### OPENING DRAW

#### FRESHMAN FRENZY

- Clemson's 2025 recruiting class was ranked No. 1 nationally by *Inside Lacrosse*.
- Additions included: Tessa DeLuca, Aubrie Eisfeld, Marleigh O'Day, Kyla Orlando, Ella Pauley, Emma Penczek, Kiera Schwartz, Teagan Scott, Alexa Spallina and Ella Wilner.
- Spallina was ranked the No. 1 freshman in the country; Penczek was ranked No. 2.
- Eisfeld landed inside the top 15, with DeLuca and O'Day rounding out the top 50.
- Pauley (No. 51) and Scott (No. 100) were named to the Nike/IWLWOMEN Power 100 Freshman Rankings Watchlist.

#### RELOADING FOR 2026

- Clemson returns 24 players from the 2025 roster, including three All-ACC selections and one *USA Lacrosse* All-American.
- Natalie Shurtleff: All-ACC First Team, Tewaaraton Watch List, USA Lacrosse Third Team All-America, IWLCA Second Team All-America.
- Kayla MacLeod: Tewaaraton Watch List, All-ACC Second Team.
- Kira Balis: All-ACC Third Team.
- MacLeod holds Clemson records for goals, woman-up goals and free-position goals; her 2025 season ended early due to an ACL injury.
- Paris Masarachia has started all 60 games in program history — the Clemson record — and was part of the inaugural 2023 roster.

#### LAST TIME OUT

- Clemson suffered its first loss of the season, falling 10-9 in a nailbiter against No. 4/5 Stanford.
- Brooke Goldstein led the offense with two goals.
- Teagan Scott was a monster on defense, causing a school single-game record 10 turnovers. Scott also picked up four ground balls.
- Spallina had a five-point performance, scoring one goal and tacking on four assists.
- Penczek netted two goals.
- Natalie Shurtleff scored her 60th career goal while also recording five draw controls, surpassing 80 in her career (83).

#### LOOKING IN ON QUEENS

- The Tigers are 2-0 all-time against Queens, outscoring the Royals 46-9.
- Clemson didn't score less than 21 points in either game, scoring 21 in the first matchup (2024) and 25 in last year's competition.
- Both of those matches were in Clemson with this game marking the first that Clemson is facing Queens in Charlotte, N.C.
- Queens comes into the game 0-2 after losing at East Carolina, 15-4 and at home against Elon, 12-10.
- In 2025, Queens went 6-11, 3-3 ASUN with a 4-5 record at home. The Royals ended the season with an 18-7 win over Lindenwood.
- The Tigers come in seeking the program's 40th overall win.







Since being hired on August 2, 2021, Head Coach Allison Kwolek has established Clemson lacrosse as one of the nations premiere programs. She recruited her first two classes in three months time and then brought on board transfers from across the country to solidify her inaugural roster. The 2027 class that Kwolek recruited was named the No. 4 overall class in the country. Unlike other first year programs, Clemson jumped right into playing games when its players arrived on campus in August of 2022.

In her first season at Clemson, Coach Kwolek led the Tigers to win four games in the ACC, upset No. 13 Duke, be ranked in the top 25 nationally for nine straight weeks, earn an automatic bid to the ACC quarterfinals and finish sixth in the ACC. She coached two players to earn ACC All-Freshmen Team, two players to the South's All-Region Second Team, and one player to Honorable Mention for USA Lacrosse's All-American Team.

That spring, not only did Kwolek have to navigate coaching a brand new team through their first season, but she also had to fight breast cancer. After upsetting No. 13 Duke, Kwolek announced her diagnosis to the public and began treatment. Coach Kwolek would only miss several games before returning to the sidelines.

