### NEED TO KNOW

- » No. 4 Duke confronts its 10th nationally-ranked opponent on Saturday, hosting No. 20 Clemson at Cameron Indoor Stadium at noon on ESPN.
- » Duke and Clemson have the ACC's top scoring defenses, allowing less than 65 points/game.
- » Duke leads the all-time series against Clemson, 115-34, including a 66-4 home record against the Tigers, having won 21 consecutive meetings at Cameron Indoor.
- » The Blue Devils have won 28 consecutive home games, including 15 straight against conference opponents, while posting a 59-3 (.952) home record under **Jon Scheyer**.
- » Duke is 23-13 when playing on Feb. 14, and has won six straight on this date.
- » Duke is No. 3 in NET rankings and is tied as the national leader with 10 Quad-1 wins. (Feb. 12)
- » Duke has secured top-25 victories over No. 7 Michigan State, No. 15 Florida, No. 20 Louisville (twice), No. 22 Arkansas, No. 24 SMU and No. 25 Kansas.
- » Duke has won 33 of its last 35 games against conference opponents.
- » Duke is one of four teams ranked in the top-10 nationally in both offensive efficiency (125.6, 9th) and defensive efficiency (89.9, 3rd) ratings. (KenPom)
- » The Blue Devils lead the ACC and are seventh nationally in scoring margin (+19.4).
- » Duke tops the conference and ranks eighth in the country in rebounding margin (+10.0).
- » The Blue Devils rank sixth in the nation and first in the ACC in scoring defense (63.5 ppg).
- » **Cameron Boozier** is the nation's fifth-leading scorer with an ACC-high 23.0 points per game, and tops the ACC in rebounding (10.0 rpg), is eighth in steals (1.8 spg), 13th in assists (4.0 apg) and fourth in field goal percentage (.578).
- » Boozier has recorded at least 14 points, five rebounds and two assists in all 24 games this season, the longest such streak by any player (men's or women's) at any point in a Division I career this century. (OptaSTATS)
- » **Isaiah Evans** leads the ACC in free-throw percentage (.883), and is the ACC's 10th-leading scorer in conference play, averaging 16.8 points per league game.
- » Duke owns the best record in Division I college basketball over the past two seasons at 57-6.

- » Clemson is ranked 20th in the Associated Press top-25 poll, while being ranked No. 18 in the USA Today coaches poll.
- » Duke has won eight of the last 11 meetings against Clemson and leads the all-time series 115-34.
- » The Blue Devils own a 66-4 home record against the Tigers, having won 21 consecutive meetings at Cameron Indoor.
- » Clemson handed Duke its only conference loss last season, a 77-71 Tigers' victory in South Carolina.
- » Two seasons ago (Jan. 27, 2024), two free throws by **Tyrese Proctor** with one second on the clock pushed No. 12 Duke to a 72-71 victory over Clemson at Cameron Indoor Stadium.
- » The Tigers are second in the league and 12th nationally in scoring defense, allowing just 64.6 points per game.
- » Clemson leads the ACC and ranks 26th in the nation in bench scoring with 31.4 points per game.
- » Eight Tigers average at least 5.3 points per game, including three scoring in double figures, topped by 6-7 senior forward RJ Godfrey with 11.6 points per outing.

**NOTES & CONNECTIONS**

- » Duke and Syracuse have met 23 times with the Blue Devils leading, 17-6. Duke has won 10 straight and 12 of the last 13.
- » The Blue Devils have won 12 of the 16 regular-season meetings since Syracuse joined the ACC, including a 29-point victory, 83-54, at JMA Wireless Dome on Feb. 5, 2025.
- » The Orange are second in the nation with an ACC-high 6.2 blocked shots per game, led by William Kyle III with 67 rejections (2.68 bpg), which ranks fourth in the country.
- » Syracuse averages a league-high 12.6 fast-break points per game.
- » Donnie Freeman leads four Orange in double-digit scoring with 17.6 points per contest.
- » Naithan George is the conference's fifth-best playmaker, averaging 5.6 assists per game.
- » Current Blue Devil **Maliq Brown** played two seasons (2022-24) at Syracuse, appearing in 61 games with 25 starts, before transferring to Duke. In 2023-24, Brown topped the ACC with 71 steals and was selected to the ACC All-Defensive Team.

