OPENING DRIVE

ORANGE START ACC PLAY AT CLEMSON

- Syracuse opens its 13th season of ACC play Saturday at Clemson.
- The game will air on ESPN, with Bob Wischusen (PXP), Louis Riddick (analyst) and Kris Budden (reporter) on the call.
- Saturday's game is the Orange's first true road contest of the season after they opened the season with a neutral site game. Syracuse will play two of its next three games on the road.

ORANGE IN ACC OPENERS

- Syracuse begins its 13th year as a member of the Atlantic Coast Conference.
- The Orange will open conference play on the road for the first time since 2021 and just the fourth time since joining the ACC in 2013. Syracuse has won two of its last three conference openers.

PEANUT BUTTER ANGELI

- QB **Steve Angeli** is the nation's leading passer after back-to-back 300+ yard performances.
- After recording a career-high 416 passing yards against UConn, Angeli posted 382 passing yards against Colgate. He now leads the country with 1,072 passing yards through three games.
- He also ranks first nationally in passing yards per game (357.3), 14th in passing touchdowns (8), 15th in points responsible for (56) and 16th in points responsible for per game (18.7).
- Angeli threw five touchdown passes in Syracuse's win against Colgate, which tied the single-game school record. He became the fifth 'Cuse quarterback to accomplish the feat.
- In addition, he is already tied for seventh on the Orange single-season record list for most 300-yard passing games with two.
- Last season, Kyle McCord led the nation in passing yards and set a single-season school record with 4,779 yards. In his first three games of the 2024 season, McCord passed for 1,074 yards.

YOUTH IS SERVED

- Syracuse is tied for seventh among FBS schools for the most first-time starters this season with 11.
- Navy's 14 first-time starters are the most in the nation.
- Of the 11 first-time starters for the Orange, eight are underclassmen, including two true freshmen in LB **Antoine Deslauriers** and DB **Demetres Samuel**.
- Jamie Tremble** became the latest addition to the group when he made his first career start at linebacker against Colgate. He has also seen time at tight end this season.
- Overall, 30 different players have started at least one of the first three games of the year.

GAME #4 MATCHUP: CLEMSON

SERIES HISTORY

- Syracuse and Clemson will play for the 13th time overall and sixth time in Memorial Stadium.
- The Tigers own a 10-2 advantage in the series.
- The Orange last beat the Tigers in 2017, 27-24 in a thrilling game in the Dome. The squads entered the fourth quarter tied at 24-24. Syracuse gained the lead with 9:41 remaining when kicker Cole Murphy nailed a 30-yard field goal to secure the Orange win.
- Syracuse and Clemson first met in the 1996 Gator Bowl where the Orange posted a 41-0 victory.
- Four of the last seven meetings have been decided by one possession.
- The squads met each year from 2013 when the Orange joined the ACC to 2023.

LAST TIME VS. CLEMSON

- Clemson jumped out to a 14-0 lead and never looked back in a 31-14 victory in the JMA Wireless Dome in 2023.
- A LeQuint Allen Jr. touchdown in the fourth quarter cut the Tigers' lead to 10 at 24-14, but Phil Mahaf's 32-yard touchdown run with 6:38 remaining put the game out of reach.
- QB Garrett Shrader was 15-of-29 for 176 yards and two touchdowns.
- Defensively, DB Justin Barron led the Orange with eight tackles. LB Marlowe Wax had seven tackles, a forced fumble, a pass breakup and a quarterback hurry.
- Clemson QB Cade Klubnik threw for 263 yards and two touchdowns.

SYRACUSE-CLEMSON CONNECTIONS

- Syracuse has two players from South Carolina – TE **Chase Simmons** (Little River) and OL **Kam Pringle** (Dorchester).