In her second season leading the Tigers, Kwolek and her team went 11-7 in overall play including three conference wins with an overwhelming win over ACC opponent Duke. Clemson also made their second official appearance in the ACC Championship, where they reached the Quarterfinal round for the second consecutive year. In addition to the team's success on the field, a franchise record of 16 Tigers were placed on the Academic All-ACC list. Paris Masaracchia and Emily Lamparter were named Preseason All-Americans, while Regan Byrne, Kayla MacLeod, and Natalie Shurtleff made the 2024 ACC All-Freshman team.

That fall, Kwolek went on to sign Inside Lacrosse's No. 1-ranked recruiting class. The historic class features five five-star recruits, including the No. 1 and No. 2-ranked players in the country, state champions and multiple multi-time All-Americans. The class is made up of four midfielders, four attackers, a defender and a goalie and hails from Connecticut, Georgia, Massachusetts, Maryland, New Jersey, New York and South Carolina.

The 2025 Tigers moved up to No. 6 in the country after road wins over No. 5 Syracuse and No. 11 Notre Dame in the span of seven days. Kwolek had led the University of Richmond into the top-10 in each of her final two seasons, before taking the head coaching job at Clemson, which did not compete until 2022. Kwolek's success in the postseason continued in 2025 as she picked up her third postseason win in three seasons at Clemson and the 14th postseason victory of her career. After reaching the 2025 ACC Semifinals with a 15-7 win over NCAA Quarterfinalist and No. 9 ranked Duke, Kwolek led Clemson to an 11-8 win over No. 15 ranked Navy to advance to the NCAA Sweet 16.

Clemson finished the 2025 season with a 14-7 record, with four of those losses coming to Final Four teams. The Tigers had 4 top-15 wins, including 2 top-10 victories. The Tigers went 6-3 in the nation's top league, the ACC, finishing in a tie for fourth place. The Purple and Regalia featured two All-Americans in 2025, Natalie Shurtleff and Summer Agostino, and had 11 All-ACC selections over the last two seasons. Kwolek has now led two different programs to top-10 national rankings in 3 of her last 5 seasons. And that is leading two programs who combine for just one top-10 ranking without Kwolek as the head coach.

Clemson's rise has been driven not just by Kwolek's developing of talent, but her recruiting. It's no secret, she is a coach that players want to play for, not just because of how she impacts their success on the field, but because of how she cares about the person off the field.

The No. 1 ranked recruiting class entering Clemson in the fall of 2025 is Kwolek's second top-5 ranked class (Class of 2027 – 4th) and 3rd class ranked in the top-15. She also had a No. 1 ranked transfer class and her balance of top high school talent and acquiring top transfers has been a key to Clemson's success, but as big an appeal as Clemson has, Kwolek landed a top-10 recruiting class at Richmond, where she also recruited and coached Sam Geiersbach, the 2022 Most Outstanding Player of the NCAA Championship.

In her last five seasons at Richmond, Kwolek went 64-16 (.800), 27-5 in Atlantic 10 play, won two conference tournaments and two regular-season championships. Richmond was nationally ranked in the top-10 each of her last two seasons and qualified for the NCAA Tournament in 2 of the her last 3 years. That doesn't include the 2020 season, when the Spiders started 7-0 and defeated No. 6 UVa before the season was cut short due to COVID-19. Kwolek coached five Atlantic 10 Players of the Year at Richmond.

Prior to her time at Richmond, Kwolek served as an assistant at the College of William and Mary, Columbia University, and Dartmouth College, helping lead the Big Green to an Ivy League Championship and NCAA Tournament berth.

Formerly known as Allison Evans, Kwolek was an All-CAA midfielder at William & Mary and defender on the US National Team. She was inducted into the Lacrosse Hall of Fame, Potomac Chapter in February 2015 and named to the William & Mary Athletics Hall of Fame in 2020. Kwolek and her husband Mark have a daughter Olivia.

Clemson Lacrosse's new stadium includes bleacher seating for 1,000 fans, artificial turf, and a 9,000 square foot operations complex, including coaches' offices, locker rooms, player lounge and other amenities. These new facilities make Clemson home to the only collegiate program to have a stadium and facility be solely designated to its women's lacrosse program.



