PY THE NUMBERS

Clemson won a school record 27 games in the 2024-25 season. That inlcluded 26 victories during the regular season (school record), 18 ACC victories (school record) and nine road ACC victories (school record). Of the 18 wins in ACC play, 15 came by double-digits the most in school history and the third-most in ACC history. Clemson is second in the ACC in overall wins over the last three seasons (74).

CLEMSON BASKETBALL HEADLINES

- » NEW LOOK TIGERS: Clemson underwent its largest roster turnover under Brad Brownell this past offseason that saw the graduations of Chase Hunter, Ian Schieffelin, Viktor Lakhin, Jaeden Zackery, Matt Kelly, Daniel Nauseef and Andrew Latiff. While seven exhausted eligiblity, six entered the transfer portal. Dillon Hunter, Dallas Thomas and Ace Buckner are the stayovers from last year's roster.
- Clemson was active in the transfer portal, adding talent from all over the country, including Nick Davidson (Nevada), Carter Welling (Utah Valley), RJ Godfrey (Georgia), Jake Wahlin (Utah), Butta Johnson (UAB) and Jestin Porter (Middle Tennessee State). In addition to these six, Clemson will also boast a freshmen class of four: Zac Foster, Chase Thompson, Trent Steinour and Blake Davidson.
- Godfrey returns to Clemson after spending a year away from the program at Georgia. He was recruited by Brownell out of high school and played his first two seasons in Tigertown, including helping the Tigers to the Elite Eight in 2023-24.
- Godfrey on returning to play for Coach Brownell: "His philosophies have helped me just in life. It's something I took for granted my first two years here ... I'm so grateful I have the opportunity to play for Clemson again."
- Coach Brownell on the team this season: "Be patient. I think we're going to be exciting and fun to watch. The strength of our team is the TFAM It's our denth."
- w WINNING WAYS: Clemson has won 74 games over the last three seasons, including two trips to the NCAA Tournament and the school's second Elite Eight appearance.
- The Tigers are 43-17 overall in the ACC over the same time period, the second-most wins in the ACC behind Duke.
- Clemson's 74-30 record for the last three years is the most wins in Clemson history over three consecutive years. The previous mark was a 72-30 mark between 2006-07 and 2008-09.
- The Tigers won a school record 27 games in 2024-25, including wins over AP Top 5 Kentucky and Duke. Clemson finished 18-2 in the ACC – the most conference wins in school history, including a record 15 by doubledigits (third-most in ACC history). The Tigers finished 9-1 on the road in league play, four more ACC road wins than any previous season.
- Since 2017-18, the Tigers are fourth in the ACC in wins (168) and fourth in league wins (90).
- » BRAD BROWNELL INKS EXTENSION: Clemson University and Head Basketball Coach Brad Brownell agreed to a contract through 2031, announced on April 25, 2025.
- Brownell is the winningest coach in program history with 292 wins as the leader of the Tigers.
- \bullet The Tigers have reached the NCAA Tournament four times in the last eight seasons that have culminated in a Sweet 16 appearance in 2018 and

- an Elite Eight in $2024-\mbox{one}$ of just 20 schools to accomplish those in separate seasons since 2018.
- » NEW ACC SCHEDULING: The Atlantic Coast Conference announced the 2025-26 opponents for league members in a newly adjusted 18-game schedule which will be in effect immediately this season.
- The 18-game schedule features teams starting league play in late December and ending on the first Saturday of March. Each team will play one primary partner both home and away as well as one variable partner home and away. The variable partner will be determined each season. Teams will play one game, home or away, against 14 of the remaining 15 teams annually.

CLEMSON RANKS FOURTH IN ACC IN WINS OVER LAST 8 SEASONS

- Head Coach Brad Brownell has led the Tigers to the fourth-most overall wins amongst ACC teams since 2017-18.
- The Tigers have won 90 games in the league, which ranks fourth in that same time frame.

CLEMSON'S RETURNING PRODUCTION IN 2025-26

- Clemson returns just one player that saw action on the court for the Tigers last season senior guard Dillon Hunter.
- The Tigers added six transfers and four freshmen to go with Hunter and two redshirt players from last season Ace Buckner and Dallas Thomas.
- Accounting for Hunter's 5.4 points per game last season, that total is the fourth-fewest in the ACC and the 12th-fewest amongst major conference teams (ACC, Big 12, Big East, Big Ten, SEC).
- While the fourth-fewest in the ACC, the Tigers are the only team of the four to not get a new coach.