- Clemson has one player from New York – OL Rowan Byrne (Bronxville).
- Syracuse OL **TJ Ferguson** and Clemson S Ricardo Jones both went to Peach County High School (Georgia).
- Orange OL **Zach Rice** attended Liberty Christian Academy (Virginia) as did Tigers' RB Gideon Davidson and OL Easton Ware.
- Syracuse DB **Isaiah Hastings**, OL **Naquil Betrand**, and OL **TJ Ferguson** all played at the University of Alabama, as did Clemson LB Jeremiah Alexander.
- 'Cuse DB **Chris Peal** and Tigers' LB **Billy Wilkes** were teammates at Providence Day School (North Carolina).
- Syracuse LB **Zyian Moultrie-Goddard** and Clemson OL Rowan Byrne both went to Iona Preparatory School (New York).
- Orange OL **Zach Rice** and Tigers' OL Hayes Galloway both played at the University of North Carolina.
- 'Cuse edge coach **Nick Williams** and Clemson offensive line coach Matt Luke worked together at Georgia from 2017-2020.
- Syracuse offensive coordinator **Jeff Nixon** and Clemson cornerbacks coach Mike Reed spent 2007-2010 coaching together for the Philadelphia Eagles.
- Orange special teams coordinator **Ricky Brumfield** briefly coached Clemson wide receivers coach Tyler Grisham while he was on the Pittsburgh Steelers in 2009.
- 'Cuse wide receivers coach **Myles White** and Clemson quarterbacks coach Garrett Riley worked together at SMU during the 2020 season.
- Syracuse special teams coordinator **Ricky Brumfield** coached C.J. Spiller, Clemson's running backs coach, in 2010 with the Buffalo Bills.

- Clemson started ACC play last weekend with a 24-21 loss at Georgia Tech. The Tigers enter Saturday's game with a 1-2 overall record.
- Head coach Dabo Swinney is in his 18th season at the helm of the Clemson program. He has guided the Tigers to seven appearances in the College Football Playoffs and two national championships.
- QB Cade Klubnik has thrown for 633 yards through three games. He has three touchdown passes this season and has rushed for another.
- WR Bryant Wesco Jr. leads the ACC with three touchdown receptions this season. He has caught 18 passes for 310 yards, which ranks second in the league and 11th in the nation.
- S Ronan Hanafin is Clemson's leading tackler this season with 28. He ranks fourth in the ACC and 24th nationally in total tackles (9.3 per game).
- Clemson once again has one of the top special teams units in the nation. The Tigers have not allowed a kickoff return this season and rank sixth nationally in punt return defense, allowing -0.50 yards per return.

GAME NOTES: TEAM

A WIN WOULD ...

- Give Syracuse its second-straight win in its ACC opener.
- Improve head coach **Fran Brown's** record to 2-0 in the first ACC game of the season.
- Give Syracuse its 767th all-time victory (includes 11 wins from 2004-06 that were vacated by the NCAA). The Orange currently rank 21st on the FBS ledger of winningest programs. Syracuse is one of 37 FBS schools to have accumulated 700+ wins.

FACING THE BEST

- After facing 10 bowl-eligible teams in 2024, Syracuse's schedule for the 2025 campaign is even more daunting as the Orange will face four College Football Playoff teams and five teams from the final 2024 rankings - all away from home.
- All-11 FBS squads on this year's schedule reached a bowl last season, and six games will be against teams that won nine-or-more games in the regular season a year ago.
- Syracuse opened the season against Tennessee in the Aflac Kickoff Game at Mercedes-Benz Stadium in Atlanta on Aug. 30.
- The Orange will also play road games at Clemson, Notre Dame and SMU - all of which played in last year's College Football Playoff - as well as Miami and Georgia Tech.

SYRACUSE OPENS FOOTBALL PERFORMANCE CENTER

- The momentum continues for the renovation of the home of the Orange - the John A. Lally Athletics Complex. The state-of-the-art Football Performance Center officially opened in March of 2024.
- The new facility provides significant upgrades to the student-athlete experience and helps them meet their performance goals. The facility features increased sports medicine space and student-athlete recovery rooms, a new and expanded team cafeteria and nutrition space, as well as a new locker room, position meeting rooms and coaches' offices, among other amenities.
- The next phase of the renovation is the "One Team" Olympic Sports Center that will feature an expanded sports medicine center, student-athlete lounge and recovery space, and a cafeteria and dining center.

ORANGE ADOPT DART

- Syracuse has adopted head coach **Fran Brown's** **DART** mentality. The acronym stands for detailed, accountable, relentless and tough.
- The mantra is on display throughout the Orange football complex and is incorporated in daily activities, both on and off the field.

