SEMINOLES BACK ON THE ROAD TO PLAY CLEMSON AT LITTLEJOHN COLISEUM

Florida State, which has won two consecutive ACC games with victories over Syracuse at home (90-74, January 4) and over Miami on the road (80-65, January 8) travels to play its second consecutive ACC road game at Clemson inside Littlejohn Coliseum in Clemson, S.C. on Saturday January 11, 2025 at 2:00 p.m. The Seminoles enter their game against the Tigers having won two straight, four of their last five and eight of their last 11 since a 79-61 win over Hofstra at the Donald L. Tucker Center in Tallahassee on November 19, 2024. Florida State's victory at Miami on Wednesday night was their fifth victory away from home with wins coming over Rice (in Houston), Temple (in Uncasville, Ct.), UMass (in Uncasville, Ct.), vs. Tulane (in Sunrise, Fla.) and at Miami (in Coral Gables, Fla.). Entering Saturday's game at Clemson, the Seminoles have won five ACC road games in the last two seasons (13 games) with two victories at Miami, and one each at Notre Dame, at Syracuse, and at Boston College. Following Saturday's game at Clemson, the Seminoles play host to Pittsburgh (Wednesday, January 15, 9:00 p.m.) and Georgia Tech (Saturday, January 18, 12 Noon) to match its longest ACC homestand of the 2024-25 season.

SEMINOLE HEAD COACH LEONARD HAMILTON BY THE NUMBERS...

...He is ranked fifth in ACC history (all games, all coaches) in victories with 432 wins in the ACC while at Florida State;

...He is ranked third in ACC history in home court ACC wins with 126. He is ranked third behind only Mike Krzyzewski (265, 1981-22) and Dean Smith (197, 1961-97);

...He is ranked fourth in ACC history (regular season ACC) wins with 194. He moved into sole possession of fourth place (surpassing Maryland's Gary Williams) with the Seminoles' victory over Syracuse in Tallahasse on January 4; ...He is ranked fifth in ACC history for regular season and ACC Tournament victories combined with 209 wins. He is one ACC win from tying Gary Williams for fourth place among all ACC coaches for combined ACC regular season and ACC Tournament victories;

...He is ranked sixth in ACC history in ACC road wins with 69. He needs six ACC road wins to surpass Gary Williams of Maryland (75, 1990-11) for road wins in ACC history.

HONORS CANDIDATES WATKINS AND EWIN RUN DOUBLE-FIGURE SCORING STREAKS TO 12 GAMES EACH

Senior All-America candidate Jamir Watkins (10 points) and junior All-ACC candidate Malique Ewin (20 points) both scored in double-figures in Florida State's victory over Miami and both players enter Saturday's game against Clemson having scored in double figures in 12 consecutive games. Watkins (225 total points / 18.8 ppg) Ewin (199 total points / 16.6 ppg) have scored double-figures in each Seminole game since November 15 against Florida. As the Seminoles' top two scorers through the first 15 games of the season (Watkins is ranked third in the ACC in scoring with a career-high 18.7 ppg scoring average while Ewin is ranked 19th in the ACC in scoring and is averaging a career-high 13.7 points per game).

EWIN IS THE ACC'S LEADER IN FIELD GOAL SHOOTING PERCENTAGE

All-ACC Candidate, who has scored in double figures and who is averaging 18.5 points scored per game in the first four ACC games of his career, enters Saturday's game as the ACC leader in field goal percentage shooting with a career-high .588 field goal shooting percentage. Ewin is shooting .690 percent from the field (49 of 71) in the last six games since December 7, 2024 at NC State and is shooting .700 percent (35 of 50) in his four ACC games.

DAQUAN DAVIS A PERFECT 10 IN THE LAST TWO GAMES

Freshman Daquan Davis was a perfect 10 of 10 from the free throw line in Florida State's win over Syracuse on January 4 in Tallahassee and earned 10 assists in Florida State's victory at Miami. He became the first freshman in school history to make a perfect 10 of 10 free throws in a game in the Seminoles' victory over the Orange.

LOOK FOR FLORIDA STATE TO ...

