy Bowden in October.

#### **HEAD COACH CONTINUITY**

Over the last decade, Clemson became a beacon of stability in the increasingly unstable environment of college football. Clemson Head Coach Dabo Swinney is in his 21st overall season at Clemson in 2023, including his 15th full season as head coach (and his 16th including an interim stint in 2008).

From the start of Swinney's first season as full-time head coach in 2009 through 2022, there were more than 435 head coaching tenures in the FBS (excluding those by interims) but only one such tenure at Clemson.

Entering this postseason, Clemson is the only school in the ACC with only one head coach since the start of the 2009 season, and among the 15 schools ever to qualify for the College Football Playoff, only Clemson and Alabama have had only one head coach since

#### SIX "FINAL FOURS" FOR SWINNEY

While the term "Final Four" may still be the linguistic property of college basketball, since the advent of the four-team College Football Playoff in 2014, Head Coach Dabo Swinney had Clemson among the sport's final four teams six times from 2015-20, becoming the first coach to lead a team to six consecutive College Football Playoffs since the format's institution in 2014.

The NCAA men's college basketball tournament dates to 1939. In the history of that tournament, only John Wooden of UCLA (nine from 1967-75) and Mike Krzyzewski of Duke (five from 1988-92) coached teams to at least five consecutive Final Fours. With his sixth "Final Four" appearance in 2020, Swinney joined basketball's Wooden as the only college football or men's basketball coaches to take teams to six consecutive Final Fours in their respective sports.

Swinney is among only nine coaches in football and men's basketball to record six career Final Four berths. He is one of only six with a winning record in Final Four

Swinney's ability to place his team among the nation's elite quartet has also been illustrated by the polls. Clemson finished first in the AP Poll in 2016 and 2018, second in 2015 and 2019, third in 2020 and fourth in 2017. Swinney became just the fourth coach to record at least six consecutive top four finishes since the AP Poll began in 1936, an exclusive list that also includes Florida State's Bobby Bowden (13), USC's Pete Carroll (seven) and Oklahoma's Bud Wilkinson (six).

Clemson's streak represented the fifth time a program has had a run of at least six top four finishes in the AP Poll. Miami (Fla.) had a seven-year run from 1986-92 with two different head coaches leading the program.

Swinney's 101st career regular-season conference win pushed him past Frank Howard (100) for sole possession of the Clemson record for career regular season conference victories. #### RILEY'S TRACK RECORD

On Jan. 9, Garrett Riley coached Cinderella TCU in the College Football Playoff National Championship Game. On Jan. 13, he was formally announced as Clemson's offensive coordinator and quarterbacks coach for 2023.

After two years as offensive coordinator of SMU's prolific offenses from 2020-21, Riley arrived at TCU following a 2021 campaign in which the Horned Frogs finished 5-7 and produced the nation's 65th-ranked scoring offense. In his lone season in Fort Worth, he transformed the unit into the nation's ninth-ranked scoring offense at 38.8 points per game as the Horned Frogs went 13-2 with a berth in the national championship game.

Riley's tutelage led quarterback Max Duggan to a multitude of honors for his play in 2022, including the Davey O'Brien Award as the nation's top quarterback, a runner-up finish in Heisman Trophy voting, All-America honors from several selectors and Big 12 Offensive Player of the Year.

All three offenses coordinated by Riley prior to his arrival at Clemson finished in the top 15 nationally in scoring offense. His units as coordinator at SMU and TCU from 2020-22 combined would rank third in the nation in points per game in that span.

#### ACADEMIC AND COMMUNITY STANDOUT

Shipley earned Academic All-America honors in 2022, becoming Clemson's first running back to earn Academic All-America status and becoming its first Academic All-American at any position since center Dalton Freeman in 2012. In December 2023, Shipley graduated with his degree in management in only three years with a perfect 4.0 GPA.

This year, Shipley became the ninth member of the Clemson program all-time to earn AFCA Good Works Team honors, joining Robert Carswell (1999), Nick Eason (2000), Xavier Dye (2009), Deshaun Watson (2016), Sean Pollard (2018), Dabo Swinney (2019), Trevor Lawrence (2020) and Darien Rencher (2021). He was also named as a Wuerffel Trophy semifinalist.

His philanthrophy includes presenting a \$10,000 check in May 2022 to Levine Children's Hospital in his home metro area of Charlotte, as well as team with former Clemson defensive end K.J. Henry to donate five figures to create the 1 CLEM5ON endowment in November 2022 to benefit Clemson University's Harvey and Lucinda Gantt Multicultural Center and Clemson Athletics' "Hear Her Roar" campaign.

Shipley produced the 23rd 1,000-yard rushing season in school history in 2022, finishing the year seventh in single-season rushing touchdowns and 11th in single-season rushing yards in Clemson annals.

#### SHIP'S MAIDEN VOYAGE IN 2021

Despite missing three games of his debut season due to multiple injuries, Shipley led Clemson in rushing touchdowns (11), total touchdowns (11), rushing attempts (149) and rushing yards (738) as a true freshman in 2021.

Shipley's freshman performance in 2021 was another entry in Clemson's recent history of feature backs declaring their arrival immediately. Clemson was led in rushing yards in each of the previous seven years by either Wayne Gallman (2014-16) or Travis Etienne (2017-20), both of whom led Clemson in rushing in their freshman seasons (Gallman's redshirt freshman season in 2014 and Etienne's true freshman season in 2017). Before Shipley, the last time someone other than Etienne or Gallman led Clemson in rushing in a season was 2013 (Rod McDowell), when Shipley was in fifth grade.

Shipley's 2021 performance ranked second in rushing touchdowns by a Clemson true freshman since 1972.

Klubnik made his debut in the Clemson-South Carolina rivalry in 2023 and led the Tigers to 16-7 road win in Columbia. In doing so, he became the 24thClemson quarterback since 1954 to win his first

#### FROM THE SIDELINE TO THE STAGE

Klubnik's national breakout came in the 2022 ACC Championship Game against North Carolina. He entered the game on Clemson's third possession and completed 20-of-24 passes for 279 yards and a passing touchdown and added seven carries for 30 yards and a rushing touchdown. His 83.3 completion percentage set an ACC Championship Game record and led to his selection as the game's Most Valuable Player in Clemson's 39-10 victory. He became the third freshman (and second true freshman) in the game's history to earn the honor.

#### 300+ IN FIRST CAREER START

In the 2022 Orange Bowl, Cade Klubnik completed 30-of-54 passes for 320 yards and also rushed 20 times for 51 yards with a touchdown. His 74 plays of total offense (combined rush attempts and pass attempts) were the fifth-most by an individual in Clemson history.

Klubnik's 320 yards were the fourth-most by a Clemson quarterback making his first career start since 1953, as he became only the fourth Clemson quarterback to exceed 300 passing yards in their first start.

Klubnik became the first Clemson freshman quarterback on record to make his starting debut in postseason play. He also became the first Clemson quarterback to make his first career start against an AP Top 6 opponent since his former offensive coordinator, Brandon Streeter, did so against No. 5 Florida State in 1997.

Klubnik became only the eighth true freshman to start at quarterback for Clemson since the NCAA instituted permanent freshman eligibility in 1972, joining Steve Fuller (1975), Willie Jordan (1975), Patrick Sapp (1992), Nealon Greene (1994), Deshaun Watson (2014), Trevor Lawrence (2018) and DJ Uiagalelei (2020).