ORANGE IN THE COMMUNITY

- The football team earned the 2025 'Cuse Cares Award for community service, which goes to the Orange team that completes the most community service hours during the academic year. It marked the second-straight year the team has earned the honor.
- LB **Derek McDonald** and LB **Anwar Sparrow** were recognized as an ACC Top 6 for Service honorees last season.

NFL DRAFT TINTED ORANGE

- Syracuse had four players drafted in the 2025 NFL Draft, its most selections since 2006..
- TE Oronde Gadsden II was selected in the fifth round by the San Diego Chargers, while QB Kyle McCord went to the Philadelphia Eagles in the sixth round. The Jacksonville Jaguars took RB LeQuint Allen Jr. in the seventh round, and the New Orleans Saints selected DL Fadil Diggs in the seventh round.
- In addition, eight players signed free agent deals, including DB Clarence Lewis (Titans), LB Justin Barron (Cowboys), LB Alijah Clark (Cowboys), WR Jackson Meeks (Lions), OL Savion Washington (Chargers), LB Marlowe Wax (Chargers) and TE Max Mang (Colts). LS Tom Callahan earned a camp invite from the Las Vegas Raiders.

LIKE FATHER, LIKE SON

- Syracuse has two father-son combinations on its 2025 roster.
- Head coach **Fran Brown's** son, **Fran Brown Jr.**, is a redshirt sophomore long snapper/fullback.
- Offensive coordinator **Jeff Nixon's** son, **Will**, is a redshirt senior running back for the Orange. In addition, Nixon's daughter, Jasmine, is a sophomore on the Syracuse women's soccer team.

FREENEY JOINS ORANGE STAFF

- College and Pro Football Hall of Fame inductee **Dwight Freeney** has joined the Syracuse staff in Player Development.
- One of the greatest players in football history, Freeney spent 16 seasons in the NFL, 11 of which with the Indianapolis Colts. He has the 19th-most sacks in NFL history, won a Super Bowl, was enshrined in Canton in 2024 and had his jersey retired at Syracuse the same year.
- Freeney was the 11th overall selection of the 2002 NFL Draft by the Indianapolis Colts, starting a legendary professional career that made him known as one of the greatest pass rushers in the sport's history. In addition to being a Super Bowl Champion, he was named to the All-Pro team four times, including three first-team selections and was selected to seven Pro Bowls.
- At Syracuse, Freeney was just as dominant as he was in the pros. The Bloomfield, Connecticut native racked up 34 sacks from 1998-2001, including setting the program's single-season (17.5) and single-game (4.5) records. A consensus All-American and co-BIG EAST Defensive Player of the Year as a senior, Freeney was a finalist for the Lombardi, Nagurski and Bednarik Awards.

SYRACUSE 60

- The Orange were 18-for-18 in head coach **Fran Brown's** first class of seniors in his Syracuse 60 program, which aims to have each graduating player have a job in their field of study, or be in an NFL camp, within 60 days of graduation.
- 12 member of last year's class wound up in NFL camps.
- Six obtained jobs in their degree fields within 60 days of graduation.

GAME NOTES: OFFENSE

ANGELI PUTS HIS NAME IN THE 'CUSE RECORD BOOK

- QB **Steve Angeli** has earned a spot on Syracuse's single-game record lists the past two games.
- Angeli was 34-of-54 for 416 yards and two touchdowns in the overtime victory against UConn. The 416 yards ranks ninth on the Orange's single-game record list.
- That total is the fourth-highest for an FBS quarterback this season.
- Angeli threw five touchdown passes in the win against Colgate. It marked the fifth time in school history that a quarterback has accomplished the feat.
- Angeli is in his first season as the 'Cuse starter after earning the spot in preseason camp.
- He orchestrated his first fourth-quarter comeback in the overtime victory against UConn. Angeli posted career highs in completions (34), attempts (54) and passing yards (416) in the victory. His 416 passing yards rank ninth on the Orange's single-game record list.
- Angeli transferred to Syracuse from Notre Dame in May 2025. He played in 21 games for the Fighting Irish from 2022-24, including both the national semifinals and championship game of the 2024 College Football Playoff.

