QUICK HITS

A Win ...

- Would move the Pack to 14-3 on the season (in game one) would mark the 13th win in a row for the Pack
- Would be the first ACC win for first time head coach Lindsay Leftwich
- Would mark the 13th win in an ACC opener in program history (12-8).

Noting the Pack

- 2024 marks the first season under the leadership of first-time head coach Lindsay Leftwich. She came to NC State after spending the last 12 seasons as the top assistant at LSU under Beth Torina.
- NC State returns 18 players from its 2023 campaign, including infielder Hannah Goodwin who led the team with a .359 batting average a year ago.
- The Pack welcomed six newcomers over the summer, including five freshmen and a transfer.
- Tenacious - the best word to describe the 2024 squad. They accept any challenge thrown their way, no matter how difficult it proves to be. Those who were here in 2023 dealt with some interesting circumstances, but stuck together as they knew the future would bring brighter days.

Series History with Clemson (Tigers lead 6-1)

- The weekend marks just the third series with the Tigers since their inaugural season in 2021.
- NC State won the third game of the series in 2023, defeating the No. 6/7 Tigers 7-5. The first two games of the 2023 series were close as Clemson won by only two and three runs.
- The Pack has never won when playing in Clemson.
- The Pack has scored as many as 7 runs and as few as one against the Tigers.
- Friday's outing will mark the first time the Pack has faced the Tigers in a conference opener.
- The meeting will also be a reunion for junior Hannah Goodwin who spent her first three seasons at Clemson. She recorded the final out in the win over the Tigers in game three of the series last season.

Program Record

- In the outing with the Pirates, NC State recorded six doubles -- highlighted by two from both Taylor Ensley and Kaylee Lambrecht.

- The marks sets the program record for most in a single game. Six is also the most in a single game since 2018 when the Pack recorded five against LIU Brooklyn.

Have a day Tay

- Taylor Ensley is having quite the season - the junior leads the team in doubles (5) and ties for second in RBI's (15), homers (5).
- Her .390 batting average marks the best through the first 16 games of the season in her career (.359 in 2022, .259 in 2023).
- She tied a career high two doubles against ECU -- she recorded two against UNC in 2023.
- She holds the longest hitting streak on the team (6 games). She holds the second longest reached base streak (12 games) and multiple RBI games (5).

Everything's Better with an M&M

- MaKayla Marbury is proving herself as a force to be reckoned with offensively. The sophomore utility player is currently hitting .386 on the season -- .181 better than she was this time last season.
- During The Wolfpack Classic, she went 8-for-12 at the plate and finished the weekend with a .667 batting average -- the best weekend average of her career.

The Amanda Show

- Sophomore catcher Amanda Hasler is making her presence known on the diamond.
- She leads the team with seven home runs, ties for first with 17 hits, and is second on the team with 37 total bases. She also has two hit by pitch tallies -- three less than she had this time last season.
- Her seven homers this season ties for most in the ACC this season.
- A nerd of the game, Hasler is one of the most intelligent softball players on the diamond. She is constantly putting in the work to grow her game and be able to help her teammates out.

Ry Wy is Just Getting Started

- The sophomore right handed pitcher recorded a career high 11 strikeouts against UConn. She is the first member of the Pack to record 10 or more in a game since Maddie McPherson recorded 14 in 2022.

NOTES

- She finished the weekend having pitched 16.1 innings, struck out 19 batters, only gave up three runs and walked just one batter.
- Her stellar performance during the Marucci Classic earned her ACC Pitcher of the Week.

Super Woman

- Sophomore Ellie Goins is making a statement in center field. She robbed Campbell of a home run Friday evening and the catch earned the #5 spot on Sports Center Top 10 Plays.
- She finished the weekend with five amazing catches (diving, over in the right center gap, against the outfield wall).

Leftwich Sets the Tone

- Head coach Lindsay Leftwich has begun her career setting the mark for best start for a head coach in their first season leading the Wolfpack. The 13-3 record, which is highlighted by an 12 game win streak, is the best start to the season since 2022.

Stealin' Bases Like No Other

- The Pack recorded six stolen bases against both St. John's (2/11) and Campbell (2/18). The total ties for second most in a single game in program history.
- NC State has already totaled 33 stolen bases this season, surpassing the total from the 2022 and 2023 seasons.

Hitting Streaks

- Freshman Tori Ensley holds a seven game hitting streak, tying Hannah Goodwin for the longest by anyone on the 2024 roster (Goodwin held a seven game streak during the 2023 season).
- The seven game streak is the second longest in the past year — Rebecca Murray went 11 games last season.

Win #600

- The Wolfpack recorded program win number 600 after defeating UConn on Feb. 17. The milestone comes during the program's 20th year of and in just the 11th game of head coach Leftwich's tenure.
- The team notes that this would not be possible if it weren't for all the incredible women who came before them.

Walkin' the Pack

- NC State was walked a total of 10 times vs St. John's, by three different pitchers.
- The mark is tied for seventh most in program history in a single game. The last time the Pack was walked 10 times was against NC Central in 2023.
- Junior Taylor Ensley leads the team with eight walks this season and has been walked twice in three games. This comes to no surprise as she leads the team with four home runs and eight RBI's. She also ties for third on the team with nine hits.

Inscoe in the Circle

- The sophomore right handed pitcher tallied a career high nine strikeouts against St. John's. She recorded six consecutive (third batter face in the bottom of the third to the first batter faced in the bottom of the fifth).
- She surpassed her previous career high of seven K's in the bottom of the fourth inning against

the Red Storm.

