QUICKLY: The Palmetto Bowl Trophy and a point in the South Carolina Education Lottery Palmetto Series are on the line when the South Carolina Gamecocks (4-7, 1-7 SEC) wrap up the 2025 season on Saturday, November 29, in a non-conference matchup with the Clemson Tigers (6-5, 4-4 ACC) out of the Atlantic Coast Conference. Game time is set for high noon at Williams-Brice Stadium (77,559) in Columbia.

OVER THE AIRWAVES: This week's game will be televised on the SEC Network with Taylor Zarzour handling the play-by-play, Matt Stinchcomb providing the color commentary and South Carolina's own Alyssa Lang working the sidelines. The Gamecock Sports Radio Network features a pair of Gamecock Hall of Fame quarterbacks in play-by-play voice Todd Ellis (34th season) and analyst Tommy Suggs (53rd season). Chet Tucker returns for his third year as the sideline reporter.

YOU DON'T WIN IF YOU DON'T PLAY: The Palmetto Series points chase was rekindled in 2022. This year's competition between South Carolina and Clemson is presented by the South Carolina Education Lottery. When the rivals face off this season, each school will earn a point for a win with the overall winner taking home the Palmetto Series trophy and bragging rights. Started in 2015, the Gamecocks lead the overall Palmetto Series by a comfortable 6-1 margin. Clemson holds a slim 2-1 lead in 2025-26, capturing points in men's soccer and volleyball, while South Carolina won a point in women's basketball. The women's soccer match ended in a scoreless tie. The next matchup comes in men's basketball when the two schools will meet on the hardwood in the Upstate on Tuesday, Dec. 16.



SEASON SNAPSHOT: The Gamecocks enter this week's contest with a 4-7 mark. Carolina opened the season with a 24-11 non-conference win over Virginia Tech in Atlanta, then rolled past South Carolina State by a 38-10 margin in the home opener. The Gamecocks had their eight-game regular season winning streak and their 16-game winning streak against Vanderbilt snapped in a 31-7 decision in the SEC lid-lifter, then fell by a 29-20 count at Missouri before bouncing back with a convincing 35-13 win over Kentucky. After a bye week, the Gamecocks went to Baton Rouge and came up on the short end of a 20-10 decision to 11th-ranked LSU, then dropped back-to-back home decisions to No. 14/13 Oklahoma (26-7) and No. 4/4 Alabama (29-22) before losing at No. 7/8 Ole Miss, 30-14, and at No. 3/3 Texas A&M 31-30. The Gamecocks got back on the winning track last Saturday with a 51-7 rout of Coastal Carolina.

CLOSE BUT NO CIGAR: The Gamecocks have played most of their opponents close this season but have not been able to finish. They have either lead or have been within a touchdown entering the fourth quarter in nine of 11 games this season. In their seven losses, they led No. 23 Missouri, No. 4 Alabama and No. 3 Texas A&M heading into the final stanza, trailed No. 11 LSU and No. 7 Ole Miss by just seven and six points respectively, before ultimately falling short, and even in the two "blowout" losses versus Vanderbilt and Oklahoma, were within one score at halftime in each contest. The Gamecocks are 25-5 when leading after three quarters under Coach Beamer, but just 4-3 this season.

CAROLINA VERSUS CLEMSON: This is the 122nd meeting between these two Palmetto State schools in a series that dates back to 1896. The teams met every year from 1909-2019, making the Carolina-Clemson series the second-longest running consecutively-played series in college football behind only Minnesota-Wisconsin before the series was interrupted in 2020 due to COVID-19. The Tigers hold a 73-44-4 lead in the all-time series, including a 54-32-3 advantage in Columbia and a 19-12-1 mark in Clemson. South Carolina has won two of the last three, snapping a Clemson seven-game winning streak. The Tigers have won the last five in Columbia with the Gamecocks last win in Williams-Brice Stadium coming in 2013.



THE LAST TIME THEY MET: LaNorris Sellers scrambled to paydirt from 20-yards out on a 3rd-and-16 with 1:08 left in the contest to put the Gamecocks on top, then Demetrius Knight Jr. sealed the win with an interception of Cade Klubnik in the red-zone as No. 16 Carolina rallied to defeat No. 12 Clemson in Tiger Stadium, 17-14, on Nov. 30, 2024. Sellers completed 13-of-21 passes for 164 yards and rushed 16 times for a career-high 166 yards and two touchdowns in the contest, lifting the Gamecocks to their sixth-straight win to wrap up the 2024 regular season.

THE LAST TIME THEY MET HERE: South Carolina scored the only offensive touchdown in the game, a one-yard run by Luke Doty, but Clemson's defense proved to be too much as the Tigers posted a 16-7 win in Columbia on Nov. 25, 2023. The Gamecocks could muster just 169 yards of total offense in the contest. Khalil Barnes returned a fumble 42 yards in the game's first series and Jonathan Weitz added three field goals for Clemson.

YOU'RE NOT WORTHY: The Gamecocks are 48-16 in their last 64 non-conference games, a .750 winning clip. The Gamecocks went 4-1 in non-conference play in 2024 with wins over Old Dominion, Akron, Wofford and Clemson, before a loss to Illinois in the Cheez-It Citrus Bowl. They are 2-0 in non-conference play this season with wins over Virginia Tech and South Carolina State.

PROTECT THIS HOUSE: South Carolina has won 42 of its last 49 home games (.857) against non-conference foes. The Gamecocks had won a school-record 22-straight home games against non-conference teams before dropping the final two games of the 2015 regular season to The Citadel and Clemson.

OLD FRIEND ALERT: Clemson defensive run game coordinator Chris Rumph was a four-year letterman as a linebacker at South Carolina from 1991-94. Lorenzo Ward, who serves as a Special Assistant to the Head Coach & Special Teams for the Tigers was part of Steve Spurrier's staff at Carolina from 2009-15, including a stint as the defensive coordinator.

NO FAVORS DETECTED: Nine of the Gamecocks' 11 FBS opponents are bowl-eligible with Kentucky needing a win over Louisville to become the 10th team to reach that plateau. 2025 Carolina opponents from Oct. 18-Nov. 15 - Oklahoma, Alabama, Ole Miss and Texas A&M - are all projected to be in the CFB 12-team bracket.

LIFE IN THE SEC: South Carolina wrapped up a stretch in which they faced five top-15 teams in a row for the first time in school history. They played at No. 11 LSU and hosted No. 14 Oklahoma and No. 4 Alabama before playing at No. 7 Ole Miss and at No. 3 Texas A&M. The Texas A&M game also marked the end of a stretch in which Carolina faced 11 ranked opponents over a 16-game span.

THEY HAD NO CHANTS: South Carolina scored on a 75-yard pass from **LaNorris Sellers** to **Jayden Sellers** on the first play from scrimmage and never looked back in a 51-7 rout of Coastal Carolina last Saturday in Columbia. The elder Sellers accounted for four touchdowns (2 rushing and 2 passing), completing 16-of-20 passes for 274 and rushing eight times for a season-high 82 yards. The younger Sellers had his best game with four catches for 127 yards, the fifth-highest single game receiving total for a Gamecock freshman. The Gamecocks rolled up a season-high 579 yards of offense while the defense limited the Chants to just 220 yards and kept them out of the end zone.

GOOD COMPANY: Jayden Sellers logged 127 receiving yards against Coastal, the fifth-highest single game total for a Carolina freshman. Only Sidney Rice (191), Alshon Jeffery (161 and 138) and Marcus Lattimore (133) have had more.