#### **INSTANT IMPACT**

Tyler Brown's hometown of Greenville, S.C., is roughly 30 miles from Clemson, so perhaps it should have come as no surprise that he's seemed to feel right at home in Clemson's offense as a true freshman.

Brown has been one of the revelations of the early portion of Clemson's season, giving the Tigers a dynamic playmaker in slot.

Brown earned ACC Rookie of the Week honors against Florida Atlantic after recording three receptions for 49 yards and two touchdowns against the Owls, becoming the first Clemson freshman wide receiver with two receiving touchdowns in a single game since Justyn Ross against Notre Dame in the 2018 Cotton Bowl. Brown also added a 44-yard punt return in that contest. A week later, he recorded team highs and then-single-game career highs in receiving yards (84) and receptions (five) vs. No. 4 Florida State despite missing a portion of the game with a shoulder injury.

Against Syracuse the following week, he again recorded career highs in receptions (nine) and receiving yards (153). He became only the seventh player in Clemson history to record a 100-yard receiving game within the first five games of a career.

Brown's 153 receiving yards against the Orange were the most by a Clemson true freshman since Justyn Ross' 153 yards against Alabama in the College Football Playoff National Championship Game to conclude the 2018 season. His total represented the most receiving yards by a Clemson player of any grade classification since Cornell Powell's 176 yards against Pitt in 2020.

Brown earned both ACC Rookie of the Week and ACC Receiver of the Week for his performance at Syracuse. He joined Sammy Watkins and Deshaun Watson as the only players in school history to win multiple ACC weekly honors in a single week.

Brown's 316 receiving yards in his first five games were the third-most by a Clemson freshman (and second-most by a Clemson true freshman) through the first five games a season since 2000.

#### **MAFAH MAN'S CAREER DAY**

Mild-mannered but hard-running, Phil Mafah has long been referenced as part of a one-two punch at running back alongside his roommate Will Shipley. But with Shipley out with a concussion against No. 12 Notre Dame on Nov. 4, Mafah moved from a co-starring role to featured status and ran with the opportunity.

Technically, he ran with the opportunity a school-record-tying 36 times.

Mafah recorded a career-high 186 rushing yards on those 36 carries and tied his career high with two rushing touchdowns in the 31-23 win against the Irish. His 36 carries tied the school record shared by Jim Shirley (36 against NC State in 1951), Ray Yauger (36 against Wake Forest in 1969) and Raymond Priester (36 against Maryland in 1997).

Mafah's 186 yards were the most by a Clemson player since Kobe Pace's 191-yard rushing performance against Wake Forest in 2021. It was the first 150-yard rushing game by a Clemson player since Shipley's 172-yard rushing performance against Syracuse in 2022.

"I knew going into the game that I would probably have to take a bigger load so I just came in with a mindset that whatever carries I get, I'm going to try to make the most out of each and every one," Mafah said following the defeat of Notre Dame. "I'm just glad that included a win for us."

Mafah, dubbed "Mafah Man" by Running Backs Coach C.J. Spiller, continues to enjoy a career year, posting career bests in carries (168), rushing yards (894), rushing touchdowns (nine), yards per carry (5.32), receptions (19) and receiving yards (105).

#### **DYNAMIC DUO**

Reminiscent of Clemson's famous "Thunder and Lightning" duo of James Davis and C.J. Spiller from 2006-08, Mafah and his close friend Will Shipley have turned into one of the nation's top running back tandems.

With Mafah at 894 yards and Shipley at 798 yards, Clemson entered bowl season as one of only five schools this season to have multiple 750-yard rushers. Of those five, Clemson is one of four schools to have multiple running backs accomplish the feat.

The 2023 season marks the ninth time since 1948 that Clemson has produced multiple 750-yard rushers. It's Clemson's first such season since 2015, a year in which quarterback Deshaun Watson reached the mark. Prior to 2023, the last Clemson running back duo to accomplish the feat was Davis and Spiller, who reached the mark in both 2006 and 2007.

#### **TIGHT END PRODUCTION**

Clemson enjoyed a renaissance from its tight ends in 2022, when the unit produced 67 catches (most by a tight end unit under Dabo Swinney) and 10 touchdowns (tied for its most under Swinney). Jake Briningstool, a junior on Clemson's 2023 squad, joined current Los Angeles Ram Davis Allen to mark the first time in Clemson history that two tight ends caught at least four touchdown passes in a single season.

With Allen gone this season, Briningstool has emerged to lead Clemson's tight end unit.

This season, Briningstool turned in the signature performance of his career to date on Oct. 21, catching five passes for a school-tight-end-record 126 yards with two touchdowns against Miami (Fla.). A week later, he and Sage Ennis combined for 121 yards, the third-most prolific day by tight ends under Dabo Swinney.

#### AXE MAN JR.

For 12 seasons, NFL offenses attempted in vain to limit opportunities for four-time Pro Bowler Jeremiah "Axe Man" Trotter to trot out his signature axe chopping celebration after big stops. With the next generation of the Trotter middle linebacker bloodline — Jeremiah Trotter Jr. — patrolling the box at Clemson, the college football world shared in their pain in his two years as a starter in 2022 and 2023.

Jeremiah Jr., about whom both Head Coach Dabo Swinney and Defensive Coordinator Wes Goodwin joked "has been a middle linebacker since he was in diapers," elevated his game in the second half of Clemson's 2022 season. After producing 18 tackles (3.0 for loss) in Clemson's first six games, the coaches credited Axe Man Jr. with 74 stops (10.5 for loss), including six games with nine or more tackles, in Clemson's final eight contests, including with a team-high-tying nine tackles in the ACC Championship Game.

Though he was snubbed that year in official conference balloting, Trotter collected second-team All-America honors from the Associated Press, third-team All-America status from Pro Football Focus and collected All-ACC honors from select individual outlets.

In the 2022 regular season finale, Trotter recorded 2.0 sacks against South Carolina (in addition to scoring on a 35-yard interception return), and a week later, he set an ACC Championship Game record with 3.0 sacks against North Carolina. He became the first Clemson player with at least 2.0 sacks in consecutive games

since former No. 4 overall pick Clelin Ferrell early in the 2018 season

Trotter was among several Power Five players from notable NFL bloodlines in 2023. One of the most notable, Ohio State wide receiver Marvin Harrison Jr., was a high school teammate of Trotter's at St. Joseph Prep in Philadelphia.

In 2023, Trotter's national recognition for his play began to match his name recognition. He earned All-America status from numerous outlets and was a Butkus Award finalist before declaring for the 2024 NFL Draft.

Trotter recorded his most productive game of the season in Clemson's 31-23 upset of No. 12 Notre Dame on Nov. 4. He recorded a game-high 11 tackles, 2.5 tackles for loss, 2.0 sacks and an interception, which he returned 28 yards for a touchdown. He earned a bevy of awards for his performance, including Bronko Nagurski National Defensive Player of the Week, Bednarik Award Player of the Week, Walter Camp Defensive Player of the Week and ACC Linebacker of the Week.

Trotter became only the fifth FBS player (and second Power Five player) since 2005 to post double-digit tackles, at least 2.5 tackles for loss, 2.0 or more sacks and a pick-six in a single game.