CLEMSON'S THREE-YEAR RUN

- Clemson has been on quite a three-year run. The Tigers were 23-11 in 2022-23, 24-12 in 2023-24 and 27-7 last season. That is a three-year record of 74-30.
- With the win over Virginia Tech last season, Clemson set a school mark for total victories in three consecutive years. Clemson won 72 games over the 2006-07 (25-11), 2007-08 (24-10) and 2008-09 (23-9) campaigns. That three year run finished at 72-30.
- Northing can compare to Clemson's record in ACC play over the last three years. The Tigers have gone 14-6, 11-9 and 18-2 in ACC play over the last three years for a 43-17 (.717) record. That includes a 19-11 ACC road record.
- This is just the second time Clemson has had a winning record in at least three consecutive ACC seasons. Clemson had four consecutive winning league seasons from 2007-08 through 2010-11.
- Clemson finished 18-2 in the ACC this season, third in the league. The Tigers finished 11-9 in 2023-24 and have now gone 29-11 over the last two seasons.
- The .725 winning percentage is the highest in program history over the course of back-to-back seasons in the ACC dating back to 1953-54.
- The Tigers three-year run in conference play from 2022-25 is only matched by a Clemson team 76 years ago toward the end of the Tigers' tenure in the Southern Conference.

A RECORD SETTING PERFORMANCE AGAINST THE ACC

- Clemson has had its best performance in Atlantic Coast Conference games this year. Here is a list of some of the more noteworthy accomplishments in league play:
- Posted a 18-2 record, four more wins than the previous Clemson record for any league schedule (14-6 in 2022-23).
- Fifteen of the 18 wins have been by double digits, the most in a season in school history. The previous record was nine double-digit wins among the 14 conference victories in 2022-23.
- Clemson finished its ACC road schedule with a 9-1 mark. It is four more ACC road wins than any previous season. The 1986-87 (5-2), 2022-23 (5-5) and 2023-24 (5-5) all had five ACC road wins.
- The 9-1 ACC road record has a .900 winning percentage, by far

- Clemson has also established a school mark for ACC winning percentage with its 18-2 record, a .900 winning percentage. The previous best were the 10-4 records of the 1986-87 and 1989-90 teams. Those teams won .714 of their league games.
- Clemson won its final eight ACC road games, the longest streak
 of ACC road wins in school history. It is three more than the previous
 record of five set in 1986-87. That Clemson team won its first five ACC
 road games before losing at Duke and North Carolina to end its ACC
 road schedule.
- When Clemson defeated Boston College on March 5 it gave the Tigers at least one victory over 16 of the other 17 ACC schools. Louisville is the only ACC team Clemson has not defeated this year as the Cardinals defeated Clemson 74-64 in Louisville on Jan. 7.
- Clemson's +11.2 points per game victory margin is also a school record for league games.
- Clemson set a school record for consecutive ACC wins regardless of site with its win over Virginia Tech. Clemson finished the regular season winning eight straight ACC games. The previous mark of seven was set in 1966-67 and 2022-23.

CLEMSON SETS RECORD FOR MOST WINS IN PROGRAM HISTORY

- Clemson won its 27th game of the season against SMU in the quarterfinals of the ACC Tournament in Charlotte on March 13.
- The Tigers set a program record for regular season wins against Virginia Tech with their 26th victory, but set a new program standard with its 27th against SMU.

CLEMSON SETS RECORD FOR WINS IN REGULAR SEASON

- Clemson won its 26th game of the regular season against Virginia
 Tech on March 8. That set the school record for regular season victories, surpassing the 1986-87 team that had a 25-4 record in the regular season before losing in the first round the ACC Tournament and the first round of the NCAA Tournament.
- That 1986-87 team ran to a 24-2 record, including 10-2 in the ACC and won its first eight road games and its first 10 games away from home. Clemson was the last team in the nation to suffer a loss away from home that year. The streak was finally broken when point guard Grayson Marshall suffered a sprained ankle at Duke and the Tigers lost, 65-59
- The victory over the Hokies tied the mark for overall wins on the court in a season.
- The No. 12 ranking in the AP Poll is Clemson's highest entering the NCAA Tournament in school history.

