ABOUT WOFFORD

The Wofford Terriers are coming off an explosive 12-9 win against crosstown foe USC Upstate. The Terriers used six runs in the fourth inning to propel the team to its 12th straight victory.

Wofford is off to a 14-1 start. That is the best start by any Southern Conference team in league history. Both Samford and Chattanooga started 13-2 at one point.

With 14 wins on the year, Wofford has the fifth-highest win total of any team in the nation.

HOT START

The Wofford Terriers have been scorching hot to start the 2026 season. The team is off to its best start in program history with a 14-1 record, including wins in 12-straight games.

The 14-1 record is the best 15-game start to a season in Southern Conference history. The 14 wins is tied for the fifth-highest win total in the nation. Only Florida (19), Texas Tech (16), Grand Canyon (16), and South Florida (15) have more.

Wofford is one of only 12 teams in the nation to have at least 10 wins and one or less losses. The 12-game win streak is tied for the sixth longest in the nation. There are five unbeaten teams with higher win totals, along with Texas who has won 12 in a row.

With 13 wins at home this season, Wofford is tied with Arizona State for the fourth most home wins in the nation. Grand Canyon is fourth with 16, USF is second with 15, while North Carolina has 14.

THE OFFENSE IS ROLLING

Wofford has been exceptional at the plate this season. The team is 10th in the nation in with a .384 batting average. Wofford is one of the highest scoring teams in the country as well, ranking 14th with 124 total runs.

The team has the ninth most triples in the country at seven and the 19th highest scoring average (8.27 runs/game).

Through 15 games last season, Wofford was averaging 3.86 runs/game. The team had 54 total runs and 49 RBI. Wofford had three total home runs at that point and 14 doubles.

Through 15 games this season, Wofford has scored 124 runs and totaled 110 RBI. This year, Wofford has totaled eight homers and 31 doubles.

TURNING TWO

Wofford was one of the best teams in the nation at turning double plays and by far the best in the Southern Conference. The Terriers finished fourth in the nation in double plays per game (0.62) and sixth in total double plays (32). The team led the conference in both categories.

The stellar infield play was the major contributor to that, as Kaytlin Greenwood ranked eighth in the nation in assists last season (137). The shortstop shared the field with third base-standout Gracie Parker. Parker was 29th in the nation in assists (125) and third in the conference.

This season, Wofford is currently leading the conference and is 26th in the nation with seven double plays. The .47 double plays/game is ranked 45th in the nation and second in the conference.

HIGHWAY ROBBERY

The Terriers were one of the best teams in the conference when it came to stealing bases last season. The Terriers averaged 1.62 stolen bases per game a year ago - pacing the conference and ranking 39th in the nation. The team's 84 total stolen bases were good for 35th in the country and first in the conference.

So far this season, Wofford is ranked 11th in the nation and first in the conference with 36 stolen bases. The 2.40 stolen bases/game is ranked 17th nationally and first in the conference.

Desirae Devine is a perfect 12-of-12 this season, ranking her first in stolen base % in the nation. Her 12 stolen bases are a SoCon best and is eighth in the country. Averaging 0.92 stolen bases per game, Devine is ranked ninth nationally.

LAYING IT ON THE LINE

Wofford was one of the best teams in the nation when it came to sacrifice bunts last season. With 52 sac bunts in 2025, the team ranked eighth in the nation and second in the SoCon (Chattanooga, 64).

The Terriers have picked up where they left off last season, as Wofford ranks 2nd in the country and first in the SoCon with 19 sac bunts this year. Rivers Sampson has been excellent, averaging 0.27 sac bunts per game. That ranks 42nd in the country and first in the conference.

The team also has eight sac flies, good for 12th in the country and first in the SoCon.

THE KAYTLIN GREENWOOD SHOW

Kaytlin Greenwood has been nothing short of spectacular to start 2026. As one of the best defensive shortstops in the nation, Greenwood is known to make miraculous plays at the No. 6 position.

Nationally, Greenwood is ranked 33rd with 37 assists on the year. That is first in the SoCon. Her 2.47 assists/game is 54th in the country and first in the conference.