## DUKE GAME NOTES

### Last Time Out

- » No. 4 Duke held Pittsburgh to just 25 second-half points en route to a 70-54 victory on Tuesday, Feb. 10, at the Petersen Events Center.
- » The Blue Devils limited the Panthers to a season-low scoring output at home.
- » **Isaiah Evans** led all scorers with 21 points, fueled by a 5-of-6 night from deep. **Cameron Boozer** tallied his 13th double-double of the season, with 17 points and 10 boards, while **Caleb Foster** contributed across the board with 14 points, five assists and a career-high eight rebounds.
- » The Panthers entered Saturday's game averaging 70.8 points per game, but were held to 54, 16.8 below their season average. Duke's defense has held all but two of their 24 opponents below their scoring average.
- » Pittsburgh's 54 points were its lowest output at home this season. Duke ranked ninth nationally and led the ACC in scoring defense (63.9) entering Tuesday and held Pittsburgh to 9.9 points below that average.
- » The Blue Devils forced three shot clock violations on Tuesday night, increasing their season total to 18.
- » Entering Tuesday night, Pittsburgh ranked third in the ACC for offensive rebounds per game (12.5). Duke limited the Panthers on the offensive glass, allowing just seven offensive rebounds, leading to only five second-chance points. The Blue Devils outrebounded the Panthers by 14 (37-23) and have finished with a positive margin on the glass in 20 games this season.
- » Duke registered one scoring run of at least 10 points, increasing its kill shot season total to 27.
- » Duke finished the contest with 12 fouls and holds a record of 65-3 (.956) in four seasons under **Jon Scheyer** when committing 15 or fewer fouls.

### Blue Devils Efficient at Both Ends of the Floor

- » Duke is one of only four teams ranked in the top-10 nationally in both offensive efficiency (125.5, 9th) and defensive efficiency (89.8, 3rd) ratings, according to KenPom.com.
- » The Blue Devils are the nation's No. 3-rated team, according to KenPom, with an overall rating of 35.74. (through games played on Feb. 12)
- » The 2024-25 Blue Devils achieved the best offensive efficiency rating (130.1) in the history of KenPom (since 1996-97 season).
- » In 2024-25, Duke registered the second-highest overall rating (39.29) in KenPom history, trailing only the 1998-99 Duke Blue Devils (43.01).
- » Last season, Duke was the only team in the country ranked among the top-five in both offensive (130.1, 1st) and defensive (90.8, 5th) adjusted efficiency (KenPom).
- » Duke has boasted a top-20 defense in all four seasons under head coach **Jon Scheyer**: 16th (93.9) in 2022-23; 16th (95.2) in 2023-24; 5th (90.8) in 2024-25; and currently 3rd (89.8) in 2025-26.

### Tracking Blue Devil Deflections

- » Through 24 games, the Blue Devils have accumulated 437 deflections, an average of 18.2 per game.
- » Duke amassed a season-best 32 deflections versus Niagara (Nov. 21), topping the previous high of 30 against Indiana State (Nov. 14).
- » **Maliq Brown**, described as a "defensive menace" by head coach **Jon Scheyer**, tops Duke with 128 deflections (5.3 avg.).
- » Brown, who was selected to the 2023-24 ACC All-Defensive Team after leading the league with 71 steals as a sophomore at Syracuse, recorded 12 deflections against Niagara (Nov. 21), the most by a Blue Devil this season.
- » Brown has the best steal percentage (5.02%) in the ACC and ranks seventh nationally, according to KenPom (percentage of possessions a player records a steal while on the court).
- » Brown joined teammate **Cameron Boozer** as one of 25 players selected to the 2025-26 Naismith Defensive Player of the Year Award watch list, announced Jan. 29.

### Cleaning the Glass

- » Duke tops the conference and ranks eighth in the country in rebounding margin (+10.0), outrebounding its opposition by an average of 39.7 to 29.7 boards per game.
- » The Blue Devils have outrebounded their opponent in 20 games this season.
- » Duke has outrebounded six opponents by 20 or more boards, including a season-best rebound margin of +34 (55-21) against Lipscomb and a +21 (47-26) versus Louisville.
- » Duke has limited three opponents to two points or less in second-chance points, including a pair of shutouts (Lipscomb, Georgia Tech).