FURREY FLURRY: The Gamecocks have scored 82 points and have logged 967 yards of offense in the two games since Mike Furrey took over the play-calling duties, averaging 41.0 points and 483.5 yards per game. Prior to that, Carolina had averaged just 19.7 points and 294.1 yards through the first nine games of the season.

30 FOR FURREY: The Gamecocks have posted 30 and 37 points **in the first half** in Mike Furrey's two games as a play-caller. They had scored 30 or more points **in a game** just twice previously this season and had five games of 20 points or less.

SCORING IS NOT OFFENSIVE: Nick Barrett's 17-yard scoop-and-score at Texas A&M gave the Gamecocks a school-record seven non-offensive touchdowns this season. They have three punt returns for TDs (all by **Vicari Swain**), three fumble returns for touchdowns (**Jaron Willis**, **Jatius Geer** and **Barrett**) and one pick-six (**Gerald Kilgore**). The previous high was six non-offensive TDs, set on three occasions, most recently in 2012. With seven non-offensive touchdowns, the Gamecocks rank in a tie for second in the NCAA with Notre Dame behind only Louisiana Tech.

IT'S A SHANESTORM IN COLUMBIA: If Beamer Ball is attributed to his father, the legendary Frank Beamer, Shane Beamer is making a name for himself with defense and special teams:

- The Gamecocks have scored seven non-offensive touchdowns this season - three on punt returns, three fumble recoveries for scores and one pick-6.
- Since his arrival in Columbia in 2021, the Gamecocks have scored 21 non-offensive touchdowns - one kickoff return; six punt returns; five fumble returns; and nine interception returns.
- **Vicari Swain** is one of only two players in the country with three punt returns for touchdowns. He is third in the SEC and ranks sixth in the nation, averaging 16.8-yards per punt return.
- **Mason Love** is the nation's second-ranked freshman punter, averaging 45.1-yards per punt.
- Under Shane Beamer, Carolina has blocked 17 kicks/punts since 2021, tied with Old Dominion for second in the country behind Notre Dame (18).

A JET IS A JET: **Vicari Swain** is one of five finalists for the 2025 Jet Award, which honors the nation's top return specialist. Celebrating its 15th year, the Jet Award continues to recognize the electrifying talents of players who excel on punt and kickoff returns. Swain is third in the SEC and ranks sixth in the nation, averaging 16.8-yards per punt return and has returned three punts for scores.

YOUR LOSS IS OUR GAIN: South Carolina has an SEC-leading 21 turnovers gained on the season (tying for 11th in the country), the Gamecocks, under head coach Shane Beamer and defensive coordinator Clayton White, have recorded 109 turnovers gained since the 2021 season, tying for the third-highest total in the FBS during that time. IT'S NO GOOD!: After surrendering 17-straight successful field goal attempts, the Gamecocks field goal defense is on a roll. In the loss at Texas A&M the Aggie placekicker missed a 45-yarder, then doinked a chip shot from 24. The Coastal Carolina kicker missed from 56 in his only attempt last Saturday, extending the streak to three-straight misses. Carolina opponents had hit on 35 of their previous 37 tries including three kicks of 50+ yards - 56 by Virginia Tech, 51 by Vanderbilt and 55 by Oklahoma - before missing on their last three tries.

Offense

MIKE DROP: On Nov. 2, South Carolina head coach Shane Beamer announced that offensive coordinator/quarterbacks coach **Mike Shula** was being relieved of his duties. Coach Beamer did not name an offensive coordinator but rather said the offensive gameplan would be a group effort with passing game coordinator/wide receivers coach **Mike Furrey** serving as the primary play-caller. Furrey, a Northern Iowa grad and NFL standout who played on both sides of the ball, is in his second year with the Gamecocks. He bookended two tours of duty as the Limestone (S.C.) head coach around a stint as the Chicago Bears wide receivers coach.

NEW VOICE ON THE O-LINE: On Oct. 12, South Carolina head coach Shane Beamer announced that he had relieved offensive line coach **Lonnie Teasley** of his duties. Run game coordinator/tight ends coach **Shawn Elliott** assumed the offensive line coaching responsibilities. Elliott previously worked as the Gamecocks' offensive line coach under head coach Steve Spurrier from 2010-15, and under Will Muschamp in 2016. In addition, he served as the Gamecocks' interim head coach over the final six games of the 2015 season. Elliott also was the offensive line coach at Appalachian State from 2001-09. He returned to Columbia in 2024 after a seven-year stint at the head coach at Georgia State. **Ben Burress**, who had been working as a pass game specialist, took on a more prominent role with the tight ends.

QB1: LaNorris Sellers, a 6-3, 240-pound redshirt sophomore from Florence, S.C., is the unquestioned leader of the squad. Sellers, who was a pre-season Heisman Trophy candidate, was the 2024 National Freshman Offensive Player of the Year as selected by the FWAA. He was also a 2024 Freshman All-American and an SEC All-Freshman selection. He threw for 2,534 yards and 18 touchdowns while completing 65.6 percent of his passes and added 674 yards and seven TDs rushing in his first season as a starting QB. He was the SEC media's choice as the 2025 preseason first-team all-league selection after earning third-team honors a year ago behind Jaxson Dart and Quinn Ewers.

SELL HIGH: Heading into Week 5, **LaNorris Sellers** emerged from the pack as the top quarterback for the 2026 NFL Draft, according to an ESPN poll of 25 NFL scouts and executives. Draft expert Mel Kiper agreed saying, "For me, I would go to Sellers. By the way, Sellers will only be 20 years of age at the draft next year." But it's not just No. 16's age that intrigues the veteran draft analyst. "Sellers looks the part. I think he's going to play some outstanding football this year for South Carolina."

WHAT HAVE YOU DONE LATELY?: **LaNorris Sellers** has completed 155-of-251 passes (61.8 pct.) for 2,056 yards and 11 TDs with six interceptions

in 2025. Against No. 23 Missouri, he threw for 302 yards and two scores, the third 300-yard passing game of his career. He rushed for a season-high 82 yards on just eight carries against Coastal Carolina and tied his career high with 22 carries at LSU. He matched his career high with 32 pass attempts against Alabama. Sellers is 12-11 as a starting quarterback. He has engineered three fourth-quarter game-winning drives in his career ODU-'24; Missouri-'24; and Clemson-'24.

TOP SELLERS: Redshirt sophomore quarterback **LaNorris Sellers** had his best games of the season at Missouri, when completing 18-of-28 passes for a season-high 302 yards and two touchdowns with no turnovers, and against Coastal Carolina when he completed 16-of-20 passes for 274 yards and two touchdowns. He also carried eight times for a season-high 82 yards and two scores against the Chants. He has thrown for 300 or more yards three times in his career including twice against Mizzou. Sellers is tied for eighth in school history with Ryan Hilinski, Connor Shaw and Tommy Suggs with three career 300-yard passing games.

I'LL TELL YOU WHEN IT'S OVER: The Gamecocks feature two running backs who are in their seventh season of college football. Both **Oscar Adaway III** and **Rahsul Faison** finished up their high school ball in 2018. Adaway III turned 25 years old on Oct. 17, while Faison turned 25 in February.

WAITING WAS THE HARDEST PART: Transfer running back **Rahsul Faison** was in limbo while the NCAA determined whether he was eligible for another season of college football. He was given a waiver to practice with the team while awaiting the green light to participate in games, which finally came on Aug. 25, just six days before the season opener. Faison had his best game as a Gamecock against Vanderbilt, rushing for a game- and season-high 74 yards with a touchdown on 15 carries. For the season, he is Carolina's top rusher with 91 carries for 433 yards and three touchdowns. He has added 18 catches for 106 yards.

