#### **CLEMSON OVERVIEW**

- Clemson is in its fifth season of competition and has made a postseason appearance in each year eligible.
- Through the regular series, Clemson holds a .301 batting average. Clemson also has a .479 slugging percentage and .393 on-base percentage.
- Clemson's pitching staff maintains a 2.24 ERA through 340 innings of work and recorded 267 strikeouts.

#### **DUKE OVERVIEW**

- Duke is led by head coach Marissa Young.
- The Blue Devils have a .332 team batting average while also maintaining a .531 slugging percentage and .410 on-base percentage.
- In the circle, they have a 1.50 ERA through 341.1 innings with 369 strikeouts.

#### **QUICK HITS**

- Clemson has outscored opponents 304-147.
- Clemson had 414 hits through 50 games, including posting 61 doubles, 52 home runs and 14 triples.
- The Tigers have 276 RBIs this season with Valerie Cagle (42), McKenzie Clark (39), Alia Logoleo (36) and Maddie Moore (34) leading the charge. A total of 15 batters have tallied at least one RBI this season, including 10 in double digits.
- 11 Tigers combined for 104 multi-hit games led by Alex Brown (20), McKenzie Clark (17), Maddie Moore (15), Valerie Cagle (15) and Alia Logoleo (11).

#### THE NATIONALLY RANKED TIGERS

- Clemson sits 22nd on the RPI heading into the ACC Tournament and the 24th toughest schedule.
- Clemson's comes in at No. 23 on the USA Today/NFCA poll and No. 21 on the USA Softball.
- The Tigers have been ranked in the last 59 polls eligible by USA Today/NFCA and USA Softball.

#### **ACC CHAMPIONSHIP HISTORY**

- The 2024 season marks the second-time in program history Clemson has entered the ACC Championships as a five seed - the first being 2022
- In 2022, Clemson entered as the five seed and went on to defeat Notre Dame (four seed - quarterfinals) and Virginia Tech (one seed - semifinals) before falling to Florida State, 8-6, in the championship game
- The 2022 season marked the second-consecutive year Clemson had made the championship game after facing Duke in the 2021 championship game
- Clemson entered the tournament in 2023 as the three seed and defeated North Carolina, 2-1, before falling to Duke in the semifinals.
- The Tigers 2024 semifinals matchup against Duke marks the fourth-consecutive appearance in the semifinals this season. This is every year the Tigers have been in the ACC Tournament (Clemson's first season was

2020 when the season was cut short due to COVID).

#### **ALL-ACC AWARDS**

- The Tigers landed seven selections on the 2024 All-ACC teams this is the most All-ACC selections in program history and second-most postseason selections for the Tigers trailing only the 2021 season where Clemson had nine selections (five All-ACC, four All-Freshman)
- Earning her first All-ACC nod is junior Maddie Moore, who is a first team selection
- Alia Logoleo earns her fourth All-ACC selection and first on the First Team (2021 2nd; 2022 & 2023 3rd)
- Alex Brown makes her second All-ACC selection, first as a Tiger - she is a second team nod
- McKenzie Clark earns her third honor after being a first team selection in 2021 and second team in 2022. She is a second team selection
- Regan Spencer earns her first postseason award with a second team selection
- Valerie Cagle and Millie Thompson round out the group with third team selections - this is Cagle's fourth All-ACC honor and Thompson's third

#### **CLARK CONNECTION**

- Senior McKenzie Clark has left her mark on the Tiger program since stepping foot on campus in 2021.
- Being the starting centerfielder for over 222 games, she has maintained a .345 career batting average with 236 hits and 140 RBIs
- Through the ACC Quarterfinals, she has scored 195 runs, which leads Clemson's career records and has stolen 46 bases on her career
- Clark claimed the Tigers' stolen bases record after surpassing Carlee Shannon (45 - 2022). She claimed the record outright with one stolen bases against Duke on April 13
- The Myakka City, Fla., native has tallied 40 doubles, 43 home runs and 12 triples to post a .627 slugging percentage and .440 on-base percentage.
- Defensively, she has 233 putouts and 16 assists while only committing three errors.
- Beyond the field, Clark sat down the the ClemsonPlus crew last fall to explain her life journey from adoption to becoming a Clemson Tiger.
- After being adopted from Minnesota immediately after birth, McKenzie transitioned in as the newest member of Brian and Carrie Clark's family that had previously adopted McKenzie's brother, Hunter.
- The love for softball developed from wanting to do everything her brother was doing and was fostered by the love and guidance her parents gave while being her coaches and mentors around the sport.
- Much like her parents chose to adopt her at a young age, McKenzie chose to attend Clemson to help make history with a new program.