### Strength of Schedule

- » Duke has secured seven top-25 victories with wins over No. 7 Michigan State, No. 15 Florida, No. 20 Louisville (twice), No. 22 Arkansas, No. 24 SMU and No. 25 Kansas.
- » Duke has played 12 Quad-1 games, based on the NCAA's NET rankings (Feb. 12), with a 10-2 record in those contests. The Blue Devils' 10 Quad-1 wins are tied for the most in the country.
- » Eight ACC teams are among the top 40 of the NCAA's NET rankings (as of Feb. 12). Duke (3), Louisville (14), Virginia (18) and North Carolina (25) rank among the top 25.
- » Five ACC teams are ranked in the latest Associated Press top-25 poll (Feb. 9): No. 4 Duke, No. 11 North Carolina, No. 15 Virginia, No. 20 Clemson and No. 24 Louisville.
- » Duke's 2025-26 non-conference lineup features eight opponents that reached the NCAA Tournament a year ago: Texas (Nov. 4; Charlotte, N.C.), Kansas (Nov. 18; New York, N.Y.), Arkansas (Nov. 27; Chicago), Florida (Dec. 2; Durham), Michigan State (Dec. 6; East Lansing, Mich.), Lipscomb (Dec. 16; Durham), Texas Tech (Dec. 20; New York, N.Y.) and Michigan (Feb. 21; Washington, D.C.). Of those teams, five advanced to the Sweet 16, with three reaching the Elite Eight.
- » The Blue Devils play 10 games against teams ranked in ESPN's preseason top 25: No. 2 Florida, No. 6 Louisville (twice), No. 8 Michigan, No. 11 Texas Tech, No. 12 Arkansas, No. 22 Kansas, No. 24 NC State and No. 25 North Carolina (twice).

### Duke's Three-Point Streak

- » Duke has connected on at least one 3-pointer in 1,288 straight games, the longest streak nationally.
- » It has been more than 35 years since Duke was held without a three-point field goal -- Dec. 30, 1989, versus Hawai'i.

### Other Notables

- » Duke has won 33 of its last 35 games against conference opponents.
- » Duke owns the best record in Division I college basketball over the past two seasons at 57-6. Houston is second at 57-7. (College Basketball Report)
- » Since Thanksgiving 2024, the Blue Devils have achieved a record of 53-4 (.930).
- » Duke has a record of 65-3 (.956) when committing 15 or fewer fouls under head coach **Jon Scheyer**, compared to 46-21 (.687) when the Blue Devils have 16 or more fouls. (@EvanMiya)
- » **Maliq Brown** is fifth in the nation in 2-point field goal percentage (75.4%), having made 52-of-69 shots inside the arc.
- » Veteran Blue Devil **Caleb Foster** has proven to be a road warrior this season, establishing new career-highs in points (20 at Louisville), rebounds (8 at Pittsburgh) and assists (8 vs. Arkansas in Chicago) all away from the friendly confines of Cameron Indoor Stadium.
- » Duke has registered 27 kill shots (scoring run of 10+ points) this season, while surrendering just six by the opposition.
- » The Blue Devils have confronted double-digit deficits in four outings this season, including their largest deficits at Louisville (12) and versus SMU (11), and have rallied to win all four games.
- » Duke's 11-0 start was the best unbeaten open to a season since the 2017-18 campaign, and its 21-1 record was the best start to a season since 2007-08 (22-1).
- » The Blue Devils' 17 straight ACC regular-season victories (Feb. 12, 2025-Feb. 3, 2026) is the third-longest ACC winning streak in program history and the longest since 2000.
- » Duke's eight consecutive ACC road wins (Feb. 12, 2025-Feb. 3, 2026) tied for the third-longest ACC road winning streak in program history.
- » The 55-point margin of victory over Army West Point (Nov. 11) was Duke's largest road win in program history.
- » Duke posted a record of 36-3 (.923) in 2025, to tie the ACC record for most wins in a calendar year, equaling the 1992 Blue Devils (36-2) and North Carolina in 2008 (36-3).