COMMITTEE WORK: The Gamecocks have used four running backs this season, with **Rahsul Faison**, **Matt Fuller**, **Oscar Adaway III** and **Jawarn Howell** all getting touches. The veterans, Faison and Adaway III had most of the carries early in the season, but lately Fuller and Howell have surfaced.

FREAKING OUT: The Gamecocks had a pair of players on Bruce Feldman's preseason "Freaks" List. Wide receiver **Nyck Harbor** checked in at No. 3 after back-to-back years at the top of the list, while **LaNorris Sellers** was ranked 33rd on the list.

ANY HARBOR IN A STORM: World-class sprinter **Nyck Harbor** gave up his love of running track this spring to focus on football. The junior wide receiver has all the measurables to be WR1. He got off to a fast start with three receptions for 99 yards in the season opener against Virginia Tech, including a then-career-long 64-yard TD reception. Always a big play threat, he hauled in a 54-yard TD catch against Alabama and a 47-yard score at Ole Miss before turning in his best performance at Texas A&M when he caught three passes for a career-high 102 yards, including a career-long 80-yard TD catch. He is second on the team with 24 catches for a team-high 503 yards, an SEC-leading 21.0-yard average, with a team-high five TDs, including TD catches in each of his last four games.

RECORD IN SIGHT: Nyck Harbor has a chance to set the school record for yards per reception. Here's where he ranks entering the season finale. He needs one catch to qualify for a spot on the all-time list:

DRE'S DAYS: Vandrevius Jacobs put together back-to-back 100-yard receiving games against Missouri and Kentucky to make a case for WR1. He had the best game of his career at Mizzou when he was targeted eight times and caught seven passes for 128 yards, setting career bests in both receptions and receiving yards. Included was a 49-yard TD. The seven catches were the most in a game for a Gamecock this season and the 128 receiving yards were the most for a Gamecock wide receiver since Xavier Legette logged 217 yards against Jacksonville State in 2023. He followed that up with a five-catch, 108-yard effort against Kentucky including a season-long 59-yard reception. They were the first back-to-back 100-yard receiving games for a Gamecock since Legette in 2023. Jacobs also had a four-catch, 64-yard effort including a 50-yard touchdown reception at Texas A&M. He leads the team with 25 catches for 407 yards (16.3 per catch - ninth in the SEC). He owns three TDs.

THE FRESHMAN 50: A trio of talented freshmen receivers have combined for 50 catches and 616 yards. **Brian Rowe Jr.** has seen the most action. He has 19 catches for 149 yards and a touchdown while making four starts. **Donovan Murph**, who was the last to arrive on campus, was the first to see game action. He has made four starts and has 14 catches for 197 yards. He had four receptions for 58 yards and his first TD last week against Coastal. **Jayden Sellers** has come on strong, catching 17 passes for 270 yards and a TD, all in the last five contests. He had a four-catch, 127-yard performance last week against Coastal. The trio comprise half of a class of talented scholarship freshman wideouts that Mike Furrey brought in this year, arguably the best wide receiver class on paper in school history. The others are **Malik Clark**, **Lex Cyrus** and **Jordon Gidron**.

BROTHERLY LOVE: Freshman wide receiver **Jayden "Pup" Sellers** did not see his first significant playing time of the season until the Oklahoma contest in game 7. He was targeted six times in that contest, four by his brother, **LaNorris Sellers**. He caught all six passes for 57 yards. It's the first time in Carolina history that a Gamecock has completed a pass to his brother. The younger Sellers had the best game by a freshman receiver this season and the fifth-best in school history when he caught four passes for 127 yards and touchdown last week against Coastal Carolina.

THROW IT TO THE TIGHT END: South Carolina rotates three tight ends. **Brady Hunt** has made six starts while **Jordan Dingle** has four. **Maurice Brown II** got the nod in the opener against Virginia Tech. The tight ends have combined for 35 receptions. Hunt leads the way with 20 catches for 162 yards after catching just two passes for 22 yards in 2024. He scored two rushing touchdowns against Coastal Carolina on the "tush push." Brown II is also a special teams standout.

IT ALL STARTS UPFRONT: The Gamecocks have started seven different offensive lines this season, featuring three different starters at center, three at left guard and three at right tackle. The Gamecocks have started nine offensive linemen overall. The only constant for all 11 games has been left tackle **Josiah Thompson**, who has manned that position since his arrival last year when he earned Freshman All-America accolades. He has started 23 of the past 24 games. True freshman **Shedrick Sarratt Jr.** has started eight games, six at left guard

and the last two at right tackle. He was one of 37 players on Shaun Alexander's Freshman of the Year watch list. Wake Forest transfer **Nick Sharpe** has started four of the last five at left guard. **Boaz Stanley**, **Nolan Hay** and **Rodney Newsom Jr.** have all made starts at center. Stanley leads the way with eight starts. **Trovon Baugh** has started 10 games at right guard. **Cason Henry** started all 13 games a season ago and the first four at right tackle this season but was injured on the first play of the Missouri contest. He underwent surgery and has not played since. **Tree Babalade**, who was the starting left tackle two years ago, replaced Henry as the starter for the next five games before giving way to Sarratt Jr. at Texas A&M.

Defense

MOLDING THE CLAY: Despite losing five players who went in the first four rounds of the 2025 NFL Draft, fifth-year defensive coordinator **Clayton White** has had the Carolina defense playing at a high level for much of the season. The Gamecocks are in the top half of the country in nearly every defensive statistical category and are 18th in the country in defensive efficiency, according to ESPN.

MISSING YOU: Defensive line coach **Travian Robertson** was injured in a serious car accident on Aug. 22. He continues to recover after a two-week stay in the hospital where he underwent numerous surgeries. **Jordan Dove** is filling in as the D-line coach in Robertson's absence. Robertson attended his first game of the season against Coastal.

THAT'S OUR BALL: The Gamecock defense has been opportunistic under **Clayton White**. The Gamecocks forced 88 turnovers over the last four seasons (2021-24), tops in the SEC. Carolina has forced an SEC-leading 21 turnovers in 2025, including 11 interceptions and 10 fumbles. The Gamecocks have four defensive scores this season and have 14 defensive TDs under Coach White's watch.

NO LONGER A COMPLETE UNKNOWN: Sophomore edge rusher **Dylan Stewart**, a 6-5, 245-pounder from Washington, D.C., earned FWAA Freshman All-America honors last season after recording 10.5 tackles for loss including 6.5 sacks. He was a finalist for the Shaun Alexander National Freshman of the Year award and was a member of the SEC All-Freshman team in 2024.

A LOT TO STEW ABOUT: Dylan Stewart hasn't missed a beat this season. Despite being double-teamed regularly, he owns 31 tackles, more than he had in 2024, leads the squad with 12.0 tackles for loss, and has 4.5 sacks. He also has recorded eight quarterback hurries and has forced three fumbles, tying for the SEC lead. He has notched 22.5 tackles for loss and 11.0 sacks in 23 career games. He collected a career-high seven tackles in the season opener against Virginia Tech.

NO ONE IS DOUBTING THOMAS: Bryan Thomas Jr. has shined playing on the opposite side of Dylan Stewart, similar to what Kyle Kennard did last year in winning the Nagurski. Thomas Jr. has 38 tackles including 10.0 tackles for loss. He leads the team and ranks tied for third in the SEC with 8.0 sacks and has added a team-high 13 QB hurries. He was the SEC's co-Defensive Lineman of the Week after his efforts against Kentucky when he was credited with a game- and career-high seven tackles, including five solos, and two sacks.