Greenwood has also shown improvement at the plate, posting a career-high four RBI in the 10-4 win against Kent State (2/8). Greenwood went 2-of-3 with a pair of singles. She tallied her first homerun of the season against UMBC (2/14).

DOUBLE OR NOTHING

Wofford has been great at the plate this season, especially in hitting doubles. The team has totaled 31 two-baggers, ranking 19th in the nation and first in the conference.

Brianna Stanley Played a large part in that, racking up six doubles by herself to rank 40th in the country and second in the SoCon.

BRIANNA STANLEY

Brianna Stanley is fresh off an opening weekend that saw her hit .706 with 12 hits, eight RBI, four doubles, two homers, and 22 total bases. The performances earned her SoCon Player of the Week and a selection to the NCAA Softball Lineup of the Week at DP.

Stanley was just named SoCon Player of the Week again on Monday, February 23, after posting a .571 batting average, eight hits, 13 RBI, and four home runs.

For the year, Stanley leads the team in batting average (.511), hits (24), doubles (6), homers (6), RBI (24), total bases (48), and slugging % (1.021).

With 13 home runs in her career, Stanley is the all-time leader in program history. She is just two shy of tying Hope Ingles single season record of 8 (2025). Stanley registered hits in 14 straight games to start the year, setting a new program record.

Stanley became the first player in program history to hit two home runs in one game. She accomplished the feat against Robert Morris earlier this season.

She is currently ranked top 50 nationally in batting average, doubles, hits, homers, on-base %, RBI, slugging %, and total bases.

THYROID CANCER

Sophomore outfielder Rivers Sampson had a tough battle with Thyroid Cancer back in middle school. Sampson beat the cancer, and the Wofford Softball team has decided to paint the safety base at first teal in support of childhood thyroid cancer awareness.

Rivers told her story prior to the season. That edition of Terrier Talk can be found on all Wofford Softball social media platforms and on YouTube.

THE AXE

Margaret Axelson, also known as "The Axe", posted a dominate 2025 season en route to her second-straight all-conference first team selection. The Axe tossed 18 complete games, ranking her 30th in the nation and second in the conference.

Axelson posted a 1.99 ERA in 2025 - the first sub-2.00 ERA in program history. That ranked her 27th in the nation and second in the conference. She threw four shutouts, which was second best in the SoCon and 54th in the country. Her 3.07 strikeout-to-walk ratio was third-best in the conference.

The Axe boasted a 1.10 WHIP, placing her 42nd in the nation and second in the SoCon. Allowing only 1.3 walks per seven innings, she ranked 17th in the nation and first in the SoCon.

Axelson was picked as the 51st best player in the D1Softball Preseason Mid-Major Top 100. She was also deemed the D1Softball SoCon Preseason Pitcher of the Year.

2026 OUTLOOK

Wofford enters year three of softball with a fourth-place prediction in the league. The Terriers finished the 2025 season with a record of 30-22 and an 11-8 mark in conference play.

The 30 wins is tied for the most wins out of a second-year program in SoCon history (UNCG, 30-34).

This season, Wofford returns 15 players from a year ago, including five from the pitching staff. The Terriers return five players who were recognized on the SoCon postseason awards last season.

Natalya Salo, Brianna Stanley, and Rivers Sampson are back after appearing on the SoCon All-Freshman Team in 2025. Margaret Axelson returns after an All-SoCon First Team selection, and Abby Greenwood comes back with an All-SoCon Second Team honor last year.

The Terriers have five newcomers - three freshmen and two transfers. Maddie Berry, Madison Thieke, and Emry Masterson round out the newbies, while Lauren Archambault and Addison Lucier come by way of the transfer portal.

NEW KIDS ON THE BLOCK

Emry Masterson, an infielder out of Chattanooga, Tennessee, led her high school team to two state championships, three region titles, and four district championships. The Silverdale Baptist Academy product batted .355 for her career and was a 2x all-region selection. Her mother played softball at North Georgia.