### The 2025-26 Duke Blue Devils

- » Entering the 2025-26 campaign under fourth-year head coach **Jon Scheyer**, Duke returns six players from a squad that finished 35-4 overall last season, capturing the program's 23rd ACC Tournament title, 21st ACC regular-season crown and advancing to its 18th Final Four.
- » The 2025-26 Duke squad returns just 20% of its offensive production from last season, as all five 2024-25 starters, representing the team's top five scorers, were selected in the NBA Draft.
- » The 2025-26 Blue Devils welcomed the nation's No. 1-ranked recruiting class - the seventh top-ranked recruiting class for Duke since Scheyer joined the coaching staff.
- » The Blue Devils are the second-tallest team in the country, trailing Illinois (80.0") - with an average height of 79.3 inches. (KenPom)
- » Duke is one of the youngest teams in the nation with an average of 0.90 years of Division I experience, according to KenPom.com, which ranks 307th out of 365.

## DUKE GAME NOTES

### Cameron Boozar's Historic Campaign

- » **Cameron Boozar** is the first Duke freshman to score 35 points or more twice - amassing 35 points versus Indiana State (Nov. 14) and tallying 35 points again versus Arkansas (Nov. 27).
- » The freshman forward became the first NCAA Division I or NBA player in the last 30 seasons to have an eight-game span with more than 175 points, 75 rebounds and 25 assists, 10 or fewer turnovers, and an undefeated record - doing so in Duke's first eight games. (OptaSTATS)
- » Boozar became the first ACC player with at least 100 points, 50 rebounds and 20 assists in a five-game span since Craig Smith of Boston College in March 2006. The freshman forward accomplished that standard in his first five college contests. (Nov. 19)
- » Boozar is the only Division I player in the last 30 seasons to collect at least 250 points, 100 rebounds and 40 assists through his first 11 career games. (Dec. 17; OptaSTATS)
- » Boozar amassed 35 points, 12 rebounds, five assists, three steals and three blocks, connecting on 13-of-16 field goals in a win over Indiana State on Nov. 14, becoming the first major conference freshman to reach 30 points, 10 rebounds and five assists with no more than one turnover since Syracuse's Carmelo Anthony in 2003 (ESPN), and joined **Zion Williamson** (2019) and **Christian Laettner** (1990) as the third Duke player in the past 45 years to score at least 35 points in a double-double performance.
- » Boozar's nine assists against Florida State were the most by a Blue Devil in the past three seasons (10 assists by **Tyrese Proctor** against Pitt in the 2023 ACC Tournament).
- » Boozar needed just 16 career games to record 300+ points, 150+ rebounds and 50+ assists. That is the second fewest needed by any player this century, as LSU's Ben Simmons reached those figures in 15 games 10 years ago in 2015-16. (Stats Perform)
- » Boozar became the first Blue Devil to score 30 points in consecutive games since **RJ Barrett** in February 2019.
- » Boozar has recorded at least 14 points, five rebounds and two assists in all 24 games this season, the longest such streak by any player (men's or women's) at any point in a Division I career this century. (OptaSTATS)
- » The Miami native has amassed 25 points or more in 10 games, including 35 points against No. 22 Arkansas, 35 points versus Indiana State, 32 points against Wake Forest, 30 points at Stanford and 29 points against No. 15 Florida.
- » Boozar's 32-point performance versus Wake Forest (Jan. 24) was his 10th game scoring 25 points or more, which ranks third among Duke freshmen all time.
- » Boozar has been voted ACC Player of the Week four times (Nov. 17, Dec. 1, Dec. 8, Jan. 19) and ACC Rookie of the Week eight times (Nov. 17, Nov. 24, Dec. 1, Dec. 8, Jan. 5, Jan. 12, Jan. 19, Jan. 26).
- » The freshman forward is currently the nation's fifth-leading scorer with 23.0 points per game, ranks 15th nationally with 10.0 rebounds per contest and is tied for ninth with 13 double-doubles.
- » Among ACC statistical leaders, Boozar leads the league in scoring (23.0 ppg) and rebounding (10.0 rpg), and ranks eighth in steals (1.8 spg), 13th in assists (4.0 apg) and fourth in field goal percentage (.578).