MAN IN THE MIDDLE: The Gamecocks lost their top four interior defensive linemen from 2024 to graduation. **Nick Barrett**, who redshirted last year, returned for his fifth season. He has started every game and leads the group with 38 tackles including 5.5 TFLs and his first two career sacks. He returned a fumble 17 yards for a score at Texas A&M. **Monkell Goodwine** (26 tackles, 3.5 TFL) has started 10 games. Transfers **Gabriel Brownlow-Dindy** (Texas A&M), **Devonte Miles** (Bowling Green) and **Troy Pikes** (Georgia Southern) all see regular time.

Scott. He recorded a game-high 10 tackles and an interception in the opener against Virginia Tech, earning SEC co-Defensive Player of the Week accolades. He is third on the team with 53 tackles including 3.5 TFLs.

WE'LL TAKE THEM: Linebackers **Shawn Murphy** (Alabama/Florida State) and **Justin Okoronkwo** (Alabama) transferred to South Carolina this season. They have split time with Okoronkwo collecting a team-high 61 tackles and Murphy with 44, including a dozen against Coastal Carolina. Okoronkwo, who had a season-high nine tackles against Texas A&M, has started seven games while Murphy has started four.

DQ PLAYS WITH A HIGH IQ: DQ Smith quarterbacked the defense from his safety position. Smith has started 44 games, tops on the squad. He owns five career INTs and two career TDs, one on an interception return and one after a blocked punt. He is second on the team with 60 tackles despite missing the Missouri contest with an injury.

KILGORE WAS HERE: Junior **Jalon Kilgore** is in his third season as a starter at the Nickel position. He was a preseason second-team AP All-America selection after tying for the SEC lead and for fourth in the country with five interceptions, tying Jaylan Foster's 2021 total for the most by a Gamecock in the last 20 years. Kilgore was hampered with a hamstring injury early in the season but logged 10 tackles at Missouri and is fourth on the squad with 47 tackles and has a team-high eight pass break-ups. He logged his first interception of the season and the seventh of his career at Ole Miss.

CORNERING THE MARKET: The Gamecocks rotate three veteran cornerbacks. **Judge Collier** started every game last season and was credited with eight PBUs but missed three games after being injured in the opener. **Brandon Cisse** has started every game and has been a solid addition with an interception and four breakups. He is consistently ranked the highest by PFF. **Vicari Swain** continues to see more action and was credited with a career-high 10 tackles at Missouri. Despite not being a starter, he leads the corners with 25 stops and with two interceptions, both at Texas A&M.

Special Teams

WHAT'S NEW?: Everything. Second-year special teams coordinator **Joe DeCamillis** has a completely different group to work with this season, as the Gamecocks have a new player in every special teams role.

MAKING A POINT: William Joyce won the place-kicking chores during fall camp. A fifth-year senior, he had never attempted a kick in a game prior to this season. He has connected on his last six field

goal attempts, including all three at Texas A&M which matched his career high, and is now 12-of-15 on the season with a long of 49 yards. He has also converted all 29 of his extra points attempts for a team-leading 65 points. Five of his last 10 field goal attempts have come from 47-yards out.

ALMOST AUTOMATIC: Dating back to 2021, the Gamecocks have successfully converted 66 of their last 79 field goal attempts (83.5 pct.). From 2021-24, Carolina posted the second-best field goal percentage in the SEC, trailing only Georgia.

LOVE IS THE ANSWER: Mason Love is trying to make Gamecock fans forget about All-American punter Kai Kroeger, now with the New Orleans Saints. Kroeger took every punt for Carolina from 2000-04. Love is the nation's second-ranked freshman punter with a 45.1-yard average on 48 punts. He has 13 punts that have traveled 50+ yards with a long of 61 yards at Texas A&M. Fifteen of his punts have pinned the opponents inside the 20 with just four touchbacks. He has a net punting average of 40.9 yards. He has been recognized as a Ray Guy "Ray's 8" Award winner twice this season, at LSU and vs. Alabama.

THERE GOES THAT MAN AGAIN: Vicari Swain has put himself in contention for SEC Special Teams Player of the Year consideration and is a finalist for the Jet Award. A midseason All-American, Swain returned a punt 80 yards for a score against Virginia Tech, then took back-to-back punts to the house from 65- and from 42-yards out against South Carolina State. He was recognized as the SEC co-Special Teams Player of the Week after both contests. For the season, Swain sixth fifth in the nation with a 16.8-yard average.

- Swain became the first Gamecock in history to return two punts (or kicks of any kind) for touchdowns in a game.

- Swain has three punt returns for touchdowns this season, tying the single-season school record, set by Dick Harris in 1971.

- Swain has tied Ace Sanders (2010-12) for second on the school's career mark for most punt returns for touchdowns with three, one behind Harris (1969-71).

RETURN TO SENDER: With 302 punt return yards on the season, **Vicari Swain** has the most punt returns yards by a Gamecock since Ace Sanders had a school-record 429 yards on punt returns in 2012.

FOR THE HISTORY BUFFS: 2025 marks the 132nd season of intercollegiate football at the University of South Carolina, dating back to 1892. It is the 119th-consecutive year in which South Carolina has competed on the gridiron. The University did not field a team in either 1893 or 1906. Carolina owns an all-time record of 647-624-44, a .509 winning percentage. Since the start of the 21st century, the Gamecocks have posted a 180-142 mark, a .559 winning percentage. Under Coach Beamer, the Gamecocks are 32-29, a .525 winning clip.



OH TO BE YOUNG AGAIN: The Gamecocks feature a pair of wide receivers who could still be playing high school ball but elected to graduate a year early to enroll at Carolina. **Donovan Murph** turned 18 years old on Oct. 1, while **Jordon Gidron** turned 18 on Oct. 30. Both are local products, with Murph graduating from Irmo High School and Gidron from Columbia's Ridge View High. All told, the

Gamecocks had 19 freshmen who graduated from high school early and enrolled in January.

FAMILY TIES: The Gamecocks have three sets of brothers on the roster. **Jalon Kilgore** is in his third year in the program while his older brother, **Gerald Kilgore** is in his second after two seasons at Tennessee Tech. Both play in the secondary. **LaNorris Sellers** has a new target to throw to in younger brother **Jayden**, a true freshman. Junior defensive back **Brandon Cisse** transferred in the spring from NC State. He was joined in the summer by his younger brother, **Cedric Cisse**, a walk-on DB. Edge rusher **Demon Clowney** is the cousin of Game-

cock Great Jadeveon Clowney and Edge rusher **Bryan Thomas Jr.** is the son of Bryan Thomas who spent 11 years with the New York Jets.

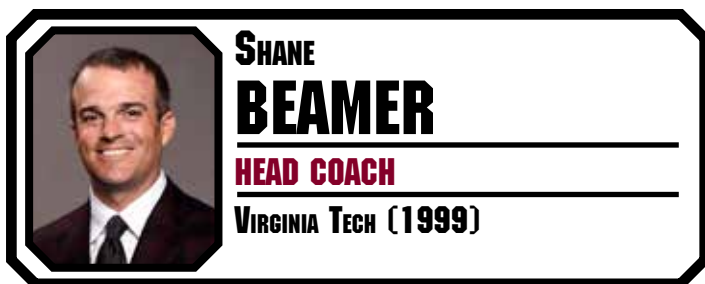

VIRGINIA TECH (1999)

Shane Beamer begins his fifth season in Columbia leading the South Carolina Football program in 2025, a program that is on the upswing following a very successful 2024 campaign.

Beamer, who owns a 33-29 record, won more games through his first four seasons at Carolina (29) than any other coach, one more than Steve Spurrier, the school's all-time winningest coach. During his tenure he has posted victories over three coaches who have won national championships – Jimbo Fisher, Dabo Swinney and Mack Brown, and has led the Gamecocks to three bowl appearances in four years.

