SEMINOLES TRAVEL CLEMSON TO FACE TIGERS FOR SECOND TIME THIS SEASON

Florida State, which defeated Boston College on Tuesday night in Tallahassee by an 84-76 score, travels to face Clemson at Littlejohn Coliseum in Clemson on Saturday, February 24, 2024 at 7:45. The game will be televised by the CW. The Seminoles arrive in Clemson with four ACC road wins this season as they have earned victories at Notre Dame (January 13, 67-58), at Miami (January 17, 84-75), at Syracuse (January 23, 85-69), and at Boston College (February 6, 63-62). The Seminoles have earned their four ACC road wins by an average of nearly 8.8 points per game with their largest road win of the season (+16 points at Syracuse) coming on the road at the JMA Wireless Dome. The four road victories by the Seminoles are just two wins away from matching their recent high of six ACC road wins they earned during the 2019-20 season. Florida State won the ACC regular season championship and ACC Championship with a 16-4 overall league record and six conference road wins. Following Saturday's game against Clemson on Saturday, the Seminoles return home to face NC State in the only regular season game between the Seminoles and the Wolfpack on Tuesday, February 27, 2024 at 9:00 p.m. at the Donald L. Tucker Center.

WATKINS CONTINUES HIS TORRID SCORING STREAK

Junior All-ACC candidate Jamir Watkins, who totaled his fifth career double-double with his 22-point, 11-rebound performance, enters Saturday's game having scored in double-figures in 12 consecutive games – each at Florida State since a 19-point performance in the Seminoles' 87-82 win over Wake Forest on January 9. He has scored 183 points and is averaging 15.3 points scored per game since Florida State's victory over the Deacons in January. Watkins has scored 20 or more points four times during his current career-best streak (his career-high of 27 at Syracuse, 21 against Virginia, 26 at Virginia Tech, and 22 against Boston College). His four games of 20+ points scoring is also a career-best. He entered the 2023-24 season (his first at Florida State and in the ACC) with two career 20+ point-scoring games in his first two seasons and 61 games.

WARLEY PROTECTING THE BALL IN ACC PLAY; SECOND AMONG CONFERENCE LEADERS IN A:TO RATIO

Junior Jalen Warley enters Saturday's game as one of the top ball protectors in the ACC with better than a 2.7:1 assist:turnover ratio in 15 ACC games played. He is ranked second behind only Georgia Tech's Naithan George who has a 2.8:1 ratio. Warley has the lowest turnover total among starting point guards in the ACC with just 17 turnovers in 15 games (1.1 per game), and just 17 turnovers in 360 minutes played in conference games. He averages one turnover for every 21.2 minutes played in and has played four ACC games (against Georgia Tech, at Notre Dame, at Syracuse, and at Virginia Tech) with at least 19 minutes played and zero turnovers. Warley totaled zero turnovers and 10 points in 31 minutes of playing time in Florida State's 67-58 win at Notre Dame (January 13).

HAMILTON RANKS FIFTH IN ACC HISTORY FOR WINS

Florida State's Leonard Hamilton enters Saturday's game at Clemson as the fifth-winningest coach in ACC history with 418 wins. He is also the fifth-most winning coach in ACC history for ACC regular-season victories (166), ACC regular season, and ACC Tournament wins combined (192). He is sixth in the ACC record book for ACC road wins (68), and eighth in ACC history for NCAA Tournament wins as an ACC Head Coach (18).

SEMINOLES' NCAA RECORD OVERTIME STREAK IS NOW AT 14 STRAIGHT WINS

Florida State enters Saturday's game against Clemson having won an NCAA record of 14 consecutive overtime games. The Seminoles' streak began with a 101-90 win in double overtime against Syracuse on January 13, 2018. Florida State defeated Duke, 79-70, in overtime on January 18, 2022, in Tallahassee for its all-time college basketball record 13th consecutive overtime victory. Florida State has defeated 12 teams during its overtime streak, including Clemson on February 14, 2018, at the Donald L. Tucker Center. The Seminoles have defeated eight nationally ranked opponents in overtime during their streak, including No. 18/21 Colorado in the championship game of the 2023 Sunshine Slam earlier this season.