- Her opposing batting average of .167 ranks seventh in the ACC.

Back & Making an Impact

- Redshirt sophomore Michele Tarpey missed the 2023 season due to a hip injury.
- She spent the off season finishing up rehab and working on all things softball to get back on the field in 2024.
- In opening weekend, she held a five game hit streak, including hitting the first home run for the Pack of 2024. She finished the weekend with six hits in five games, including a solo home run against Western Kentucky

Duo in the Dugout

- 2024 marks the second time in 20 years (also the length of the program being a varsity sport at NC State) that there have been sisters on the team .
- In 2004, twins Miranda and Shania Ervin were on the roster — catcher and pitcher duo. The two were also the first recruits of the program.
- The 2024 roster has both Tori and Taylor Ensley listed, marking the first time the duo have shared the same dugout in three years. Both sisters play in the outfield, with Taylor making the occasional appearance in the infield.
- The duo started all five games of opening weekend — Tori in left field, Taylor in right. Both made an impact offensively — both recorded at least one hit and Tori recorded a stolen base.

Aisha's Circle

- The redshirt senior pitcher is the first black woman to take the circle for the red-and-white.
- After spending her first two years at Winthrop, the right-handed pitcher joined the Wolfpack in 2022.
- Her first appearance for the Pack was against her former team on Feb. 11, 2022. She pitched five innings in the season opener, earning a game ERA of 1.40.
- She etched her name into the record book after just two seasons with the Wolfpack — third in career strikeouts per 7 innings (7.59), tied-seventh in career saves (2), eighth in career opposing batting average (.234)

Bigger Than Softball

- Sophomore outfielder Bailey Edwards lost her mom during her senior year of high school to cancer. Her mom fought until the very end to make sure Bailey was at everything (recruiting camps, 8am practice, official visits, etc.) to give her daughter the opportunity to play at the next level.
- Bailey strives to be the best version of herself on and off the field because of her mom's strength and bravery.
- After hitting her first collegiate home run (3/8/23 vs USC Upstate), as she was rounding third base, Edwards pointed to the sky with her mom on her mind. After the game, she said her mom was the first person she thought of when she saw the ball go over the outfield wall.

Pack Picked 11th in Preseason Poll

- The Pack was picked to finished 11th in the ACC Preseason Poll
- Reigning champion Florida State was selected to finish top of the conference, followed by

The fourth coach in Wolfpack program history, she comes to Raleigh after a dozen years as an assistant coach at national powerhouse LSU, where she was involved with all aspects of the program including defense, hitting, recruiting, video scouting and camps. In her 12 seasons with the Tigers under head coach Beth Torina, Leftwich helped lead the program to four College World Series, including two finals. The Tigers have spent 166 weeks in the top 25, dating back to Leftwich's first season in Baton Rouge (2012).

LSU also appeared in 10 NCAA Regionals and seven Super Regionals during Leftwich's tenure. While working with all positions, she helped mentor 21 All-Americans and the program's first four-time All-American in catcher/infielder Sahvanna Jaquish. The Tigers boasted 58 All-SEC and 144 SEC Academic Honor Foll athletes while she was on staff.

The 2023 season marked the 17th consecutive NCAA Tournament appearance for the 42-17 Tigers, who ranked 25th in the week-one polls and finished the season ranked 11th. Leftwich led the Tiger defense to its second-highest fielding percentage in program history at .975 and set a program record for the fewest errors in a single season (41). She helped develop Ali Newland into an All-SEC first-team selection as a utility player and assisted center fielder Ciara Briggs to her second consecutive Gold Glove Award - the only two-time winner in college softball -- LSU also boasted a program-high four student-athletes on the 2023 SEC All-Defensive Team.

In 2022, Briggs recorded 82 putouts, seven assists, and was involved in one double play to earn the program's first Gold Glove Award.

The 2019 team posted a .303 batting average to finish out the season, 43 points higher than in 2018. The Tigers set a program record with 74 homers on the season, with two athletes recording 17 each.

The Tigers were SEC tournament runner-ups in 2016 and 2017. The 2016 season left a mark in the history book as the Tigers defeated Louisiana Tech 30-8 at Tiger Park. LSU recorded 30 runs, 27 hits, seven home runs, 27 RBIs, and 56 total bases to record program and SEC records. The team finished third in the College World Series after posting a 52-18 record. The 2017 season marked the third consecutive appearance in the College World Series for the Tigers.

Prior to LSU, Leftwich spent four seasons at Florida International as Torina's top assistant. The Golden Panthers marked a historic season in 2010, accepting the program's second-ever NCAA Tournament bid and winning its first tournament game behind a 38-21 record. Leftwich spent the 2007 season at New Mexico as the director of operations, where she was in charge of softball operations and assisted in daily coaching duties. She was the pitching coach at Wichita State for one year and helped the Shockers to a 35-23 record in 2006.

A native of Houston, Texas, Leftwich was a standout at Northwestern State where she earned NFCA All-Southeast Region, All-Southland Conference, and All-Louisiana second-team accolades in 2002. She drew in 44 RBIs in her sophomore season, tying the third most in NSU history. Sidelined by a back injury, Leftwich missed her senior season as a player, but began her coaching career as a student assistant, aiding in coaching the offense and catchers in addition to playing an instrumental role in recruiting, fundraising, alumni relations, and camps. Leftwich graduated from NSU in 2005 with a bachelor's degree in psychology and minors in art and substance abuse prevention. A standout in the classroom as well, she garnered several academic honors, earning Verizon Academic All-District nods twice and being named a four-time NFCA Scholar-Athlete.