Madison Thieke, an outfielder from Greer, South Carolina, was a 2x all-region selection at Riverside High School. She started every game since her freshman season and helped lead her team to its first region title in 20 years. Thieke posted a career batting average of .417 and totaled 38 stolen bases. Her mother, father, and grandfather played collegiate athletics at Murray State.

Maddie Berry, a right handed pitcher from Latta, South Carolina, earned five varsity letters at Latta High School. She was a 2x all-state selection and was named all-region

every year she played. For her career, Berry pitched 311 innings and posted a 31-5 record. She compiled 547 strikeouts and a 0.81 ERA.

PORTAL SUCCESS

Head coach Chelsea Butler dipped into the transfer portal during the offseason, bringing in two players - Lauren Archambault and Addison Lucier

Archambault, a sophomore out of Apex, North Carolina, played her freshman season at Florida Gulf Coast. She appeared in 23 games for FGCU and recorded her first career hit against Saint Francis (3/4). She stole three bases and scored four runs.

Lucier makes her way from Boston University, where she helped lead her team to its third-straight Patriot League Title. She started in 51 of 54 games she appeared in, including at least one start in seven different positions - 24 of which were at catcher. Lucier batted .226 with 23 runs scored, 19 RBI, four doubles, two triples, and two stolen bases.

PRESEASON RECOGNITION

The 2026 Southern Conference Preseason Polls came out on Thursday, January 29, and the Terriers were picked to finish fourth out of eight teams. That is the highest pre-season ranking in the program's young history. Wofford was picked to finish fifth last season.

Senior hurler Margaret Axelson was tabbed the preseason pitcher of the year along with a first-team all-conference selection. Brianna Stanley, Abby Greenwood, and Rivers Sampson found themselves on the second team.

THE ARM FARM

The Wofford Terriers possessed one of the best pitching staffs in the nation last year and the best in the SoCon. In 2025, the team posted a 2.19 ERA to top the conference and rank fifth in the nation.

Wofford is poised for a big year on the rubber again, as the team returns five pitchers from last season. Margaret Axelson, who is a back-to-back All-SoCon First Team selection, returns as the ace. She was just named the Preseason SoCon Pitcher of the Year.

Nationally, Wofford's 3.36 ERA is ranked 72nd in the nation and third in the conference. The team posts a WHIP of 1.37 to rank 57th in the nation and second in the conference.

The Terriers are 31st nationally and first in the conference in strikeout/walk ratio (2.65).

IT RUNS IN THE FAMILY

Desirae Devine led the team and was sixth in the SoCon in stolen bases last year with 14. Speed runs in her family, as her father, Noel Devine, was the running back for the West Virginia Mountaineers between 2007-10. He currently holds the WVU career all-purpose yardage record with 5,761 yards and was inducted into the WVU Hall of Fame in 2021. He continues to work for WVU as an offensive analyst for the football program.

Sophomore Rivers Sampson has two older sisters, Tyler and Haven Sampson, go on to play DI softball. Tyler Sampson played for Georgia Southern before transferring to Reinhart University. Haven Sampson would go on to play for the University of Florida for two years before finishing her career at West Georgia.

Madison Thieke, a freshman out of Greer, South Carolina, comes from an athletic family as well. Her mother, father, and grandfather all played Division I athletics at Murray State.

Emry Masterson is also another freshman that hails from an athletic family. Masterson's mother played softball at North Georgia.

MR. 25

One of the winningest coaches in Wofford baseball history is Mark Line. He served as head coach from 1985 to 1994, posting a career record of 204-157 for a .564 winning percentage. He was named NAIA District VI Coach of the Year in 1987. In 1990, the Terriers won 30 games for the first time in school history. He served as the Deputy Athletic Director at Wofford before serving at the first head coach of the Wofford softball program during its inception until the hiring of Chelsea Butler. Line currently is an assistant coach for the Terrier softball team as it begins its second season of action.

GOING THE DISTANCE

In 2025, out of the 51 games played Wofford starters have pitched 37 complete complete games this season. With Margaret Axelson leading the way with 18 complete games - four of which were shutouts.

