CLEMSON OVERVIEW

- Clemson is in its fifth season of competition and has made a postseason appearance in each year eligible.
- Through the North Carolina series, Clemson holds a .308 batting average. Clemson also has a .520 slugging percentage and .398 on-base percentage.
- Clemson's pitching staff maintains a 1.85 ERA through 181.1 innings of work and recorded 157 strikeouts.

SOUTH CAROLINA OVERVIEW

- South Carolina is led by head coach Beverly Smith.
- The Gamecocks have a .258 team batting average while also maintaining a .379 slugging percentage and .381 on-base percentage.
- In the circle, they have a 1.55 ERA through 190 innings with 167 strikeouts.

VIRGINIA OVERVIEW

- Virginia is led by head coach Joanna Hardin.
- The Cavaliers have a .252 team batting average while also maintaining a .380 slugging percentage and .329 on-base percentage.
- In the circle, they have a 2.12 ERA through 175 innings with 204 strikeouts.

QUICK HITS

- \bullet Clemson has outscored opponents 162-60 this season.
- Clemson had 219 hits through 27 games, including posting 35 doubles and 32 home runs.
- The Tigers have 144 RBIs this season with Valerie Cagle (27), Maddie Moore (21), McKenzie Clark (20) and Alia Logoleo (16) leading the charge. A total of 14 batters have tallied at least one RBI this season, including seven in double digits.
- Nine Tigers combined for 55 multi-hit games led by Alex Brown (11), Valerie Cagle (10), McKenzie Clark (9), and Maddie Moore (7).

THE NATIONALLY RANKED TIGERS

- Clemson sits sixth on this week's RPI with a 21-6 record Clemson's comes in at No. 11 on both the USA Today/
- NFCA poll and the USA Softball.

 The Tigers are also sitting at No. 13 on this week's Softball America poll and No. 11 with D1Softball.
- For the first time in program history, the Tigers clocked in with a single-digit ranking on all major polls during the preseason.

100 WINS AT HOME

- The Clemson Tigers opened their home slate on Feb. 12, 2020 against Western Carolina at the then Clemson Softball Stadium
- Just over five years later, the Tigers celebrated their 100th-home victory with a 12-0 win against Fordham on Sunday, March 10
- Clemson has tallied a 175-51 overall record in its short five-year span, with an 104-18 (.852) record inside its home venue through the North Carolina series
- The Clemson Softball Stadium was officially renamed after Stuart McWhorter and Leigh Anne Hendrix Mc-Whorter pledged a \$2.5-million-dollar Cornerstone Partner Gift to IPTAY, Clemson Athletics and, more specifically, the softball program. On Feb. 17, 2021, "McWhorter Stadium" signage was officially installed above the stadium's scoreboard, press box and along the backstop to honor the generous gift from the McWhorter family.

CLARK CONNECTION

- Senior McKenzie Clark has left her mark on the Tiger program since stepping foot on campus in 2021.
- Being the starting centerfielder for over 199 games, she has maintained a .341 career batting average with 207 hits and 121 RBIs
- Through the North Carolina series, she has scored 171 runs and stolen 43 bases on her career, both of which sit second amongst Clemson's career records.
- Clark is closing in on the current record for most stolen bases in a career sitting only two behind former Tiger, Carlee Shannon, who tallied 45 during her time in the Orange and Regalia.
- The Myakka City, Fla., native has tallied 37 doubles, 41 home runs and 11 triples to post a .641 slugging percentage and .437 on-base percentage.
- Defensively, she has 192 putouts and 15 assists while only committing two errors.
- Beyond the field, Clark sat down the the ClemsonPlus crew last fall to explain her life journey from adoption to becoming a Clemson Tiger.
- After being adopted from Minnesota immediately after birth, McKenzie transitioned in as the newest member of Brian and Carrie Clark's family that had previously adopted McKenzie's brother, Hunter.
- The love for softball developed from wanting to do everything her brother was doing and was fostered by the love and guidance her parents gave while being her coaches and mentors around the sport.
- Much like her parents chose to adopt her at a young age, McKenzie chose to attend Clemson to help make history with a new program.