The performance was Trotter's third career game with 2.0 or more sacks, making him the first Clemson linebacker to post three or more career games with 2.0 sacks in Dabo Swinney's tenure.

#### **BARRETT CARTER**

Head Coach Dabo Swinney has routinely sung the praises of the versatility of linebacker Barrett Carter, a 2023 preseason All-American.

"He's one of the best football players in my 20 years at Clemson," Swinney said. "He's a pure football player.

I mean, the guy can play anywhere. He could go play tailback, he could play corner, he can play safety, he can play Nickel/Sam, he can play Mike, he can play Will. He's special... He's so smart and he's got unbelievable instincts for the game."

Close observers of Clemson in 2022 quickly recognized Carter's impact in his first year as a starter, but Carter served notice of his arrival to the country with a signature performance against Louisville last November. In that game, Carter recorded eight tackles (3.5 for loss), two sacks, an interception and a pass breakup, becoming the first player to record 3.5 or more tackles for loss, 2.0 or more sacks and an interception in a game between two Power Five teams since South Carolina's Melvin Ingram against Auburn in 2011.

Carter finished 2022 credited by the coaching staff with 77 tackles (10.5 for loss), tied for third-most on the team, with 5.5 sacks, eight pass breakups, two interceptions and two forced fumbles in a unit-high 832 snaps over 13 games (all starts). His 832 snaps were the sixth-most by a Clemson linebacker on record.

Carter was one of only three players in the Power Five with at least 10 tackles for loss, 5.0 sacks, multiple interceptions and multiple forced fumbles in 2022. Before Carter and two others reached the marks in 2022, the last two Power Five players to reach Carter's numbers in all four categories were both Butkus Award winners: Georgia's Nakobe Dean (2021) and Clemson's Isaiah Simmons (2019).

No. O has also been a hero in the community. He has volunteered his time for the Our Friend Christopher organization in the memory of his late former teammate Christopher Miles, who died of a brain tumor. He also routinely reads to local elementary schools and serves as a mentor to local youth and has aspirations of one day opening a training facility for young athletes.

"I remember I was that young kid that looked up to football players," Carter said. "Now that I have the opportunity to give back, I have no choice but to do so. I just put myself in those shoes and remember when I was that kid."

#### **OPENING A CAN OF WOODAZ**

As conference and national acclaim began to accrue for Clemson's young linebacking duo of Barrett Carter and Jeremiah Trotter Jr. in late 2022, Dabo Swinney was quick to advise observers not to sleep on Wade Woodaz, now a true sophomore.

"He's a baller," Swinney said in September. "The kid is tough, physical, he can really run. He really understands the game at a high level. He played most of his [prep] career as a quarterback and as a safety, so he has a great understanding of the game. He plays really, really hard; he's a great effort guy, he's a great preparer and he loves it. He's a fun guy to coach and a fun guy to watch play because he plays the way you want everybody to play."

The first career start for versatile hybrid linebacker from Tampa actually came at safety in the 2022 ACC Championship Game. He then served as Clemson's primary Sam linebacker in the 2022 Orange Bowl.

Woodaz opened the 2023 season with a takeaway in three straight games. He recovered a muffed punt in the season opener at Duke, his second straight season opener with an impact special teams play after blocking a punt in his collegiate debut a year earlier. In Clemson's second game against Charleston Southern, he recorded his first career interception and returned it 35 yards for a touchdown to help Clemson blow the game open.

A week later against Florida Atlantic, he returned another interception 59 yards. In doing so, he became

the first Clemson linebacker with an interception in consecutive games since Isaiah Simmons accomplished the feat in the ACC Championship Game and Fiesta Bowl of his Butkus Award-winning 2019 campaign.

The only Clemson player since 1996 other than Woodaz to have a takeaway in each of the team's first three games of a season was DeAndre McDaniel, Clemson's current Senior Defensive Assistant, who posted a takeaway in each of Clemson's first three games in 2009 en route to All-America honors that season.

#### SURPRISE RETURNS ALONG D-LINE

Clemson's defensive line got a boost when defensive tackles Tyler Davis and Ruke Orhorhoro and defensive end Xavier Thomas all elected to return to Clemson for 2023 despite receiving draftable grades and feedback from NFL talent evaluators prior to the 2023 NFL Draft.

The returns of Davis (15.5 sacks from 2019-22) and Thomas (14.5 from 2018-22) made Clemson the only Power Five program to return multiple players with at least 14.0 career sacks for 2023. The addition of Orhorhoro's 7.0 sacks from 2019-22 gave the Tigers 37.0 returning career sacks from a trio that was previously presumed NFL-bound.

Injury limited Thomas to only three games in 2022. After missing the first five games of the season, he returned to action at Boston College, where despite playing only six snaps, he earned ACC Defensive Lineman of the Week after posting two sacks, a forced fumble and an additional quarterback hit, collecting the Leather Helmet Award from the Boston College Gridiron Club as the game's MVP.

Davis was a 2022 FWAA and Phil Steele All-American and entered 2023 as already a three-time All-ACC selection (2019, 2021 and 2022). Davis' three career All-ACC selections were tied with Christian Wilkins (2016-18), Dexter Lawrence (2016-18) and William "Refrigerator" Perry (1982-84) for the most by a defensive tackle in Clemson history, company befitting a player nicknamed "Baby Dex" by Dabo Swinney and "Mini Fridge" by former teammate K.J. Henry.

Entering bowl season, Thomas and Davis represented one of nine active FBS duos with 15 career sacks each.

Parker is a product of Central High School in Phenix City, Ala., a school that has become a Clemson hotbed in recent years. Parker became Clemson's fourth signee (and fifth overall player including walk-on safety Caleb Nix) from Central since 2018, a pipeline that started with Justyn Ross in Clemson's 2018 recruiting class.

Parker initially committed to Penn State but coveted a Clemson offer. He decommitted from the Nittany

Lions in hopes of soliciting Clemson, and Clemson's 2023 recruiting class immediately went to work.

"CV [Christopher Vizzina], Peter and a few other guys on the team, they hit me up with the eyes emoji on Instagram," Parker said. "It was like, 'You know what time it is.' I texted Coach Ski [Clemson Defensive Ends Coach Lemanski Hall] the eyes emoji, the same thing they sent me, and from there we got in contact and a few days later they offered and I committed."

#### THE CFP ERA'S DOMINANT DEFENSE

Since the advent of the College Football Playoff in 2014, Clemson has routinely produced one of the nation's elite defenses.

#### ACCEPTING THE CHALLENGE

Dabo Swinney was crystal clear both publicly and privately in the 2023 offseason in saying that Clemson needed to improve its pass defense from 2022.

"If we're a better pass defense and a better pass offense then we'll have a chance," Swinney said at ACC Football Kickoff in July. "If we keep everything else the same... I mean we were one point away last year — one point — from being in the playoff. So we've just got to improve in some of the areas that we weren't quite as good as we needed to be last year."

Defensive Coordinator Wes Goodwin and his staff accepted the challenge and the results have spoken for

Defensive Coordinator Wes Goodwin's defense truly validated its improvement against some of the best passers in ACC history in November.

On Nov. 18, Clemson held North Carolina quarterback Drake Maye to a 44.4 percent completion percentage (16-of-36), the lowest of his career. Clemson also held Maye to a 96.8 pass efficiency rating, another career low.