### AP Poll Streak Extends

- » With the release of the *Associated Press* preseason poll on Oct. 13, Duke was ranked No. 6 -- extending a notable streak.
- » The Blue Devils have now been ranked in the top 10 at least once in 30 consecutive seasons -- the longest active streak nationally. The next closest program is Kansas, which has held a top-10 ranking at some point in each of the last 20 seasons.
- » The No. 6 ranking also marked the 18th consecutive season that the Blue Devils made their debut in the top 10.
- » Duke's current run in the AP top-25 poll is 58 consecutive weeks - the third-longest active streak. (as of Feb. 9)

### The Blue Devils Have Won 85% of Games at Cameron Indoor Stadium

- » Duke has posted an all-time record of 989-174 (.850) at Cameron Indoor Stadium, including a 59-3 (.952) record under head coach **Jon Scheyer** with unblemished home records in 2022-23 (16-0) and 2024-25 (17-0).
- » The Blue Devils have won 28 consecutive home games.
- » Duke has won more games at its current home venue than any team in college basketball.
- » Now in its 87th season as the home of the Blue Devils, Duke has averaged 11.1 wins since the venue opened Jan. 6, 1940 -- a 36-27 win over Princeton.

### Sellout Streak Still Staying Strong

- » Duke has sold out 552 consecutive games at Cameron Indoor Stadium. The last time Duke did not have a sellout at home was on Nov. 16, 1990, against Boston College.
- » The sellout figure is the longest current streak (by time) in either men's college basketball or the NBA.
- » Duke's record at Cameron during the sellout streak is 503-49 (.911).

### Nearly 75% Winning Percentage in NBA Arenas

- » Duke is a combined 106-36 (.746) all-time in 13 current NBA venues.
- » The Blue Devils have won 36 of their last 46 at NBA venues, including a 3-1 record this year and a 4-1 mark last season.
- » Duke has a 15-7 (.682) record in NBA facilities under head coach **Jon Scheyer**, including an 12-4 (.750) ledger in the past three seasons.
- » During the 2025-26 campaign, the Blue Devils play five regular-season contests at NBA venues - Spectrum Center (Charlotte Hornets) on Nov. 4 vs. Texas, Madison Square Garden (New York Knicks) on Nov. 18 vs. Kansas and Dec. 20 vs. Texas Tech, United Center (Chicago Bulls) on Nov. 27 vs. Arkansas, and Capital One Arena (Washington Wizards) on Feb. 21 vs. Michigan.
- » The ACC Tournament returns to the Spectrum Center, home of the Charlotte Hornets, on March 10-14, 2026.

### Madison Square Garden: Has Seen More Duke Wins Than Any Arena Outside of N.C.

- » The Dec. 20 contest against Texas Tech at Madison Square Garden marked Duke's 62nd game at current MSG, and the Blue Devils are 43-19 (.694) in the venue all-time.
- » Duke has won 10 of its last 12 contests at the World's Most Famous Arena.
- » The Texas Tech game was head coach **Jon Scheyer**'s 29th at MSG as a Duke player, assistant coach and head coach (23-6).
- » Duke is 49-25 in all versions of MSG, dating back to a Jan. 1, 1944, matchup with LIU Brooklyn.
- » Duke has played at least once at MSG in 12 of the last 13 seasons, in 22 of the last 24, and 25 of the last 28.
- » Current MSG has seen the fifth-most Duke wins (43) of any venue in the country, behind only Cameron Indoor Stadium (989), Greensboro Coliseum (102), Reynolds Coliseum in Raleigh (83), and former Duke home venue Card Gym (57).

### Duke is Most-Watched Men's College Basketball Team

- » Duke is the most-watched men's college basketball team this season, according to Nielsen (as of Feb. 8).
- » No. 4 Duke's 80-71 victory over No. 22 Arkansas at the United Center on Thanksgiving Day averaged 6.813 million viewers for CBS Sports, becoming the most-watched regular-season college basketball game on any network since the 1992-93 season, according to Nielsen. The previous high came on Feb. 21, 1993, when Purdue faced Indiana on CBS (7.225 million).
- » The Duke versus North Carolina game on Feb. 7, averaged 3.51 million viewers on ESPN, making it the most-watched regular-season college basketball game in four years. The contest peaked at 4.8 million viewers, representing a 53% increase over the 2025 matchup.