ALL ALIA

- Alia Logoleo enters her final season as a Clemson Tiger poised for a dominant finale in the Orange and Regalia.
- The redshirt senior has maintained a .294 career average with 167 hits, including 25 doubles, 37 home runs and three triples.
- She has scored 110 runs and tallied 150 RBIs while

- holding a .544 slugging percentage and .371 on-base percentage. She has also stolen 31 bases.
- Coming from a family of athletes, Alia is the youngest of four: Avei Logoleo (beach volleyball - UAB), Kayla Logoleo (softball - Chattanooga State CC)
- Her mom, Cynthia "Cyndi" Weathers-Logoleo, was a member of the first softball team at Austin-Peay State and met her dad, Elia Logoleo, playing volleyball.
- Of Samoan heritage, she is on of only a few female Polynesian representatives playing full-time college softball.
- In December 2023, Alia traveled to Amerika Samoa to learn more about her culture, visit family and teach softball running camps/clinics with some of the locals

COMPLETE CAGLE

- The Yorktown, Va., native returns for her final season in the Orange and Regalia after being crowned the 2023 USA Softball Collegiate Player of the Year. She also won the Rawlings Gold Glove (pitcher) last season.
- She was the first softball player in the ACC to be crowned both the ACC Freshman of the Year and Player of the Year earning the honor in 2021. She was crowned the ACC Player of the Year again in 2023.
- A threat both in the circle and at the plate, Cagle looks to build upon her 2023 campaign in her final year.
- Cagle aspires to be only the second NCAA player and first since Lauren Haeger (Florida '15) to record 70 pitching wins and 70 home runs. She has secured the pitching wins (currently has 85) and is looking to tally the homers this season (currently has 64).
- This season, she leads Clemson with a .390 average through 24 games, with a .695 slugging percentage and .435 on-base percentage. She also has 27 RBIs and 32 hits, both team highs.
- In 2023, Cagle finished the season with a .469 average after clocking 83 hits, including 19 home runs and 15 doubles. She also had a .887 slugging percentage and .565 on-base percentage.
- Being a dual threat, she posted a 1.56 ERA through 193 innings of work with 188 strikeouts last season. She had 25 victories with eight solo shutouts and three saves on 38 appearances.
- This year, she has a 1.92 ERA through 69.1 innings with 73 strikeouts while holding a 7-4 record with two saves
- Setting a lot of 'Clemson's firsts,' Cagle threw the first perfect game in program history in 2023 against Mercer. The 5.0 inning performance had Cagle facing 15 batters, striking out eight, while only throwing 51 total pitches (40 strikes), and never reached a threeball count during the contest. During the performance, she eclipsed 600 career strikeouts. She became the eighth D1 player to throw a perfect game that season.
- In the opening game of the 2023 ACC Tournament, Cagle struck out a season-high 12 batters in eight innings of work to surpass 700 strikeouts in her career.
- Against Georgia Tech, she threw an immaculate inning tossing only nine pitches to strikeout out all three GT batters on March 24, 2023 in the bottom of the second.

CAGLE HOME RUNS/VICTORIES

- During her career, Valerie Cagle has earned 85 pitching victories and hit 64 home runs at Clemson. She has accomplished both 30 times in the same game.
- When she hits a home run and has the pitching decision, the Tigers are 30-4 (she has suffered only one loss each season).
- In 2023, she accomplished the feat four times in eight days (March 24-31)
- She accomplished it for the first time in 2024 against Wichita State and again against Longwood