... Defeat Clemson and gain its third consecutive ACC victory. The Seminoles have defeated Syracuse (90-74, January 4) and Miami (80-65, January 8) in their last two games. The Seminoles most recently won five consecutive ACC games during the 2023-24 season with consecutive victories over Georgia Tech (82-71, January 3), Virginia Tech (77-74, January 6, 2024), Wake Forest (87-82, January 9, 2024), Notre Dame (67-58, January 13, 2024), and Miami (84-75, January 17, 2024); ... Defeat Clemson and gain its second consecutive ACC road win. The Seminoles most recently won back-to-back ACC road games during the 2023-24 season with wins at Notre Dame (67-58, January 13, 2024) and at Miami (84-75, January 17, 2024).

Noting All-America Candidate Jamir Watkins

Jamir Watkins – I have switched my number this season from No. 2 to No. 1 for my final collegiate season. I wore both No. 0 and No. 1 in high school at Trenton Catholic, No. 0 during my career at VCU, and No. 2 during my first season at Florida State. I think it's a great looking number. I will also become the first player in my family to earn a college degree and I want to show the younger members of my family that they, too, can earn a college degree.

FLORIDA STATE IS THE SECOND-TALLEST TEAM IN THE NATION

Florida State has been measured as the nation's second-tallest team in the nation by Ken Pomeroy's analytics. The Seminoles' roster contains 12 players listed at 6'5 or taller, 10 at 6'7 or taller, five taller than 6'10, and one seven-footer. Florida State is annually one of the tallest and lengthiest teams in all of college basketball. According to analytics supplied by the legendary Ken Pom, Florida State was the tallest team in the nation during the 2023-24 season.

DURING FLORIDA STATE'S SECOND HALF AGAINST MIAMI...

...The Seminoles shot .630 percent from the field (17 of 27) and scored 41 points. At the same time, the Seminoles limited Miami to a .400 shooting percentage, 12 baskets made (12 of 30), and 40 points scored;

... The Seminoles earned 16 assisted baskets on 17 made field goals (.941 percent). Florida State's only unassisted basket came on a turnaround jumper by Malique Ewin at the 6:47 mark of the second half – a bucket which put the Seminoles up by a 67-50 score;

... The Seminoles earned four blocked shots and two steals while forcing five turnovers. Florida State outscored the Hurricanes 11-3 on turnovers and 11-0 on second chance points;

...The Seminoles turned the basketball over on three times in the second half;

... The Seminoles made five of 10 shots from the 3-point line and outscored Miami, 15-9, from beyond the arc;

...The Seminoles led by as many as 25 points (80-55) on a Malique Ewin dunk with 2:57 left to play.

NOTING FLORIDA STATE'S 26 ASSISTS AGAINST MIAMI

Led by 10 assists from All-ACC Freshman Team candidate Daquan Davis, the Seminoles earned a season-high 26 assists in 32 baskets in their win over Miami on Wednesday night in Coral Gables. The 26 assists tied the Florida State record for most team assists in an ACC game (also 26 against NC State on January 15, 1995, 26 against Clemson on Feb. 20, 2017, and 26 against Boston College on February 20, 2017) and were the most assists in a game since Florida State was credited with 26 assists in a 104-72 victory over Boston College on February 20, 2017. The Seminoles totaled 26 assists on 39 baskets in that win over the Eagles. The school record for assists in a game is 36 against Baptist College on February 5, 1977 when the Seminoles totaled 36 assists in 56 buckets in a 139-72 victory.

FLORIDA STATE'S ASSISTS IN THE ACC STATISTICS

Florida State enters Saturday's game against Clemson ranked fourth in the ACC in assists with a 14.8 team assists per game average. The Seminoles' assists total against the Hurricanes ranks as their season-high and the second time this season they have earned 25 or more assists in a game. Florida State's 26 assists against Miami is the highest by an ACC team against an ACC team this season and is the second-highest total by an ACC team this season just behind Georgia Tech's 27 assists against Alabama A&M on December 28, 2024. The Seminoles' 26 assists are the most by an ACC team against an ACC team since Duke totaled! 27 assists against Pittsburgh in the ACC Tournament on March 9, 2023.

