#### SEMINOLES PLAY HOST TO CLEMSON RIDING A FIVE-GAME ACC WINNING STREAK

Florida State, which has won five consecutive ACC games for the first time since January of the 2021-22 season, plays host to Clemson on Saturday, January 20, 2024, at 4:00 p.m. at the Donald L. Tucker Center in Tallahassee. The game will be televised by the ACC Network. The Seminoles won each and every one of their ACC games in the 2024 calendar year with victories over Georgia Tech (January 3, 82-71), Virginia Tech (January 6, 77-74), Wake Forest (January 9, 87-82), Notre Dame on the road (January 13, 67-58) and Miami on the road (January 17, 84-75) and have won seven of their last eight games dating to a 91-75 win over North Florida at the Tucker Center (December 19). The Seminoles' game against Clemson is the first of two regular season meetings between the two teams with Florida State traveling to play at Clemson at Littlejohn Coliseum in Clemson, S.C. on February 24. Following Saturday's game against Clemson, the Seminoles travel to the northern most post in the ACC as they play at Syracuse on Tuesday, January 23.

#### LAST TIME WITH SIX CONSECUTIVE ACC VICTORIES

Florida State enters Saturday's game against Clemson having won five consecutive ACC games against Georgia Tech, Virginia Tech, Wake Forest, Notre Dame, and Miami. It marks the first time since the 2021-22 season with wins over Louisville (79-70, January 8, 2022), Miami (65-64, January 11, 2022), Syracuse (76-71, January 15, 2022), Duke (79-78 in overtime, January 18, 2022), and Miami (61-60, January 22). The last time the Seminoles won six consecutive ACC games was during the 2019-20 season with victories over Georgia Tech (70-58, December 31, 2019), at Louisville (78-65, January 4, 2020), at Wake Forest (78-68, January 8, 2020), against Virginia (54-50, January 15, 2020), at Miami (83-79 in overtime, January 18) and against Notre Dame (85-84, January 25, 2020).

#### BASKETBALL REUNION BRINGS PROGRAMS HISTORY INTO FOCUS

Seminole Head Coach Leonard Hamilton and his program welcome back nearly 50 alumni of the program for a special weekend in Tallahassee January 19-20. The alumni group will be treated to a welcome reception on Friday night, Saturday's game against Clemson, a halftime recognition for each of the returning players, and a post-game dinner. The returning group is scheduled to include all-time leading scorer Bob Sura, Hall of Famers Jeff Hogan, Harry Davis, Pat Kennedy, Hugh Durham, Greg Grady, Eugene Harris Jeff Hogan, George McCloud, and Charlie Ward, amongst the star-studded group.

#### WATKINS LOOKING TO BECOME THE FIRST SEMINOLE TO LEAD IN POINTS, REBOUNDS, ASSISTS AND STEALS

Redshirt junior Jamir Watkins enters Saturday's game against Clemson looking to become the first player in Florida State history to lead the team in scoring, rebounding, assists and steals. Through the first 17 games of the season, he is averaging a team-leading 13.1 points, a team-leading 5.9 rebounds, a team-leading 3.2 assists and a team-leading 1.6 steals. Watkins is the only player in the ACC who is leading his team in scoring, rebounding, assists, and steals.

#### SPEARS ONLY SIX POINTS FROM 1,000 FOR HIS CAREER

Junior Guard Primo Spears enters Saturday's game against Clemson with 994 career points and needs only six points to reach the 1,000-point mark for his career. He is Florida State's third-leading scorer with 102 points and an 11.3 points per game scoring average. He totaled 381 points (12.7 ppg) as a freshman at Duquesne, 511 points as a sophomore at Georgetown (career-high 16.0 ppg) and has 102 points in the first nine games of his Florida State career.