PITCHING PROWESS

- Clemson's pitching staff has been one of the best in the country over the past three seasons, finishing in the top seven in ERA since 2021 (2021 5th, 1.50; 2022 7th, 1.78; 2023 4th, 1.59).
- Joining Cagle in charge has been senior Millie Thompson, who has added the perfect 1-2 punch.
- The lefty is a two-time Third Team All-ACC selection (2022-23) and made the All-Freshman team in 2021.
- The Bedford, Va., native has two solo no-hitters on her career (both in 2022) after throwing them against Furman (April 6) and in the 2022 Clemson Regional against UNCW (May 20).
- This season, Thompson holds a 1.36 ERA with four wins through 36 innings with 31 strikeouts.
- On her career, she has a 1.74 ERA in 80 appearances and 326.1 IP. She has struck out 283 batters and tallied 42 victories.
- Joining Cagle and Thompson over the past two seasons have been junior Brooke McCubbin and senior Regan Spencer.
- McCubbin has tallied 16 victories through 51 appearances with five saves. In 147.1 IP, she has struck out 91 batters and holds a career 2.04 ERA.
- Last season, she struck out a career-high eight batters against Michigan State and was one out away from throwing her first career no-hitter after going 6.2 innings before giving up a hit.
- Spencer has made 68 appearances (175.1 innings) with four solo shutouts and 95 strikeouts while maintaining a 1.16 ERA with 21 wins and two saves during her career.
- She picked up her first complete-game shutout of the 2024 season with a seven-inning performance against North Carolina
- Freshman Olivia Duncan made her first appearance in 2024 with a start against Liberty. She has pitched 6.0 innings with two strikeouts.

IT'S GIVING MOORE

- Maddie Moore found her place in the Clemson lineup on the right side of the infield last season by moving to second base after previously floating between third base and shortstop during her freshman campaign.
- As a sophomore, she tallied 92 putouts and 109 assists while only committing four errors - improving from the 46 PO, 94 A & 11 E during her freshman campaign.
- In 2024, she has 32 putouts and 44 assists.
- Appearing in 147 games on her career, she has tallied 89 hits, including 19 doubles and 18 home runs for a .484 slugging percentage and .382 on-base percentage.
- With speed on her side, she has 34 stolen bases and has scored 87 runs.
- She kicked off her junior campaing with a grand slam in the opening game against Missouri State. She followed that with a two-run shot at Charlotte and a three-run bomb in the series finale against North Carolina
- Off the diamond, the junior spoke about what it was like returning to softball after suffering an ACL injury and meniscus tear in October 2019 while she was still in high school
- She credits her mom keeping her sane and helping overcome the mental comeback that was needed to return from injury.
- Majoring in sociology and minoring in women's leadership, she hopes to pursue a career in developing women's athletic wear to encourage body positivity.
 After experiencing so much love and support from the women in her life, she wants to give back on a larger scale.

NOTES

BUFORD PIPELINE

- Redshirt seniors JoJo Hyatt and Arielle Oda enter their sixth year with the Clemson Softball program in 2024.
- The duo both attended Buford HS in Buford, Ga. and signed with the Tigers during their senior year.
- The two joined the program in the fall of 2018 as two
 of the first-ever members of the softball program and
 participated in practice during Team 0's initial year.
- Members of the inaugural season in 2020, these two
 of been a part of every historical milestone Clemson
 has had (from stadium being built to being shutdown
 in 2020 because of Covid to winning an ACC Championship in 2021 to hosting a Regional and making a
 Super Regional in 2022 and 2023).
- The two are looking to help Team 5 'Knock Down the Door' during the 2024 season by making it a step farther than this team ever has before.