WILLIS FIND THE END ZONE

- RB **Yasin Willis** ranks 14th in the nation in rushing touchdowns with four this season despite missing the Colgate game due to injury.
- Willis, who is a member of the Doak Walker Award Watch List, led the ground game against Tennessee with a career-high 91 yards and three touchdowns.
- He added another rushing touchdown against UConn.
- Willis is Syracuse's leading rusher this season with 139 yards on 34 carries.

COOK MAKING AN IMPACT

- WR **Johntay Cook** has played a major role in Syracuse's success throwing the ball.
- He is tied for second on the squad in receptions (12) and is fourth in receiving yards (131).
- Cook posted career highs in catches (6) and receiving yards (58) against Tennessee.

HIGH-FLYING OFFENSE

- The faces may have changed, but Syracuse's success throwing the ball remains the same for the Orange, which led the nation in passing offense in 2024, averaging 370.0 yards per game.
- Syracuse ranks third in the nation in passing offense, averaging 379.0 yards through the air per game.

- The Orange have two of the top-10 single-game passing totals in FBS this season. Syracuse's 447 passing yards against Colgate ranks sixth, while the 416 yards in the win against UConn ranks as the 10th-highest total by an FBS team this season.
- A year ago, Syracuse recorded 4,810 passing yards for the season, which is a school record, shattering the previous mark of 3,855 set in 2016.

DOMES COMEBACKS

- Syracuse produced its second-straight late-game comeback in the JMA Dome in its victory against UConn.
- In two of their last three home games dating back to last season, the Orange have trailed by double digits and comeback to post a victory.
- Syracuse trailed Miami in last year's regular-season finale by 21 in the first half, but outscored the Hurricanes, 28-17, in the second half on its way to a 42-38 victory.
- The Orange entered the fourth quarter down by 13 to UConn in this year's home opener. Syracuse stormed back in the fourth quarter and scored the only points in overtime for a 27-20 victory. It was the sixth come-from-behind win for the Orange under the direction of head coach **Fran Brown**.

GILL AMONG RETURNING WR LEADERS

- WR **Darrell Gill Jr.** is the lone returner from a group of five players who recorded 500+ yards receiving for the Orange a year ago.
- Gill caught six passes for 152 yards and two touchdowns against Colgate. The 152 yards ranks as the second-highest total for a player in the ACC this season.
- He has now recorded 100+ yards receiving in three of his last six games dating back to last season.
- Gill ranks 24th in the nation in receiving yards (269) and 27th in receiving yards per game (89.7).

VILLARI LEADS TIGHT ENDS

- **Dan Villari** is Syracuse's leader in receptions this season with 16. He ranks second in receiving yards with 199.
- He posted career highs in receptions (7) and receiving yards (104) in Syracuse's win against UConn. It marked his first 100+ yard receiving game of his career.

NEW LOOK O-LINE

- Syracuse's offensive line has several new faces this season.
- The Orange have used two different starting lineups in the first three games and nine different players have played at least one snap on the o-line this season.
- Joe Cruz** is the Orange's most experienced lineman. He has played in 28 games for Syracuse, making seven starts, including all three games this season.
- Da'Metrius Weatherspoon** has the most starts among returners, starting 10 games in 2024 at tackle. He appeared in every game and also has 27 collegiate appearances (15 at Syracuse).
- Mark Petry**, who has 39 appearances and 24 starts at Syracuse, will miss this season due to injury.
- The Orange welcomed transfers **Austin Collins** (Louisville), **Naquil Bertrand** (Alabama), **TJ Ferguson** (Florida State) and **Zach Rice** (North Carolina) to the group this season. The four have played in a combined 95 games with 31 starts.

SPREAD OFFENSE

- Twelve different players caught a pass in Syracuse's win against Colgate.
- WR **Darrell Gill Jr.** led the way with six catches for a season-high 152 yards. TE **Dan Villari** and WR **Jaylan Hornsby** had four catches apiece.
- Six different receivers caught four or more passes in the victory against UConn.
- Syracuse was the only FBS school that had five players who recorded 500+ yards receiving in 2024.