CLEMSON POSTSEASON SUCCESS SINCE 2018

- The Clemson Tigers are one of 19 teams since 2018 to have gone to at least four NCAA Tournaments and reached at least two Sweet 16's and one Elite Eight in that time frame.

- Clemson has exceeded the preseason poll projection 12 times in Head Coach Brad Brownell's 15 full seasons leading the program.
- With a 10-6 record in 2020-21, Clemson finished the season in a tie for fifth place in the ACC standings entering games. The Tigers were picked 10th in the preseason vote by the Atlantic Coast Conference Media – a five-place improvement over the preseason prediction.
- Brad Brownell's team had the second-best standing relative to its preseason prediction. Only Virginia Tech was better, standing eight spots ahead of its preseason prediction. Virginia Tech was 11th in the preseason media poll and finished in third.
- This includes a 10-place improvement in 2017-18 when the Tigers were picked 13th in the preseason and finished third.
- That is the all-time record improvement in ACC history from the preseason to the postseason. That team also reached the Sweet 16 of the NCAA Tournament and Brownell was named the National College Coach of the Year by Sports Illustrated.

HUNTER TYSON COMPLETES SECOND NBA SEASON WITH NUGGETS, PREPARES FOR YEAR THREE

- \bullet Hunter Tyson finished his second NBA season in 2024-25 and played 51 games, including two starts.
- Tyson averaged 2.6 points and 1.5 rebounds mostly off the bench for the Nuggets, who advanced to the Western Conference Semifinals against the Minnesota Timberwolves.
- His first career start came on March 17, 2025 at Golden State. He
 finished with nine points and seven rebounds in just under 20 minutes
 of action. He was 4-9 from the field, 1-4 from three and 3-5 at the foul
 line.

PJ HALL SIGNS TWO-WAY CONTRACT WITH MEMPHIS GRIZZLIES

- PJ Hall completed his first season in the NBA on a two-way contract with the Denver Nuggets in 2024-25.
- Hall shined in the 2025 NBA Summer League with the Charlotte Hornets and earned a two-way contract with Memphis.
- In Hall's first season, he appeared in 19 games for Denver and averaged 1.7 points per game and 1.2 rebounds per contest.
- He shined in the G League with the Grand Rapids Gold, appearing in

13 games and averaging 19.2 points, 12.5 rebounds, 1.8 assists, 1.1 blocks and 0.8 steals in 31.4 minutes per game.

PARKER FOX - PHOENIX SUNS FRONT OFFICE

- Parker Fox (2018-22) spent three seasons as a walk-on for the Tiger basketball team before earning a scholarship his senior season in 2021-22.
- Fox graduated from Clemson and immediately began work as a Basketball Operations intern in the Milwaukee Bucks front office.
- Fox has moved into a role in the Phoenix organization where he began working prior to the 2024 season.

GREG BUCKNER - ASSISTANT COACH, MILWAUKEE BUCKS

- Greg Buckner (1994-98) has served on an NBA coaching staff since 2017. He started as an assistant for the Memphis Grizzlies from 2017-19 and had been with the Cleveland Cavaliers since 2020. While in Cleveland, Buckner was promoted from assistant to associate head coach prior to the 2022 season and served in that role through 2023-24
- Buckner was hired by the Milwaukee Bucks in the offseason as an assistant coach beginning in 2024-25.
- Buckner enjoyed a long playing career in the NBA: Dallas Mavericks (1999-02, 2006-07), Philadelphia 76ers (2002-04), Denver Nuggets (2004-06), Minnesota Timberwolves (2007-08) and Memphis Grizzlies (2008-09).