FLORIDA STATE FROM THE FIELD RECENTLY

Florida State shot its ACC season-high of .549 from the field in defeating Boston College, 84-76, on Tuesday night in Tallahassee. It marked the fourth time in the last six games the Seminoles have shot better than 50 percent from the field. Additionally, during their current span, the Seminoles are shooting better than 60 percent (136 of 224, .607 percent) from inside of the 3-point arc. Florida State shot a season-high .627 from the field (33 of 51) in its 83-75 win over UNLV in the semifinals of the Sunshine Slam at the Ocean Center in Daytona Beach, Fla. on November 20, 2023.

SEMINOLES GET THEMSELVES TO THE FREE THROW LINE IN VICTORY OVER BOSTON COLLEGE

Florida State made 21 free throws – its fourth-highest total for free throws made in an ACC game this season – in its 84-76 win over Boston College on Tuesday night in Tallahassee. The Seminoles shot .724 from the line – including .813 percent from the free throw line in the second half – in outscoring the Eagles by 10 points (21-11) from the line during the game. Florida State drew 25 fouls in their victory over the Boston College on Tuesday.

SEMINOLES FROM THE FREE THROW LINE

Florida State made more free throws (21) than Boston College attempted (16), drew its ACC season-high of 25 fouls, and outscored the Eagles by a 21-11 margin from the free throw line in its 84-76 victory over the Eagles on Tuesday night. It marked the fifth ACC game this season the Seminoles made more free throws than their opponent had attempted. Florida State also enjoyed their second +10 point advantage from the line of the season (also in its win at Notre Dame) while drawing its ACC season-high of 25 fouls against Boston College.

SEMINOLES NECK AND NECK WITH SYRACUSE IN ACC STEALS RACE

Florida State earned 10 steals – the eighth time in the last 11 games the Seminoles have earned at least 10 steals in a game – and enters Saturday's game against Clemson ranked second in the ACC (behind Syracuse) with an average of 9.3 steals per game. The Seminoles have totaled in double-figure steals in 13 of 26 games with their season-high of 17 steals coming in their 77-71 overtime victory over No. 18 Colorado in the championship game of the Sunshine Slam. The Seminoles ACC high of 13 steals came in their win at Boston College (February 6). Florida State is averaging 9.7 steals per game (77 total steals) in the last eight games entering Saturday's game against Clemson.

FLORIDA STATE VS. CLEMSON – THE LAST MEETING

Clemson's Chase Hunter scored 14 points, going perfect from both the field and the foul line, to help the visiting Tigers to a 78-67 win over Florida State at the Donald L. Tucker Center on January 20, 2024. Darin Green Jr. scored the first basket of the game and from that point on, it was a back-and-forth battle for the lead for the conference rivals. The Seminoles led for over 16 minutes in the first half, as Jalen Warley led the team in scoring with seven points, as well as earning his 100th career steal early in the half. However, the Tigers would not relent, as they managed to tie the score 30-30 right before the first half expired. Junior guard Primo Spears also reached a career milestone, as he passed the 1,000-point mark for his career early in the second half. He is currently Florida State's third-leading scorer on the season and finished tonight's game with 12 points, two rebounds and one assist.

He began his torrid 13-game shooting streak with a five of five shooting performance from the field in scoring 11 points in Florida State's 77-74 victory over Virginia Tech in Tallahassee (January 6). He enters Saturday's game against Clemson shooting .592 from the field for his entire 53-game career as a Seminole.

.833 Freshman Taylor Bol Bowen is shooting .833 from the free throw line (five of six) in the last five games.

.875 Junior Jalen Warley is shooting .875 from the free throw line (seven of eight) in the last two games, has made four consecutive free throws, and is shooting a career-high .701 from the free throw line entering Saturday's game against Clemson.