Beamer's 2024 squad was his most successful to date. The Gamecocks finished the season with a 9-4 record including a 5-3 mark in the SEC, posting nine wins in a season for just the eighth time in school history. The Gamecocks recorded a school-record four wins against ranked opponents, including three in consecutive weeks as part of a regular season-ending six-game winning streak. Carolina finished the season ranked 19th in both the final Associated Press and Coaches polls, its highest ranking since 2013 and its second top-25 ranking in the past three seasons.

Beamer was the Bobby Dodd National Coach of the Week for the third time in his career following the Gamecocks' upset win over Texas A&M and earned SEC Coach of the Year accolades from the AP, USA TODAY, Bear Bryant and College Football Nation. He was a finalist for the Eddie Robinson, the Bobby Dodd, and the Bear Bryant National Coach of the Year honors and was a semifinalist for the George Munger Coach of the Year.

Individually, edge rusher Kyle Kennard was the school's first Bronko Nagurski Award winner as the nation's top defensive player and was the SEC's Defensive Player of the Year. Kennard, along with safety Nick Emmanwori, earned first-team All-America honors, while punter Kai Kroeger was a second-team selection. Quarterback LaNorris Sellers was selected as the SEC's Freshman of the Year. Sellers, offensive tackle Josiah Thompson and Edge rusher Dylan Stewart earned Freshman All-America honors, giving the Gamecocks six All-Americans as selected by the Football Writers Association of America (FWAA), the most of any FBS school in 2024. In addition, Kennard and Raheim Sanders were named first-team Academic All-America.

Named the Gamecocks' 36th head football coach on Dec. 6, 2020, Beamer had a successful first season in Columbia, improving the Gamecocks by 3.5 games, from a 2-8 mark in 2020 to a 7-6 campaign in 2021, including a convincing win over North Carolina in the Duke's Mayo Bowl. He tied the school record for wins by a first-year head coach, doubled the preseason's expected win total and surpassed the win total of the two previous seasons combined, earning him a share of the Steve Spurrier First-Year Coach of the Year Award,

presented by the Football Writers Association of America (FWAA). Safety Jaylan Foster earned All-America honors and three players were selected in the NFL Draft following his inaugural season.

In 2022, the team again exceeded expectations by recording eight wins, including three wins over ranked opponents. The Gamecocks won eight games for just the 15th time in 129 seasons and for the first time since 2017. The Gamecocks were ranked 23rd in the country in the final AP and USA Today Coaches' polls. It marked the first time since 2013 that the Gamecocks finished the season ranked in the top-25 and the 10th time Carolina has finished the season ranked in the final AP poll. The Gamecocks defeated No. 5 Tennessee and No. 7 Clemson in the final two games of the regular season, the first time Carolina has posted back-to-back wins over top-10 teams and just the seventh time in history that a school has defeated AP top-10 opponents in consecutive weeks as an unranked team, the first since 2003. Coach Beamer was a two-time Bobby Dodd National Coach of the Week recipient after wins over Kentucky and Tennessee. Punter Kai Kroeger earned All-America honors, leading a special teams unit ranked No. 1 in the country. Five players were selected in the NFL Draft off that squad, the most since 2013.

Challenged by one of the toughest schedules in the FBS and in a season mired by numerous injuries, decimating the offensive line most notably, the 2023 Gamecocks finished the campaign with a 5-7 mark. The squad was led by quarterback Spencer Rattler and wide receiver Xavier Legette. Rattler set the school's single-season record for completions (275) and completion percentage (68.9), while his 3,186 passing yards was the third-highest total in school history. Legette, a semifinalist for the Biletnikoff Award, led the team with 17 receptions for 1,255 yards and seven receiving touchdowns. His 1,255 receiving yards was the second-highest single-season mark in school history.

Prior to his first head coaching stint, Beamer had been an assistant coach at seven FBS schools for 21 seasons. During his career as an assistant, he coached in 17 bowl games, including a College Football Playoff National Championship Game, posted 18 non-losing seasons, six of those with double-digit victories, and his teams won 63 percent of its games. He coached all three phases of the game – offense, defense and special teams.

Beamer is not new to Carolina. The Charleston, S.C. native served as an assistant coach with the Gamecocks for four seasons from 2007-10 under Steve Spurrier. In 2007, he served as the outside linebackers coach and co-special teams coordinator. He mentored the cornerbacks in 2008, then coached the Spurs and strong safeties and was the special teams coordinator and recruiting coordinator in 2009 and 2010, setting the foundation for the most successful run in school history.

In 2009, Beamer was nominated for the Frank Broyles Award. His special teams' units recorded five blocked kicks, tying for the SEC lead and for eighth in the nation. He also helped coach a defensive unit that ranked 15th in the country in total defense, and eighth in the nation in passing defense.





As the Gamecocks' recruiting coordinator, his 2009 class was ranked 12th-best in the country, and the 2010 and 2011 classes were ranked in the Top 25.

During his tenure as recruiting coordinator, nine Gamecocks were selected in the NFL Draft, including first round selection Stephen Gilmore (Buffalo) and second round picks Alshon Jeffery (Chicago) and D.J. Swearinger (Houston).

The Gamecocks all-time winningest quarterback, Connor Shaw, and rushing touchdown leader, Marcus Lattimore, were also in the 2010 class.

Beamer has helped build several programs during his career. He was on three coaching staffs where the head coach was in his first or second season at the school. He joined Sylvester Croom's staff at Mississippi State in his first season, Kirby Smart's program at Georgia in his first season, and Lincoln Riley's unit at Oklahoma in his second season.

Beamer served as the assistant head coach for offense and mentored the tight ends and H-backs at Oklahoma from 2018-20. In 2020, Oklahoma ranked sixth in the country in scoring, 11th in total offense and 14th in passing offense. In 2019, the Sooners led the nation in yards per play, ranked third in total offense and fourth in passing efficiency rating. Oklahoma led the nation in total offense, scoring offense and yards per play (FBS-record 8.6), and ranked second in passing efficiency rating in 2018.

Beamer spent two seasons (2016-17) at Georgia as tight ends coach and special teams coordinator under Kirby Smart, helping the Bulldogs to a 21-7 combined record. In 2017, UGA won the SEC Championship before falling in the CFP title game to Alabama in overtime. His special teams ranked eighth nationally in net punting and 20th in kickoff returns while blocking four kicks.

The son of Hall of Fame coach Frank Beamer, he worked with his father as the associate head coach and running backs coach at Virginia Tech from 2011-15. In his first year, he coached David Wilson, who broke the Tech single-season rushing record, was named All-America and ACC Player of the Year, and went on to become a first-round NFL draft selection. Shane served as the Hokies' acting head coach in the 2014 Military Bowl win while his father watched from the press box following throat surgery.

Beamer's first full-time coaching position came at Mississippi State in 2004 as cornerbacks coach and recruiting coordinator. In his first two seasons at State, he guided three defensive backs to SEC All-Freshman Team accolades. He maintained the recruiting coordinator title but made the move to running backs coach in the spring of 2006 where he tutored running back Anthony Dixon to SEC All-Freshman honors.

Beamer spent three seasons (2001-03) as a graduate assistant at Tennessee, helping with the cornerbacks and assisting in all special teams areas. He also oversaw game opponent scouting while earning a master's degree in sport management in Dec. 2003.

Before joining the staff at UT, he worked one season (2000) as a G.A. at Georgia Tech, helping with the Yellow Jacket quarterbacks and wide receivers.

A December 1999 graduate of Virginia Tech, Beamer was a member of five bowl teams (1995-99 seasons) and three Big East Conference championship squads on the Hokie football team as a long snapper and wide receiver. He was a long snapper on the 1999 Virginia Tech team that played for the BCS National Championship.