TRANSFER TRACKER

- The Tigers added two players to the 2024 roster during the offseason: Alex Brown (junior from North Carolina) and Lindsey Garcia (grad transfer from Auburn).
- Last season, Brown was an All-ACC Second Team selection and earned NFCA Southeast All-Region Third Team honors.
- She led the Tar Heels in 2023 with a .399 average, 63 hits and a .438 on-base percentage while tallying a team-best 19 multi-hit games and five multi-RBI outings.
- As a sophomore, she also hit .434 in ACC play with a team-best 33 hits and stole 11 bases.
- Since joining the Tigers, Brown has 30 runs with 31 hits and 11 RBIs. She holds a .344 average with .500 slugging percentage and .390 on-base percentage.
- Against her former team, Brown went 5-for-10 with two home runs, three runs and a 1.200 slugging percentage
- Garcia is someone the Clemson fanbase recognizes, as she concluded her previous two seasons in McWhorter Stadium at a Clemson Regional.
- Coming off a strong 2023 season, she had a career high with 45 hits, including 10 multi-hit games and 13 multi-RBI contests during her senior campaign. This season, she has three hits with two doubles, RBIs and runs scored.
- She closed her Auburn career tied for fifth in school history in sacrifice flies and tied for seventh in career triples.
- This season, Garcia has a .289 average off 13 hits, including four doubles and one home run, and 10 runs scored with nine RBIs. She also has a .444 slugging percentage and .377 on-base percentage.
- She hit her first home run of the 2024 season 271 feet with an exit velocity of 80 mph in the series finale against North Carolina
- Previous transfers to the Clemson program: Reedy Davenport (3B - 2023), Caroline Jacobsen (OF - 2023), Ally Miklesh (OF - 2023) and Sam Russ (OF - 2021).

TO KNOWLER IS TO LOVE HER

- Julia Knowler jumped onto the collegiate softball scene with a splash as a freshman
- The Fort Myers, Fla. native led off her Clemson career with a solo home run in her first collegiate at-bat. That same game, she tallied a two-run homer and tabbed four RRIs
- She finished opening weekend with a .438 average after clocking seven hits two home runs and two doubles seven RBIs and three runs with 15 total bases. She also had a .938 slg percentage and .526 OBP.
- In the second week, Knowler tallied four RBIs against Wichita State off two hits, a double and a home run.
- She is currently second on the team with a .350 average after recording 14 hits with a .675 slugging percentage

- and .447 on-base percentage. She is second on the roster with 12 RBIs and has four doubles and three home runs this season.
- Before Clemson, she was the Florida Gatorade Player of the Year in 2021 and was named the SWFL Softball Player of the Year in both 2021 & 2022.

FRESH FACES

- Clemson added five freshmen to the 2024 roster: Knowler, Duncan, Kylee Johnson, Riley Burton and Kennedy Ariail.
- Johnson broke seven single-season school records in 2022 and holds two career school records at Wiregrass Ranch HS.
- She was the 2022 Conference Player of the Year and named the #32 Outfielder by ExtraInningSoftball.
- In 22 appearances, she has 10 hits, includig three homers, and six runs score.
- She hit two home runs in the series opener against North Carolina
- The freshman has also clocked eight stolen bases, including two in a single-game against Ole Miss.
- Both Knowler and Johnson played in the 2023 Alliance Fastpitch All-Star Game Clemson sophomore Marena Knowles played in this game in 2022.
- Duncan provides depth to the pitching staff after being named the 2023 Georgia Gatorade Player of the Year.
- A graduate of Buford HS, Duncan was the Regional Pitcher of the Year and the #5 prospect by ExtraInningSoftball.
- Burton is the lone South Carolina resident in this signing class and earned the Golden Glove Award in 2022 for her work behind the plate.
- She helped Legion Collegiate Academy be crowned 2021 SCHS State Champions and was a 2019 4A Player of the Year nominee.
- Ariail rounds out the class as the #70 player on the ExtraInningSoftball Top 100 list and helped set the school record at South Forsyth HS in the 4x200.
- She has appeared in 13 games, starting one, and scored five runs.
- Her first collegiate hit was an RBI single against Fordham