So far this season, Wofford pitchers have combined for seven complete games. Abby Greenwood has thrown three, while Margaret Axelson and Natalya Salo have two apiece.

THE FIRST SKIPPER

In 2022, the Terriers hired Chelsea Butler to take over as softball head coach. She pitched for Golden West Junior College earning all-conference recognition before transferring to Eastern Kentucky from 2008-2009 with her senior season highlighted by a 2.32 ERA. Before Wofford, she was on many DI coaching staffs, including Utah State, Temple and Presbyterian. She was an assistant coach at the University of Maryland in 2021 leading the Terapins pitching staff to 3.10 ERA with an opponent batting average of .249 before joining Wofford. Once at Wofford, she oversaw many milestones in the inaugural season, guiding the newly formed softball program to a 23-24 record and an 11-10 record in Southern Conference play. She earned the Coach of Year award in the Southern Conference. This is the second time in Wofford's history that such an award was given to a first year head coach and the first ever for Wofford women's athletics.

SOPHOMORE STANDOUTS

This season could see one of the deepest Wofford softball teams to date. A large part of that is due to the six sophomores that are primed to have a big year.

Starting with the returners, Wofford welcomes back three freshmen that were on the 2025 SoCon All-Freshman Team. Brianna Stanley, Rivers Sampson, and Natalya Salo make up the trio. Sampson and Stanley were selected to the SoCon Preseason Second Team this season as well.

The duo of Stanley and Sampson led the group with 53 hits and 51 hits, respectively, a year ago. Right handed pitcher Natalya Salo became the only player to have multiple saves during one season in program history. In limited action, sophomore catcher Lucy Cameron showed strong defensive promise. The Illinois native is primed to have a big sophomore season.

The Terriers welcomed a pair of sophomore transfers during the offseason as well. Lauren Archambault comes from FGCU where she saw limited action. Addison Lucier was a regular starter at Patriot League Champion Boston University last season. she was named Patriot League All-Tournament Team as a freshman.

SPARTANBURG, S.C. – The Wofford College softball team defeated USC Upstate 12-9 on Tuesday evening at Hope Field. The Terriers used six runs in the fourth inning to help seal the game. Wofford improves to 14-1 on the year, including wins in its last 12 games

Natalya Salo earned the win, improving to 3-1 this season. Salo threw 6.2 innings with two strikeouts. Margaret Axelson got the last out of the game to get her first save of the season. Axelson struck out the final batter for USC Upstate. Kate Platte went a perfect 3-of-3 from the plate with two runs scored and two RBI. Lauren Archambault tallied two hits and three RBI. Gracie Parker had two RBI as well. Addison Lucier, Rivers Sampson, Kalli Petty, and Kaytlin Greenwood all finished with one RBI. Sampson had three hits as well.

USC Upstate got the scoring started in the first inning, taking an early 2-0 lead. Wofford answered in the bottom half of the stanza with three runs, however. An error by the Spartans scored the first run, followed by a two RBI double from Lauren Archambault to drive in Kalli Petty and Brianna Stanley. Holding a 3-2 lead in the second inning, Wofford was able to add two more runs in the third. A single through the right side from Addison Lucier scored Abbi Campbell. Rivers Sampson closed the second inning with an RBI double to score Lucier

In the fourth inning, USC Upstate was able to tie the game at five-all. Wofford answered again, scoring six runs to stretch the game out to 11-5. Kalli Petty started it off with a single to score Kate Platte. Another single from Lauren Archambault drove home Rivers Sampson, and Gracie Parker would find two RBI after a single up the middle. A double from Kaytlin Greenwood scored Madison Thieke. Kate Platte ended the big inning with a sacrifice fly to score Gracie Parker. The Spartans found one run in the sixth inning, but Kate Platte responded with an RBI single to give Wofford a 12-6 lead. In the final inning of the game Upstate was able to score three runs. Wofford ended the comeback short, however, earning a 12-9 win.

The Terriers will be back in action on Friday, February 27, as the team will compete in the Tiger Invitational at Clemson University. Wofford will take on Mississippi State, Clemson, and Georgia Southern over three days of action.