JRS TO THE HOUSE

- WR **Justus Ross-Simmons** posted his second multiple-touchdown game in a Syracuse uniform in the win against UConn. He is one of eight players tied the lead in the ACC in receiving touchdowns with three.
- Ross-Simmons is one of 15 ACC players to have two receiving touchdowns in a game this season.
- He has been one QB **Steve Angeli's** most frequent target this season with 20, one behind leader **Darrell Gill Jr.**
- Ross-Simmons is third on the team in receiving yards (159) and fourth in receptions (9).

FIRST-TIMERS

- The first three games of the season have featured several firsts for members of the Orange.
- Wide receivers **Jaylan Hornsby**, **Darien Williams** and **Gabe Daniels** as well as QB **Luke Carney** have scored their first career touchdowns.
- RB **Will Nixon** recorded his first touchdown as a member of the Orange.
- QB **Rickie Collins** threw his first career touchdown pass, while TE **Daunte Bacheyie** made his first career reception.
- Carney, RB **Tylik Hill** and RB **Malachi Coleman** have recorded their first career rushes this season.

GAME NOTES: DEFENSE

17 YEAR OLD STARTER

- DB **Demetres Samuel Jr.** has earned a starting spot in Syracuse's defensive backfield. He will also see time on the offensive side of the ball as well.
- Samuel, who reclassified from the class of 2026 to the class of 2025, enrolled early at just 16 years old in January. He will spend the entire 2025 campaign at age 17 and play both cornerback and wide receiver.
- Samuel is the second-youngest player in college football this season, behind Auburn center Kail Ellis, who checks in 27 days younger than Samuel, but did not enroll early for spring ball and arrived on campus this summer. He was also named a Preseason Freshman All-American by On3.
- He was tabbed as one of ESPN's top-10 freshman for the 2025 season, coming in at No. 8 on Billy Tucker's FBS list of top freshmen. Samuel ranks second in the ACC behind Clemson running back Gideon Davidson, who Tucker slotted at No. 3.

8 FOR #8

- DL **David Reese** is one of three FBS players who are entering their eighth year of college football, joining MTSU's Brendon Harris and Indiana's Solomon Vanhorne.
- Reese transferred to Syracuse in the spring of 2025 after playing two seasons at California. Previously, he battled injuries in five seasons at Florida, providing him additional eligibility later in his career.
- In his first season with the Golden Bears, Reese was selected fourth-team All-Pac-12. He recorded 36 tackles 6.5 sacks and 8.0 TFLs that year.

THE KIDS ARE ALRIGHT

- Syracuse had two true freshman in the starting lineup on defense in the season opener.
- **Demetres Samuel Jr.** became just the fourth true freshman to start at defensive back in a season opener for the Orange since 1985. The group includes Markus Paul, Andre Cisco and current S **Duce Chestnut**.
- **Antoine Deslauriers** was also in the starting lineup against Tennessee at linebacker. He is the first true freshman to start in a season opener at linebacker since Stefon Thompson in 2020.

ROOKS CONTINUES FAMILY TRADITION

- DL **George Rooks** is in his first season at Syracuse, but his name should sound familiar to Orange fans. His father, George, was a star defensive lineman at Syracuse from 1988-91, earning BIG EAST co-Defensive Player of the Year honors before going on to play in the NFL.
- Rooks comes to Syracuse from Boston College where he was a two-year starter. He recorded 55 tackles, 4.5 TFLs and 2.5 sacks for the Eagles.

TRENDING UP

- Since the start of the 2021 season, the Orange have held their opponents to less than 400 yards 34 times. Only Clemson (43) and NC State (37) have done it more times among ACC teams.
- In 2023, Syracuse held eight of its 13 opponents to less than 400 yards of total offense.
- In 2022, Syracuse allowed 328.6 yards per game, which was its lowest total since the 2010 season (301.5 ypg.).

BRYANT MAKES ORANGE DEBUT

- LB **Gary Bryant III** has been a part of the starting lineup in both games this season. He is second on the squad in tackles with 17.
- Bryant transferred to Syracuse last spring from South Dakota, where was a FCS All-American. He helped the Coyotes reach the semifinals of the 2024 FCS Playoffs.

