"I don't feel bad," he spoke in the sullen Tiger locker quarters." Their line just whipped ours. I think that Oklahoma line had a helluva lot more to do with the outcome than the heat. They've got some big tough bullies in that line.

"I think we're elright. We just have to get in shape," he continued.

Asked if the new player substitution rule was to his liking, Howard commented negatively.

"I'm having to think more about substitutions than playing," Howard spoke, in evident opposition to the new ruling. "No, I don't like it and I am one of the 15 on the NCAA rules committee. It's not adjustable enough."

OU President George Cross came in to speak with Howard. "Do we have a return game?" Cross queried.

"No, but I want to get one," Howard said. "Tell Bud that."

The Tiger players were quiet, but not outwardly mad of the game.

"Oklahoma has a good football team" pile-driving fullback Pat Crain said.
"They just outlasted us. We didn't keep going like we should I guess."

Starting tackle Jack Aaron thought the Tigers relieved the pressure in the second half, and were quickly succumbed.

"We just let up in the second half. We didn't come out in the second half.

We just let up. Were they running three lines?" Aaron asked. "That hurt us. Individually.

Neely's a good ballplayer."

Aaron played across from Neely.

Punter Bob Fritz admitted John Flynn's rushing his kicks affected him.

Hoarse and soaked with perspiration, Sooner Coach Bud Vilkinson seemed almost too exhausted to enjoy the smashing victory of his 1963 football warriors.

Perched on a counter in the locker room, Wilkinson bemoaned the many errors that plunged the Sooners into a 14-0 deficit early in the game.

"Both teams made more mistakes than you can ever make and win a football game,"
Wilkinson declared. "We made ours in the first half and they made theirs in the second."

Did his team play up to his expectations? "Well, you just never know what to expect, but we sure didn't play well at all. We had those bad kicks and that roughing the kicker penalty, which put us x in a hole. Those were line errors and not quarterback errors."

What did he tell his charges at half-time? "I just told them we had to play better, if we expected to win.

Asked if he believed there was a turning point, Wilkinson said, "Our scoring in the first half was very helpful. Our third team line played exceptionally well. They played eight or nine minutes in the third quarter and kept the other people a little more rested."

Wilkinson said Halfback Joe Don Looney played very little because he felt a muscle tightening in his right leg and "we feared he might pull it." Reporters entering the Oklahoma dressing room after the game found Looney soaking the leg in the hot whirlpool bath.

"You might say the third line sparked us," declared Co-captain John Garrett. "After they blocked that punt they gave the whole team life. I thought the heat was a factor. We were in better condition and better prepared than Clemson.

"I was real happy with the team play for a first game, but we can't play like we did the first half and stay on the field with Southern California," Garrett announced.

Sophomore Carl McAdams agreed with Garrett. "If we play USC like we played Clemson, they'll run us out of the park." Playing his first game in the big time, McAdams admitted, "It was exciting. That was a tough first half, though, but in the second half they were

tired and we were fresher. They were playing longer than we were."

Tackle Ralph Neely, who moved over to end and scored the first touchdown of his career on a 20-yard pass from quarterback Mike Ringer, was beaming over the victory and his scoring feat. "I didn't even know I had the ball until I looked down and saw it in my hands," he laughed.

"We tried it once last year against Notre Dame, but it was short and was intercepted,"
Neely remembered. "It was great to win, but we sure have a lot of work to do."

Toweling off after his shower, halfback Lance Rentzel gave full credit for his thirdquarter 49-yard touchdown run to end Allen Bumgardner. "I didn't really make that run," Rentzel stated modesty. "Al Bumgardner did it. He's the guy who made that block.

Agreeing completely, halfback Virgil Boll said, "We played very poorly, but I think we got a team in the second half. The only thing we really accomplished today is that we finally got together."

Questioned about Coach Wilkinson's halftime remarks, Neely had said, "If Coach Wilkinson's halftime remarks, Neely had said it."

Boll and Rentzel said Wilkinson's halftime comments "made us realize what a real bunch of slobs we were, but then I think we knew that already. You could say the coach made us understand a few things more clearly."

Looney was in the whirlpool shortly after the game ended. Trainer Ken Rawlinson said Looney had "a muscle catch or twitch or something."

Other than Looney, George Stokes has a cut chin and that's all, "beamed Rawlinson."
"Unless a lot of them show up at 9 a.m. tomorrow, we've had a great day."

CLEMSON:

Frank Howard was quite good-humored despite the 31-14 loss Oklahoma had just administered on his Clemson Tigers.

"I don't feel bad," he spoke in the sullen Tiger locker quarters." Their line just whipped ours. I think that Oklahoma line had a helluva lot more to do with the outcome than the heat. They've got some big tough bullies in that line.

"I think we're elright. We just have to get in shape," he continued.

Asked if the new player substitution rule was to his liking, Howard commented negatively.

"I'm having to think more about substitutions than playing," Howard spoke, in evident opposition to the new ruling. "No, I don't like it and I am one of the 15 on the NCAA rules committee. It's not adjustable enough."

OU President George Cross came in to speak with Howard. "Do we have a return game?" Cross queried.

"No, but I want to get one," Howard sadd. "Tell Bud that."

The Tiger players were quiet, but not outwardly mad of the game.

"Oklahoma has a good football team" pile-driving fullback Pat Crain said.
"They just outlasted us. We didn't keep going like we should I guess."

Starting tackle Jack Aaron thought the Tigers relieved the pressure in the second half, and were quickly succumbed.

"We just let up in the second half. We didn't come out in the second half.

We just let up. Were they running three lines?" Aaron asked. "That hurt us. Individually."

Neely's a good ballplayer."

Aaron played across from Neely.

Punter Bob Fritz admitted John Flynn's rushing his kicks affected him.

"It was a factor. When you get a punt blocked, you either let someone by or kicked too slow. I guess you could say it affected me."

Reserve halfback Jim Howard, who didn't play, chimed in at that point, "It wasn't your fault Bob."

"I think our overall performance beat us," Fritz added. "I'd say it was a turning point when that punt was blocked."