## DUKE GAME NOTES

### Scheyer Continues to Make History

- » Duke men's basketball head coach **Jon Scheyer** continues to add historic milestones to his résumé.
- » In his fourth season as a head coach, Scheyer became the fastest head coach to win 100 games in ACC history and the second-fastest Division I head coach to reach 100 victories in the last 45 years.
- » When Duke defeated Lipscomb, 97-73, on Dec. 16, Scheyer hit the century mark in just 122 games.
- » Scheyer broke the ACC record for the fastest head coach to reach 100 career victories by exceeding Duke's Vic Bubas, who achieved the mark in 128 games in 1964.
- » Scheyer compiled an 89-22 record (.802) in his first three seasons at the helm, establishing new benchmarks in conference and national history.
- » Scheyer's 89 victories surpassed the standard set by Bill Guthridge (80, North Carolina, 1997-2000) for the most wins by an ACC coach in their first three seasons and tied Brad Underwood and Brad Stevens for the most by any Division I men's basketball head coach over that span.
- » Scheyer also became the first coach in conference history to win two ACC Tournament championships within his first three seasons.
- » During the 2022-23 campaign, Scheyer became the first coach in the conference's storied history to post an undefeated home record in a debut season and the first to lead a team to an ACC title as both a player (2009, 2010) and as a head coach (2023).
- » In 2024-25, Scheyer guided the Blue Devils to one of the most dominant seasons in program history and the school's 18th Final Four appearance, becoming the youngest head coach to reach the Final Four since 2011.
- » Under Scheyer, Duke posted a 35-4 overall record in 2024-25, joining a rare group as only the sixth team in school history to notch at least 35 wins and the first in a decade to do so.
- » Ranked inside the AP Top 25 throughout the 2024-25 campaign, Duke spent two weeks at No. 1 and finished the season No. 3 in the final poll, marking the 41st top-10 finish in school history. The Blue Devils closed the year by winning 31 of their final 33 games, riding impressive win streaks of 16 and 15 games, and storming through the NCAA Tournament with an 86.80 points-per-game average - the second-highest by a Duke team in tournament history (min. five games), behind only the 2001 national champions.
- » Scheyer's Blue Devils were a statistical powerhouse, leading the nation in scoring margin (+20.5) and becoming the first team in ACC history to lead the conference in both scoring offense (83.2) and scoring defense (62.8).
- » Duke also tallied 394 made three-pointers, the second-most in program history, while becoming the only Division I team to both average over 80 points per game (83.2) and allow fewer than 63 (62.8).
- » The Blue Devils achieved a KenPom net rating of 39.29, the second-highest in the site's history since 1996-97 - trailing only the 1998-99 Duke squad (43.01).
- » Scheyer, one of four finalists for the 2025 Naismith Coach of the Year award, was honored as the recipient of the 2024-25 John McLendon National Coach of the Year Award (presented by College Insider) and was named NABC South Atlantic District Coach of the Year.
- » The Northbrook, Illinois, native has been integral in the recruiting and development of several young Duke stars since joining the staff in 2013-14, and as head coach has landed the nation's No. 1-ranked recruiting class three times (2022, 2024, 2025) and a No. 2-ranked recruiting class (2023).
- » Duke has signed a top-three recruiting class per ESPN in every season since Scheyer joined the staff, including the No. 1 class seven times in 12 seasons (2014, 2015, 2017, 2018, 2022, 2024, 2025).

### Scheyer Announces Three Signees in 2026 Recruiting Class

- » Duke head coach **Jon Scheyer** announced the signing of three players in the Blue Devils' 2026 recruiting class during the NCAA early signing period.
- » The three-player group includes five-star prospects **Cameron Williams**, the No. 3 overall recruit and top-ranked power forward from St. Mary's High School in Phoenix, and **Bryson Howard**, the No. 12 overall prospect and No. 5 small forward from Heritage High School in Frisco, Texas, along with four-star recruit **Maxime Meyer**, ranked 94th overall and 11th among centers nationally from IMG Academy in Bradenton, Florida.
- » Ranked as the fourth-best recruiting class in the country through the early signing period, according to 247Sports, Scheyer has signed a top-three class in each of his 12 seasons on the Duke coaching staff with seven No. 1 classes during that stretch, including in 2022, 2024 and 2025.
- » This represents the third straight recruiting cycle in which Scheyer has secured a top-three prospect.

### Duke Adds Three More McDonald's All-Americans

- » Following the announcement of the 2025 McDonald's All-American Game rosters, Duke has signed 95 McDonald's All-Americans all-time -- the most of any NCAA program.
- » The Blue Devils' most recent selections are **Cameron Boozer**, **Cayden Boozer** and **Nikolas Khamenia**.
- » Duke has added at least one McDonald's All-American in 41 consecutive years.