Led by Taylor Bol Bowen's four-of-four shooting night from the 3-point line against Miami, the Seminoles made a season-high 10 3-point shots in defeating Miami on Wednesday night. Florida State is averaging 8.0 3-point field goals made and 82.0 points in the its last four games after averaging 6.3 3-point field goals made and 78.1 points scored per game in their first 11 games of the season.

FLORIDA STATE VS. CLEMSON - THE LAST GAME

Clemson's Joe Girard III scored a game-high 24 points on four made 3-point shots and a perfect 10 of 10 shooting from the free throw line to lead the Tigers to a 74-63 victory over Florida State at Littlejohn Coliseum on February 25, 2024. Girard scored 15 of his 24 points in the second half as the Tigers held the lead throughout the final 20 minutes to gain the win. Junior Jamir Watkins topped Florida State with 18 points, while Primo Spears scored 16 and Baba Miller totaled 12. It was the 13th consecutive game that Watkins had in double figures. Watkins also led the Seminoles with eight rebounds. Led by 10 secondhalf points from Watkins, seven by Miller and six by Spears, the Seminoles chipped away at their deficit and were within five with five minutes remaining to be played. Two free throws from Watkins narrowed the Clemson lead to 60-55. The Tigers, though, closed the game on a 14-8 burst to gain the win. Spears led the Seminoles with 10 points in 11 first half minutes of playing time. He played well as the Seminoles' leading scorer off of the bench for the game with his 16 points. Spears totaled three steals and one assist and finished tied with Watkins for the team lead with six field goals made.

.690 Junior All-ACC candidate Malique Ewin is shooting .690 from the field in the last six games (49 of 71). He enters Saturday's game as the ACC's leader in field goal shooting percentage with a .588 shooting mark from the field.

.750 Sophomore Taylor Bol Bowen is shooting .750 from the field (12 of 16) and the 3-point line (six of nine) in the last two games.

.833 Senior Bostyn Holt is shooting .833 from the free throw line (five of six) in the last two games. He was a perfect two of two from the free throw line and scored four points in Florida State's victory over Miami on Wednesday night in Coral Gables.

.867 Freshman Daquan Davis is shooting .867 from the free throw line (13 of 15) in the last four games. He was a perfect 10 of 10 from the line in Florida State's victory over Syracuse on January 4 in Tallahassee.

Chandler Jackson -- I wear 0 at Florida State because it's a tough-looking number, and one of my favorite players, Russell Westbrook, wears 0.

Jamir Watkins – I have switched my number this season from No. 2 to No. 1 for my final collegiate season. I wore both No. 0 and No. 1 in high school at Trenton Catholic, No. 0 during my career at VCU, and No. 2 during my first season at Florida State. I think it's a great looking number. I will also become the first player in my family to earn a college degree and I want to show the younger members of my family that they, too, can earn a college degree.

Bostyn Holt – I wear No. 3 at Florida State. It's a number I have worn throughout my career – when it has been available. I wore No. 5 at South Dakota, No. 3 during my two seasons at Utah, No. 3 at Coffeyville C.C., and during high school.

Daquan Davis -- I wear No. 5 at Florida State because that's the number I wore as a senior in high school and it's a number that I think looks great on a basketball uniform.

Jerry Deng – I wear No. 7 at Florida State to honor New York Knicks star Carmelo Anthony who has always been my favorite player. I wore No. 15 during my only year at Hampton.

Taylor Bol Bowen – I wear No. 10 at Florida State because my older brother, Deng Adiang, wore the number when he was an AAU star player. Deng later played at the University of Vermont.

Alier Maluk – I wear No. 21 at Florida State because it is 12 backward – which is a number that I have worn – and earned success with while wearing the number throughout my entire career. I wore the No. 12 when I began playing in Baldwin, Pa.

Justin Thomas – I wear No. 25 at Florida State because of an ESPN 30 of 30 story I saw on a player named Benji Wilson. AJ Swinton: Energy, Personality And Basketball Ability Make Him A Great Seminole By Jessi Wynn Seminoles.com January 10, 2025

CLEMSON, S.C. – AJ Swinton is a 6'6" freshman with a 7'2 wingspan who wears a size 18 basketball sneaker.