Two weeks earlier, Clemson held Notre Dame's Sam Hartman (formerly of Wake Forest) to the second-lowest passer rating of his career, trailing only his 2018 game against Clemson as a freshman. Clemson also held Georgia Tech's Haynes King and South Carolina's Spencer Rattler to their career lows as starters as well in November

#### **GOOD UNDER GOODWIN**

Goodwin took over as Clemson's defensive coordinator prior to the Tigers' 2021 Cheez-It Bowl win against Iowa State. He has now spent 27 games as Clemson's defensive coordinator, and he has held opponents below their season averages for both vards and points in 24 of those contests.

Included below are comparisons of the yards and points surrendered by Clemson in Goodwin's tenure as defensive playcaller. Games in which Goodwin's unit did not hold opponents below their season average are italicized.

#### THE OTHER SWINNEY DYNASTY

Like the Colquitt family punting at Tennessee, the Swinney family holding for placekicks at Clemson has become a dynasty of its own.

Head Coach Dabo Swinney's oldest son, Will, arrived at Clemson in 2017 and immediately earned Clemson's starting holder position on placekicks. He played five seasons and a record-tying 69 games at Clemson through 2021. In those five seasons, Clemson scored 565 points on placekicks, including field goals and PATs, and he held for 555 of those 565 points. The only 10 Clemson kicking points not held by Will in his career were instead held by his brother, Drew, who was Clemson's starter at the position in 2022.

Will and Drew are succeeded by the youngest of the three Swinney boys, Clay, a redshirt freshman who is Clemson's starting holder for 2023. Clay's presence creates a plausible scenario in which every Clemson placekick in a full 10-year span from 2017-26 could be held by a Swinney.

Clemson's last hold by any player outside the Swinney family was on the final point of Clemson's 2016 national championship, as Seth Ryan, coincidentally also the son of a famous long-time coach (Rex Ryan), held the PAT following Hunter Renfrow's game-winning touchdown with one second remaining.

or PATs. Will Swinney scored 12 additional points, six via receiving touchdown on offense and six via rushing touchdown on a fake field goal; Drew Swinney scored two additional points on a fake PAT.

#### SWANSON'S SURGE

Punter Aidan Swanson is in his fifth year at Clemson and his second year as Clemson's starting punter. In his first season as starter in 2022, Swanson averaged 42.3 yards on 62 punts, including 16 downed inside the 20, 13 of 50 or more yards and only two touchbacks.

This season, he has improved his punting average by a yard-and-a-half and is successfully placing his punts inside the 20 at a substantially higher rate. His 24 punts inside the 20 are four shy of the Clemson singleseason record set by Bradley Pinion (28 in 2014).

Swanson had a career day against Florida State on Sept. 23. His 53.2-yard average was a single-game high for his career, surpassing his 52.5-yard average against Syracuse in 2022. It was the best average by a Clemson punter with a minimum of three punts since Will Spiers' 53.6-yard average against Syracuse in 2020.

Swanson's four punts in that game included a 60-yarder in the first quarter and a 62-yarder in the third quarter. He joined Pittsburgh's Daniel Sparks (2022), Wake Forest's Dom Maggio (2019) and Miami's Pat O'Donnell (2013) as the only ACC players since 2008 with multiple 60-yard punts in a single game, according to Stats Perform.

Against Notre Dame on Nov. 4, Swanson placed a career-high five of his six punts inside the 20. It was the most punts placed inside the 20 by a Clemson punter since Will Spiers in the National Championship Game to end the 2019 season (five vs. LSU), earning Swanson ACC Specialist of the Week honors. Swanson would tie that mark again in the regular season finale, dropping five punts inside the 20 in a nine-point win against South Carolina.

Davis' selection is the fourth of his career, placing him in select company in school history. He joins Travis Etienne (five), C.J. Spiller (five), Nelson Welch (four) and Mitch Hyatt (four) as the only players in school history to collect at least four career All-ACC selections. Davis, who is Clemson's record holder for career starts by a defensive player (51), becomes the first defensive player in Clemson history to earn four career All-ACC honors.

Trotter, Wiggins, Carter, Briningstool, Miller and Orhorohoro were all first-time selections. Putnam earned a repeat selection after earning All-ACC honors a year ago.

Clemson's eight selections ranked tied for fourth in the ACC but the Tigers tied for second in first-team selections with three.

#### STRENGTH OF RECORD

Clemson has lost 17 games since 2015. Seven of Clemson's 17 losses since 2015 have come against AP Top 5 teams.

The opponents to whom Clemson has lost since 2015 have a combined final record of 168-49, a winning percentage of .774. Clemson has not lost to a team that finished with a losing record since 2017 and has not lost to a team with a losing record at the time of the game since losing to 2-5 Boston College in 2010, Dabo Swinney's second full season as head coach.

Losses to Top 5 opponents Ohio State and Georgia across the 2020 and 2021 seasons ended a streak of 127 games since losing back-to-back contests, which had been the longest active streak in the nation and the longest in ACC history.

Clemson had not lost back-to-back games in a single season since November 2011, a streak that was snapped with losses to Miami and NC State in October 2023. It snapped a streak of 161 consecutive games played in which Clemson hadn't lost back-to-back games in a single season, a Clemson record, and, at the time, the nation's longest active streak.

Under Swinney, Clemson is also 34-6 in games in which it enters ranked lower in the AP Poll than it did in its previous contest. This includes the 2014, 2016, 2017, 2018 and 2021 season openers in which Clemson opened the season lower than its ranking from the final game of the previous campaign.

#### FIRST DOWN DIFFERENTIAL

Clemson ranks tied for 18th in the nation in first downs per game (23.3) offensively in 2023, and Clemson's defense ranks fourth in the nation in first downs allowed per game (14.4).

Despite it coming in a four-loss campaign, Clemson's current advantage in average first downs would rank as Clemson's fourth-highest average first down differential on record.

#### OFFENSIVE BALANCE

Clemson has fielded one of the nation's most balanced offenses since 2018. In 2018, Clemson set a school record with 3,723 rushing yards. Just two years later, Clemson set a school record with 348.5 passing yards per game in 2020.

Clemson was perfect when exceeding both 200 rushing yards and 200 passing yards — 58-0 under Swinney and 108-0-1 all-time — until a defeat at Duke to open the 2023 season in which the Tigers reached the double-century mark in both categories. The defeat was also a statistical anomaly nationally, as from 2014 through the 2023 season opener, there had been 1,789 instances in which an FBS team had passed for 200-plus yards, rushed for 200-plus yards and given up 28 or fewer points in a single game. Teams who accomplished all three metrics were a combined 1748-41 (97.7 percent).

Clemson's 28 games reaching both 200 passing yards and 200 rushing yards since the start of the 2018 season are among the most in the country.

From 2018-22, Clemson was one of only three programs in the nation to both rush for at least 13,000 rushing yards and pass for at least 18,000 passing yards. Clemson was also the only program in the country to rush for 175+ rushing touchdowns (184) and throw 140+ passing touchdowns (144) in that span.

Since 2015, Clemson has frequently won one of the hidden "games within the game" on each side of halftime. SportSource Analytics tracks the "Middle Eight," the section of the game defined as the final four minutes of the first half and the first four minutes of the second half. Clemson has outscored opponents in that time window 71 times since 2015, posting a 69-2 record in those contests.