Wofford College announced on May 25, 2022, that Chelsea Butler had been named the head coach of the softball program. Butler brings over a decade of experience, both as a collegiate student-athlete and pitching coach, at the Division I level to Wofford. She enters her third season at the helm of the program in 2026.

After an astonishing first season, Butler's squad elevated in 2025 with a 30-22 record overall alongside an 11-8 SoCon clip. The campaign marked the first 30-win season in program history with the 11-8 SoCon record the program's best by winning percentage. Wofford earned the No. 4 seed for the SoCon Tournament, its best seeding yet, as the Terriers hosted the event at Hope Field on the Wofford College campus. The Terrier pitching staff remained one of the best in the conference, leading the SoCon in ERA (2.19), strikeout-to-walk ratio (2.75), and WHIP (1.16) with the ERA fifth best in the entire nation. The Terriers also led the conference in double plays turned (32), which ranked sixth nationally, fielding percentage (.973), and stolen bases (84). With 52 sacrifice bunts, Wofford was second in the conference and eighth in the country. At season's end, Margaret Axelson and Hope Ingle were honored on the All-SoCon First Team as Abby Greenwood secured a spot on the All-SoCon Second Team. The SoCon All-Freshman Team sported the trio of Rivers Sampson, Brianna Stanley, and Natalya Salo. Axelson (1.99) and Greenwood (2.18) ranked second and third, respectively, in the SoCon for ERA with Axelson's mark the first sub-2.00 ERA in program history. Greenwood sported 107 strikeouts to become the first Terrier to break through the 100-punchout barrier, ranking fourth in the conference. She led the league with a 3.82 strikeout-to-walk ratio. The Wofford offense took a leap forward from year one to year two, as the team batting average elevated from .228 in 2024 to .282 in 2025. The Terriers recorded over 100 more hits, three times as many home runs, 30 more runs, and 34 more stolen bases.

Butler guided the program to an incredible inaugural season in 2024 with a 23-24 overall record and 11-10 Southern Conference mark. The Terriers tied for fourth place in the conference and entered the SoCon Tournament as the No. 5 seed due to tiebreakers. Wofford led the conference with

a 2.91 team ERA and a 1.95 strikeout-to-walk ratio. Leading that charge was Margaret Axelson, whose 2.15 ERA topped the league. Butler was tabbed Southern Conference Coach of the Year upon the conclusion of the season for her efforts in guided the program to unprecedented success in its first-ever season. Axelson was named to the All-SoCon First Team. A trio of Terriers – Abby Greenwood, Kaytlin Greenwood and Megan Towerly – were honored on the All-SoCon All-Freshman Team. The season saw a plethora of firsts for the program of course, most notably its first game against Eastern Kentucky on February 8, followed by the team's first win, 3-0, over Robert Morris the following night on February 9. Wofford secured its first SoCon triumph with an 11-8 victory at Mercer on March 24. Though Wofford's season ended in the SoCon Tournament, the Terriers opened the event with a 5-4 win over ETSU in 10 innings for the program's first-ever SoCon Tournament win. Wofford also owned a series win over the eventual SoCon champion, Chattanooga, during the regular season.

Butler spent the prior three seasons as an assistant coach at the University of Maryland, working with the pitching staff. This past season, Maryland was 29-23 overall and 14-8 in the Big 10. It marked the most wins for the Terps since 2013 and the fifth-place finish was the highest since joining the conference. It was also the first season in which Maryland won a game in the Big Ten tournament. Jaeda McFarland (first team) and Megan Mikami (second team) were named All-Big Ten.

"I am thrilled and grateful for the opportunity to build the Wofford softball program," said Butler. "I want to thank President Nayef Samhat, Athletic Director Richard Johnson, Deputy AD/SWA Elizabeth Rabb and Mark Line for this opportunity and I am incredibly honored by their belief in me. I look forward to not only building this program, but empowering young women to find and be the best version of themselves on the field, in the classroom and in their individual lives. Now and forever, Go Terriers!"