What really stands about the him isn't his size, rather it's the electric energy he brings to the court and his larger-than-life personality. Every time Swinton steps onto the court, he's full of life, radiating positivity, and firing up his teammates with his contagious enthusiasm.

Swinton has always been full of energy, a trait that has defined him since childhood and led him to basketball.

"I was a very energetic kid, so my parents put me in a whole bunch of different sports, basketball and football," said Swinton. "I fell in love with basketball because it wasn't too much contact, like football or hockey."

Swinton graduated from Bishop O'Connell High School in 2024, where he was a McDonald's All-American game nominee and helped his team achieve a top-15 national ranking during his senior season. Hailing from Cabin John, Md., Swinton developed into a highly sought-after recruit and became the first commitment of the 2024 Florida State recruiting class.

He's carried his high-energy style into his collegiate career, and will help lead the Seminoles (11-4, 2-2 AC) into their game at Clemson (12-4, 4-1 ACC) on Saturday at 2:00 p.m. at Littlejohn Coliseum. The game is set for national television on ESPNU

"I think just over time, I realized I have to show my energy in different ways," said Swinton. It's being able to direct my enthusiasm it in a positive way to uplift my teammates. I try to show it on the bench, if we hit a celebration, and just in general."

Whether on the bench or in the game, Swinton's positivity is undeniable. His radiant smile and contagious laugh are constant, and his presence energizes the entire team.

In addition to the enthusiasm he brings to the court, the Seminoles' coaching staff has also taken note of his defensive abilities which he has illustrated during the first 15 games of his career.

Against Syracuse on January 4, Swinton enjoyed a standout defensive performance in the Seminoles' victory over the Orange, earning a career-high with two steals.

His effort and energy caught the attention of Coach Hamilton, who praised him during the post-game press conference.

"A player that probably didn't have the greatest statistics but made a huge impact was AJ Swinton," said Hamilton. "His contests, his blocks, the energy that he played with when he went in was tremendous. Instead of switching to contain, he was switching to deny, and he got some deflections. We were able to keep up with their energy, put a little more pressure on them, and get some deflections and steals."

Hamilton and Swinton have built a strong bond during the newcomers first season in Tallahassee.

"One thing I appreciate the most about Coach Hamilton is that he gives freedom," said Swinton. "I don't think many college coaches, from what I've seen, give the same of freedom to his players that he gives. He's so in

tune and so in touch with players -- even if we have a bad practice, he'll still be able to joke around a little bit, but still be on that serious note. My relationship with him is great. I can go talk to him anytime."

Swinton notes that because of the person Hamilton is that even short talks turn into life-changing conversations.

"The minutes I spend with Coach Hamilton are always worth the time," said Swinton.

Swinton has also formed strong relationships with the veterans on the team, looking up to them for leadership and guidance.

"I looked up to Jamir when I first came here and when I first committed because he was a strong defender," said Swinton. "I've always looked up to him like an older brother. Chandler is another player I look up to. He's a thirdyear veteran and knows our system almost as well as the coaches."

Off the court, Swinton has found a great connection with his roommate, Taylor Bol Bowen.

"I can go to Taylor, my roommate, and talk and see him every day, always laughing, smiling," said Swinton. "He helps keep me happy, and after games, I go back to the apartments and chat with him on the couch. We just talk basketball"

Swinton's freshman year is off to a promising start. He's averaging 10 minutes played in each of the Seminoles' first 15 games.

His personality also resonates with Kevin Nickelberry, one of Florida State's assistant coaches.

"What makes AJ AJ is no matter what ups and downs he has experienced in his life and his basketball journey he has never lost his joy and appreciation for the game," said Nickelberry. "What first attracted me to AJ when I saw him at the 2023 Peach Jam on a big stage was that I thought he was one of the best 3 and D players in his class. You didn't have to run any plays for him, and he could still affect the game.

"He has the perfect demeanor to continue his basketball career for a long time. With more and more experience he continues to earn, we are going to see a huge jump in his statistics.

Swinton's energy, personality, and dedication make him not just a great teammate, but a rising star whose impact is felt far beyond the stat sheet.