The approach to creating functional depth and rewarding players ready to play has been a key philosophy for Head Coach Dabo Swinney, whose own collegiate playing career was hatched as a walk-on fighting for playing time in Alabama's receiving corps.

"We're fully committed to playing guys who deserve to play," Swinney said. "You commit to a guy early in the season, and even if a guy has only played 10 percent of the snaps, when you get to game eight or nine, they've got some good experience."

Plenty of experience was accrued in Clemson's home opener against Charleston Southern when Clemson played a school-record 117 players in a 66-17 win. A week later, Clemson played 93 players in a 48-14 victory against Florida Atlantic.

#### YOUTH IS SERVED

In the first year of new redshirt regulations in 2018, Clemson played a then-school-record 20 true freshmen. Clemson immediately shattered that record in its 2019 season opener, with 27 true freshmen making their collegiate debuts in that contest. An additional eight true freshmen made their debuts to push that 2019 total to a school-record 36.

Clemson had 27 true freshmen appear in Clemson's Week 2 win against Charleston Southern. That game alone pushed Clemson's number of true freshmen played this season into second in a year since 1982. The number moved to 28 a week later when Misun "Tink" Kelley made his collegiate debut.

Coinciding with redshirt rule changes in 2018, Clemson's five most recent seasons have resulted in the most game action for first-year freshmen since 1982.

Six Clemson true freshmen — Jamal Anderson, Khalil Barnes, Tyler Brown, Shelton Lewis, T.J. Parker and Avieon Terrell — have appeared in every game for Clemson this season. As of early November, Clemson was one of only four programs (alongside Florida, LSU and Texas A&M) to have at least six true freshmen appear in every game this season.

Clemson's freshmen took center stage in a 42-21 win against Georgia Tech on Nov. 11, accounting for three of Clemson's six touchdowns (Tyler Brown, Josh Sapp and Shelton Lewis) and all four of Clemson's seasonhigh four interceptions (Khalil Barnes, Avieon Terrell, Kylon Griffin and Lewis). According to Stats Perform, it was the first time since at least 2000 that an FBS team had four different freshmen record an interception in a

#### **650-POINT SEASONS**

Clemson remains responsible for two of the 22 650-point seasons in major college football history and two of only 16 since Division I split in 1978. Clemson was the first school with back-to-back 650-point seasons since Yale in 1888-89, predating the start of official NCAA recordkeeping in 1937 and the second year of which was coincidentally the year Clemson was founded.

#### **FINISH**

In 2018, Clemson debuted a new version of its "This is Why We Work" fourth quarter video at Death Valley, a hype video imploring the team to finish and featuring Director of Strength and Conditioning Joey Batson bellowing:

"Let me tell you something right now: they don't put championship rings on smooth hands! You gotta go earn it! You gotta go earn it six seconds at a time! You win championships when the stadium is empty, when the band ain't playing, when the cheerleaders ain't cheering, when it's just you and your brothers right beside you. That's when you win championships! In the fourth quarter, that is when we shine!"

The video and the speech became a part of Clemson lore, buoyed by its playing during Clemson's comeback win against Syracuse that year en route to a 15-0 national championship season. Over the years, the video has changed but the speech remains the same, with many Clemson fans yelling it in unison as it plays.

Clemson holds a 135-4 record since 2011 when leading after three quarters. And though Head Coach Dabo Swinney frequently reiterates the phrase, "There is nothing less important than the score at halftime," Clemson has the second-best winning percentage in the nation among Power Five teams since 2017 in games

in which it leads at halftime. Clemson has recorded a halftime lead in a national-best 76 games in that span.

#### ACADEMIC EXCELLENCE

- Through the summer of 2023, of the 357 eligible players who completed their athletic eligibility at Clemson and/or graduated early in Dabo Swinney's 14+ full years as head coach, 351 (98 percent) have earned a degree during their time at Clemson.

- Clemson broke program multi-year APR records in three straight years from 2017-19 (987 in 2016-17, 992 in 2017-18 and 993 in 2018-19) before the NCAA suspended APR reporting during the COVID-19 pandemic. Upon reinstatement of APR reporting in June 2022, Clemson shattered its multi-year APR record with a 999 covering the 2017-18 through 2020-21 academic years.

- Most recently, Clemson posted a 995 multi-year APR covering 2018-19 through 2021-22, tied for third in the FBS and trailing only Northwestern and Wisconsin (996). Clemson's lofty academic success in that period coincided with on-field excellence that included three ACC titles, three College Football Playoff berths, two national championship game berths and the 2018 national championship.

- Clemson, Air Force and Northwestern are the only FBS programs to produce a 990+ multi-year APR in each of the last four reported cycles.

- Clemson is the only program in the country to finish among the Top 25 in APR rate among FBS schools and the AP Top 25 in each of the last 12 years.

- Prior to the suspension of APR Public Recognition Awards during the COVID-19 pandemic, the NCAA recognized Clemson with its annual honor, which is bestowed upon programs ranking in the Top 10 percent of their respective sports, for nine of the award's last 10 reported academic cycles. Only 37 of the 130 FBS programs earned at least one APR recognition across the 2009-10 through 2018-19 academic years. Only 30 programs earned it multiple times. Clemson, Duke and Northwestern were the only ones to earn the award 9+ times in that 10-year span.

- With its award for the 2018-19 academic year, Clemson became the only FBS program since the NCAA created the APR metric in 2003 to win a national

championship and an APR Public Recognition Award in the same year multiple times. Alabama is the only other school to accomplish the title/APR double in a single year once (2011-12 academic year).

Clemson's national academic success has understandably resulted in the shattering of its own internal metrics. Clemson posted a program-record 90 players with a 3.0 GPA or better during the Fall 2022 term. Of the 90 players, 30 earned a 3.5 GPA or better and 17 earned a 4.0. Clemson's team GPA of 3.04 was a program record for a fall semester and its second-highest on record across all semesters behind its 3.11 GPA for the spring of 2022.

#### HISTORIC GRADUATION SUCCESS RATE

Aided in part by a historically elite academic performance by Clemson Football, Clemson Athletics topped the nation among public Power Five institutions in Graduation Success Rate (GSR) with a 97 percent mark for the 2013-16 cohort in data released by the NCAA in December 2023. Clemson Football set a new program record of 99 percent, which led all of Division I.

Football's 99 percent mark was the highest GSR score for any Power Five football program since the 2018-19 release, and the highest ever recorded among public Power Five football programs in the 19 years the NCAA has tracked the metric. The previous GSR record for a public Power Five program was 96 by multiple schools.

The interest in watching Clemson play hasn't been limited to television broadcasts. Clemson continues to provide one of the marquee in-venue experiences in all of sports, as Clemson entered 2023 having been ranked in the Top 20 in the nation average home attendance at Memorial Stadium for 42 straight seasons.

#### **DEATH VALLEY RENOVATIONS**

Clemson embarked on a two-year improvement cycle for Memorial Stadium during the 2022 and 2023 offseasons

New in 2023 is an expanded gameday locker room behind Memorial Stadium's west end zone. In addition to a visual facelift, the expansion increased the space's footprint from roughly 6,400 square feet to approximately 8,100 square feet. The space connects to a new tunnel directly behind the west goalposts for the team to use for field ingress and egress at all times other than the team's famous pregame run down the Hill.