- Following graduation, Clark intends to pursue a professional playing career in Japan, and enter the fire academy.

- poised for a dominant finale in the Orange and Regalia.  $\,$
- The redshirt senior has maintained a .299 career average with 191 hits, including 27 doubles, 40 home runs and three triples.
- She has scored 121 runs and tallied 170 RBIs while holding a .538 slugging percentage and .375 on-base percentage. She has also stolen 32 bases.
- Coming from a family of athletes, Alia is the youngest of four: Avei Logoleo (beach volleyball - UAB), Kayla Logoleo (softball - Chattanooga State CC)
- Her mom, Cynthia "Cyndi" Weathers-Logoleo, was a member of the first softball team at Austin-Peay State and met her dad, Elia Logoleo, playing volleyball.
- Of Samoan heritage, she is one of only a few female Polynesian representatives playing full-time college softball.
- In December 2023, Alia traveled to Amerika Samoa to learn more about her culture, visit family and teach softball running camps/clinics with some of the locals
- She sat down with Clemson Athletics earlier this season to talk about her journey as a student-athlete at Clemson that spans from the inaugural season (2020) to her senior year (2024). Read the full story now on clemsontigers.com/the-journey-to-a-lasting-legacy/
- Following graduation, Alia intends to pursue a career in college athletics

#### **REGAN SPENC(HER)**

- Taking on a new role in 2024, senior Regan Spencer has transitioned from a relief pitcher to Clemson's star in the circle.
- The Lexington, N.C. has been on a roll this season, clocking 10 victories and one save in 27 appearances
   her 10 wins are the most victories in a single season on her career.
- Not a traditional strikeout pitcher, Spencer pitches for contact and has only allowed 18 extra-base hits in 105 IP and only given up 21 walks
- She threw a knock-out series against North Carolina with a complete-game shutout earlier this season to be crowned the ACC Pitcher of the Week following week six the first ACC weekly honor of her career.
- She opened the ACC Tournament with a seven inning performance that allowed only two hits and one walk.
- This season, she holds a 1.93 ERA allowing only 29 earned runs and limiting opponents to a .220 average
- On her career, Spencer has made 81 appearances (239 innings) with four solo shutouts and 130 strikeouts while maintaining a 1.61 ERA with 27 wins and three saves.

#### IT'S GIVING MOORE

- Maddie Moore found her place in the Clemson lineup on the right side of the infield last season by moving to second base after previously floating between third base and shortstop during her freshman campaign. She made the shift back to shortstop in the second game of the Syracuse series and has been there for the last 14 games of the regular season
- As a sophomore, she tallied 92 putouts and 109 assists while only committing four errors - improving from the 46 PO, 94 A & 11 E during her freshman campaign.
- In 2024, she has 67 putouts and 98 assists seeing time at both middle infield positions.
- Appearing in 169 career games, she has tallied 115 hits, including 23 doubles and 22 home runs for a .501 slugging percentage and .398 on-base percentage.
- With speed on her side, she has 40 stolen bases, including a team-high 15 this season, and has scored 108 runs.
- Her 15 stolen bases this season marks the thirdconsecutive year that Moore has clocked double-digit stolen bases. She sits six bases behind Clark's record

- seven from holding it outright.
- She kicked off her junior campaign with a grand slam in the opening game against Missouri State. She followed that with a two-run shot at Charlotte and a three-run bomb in the series finale against North Carolina
- Off the diamond, the junior spoke about what it was like returning to softball after suffering an ACL injury and meniscus tear in October 2019 while she was still in high school.
- She credits her mom keeping her level and helping overcome the mental comeback that was needed to return from injury.
- Majoring in sociology and minoring in women's leadership, she hopes to pursue a career in developing women's athletic wear to encourage body positivity.
   After experiencing so much love and support from the women in her life, she wants to give back on a larger scale.