### NBA Champion Jayson Tatum Named Chief Basketball Officer

- » Duke men's basketball head coach **Jon Scheyer** announced Tuesday the creation of a groundbreaking new opportunity within the men's basketball program and within college basketball - Chief Basketball Officer. NBA Champion and former Blue Devil standout **Jayson Tatum** has been named to this first-of-its-kind responsibility.
- » As Chief Basketball Officer, Tatum will volunteer his time as a special advisor to Scheyer and the Duke program, bringing championship-level insight and professional basketball experience to player development, leadership, and life as an elite athlete. Tatum, who starred for the Blue Devils in 2016-17 before launching a decorated NBA career, will leverage the lessons he first learned in Durham to help prepare current Blue Devils for success both on and off the court.
- » The creation of the Chief Basketball Officer signals a bold and innovative step in college basketball. It underscores Duke's deep connection to the NBA while affirming Scheyer's vision for a program that not only develops champions in college, but also prepares players for life and success at the game's highest level. By embedding a player of Tatum's caliber directly into the program, Duke is redefining how alumni can actively shape the future of student-athletes.
- » The appointment of Tatum as Chief Basketball Officer further reinforces the power of The Brotherhood - Duke's lifelong network of players, coaches, and alumni - and illustrates how Scheyer is reimagining the college basketball model. For current student-athletes, it offers a rare and invaluable opportunity: direct access to the mindset, standards, and habits required to excel at the game's highest level.

### NBA Season Begins with 24 Blue Devils on Opening Day Rosters

- » When the NBA season began on Oct. 21, Duke had 24 members of The Brotherhood on opening-day rosters.
- » The list was compiled from the NBA's official opening-day rosters (including two-way and inactive lists) and includes any Blue Devil that played and finished their college basketball careers at Duke.
- » The Blue Devils have players at a total of 14 different franchises, including trios in Charlotte (**Sion James**, **Kon Knueppel** and **Mason Plumlee**), Dallas (**Cooper Flagg**, **Kyrie Irving** and **Dereck Lively II**), Orlando (**Paolo Banchero**, **Wendell Carter Jr.** and **Tyus Jones**) and Phoenix (**Grayson Allen**, **Khaman Maluach** and **Mark Williams**) along with duos in Atlanta (**Jalen Johnson** and **Luke Kennard**) and Toronto (**RJ Barrett** and **Brandon Ingram**).
- » **Tyrese Proctor** (Cleveland) rounds out Duke's starting five from the 2024-25 Duke roster, with all five making their respective franchises' roster. **Tré Jones** (Chicago) is scheduled to matchup against his brother, Tyus, four times during the regular season. **Jayson Tatum**, recently announced as Duke's Chief Basketball Officer, continues to rehab from his injury suffered during the 2025 NBA Playoffs. In New Orleans, **Zion Williamson** enters his seventh season in the league, while **Gary Trent Jr.** (Milwaukee) and **Marvin Bagley III** (Washington) are each entering their eighth seasons. Former teammates and 2024 NBA Draft picks, **Kyle Filipowski** (Utah) and **Jared McCain** (Philadelphia) are each gearing up for their second year in the NBA.

## HEAD COACH JON SCHEYER



### BIO

Former Duke All-American and two-time team captain Jon Scheyer is the 20th head coach in Duke University's storied basketball history. He was named to the position on June 4, 2021, succeeding Hall of Fame head coach Mike Krzyzewski.

Scheyer, who enters his fourth season as head coach in 2025-26, has vast experience on the Duke bench, having served on Krzyzewski's staff since the 2013-14 season. His previous roles with the Blue Devils include special assistant, assistant coach and the previous three years as associate head coach. Scheyer and Duke agreed to a new contract in October of 2025, extending him through the 2030-31 season.

The 35-year-old Scheyer was among the youngest head coaches in Division-I men's basketball, and the youngest at a power conference institution. He was named to *The Athletic's* 40 Under 40 in college sports in 2022, and was previously touted as one of the best assistant coaches in college basketball.

In his first three seasons as head coach, Scheyer led the Blue Devils to two ACC Tournament titles and three NCAA Tournament appearances, including trips to the Elite Eight and Final Four.