Outside the stadium, Clemson turned Lot 5 — the parking lot immediately to the west of the stadium — into a 365-day Tiger Walk destination honoring the team's history. Upon being promoted to interim head coach on Oct. 13, 2008, one of Dabo Swinney's first actions was to create Tiger Walk, which has since become a staple of the Clemson gameday experience. Rather than the previous procedure of buses dropping the team directly at the stadium's entrance, Swinney sought the support of Clemson officials to instead drop them amid throngs of fans at the entrance to the parking lot, allowing the team to further immerse itself in Clemson's legendary gameday atmosphere. That pregame tradition will now take place in the updated plaza lined with the names of every captain in Clemson football history, including era-specific jersey graphics.

In 2022, Clemson's videoboard got its first major upgrade since 2005, with nearly five times the surface area of the previous board, which was last updated before the 2012 season. The new video system, affectionately and unofficially nicknamed "DaboTron," measures 126 feet wide by 56.5 feet tall, eighth-largest in the NCAA. It also sits 20 feet off the ground, giving fans a 365-day open view into the stadium. The new board also features color LED fixtures on the inside and custom portal LED lights for the team entrance. Ribbon boards on the north, south, and west, along with new corner video boards in the west were also upgraded to be higher quality, easier to read, and more immersive.

That year, the eight main stadium light poles were updated to an LED system, which allows for individual light fixture control, spotlighting of Howard's Rock, and higher-quality field lighting. As part of stadium facade updates, Clemson also installed new signage honoring the all-time greats, championship years, and backlighting the traditional "Clemson Welcomes You To Death Valley" signage.

Renovations in 2022 also included the addition of IPTAY's Masters Club, a 688-seat premium area on the  $\,$

concourse level of the stadium's west side. Concessions and restrooms in the west were also relocated and expanded to the terraces, allowing easier pedestrian flow and access.

- Jake Briningstool, TE: Son of Tony Briningstool, a linebacker who played at Michigan State from 1987-92
- Vic Burley, DL: Cousin of Clemson Defensive Run Game Coordinator/Defensive Tackles Coach (and 10year NFL veteran) Nick Eason.
- Brodey Conn, S/P: Son of Clemson Co-Defensive Coordinator/Safeties Coach Mickey Conn.
- Joseph Flesch, WR: Son of Jeb Flesch, a former Clemson offensive lineman from 1988-91 who was a consensus All-American in his final season with the Tigers.
- Hamp Greene, WR: Son of Hamp Greene, who was a kicker on Alabama's 1992 national championship squad with Dabo Swinney.

DURHAM, N.C. — Duke took advantage of three second-half turnovers to pull away from No. 9 Clemson, 28-7, at Wallace Wade Stadium.

The game marked the first time in Clemson history that the Tigers both rushed and passed for 200 yards and lost. Entering the game, Clemson had been 108-0 - including a 58-0 mark under Dabo Swinney — when reaching 200 yards in both categories. Clemson outgained Duke, 422-374, and led the Blue Devils in first downs, 29-17, in the defeat.

After two Duke field goals, Wade Woodaz recovered a muffed punt on Duke's 18-yard line, setting up Will Shipley's first career receiving touchdown on a pass from Klubnik for a 7-6 lead the Tigers would carry into

On the first possession of the second half, Duke quarterback Riley Leonard escaped from the pocket and scored on a 44-yard touchdown run, giving Duke a 13-7 lead. Clemson drove the ensuing possession deep into Duke territory but suffered its second blocked field goal attempt of the evening.

The Tigers again drove deep into Duke's end late in the third quarter and appeared poised to take the lead, but a Mafah fumble on the one-yard line ended the scoring threat. Klubnik saved a touchdown, running nearly 60 yards to track down Jaylen Stinson, but the Blue Devils added a touchdown on the ensuing six-play scoring drive.

Clemson got the ball back on their own 20-yard line with 5:43 left on the clock in search of 14 points. However, a Duke interception on the fourth play of the drive gave the Blue Devils the ball back with a twopossession lead. A 30-yard touchdown run from Jordan Waters sealed a 28-7 Duke victory.

CLEMSON, S.C. — No. 25/21 Clemson scored 45 unanswered points over the final three quarters to defeat Charleston Southern, 66-17, in Clemson's home opener at Memorial Stadium. The Tigers played a school-record 117 players in the contest.

Clemson overcame a couple of critical early mistakes. A Clemson fumble on fourth down in its own territory set up a one-yard Charleston Southern touchdown, and a 67-yard pick six gave the Buccaneers a 14-7 lead late in the first quarter. The game was tied 14-14 after the first quarter despite a 198-6 Clemson advantage in offensive yardage and 12-0 Clemson edge in first downs at the quarter break.

Clemson outscored Charleston Southern, 52-3, over the remaining three quarters. Phil Mafah (two rushing), Antonio Williams (two receiving) and Jay Haynes (one rushing, one receiving) all found the end zone twice during the contest, and Beaux Collins led the Tigers with seven receptions and 137 receiving yards, including a 69-yard catch-and-run for a score. Clemson's 37 third downs were the third-most in school history.

Defensively, Clemson held the Bucs to only 73 total vards and four first downs. Linebacker Wade Woodaz returned his first career interception 35 yards for a score.

The game was Dabo Swinney's 100th home game as head coach, improving him to 92-8 in Death Valley.

CLEMSON, S.C. — Twenty first-quarter points sparked RV/22 Clemson to a 48-14 prime-time win against Florida Atlantic at Memorial Stadium.

Quarterback Cade Klubnik was responsible for four total touchdowns — three passing and one passing. Wide receiver Tyler Brown caught two touchdowns, becoming the first Clemson freshman with two receiving touchdowns in a game since Justyn Ross in the 2018 Cotton Bowl.

Clemson forced four turnovers in the victory. Cornerback Nate Wiggins jumpstarted Clemson and opened the scoring with a 46-yard interception return for touchdown, become the first Tiger with a pick-six in consecutive season since Rex Varn in 1977-78. Khalil Barnes recorded his first career interception later in the guarter, and Wade Woodaz notched his second interception in as many weeks later in the contest, becoming the first Clemson linebacker with a pick in back-to-back games since Isaiah Simmons in 2019.

After Wiggins' opening salvo, the Tigers added four more touchdowns in the first half, including scoring passes from Klubnik to Brown and Jake Briningstool as well as rushing touchdowns by Phil Mafah and Klubnik, giving Clemson a 34-0 lead at halftime.

CLEMSON, S.C. - Despite never trailing until overtime, RV/25 Clemson fell to No. 4/3 Florida State, 31-24, at Memorial Stadium. Clemson outgained Florida State, 429-311, and had a 25-16 edge in first downs in the loss.

Cade Klubnik completed 25-of-38 passes for 283 vards and one touchdown and added a rushing touchdown as well. Will Shipley added a touchdown both on the ground and through the air. Clemson limited Florida State to just 22 yards rushing on 20 carries and registered five tackles for a loss.

Clemson scored first on Jonathan Weitz' first career field goal less than a week after he re-joined the team out of retirement. Clemson and Florida State traded a pair of touchdowns in the second quarter to bring the halftime score to 17-14 in favor of Clemson.