Beamer and his wife, Emily, are the parents of three children – two daughters, Sutton and Olivia, both born in Columbia, and a son, Hunter, born in Blacksburg, Va.

ATLANTA, GA. (AP) — Vicari Swain returned a punt 80 yards for a touchdown to break open a close game, LaNorris Sellers threw a 64-yard touchdown pass to Nyck Harbor, and No. 13 South Carolina beat Virginia Tech 24-11 on Sunday in the opener for both teams.

Gamecocks coach Shane Beamer used his brand of "Beamerball" to pull away from the school where his dad, Frank Beamer, originated the style of play that emphasizes turnovers and big plays on special teams. The elder Beamer was in attendance at Mercedes-Benz Stadium, wearing South Carolina black.

"Thought you'd like a special teams touchdown," Shane Beamer told his dad as they shared a postgame hug.

South Carolina intercepted two passes by Virginia Tech's Kyrion Drones. Fred Johnson made a pick in the red zone to halt a first-quarter drive, and Peyton Williams' interception in the fourth quarter helped seal the win.

The Gamecocks led 10-8 early in the fourth when Swain fielded a punt by Nick Veltsistas, turned upfield and made several would-be tacklers miss on the way to the end zone. After a Virginia Tech field goal, Sellers found Harbor wide open on a deep post route to restore South Carolina's two-score advantage.

Swain muffed a punt earlier in the game and narrowly avoided disaster by recovering the ball. Beamer comforted the sophomore on the sideline after that play.

"Coach Beamer was like, 'This is going to happen,'" Swain said. "'It's your first time being out there, just make sure on the next one, just take it to the house.' So I took it to the house, and my thought process was like, I messed up the first time, can't mess up again. This is my only shot."

Beamer's faith in Swain, a defensive back and part-time return man, was rewarded.

"So proud of Vicari Swain," Beamer said. "He's a weapon, and it was really neat for him to do that and how fitting that is playing Virginia Tech with their history, my dad's history at special teams."

Sellers scored South Carolina's first touchdown on a 15-yard rush and was 12 of 19 passing for 209 yards and the TD to Harbor, who had three catches for 99 yards. Harbor had another potential touchdown taken away by a replay review.

Virginia Tech's offense was held without a touchdown. John Love kicked three field goals, including a 56-yarder, and the Hokies' defense contributed a safety in the first quarter when Kelvin Gilliam Jr. and Kody Huisman took down Sellers in the end zone.

Drones went 15 of 35 for 221 yards and two interceptions.

COLUMBIA, S.C. (AP) — Vicari Swain returned two punts for touchdowns to rescue a struggling offense for No. 10 South Carolina as the Gamecocks beat South Carolina State 38-10 early Sunday.

The kickoff was delayed more than two hours because of lightning in the area.

South Carolina (2-0) scored more from its special teams and defense than its offense as Jaron Willis also returned a fumble for a score and LaNorris Sellers couldn't get the offense going for a second week.

South Carolina looked like it was up past its bedtime, trailing 3-0 before Swain eluded a tackler right on top of him and then ran 64 yards for a touchdown. His second TD was a 42-yard return after he picked up a partially blocked punt just before it stopped rolling.

With his 80-yard punt return TD in last week's opener against Virginia Tech, Swain is now tied for the school's single-season record. The sophomore defensive back is the first FBS player with two punt returns scores in a game since Penn State's Daequan Hardy did it against UMass in October 2023.

Sellers threw six incompletions in his first eight attempts and finished the game with 128 yards passing and 23 yards rushing.

The Takeaway

South Carolina State: The Bulldogs will take \$500,000 back to Orangeburg, which is a lot of help for an athletic program that takes in about \$13 million a year.

South Carolina: The Gamecocks have to figure out how to get their offense going, gaining just 253 yards against the Bulldogs. And South Carolina may not last long in the top 10 with a tepid performance against a FCS school compared to No. 11 Illinois 45-19 drubbing of Duke.

COLUMBIA, S.C. (AP) — Diego Pavia completed 18 of 25 passes for 177 yards and two touchdowns, Jamezell Lassiter ran for a 44-yard score and Vanderbilt defeated No. 11 South Carolina 31-7 at Williams-Brice Stadium Saturday night (Sept. 13).

The Commodores hadn't beat South Carolina since 2008, but forced four turnovers for their first 3-0 start since 2017.

South Carolina quarterback and Heisman Trophy candidate LaNorris Sellers was knocked out of the game in the second quarter after taking a helmet-to-helmet hit from Vanderbilt linebacker Langston Patterson, who was ejected for targeting.

Sellers did not return, and finished 6 of 7 passing for 94 yards with one interception in the red zone with the score tied at 7. He was replaced by Luke Doty.

The Commodores held nearly a 12-minute edge in time of possession.

Pavia led Vanderbilt on a nine-play, 73-yard drive to open the game, capped with an 18-yard touchdown pass to Sedrick Alexander. Pavia later tossed a 5-yard TD pass to Junior Sherrill in the second quarter giving the Commodores a 14-7 lead at the break.

Lassiter's scamper around right end stretched Vanderbilt's lead to 21-7 early in the third quarter and the Commodores began to sense an upset brewing. Brock Taylor's 51-yard field goal with 9:27 left made it a three-possession game.

Alexander added his second TD on a 2-yard run in the fourth quarter.

Rahsul Faison ran for 74 yards and a touchdown for South Carolina.

COLUMBIA, MO. (AP) — Ahmad Hardy had 138 yards rushing and a touchdown, Beau Pribula led No. 23 Missouri downfield for a go-ahead score in the fourth quarter and the Tigers beat South Carolina 29-20 on Saturday night.

Pribula threw for 171 yards with a touchdown pass, and Jamal Roberts had a touchdown of his own with 9:32 left to give the Tigers the lead, ultimately helping them to their 14th consecutive home win.

LaNorris Sellers had 302 yards passing and two touchdowns for the Gamecocks South Carolina twice went three-and-out down the stretch, giving the Missouri ground game the chance to close out the win.

The Tigers finished with 285 yards rushing. South Carolina had minus-9 on the ground.

The Tigers struck first with a 99-yard drive — their third full-field march of the season — before Sellers answered with a 49-yard touchdown throw to Vandrevius Jacobs to give the Gamecocks a 7-6 lead.

Sellers hit Brian Rowe Jr. with his second touchdown throw later in the half, and South Carolina led 14-12 at the break.

Hardy carried the Tigers in the second half. The highlight may have been his TD run, when it looked as if he was stood up at the line of scrimmage, spun off the pile and scored to give Missouri an 18-16 lead.

But it always felt as if the game was destined to be decided in the fourth quarter, just like last November, when Sellers capped a 353-yard, five-touchdown performance by rallying the Gamecocks for a 34-30 win in the Palmetto State.

This time, South Carolina had regained the lead when Pribula led the Tigers downfield in the fourth quarter. And after Hardy had checked out for a breather, Roberts had a 16-yard sprint to the pylon for a touchdown; Pribula added the 2-point conversion to give Missouri a 26-20 lead with 9:36 to go.

Then it was the Tigers defense that stepped up, forcing South Carolina into a pair of three-and-outs before Robert Meyer kicked a clinching 40-yard field goal with 1:34 left on the clock.

BATON ROUGE, LA. (AP) — Garrett Nussmeier passed for 254 yards and two touchdowns, LSU's defense contained South Carolina's LaNorris Sellers, and the 11th-ranked Tigers overcame three turnovers to defeat the Gamecocks 20-10 on Saturday night.