JACKSON SCORES HIS CAREER-HIGH OF 19 IN VICTORY OVER EAGLES

Just one day removed from his 20th birthday, sophomore Chandler Jackson scored his career-high of 19 points with two rebounds and a career-high tying three steals in Florida State's 84-76 win over Boston College on Tuesday night in Tallahassee. In just the second start of his career, Jackson made seven of his 10 shots from the field (.700 percent), two of his three shots from long distance (.667 percent) and three of his four free throw attempts (.750 percent). Jackson averages 13.0 points and 5.0 assists as a starter. He totaled his career-high of nine assists in his first career start against Syracuse on February 8, 2023 and scored his career-high of 19 points in his second career start against Boston College on Tuesday night.

Jamir Watkins – I wear No. 2 at Florida State because it is my favorite number and the number I wore in high school. I wore No. 0 during my career at VCU.

De'Ante Green – I wear No. 5 at Florida State because I think it looks like a really cool number. It's the first time in my career I've worn the No. 5.

Taylor Bol Bowen – I wear No. 10 at Florida State because my older brother, Deng Adiang, wore the number when he was an AAU star player. Deng later played at the University of Vermont.

Baba Miller -- I wear No. 11 at Florida State because I believe that the only person that can stop me from growing and getting better is myself. I identify 1 as myself, so 11 is the representation of me vs me.

Tom House – I wear No. 12 at Florida State because it has always been my favorite number. It's the only number I've ever worn as a basketball player. Not only is it my favorite number, but it's also my mom's favorite number, too.

Josh Nickelberry – I wear No. 20 at Florida State as a tribute to my favorite all-time player, Ray Allen. Ray Allen has been my favorite all-time shooting guard since I was 10 years old. I've worn 20 my whole basketball career because of him.

GREEN JR. AS ONE OF FLORIDA STATE'S TOP MEN OF STEAL

Senior Darin Green Jr. has 14 steals in his last seven games (2.0 spg), totaled four steals at Louisville (February 3), and enters Saturday's game against Clemson with a single-season career-high of 40 steals and a career-high of 1.6 steals per game average. Chandler Jackson: Improved Confidence Is Important For the Seminoles' Sophomore

CLEMSON, S.C. -- Twice in his last four games, Florida State's Chandler Jackson has established a new career-high for points scored. First it was 17 points against Virginia on February 10, then on Tuesday against Boston College he totaled 19 points as a starter in the Seminoles' 84-76 win over the Eagles.

Just one day removed from his 20th birthday, Jackson scored his career-high of 19 points with two rebounds and a career-high tying three steals in Florida State's victory over Boston College. In just the second start of his career, Jackson made seven of his 10 shots from the field (.700 percent), two of his three shots from long distance (.667 percent) and three of his four free throw attempts (.750 percent).

Jackson has scored in double figures in three of Florida State's last five games and enters Saturday's game at Clemson having scored a single-season career-high 137 points and averaging a career-high 5.7 points per game. He has scored in double-figures more times (four) in 24 games this season than he did in 30 games as a freshman (two). During his Seminole career, he has scored in double figures five times – with each of his double-figure scoring games in his career coming in ACC play (10 against Miami and North Carolina as a freshman and 14 against Georgia Tech, 10 against North Carolina, 17 against Virginia, and 19 against Boston College as a sophomore).

Jackson and the Seminoles travel to play at Clemson at Littlejohn Coliseum on Saturday in a game slated for a 7:45 p.m. tip-off. The game will be televised by The CW.

So, what's changed for the affable sophomore majoring in Social Science?

"What has helped Chandler, is not having the point guard responsibilities as much as we anticipated when he first got here," said Head Coach Leonard Hamilton. "He has the ability to score. He's a big, strong guy, and you can't leave him open. He takes contact and finishes around the basket. He also has a burst of speed that allows him to accelerate and move past people.

"He's also a much better athlete that you might think. Whenever he's in a crowd, it seems that he always comes away with the ball."

Jackson has always had a knack for scoring.

As a senior at Christian Brothers High School in his hometown Memphis, Jackson averaged a double-double of 20 points and 10 rebounds and was named Mr. Basketball in the state of Tennessee. He averaged 18.5 points as a junior as he led Christian Brothers to a 22-1 record and a state championship.