As a player, Scheyer sparked the Blue Devils to two ACC championships and the 2010 NCAA title as a player from 2007-10. In his time on the coaching staff, he has helped Duke compile a 272-80 (.773) record, a national championship (2015), two Final Fours (2015, 2022) and three ACC Tournament crowns (2017, 2019, 2023).

The Northbrook, Illinois, native has been integral in the recruiting and development of several young Duke stars since joining the staff, and landed the nation's No. 1-ranked recruiting class in 2022, 2024 and 2025, and No. 2-ranked class for 2023.

Duke has signed a top-three recruiting class per ESPN in every season since Scheyer joined the staff, including the No. 1 class seven times in 12 seasons (2014, 2015, 2017, 2018, 2022, 2024, 2025).

## 2024-25 IN REVIEW

### SEASON SUMMARY

- » The 2024-25 Blue Devils achieved a 35-4 overall record as one of six Duke teams to win at least 35 games in a season, and the first to do so in 10 years.
- » Duke made its 18th Final Four appearance - tied for second-most all time - with Scheyer becoming the youngest head coach in the Final Four since 2011 (Brad Stevens, Butler).
- » Duke secured the East Region title with top-25 victories over No. 21 Arizona (100-93) and No. 7 Alabama (85-65) in Newark, N.J., advancing to the Final Four at the Alamodome in San Antonio.
- » Duke achieved the second-highest net rating (39.29) and best offensive efficiency rating (130.1) in the history of KenPom (since 1996-97 season). Only the 1998-99 Duke Blue Devils achieved a higher net rating (43.01).
- » Duke tallied a 19-1 conference record to capture the school's 21st ACC regular-season title.
- » The Blue Devils captured the ACC Tournament championship for the 23rd time in program history and the second time under third-year head coach Jon Scheyer.
- » Duke was ranked inside the top 25 for the entirety of the 2024-25 season, including two weeks at No. 1 and concluding at No. 3 in the final Associated Press poll - the 41st time Duke has finished in the top 10.
- » The Blue Devils won 31 of their last 33 games, including win streaks of 16 and 15 consecutive victories.
- » Duke led the nation in scoring margin (+20.5) and ranked third in the country in assist-to-turnover ratio (+1.82), fourth in field goal percentage defense (.384), fifth in effective field goal percentage (.579), seventh in field goal percentage (.493), seventh in scoring defense (62.8), eighth in turnovers per game (9.3), 10th in free throw percentage (.790), 11th in scoring offense (83.2), 11th in three-point percentage (.386), 13th in rebound margin (+7.2), 17th in assists per game (17.0) and 21st in three-pointers per game (10.1) - all top marks in the ACC.
- » Duke became the first team in ACC history to lead the conference in both scoring offense (83.2) and scoring defense (62.8).
- » Duke was the only team in the country ranked among the top-five in both offensive (1st) and defensive (5th) adjusted efficiency, according to KenPom.
- » Duke was the only Division I team to score 80 points or more per game (83.2) and hold its opponents to fewer than 63 points per game (62.8).
- » The 2024-25 Blue Devils tallied the best assist-to-turnover ratio (1.82) in program history and posted the best field goal percentage defense (.384) by any Duke squad since 1960.
- » Scheyer's 89 career victories tied with Brad Underwood and Brad Stevens for the most wins among Division I head coaches in their first three seasons.
- » Scheyer, who received the 2024-25 John McLendon National Coach of the Year Award, is the first coach in conference history to win two ACC Tournament championships in his first three seasons as a head coach.
- » Cooper Flagg was named National Player of the Year by five of the six organizations recognized by the NCAA, taking home the honor from the United State Basketball Writers Associated (USBWA), National Association of Basketball Coaches (NABC), the Associated Press (AP), Wooden and Naismith.
- » Flagg swept the ACC Player and Rookie of the Year awards and became Duke's first consensus First Team All-American since 2019.
- » Flagg became the first Blue Devil to lead the team in all five major statistical categories - scoring (19.2), rebounding (7.5), assists (4.2), steals (1.4) and blocks (1.4).
- » Kon Knueppel was named ACC Tournament MVP, averaging 21 points per game in Duke's three games in Charlotte, while shooting 18-of-37 (.486) from the field.
- » All five Duke starters were selected in the 2025 NBA Draft with Cooper Flagg picked No. 1, Kon Knueppel at No. 4 and Khaman Maluach at No. 10, with Sion James and Tyrese Procter chosen in the second round.