McWHORTER MADNESS

- Clemson fans continue to showcase why they are the best fans in the country.
- With an original capacity of 1,616 for the inaugural season, Clemson expanded the outfield berm seating in the summer of 2022 to move the capacity to 2,116
- In 2024, Clemson has averaged 1,868 fans during its 17 home contests bringing in a total of 31,766 fans through the gates at McWhorter Stadium.
- Through 31 home events in 2023, Clemson welcomed 59,691 fans into the stadium to average roughly 1,925 fans per game (previous attendance record was 1,616).
- Prior to the 2024 season, Clemson has sold out of season tickets for the third-consecutive year after previously selling out in 2022 and 2023 (season tickets were not sold in 2021 due to COVID).
- The Tigers are selling single-game tickets both online and saving a select number of berm-only seats for walkup sales to help fans snag tickets to the hottest show on dirt in Clemson, S.C.

HEAD COACH JOHN RITTMAN



John Rittman, a longtime head coach and member of the USA Softball Women's National Team coaching pool, was named the first Head Coach of Clemson Softball on Nov. 3, 2017. Rittman came to Clemson after serving as the Associate Head Coach at the University of Kansas from 2015-17. Rittman joined the Jayhawks after 18 seasons as the Head Coach at Stanford University and 10 years on the United States National Team coaching staff (2001-08, 2016-18). He returned to the USA Women's National Team staff in 2023 when he served as the head coach for the Japan All-Star Series.

In 2023, Rittman guided the Tigers to a 49-12 overall record that started with a perfect 14-0 run to open the season before the Tigers posted a 37-1 record through the first week of April for another program best. Clemson capped the regular season with a 5-4 victory to mark the 150th of the program and Rittman's 900th-win of his coaching tenure. He become the 44th collegiate softball coach to reach the 900-win benchmark. Hosting the second regional in program history, Clemson went on to defeat UNCG and Auburn to make the second-consecutive super regional appearance. Offensively, Clemson tallied 488 hits with a .313 average. The Tigers led the ACC in On-Base Percentage (.409) and Scoring (6.08 per game) and finished in the top 25 of the NCAA in eight offensive categories. Defensively, Clemson finished with a .980 fielding percentage to lead the ACC and finish seventh in the NCAA. The Tiger defense also turned 31 double plays (.510 per game), which ranked sixth in the nation. With Rittman's tutelage, redshirt junior Valerie Cagle was named the 2023 USA Softball Player of the Year, a Rawlings Gold Glove (pitcher) recipient, the ACC Player of the Year and a NFCA First Team All-American for the second time of her career after she led the ACC in seven categories and ranked in the top 25 of the NCAA in 11 - including sitting in the top 10 in seven led by being second in the country with 157 total bases. As a team, the Tigers clocked their highest individual ranking climbing as high as No. 4 and finished the season at No. 9 in both of the major polls.

In the third year of the program, Rittman continued to guide Clemson to new heights by making the program's first Super Regional appearance after earning the program's first national seed and hosting a Regional. Early in the season, the Tigers upset then-No. 6 Washington, 2-0, at the St. Pete/Clearwater Elite Invitational for the program's first top-10 win. Clemson followed that by playing its 100th game in program history against Illinois on March 13. The Tigers won with a 4-0 victory to tie Clemson women's tennis for the most wins through a program's first 100 games with a 78-22 record. With that record, Rittman solidified himself as the winningest coach among active head coaches at Clemson surpassing Dabo Swinney (football), who held a 74-26 record. The Tigers continued to reach new levels by winning their 100th game in only 130 games on May 1 with a 3-2 win against Georgia Tech on Senior Day to become the second-fastest program at Clemson to reach 100 wins trailing only women's tennis (128). The Tigers were ACC Tournament Runner-Ups after defeating then-No. 19 Notre Dame, 7-3, and then-No. 2 Virginia Tech, 4-1, in the first two rounds before falling in the championship game, 8-6, to then-No. 3 Florida State. The upset win over Virginia Tech marks Clemson softball's highest victory over a ranked opponent in program history. The hot streak continued for Clemson entering postseason as the Tigers earned the No. 10 national seed for the NCAA softball tournament. The No. 10 Tigers welcomed No. 17 Auburn, Louisiana and UNCW for the Clemson Regional and made a clean sweep in three games by shutting out all three programs and run-ruling UNCW and Louisiana to advance to the Stillwater Super Regional.