SEEING DOUBLE

- Syracuse's defensive backfield features a set of twins this season.
- **Davien Kerr** is in his second season with the Orange. he appeared in eight games in 2024, starting the last four games of the year at corner. He had 14 tackles, one interception and returned one punt for 46 yards.
- This season, Davien's twin brother, **Davion**, has joined the squad after playing at St. Thomas More in his postgraduate year.

TURNOVER TALE

- 'Cuse has won the takeaway battle in 40 of its last 92 games (23 of the remaining 52 were even).
- Syracuse has ranked in the top-15 in turnover margin in three of the last eight seasons.
- Since the start of the 2018 season, Syracuse's 147 takeaways rank tied for 10th among FBS schools.

DEFENSE COMES UP BIG

- The 'Cuse defense did not allow a touchdown in a half for the second-straight week in its win against Colgate.
- The Orange gave up a first quarter field goal for the Raiders' only points in the first half. The unit did not allow a touchdown in the second half against UConn the week prior.
- The UConn game marked the first time that Syracuse has not allowed a touchdown in a half since Sept. 28, 2024 against Holy Cross (2nd half).
- The Orange limited the Huskies to a pair of field goals between the second half and overtime.

DEFENSIVE TOUCHDOWNS

- DB **Devin Grant** scored Syracuse's second defensive touchdown of the 2024 season when he returned a fumble for a touchdown in the win against Miami. in the regular-season finale.
- It marked the third consecutive year that Syracuse has had multiple defensive touchdowns in a season.
- The Orange recorded three defensive touchdowns in 2022 and 2023.

WELCOME BACK

- Syracuse welcomed back a pair of defensive linemen who missed significant time last season due to injury in the season opener.
- **Dion Wilson Jr.** played in the first four game of the year before suffering an injury that sidelined him until the bowl game. He finished the season with 23 tackles.
- **Kevin Jobity Jr.** started the first five games of the year before suffering a season-ending injury. He had 10 tackles, 2.5 TFLs and two quarterback hurries on the season.

STONEHOUSE STANDS OUT

- P **Jack Stonehouse** once again ranks as one of the top punters in the nation. His 52.6 yards per punt average would lead the nation, however, he does not have enough attempts to qualify for the NCAA rankings. He has six punts of 50+ yards this season, including a season-long 64 against Colgate.
- Stonehouse averaged 45.7 yards per punt last season, which is a single-season Syracuse record.
- He punted 33 times for 1,509 yards, had 10 punts of 50+ yards, 11 downed inside the 20 and allowed just three touchbacks
- Stonehouse now has two of the top three single-season punting averages in school history. In his first year with the Orange in 2023, he averaged 44.6 yards per punt.
- Stonehouse is a member of the Ray Guy Watch List, which honors the top punter in the nation.

WOODY GETS THE CALL

- K **Tripp Woody** earned the starting kicker job during preseason camp and recorded his first career field goals in the win against UConn.
- Woody converted on a 38-yard attempt in the second quarter for Syracuse's first points of the game. Overall, he is 2-for-3 on field goal attempts through three games.
- He is also 12-for-12 on PAT attempts this season.
- Woody transferred to Syracuse in December 2024 after spending his first collegiate season at Iowa.

SPECIAL TEAMS U

- Syracuse has continued its long history of producing punters and kickers who have gone on to success in the NFL.
- Since 2010, Syracuse is one of four schools to have multiple punters selected in the NFL Draft: Riley Dixon (2016) and Sterling Hofrichter (2020). The others are Texas A&M, Michigan and Florida.
- Hofrichter and P Nolan Cooney earned All-America honors in back-to-back seasons in 2019 and 2020, respectively.
- K Andre Szmyt concluded his career in 2022 as Syracuse's all-time leader in points with 454. That total ranks 14th in FBS history and fourth in ACC history in scoring.