#### **COMPLETE CAGLE**

- The Yorktown, Va., native returns for her final season in the Orange and Regalia after being crowned the 2023 USA Softball Collegiate Player of the Year. She also won the Rawlings Gold Glove (pitcher) last season.
- She was the first softball player in the ACC to be crowned both the ACC Freshman of the Year and Player of the Year earning the honor in 2021. She was crowned the ACC Player of the Year again in 2023.
- Cagle aspires to be only the second NCAA player and first since Lauren Haeger (Florida '15) to record 70 pitching wins and 70 home runs. She has secured the pitching wins (currently has 86) and is looking to tally the homers this season (currently has 66).
- With the 66 home runs, Cagle is tied with North Carolina's Kristen Brown (2016) for second on the ACC Home Run list. Brown hit 66 career homers for the Tar Heels from 2013-16.
- This season, she holds a .368 average, with a .617 slugging percentage and .442 on-base percentage. She also has 42 RBIs and 49 hits.
- In 2023, Cagle finished the season with a .469 average after clocking 83 hits, including 19 home runs and 15 doubles. She also had a .887 slugging percentage and .565 on-base percentage.
- Being a dual threat, she posted a 1.56 ERA through 193 innings of work with 188 strikeouts last season.
   She had 25 victories with eight solo shutouts and three saves on 38 appearances.
- This year, she has a 2.50 ERA through 89.2 innings with 96 strikeouts while holding an 8-6 record with two saves.
- Setting a lot of 'Clemson's firsts,' Cagle threw the first perfect game in program history in 2023 against Mercer. The 5.0 inning performance had Cagle facing 15 batters, striking out eight, while only throwing 51 total pitches (40 strikes), and never reached a three-ball count during the contest. During the performance, she eclipsed 600 career strikeouts. She became the eighth D1 player to throw a perfect game that season.
- In the opening game of the 2023 ACC Tournament, Cagle struck out a season-high 12 batters in eight innings of work to surpass 700 strikeouts in her career.
- She struck out four batters on April 2 against Furman to surpass the 800 strikeout mark.
- Against Georgia Tech, she threw an immaculate inning tossing only nine pitches to strikeout out all three GT batters on March 24, 2023 in the bottom of the second.

#### PITCHING PROWESS

• Clemson's pitching staff has been one of the best in the country over the past three seasons, finishing in the top seven in ERA since 2021 (2021 - 5th, 1.50; 2022 - 7th, 1.78; 2023 - 4th, 1.59). Through the

- regular season, the staff holds a 2.27 ERA to sit 23rd
- · Joining Cagle and Spencer have been senior Millie Thompson and junior Brooke McCubbin.
- Thompson, a lefty, is a two-time Third Team All-ACC selection (2022-23) and made the All-Freshman team
- The Bedford, Va., native has two solo no-hitters on her career (both in 2022) after throwing them against Furman (April 6) and in the 2022 Clemson Regional against UNCW (May 20).
- $\bullet$  This season, Thompson holds a 1.77 ERA with six wins and one save through 83 innings with 71 strikeouts.
- . She is fourth in the NCAA in walks allowed per seven innings (0.67) and is fourth in the NCAA with a 8.88 strikeout-to-walk ratio. She also leads the conference with only two hit batters all season (14th NCAA)
- On her career, she has a 1.78 ERA in 93 appearances and 373.1 IP. She has struck out 323 batters and tallied 44 victories.
- When not in the circle, expect Millie to bring the energy in the dugout with different hats, bubbles and a multitude of additional antics.
- · McCubbin has tallied 20 victories through 62 appearances with five saves. In 175 IP, she has struck out 103 batters and holds a 2.00 career ERA.
- Last season, she struck out a career-high eight batters against Michigan State and was one out away from throwing her first career no-hitter after going 6.2 innings before giving up a hit.
- Freshman Olivia Duncan made her first appearance in 2024 with a start against Liberty. She has pitched 6.0 innings with two strikeouts.