HUNTER TYSON DRAFTED 37TH OVERALL BY DENVER NUGGETS

- Tyson was selected 37th overall by the Oklahoma City Thunder in the second round of the 2023 NBA Draft on June 22. The pick was made by the Denver Nuggets as part of a previously agreed upon trade.
- Tyson was selected the highest in the NBA Draft by a Tigers since K.J. McDaniels was picked 32nd by the Philadelphia 76ers in 2014. He was the first Tiger selected since Jaron Blossomgame in the 2017 NBA Draft (59th overall).
- Tyson earned his first career All-ACC honor last season and was named to the All-ACC First Team for his performance in 2022-23. Tyson put together a career year this past season season.
- He averaged a team-best 15.3 points and 9.6 rebounds per game while shooting 47.9 percent from the floor, 40.5 percent from three and 83.8 percent at the free throw line. In league play, he was even better. He averaged 16.4 points and 9.9 rebounds while shooting 50.5 percent and 84.3 percent at the charity stripe.
- He was named the 2023 ACC Skip Prosser Scholar-Athlete of the Year for his work on the court and in the classroom.
- Tyson became the 44th player in Clemson history to amass 1,000 career points and has since moved into the top 40 all time. He was named to the 2023 Naismith Hall of Fame Karl Malone Award Top 10 and the 2023 USBWA Oscar Robertson Trophy Award Midseason Watch list
- He collected 16 double-doubles which tied him for eighth all-time in Clemson history for a single season with Sharone Wright (1992-93). It is the most in a season since Wright posted 18 in 1993-94.
- Tyson ranked 11th in the nation in double-doubles and is second in the ACC. He's first in defensive rebounding per game (8.26) and second nationally. His 325 rebounds are fourth in the league and 18th nationally.
- The Monroe, N.C. native became just the 17th player in Clemson history to eclipse 1,000 points and 600 rebounds in a career. In Clemson's win over the Wolfpack (Feb. 25), Tyson became the all-time games played leader in Clemson history (136).

HUNTER TYSON MAKES NBA DEBUT

- Hunter Tyson made his NBA debut against the Oklahoma City Thunder on Oct. 29, 2023. Tyson played three minutes and grabbed one rebound.
- Tyson scored his first career NBA points at the Minnesota Timberwolves on November 1. He played a season-high four minutes and finished 1-for-2 from the field with his first basket coming on a dunk. He also added a rebound.

TYSON COMPLETES FIRST SEASON IN THE NBA

- Hunter Tyson played in 18 games last season for the Denver Nuggets, averaging 2.7 minutes per contest.
- He scored 20 points, grabbed nine rebounds and totaled two assists and one steal.

PJ HALL SIGNS FIRST TWO-WAY CONTRACT WITH DENVER NUGGETS

- PJ Hall (Spartanburg, S.C./Dorman) agreed to terms with the Denver Nuggets. Hall will join Hunter Tyson (Monroe, N.C./Piedmont) in Denver after Tyson spent his rookie season with the Nuggets in 2023-24.
- Hall was an All-ACC First Team selection as a senior after being named to the Third Team as a junior. He was an AP All-American Honorable Mention and was named to the NCAA All-West Region Team, NABC All-District First Team, a finalist for the Kareem Abdul-Jabbar Award (nation's best center) and the Oscar Robertson Trophy All-America Watch List in 2024.
- Hall finished with 659 points this year in 36 games, an 18.3 average per game. He set the school record for points in a season. The existing record was 651 points by Horace Grant in 1986-87 and Bill Yarborough in 1954-55
- He posted fourteen 20-point games this season and has scored in double-figures 35 times. Hall totaled seven double-doubles and netted one 30-point game, which was a career high 31 points and 17 rebounds against Georgia Tech (Jan. 16).
- Hall finished fourth in the ACC in scoring with 18.3 points per game, while ranking 15th in rebounding (6.4 per game). He shot at a very high clip this past season, ninth in the league (48.8 percent). Defensively, Hall was fourth in the ACC blocks per game (1.42) and had 51 blocked
- He finished seventh on Clemson's all-time scoring list (1,702 points). He is just the fourth Tiger to amass 1,700 points, 600 rebounds and 100 blocks in a career (Trevor Booker, Elden Campbell and Dale Davis)
- Hall is seventh in career points (1,702), 15th in scoring average (14.20), 22nd in rebounds (634) and seventh in field goals made (641).
- He finished with five NCAA Tournament games played in his career. He averaged 11.2 points and added 19 rebounds, three assists, two blocks and a steal

- PJ Hall scored his first career points on 11/23/24 at the Los Angeles Lakers. The Nuggets won 127-102.
- Hall played three minutes and finished with two points which came on a reverse dunk.