MONK TO HAVE JERSEY RETIRED

- College and Pro Football Hall of Fame inductee Art Monk will be the latest football student-athlete to see his jersey hung from the rafters of the JMA Wireless Dome on Nov. 29 when Syracuse hosts Boston College.
- One of the greatest wide receivers in football history, he played at Syracuse from 1976-79 and is still the only player in program history to lead the team in receptions and receiving yards for three-straight seasons (1977-79). He left Syracuse ranked second in school history in all-purpose yards, trailing only fellow Hall of Famer Floyd Little at the time. His 3,899 yards still ranks seventh in school history. He tallied over 100 career receptions, 1,644 receiving yards and nine touchdowns, while also amassing 1,174 rushing yards and four touchdowns in the ground in his 'Cuse career.
- Monk went on to be selected 18th overall by the now Washington Commanders in the 1980 NFL Draft. He'd spend 14 of his 16 seasons in the NFL with the franchise, where he became a three-time Super Bowl Champion (XVII, XXII, XXVI), two-time First Team All-Pro and three-time Pro Bowl selection.

OUR HOUSE- THE LOUD HOUSE



- Built between April 1979 and September 1980, the JMA Wireless Dome was the fifth-largest stadium of its kind in the U.S. at the time and the first in the Northeast. The building covers 7.7 acres and has 527,320 square feet of floor space. It is 570 feet long and 497 feet wide, and the top of the Dome is 165 feet above the playing surface.
- In May 2018, the University Board of Trustees authorized a \$118 million investment for new stadium improvements. Renovations began in March of 2020 with the installation of a new fixed roof. Additional upgrades include a center-hung scoreboard, state-of-the-art sound and lighting systems, improved accessibility and added Wi-Fi capabilities. Air conditioning, new accessible restrooms and new concessions space were also added.
- The new roof features over 3,000 tons of steel fixed to the structure and the center-hung scoreboard is the second-largest center-hung indoor system in the United States.
- Construction continues on the installation of upgraded chairback seating and the introduction of new premium offerings throughout the venue.

Walter Reyes rushed for an SU record 241 yards with four touchdowns to lead Syracuse past UCF, 38-14. The Orange forced five turnovers, including three interceptions. Diamond Ferri and Rich Scanlon led the Orange defense with 30 combined tackles. Tied at the start of the second half, the Orange offense responded with a 94-yard scoring drive to score the first of their 24 unanswered points.

FRAN BROWN

Head Coach • Second Season • Career Record: 12-4 (.750)



Fran Brown was hired as Syracuse's 31st head coach on Nov. 28, 2023 and in one year instilled a culture of success that has paid immediate dividends for the Syracuse football program.

Brown delivered a 10-win season in his first year at the helm, tying Paul Pasqualoni (1991) for the most victories by a coach in their first season at Syracuse. The 10 wins tie for the third-most victories in a season in program history and was just the third double-digit win campaign for Syracuse since the start of this century.

Buoyed by the culture of D.A.R.T. (Detailed. Accountable. Relentless. Tough.), Brown's Orange won three games against top-25 opponents, the most since 1998 for Syracuse, tallied nine wins over bowl teams, finished the season ranked in every poll for the first time since 2018 and boasted a 7-2 mark in one-score games. 'Cuse capped the season with a win over Washington State in the DIRECTV Holiday Bowl, the program's third-straight bowl appearance.

Syracuse had 12 players earn All-ACC honors, the most since joining the conference, despite the league now having the most teams in conference history (17), including First Team All-ACC selection Oronde Gadsden II, who also earned AP All-America honors.

The Orange's passing attack led the nation and set numerous records in Brown's first season. Led by standout Kyle McCord, who became the first Syracuse player to finish in the top-10 of Heisman Trophy voting since 2001. McCord set new program records for passing yards (4,779), completions (391), passing attempts (592), passing touchdowns (34), yards per game (367.6) and total offense (4,714).

'Cuse had four players with 60+ receptions, the only school in the nation to do so, and had five players have over 500 yards receiving. Trebor Pena (84), Jackson Meeks (78), Oronde Gadsden II (73) and LeQuint Allen Jr. (64), all finished in the top-11 of single-season receptions at Syracuse.

Allen also had over 1,000 yards on the ground, making him the first running back in school history to have over 1,000 rushing yards and 500 receiving yards in the same season. Allen set new program records for receptions (64) and receiving yards (521) by a running back. He was one-of-two running backs nationally to go over 1,000 rushing and 500 receiving yards on the season.