#### **BUFORD PIPELINE**

- Redshirt seniors JoJo Hyatt and Arielle Oda enter their sixth year with the Clemson Softball program in 2024.
- The duo both attended Buford HS in Buford, Ga. and signed with the Tigers during their senior year.
- The two joined the program in the fall of 2018 as two of the first-ever members of the softball program and participated in practice during Team O's initial year.
- Members of the inaugural season in 2020, these two have been a part of every historical milestone Clemson has had (from stadium being built to being shutdown in 2020 because of Covid to winning an ACC Championship in 2021 to hosting a Regional and making a Super Regional in 2022 and 2023).
- The two are looking to help Team 5 'Knock Down the Door' during the 2024 season by making it a step farther than this team ever has before.
- This season, Oda has started in 47 games and racked up a .453 on-base percentage with 34 hits, 24 walks and been hit by four pitches. She also holds a careerhigh .312 average with 37 runs and 12 RBIs
- In the 2024 ACC Quarterfinal game, Oda tied her career-high with three runs scored against Virginia
- Hyatt, known for executing sac bunts, clocked an RBI in the series opener against Duke with a sac squeeze she made an identical play in 2023 against Pitt. She also went 1-for-1 with two walks and a run scored against Winthrop.

#### TRANSFER TRACKER

- The Tigers added two players to the 2024 roster during the offseason: Alex Brown (junior from North Carolina) and Lindsey Garcia (grad transfer from Auburn).
- Last season, Brown was an All-ACC Second Team selection and earned NFCA Southeast All-Region Third
- She led the Tar Heels in 2023 with a .399 average, 63 hits and a .438 on-base percentage while tallying a team-best 19 multi-hit games and five multi-RBI

- As a sophomore, she also hit .434 in ACC play with a team-best 33 hits and stole 11 bases.
- Since joining the Tigers, Brown has 42 runs with 59 hits and 27 RBIs. She holds a .341 average with .480 slugging percentage and .397 on-base percentage.
- Against her former team, Brown went 5-for-10 with two home runs, three runs and a 1.200 slugging percentage
- Garcia is someone the Clemson fanbase recognizes, as she concluded her previous two seasons in McWhorter Stadium at a Clemson Regional.
- This season, Garcia has a .257 average off 29 hits, including six doubles and four home runs, with 17 runs scored and 23 RBIs. She also has a .416 slugging percentage and .323 on-base percentage.
- · Previous transfers to the Clemson program: Reedy Davenport (3B - 2023), Caroline Jacobsen (OF - 2023). Ally Miklesh (OF - 2023) and Sam Russ (OF - 2021).

#### TO KNOWLER IS TO LOVE HER

- Julia Knowler jumped onto the collegiate softball scene with a splash as a freshman
- The Fort Myers, Fla. native led off her Clemson career with a solo home run in her first collegiate at-bat. That same game, she tallied a two-run homer and tabbed four RBIs.
- She finished opening weekend with a .438 average after clocking seven hits - two home runs and two doubles - seven RBIs and three runs with 15 total bases. She also had a .938 slg percentage and .526 OBP.
- In the second week, Knowler tallied four RBIs against Wichita State off two hits, a double and a home run.
- . She missed 18 games in 2024 due to illness, but returned to the lineup on March 28 against Boston College, where she hit a double, drew a walk and scored one run
- The freshman holds a .283 average through 30 games played, clocking 10 doubles and five home runs with 28 RBIs and 13 runs scored
- Before Clemson, she was the Florida Gatorade Player of the Year in 2021 and was named the SWFL Softball Player of the Year in both 2021 & 2022.