#### LOOK FOR FLORIDA STATE TO...

...Defeat Clemson and win its sixth consecutive ACC game for the first time since January of 2020 when it won six consecutive games against Georgia Tech, at Louisville, at Wake Forest, against Virginia, at Miami in overtime and against Notre Dame. The Seminoles finished with a program-best 16 ACC wins, as the ACC Champion, and with an overall record of 26-5;

...Defeat Clemson and gain their eighth win in the last nine home games against the Tigers. The Seminoles have defeated the Tigers in six of the last seven games at the Donald L. Tucker Center – a streak that began with a 75-65 win on January 30, 2016.

### SEMINOLES' NCAA RECORD OVERTIME STREAK IS AT NOW AT 14 STRAIGHT WINS

Florida State enters Saturday's game against Clemson having won an NCAA record 14 consecutive overtime games. The Seminoles' streak began with a 101-90 win in double overtime against Syracuse on January 13, 2018. Florida State defeated Duke, 79-70, in overtime on January 18, 2022, in Tallahassee for its all-time college basketball record 13<sup>th</sup> consecutive overtime victory. Florida State has defeated 12 teams during its overtime streak, including Wake Forest on February 13, 2021, at the Donald L. Tucker Center. The Seminoles have defeated eight nationally ranked opponents in overtime during their streak, including No. 18/21 Colorado in the championship game of the 2023 Sunshine Slam.

Florida State's Leonard Hamilton enters Saturday's game against Clemson as the fifth winningest coach in ACC history with 415 wins. He is also the fifth winningest coach in ACC history for ACC regular season victories (185), ACC regular season and ACC Tournament wins combined (190), sixth in the ACC record book for ACC road wins (67), and eighth in ACC history for NCAA Tournament wins as an ACC Head Coach (18).

Florida State earned the 1,300<sup>th</sup> victory in school history with its 84-75 win over Miami at the Watsco Center on Wednesday night in Coral Gables.

### FLORIDA STATE ENTERS SATURDAY'S GAME AGAINST CLEMSON AS THE ACC MEN OF STEAL

Florida State totaled its ACC games only season-high of 12 steals in its victory at Miami and enters Saturday's game against Clemson as the ACC leader in team steals per game with a 9.35 steals per game average. The Seminoles' 12 steals against the Hurricanes led to a 16-12 advantage on points off turnovers in its second consecutive ACC win on the road. A total of six Seminoles earned at least one steal with freshman Taylor Bol Bowen totaling a career four steals in only eight minutes of playing time.

Illustrating Florida State's renewed and increased depth, Florida State bench bunch outscored Miami's bench players by a 40-14 score in its 84-75 win over the Hurricanes on Wednesday night in Coral Gables. The Seminoles' bench is outscoring its opponents' bench by an average of +17.4 points per game. Guard Primo Spears has scored in double figures in eight of his nine games played coming off of the bench – the third highest scoring total among his Florida State teammates.

## FLORIDA STATE VS. CLEMSON – THE LAST MEETING

Clemson's PJ Hall scored a game-high 20 points on eight made field goals to lead the Tigers to a 94-54 victory over the Seminoles at the Littlejohn Coliseum. Hall led four Tigers in double figure scoring; Chase Hunter (18 points), Hunter Tyson (10 points), and Josh Beadle (10 points) to earn their 11th ACC win of the season. Baba Miller scored a career and team-high 12 points on four made field goals and one free throw to lead the Seminoles in points and rebounds against Clemson. Miller pulled down six rebounds, tying his career-high at Notre Dame on January 17<sup>th</sup>. Miller was the only Seminole who scored in double digits in Wednesday night's game. Darin Green Jr. added nine points of his own and Jalen Warley added six points with a team-high three assists. Florida State had a .429 shooting percentage (21-49) from the field, a .450 shooting percentage (nine-20) from beyond the arc and shot three for eight (.375) from the charity stripe.

**.615** Sophomore De'Ante Green is shooting .615 from the field (eight of 13) in the last three games. He was four of seven from field and scored 10 points in Florida State's victory at Miami on Wednesday night.

**.778** Sophomore Chandler Jackson is shooting a career-high .778 from the free throw line this season. He made three of four free throws and scored his career-high of 14 points in the Seminoles' 82-71 win over Georgia Tech on January 3 in Tallahassee.