"We found a way to win, even though we had some mistakes out there that could at some time be catastrophic," LSU coach Brian Kelly said. "The bottom line is: against an SEC opponent, we held them to 10 points and really, except for our own mistakes, we controlled the flow of the game."

The victory arguably should have been easier for LSU (5-1, 2-1 SEC), which twice lost the ball right at the South Carolina goal line on a fumble and an interception. The first of Nussmeier's two interceptions also occurred on the Gamecocks' side of the field.

LSU tight end Trey'Dez Green, a 6-foot-7 former college basketball player, caught eight passes for 119 yards and a touchdown.

"Clearly he is a mismatch," Kelly said. "He is a unique talent and we need to continue to feature him in our offense."

Green, who received a game ball, said he has largely recovered from a knee injury that occurred during LSU's home opener on Sept. 6.

"The ball came my way tonight a lot," he said. "I wasn't going to waste that opportunity."

Kyle Parker had five catches for 75 yards, highlighted by his 43-yard score on which he snagged a short slant pass in stride and ran away from everyone.

LSU also rushed for a season-high 166 yards, led by Caden Durham's 70 yards on 15 carries.

Damian Ramos' second field goal of the game all but sealed it with 1:46 left, capping a drive that started after LSU cornerback Mansoor Delane had broken up Sellers' fourth-down pass with 5:43 left.

Sellers passed for 124 yards, took five sacks and was intercepted once by LSU safety Tamaricus Cooley.

"Sellers is a difficult guy to corral," Kelly said. "I'm proud of the way our guys attacked him. ... He will leave here feeling the game against LSU."

South Carolina (3-3, 1-3) drove into Tigers territory six times, but four of those possessions produced no points. One fruitless drive ended with a missed field goal, two ended with punts and the last with a turnover on downs.

"I'm sick to my stomach that we didn't win that football game," South Carolina coach Shane Beamer said, noting the Gamecocks finished with 193 yards rushing. "When we ran the ball, when we won the turnover battle, win time of possession — when you do all that, you should win the game."

LSU was on the brink of taking a 10-0 lead early in the second quarter as running back Ju'Juan Johnson fought through tacklers to try to reach the goal line. But defensive tackle Monkell Goodwine dislodged the ball and the Gamecocks recovered in the end zone.

Three plays later Matt Fuller, who entered the game with 71 yards rushing this season, broke loose for a 72-yard touchdown run to give the Gamecocks a 7-3 lead.

The Tigers responded quickly, driving 72 yards in six plays for Green's leaping 6-yard touchdown catch on a fade pass.

COLUMBIA, S.C. (AP) — It was a long, disappointing week for Oklahoma quarterback John Mateer, the Washington State transfer who shouldered much of the blame for the Sooners' 23-6 defeat at Texas last week.

Mateer and the 14th-ranked Sooners' defense made sure to put that loss behind them in a 26-7 win over South Carolina on Saturday.

Mateer threw for 150 yards and a touchdown while the defense sacked Gamecocks quarterback LaNorris Sellers six times, had a interception and a safety to get back to their winning ways.

"I expected better than that," Mateer said of his three interception showing against the Longhorns. "Today, whether I was feeling good or not, I was going to play. I got myself to a good point, the team was in a good spot and, yeah, played well."

Oklahoma (6-1, 2-1 Southeastern Conference) recovered with a steady, mistake-free offense and a best-in-the-nation defense to beat the Gamecocks (3-4, 1-4).

Mateer led touchdown drives of 75 and 92 yards and the Sooners held on fourth-and-goal from their own 5 for a 14-0 lead.

Tory Blaylock had an 18-yard touchdown run to open the scoring and Xavier Robinson bullied his way into the end zone from 10 yards out to take a two-touchdown lead.

Oklahoma coach Brent Venables appreciated his team's courage and toughness in dismissing outside noise and focusing on South Carolina.

"Whenever anybody questioned our team from a week ago, our guys had the ability to block it out," Venables said.

Oklahoma came in leading the nation in yards allowed at 193 and kept the pressure up against the Gamecocks. Defensive end Taylor Wein sniffed out a fake punt pass by South Carolina's Mason Love and got the interception. Five plays later, Mateer found Isaiah Sategna III for a 20-yard TD and a 24-7 lead.

Then again, Oklahoma coach Brent Venables knows how to lock down South Carolina at home. He went 4-1 at Williams-Brice Stadium as Clemson's defensive coordinator, and his group held the Gamecocks to an average of 285 yards and four points in Venables' last three times in the building.

Sellers, a projected NFL first-round draft pick, finished with 124 yards passing. As a parting shot, Oklahoma defensive tackle Markus Strong tackled tailback Matt Fuller in the end zone for a safety with about four minutes left.

Blaylock ran for 101 yards and Oklahoma kicker Tate Sandell matched his career long with a 55-yard field goal.

COLUMBIA, S.C. (AP) — Germie Bernard scored two touchdowns in the final 2 1/2 minutes, and No. 4 Alabama rallied to beat South Carolina 29-22 at Williams-Brice Stadium for its seventh straight win.

Ty Simpson threw for 253 yards and two touchdowns and De-Shawn Jones returned an interception 18 yards for a score for the Crimson Tide (7-1, 5-0 Southeastern Conference).

"We knew that this was going to be a dogfight coming in, right?" Simpson said. "... But there was not one ounce of nonbelief, right? We knew what we had to do and we made sure that we were going to be unbreakable with everything that we had — and that's what we did."

LaNorris Sellers threw for 222 yards and a touchdown and ran for 67 yards and another score for South Carolina (3-5, 1-5), but had a costly fumble late which led to the winning score.

The Tide trailed 22-14 late in the fourth quarter, but drove 79 yards on 14 plays with Simpson finding Bernard for a 4-yard touchdown pass in the left corner of the end zone with 2:16 to play. Simpson then connected with Josh Cuevas, who caught a TD pass earlier in the game, for the 2-point conversion to tie the game.

On the ensuing drive, linebacker Deontae Lawson stripped Sellers, giving Simpson and the offense the ball at the South Carolina 38.

"I had two hands on it because I knew they were trying to strip it," Sellers said. "I was thinking the ref was going to blow the whistle and that is when I started to fall down. When I was going to catch myself that's when I took my other hand off it and I guess that is when he got under the ball."

On a third-and-10 play, Bernard took a direct snap and raced around right end and stayed inbounds for a 25-yard touchdown with 34 seconds left.

South Carolina tried to let Bernard score after he'd picked up the first down.

Bernard could have slid down near the goal line and let the clock run down to set up the go-ahead field goal.

Instead, he happily took the six points.

"Coach gave me the green light to go ahead and score, so that's what I did," Bernard said.

Alabama took a 7-3 lead in the second quarter after Sellers' pass in the flat bounced off the hands of running back Raheem Faison and into the arms of Jones, who raced down the left sideline for a score.

Mistakes haunted the Gamecocks in the first half.

Along with the mishandled catch by Faison, a holding penalty negated a 15-yard TD run by Sellers. Another holding call ended a potential touchdown drive and the Gamecocks also missed a field goal.

Despite the errors, South Carolina only trailed 14-6 at halftime.

The Gamecocks scored the next 16 points.

Nyck Harbor got behind the defense and hauled in a 54-yard touchdown strike, William Joyce connected on a 47-yard field goal and Sellers scored on a 10-yard run after the Gamecocks recovered a punt deep in Alabama territory after it hit a Tide player in the back of the leg.

Down by 8 on the road, Alabama never flinched.

For South Carolina, which started the season ranked No. 13, it was yet another agonizing defeat.