With Allen's 1,021 rushing yards and Jackson Meeks' 1,021 receiving yards, it was the first time since 2012 that 'Cuse had a 1,000+ yard rusher and receiver.

In addition to Allen's records by a running back, Gadsden broke his own record for receptions by a tight end (73) on the season.

The Orange offense set over 20 individual or team single-season or career records on the season.

Defensively, 10 different Syracuse players recorded an interception on the season, a hallmark of Brown's experience in the secondary and development of defensive backs.

In one season, Brown placed more 'Cuse players in the NFL than Syracuse has seen in nearly two decades. Gadsden (Chargers), McCord (Eagles), Allen (Jaguars) and Fadil Diggs (Saints) were all selected in the 2025 NFL Draft, the most selections for Syracuse since 2006. Seven other players - Jackson Meeks (Lions), Justin Barron (Cowboys), Alijah Clark (Cowboys), Savion Washington (Chargers), Marlowe Wax (Chargers), Max Mang (Colts), Clarence Lewis (Titans) - signed free agent contracts and Tom Callahan (Raiders) earned a camp invite, bringing the total to 12.

The nation's top recruiter, a member of the 2022 College Football National Championship coaching staff and a New Jersey native, Brown has invigorated Syracuse's recruiting efforts in just one season at Syracuse. The 2024 and 2025 recruiting classes - Brown's first two classes - are the two highest-ranked recruiting classes since the advent of national recruiting services. His first transfer portal class ranked No. 9 nationally, another program best.

A proven winner, Brown is 37-4 over his last three seasons between his first season as a head coach and last two as an assistant.

Brown came to Syracuse from Georgia, where he joined the staff in early 2022. The Bulldogs were 27-1 in his time there and he was part of the coaching staff that led the team to an undefeated season and victory in the 2022 College Football National Championship. Under the leadership of the defensive coaching staff, the Georgia defense finished the season ranked among the nation's leaders in rushing defense, scoring defense, red zone defense and total defense. The defense also finished the season with two first team All-Americans and finalists for awards, including the Butkus Award, the Rotary Lombardi Award, the Bronko Nagurski Trophy and the Shaun Alexander Freshman of the Year Award.

According to 247Sports, Brown was the No. 1 recruiter in the nation for the 2024 recruiting class and played a critical role in attracting top talent to Georgia. This designation follows his recruitment of two five-star prospects, both of whom were ranked No. 1 in their respective positions.

Brown’s extensive resume also includes stops at Rutgers, Temple (2011-16, 2019), Baylor (2017-18) and Paul VI High School (2010).

Prior to joining the Georgia staff, Brown was defensive backs coach at Rutgers for two seasons. In his first year with the program, his secondary helped create 19 turnovers in 2020, 10 more than the previous season and the most since 2012 for the Scarlet Knights.

Before Rutgers, Brown was co-defensive coordinator and cornerbacks coach at Temple. While there, the defensive unit was nationally ranked in red zone defense, sacks, defensive touchdowns, tackles-for-loss and fumbles recovered. At Temple, Brown recruited or coached five players who went on to play in the NFL, including three draft picks: Harrison Hand (fifth round, Minnesota Vikings), Shaun Bradley (sixth round, Philadelphia Eagles) and Chapelle Russell (seventh round, Tampa Bay).

Brown has also recruited and worked with future NFL players, such as Sean Chandler, P.J. Walker, Hasson Reddick, Jullian Taylor, Sharif Finch, Jacob Martin and Raquell Armstead.

At Baylor, Brown served as the assistant head coach/defensive backs coach. While in Waco, he helped turn the program around from a 1-11 season in 2017 to a 7-6 mark the following year, which culminated in a Texas Bowl victory.

A former student-athlete, Brown played football at Western Carolina University, where he was named a team captain and earned First Team All-SoCon selection at cornerback for the Catamounts. He went on to play two seasons in the NFL with the Cincinnati Bengals.

Brown grew up in Camden, New Jersey, and began his collegiate career at Hudson Valley Community College, before transferring to Western Carolina.

Brown and his wife, Teara, have two sons, Fran Jr. and Brayden, and a daughter, Ivy Ann.