**.879** Redshirt junior Jamir Watkins is shooting .879 from the free throw line (35 of 39) in the last six games. He is averaging 5.8 free throws made per game during that stretch of games.

**.900** Sophomore Baba Miller is shooting .900 from the free throw line (nine of 10) in the last three games and has made five consecutive free throws entering Saturday's game against Clemson.

**2.0** Redshirt junior Jamir Watkins is averaging 2.0 steals per game in the last three games. He totaled four steals for the third time this season in Florida State's victory at Notre Dame on January 13.

**4** Freshman Taylor Bol Bown totaled four steals in Florida State's victory over Miami on Wednesday night. He nearly doubled his steals total for the season against the Hurricanes as he entered the game with five steals in the first 14 games of his career.

**9** Sophomore De'Ante Green has made nine consecutive free throws since the first half of Florida State's game against Lipscomb on December 30.

**11** Florida State is undefeated, 11-0, when it outscored its opponent.

**12** Florida State has utilized the same starting lineup (Jamir Watkins, Jalen Warley De'Ante Green, Baba Miller and Darin Green, Jr.) in each of its last 12 games beginning with its game on November 29 against Georgia in the inaugural ACC/SEC Challenge.

**26** Junior Jalen Warley is scheduled to start his 26<sup>th</sup> consecutive game on Saturday against Clemson. He has started each of Florida State's 17 games this season and started the final eight games of the 2022-23 season.

**58** Florida State allowed a season-low 58 points to Notre Dame on their home court on January 13 in the Seminoles' 67-58 win over the Irish – the fewest points they have allowed in a game this season.

**91** Redshirt junior Jamir Watkins enters Saturday's game against Clemson with 91 career steals. He needs just nine to reach 100 for his career.

## FLORIDA STATE WON MANY OF THE BATTLES AGAINST MIAMI

Florida State won many of the statistical battles in its victory over Miami on Wednesday including points off of turnovers (16-12), points in the paint (52-34), second chance points (21-12) and points from the bench (40-14). During its current five-game winning streak, the Seminoles have won the overwhelming majority or the specialty statistic battles – winning (or being tied) 18 of the 20 battles (90 percent) – and losing only the points off of turnover battle to Georgia Tech (by one point, 10-11) and the second chance point battle by two points to Virginia Tech (by two points, 9-11). The Seminoles and Yellow Jackets finished tied at 30 points each in the points in the paint category in the Seminoles' victory over Georgia Tech on January 3 in Tallahassee.

Florida State averages 16.2 free throws made in each game during its current five-game ACC winning streak. For the entire season, the Seminoles average 15.9 made free throws per game.

### SEMINOLES FORCING TURNOVERS

Florida State forced 14 turnovers by Miami, outscored the Hurricanes 16-12 on points off turnovers, and won in Coral Gables by an 84-75 margin. The Seminoles have forced double figure turnovers in 16 of their first 17 games of the season including a season-high 24 by North Florida in the Seminoles' 91-75 win over the Ospreys on December 19 at the Donald L. Tucker Center.

### WARLEY'S STEALS

Junior Jalen Warley earned one steal in Florida State's 67-58 win over Notre Dame on January 13 and enters Saturday's game against Clemson with 99 career steals. He needs just one steal to reach 100 for his career. Warley has earned multiple steals in five games this season and tied his career-high high with five steals in Florida State's game at Florida (November 17). He is ranked third among his Florida State teammates with 21 steals – the third time in his career that he has earned at least 20 steals in a season. Warley totaled a single-season career-high 41 steals (1.3 spg) during his sophomore season.

## Why I Wear My Number

**Chandler Jackson** – I wear No. 0 at Florida State because it's a tough looking number and one of my favorite players, Russell Westbrook, wears 0.

Jalen Warley – I wear No. 1 at Florida State because it's a number that I played well in when I was younger. I wanted No. 2 (the number I wore in high school, but it wasn't available for my freshman season because Anthony Polite wore it).

**Jamir Watkins** – I wear No. 2 at Florida State because it is my favorite number, and the number I wore in high school. I wore No. 0 during my career at VCU.