A Florida State field goal on its first possession of the second half tied the game, but Clemson re-claimed the lead on Shipley's one-vard touchdown run in the third quarter. Clemson was in Florida State territory poised to push the lead to two scores, but Kalen Deloach stripsacked Klubnik and returned the fumble 56 vards for a touchdown to even the score at 24-24.

Clemson drove 44 yards in 11 plays to the Florida State 12 in the final minutes, but Weitz missed a 29yard field goal attempt that would have given the Tigers the lead. Clemson then forced a Florida State turnover on downs in the waning seconds of regulation to force

Florida State opened the extra frame with a 24-yard touchdown pass from Jordan Travis to Keon Coleman on its second play. Clemson's attempt to force a second overtime ended when a Klubnik pass was tipped at the line of scrimmage and fell incomplete on fourth down.

SYRACUSE, N.Y. - A diving interception by Jeremiah Trotter Jr. with 6:45 to play combined with Phil Mafah's 32-yard touchdown run on the ensuing play helped secure Clemson's 31-14 win over previously unbeaten Syracuse at the JMA Wireless Dome. The win was Head Coach Dabo Swinney's 100th career regular season victory in ACC play, as he joined Bobby Bowden as the only coaches to accomplish the feat.

Wide receiver Tyler Brown turned in a magnificent nine-catch, 153-yard receiving effort in his fifth career game. Quarterback Cade Klubnik finished 23-of-37 for 263 yards and a pair of touchdown passes.

Defensively, Clemson recorded five sacks and held Syracuse's offense, which entered the week in the Top 10 nationally in points per game and yards per game, to 14 points and 281 yards of offense.

Clemson set the tone when Justin Mascoll crushed Syracuse quarterback Garrett Shrader for a fumble on Syracuse's opening drive that was recovered by Payton Page. The Tigers jumped out to an early 14-0 lead in the first 10 minutes on the back of a pair of turnovers that resulted in touchdowns for Troy Stellato and Will Shipley.

A 28-yard second-quarter touchdown pass from Shrader to Dan Villari cut the score to 14-7, but Clemson re-extended the lead on a 47-vard touchdown pass from Klubnik to Beaux Collins. Jonathan Weitz added a field goal early in the third quarter to give Clemson a 24-7 advantage.

Syracuse got as close as 10 points in the second half, turning a Jake Briningstool fumble into seven points on a five-play scoring drive to make the score 24-14.

With the Orange driving in search of a comeback, Trotter dove in front of a Shrader pass for an interception on the 32-yard line with 6:45 to play. On the ensuing play, Mafah took a handoff and burst down the left side nearly untouched for the touchdown to set the final margin.

ard's Clemson record for career wins with his 165 victory as the Tigers earned a 17-12 win over Wake Forest at Memorial Stadium on Homecoming.

Clemson's defense produced eight tackles for loss, four sacks and a fumble recovery. Additionally, Clemson allowed only two third down conversions on 12 attempts. The Tigers kept Wake Forest out of the end zone for the first 58 minutes of the game.

Cade Klubnik completed 18-of-28 passes to total 131 yards and added 48 rushing yards, including a seven-yard touchdown scamper in the first quarter. Shipley led Clemson in rushing yards with 97 on 19 carries. Defensively, safety R.J. Mickens recorded nine tackles (one for loss) and his first career fumble recovery, while linebacker Wade Woodaz had two of Clemson's four sacks.

Clemson's two touchdowns came on scoring drives of 16 plays and 15 plays, marking Clemson's first time producing multiple 15-play scoring drives since the 2021 Cheez-It Bowl.

Clemson held a 7-3 lead at halftime and the teams traded field goals to bring the score to 10-6 entering the final frame. Shipley scored on a one-yard touchdown run with 5:49 remaining to extend the score to 17-6. Wake Forest mounted an 11-play, 75-yard touchdown drive late in the contest, finishing the drive with a three-yard touchdown run by Demond Claiborne. An attempted two-point conversion by the Demon Deacons failed when a Mitch Griffis pass to Jahmal Banks was ruled out-of-bounds near the goalpost.

Wide receiver Hamp Greene recovered Wake Forest's ensuing onside kick attempt to give Clemson the ball at Wake Forest's 44-vard line. Phil Mafah rushed for 33 yards on four carries on Clemson's final drive to help run out the clock and seal the victory for Clemson.

MIAMI GARDENS, Fla. – Miami overcame a 10-point fourth-quarter deficit to defeat Clemson, 28-20, in double overtime at Hard Rock Stadium. Clemson dropped to 4-3 (2-3 ACC) with the defeat.

Sophomore quarterback Cade Klubnik was 18-for-34 for 314 yards. Klubnik connected with tight end Jake Briningstool five times for 126 yards and two touchdowns. Briningstool's 126 yards broke Clemson's school record for single-game receiving yards by a tight end, surpassing Jordan Leggett's 122 yards against Florida State in 2016.

Turnovers once again played a major role for Clemson, as the Tigers' recorded one takeaway against three giveaways.

Clemson appeared poised to take an early lead, but Miami recovered a Clemson fumble in the Hurricane end zone. On the ensuing play, Miami opened the scoring on an 80-yard touchdown, as Brashard Smith broke free on a rush up the middle, and though Nate Wiggins chased him down and forced a fumble at the one-yard line, Miami's Jacolby George recovered the fumble in the end zone for a touchdown. Klubnik and Briningstool's first scoring connection in the second quarter evened the game at 7-7 at the half.

Clemson added 10 points in the third quarter on a 41-yard Jonathan Weitz field goal and an acrobatic 19-yard touchdown by Briningstool. However, Miami responded with 10 points of its own in the fourth quarter to send the game to overtime.

The teams traded field goals in the first overtime period. After Miami's Ajay Allen rushed for a touchdown and a two-point conversion in double overtime, Miami finished a goal-line stand by chasing down Klubnik on the edge on fourth down to earn the win.

RALEIGH, N.C. - Clemson outscored NC State 10-0 in the fourth quarter but the Tigers' comeback attempt fell short as NC State defeated Clemson, 24-17, at Carter-Finley Stadium.

Clemson's defense held NC State to 202 yards, and the Tigers outgained the Wolfpack, 364-202, but NC State converted two takeaways into 14 points in the Wolfpack's seven-point win.

NC State took advantage of an early Klubnik interception on its own 40-yard line, scoring first after a 50-yard rush set up a nine-yard touchdown reception from Kevin Concepcion with 7:18 to play in the first quarter.

NC State extended the lead to 10-0 on a Brayden Narveson 41-yard field goal in the second quarter. On its ensuing drive, Clemson went 75 yards in nine plays as Phil Mafah punched in his fifth touchdown of the season with 8:24 to play before halftime.

The Wolfpack upped their lead to 17-7 when Payton Wilson returned a deflected Klubnik pass 15 yards for a touchdown. NC State scored again on a 72-yard connection from MJ Morris to Concepcion with 4:35 to play in the third quarter, taking a 24-7 lead.

Early in the fourth quarter, Mafah capped a 10-play 75-yard drive with another one-yard score, which cut the deficit to 24-14. After Clemson's defense forced a pair of three-and-outs, Mafah jump-started another Clemson scoring drive with a 41-yard gain on the first play of a possession to carry the Tigers to the NC State nine-yard line. A 19-yard field goal by Jonathan Weitz at the end of that possession pulled the score to 24-17.