"It's hard. As the coach, I feel like I'm letting a lot of people down," South Carolina coach Shane Beamer said. "I know today let a lot of people down. I wish I had something to say to make it better."

OXFORD, MISS. (AP) — Mississippi sacked LaNorris Sellers six times and the No. 7 Rebels held off upset-minded South Carolina 30-14 on Saturday night.

Ole Miss, third in the SEC and ninth nationally in total offense, looked rather pedestrian as Trinidad Chambliss completed just 12 of 21 passes with a touchdown and an interception.

He threw an 8-yard TD pass to Dae'Quan Wright and scored on a 15-yard run, but the Rebels (8-1, 5-1 SEC) were forced to settle for short field goals on other possessions when they could've taken control.

Suntarine Perkins and Da'Shawn Womack sacked Sellers twice in three plays after the Gamecocks (3-6, 1-6), trailing by nine, reached the Ole Miss 33 with a little more than seven minutes left.

On the first play after the turnover on downs, Kewan Lacy scored on a 54-yard run to put the game out of reach for Ole Miss.

"To go to 8-1, the only loss at Georgia, and we were ahead by two scores and should have finished," Ole Miss coach Lane Kiffin said. "I didn't feel great about our passing performance, but I've got to remind myself that we're in the SEC and 16-point wins are good. They've got some really elite (SEC) players, especially on defense."

The Rebels also intercepted Sellers twice in the last 5:27. Perkins had 1½ sacks and an interception with 5:21 remaining.

While Chambliss was erratic, the long touchdown run was an exclamation point for Lacy, who finished with 167 yards including 101 yards in the first half.

"We talked all week about being the most poised, the most disciplined team, and we were the most undisciplined to say the least," South Carolina coach Shane Beamer said. "Multiple offsides, taunting, two offensive pass interference penalties."

Sellers was playing at less than full health.

"He was obviously beat up coming into the game, but he competed and battled," Beamer said.

The Gamecocks cut Ole Miss' lead to three on their first possession of the second half.

The drive was kept alive by a pass interference call against Ole Miss, but ended with Sellers throwing a 47-yard pass to Nyck Harbor to make it 17-14.

"I thought our D-line showed up today," Kiffin said. "We challenged them to be consistent and they sure did that. We've got to keep getting better. We've got some really good teams coming up."

COLLEGE STATION, TEXAS (AP) — Marcel Reed threw for a career-high 439 yards and three touchdowns and No. 3 Texas A&M rallied from a 27-point halftime deficit to remain undefeated with a 31-30 victory over South Carolina on Saturday.

The comeback was the biggest in school history, eclipsing a 21-point rally by a Johnny Manziel-led team in a 52-48 win in the 2013 Chick-Fil-A Bowl over Duke.

Reed bounced back from an awful first half where he was intercepted twice and had a fumble returned for a score to put the Aggies in a 30-3 hole with a dazzling second half to keep Texas A&M (10-0, 7-0, No. 3 CFP) on track for its first trip to the College Football Playoff. They're 10-0 for the first time since 1992.

Last season, Texas A&M had a seven-game winning streak entering the game against South Carolina before a 44-20 defeat sent the team into a downward spiral that knocked them out of contention to reach the playoff.

The Aggies took the lead for the first time on a 4-yard run by EJ Smith with about 11 minutes left.

Texas A&M had a first down at the 1 after that, but Jamarion Morrow fumbled on a trick play and the Gamecocks recovered with about three minutes to go.

Dalton Brooks and Cashius Howell sacked LaNorris Sellers on consecutive plays to bring up fourth-and-16 with about 90 seconds to go. Sellers scrambled on fourth down and was stopped short of the first down marker to seal the victory.

Sellers threw for 246 yards with two touchdowns and an interception for South Carolina (3-7, 1-7), which lost a fifth straight game.

Izaiah Williams caught a 27-yard TD pass from Reed to make it 30-10 on A&M's first drive of the second half. Reed had a 16-yard run on fourth-and-12 to keep the drive alive.

Reed found Ashton Bethel-Roman for a 39-yard TD to get the Aggies within 30-17 with about four minutes left in the third.

Reed's 14-yard pass to Nate Boerkircher cut the lead to a touchdown late in the third quarter. That score was set up by a short pass that Bethel-Roman turned into a 76-yard reception the play before.

K.C. Concepcion had seven receptions for 158 yards and Bethel-Roman added 139 yards receiving for the Aggies.

The Gamecocks took a 10-3 lead when Sellers connected with Vandrevius Jacobs on a 50-yard touchdown pass.

They pushed the lead to 17-3 when 322-pound defensive tackle Nick Barrett scooped up a fumble by Reed and rumbled 17-yards for a score late in the first quarter.

South Carolina was up by 17 late in the second quarter when Brooks intercepted a pass from Sellers and returned it 39 yards to give the Aggies a first down at the 6. Concepcion couldn't reel in two straight passes in the end zone before Randy Bond missed his second field goal of the half to leave Texas A&M empty handed.

The Aggies defense got a stop, but Reed was intercepted in the end zone with about a minute left in the first half to give the Gamecocks the ball again. They took advantage of that mistake when Nyck Harbor had an 80-yard catch and run for a score on the first play of the drive to extend the lead to 27-3.

Reed was picked off again two plays later and South Carolina tacked on a field goal to make it 30-3 at halftime.

COLUMBIA, S.C. (AP) — LaNorris Sellers felt as despondent as everyone else on South Carolina after enduring the crushing loss to No. 3 Texas A&M last week.

He made sure the Gamecocks wouldn't let that collapse damage their resolve or the rest of the season.

Sellers ran for two touchdowns and threw for two more, including a 75-yard strike to his younger brother Jayden Sellers on the game's first snap, in South Carolina's 51-7 rout of Coastal Carolina on Saturday night.

The Gamecocks (4-7) were coming in off a disheartening 31-30 loss to the Aggies at No. 3 where they led 30-3 at halftime. But the players didn't let that collapse beat them once more, overwhelming the Chanticleers (6-5) to lead 20-0 less than eight minutes in.

"It means a lot because of last week, some teams would've come out there and given up," Sellers said. "We've still got something to play for."

Sellers, whose escapability, strong arm and running skill had him atop many preseason Heisman Trophy lists, showed off all of it in ending South Carolina's five-game losing streak.

He finished 16 of 20 passing for 274 yards and led the Gamecocks with 82 yards rushing before heading to the bench after the third quarter.

Gamecocks coach Shane Beamer recalled the stark quiet of the plane ride home from Texas. He wondered, as any coach would, if his players would have the gumption to put that defeat aside. After a spirited workout session Sunday night, Beamer left the field, thinking, "Alright. we're going to be OK," he said.

The Sellers' brothers backed that up immediately as the quarterback hooked up with his speedy, younger brother on the first snap for a short pass then broke for a 75-yard TD.

Jayden Sellers' thought as he headed toward the endzone: "I better not fall."

The elder Sellers pushed through for a 2-yard score on the team's second drive.

After Coastal Carolina passer Tad Hudson fumbled while getting hit by lineman Bryan Thomas Jr. deep in Chants' territory, tight end Brady Hunt scored three plays later for a 20-0 lead.

Coastal, of the Sun Belt Conference, could not match up with an opponent that entered with a five-game losing streak and 1-7 record in the Southeastern Conference.

South Carolina had 419 of its 579 yards by halftime. Its defense held Coastal Carolina to 46 yards rushing, far below its 194 average coming in.

The Chanticleers ended the shutout with a blocked punt by receiver Jameson Tucker, who picked it up and went 17 yards for the score with less than 10 minutes left to play.

Jayden Sellers had four catches for 127 yards while Hunt finished with a pair of rushing touchdowns.