**De'Ante Green** – I wear No. 5 at Florida State because I think it looks like a really cool number. It's the first time in my career I've worn the No. 5.

**Taylor Bol Bowen** – I wear No. 10 at Florida State because my older brother, Deng Adiang, wore the number when he was an AAU star player. Deng later played at the University of Vermont.

**Baba Miller** -- I wear No. 11 at Florida State because I believe that the only person that can stop me from growing and getting better is myself. I identify 1 as myself, so 11 is the representation of me vs me.

**Tom House** – I wear No. 12 at Florida State because it has always been my favorite number. It's the only number I've ever worn as a basketball player. Not only is it my favorite number, but it's also my mom's favorite number, too.

**Josh Nickelberry** – I wear No. 20 at Florida State as a tribute to my favorite all-time player, Ray Allen. Ray Allen has been my favorite all-time shooting guard since I was 10 years old. I've worn 20 my whole basketball career because of him.

**Cam'Ron Fletcher** - I wear No. 21 at Florida State because that's the only number I have ever worn – I've worn it my whole life and it has gotten me this far.

**Darin Green, Jr.** – I wear No. 22 at Florida State (and also at UCF) because it's the number my dad wore when he was a collegiate player at George Washington (1995-98). He played in 89 games and in the NCAA Tournament in both 1996 and 1998.

**Jaylan Gainey** – I wear No. 33 at Florida State because it's the number I wore in high school when I was a three-time All-Conference and three-time conference Defensive Player of the Year. I wore No. 22 during my career at Brown.

**Sola Adebisi** – I wear No. 51 at Florida State because I think it is a cool-looking number. I've never worn it at any other level of basketball, but when I was given my choice of numbers, 51 came to my mind as a tough-looking number on the back of a uniform.

## **Cameron Corhen: The Making Of A Great Shot**

TALLAHASSEE, Fla. – Just after daybreak on Thursday morning, sophomore Cameron Corhen confidently (and briskly) walked into the Florida State Basketball Training Center.

Never mind that the Seminoles had been on the road and beaten rival Miami, 84-75, the night before. Never mind that the Seminoles arrived back to campus well after midnight. And never mind that the temperatures in the Panhandle of Florida were just below freezing.

And never mind that he had tied a longstanding school record for field goal percentage in a single game with his seven of seven shooting performance in scoring 16 points against the Hurricanes just 12 hours prior to beginning his morning workout. Corhen is now one of five players to be perfect on at least seven field goal attempts in an ACC game in school history.

Corhen enters Saturday's game against Clemson at 4:00 p.m. at the Donald L. Tucker Center ranked in the 13<sup>th</sup> in school history for career field goal shooting percentage with a .568 mark. He shot .516 from the field as a freshman, and buoyed by his perfect performance against Miami, is shooting a career-high .618 from the field as a sophomore.

"I've always had a feel for shooting, but I wouldn't consider myself a great shooter," said Corhen. "I've always worked hard to be a good shooter since I was young. My dad definitely instilled the importance of being a good shooter in me since I began playing basketball."

His dad, Richard, was an outstanding shooter during his 120-game career at the University of Georgia (1982-85). During his career as a Bulldog, Richard shot better than 50 percent from the field as a member of Georgia's 1983 SEC Championship and NCAA Final Four teams.

Corhen's daily routine began during the summer of 2023 with Associate Head Coach Stan Jones and has continued throughout the season. What started as daily teaching sessions with Jones developed into twice daily practice sessions as Corhen and West would return to the court each night to perfect what Jones had taught him earlier in the day.

The instruction comes on all types of shots – from touch shots around the basket, to hook shots, to mid-range jump shots, to free throws with each morning workout lasting about 45 minutes. He then heads for class and back to the gymnasium in the early afternoon for practice with his teammates.

"I go hard every morning," said Corhen. "I work on my touch around the rim and on my mid-range jumpers to help me develop a rhythm that translates into our games. My shooting workouts help me get focused for our games."

Corhen was certainly focused on Wednesday night against Miami.