TALLAHASSEE, Fla. - The first look at the 2024-25 Seminoles Basketball team proved successful as newcomer Malique Ewin scored 19 points and star guard Jamir Watkins added 18 points to lead Florida State to an 87-64 victory over Saint Leo at the Donald L. Tucker Center. Each of Florida State's 16 players earned playing time, with 12 playing at least 10 minutes and 12 writing their names in the scoring column. The Seminoles established a dominance from the opening tip with Watkins scoring the first points of the season from outside the arc. Watkins led the Seminoles in the first half with 13 points, three assists, and one steal as the home team built a 43-31 halftime lead. Ewin showcased why he was the number one ranked player and center in the junior college rankings during the 2023-24 season. In leading the Seminoles with 19 points he was a perfect eight of eight from the field with a team-leading five rebounds, and several thunderous dunks most of which came as he ran rim to rim to lead the Seminoles' fastbreak.

UNCASVILLE, Ct. - Junior Malique Ewin scored a careerhigh 15 points and added a career-high nine rebounds, and senior Jamir Watkins scored 19 points to lead Florida State to a 78-69 win over Temple in the Basketball Hall of Fame Tip-Off at the Mohegan Sun Arena. UNCASVILLE, Conn. - Maligue Ewin led four Seminoles in double figure scoring and Florida State defeated UMass, 92-59, in the final game of the Naismith Basketball Hall of Fame Tip-Off at the Mohegan Sun Arena. Ewin was seven of 14 from the field with three free throws and earned 11 of his careerhigh 17 rebounds on the offensive end of the court. Largely because of his efforts, Florida State outscored LSU by a 19-14 margin on second chance points.

SUNRISE, Fla. - Jamir Watkins scored a team-high 29 points, the Seminoles benefited from an early 29-4 run and defeated Tulane, 77-64, in the Orange Bowl Classic at the Amerant Bank Arena. Watkins drew 14 fouls and was 19 of 23 from the free throw line in reaching 29-poinstg plateau for the second time this season. His 19 free throws made are a career-high and the fourth most made in a single game by a Florida State player. Watkins also contributed five assists, four rebounds, and one steal in his standout performance. He was chosen as the MVP of the Seminoles' victory. TALLAHASSEE - Malique Ewin (21 points and 15 rebounds) and Taylor Bol Bowen (13 points and 13 rebounds) earned double-doubles and Florida State defeated Winthrop 82-64 at the Donald L. Tucker Center. The Seminoles opened up a close game late in the first half as they outscored the Eagles 14-5 over the final 4:17 of the first half, and took a 25-point second half lead in earning the victory at home. Jamir Watkins led four Seminoles in double-figure scoring with 23 points. TALLAHASSEE - Freshman Daguan Davis scored 18 points. Taylor Bol Bowen earned his second double-double in the last three games, and four Seminoles scored in double figures to lead Florida State to a 90-74 win over Syracuse at the Donald L. Tucker Center. Davis tied a school record for perfection from the free throw line in an ACC game as he made all 10 of his free throws while Bol Bowen totaled 14 points and 10 rebounds to lead the Seminoles to their first ACC victory of the season. After 12 lead changes and five ties in the first half, Florida State took the lead at 36-34 on a 3-point shot by Davis with 24 seconds remaining before halftime. From there, the Seminoles never trailed, led by as many as 18, and outscored the Orange, 54-40, in the second half to gain the win. The first half ended the same way it began - on a 3-point shot by Davis. He started the scoring with a 3-point shot at the 19:40 mark of the first half and ended with a 3-point shot at the 24- second mark. Davis was two of four from the 3-point line during the game.

MIAMI -- Malique Ewin totaled his third career double-double of 20 points and 10 rebounds, the Seminoles closed the game on a 30-7 run, and defeated Miami, 80-65, at the Watsco Center. Ewin totaled 12 second half points and totaled four second half rebounds as Florida State won its second consecutive ACC game and earned its first ACC road win of the season. Ewin led three Seminoles in doublefigure scoring with his 20 points. Also in double figures were Taylor Bol Bowen with 16, and Jamir Watkins with 10. Both Ewin and Watkins have now scored in double figures in 12 consecutive games - each game since November 15. Bol Bowen was spectacular from 3-point range as he made all four of his attempts from long range. He added six rebounds and three assists.