During the second season and first complete year, Rittman propelled Clemson to even higher heights by becoming the ACC Regular Season Champions after posting a 29-5 ACC record and winning seven ACC series, including six

series sweeps. The Tigers were ACC Tournament Runner-Ups after shutting out both Georgia Tech and then-No. 20 Virginia Tech in the first two rounds before dropping the championship game, 1-0, to then-No. 21 Duke. The Tigers finished the season with a 44-8 record and the sixth-best WL Percentage in the NCAA (.846). Rittman was named ACC Coach of the Year and guided Valerie Cagle to being the first softball player in league history to be named both the ACC Freshman and Player of the Year in the same season. Behind Rittman's efforts, Clemson climbed as high as No. 13 in the NFCA national rankings and No. 10 in the ESPN/USA Softball rankings before finishing the season at No. 18 in the NFCA poll. Rittman led the Tigers to their first postseason appearance traveling to the Tuscaloosa Regional to defeat Troy twice, including a five-inning run-rule victory in the opening game that capped off a historic second season.

In its inaugural season, Rittman transcended Clemson into a nationallyrespected program. Rittman guided Clemson, which was predicted to finish 10th in the conference, according to the 2020 ACC preseason poll, to a 19-8 overall record, including 5-1 in ACC play. The Tigers, who won both of their ACC series against Virginia and Pitt, won 11 of their final 12 games before the 2020 season was cut short due to the coronavirus pandemic (COVID-19). Additionally, Clemson went 14-2 at Clemson Softball Stadium (now McWhorter Stadium), which included a 13-game home win streak that spanned 25 days. Rittman and the Tigers generated plenty of enthusiasm among the Clemson faithful as the first-year program ranked fourth nationally in attendance (24,860) and fifth in average attendance (1,544/game) in 2020. On March 3, the National Fastpitch Coaches Association (NFCA) announced the first-year program received votes (10) in the fifth edition of the 2020 USA Today/NFCA D1 Top 25 Coaches Poll. The announcement came after Clemson defeated then-No. 14 Georgia, 4-1, on Feb. 26 at Clemson Softball Stadium before sweeping the Cavaliers to win its first-ever ACC

At Stanford, Rittman and the Cardinals recorded 18-consecutive winning seasons, made 16-straight NCAA appearances, notched 13 40-win seasons and produced at least one All-American in 15 of his last 17 seasons. As head coach, Rittman accumulated a 750-351-3 overall mark, coached a national player of the year, 16 All-Americans, earned five Super Regional appearances, two Women's College World Series appearances and maintained a spot in every regular-season NFCA top-25 poll for more than a decade.

Rittman served on the staff of the USA Softball team which won gold at both the 2016 Women's Softball World Championship and the 2017 Pan Am Qualifier. He also worked with Team USA from 2001-08, coaching the 2004 Olympic gold medal winners in Athens and the 2008 silver medalists in Beijing. Team USA also won gold medals at the 2002 and 2006 World Championship and the 2003 and 2007 Pan Am Games.

Prior to being named head coach at Stanford, Rittman spent four seasons as an assistant coach at the University of Washington, focusing on hitting and defense. Rittman helped start the program and, within just four seasons, the Huskies had earned a No. 1 national ranking, won the 1996 Pac-10 Championship, made three NCAA Tournament appearances and notched a runner-up finish in their first trip to the Women's College World Series. Washington became the first team since Texas A&M (1983) to advance to the championship game in its first appearance at the WCWS.