His first field goal against the Hurricanes came as a driving lay-up to give the Seminoles a 19-15 lead. He earned a steal under the Seminoles' basket and turned that into a quick layup to increase the Seminoles lead to nine points at 29-20. He followed with another layup, then a dunk, then offensive rebound and a put back dunk.

Corhen finished the first half with 11 points (he added a free throw after his fifth basket) on a perfect five of five shooting from the field. His efforts helped the Seminoles shoot .514 percent from the field as a team and gave them a 45-35 lead at halftime.



"Honestly, I felt after the first few buckets that I was going to have a good night," said Corhen. "But I was focused on winning and didn't until the end of the game when Coach Ham mentioned in the locker room that I went seven for seven."

Corhen was a perfect on both of his field goal attempts in the second half to bring his total to a perfect seven-of-seven.

A high percentage dunk gave Florida State a 10-point lead with just over 13 minutes remaining, and he put his jump shooting abilities on display with a shot from just outside the paint to increase the Seminoles' lead to 71-62.

"My mindset when I shoot is just to remember what I have worked on and been taught to do," said Corhen. "If I think about what I have been taught, I am confident my shots will fall consistently."

Jones, one of the noted shooting experts in college basketball is often seen working one-on-one with Corhen on his shooting techniques.

"Shooting is such a fine-tuned motor skill that you can't be away from it and you fall right back in rhythm," said Jones. "Cam is just now getting back up to game speed and the rhythm he was at before the toe injury knocked him out for plus weeks. He is a willing worker and is both coachable and teachable. He was frustrated as he came back into full-time participation but has grasped the maturity that all good things have a time frame associated to it happening. Hopefully getting those early interior makes versus Miami will strengthen his trust in his work. His ceiling is still way out there for his development."

Corhen, who also shot a perfect five-of-five from the field and scored 11 points in Florida State's victory over Virginia Tech on January 6, is shooting .760 percent from the field (19 of 25) during the Seminole's current five-game ACC winning streak.

"Coach Jones has helped me understand the difference between a good shot and a great shot," said Corhen. "He has taught me that's just as important as working on my shooting fundamentals. He has helped me become a student of the game and a better basketball player."

DAYTONA BEACH, Fla. -- Florida State's Jamir Watkins scored a double-double of 18 points and 11 rebounds in earning tournament MVP honors as Florida State defeated 18th ranked Colorado, 77-71 in overtime, to win the championship of the 2023 Sunshine Slam at the Ocean Center. The Seminoles scored the first nine points of the overtime period and outscored the Buffaloes by a 17-11 margin in overtime to extend their ongoing NCAA-best streak of consecutive overtime victories to 14. Florida State has won each of its overtime games since a 101-90 double-overtime win over Syracuse on January 13, 2018 at the Donald L. Tucker Center in Tallahassee. Junior Jalen Warley came alive in the second as he totaled 19 points -- with 16 of his 19 coming after halftime. The Seminoles' point guard scored 11 second half points and five more in the overtime period. Warley led four Seminoles in double figure scoring with 19 points. He was followed by Watkins (18 points), Darin Green Jr (12 points) and De'Ante Green (10 points). This matchup had the feeling of a March battle with both teams playing hard on each possession on both sides of the court. There were nine lead changes and 13 ties before Warley scored on a jumper in the paint to give the Seminoles a 62-60 lead they would not relinquish. ### Game 15 -- Florida State 87, Wake Forest 82

TALLAHASSEE, Fla. -- Junior Jamir Watkins scored a team-high 19 points on a perfect 11 of 11 shooting from the free throw line and sophomore Baba Miller scored a career-high 14 points to lead Florida State to an 87-82 win over Wake Forest at the Donald L. Tucker Center. The victory over the Deacons was their third consecutive ACC victory and raised the Seminoles to 3-1 in ACC play. Florida State Head Coach Leonard Hamilton rotated through 11 players with each of them scoring and three players scoring in double digits with Watkins (19 points), Darin Green Jr. (17 points) and Miller (14 points) all in double figures.