#### **FRESH FACES**

- Clemson added five freshmen to the 2024 roster: Knowler, Duncan, Kylee Johnson, Riley Burton and Kennedy Ariail.
- Johnson broke seven single-season school records in 2022 and holds two career school records at Wiregrass Ranch HS. She was also the 2022 Conference Player of the Year and named the #32 Outfielder by ExtraInningSoftball.
- In 40 appearances, she has 16 hits, including four homers and 10 runs scored with 10 RBIs
- The freshman has also clocked 11 stolen bases, including two in a single-game against Ole Miss.
- Both Knowler and Johnson played in the 2023 Alliance Fastpitch All-Star Game - Clemson sophomore Marena Knowles played in this game in 2022.
- Duncan provides depth to the pitching staff after being named the 2023 Georgia Gatorade Player of the Year.
- Duncan was the Regional Pitcher of the Year and the #5 prospect by ExtraInningSoftball.
- · Burton is the lone South Carolina resident in this signing class and earned the Golden Glove Award in 2022 for her work behind the plate.
- · She helped Legion Collegiate Academy be crowned 2021 SCHS State Champions and was a 2019 4A Player of the Year nominee.
- Ariail rounds out the class as the #70 player on the ExtraInningSoftball Top 100 list
- · She has appeared in 33 games, starting one, and scored 12 runs.

### **HEAD COACH JOHN RITTMAN**



John Rittman, a longtime head coach and member of the USA Softball Women's National Team coaching pool, was named the first Head Coach of Clemson Softball on Nov. 3, 2017. Rittman came to Clemson after serving as the Associate Head Coach at the University of Kansas from 2015-17. Rittman joined the Jayhawks after 18 seasons as the Head Coach at Stanfour University and 10 years on the United States National Team coaching staff (2001-08, 2016-18). He returned to the USA Women's National Team staff in 2023 when he served as the head coach for the Japan All-Star Series.

In 2023, Rittman guided the Tigers to a 49-12 overall record that started with a perfect 14-0 run to open the season before the Tigers posted a 37-1 record through the first week of April for another program best. Clemson capped the regular season with a 5-4 victory to mark the 150th of the program and Rittman's 900th-win of his coaching tenure. He become the 44th collegiate softball coach to reach the 900-win benchmark. Hosting the second regional in program history, Clemson went on to defeat UNCG and Auburn to make the second-consecutive super regional appearance. Offensively, Clemson tallied 488 hits with a .313 average. The Tigers led the ACC in On-Base Percentage (.409) and Scoring (6.08 per game) and finished in the top 25 of the NCAA in eight offensive categories. Defensively, Clemson finished with a .980 fielding percentage to lead the ACC and finish seventh in the NCAA. The Tiger defense also turned 31 double plays (.510 per game), which ranked sixth in the nation. With Rittman's tutelage, redshirt junior Valerie Cagle was named the 2023 USA Softball Player of the Year, a Rawlings Gold Glove (pitcher) recipient, the ACC Player of the Year and a NFCA First Team All-American for the second time of her career after she led the ACC in seven categories and ranked in the top 25 of the NCAA in 11 - including sitting in the top 10 in seven led by being second in the country with 157 total bases. As a team, the Tigers clocked their highest individual ranking climbing as high as No. 4 and finished the season at No. 9 in both of the major polls.

In the third year of the program, Rittman continued to guide Clemson to new heights by making the program's first Super Regional appearance after earning the program's first national seed and hosting a Regional. Early in the season, the Tigers upset then-No. 6 Washington, 2-0, at the St. Pete/Clearwater Elite Invitational for the program's first top-10 win. Clemson followed that by playing its 100th game in program history against Illinois on March 13. The Tigers won with a 4-0 victory to tie Clemson women's tennis for the most wins through a program's first 100 games with a 78-22 record. With that record, Rittman solidified himself as the winningest coach among active head coaches at Clemson surpassing Dabo Swinney (football), who held a 74-26 record. The Tigers continued to reach new levels by winning their 100th game in only 130 games on May 1 with a 3-2 win against Georgia Tech on Senior Day to become the second-fastest program at Clemson to reach 100 wins trailing only women's tennis (128). The Tigers were ACC Tournament Runner-Ups after defeating then-No. 19 Notre Dame, 7-3, and then-No. 2 Virginia Tech, 4-1, in the first two rounds before falling in the championship game, 8-6, to then-No. 3 Florida State. The upset win over Virginia Tech marks Clemson softball's highest victory over a ranked opponent in program history. The hot streak continued for Clemson entering postseason as the Tigers earned the No. 10 national seed for the NCAA softball tournament. The No. 10 Tigers welcomed No. 17 Auburn, Louisiana and UNCW for the Clemson Regional and made a clean sweep in three games by shutting out all three programs and run-ruling UNCW and Louisiana to advance to the Stillwater Super Regional.