He averaged 3.6 points in 29 games as a freshman and is averaging 5.7 points in 23 games as a sophomore at Florida State.

"I've grown more confident at the urging of my teammates," said Jackson of his recent scoring burst. "Our coaching staff has helped my confidence by teaching me to be more consistent in everything I do both on and off the court."

In his last five games, Jackson has scored 56 points and is averaging 11.2 points scored per game. He has scored in double figures three times and is shooting .710 from the field (22 of 31) with seven field goals made against Virginia and Boston College. Jackson is shooting nearly 80 percent from the free throw line since January 27 against North Carolina.

"I would say what's working best for me right now is getting down hill and getting to my spots on the court," said Jackson. "If I continue to do that, everything else on the offensive side of the court opens up for me and my teammates."

Not only is Jackson playing well offensively, but he's helping the Seminoles on the defensive end of the court.

He totaled three of Florida State's 10 steals on Tuesday against Boston College and has 18 steals in his first 24 games – just one fewer steal than he earned his entire freshman season. Jackson's efforts on the defensive end of the court has helped the Seminoles rank either first or second in the ACC and on a school record pace for steals in a season (9.3 spg).

"I've become a better basketball player during my first two years at Florida State under Coach Ham and his staff," said Jackson. "I think some of my improvement is just me telling myself that I can compete in the ACC and at a high level of basketball. I know that I can go out and be effective every night if I put my mind to it."

Hamilton, the 22nd year Seminole Head Coach agrees.

"Chandler is making much better decisions," said Hamilton following Tuesday's victory. "I don't think he forced anything tonight, and he definitely had an impact on the game."

Jackson's impact on the Seminoles grows as he continues to learn the nuances of the Florida State system. His impact is certainly illustrated by his increased statistics this season as compared to his first year in Tallahassee.

He has already played more minutes, made more field goals, more free throws, and has scored more points in five fewer games. He's established career-high statistics for points, rebounds, steals, field goals and 3-point field goals made in a game. Jackson is shooting better than 48 percent from the field (as compared to just over 40 percent as a freshman) and nearly 78 percent from the free throw line (as compared to 76 percent as a freshman) and he made just as many 3-point shots already this season as he did as a freshman (12).

"I am looking to score more for our team within the flow of the game," said Jackson. "That opens up everything for my teammates, and we are more successful when we are all playing at our highest levels."

Jackson says that the main thing he has improved on this season is certainly his confidence.

"It all starts with my confidence," said Jackson. "But I'm not going to lie, the basket looks pretty big to me right now."

DAYTONA BEACH, Fla. -- Florida State's Jamir Watkins scored a double-double of 18 points and 11 rebounds in earning tournament MVP honors as Florida State defeated 18th ranked Colorado, 77-71 in overtime, to win the championship of the 2023 Sunshine Slam at the Ocean Center. The Seminoles scored the first nine points of the overtime period and outscored the Buffaloes by a 17-11 margin in overtime to extend their ongoing NCAA-best streak of consecutive overtime victories to 14. TALLAHASSEE, Fla. -- In a game that featured 10 ties and 20 lead changes, Florida State's Jamir Watkins earned his fifth double-double game with 22 points and 11 rebounds to lead the Seminoles over Boston College, 84-76, at the Donald L. Tucker Center. Watkins led four Seminoles in double-figure scoring -- Watkins, Chandler Jackson, 19 points, Jalen Warley, 13 points and Cam Corhen, 13 points, leading the way for the Seminoles as they gained their eighth

ACC victory of the season. Florida State's Taylor Bol Bowen hit two free throws at the 10:08 mark of the second half to put the Seminoles up 62-61. From there, the Seminoles steadily built their lead and won the game going away. Watkins pushed Florida State's lead 80-68 with 4:27 remaining and the Seminoles maintained a double-figure lead until Donald Hand Jr. scored the final basket of the game for the winning-margin of eight points for Florida State. The first half was action-packed at a shoot-out pace with both teams going into the half tied at 43. Watkins led the Seminoles in scoring in the first half with 12 points on four of five shooting from the field. Jackson, who was in the starting lineup for the first time this season, totaled nine first half points.