Clemson forced NC State to punt, giving the Tigers the ball back trailing by seven points with 4:23 left to play in the game. An incompletion on 4th-and-19 kept the score at 24-17 and gave NC State the ball and the eventual victory.

CLEMSON, S.C. - Head Coach Dabo Swinney earned his 166th career victory to become Clemson's all-time winningest coach as Clemson earned a 31-23 upset of No. 12 Notre Dame at Memorial Stadium.

Clemson recorded its first penalty-free game on record since the 1952 Gator Bowl. Jeremiah Trotter Jr. led Clemson defensively with 11 tackles, 2.5 tackles for a loss, 2.0 sacks and a pick-six. Phil Mafah rushed for two touchdowns and recorded a career-high 186 rushing yards on a school-record-tying 36 carries.

Notre Dame opened the scoring with a 43-yard field goal. Clemson's scored on its second possession on a 41-yard touchdown run by Mafah. The teams traded field goals, and Tyler Brown later extended Clemson's lead on a nine-yard touchdown reception. On the Irish's next drive, Trotter returned an interception 28 yards for a touchdown, giving Clemson a 24-6 second quarter lead.

Early in the third quarter, an Xavier Watts interception gave Notre Dame the ball on Clemson's two-yard line, setting up an Audric Estime touchdown. Mafah then capped an 11-play, 75-yard drive with a one-yard rushing touchdown to put Clemson up 31-16. Notre Dame again cut the lead though on a 26-yard touchdown run by Hartman.

Kylon Griffin's first career interception gave Clemson the ball in the final two minutes of the game, but a fumble by Mafah gave the ball back with 1:47 remaining. However, Clemson harassed Hartman and forced a turnover on downs, allowing Clemson to run out the clock.

The loss dropped Hartman to 0-5 against Clemson as a starter, becoming the first Power Five starting quarter-back to go 0-5 against a single opponent since Florida State's Chris Rix against Miami (Fla.) in the early 2000s.

CLEMSON, S.C. — Clemson's freshmen took center stage and helped the Tigers score 42 consecutive points in a 42-21 win against Georgia Tech at Memorial Stadium.

True freshmen and redshirt freshmen combined for three of Clemson's six touchdowns (Tyler Brown, Josh Sapp and Shelton Lewis) and all four of its interceptions (Khalil Barnes, Avieon Terrell, Kylon Griffin and Lewis). Clemson became the first FBS team since at least 2000 to have four different freshmen record a pick in a single game.

Quarterback Cade Klubnik completed 23-of-34 passes for 205 yards and a career-high tying four touchdown passes in leading the Tigers to victory. After Georgia Tech struck first on a short field, touchdown passes to Beaux Collins and Brown gave Clemson a 14-7 second-quarter lead. The first touchdown came on a drive lasting 9:51, the longest scoring drive (and second-longest drive of any result) in school history. Running back Will Shipley added a 32-yard rushing touchdown late in the second to push the Tigers' halftime advantage to 21-8.

Klubnik added two more touchdowns in the second half, finding tight ends Jake Briningstool and Josh Sapp for touchdowns of five yards and 13 yards, respectively, to take a 35-7 lead early in the fourth quarter.

Less than two minutes after the Briningstool touchdown, Lewis extended the Tiger lead to 35 with a 46-yard pick-six on his first career interception. He also added four pass breakups in the contest, one shy of a school record and the most by a Tiger since Mario Goodrich's four at Syracuse in 2021.

Georgia Tech added two late touchdowns to bring the final score to 42-21. Clemson held Georgia Tech to 254 yards, 142 of which came on the Yellow Jackets' final two drives of the game with the result already decided.

CLEMSON, S.C. - Will Shipley recorded 179 yards from scrimmage Clemson defeated No. 20/22 North Carolina, 31-20, at Memorial Stadium on Senior Day.

Clemson held reigning ACC Player of the Year Drake Maye to 16-of-36 passing for 209 yards and one touchdown, the lowest completion percentage and pass eficiency rating of his career. Clemson's offense totaled 466 yards on 89 plays.

North Carolina jumped out to a 7-0 lead and was poised to take a two-touchdown lead when cornerback Nate Wiggins stripped UNC running back Omarion Hampton at the goal line for a touchback. Wiggins later added an acrobatic interception of Maye with 2:37 to play to help seal the win.

Clemson outscored North Carolina 14-0 in the second frame on a touchdown pass from Klubnik to Jake Briningstool and a touchdown rush by Klubnik as time nearly expired. Phil Mafah extended Clemson's lead to 21-7 with a third-quarter rushing touchdown.

North Carolina cut the lead on a 55-yard rushing touchdown by Hampton, who finished the day with 178 rushing yards. But Shipley both jumpstarted and finished a response drive from Clemson, capping a six-play, 75-yard drive with a 33-yard rushing touchdown to push the lead back to 14. Jonathan Weitz's 21-yard field goal to increased Clemson's lead to 31-14 with 10:28 left to play.

Hampton ran for a three-yard rushing touchdown with 7:03 left in the game, but Andrew Mukuba broke up Maye's pass on a two-point conversion attempt, leaving the score at 31-20.

The teams remained scoreless in their remaining possessions, and Wiggins recorded his third career interception (and second all-time off Maye) to give Clemson the ball back on the 25-yard line with 2:37 left to play. Clemson ran the clock out to earn the 31-20 win.

COLUMBIA, S.C. - Clemson's defense scored a touchdown and held rival South Carolina to 169 yards of offense in a 16-7 victory at Williams-Brice Stadium. The 169 yards of offense were the fewest allowed by a Clemson defense in the series since 1989 (155).

Freshman Khailil Barnes set the tone, becoming the first Clemson player since Brian Dawkins in 1995 to record a takeaway on consecutive plays from scrimmage. On the second snap of the game, he recovered a dropped lateral and returned it 42 yards for a touchdown just 25 seconds into the game, Clemson's fastest score against South Carolina since C.J. Spiller ran back the opening kickoff in 2009. It was also Clemson's school-record-tying fifth defensive touchdown of the season. On South Carolina's next offensive play, Barnes made a diving interception on a deep pass by Spencer Rattler.

After surrendering its only touchdown of the game with 6:39 to play in the first quarter, Clemson's defense forced eight consecutive punts and a turnover on downs over South Carolina's final nine possessions. Clemson allowed just 66 yards on those nine drives. Offensively, the Tigers piled up 219 yards rushing, including 89 from running back Phil Mafah, 80 from running back Will Shipley, and a career-high 52 from quarterback Cade Kluhnik

Placekicker Jonathan Weitz finished 3-for-3 on field goals to account for the final margin of victory in Clemson's nine-point win. He converted field goal attempts of 50, 49 and 42 yards after entering the evening with a career long of 41. His three field goals of 40-plus yards tied a school record set previously by four others.

Weitz' career-long 50-yard field goal in the first quarter was Clemson's longest field goal since a 52-yarder by B.T. Potter in the 2022 ACC Championship Game. The 50-yarder came in the same stadium as the first 50-yard field goal in Clemson history, a 52-yarder by Eddie Seigler against South Carolina in 1971.