During the second season and first complete year, Rittman propelled Clemson to even higher heights by becoming the ACC Regular Season Champions after posting a 29-5 ACC record and winning seven ACC series, including six

series sweeps. The Tigers were ACC Tournament Runner-Ups after shutting out both Georgia Tech and then-No. 20 Virginia Tech in the first two rounds before dropping the championship game, 1-0, to then-No. 21 Duke. The Tigers finished the season with a 44-8 record and the sixth-best WL Percentage in the NCAA (.846). Rittman was named ACC Coach of the Year and guided Valerie Cagle to being the first softball player in league history to be named both the ACC Freshman and Player of the Year in the same season. Behind Rittman's efforts, Clemson climbed as high as No. 13 in the NFCA national rankings and No. 10 in the ESPN/USA Softball rankings before finishing the season at No. 18 in the NFCA poll. Rittman led the Tigers to their first postseason appearance traveling to the Tuscaloosa Regional to defeat Troy twice, including a five-inning run-rule victory in the opening game that capped off a historic second season.

In its inaugural season, Rittman transcended Clemson into a nationallyrespected program. Rittman guided Clemson, which was predicted to finish 10th in the conference, according to the 2020 ACC preseason poll, to a 19-8 overall record, including 5-1 in ACC play. The Tigers, who won both of their ACC series against Virginia and Pitt, won 11 of their final 12 games before the 2020 season was cut short due to the coronavirus pandemic (COVID-19). Additionally, Clemson went 14-2 at Clemson Softball Stadium (now McWhorter Stadium), which included a 13-game home win streak that spanned 25 days. Rittman and the Tigers generated plenty of enthusiasm among the Clemson faithful as the first-year program ranked fourth nationally in attendance (24,860) and fifth in average attendance (1,544/game) in 2020. On March 3, the National Fastpitch Coaches Association (NFCA) announced the first-year program received votes (10) in the fifth edition of the 2020 USA Today/NFCA D1 Top 25 Coaches Poll. The announcement came after Clemson defeated then-No. 14 Georgia, 4-1, on Feb. 26 at Clemson Softball Stadium before sweeping the Cavaliers to win its first-ever ACC

At Stanford, Rittman and the Cardinals recorded 18-consecutive winning seasons, made 16-straight NCAA appearances, notched 13 40-win seasons and produced at least one All-American in 15 of his last 17 seasons. As head coach, Rittman accumulated a 750-351-3 overall mark, coached a national player of the year, 16 All-Americans, earned five Super Regional appearances, two Women's College World Series appearances and maintained a spot in every regular-season NFCA top-25 poll for more than a decade.

Rittman served on the staff of the USA Softball team which won gold at both the 2016 Women's Softball World Championship and the 2017 Pan Am Qualifier. He also worked with Team USA from 2001-08, coaching the 2004 Olympic gold medal winners in Athens and the 2008 silver medalists in Beijing. Team USA also won gold medals at the 2002 and 2006 World Championship and the 2003 and 2007 Pan Am Games.

Prior to being named head coach at Stanford, Rittman spent four seasons as an assistant coach at the University of Washington, focusing on hitting and defense. Rittman helped start the program and, within just four seasons, the Huskies had earned a No. 1 national ranking, won the 1996 Pac-10 Championship, made three NCAA Tournament appearances and notched a runner-up finish in their first trip to the Women's College World Series. Washington became the first team since Texas A&M (1983) to advance to the championship game in its first appearance at the WCWS.


